Interest Rate—Contract Claims

The Postal Service periodically publishes in the *Postal Bulletin* the interest rate payable on a claim decided in a contractor's favor, under the Contract Disputes Act of 1978. This rate also applies for late payments to contractors under the Prompt Payment Act, as amended.

Effective for the 6-month period beginning January 1, 1995, and ending June 30, 1995, this interest rate is 8½ percent.

Improved Tray Label Holders

Selection: An improved tray label holder was selected from a number of designs to replace the current label holder.

Distribution: Manufacturers began supplying new plastic MM trays, both standard and extended size, with the improved label holder in December. The improved label holder begins appearing on newly manufactured fiberboard MM trays this month. Flat trays will continue to be supplied with the old style (double pocket) label holder until current supplies have been exhausted.

Using the Improved Label Holder: When viewing the tray's label end, the label is to be inserted into the right side of the label holder and pushed to the left all the way (nearly 3 inches) into the label holder. While it is possible to insert the label from either end, labels inserted incorrectly will extend beyond the tray and could be torn off or dislodged during processing.

Supply: Initial supplies will be made available to tray manufacturers and to MTE warehouses for distribution with unassembled fiberboard trays. The material distribution centers will have limited quantities available mid-January 1995. Field offices needing replacement quantities should order label holder PSIN 09930-A at that time. Dispose of the old style (double pocket) label holders immediately upon receiving the new label holders.

Retrofitting: Field offices must ensure that the improved label holders are available to replace damaged label holders. Also, where feasible, the old (double pocket) label holder should be removed from plastic MM and EMM trays and replaced with the improved label holder.

DMM REVISION

Advance Payment of Annual Fees

This notice is issued to clarify the standards for advance payment of annual permit, mailing, and accounting fees. Instructions in this notice are consistent with past practice and interpretation of the *Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)*. Information in this notice responds to mailer inquiries about paying such fees in advance, particularly before the January 1, 1995, fee increase.

This notice also repeats an announcement transmitted in December 1994 by the five rates and classification service centers. The DMM revisions shown below are effective immediately and will be incorporated into DMM Issue 49.

The annual fees for business reply mail (BRM) permit and accounting, First-Class presort, bulk third-class, fourth-class destination bulk mail center (DBMC), special fourth-class presort, and merchandise return service are due on the anniversary date of the original application or on the date of the previous year's payment, whichever is later.

Each annual fee may be paid in advance only for the next year and only during the last 30 days of the current service period. The correct fee is the fee that is in effect on the date of payment of the fee. For example, a fee due on January 1, 1995, may be paid in advance at the current (1994) fee only during December 1994. Because payment may not be made earlier than 30 days before the due date, a fee due after January 30, 1995, must be paid in the amount of the new (1995) fee.

If a fee is due in December 1994 or January 1995, payment in the amount of the 1994 fee is acceptable under either of these two conditions:

1. The payment is *mailed and postmarked* before January 1, 1995, but received after that date; or
2. The payment is made at the business mail entry unit (and a receipt issued on Form 3544, *Post Office Receipt for Money*) by close of business on December 31, 1994, but posted in the account book after that date.

DMM NOTICE

Revisions to Weight and Preparation Standards for Barcoded Letter Mail**General Information**

Effective January 16, 1995, for a period of up to 1 year, the Postal Service will conduct a live test of barcoded bulk third-class regular rate letter mail weighing between 3.0 and 3.3067 ounces, and First-, second-, and bulk third-class nonprofit rate letter mail weighing between 3.0 and 3.3363 ounces. (*These values increased to 3.3376 and 3.3071 ounces, respectively, when R94 rates were implemented on January 1, 1995. The increased values are used in this article and in the Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) revisions appearing below.*) Notice of this test was published in the *Federal Register* (as a proposed rule on July 14, 1994 (59 FR 35873-35875), and as a final rule on December 22, 1994 (59 FR 65967-65971)).

Purpose and Basic Requirements

Although the Postal Service believes that this mail can benefit from barcoding (as the means of moving this mail into an automated processing environment), it also believes that this benefit can be achieved only under specific standards governing the construction and preparation of this "heavy letter mail." Thus, the revised DMM standards implemented for this test period (and published below) require that each "heavy letter" mailpiece comply with the following:

- (1) Be part of a mailing that is 100 percent delivery point barcoded.
- (2) Have the barcode in the address block.
- (3) Be in an envelope that has no open windows.
- (4) Not be bound or have stiff enclosures.

Weight Limits

For simplicity and consistency, the maximum weight for First-, second-, and nonprofit bulk third-class barcoded letter mail is set at 3.3376 ounces. For regular bulk third-class rate only, the maximum is set at 3.3071 ounces, which is its "break point." If the proposed test or changes in the break point indicate that this alignment is not in the best interest of the Postal Service, the maximum weight will be adjusted accordingly. Heavier mail is not included in this test because previous controlled tests conducted by the Postal Service revealed that increased problems (such as damage, jams, and throughput) arose or worsened with mail heavier than 3.3376 ounces.

Enveloped Mail

Only enveloped mail will be part of this test; self-mailers, bound or booklet-type mail, and tabbed catalogs are not eligible for participation in this test. In recent tests, the Postal Service verified that such pieces cause equipment jams and are more susceptible to damage. In allowing only enveloped mail in the proposed test, the Postal Service is seeking to evaluate the performance of heavy letter mail having the best opportunity for successful auto-

ated processing, insofar as that can be predicted by physical criteria.

Accordingly, heavy letter mail joining the general category of automation-compatible mail for the test period must be prepared in trays, as is currently the case for other automation-compatible letter mail. The Postal Service will also exclude from this test mailpieces above 3.0 ounces with open windows because, based on preliminary tests, they have a greater tendency to snag on automated processing equipment.

Delivery Point Barcoding

All pieces eligible for this test must bear a delivery point barcode. This requirement is necessary because routine postal processing uses optical character readers (OCRs) to handle mailpieces rejected from barcode sorters in an effort to read the delivery address and print a barcode in the lower right corner of the mailpiece. However, heavy letter mail will not run through OCRs; attempts to process and barcode such mail on an OCR revealed that significant damage occurred to the heavy letter pieces and that any barcodes printed in the barcode clear zone by the OCR were often unreadable.

The increased thickness caused the bottom edges of the heavy letter mail envelopes to be rounded and to buckle when bent. Because of the curvature and irregular surface created by the rounding and buckling of the heavy mailpiece, barcodes printed in the lower right corner of such mailpieces by the OCR were outside the working specifications of postal barcode readers and, as a result, useless for automated processing.

Together, the additional OCR processing of non-delivery point barcoded heavy letter mail, the labor to repair damaged pieces, and the ensuing manual or mechanized handling of that mail amount to unreasonable additional costs for the Postal Service, well beyond that acceptable for Barcoded rate mail. As a result, a 100 percent delivery point barcoded mailstream is being required for heavy letter mail.

Mailing Identification

To ensure the Postal Service's ability to identify, measure, and monitor heavy letter mail as it enters and moves through the mailstream, test participants will be required to take specific measures to identify heavy letter mail. Specifically, each container of heavy mail must be clearly identified when submitted by the mailer.

Pallets, general purpose mail containers, and other similar equipment used to transport trays of heavy letter mail will require labels (placards) bearing the words "HEAVY LETTER MAIL" in letters not less than 1/2 inch high. These labels must be white or light-colored stock, not smaller than 8 by 11 inches, and placed on two adjacent sides of the pallet or other equipment.

Each tray of heavy letter mail must also be identified by a flag (similar to a separator card) clearly marked "HEAVY LETTER MAIL" and placed in front of the contents of the tray. No marking will be required on the pieces of heavy letter mail other than as required by the class or rate claimed, or by the postage payment method used.

Documentation of Large Mailings

Participants in the heavy letter mail test will also be asked to provide documentation for any heavy letter mailing exceeding 100,000 pieces. Requested information includes the mailer's name and contact person for test information, the mailing's contents (size, weight, volume, level of presort, and proportion of heavy letter mail), and the mailing's distribution (place(s) of mailing and destination ZIP Code ranges). This information, which should be provided to the address below at least 3 weeks before mailing, will allow the Postal Service adequate time to conduct on-site evaluation and data collection for test mail. Damaged Mail

If heavy letter mail is damaged in processing during this test period, the mailer will be asked to recall the damaged pieces before delivery (by completing Form 1509) to allow their examination for evaluation of both the cause of the damage and possible remedies for that cause.

Final Determination

The results of this yearlong test will determine whether heavy letter mail will be allowed thereafter in the automation-compatible mailstream. Notice of that determination, and of any DMM changes thereby required, will be published in both the *Federal Register* and the *Postal Bulletin*.

Conditions Applied to Mail Addressed to Military Post Offices Overseas

Mail addressed to, from, or between military post offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO (army post office/fleet post office) ZIP Code through the use of footnoted mailing restriction codes, which appear on the last page of the table.

Acceptance Clerks. Use this table in conjunction with the integrated retail terminal (IRT) to determine

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2966-A is required. Prepaid mail from a contractor addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.

B1. Form 2966-B is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

B2. Form 2966-A is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar value of the items, a complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.

B3. Form 2966-A is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotape, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers or cordless telephones are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail Section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM part C021, are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 12 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

INTERNATIONAL MAIL

IMM AND PUBLICATION 273 REVISION

International Express Mail Service—Vietnam

Effective December 1, 1994, On Demand and Custom Designed Express Mail Services are available on a reciprocal basis with Vietnam. The basic features of Express Mail International Service (EMS) to Vietnam follow:

Services Available: On Demand and Custom Designed services are available.

Reciprocal Name: In Vietnam, Express Mail International Service is called EMS.

Weight: 44 pounds.

Size Limit: maximum length: 36 inches.

Areas Served: Hanoi City, Hochiminh City, Hadong Town, Haiphong City, Hongai Town, Haiduong Town, Namdinh Town, Thaibinh Town, Hue Town, Danang City, Nhatrang City, Phanrang Town, Thudaumot Town, Bienhoa Town, Longxuyen Town, Vungtau City, Tanan Town, Mytho City, Bentre Town, Vinhlong Town, Travinh Town, Caolanh Town, Cantho City, Soctrang Town, Tayninh Town, Thanh Hoa City, and Vinh City.

Delivery: EMS items will be delivered within 24 hours of their receipt at the exchange office. Items are delivered Monday through Saturday.

No Service Guarantee: Postal employees must tell customers that there is no service guarantee on any EMS item to Vietnam.

Country Code: VN.

Air Stop Code: SGN.

City Code: SGN.

Acceptable Items: All items admissible in international mail to Vietnam, including correspondence, business papers, and merchandise are accepted in EMS. See the Country Conditions of Mailing for Vietnam in the *International Mail Manual (IMM)* for specific prohibitions and restrictions.

Customs Declaration/Endorsement:

Articles Admitted: Correspondence and business papers. Use Form 2976, *Customs—Douane C1* (green label). Endorse item clearly next to mailing label as BUSINESS PAPERS.

Merchandise samples without commercial value and not subject to customs duty. Use Form 2976, *Customs—Douane C1* (green label).

Merchandise and all articles subject to customs duty. Use Form 2966-A, *Parcel Post Customs Declaration—United States of America*. Include commercial invoice in each item.

Prohibited Items: Coins; bank notes; currency notes (paper money); securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver (manufactured or not); precious stones; jewelry; and other valuable articles prohibited in EMS shipments to Vietnam.

All items prohibited in regular international mail are also prohibited in international EMS to Vietnam.

IMM REVISION

International Package Consignment Service

Effective December 1, 1994, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 620 is added to establish International Package Consignment Service (IPCS).

The Postal Service is implementing IPCS as a new international mail service designed for mail order companies sending merchandise packages to other countries. Initially, this service is being managed as a Headquarters program. A full description of this service was published on December 22, 1994, in the *Federal Register* (59 FR 65961-65967).

620 International Package Consignment Service**621 Description****621.1 General**

International Package Consignment Service (IPCS) is a bulk mailing system that provides fast, economical international delivery of packages containing merchandise. IPCS is designed to make it easier and less costly for mail order companies to export goods. The Postal Service provides IPCS on a destination country-specific basic pursuant to the terms and conditions stipulated in 620.

621.2 Admissible Items**621.21 Prohibited Enclosures**

IPCS packages may not contain:

- a. Typewritten and handwritten communications having the character of current correspondence.
- b. Any item that is prohibited in international mail. Refer to the Country Conditions of Mailing in the Individual Country Listings for individual destination country prohibitions.

621.22 Exceptions

IPCS packages may contain an invoice as long as the invoice is limited to the particulars that constitute an invoice.

621.3 Availability

IPCS is available only to destination countries identified in 620.

622 Qualifying Mailers

To qualify, a mailer must enter into a service agreement containing the commitments stipulated in 625.2 and must be able to meet the general and destination country-specific preparation requirements stipulated in 620.

623 General**623.1 Special Services**

The special services provided for in Chapter 3 are not available for packages sent by IPCS unless specifically provided for in 620.

623.2 Customs Documentation

The requirements for customs forms vary by destination country as stipulated in 620.

623.3 Size and Weight Limits

Size and weight limits for packages sent by IPCS vary by destination country as stipulated in 620.

623.4 Postage**623.41 Rates**

Rates vary by destination country as stipulated in 620.

623.42 Postage Payment Method

Postage must be paid by permit imprint.

623.43 Documentation

Each mailing of IPCS packages must be accompanied by a manifest and other documentation in the form specified by the Postal Service.

624 Preparation Requirements**624.1 General Requirements****624.11 Barcode**

Every IPCS package must bear a barcode, in a format acceptable to the Postal Service, that identifies the package by a unique number. The mailer must place the barcode on the address side of the package.

624.12 Addressing

See 122. The name and address of the mailer and of the addressee also should be recorded on a separate slip enclosed in the package.

624.13 Sealing

Every IPCS package must be sealed by the mailer. Wax, gummed-paper tape, nails, screws, wire, metal bands, or other materials may be used as suitable. The seal must be sufficient to allow detection of tampering.

International Package Consignment Service—Continued

624.14 Packaging

Every IPCS package must be securely and substantially packed. In packing, the mailer should consider the nature of the contents, the climate, and the delivery method. The Postal Service will determine whether the contemplated packaging is suitable prior to the mailer's use of IPCS.

624.15 Nonpostal Documentation

Forms required by nonpostal export regulations are described in Chapter 5.

624.2 Destination Country-Specific Requirements

Certain preparation requirements vary by destination country as stipulated in 620.

625 IPCS Service Agreements

625.1 General

The mailer must enter into a separate service agreement for each destination country to which it wants to use IPCS.

625.2 Required Provisions

Each service agreement must contain the following:

- a. The mailer's commitment to send at least 25,000 packages by IPCS during the next 12 months to the specified destination country.
- b. The mailer's commitment to designate the Postal Service as its carrier of choice to the specified destination country.
- c. The mailer's commitment to link its information systems with the Postal Service's so that (1) the Postal Service and the mailer can exchange data transmissions concerning the mailer's packages, and (2) by scanning the mailer-provided barcode on each package, the Postal Service can extract, on an as-needed basis, certain information about the package. The package-specific information that the mailer is required to make available varies by destination country as stipulated in 620.

625.3 Optional Provisions

Each service agreement may set forth any IPCS-related arrangements between the Postal Service and the mailer that are technical in nature.

626 IPCS to Japan

626.1 Description

626.11 General

IPCS to Japan provides the mailer with three delivery options, and with preparation by the Postal Service of the customs forms required by Japan Post.

626.12 JFK Processing Facility

All IPCS packages sent to Japan are processed at, and dispatched from, a dedicated facility located at JFK International Airport (the JFK Processing Facility).

626.13 Delivery Options

626.131 Express Service

Packages sent through Express Service are transported by air to Japan, where they receive special handling by Japan Post and expedited delivery. The mailer can track Express Service packages through delivery. Reports of delivery performance are furnished to the mailer in the formats and at the frequencies agreed upon by the Postal Service and the mailer.

626.132 Standard Air Service

Packages sent through Standard Air Service are transported by air to Japan, where they enter Japan Post's domestic airmail system for delivery. The mailer can track Standard Air Service packages through dispatch from the JFK Processing Facility.

626.133 Economy Air Service

Packages sent through Economy Air Service are transported by air to Japan, where they enter Japan Post's domestic surface mail system for delivery. The mailer can track Economy Air Service packages through dispatch from the JFK Processing Facility.

626.2 Acceptance

626.21 Within 500 Miles of JFK

If the plant at which the mailer's IPCS packages originate is located within 500 miles of the JFK Processing Facility, the Postal Service accepts the packages at the plant and transports them by truck to the JFK Processing Facility according to a schedule agreed upon by the Postal Service and the mailer.

626.22 More Than 500 Miles From JFK

If the plant at which the mailer's IPCS packages originate is located more than 500 miles from the JFK Processing Facility, the mailer must present the packages for verification at the plant and transport them as a drop shipment to the JFK Processing Facility according to a schedule agreed upon by the Postal Service and the mailer.

626.3 Required Package-Specific Information

The mailer must make available to the Postal Service, by means of data transmissions in the formats and at the frequencies agreed upon by the Postal Service and the mailer, the following information about each IPCS package:

International Package Consignment Service—Continued

- a. Order number.
- b. Package identification number.
- c. Delivery option used for package.
- d. Buyer's name and address.
- e. Recipient's name and address.
- f. Total weight.
- g. Total value.
- h. Total number of items in package.
- i. Number of each individual item in package.
- j. SKU and/or key-word description of each item.
- k. Value of each item.
- l. Country of origin (if available) of each item.

626.4 Insurance and Indemnity

626.41 Express Service

Packages sent through Express Service are insured against loss, damage, or rifling at no additional cost. Indemnity will be paid by the Postal Service as provided in DMM S500. However, Express Service packages are not insured against delay in delivery. Neither indemnity payments nor postage refunds will be made in the event of delay.

626.42 Standard Air Service

Packages sent through Standard Air Service weighing more than 1 pound may be insured at an additional cost. See 320.

626.43 Economy Air Service

Packages sent through Economy Air Service may not be insured.

626.5 Postage

626.51 Base Rates

See Exhibit 626.51. Postage is paid on a per-package basis.

- c. Maximum length and girth combined: 108 inches (79 inches until Japan Post formally agrees to the larger size limit). Maximum length, height, depth (thickness) combined for packages weighing 1 pound or less is 36 inches.

626.613 Economy Air Service

Economy Air Service packages must meet these size limits:

- a. Minimum length and width: large enough to accommodate the necessary labels and customs forms on the address side.
- b. Maximum length: 24 inches.
- c. Maximum length, height, depth (thickness) combined: 36 inches.

626.62 Weight Limits

626.621 Express Service

Maximum weight: 44 pounds.

626.622 Standard Air Service

Maximum weight: 44 pounds.

626.623 Economy Air Service

Maximum weight: 4 pounds.

627 Customs Forms Required

The mailer is not normally required to affix customs forms to IPCS packages sent to Japan. The Postal Service prints the necessary customs forms based on the

package-specific information transmitted by the mailer and affixes them to the packages. However, during the interim period in which the Postal Service and the mailer are establishing the information system linkages to enable the Postal Service to accomplish this, the mailer is required to affix the appropriate customs forms to the packages, as follows:

- a. Express Service: Form 2966-A, *Parcel Post Customs Declaration—United States of America*.
- b. Standard Air Service: Form 2966-A, *Parcel Post Customs Declaration—United States of America* (packages weighing 1 pound or less must bear Form 2976, *Customs—Douane C-1*).
- c. Economy Air Service: Form 2976, *Customs—Douane C-1*.

628 Preparation Requirements

628.1 Express Service

Every package sent through Express Service must bear a label identifying it as an Express Service package. The mailer is not normally required to affix this label. The Postal Service prints the necessary label and affixes it to the Express Service package. However, during the interim period in which the Postal Service and the mailer are establishing the information systems linkages to enable the Postal Service to accomplish this, the mailer is required to affix Label 11-B, *Express Mail Post Office to Addressee Service*, or an alternative label as instructed by the Postal Service, to every Express Service package.

628.2 Standard Air Service

There are no Japan-specific preparation requirements for packages sent through Standard Air Service. Packages weighing 1 pound or less must bear the "SMALL PACKET" marking (see 264.21).

628.3 Economy Air Service

Packages sent through Economy Air Service must bear the "SMALL PACKET" marking (see 264.21).

IMM REVISION

Forwarding Dutiable Mail Within the U.S.

U.S. Customs has changed its procedures for dutiable mail that is forwarded to a new address. It is not necessary to send a copy of Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, to U.S. Customs when a dutiable item is forwarded. In addition, the mail entry number is no longer a 7-digit serial number. Effective immediately, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 713.312 and 713.313 are revised as follows:

Delivery of GSA Nonmailable Items

Under an agreement between the Postal Service and the General Services Administration (GSA), GSA will ship all mailable items ordered by postal installations via USPS. The agreement also states that "freight shipments and nonmailable items will be sent by the most economical means that satisfies delivery requirements."

The agreement does not cover all current Federal Supply Schedules (FSSs), but will cover all new ones as they are promulgated. GSA is including a mandatory transportation clause in FSS that specifically states "other commercial services shall not be used." Contractors will be required to ship mailable deliveries to the Postal Service via USPS or use their own vehicles.

In shipping orders, GSA will consider an entire order as nonmailable if one item in the order is nonmailable and will ship via a commercial carrier. Nonmailable items are those that are hazardous, oversize, overweight, or do not otherwise meet Postal Service packaging criteria.

Attached is a list of the most common nonmailable items ordered from GSA. Requisitioners are reminded that GSA is not a mandatory source for these items. However, once an order is placed, do not refuse delivery.

CORRECTION

Hazardous Waste Reduction Program

The United States Environmental Protection Agency has established national goals to reduce the releases and off-site transfers of 17 targeted hazardous and toxic chemicals under the 33/50 program. The 33/50 program is a voluntary initiative that set national reduction goals of 33 percent by 1992, and 50 percent by the end of 1995. The chemicals included in this program are listed in Maintenance Management Order MMO-049-93, issued November 19, 1993.

A major environmental goal of the Postal Service is to virtually eliminate hazardous and toxic chemicals used in vehicle maintenance facilities, plant and distribution centers, bulk mail facilities maintenance operations, pest management, and painting operations over the next 3 years by introducing environmentally preferable substitute chemicals. Many facilities around the country have already taken action to achieve this goal by substituting nonhazardous for hazardous chemical products and operations, recycling, reusing and recovering materials, and improving general housekeeping activities. Postal man-

agers involved with the generation of hazardous wastes must comply with the policies, regulations, and procedures found in Handbook AS-553, *Hazardous Waste Guide*.

Increased regulations, disposal costs, liability costs, reporting requirements, and public awareness are very good reasons to change from end-of-pipe control methods to source reduction technologies. Source reduction initiatives are economically beneficial for the Postal Service and lead to the improved quality of the environment. Source reduction techniques and technologies alone, however, will not solve the hazardous waste problem within the Postal Service. Properly trained, motivated, and empowered employees will have a significant role.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-1

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

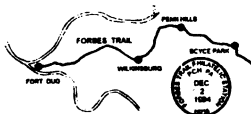
Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.
