Website Update. We are now starting our Seventy-sixth year as the Lake County Philatelic Society - so the website (needed) has a new look.

The membership and interest information to the site still is being modified and it would be nice if everyone came to the meeting this month for we could get new pictures and updates of stamp collecting interest.

New issues for each month will be displayed on the home page and as Scott numbers are assigned, the technical details will be added. Also added are links to the show schedules listed on the INTERNET for both Illinois and Wisconsin.

Another modification is that *Perforations* is now in Adobe PDF format in order to speed download and save space.

Other task that are in the offing are: the scanning of the older issues of *Perforations* - starting with a shoe box of past issues on loan from Howard S.
