CORRECTION: NOTICE TO FINANCE AND INJURY COMPENSATION OFFICES

## Revision of Form 202

The following is a correction to the notice that was published in *Postal Bulletin* 21901, dated August 31, 1995.

Form 202, *Health Benefits Refund Payment Authorization*, has been revised (September 1995). The revised form is now electronically generated by the Workers' Compensation Information System (WCIS), which will be on line and available for use September 6, 1995.

This WCIS-generated Form 202 is the *only* authorized method for reimbursing injured employees for an overdeduction of health benefits premiums by the office of Workers' Compensation Programs (OWCP) in accordance with postal policy (see ELM 525.132).

A sample of the new Form 202 is shown below.

### Injury Compensation Offices

Starting in September 1995, to reimburse injured employees for an overdeduction of health benefits premiums, injury compensation offices will:

1. Generate Form 202, *Health Benefits Refund Payment Authorization*, in WCIS.
2. Certify this report for payment.
3. Make copies of the form for Finance, the employee, the employee's official personnel folder (OPF), and the Injury Compensation Control Office file.
4. Submit the certified Form 202 to Finance.

### Finance Offices

Finance offices must not process any previous editions of Form 202 after Pay Period 18, September 1, 1995. Accept only the WCIS-generated Form 202, dated September 1995, for refund of insurance premiums for postal employees per ELM 525.132.

PUBLICATION 41 REVISION

**Approval for Proposed Purchase Actions**

The USPS Procurement Manual (Pub 41) has been revised to further define higher-level review and approval requirements for proposed purchase actions that exceed a contracting officer's delegation of authority and certain other high-dollar-level purchases that require the review and approval of the Vice President of Purchasing and Materials.

Effective immediately, Pub 41 1.5.3.e is revised as follows.

**Publication 41, USPS Procurement Manual**

**1.5.3 Contracting Officers**

\* \* \* \* \*

1.5.3.e *Reviews and Approvals.* Prior review and written approval by a contracting officer with the required contract-

ing authority must be obtained whenever the dollar amount of the proposed purchase or the potential liability (including termination cost liability) of a proposed contract action exceeds the contracting officer's delegated authority. Exhibit 1.5.3e, *Review and Approval Thresholds*, sets out actions involved with certain high-dollar-value purchases which require the prior review and approval of the VP, P&M, even though the contract amount may be within the contracting officer's authority.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. For policy and information on Postal Service support in efforts to recover missing children, see *Postal Bulletin* 21536, page 1, October 17, 1985.

Missing Children Posters are available for the U.S. Postal Service only through periodic issues of the *Postal Bulletin*.

## National Business Partners' Program

From October 5 through November 30, 1995, and January 2 through February 29, 1996, the U.S. Postal Service will implement the National Business Partners' Program for developing working relationships between its Postal Business Centers (PBCs) and local service vendors. This program should generate additional business activity in mailing-related industries while increasing awareness of postal products and services. The Business Partners' Program includes a seminar on postal products and services that is required for vendors interested in participating. This seminar provides vendors with a better understanding of how the PBCs can support their efforts to expand business.

The Postal Service has developed the National Business Partners' Program as a means of identifying local service vendors who can help potential business mailers learn how to benefit from using the mail, lower their postage costs, and prepare their mail more efficiently. Relationships with business partners have been successfully established at the national and local level. The objective of the Postal Service is to develop and maintain these relationships in order to increase mail volume and mutual revenues.

The Business Partners' Program is available through the Postal Service's network of Postal Business Centers in 100 locations nationwide. Prospective partners are third-party vendors who can offer business mailers such services as printing, presorting, prebarcoding, addressing, and direct mail marketing. Business partners are strong influencers of the customer base of the Postal Service and are frequently stakeholders in the entire postal distribution and delivery process. Postal Business Centers are currently identifying local vendors and mailing to them information about the program.

The program requires vendors to attend a three-part seminar that covers mailpiece design, basics of postage discount programs, and value-added products and services. Participation in the seminar enhances a vendor's knowledge of postal products and mailing requirements, while developing a working relationship with the local Postal Business Centers. Each participant in the program will receive a seminar certificate, valid for 1 year. Participation in a Business Partners' seminar costs \$40 for each attendee. Group rates and on-site rates are also available.

After completing the seminar, participating vendors become eligible to be listed in a local Business Partners' directory. Customers seeking assistance in fulfilling their mailing needs can use the directory as a reference to find vendors that specialize in mailing-related services. These directories will be distributed at scheduled Ad Mail and other customer education seminars. The validation period for a directory listing will be 1 calendar year, and vendors will be required to attend the three-part seminar every year to maintain a listing in the directory.

The Business Partners' program is one of many services provided by the Postal Business Centers for local business mailers. Consultants are on hand at the Postal Business Centers to help mailers learn how to qualify for discounted postage rates and use the postal system more efficiently.

## Treasury Department Checks

October Supplemental Security income checks and Veteran's Administration compensation and pension checks, normally delivered on the first of the month, are scheduled for delivery on Friday, September 29, 1995. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 29th day of the month

Civil Service annuity and Railroad Retirement checks are scheduled for delivery on Monday, October 2, 1995. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 1st day of the month or the first delivery date thereafter

Social Security benefit checks normally delivered on the third of the month are scheduled for delivery on the normal delivery date of Tuesday, October 3, 1995. The envelopes will bear the legend:

Postmaster: Requested delivery date is the 3rd day of the month

## Prescription Medicines Loose in the Mail

Because the delivery of prescription medicines is generally time-sensitive, they require prompt and special attention.

Thus, containers of prescription medicines found loose in the mail must be immediately rewrapped and sent to the addressee, annotating that it was damaged in handling by the Postal Service (in accordance with normal procedures). If the addressee's address cannot be determined, the container should be immediately rewrapped and returned to the sender or referred to the appropriate mail recovery center if the return address cannot be determined. At no time should containers without a clearly identified addressee be combined with other containers going to an addressee.

REVISION TO HANDBOOKS F-10, F-11, AND F-12

## Changes in the Use of GTS Travel Account for Transportation

On September 16, 1995, restrictions will go into effect on the use of the travel account of the government travel system (GTS) to obtain transportation tickets. The restrictions include:

### Relocation Travel

Use your government credit card (American Express) or your personal funds to obtain transportation tickets for yourself and your eligible family members. Do not charge transportation tickets for relocation to the GTS corporate travel account. This will ensure that relocation expenses are properly reported and recorded and meet Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations.

### Nonrelocation Travel

- **Bargaining unit employees:** Continue to charge your transportation tickets to the corporate account for nonrelocation travel (travel for training, details, etc.).
- **Nonbargaining employees:** Use your individual government credit card (American Express) or your personal funds to obtain transportation tickets from the USPS-authorized travel agency for all travel (training, details, business trips, etc.).

Effective immediately, Handbooks F-10, *Travel Policy*, F-11, *PCES Relocation Policy*, and F-12, *Relocation Policy*, are revised as follows.

### Handbook F-10, Travel Policy

#### 320 Obtaining Common Carrier Transportation by the Government Card Program

#### 321 Government Card Program

\* \* \* \* \*

**321.31 Nonbargaining employees.** Use your individual government credit card or personal funds to obtain transportation, lodging, and other travel-related services for official business. To meet the requirement to obtain the best fare or rate available, you may need to use your individual government credit card (for example, government rate airfares, according to the GSA contract, must be charged to the government credit card).

**321.32 Bargaining unit employees.** Use the GTS to obtain the following:

- Nonrelocation transportation via common carrier for official business.

- Authorized nonrelocation travel of a spouse or employee's immediate family member (for example, spouse travel in lieu of an employee's intermediate return trip home for employees on extended travel).

Note: Do not charge transportation for relocation to the GTS corporate account.

  - Non-PCES managers who are direct reports to vice presidents or other PCES executives

## Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-18

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail post-

age (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 Code).

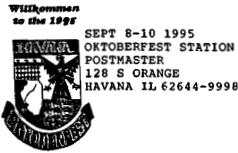

**The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps, 22nd Edition**

The new 22nd edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, Item 8895, is available in late September at all philatelic centers, post offices that sell philatelic products, and by mail order from the Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center.

All locations may place the new edition of the guide on sale when supplies are available but not before September 29, 1995. Offices are encouraged to promote the new edition of the guide during National Stamp Collecting Month in October.

The new 22nd edition of the guide features over 20 additional pages, more than 100 new illustrations, hundreds of new listings and prices, plus new features and stamp-

related facts. Priced at \$10.95, the 456-page guide includes lists of market-based values for all U.S. used and unused stamps and for many valuable stamp errors. In addition, the guide contains more than 2,000 full-color stamp illustrations; extensive lists of philatelic organizations, publications, and resources; and a wealth of basic stamp collecting information. These features make it a valuable tool for beginning, intermediate, and advanced collectors, and it is still one of the best bargains in the hobby.

The printing contractor for the guide will ship the books (which are accountable items) in cartons of 40 to stamp

distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs). All offices must verify that they received the quantities of the guide recorded on their Advice of Shipment. Installations should report any differences between the quantities shown on the Advice of Shipment and those actually received using the procedure outlined in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 426.3.

All post offices that want supplies of the 22nd edition of the guide (Item 8895) should immediately place initial orders with their SDOs using Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, or with their SDNs using Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*. SDOs and SDNs should exercise prudence in filling orders and avoid unreasonable requests for excessive quantities.

Promotional copies of the guide *will not* be distributed. Any office can now display the guide by simply removing a copy from their inventory for promotional use. Follow the procedures outlined in the article "Stock for Promotions and Presentations," *Postal Bulletin* 21886, February 2, 1995, page 21.

The vinyl covers, distributed to post offices last year for displaying the guide, are designed to be reused with each new edition. All CAG A–G offices, however, will receive a replacement vinyl cover in which to place a copy of the guide to update their lobby display. Instructions for obtaining additional vinyl display covers will be published in a future *Postal Bulletin*. Offices that display the 22nd edition of the guide must ensure that it reflects the new sale price of \$10.95.

Offices should report all sales of these books in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales.

### Guide to U.S. Stamps, 21st Edition

As the 22nd edition of the guide becomes available, offices must withhold all remaining copies of the 21st edition of the guide (Item 8894) from sale and take the following actions:

1. *Retail Outlets*. Collect any copies of the 21st edition of the guide from stamp credits. Immediately return them to main stock using Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.
2. *Post Offices*. Consolidate all remaining copies of the 21st edition of the guide, if any, into the main stock. *Hold them for return to the SDO or SDN during the week of October 9*. List the quantity and value of the returned stock on Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, or Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*; record the value in AIC 501, Postage Stock. Shipped; and reduce the stamp accountability accordingly. The name and finance number of the SDO or SDN, as well as that of the shipping office, must be on Form 17.
3. *Stamp Distribution Offices and Stamp Distribution Networks*. Record the value of all copies of the 21st edition of the guide received in AIC 005, Postage Stock Received, and increase stamp accountability accordingly.
4. *Local Office Philatelic Programs*. Submit Form 17 or Form 17-S for the number of 21st editions of the guide (Item 8894) needed for philatelic/promotional programs. One or more copies may be given to local schools, libraries, student groups, stamp clubs, retirement homes, etc. Note that the quantities available are limited. Stamp all copies of the guide used in promoting philatelic programs NOT FOR RE-SALE. The custodian of accountable paper attests that each item is so stamped and prepares Form 3238, *Stamps and Stamped Paper Destruction Certificate*, endorsed PHILATELIC PRODUCTS GIVEN TO PHILATELIC PROGRAMS. Program coordinators acknowledge receipt of Item 8894 and are responsible for its control. Note that this is an exception to general guidelines for destruction of accountable items, especially regarding obsolete (withdrawn from sale) items. In this instance, it is USPS policy *not to destroy* copies of the previous year's edition when they can be used for valid promotional and/or educational purposes.

### Disposition

Dispose of all remaining copies of the 21st edition of the guide (Item 8894) in accordance with Handbook F-1, section 450. Because disposition instructions are issued annually for past issues of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, offices should have only the 22nd edition in inventory after completing the above procedures. If previous editions are on hand, offices should dispose of them immediately, in accordance with Handbook F-1, section 450.
