New International Rates And Fees Effective July 9, 1995

Pursuant to its authority under 39 U.S.C. 407, the Postal Service announces adjustments in international postal rates and fees for mail services as shown on pages 17–56. These rates and fees are effective at 12:01 a.m., July 9, 1995. Certain of the international fees contained in this notice became effective on January 1, 1995, and are reprinted for informa-

tion purposes. Integrated Retail Terminal software will be updated and distributed before the effective date of the new international rates and fees.

STAMP ANNOUNCEMENT 95-31

Carousel Horses Commemorative Stamps (Folk Art Series)



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As part of the Folk Art Series, the Postal Service is issuing four new designs, featuring four carousel horses. This pane of 20 32-cent stamps (Item 4472) will be issued July 21 in Lahaska, PA. The stamps were designed by Paul Calle of Stamford, CT. The figures chosen represent the three styles of American carousel carvings that developed from 1870 to 1930. Representing the flamboyant "Coney Island Style" is a magnificent "King Horse," decorated with tassels and a festoon of large cabbage roses. Representing the realistic "Philadelphia Style" is an exciting lifelike "Indian Pony," decorated with feathers, beads, and "tooled leather" straps. Representing the "Country Fair Style" is a "Lillie Belle" jumper, circa 1917, with a dramatic high-flying mane. The final horse selected is an intricately designed armored jumper, circa 1912, also carved in the "Coney Island Style." This medieval horse is draped with fish-scale armor, a fancy gorget, and layers of chain mail. The stamps go on sale nationwide July 22.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

STAMP DISTRIBUTION

32-Cent Carousel Horses Commemorative Stamps (Folk Art Series)

The 32-cent Carousel Horses commemorative stamps go on sale July 21 in Lahaska, PA. The stamps are presented as a block of four colorful carousel horse designs. A future *Postal Bulletin* will include collector information.

Distribution

All stamp distribution offices (SDOs) will receive their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 20-stamp pane, rounded to the nearest master carton size (70,000 stamps). The distribution will be completed by June 9.

SDOs will ship standard automatic distribution quantities to post offices, using Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*. SDOs must not distribute stamps to post offices before July 13.

Philatelic Requirement

tribution networks (SDNs) will receive 3,780,000 Carousel Horses stamps for filling supplemental orders.

For the vending program, 20,000,000 stamps will be provided as 2,000,000 packets of 10 stamps (Item 3690).

SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from their APD, using separate Forms 17, *Stamp Requisition*. All other post offices requiring additional stamps must order them from their SDO or SDN on a separate Form 17, or Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*.

Sales Policy

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale, generally 1 year from the date of issue. Automatic distribution of commemorative issues is based on a 60-day supply. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities through their normal ordering procedures.

Endeavour Space Shuttle Express Mail Stamp



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The Postal Service features the *Endeavour* Space Shuttle with the issuance of a \$10.75 Express Mail stamp (Item 1111), in a pane of 20 stamps, on August 4 in Irvine, CA. The stamp exhibits the flawless liftoff of the *Endeavour* Space Shuttle, Mission STS-57, which took place on June 21, 1993, from Kennedy Space Center, FL. The stamp, designed by Phil Jordan of Falls Church, VA, goes on sale nationwide August 5. As an added security feature, elliptical perforations are being used to prevent counterfeiting.

INTERNATIONAL MAIL

Use of G Stamps for International Mail

International conventions that were in effect when G series nondenominated stamps were produced (bearing and endorsement for domestic use only) were later changed to allow the use of nondenominated postage in international mail. Therefore, despite the endorsement they bear, some G series stamps (the 32-cent domestic rate, the 20-cent postcard rate, and the 3-cent make-up stamp) may be used on international mail and given credit for their established value.

G stamps for the nonprofit rate and the First-Class Pre-sort rate must not be used on international mail.

Post offices and exchange offices must accept, process, and forward mail bearing the G series stamp if the total postage paid is correct for the class and weight of the mail piece. The mail must not be returned solely because its postage includes one or more of the G stamps.

Resumption of International Surface Mail Service to Gabon

Effective immediately, international surface mail service to Gabon is hereby resumed.

New International Rates And Fees Effective July 9, 1995

Summary of Changes:

1. Surface service for LC items (letters, letter packages, postcards and postal cards) is eliminated. These items will be handled as First-Class Mail in the United States, dispatched by the most expeditious transportation available (usually air), and treated as airmail or priority mail in the destination country. Surface service will continue to be available for AO (printed matter, matter for the blind, and small packets) and parcel post.
2. Country Changes:
 - Serbia and Montenegro are combined as Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia).
 - Kampuchea is changed to Cambodia.
 - East Timor is deleted. (It is part of Indonesia.)
3. The minimum weight for M-Bags is reduced from 15 to 11 pounds.
4. The limit of insurance for many countries is increased.
5. The air AO rate group for Malta is changed to rate group Europe (EU).
6. The air parcel post rate group for Germany is changed to rate group B.
7. Separate rates for surface parcel post, books and sheet music, and publishers' periodicals are established for Mexico.
8. The countries in Express Mail International Service rate group 1 are given country-specific rates. In addition, Japan and China have country-specific rates.
9. The rate structure for International Surface Air Lift (ISAL) is changed to "per-piece" plus "per-pound" rates based on the current country rate groupings. Postage payment methods and procedures are revised to accommodate this change.

The format of Form 3651 changes to expand the rates and weight cells up to 3 ounces for Bulk Letter Service to Canada; the surface reference for letter and cards is removed; new "Parcel Post" and "other" sections are added to allow mailers to report permit imprint mailings of 200 or more parcel post items and to report other nonidentical-weight permit imprint items including M-Bags paid under an

itemized Manifest Mailing System, Optional Procedure, or Alternate Mailing System.

3. The postage calculation section of Forms 3650 and 3650-I reflects a new piece-plus-pound rate structure. M-Bags included in an ISAL mailing are not subject to the piece rate, only the per-pound charge.

Distribution and Requisition

There will be a limited automatic distribution of mailing statements to CAG A through H offices and to the managers of business mail entry units (BMEU). BMEUs should distribute supplies to associate post offices as necessary. Stocks of mailing statements are expected to be available at the MDCs July 7. While supply channels are being stocked, order only quantities necessary to meet post office needs, using Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*. If the automatic distribution does not arrive by the date of rate implementation, copy the appropriate mailing statement in this *Postal Bulletin*.

With the exception of ISAL billing statement Form 3650-I, and the IPA billing statement Form 3652-I, current versions of the mailing statements may be used for 30 days or until new forms are available if the current versions are modified to reflect the new rates. Forms 3650-I and 3652-I will be sent directly to authorized billing customers by the St. Louis Accounting Service Center (ASC).

For **identical weight pieces**, each piece may bear a permit imprint or postage meter for the piece rate. Postage for the pound rate portion may be paid by meter strip attached to the mailing statement, or through the international billing program.

DMM REVISION

Third-Class Mail—Basic Rate Sack Preparation

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M020.1.4f is revised to allow bulk rate third-class mailers to prepare one sectional center facility (SCF) sack containing fewer than 125 addressed pieces or less than 15 pounds of addressed pieces for a 3-digit area served by the origin SCF. Such mail is ineligible for the 3/5 presort rates under DMM E332.2.1a. SCFs are listed in DMM L002, with single 3-digit SCFs marked with three bullets in Column A.

Under current DMM standards, all 3-digit sacks must contain at least 125 pieces or 15 pounds of pieces, and all SCF sacks prepared to SCFs serving multiple 3-digit ZIPs must contain mail for at least two 3-digit areas. When mailers cannot meet these minimums, they must place 3- or 5-digit packages into a state sack. In those instances when mail destined for the origin SCF service area must be placed into a state sack, the mail is first transported to the designated state distribution center, then returned to the origin SCF facility for processing and delivery. As a result, service is delayed.

These changes, which will correct this situation, are consistent with the provisions in current DMM M020.1.4f and DMM M800 that allow mailers to prepare one less-than-full tray for the origin SCF for automation letter-size

mailings. Such trays may contain mail for only one 3-digit area. The DMM revision shown below will appear in DMM Issue 49.

DMM NOTICE

Permit Imprint Revocations

Effective July 9, 1995, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P040.1.6 (renumbered as P040.1.8 and amended earlier by *Postal Bulletin* 21892, dated April 27, 1995, page 6) increases from 12 months to 24 months the period of nonuse allowed for a permit imprint before the Postal Service revokes the authorization.

This revision also eliminates the provision that allowed permit holders to request a 90-day extension if they had not used their permit for 12 consecutive months. This DMM revision makes the period of nonuse before revocation consistent with the period of nonuse before revocation for an authorization to mail at the special bulk third-class rates. The revised text will appear in DMM Issue 49.

1.8 Revocation

A permit may be revoked for use in operating any unlawful scheme or enterprise, for nonuse during any 2-year period, for refusal to provide information about permit imprint use or mailings, or for noncompliance with any standard applicable to permit imprints. The permit holder may make a written appeal to the postmaster within 10 days of receipt of the notice.

DMM NOTICE

Postage Meters

Effective June 30, 1995, with the exception noted in the following paragraph, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P030 is revised as shown below to strengthen controls over the use of postage meters. The DMM revisions are part of an effort to increase the amount of information available to facilitate effective management and control of the meter program to ensure that correct postage is paid, and to minimize meter misuse.

The effective date for the electronic transmission of license applications and centralized application processing is January 2, 1996. Until then, post offices are to continue to accept and process license applications locally. Reference DMM P030.2.1, Procedures, and DMM P030.2.3, Refusal to Issue Meter License. The revised text will appear in DMM Issue 49.

P030 Postage Meters and Meter Stamps**1.0 BASIC INFORMATION****1.1 Description of Meters**

Postage meters can print one or more denominations of postage and display the amount of postage used and the amount remaining. A meter locks when no postage or minimal postage remains. A meter generally must be taken to the licensing post office to be reset by payment for additional postage. Avoiding the payment of postage by misusing a meter is punishable by law.

1.2 Meter Manufacturers

Postage meters are available only by lease from authorized manufacturers. The USPS holds manufacturers responsible for the control, operation, maintenance, and replacement of their meters. The following manufacturers are authorized to lease meters:

1.3 Possession

No one other than an authorized manufacturer may possess a postage meter without a valid USPS meter license and a rental agreement with the meter manufacturer and

until the USPS sets, seals (if applicable), and checks the meter into service. Other parties in possession of a meter must immediately surrender it to the manufacturer or USPS.

* * * * *

1.8 Meter Documentation, Markings, and Endorsements

Unless excepted by standard, a mailing of pieces bearing meter stamp postage must be accompanied by documentation meeting the standards in P012 if the mailing contains nonidentical-weight pieces or pieces without the full correct postage at the applicable rate. Each piece bearing meter postage must show the markings and endorsements required for the rate claimed and any special service requested.

2.0 METER LICENSE**2.1 Procedures**

An applicant wanting to be licensed to lease and use a meter must provide an original signed Form 3601-A to the post office where the applicant intends to deposit metered mail. A meter manufacturer may, on behalf of the applicant, electronically transmit the information requested on Form 3601-A to the designated USPS license application central processing center in USPS-specified format. A single license covers all meters licensed to the same applicant by the same post office, but a separate application must be submitted for each post office where the applicant wants to deposit metered mail. There is no fee for this application and license. After approving an application, the USPS issues a license (Form 3601-B) and one Form 3602-A for each meter checked into service. The use of Form 3602-A is voluntary, but its use supports refunds in the case of meter register malfunctions. If a meter manufacturer transmits the application on behalf of the applicant, the USPS notifies the manufacturer when a license is issued.

2.2 Licensee Agreement

By submitting an application, the licensee agrees that the license may be revoked immediately and the meter removed by the manufacturer or the USPS in these cases: the meter is used in any fraudulent or unlawful scheme or enterprise; the meter is unused during any consecutive 12-month period; the licensee fails to exercise sufficient control of the meter or fails to comply with the standards for meter care or use; or a meter is taken outside the United States, its territories, or its possessions (without written permission by the manager of Retail Systems and Equipment, USPS Headquarters).

2.3 Refusal to Issue Meter License

The USPS may refuse to issue a meter license for these reasons: the applicant submitted false or fictitious information on the license application; within 5 years preceding submission of the application, the applicant violated any standard for the care or use of a meter that resulted in the revocation of that applicant's meter license; or there is sufficient reason to believe that the meter is to be used in violation of the applicable standards. When an application for a license to lease and use meters is refused, the USPS sends the licensee written notice of the reason. If the license application is electronically transmitted to the USPS by a manufacturer on behalf of the applicant, the USPS notifies the manufacturer of the refusal. An applicant refused a meter license may appeal the decision under 2.5.

2.4 Revocation of License

The USPS notifies the licensee in writing of the reasons why the meter license is to be revoked. The USPS also notifies the licensee's meter manufacturer of the revocation so that the manufacturer can cancel the lease agreement and remove the meter from service. Revocation takes 10 days thereafter unless, within that time, the licensee appeals the decision under 2.5. A license is subject to revocation for any of these reasons:

- a. A meter is used for any illegal scheme or enterprise.
- b. The license or licensee's meter is not used for 12 consecutive months.
- c. Sufficient control of a meter is not exercised or the standards for its care or use are not followed.
- d. The meter is kept or used outside the boundaries of the United States or those U.S. territories and possessions where the USPS operates (except as specified in 2.2).
- e. Metered mail is deposited at other than the licensing post office (except as permitted by 5.0 or D072).

2.5 Appeals

An applicant who has been refused a meter license, or a licensee who has had a license revoked, may file a written appeal with the manager of Retail Systems and Equipment (RSE), USPS Headquarters, within 10 calendar days of receipt of the decision. A licensee appealing decisions on postage adjustments may file the appeal with the same official within 60 days of the date that the manufacturer submitted the postage recommendation to the USPS.

2.6 Licensee Responsibilities

The meter licensee's responsibilities for the care and use of a meter include the following:

- a. After a meter is delivered to a licensee, the licensee must keep the meter in the licensee's custody until it is returned to the authorized manufacturer or the licensing post office.
- b. Each day of operation, the licensee may record the readings of the ascending and descending registers on Form 3602-A (except that licensees using metering systems that record these readings electronically may use system-generated printed records of the preceding 12 months of meter activity as a substitute for manual entry of daily readings on Form 3602-A). The licensee may bring Form 3602-A to the post office when the meter is reset or examined.
- c. The licensee must make meters in the licensee's custody and records on meter transactions immediately available for review and audit on request by the USPS or the meter manufacturer.
- d. The licensee must present meters not reset within a 3-month period to the licensing post office for examination. Remote-set meters that are reset at least once every 3 months need be presented for examination only annually. Failure to present a meter for examination as required following notification can result in revocation of the licensee's authorization to lease and use meters.
- e. The licensee must immediately notify the licensing post office and manufacturer's representative of any change in the licensee's name, address, or telephone number, or the location of the meters, or any other information contained on the original Form 3601-A. The USPS thereafter issues a modified meter license reflecting the updated information. The licensee must verify and update license information on a periodic basis as well as following any event that indicates the need to update this information immediately (e.g., billings returned to a meter manufacturer or failure of a manufacturer to locate a meter for inspection).
- f. The licensee must report a misregistering or otherwise defective meter to the manufacturer according to 2.8 and must ensure that the meter is not used.
- g. The licensee must ensure that the cautionary and barcode labels placed onto each meter before its being checked into service are not removed while the meter is in the licensee's possession. The

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cautionary label contains basic reminders on leasing, meter movement, and misuse. The barcode label contains a barcoded representation of the meter serial number. Meters without these labels may not be checked into service.

2.7 Custody of Suspect Meters

Postal inspectors are authorized to conduct unannounced on-site examinations of meters reasonably suspected of being manipulated or otherwise defective. An inspector may also immediately withdraw a suspect meter from service for physical and/or laboratory examination. The inspector issues the licensee a receipt for the meter, forwards a copy to the manufacturer, and, if necessary, assists in obtaining a replacement meter from the meter manufacturer. Where possible, the Inspection Service provides the manufacturer with advance notice that a meter is to be inspected. Unless there is reason to believe that the meter has been fraudulently set with postage, existing postage in the meter to be examined is transferred to the replacement meter.

2.8 Defective Meters

The licensee must immediately report any defective meter to the licensing postmaster and the manufacturer. The manufacturer must pick up any defective meter and take it to the licensing post office to be checked out of service within 3 business days of being notified by the licensee. A faulty meter may not be used under any circumstance, and it must be removed from service when taken to the licensing post office. The manufacturer provides the licensee with a replacement meter.

2.9 Missing Meters

The licensee must immediately report to the licensing postmaster and the manufacturer the loss or theft of any meter or the recovery of any missing meter. Reports must include the meter model and serial number; the date, location, and details of the loss, theft, or recovery; and a copy of any police report.

2.10 Returning Meters

After a meter is delivered to a licensee, the meter must be kept in the licensee's custody until returned to the authorized manufacturer or licensing post office. A licensee with a faulty or misregistering meter or no longer wanting to retain a meter must notify the meter manufacturer's representative of any meter to be returned to the licensing post office to be checked out of service. Meters must be shipped by registered mail unless the manager of RSE, USPS Headquarters, gives written permission to ship meters otherwise.

3.0 SETTING METERS

3.1 Initial Setting

Before delivering a meter to the licensee, the meter manufacturer must take the meter to be set, sealed (if applicable), and checked into service by the post office where it is to be regularly set or examined, unless the meter is serviced through the on-site meter-setting program described in 3.5. The manufacturer must present the postal representative with the meter and a completed Form 3601-C when checking a meter into service.

3.2 Licensee Relocation

If a licensee changes the post office where metered mail is to be deposited, the meter must be checked out of service by the licensing post office. That meter or another meter must be licensed at the new post office before it is reset or initial settings are made. For this standard, a post office includes all subordinate branches and stations of the licensing post office.

3.3 Location of Setting

Except under 3.4 or 3.5, meters must be set at the licensing post office, not at contract stations or branches. Remote-set meters are subject to 3.9 through 3.13 and related standards.

3.4 Alternative Meter Setting Location

The postmaster serving a licensee's location may set a meter used to pay postage on mail presented at another post office, subject to these conditions:

- a. The licensee must obtain a meter license from the post office where the mailing is to be deposited and must present the license to the licensee's local post office with the meter for setting and Form 3602-A, if maintained (or its electronic equivalent).
- b. The postmark die must show the name of the post office of mailing (licensing post office).
- c. A separate meter must be used for mailings made at each post office.
- d. Mail matter sent to another post office for mailing must be shipped on private transportation, to be deposited at the time and place designated by the postmaster. Such matter may not be consigned to the USPS in bulk by freight, express, or other carrier. The USPS has no responsibility for the metered matter before it is accepted in the mail.
- e. When a meter is no longer used, the licensee must return the meter to the manufacturer's representative or licensing post office to have it checked out of service.

3.5 On-Site Meter-Setting Program

The on-site meter-setting program allows USPS employees to set or examine meters at a licensee's place of

business within the area served by the licensing post office. Only the licensee's meters participating in the program may be set or examined at that location. The program also provides for checking meters into or out of service at the meter manufacturer's branch offices, including meters set for use at another post office. A fee is charged for each meter set, examined, or checked into or out of service at a licensee's place of business or at a manufacturer's office, unless a USPS employee (qualified to set meters) is regularly assigned to that licensee's location for postal administrative duties. The licensee must pay on-site setting or examination fees (shown in R900) and postage by check or advance deposit account at the time of the setting or examination.

3.6 Payment for Postage

Payment must be made for postage when the meter is set. Payment may be in cash or by check, money order, or withdrawal from an advance deposit account established with the post office. (Advance deposit accounts may be established when the licensee's monthly metered postage is \$500 or more.) Payment by check or advance deposit account is subject to USPS standards and procedures.

3.7 Postage Transfers and Refunds

Upon USPS verification, unused postage in a meter being checked out of service may be transferred to another of the licensee's meters licensed at the same post office, or the licensee may request a refund, which may include a refund for unused meter stamps according to applicable standards. The meter must be examined by the USPS before a refund or credit is initiated for unused postage or additional postage is collected, based on what is found. The licensee may also submit Form 3602-A, if maintained, or a system-generated register as supporting documentation.

3.8 Postage Adjustments, Misregistering Meters

To request a postage adjustment for a faulty or misregistering meter, the licensee must present to the manufacturer the meter and the licensee's Form 3602-A, if maintained. After examining a meter checked out of service for apparent faulty operation affecting registration, the manufacturer must provide the licensing post office with a report of the malfunction. The report must contain all applicable meter documentation (including a copy of the licensee's Form 3602-A, if maintained, and the licensee's Form 3610 provided by the USPS) and a recommendation about the appropriate postage adjustment. If the electronic redundant memory data, as examined by the manufacturer, is inconclusive about the appropriate postage adjustment, the manufacturer must include an analysis of the licensee's recent mailing history supporting the recommended postage adjustment. (In the absence of a completed Form 3602-A,

the licensee may submit some other reliable evidence showing that a postage adjustment is warranted.) A licensee may appeal a postage adjustment under 2.5.

3.9 Computerized Meter Resetting

The Computerized Remote Postage Meter Resetting System (CMRS) allows certain meters to be reset electronically at the licensee's place of business. CMRS meters must be set at the licensee's place of business, except under 3.11. Before delivering a meter to the licensee, the manufacturer must take the meter and a completed Form 3601-C to the licensing post office to have the meter checked into service, unless the meter is initially checked into service at the manufacturer's office under 3.5.

3.10 Postage Transfer for CMRS Meters

No postage is set by the licensing post office unless a CMRS meter is checked out of service and the unused postage in it is transferred to another CMRS meter leased by the same licensee for use at the same post office.

3.11 Periodic Examination of CMRS Meters

CMRS meters must be reset or examined every 3 months. CMRS meters set at least once every 3 months require examination by a USPS employee only annually. The licensee must take a CMRS meter and applicable Form 3602-A, if maintained, to the licensing post office when notified by the manufacturer of a required examination. A licensee who does not comply with examination requirements may not reset meters via CMRS. Failure to have a meter examined on notification can result in revocation of the licensee's meter license.

3.12 Resetting CMRS Meters

The following conditions must be met for resetting a CMRS meter:

- a. The licensee's account must have sufficient funds to cover the desired postage increment, or the manufacturer must agree to advance funds to the licensee. The licensee may deposit funds by check, electronic funds, or automated clearing-house transfer.
- b. The licensee must provide the manufacturer or designated meter resetting company with the meter serial number, licensee's account number, and the meter's ascending and descending registers.
- c. After a meter is reset, the manufacturer must provide the licensee with documentation of the transaction and the balance remaining in the licensee's account, unless the manufacturer provides a monthly statement documenting all transactions for the period and the balance after each transaction.

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3.13 CMRS Refunds

The USPS issues a refund to a licensee for any unused postage in a meter. Refunds of licensee balances maintained by the USPS in the USPS fund are made to the licensee by the USPS lockbox bank within 48 hours after receipt of a licensee's request.

4.0 METER STAMPS

4.1 Designs

Meter stamp designs (types, sizes, and styles) must be those specified when a meter is approved by the USPS for manufacture (see Exhibit 4.1).

6.0 METER MANUFACTURE AND DISTRIBUTION

Title 39, Code of Federal Regulations, part 501, contains information about the authorization to manufacture and distribute meters; the suspension and revocation of such authorization; performance standards required in meters, test plans, testing, and approval of meters; required manufacturing security measures; and standards for the distribution and maintenance of meters. Further information may be obtained from Retail Systems and Equipment, USPS Headquarters.

CORRECTION

Z4CHANGE

The following Z4CHANGE standards, effective immediately, are in addition to the standards noted in *Postal Bulletin* 21893, dated May 11, 1995 ("Z4CHANGE—Address Matching Alternative," page 12). These additional standards were inadvertently omitted from the original article.

As stated in the above-mentioned article, any mailer who uses Z4CHANGE must first process the appropriate address list(s) through current Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) certified address matching and coding software. This list processing must be repeated at least once every 3 years if the mailer continues to use the Z4CHANGE option. The mailer must also submit a copy of PS Form 3553, *Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS) Summary Report*, produced from this initial address list processing to the National Customer Support Center (NCSC) in Memphis, TN. If the mailer continues, in subse-

quent years, to use the Z4CHANGE address matching alternative, the mailer must submit Form 3553 to the NCSC every 3 years on completion of the address list(s) reprocessing requirement.

To ensure compliance with existing address quality standards, any mailer using Z4CHANGE to qualify for specific postage rates is subject to an annual evaluation of the matching and coding process used. For this evaluation, the Postal Service will provide the mailer with a test tape containing ZIP+4 codes. The mailer must then process the codes through his or her Z4CHANGE software and return the tape to NCSC for review.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Processing Contractual Documentation

Each year the Postal Service purchases a variety of goods and services from many suppliers. Prompt payment to contractors and vendors for these goods and services involves (1) timely distribution of receiving reports by Purchasing and Materials to receiving activities, and (2) the receiving activities' prompt completion and submission of reports upon receipt of those goods or services. Failure to adhere to these guidelines has resulted in the loss of prompt payment discounts and delays in processing payments to contractors and vendors. It has also resulted in Prompt Payment Act Interest Payments to vendors. By promptly processing contractual documentation, the Postal Service will avoid this unnecessary interest cost and maintain good relations with suppliers.

To meet this commitment, all contract documents and receiving reports must be processed quickly, accurately, and efficiently. Invoices and receiving reports must not be held at any point in the payment line. All necessary certifications must be affixed to the documentation and forwarded on to the next destination no later than 5 working

days after receipt. The following steps must be taken to ensure prompt processing:

- Date stamp (with the date received at the facility) all contract documentation (invoices, delivery tickets, etc.).
- Act on all the documentation immediately, by either:
 - approving and sending the documentation forward, or
 - promptly resolving any irregularities.

Helping Customers Who Object to Sexually Oriented Advertising in Their Mail

Customers who are offended by unwanted sexually oriented advertising received in the mail, and those who are concerned about their minor children's exposure to such advertising, may contact their local post office for help. The following two Postal Service programs can help customers protect themselves and their children from advertising matter in the mail that they find objectionable:

- The sexually oriented advertising (SOA) prohibitory list. This list protects customers and their minor children from receiving through the mail unsolicited sexually oriented advertisements as defined in title 39, United States Code.
- The prohibitory order. This order protects customers from receiving pandering advertisements through the mail. The addressee may obtain a prohibitory order against the mailer of an advertisement that the addressee determines, in his or her sole discretion, to be offering matter for sale that is erotically arousing or sexually provocative.

SOA Prohibitory List

The SOA prohibitory list protects customers from receiving sexually oriented advertisements as defined in 39 U.S.C. 3010. This statute makes it unlawful for anyone to

mail such an advertisement to any individual whose name and address have been on the list for more than 30 days.

The Postal Service sells the database of the SOA prohibitory list to companies that mail sexually oriented advertisements so that customers whose names appear on the list can be deleted from these companies' mailing lists. It is the mailer's responsibility to ensure that no unsolicited SOA is sent to any person on the SOA prohibitory list. Violators may be subject to civil or criminal penalties.

Customers may add their names and addresses to the list by completing at any post office Form 2201, *Application for Listing (Pursuant to 39 USC 3010)*. All post offices and classified stations and branches must maintain a supply of the January 1993 edition of Form 2201.

Because being added to the list does not depend on having received a sexually oriented advertisement, applicants do not submit mailpieces with their completed Forms 2201. Postmasters should advise customers to keep part 1 of Form 2201 (the top half of the form) and to use the application number if it is later necessary to report a violation to the Postal Service.

Postmasters must send all completed Forms 2201 at least once each week to the National Customer Support Center. (Completed Forms 2201 must not be sent to the

Postal Inspection Service.) The forms must be mailed to the following address for the addition of names to the SOA prohibitory list:

A customer's name and address remain on the list for 5 years, unless the customer asks to be removed from the list sooner. The names and addresses of minor children are removed from the list when they reach 19 years of age. Each application pertains to only one address. If a customer moves and receives unwanted sexually oriented mail at the new address, he or she must file an additional Form 2201.

A customer who receives unsolicited SOA more than 30 days after placement on the list may submit the entire mailpiece, including the envelope or wrapper, to any postmaster. The mailpiece must be opened by the addressee who must endorse the envelope or wrapper and contents with the signed statement "I received the mailpiece on [date]."

The postmaster of the installation to which the mailpiece is submitted must send it without delay to the office of the inspector in charge who has geographical jurisdiction over the address of the mailer. A listing of inspectors in charge and the areas that they serve can be found in section 11 of Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*.

Step-by-step instructions for processing Forms 2201 appear below. More information on sexually oriented advertisements can be found in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C032.

Prohibitory Order

By completing Form 2150, *Notice of Prohibitory Order Against Sender of Pandering Advertisement in the Mails*, an addressee who receives an advertisement by mail,

whether solicited or unsolicited, offering for sale a product or service that he or she determines, in his or her sole discretion, to be erotically arousing or sexually provocative may obtain a prohibitory order directing the mailer to refrain from making further mailings to him or her.

The completed Form 2150 must be accompanied by the advertisement on which the application is based. The addressee may include his or her minor children under 19 years of age and residing with him or her in the application. Although a legible signed statement providing all the information as Form 2150 is acceptable in place of the postal-provided form, all postmasters should maintain an adequate supply of Forms 2150. Postmasters may not refuse to accept a Form 2150 because the advertisement in question does not appear to be sexually oriented. Only the addressee may make that determination.

While customers' applications for prohibitory orders may be submitted to any post office, station, or branch, each completed Form 2150 and related advertisement for action must be forwarded by the accepting employee to the district manager serving the addressee's delivery address. Completed Forms 2150 must not be sent to the Postal Inspection Service. The district is responsible for reviewing the request and, if appropriate, issuing a prohibitory order.

If a customer protected by a prohibitory order receives a sexually oriented mailpiece 30 days after the mailer received the prohibitory order, the customer should open the envelope or other outside cover, write on the mailpiece the number of the prohibitory order (if known), a statement indicating receipt by mail, the date of receipt, and the recipient's signature. The customer may submit the mailpiece to any postmaster, who must forward it for action to the district manager serving the addressee's delivery address.

Step-by-step instructions for processing Forms 2150 appear on page 70. More information about pandering advertisements and prohibitory orders can be found in DMM C033.

Instructions for Processing Form 2201, Application for Listing (Pursuant to 39 USC 3010)

1. Customer reports that he or she does not wish to receive any unwanted sexually oriented advertisement as defined in DMM C032.1.2.
2. Customer obtains Form 2201 from any post office.
3. Customer completes Form 2201, retains part 1 for future reference, and submits part 2 to any post office for action.
4. Postmaster or accepting employee ensures that Form 2201 is properly completed (including signature).

5. On no less than a weekly basis, accepting postmaster sends Forms 2201 to:

6. If the customer presents mail he or she believes was sent in violation of his or her listed status, the postmaster or accepting employee ensures that the customer has opened the mailpiece and written on both the exterior and all of the contents a signed statement of having received the mail and the date of receipt.
7. Postmaster or accepting employee sends this evidence of possible violation to the postal inspector in charge of the division having geographical jurisdiction over the address of the mailer.

Instructions for Processing Form 2150, Notice of Prohibitory Order Against Sender of Pandering Advertisement in the Mails

1. Customer receives an unwanted advertising mailpiece offering for sale matter that he or she considers erotically arousing or sexually provocative.
2. Customer obtains Form 2150 from any post office.
3. Customer completes Form 2150 and submits it along with the entire opened mailpiece to any post office.
4. Postmaster or accepting employee ensures that the Form 2150 is complete (including signature) and accompanied by the advertising mailpiece.
5. Postmaster sends the Form 2150 and accompanying mailpiece to the district manager serving the customer's address.
6. If the customer presents mail he or she believes was sent in violation of a prohibitory order, the postmaster or accepting employee ensures that the customer has opened the mailpiece and written on its exterior the prohibitory number (if known), a signed statement of having received the mail, and the date of receipt.
7. Postmaster or accepting employee sends this evidence of possible violation to the district manager serving the complainant's address.
