### Combined Federal Campaign


Nationally, U.S. Postal Service employees contributed more than \$25 million to local, national, and international service organizations last year through the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC).

## Environmental/Purchasing Policies for Paper and Paper Products

On October 20, 1993, President Clinton signed Executive Order (EO) 12873 regarding Federal Acquisition, Recycling, and Waste Prevention. Although the EO does not apply to the Postal Service, we have, for business and environmental reasons, voluntarily adopted portions of this EO as postal policy. Specifically, we are revising the purchasing policies and the specifications for paper and paper products so that a price preference, when desirable, is given for paper and paper products containing recycled material.

Purchases of paper and paper products must meet or exceed the following minimum materials content standards unless (1) they are not available competitively within a reasonable time frame, (2) they do not meet appropriate performance standards, or (3) they are only available at an unreasonable price.

1. The recycled content standard will be a minimum of 20 percent for high speed copier paper, offset paper, forms bond, computer printout paper, carbonless paper, file folders, and white woven envelopes, assuming all performance requirements are satisfied.
2. The minimum recycled content standard for uncoated printing and writing paper, such as writing and office paper, book paper, cotton fiber paper, and cover stock, will be 50 percent recycled material, including a minimum of 20 percent postconsumer materials.
3. Products containing cardboard will have a minimum of 30 percent postconsumer recycled content material.

To facilitate this effort, and at the discretion of requirements organizations, a price premium of up to 10 percent

may be paid for the purchase of recycled content paper or paper products. The price premium can be computed by adding an adjustment factor of 10 percent to the proposal offering virgin paper. If a tie results between a proposal for virgin and a recycled content proposal, the recycled content proposal must be selected for award.


Requirements organizations should also (1) review existing specifications to consider elimination of virgin material requirements, (2) specify use of recovered materials, (3) use life cycle costing methods, including disposal costs, and (4) specify for purchase of environmentally friendly products.

Finally, to achieve savings that would more than offset the additional costs, the following waste reduction techniques should be used to the maximum extent possible:

- Reduce the number of hard copies for all documents.
- Use two-sided copying for all documents.
- Use cc:Mail for draft reviews and final distributions.
- Use cc:Mail for business communications.
- Request contract deliverables and reports to be on disk.
- Strive to reduce paperwork and unnecessary copies in general.

# DOMESTIC MAIL

PUBLICATION 417 REVISION

## Special Bulk Third-Class Eligibility Restrictions

Postal Bulletin 21893 (May 11, 1995) contained the new content-based rules that will be effective October 1 for special bulk third-class mail. The Postal Service has revised Publication 417, *Special Bulk Third-Class Eligibility — Nonprofit and Other Qualified Organizations*, dated October 1995. This publication contains information that will aid authorized organizations in determining whether their mailpieces qualify for mailing at the special bulk third-class rates.

Publication 417 was automatically distributed to all post offices. If additional copies are required, they can be ordered from the material distribution centers by citing PUB 417, or PSN 7610-02-000-9159. Only the quantity needed should be ordered so that sufficient copies will be available for other post offices that need additional copies.

## Termination of Free Mail Privileges for Armed Forces and Department of Defense Civilians

Effective immediately, the Secretary of Defense has terminated free mailing privileges for members of the Armed Forces and Department of Defense civilians in the areas listed below:

- Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates, and the waters adjacent thereto to include the Arabian Gulf, Eastern Mediterranean Sea, Gulf of Aden, North Arabian Sea, and the Red Sea.
- Egypt, Israel, Northern Iraq, and Southern Turkey.
- The countries of and waters surrounding Djibouti, Kenya, and Somalia.

- Rwanda and the adjacent areas of Burundi, Uganda, and Zaire.

There is an exception to the free mail termination. Free mail privileges will remain in effect for personnel in support of Operation Provide Comfort located in Zakho, which is south of the Turkish border in the no-fly zone of northern Iraq.

Free mail privileges continue in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba; Haiti; and the former Republic of Yugoslavia.

## Political Campaign Mail

*Postal Operations Manual* (POM) Issue 6, section 454, Political Campaign Mail, is revised to include miscellaneous clarifications. In particular, material has been added to Section 454.7 regarding what may be mailed under the special bulk third-class rates by qualified political committees. Issue 7 of the POM will include this revision.

Field managers must understand their responsibilities as described in this instruction in connection with political campaign mailings sent and received within their jurisdiction, and take actions accordingly. Following is the POM 454 revision.

### 454 Political Campaign Mail

#### 454.1 Introduction

##### 454.11 General

The American electorate votes on numerous political offices and issues. Citizens cast ballots every 4 years for president, every 2 years for one-third of the U.S. senators and all members of the House of Representatives, and at varying frequencies for governorships and other state, county, and local offices and referenda measures. During the period preceding local, state, and national primaries, special elections, and general elections, the Postal Service accepts and delivers many political campaign mailings, frequently in large quantities. These mailings are made up by individual candidates and their campaign organizations, as well as by local, state, and national committees of political parties.

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#### **454.12 Postal Service Responsibility**

The Postal Service is responsible for providing information to assist in the knowledgeable preparation and deposit of political campaign mailings, as well as for the proper acceptance, processing, delivery, and recording of these mailings.

#### **454.13 Special Bulk Third-Class Rates**

Section 3626(e) of Title 39, U.S. Code, as enacted by Public Law 95-593, permits bulk third-class matter to be mailed by a "qualified political committee" at the special bulk third-class rates prescribed for qualified nonprofit organizations (see DMM E370.3.0 and E370.5.9). Also see 454.23 for a definition of "qualified political committee" and 454.73 for the rules on what mail may be sent at the special bulk third-class rates by qualified political committees.

#### **454.2 Definitions**

##### **454.21 Political Campaign Mailings**

Any material accepted for mailing at First-Class or third-class postage rates that is mailed for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, or committee of a political party is classified as a political campaign mailing. This type of mailing normally uses the address of a candidate's campaign committee or the committee of a political party as the return address. Do not confuse political campaign mailings with official mailings by members of Congress under congressional franking privileges. See 453 for a discussion of congressional mail.

##### **454.22 Registered Political Candidate or Party**

An individual or organization recognized as such by the appropriate governmental election control authority is considered to be a registered political candidate or party.

##### **454.23 Qualified Political Committee**

Section 3626(e)(2) of Title 39, U.S.C., defines a qualified political committee for the purpose of eligibility for special bulk third-class rates as follows:

- a. The term *qualified political committee* means:
  - (1) A national committee of a political party.
  - (2) A state committee of a political party.
  - (3) The Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.
  - (4) The Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee.
  - (5) The National Republican Congressional Committee.
  - (6) The National Republican Senatorial Committee.
- b. The term *national committee* means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is

responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the national level.

- c. The term *state committee* means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the state level.

#### **454.3 Premailing Assistance**

##### **454.31 General**

Experience has shown that there will be no cause for criticism if all mailers of political campaign material are fully informed of postal requirements for prompt delivery and are assured of proper and equal handling of their mailings.

##### **454.32 Responsibilities**

Managers, Customer Service Support, Customer Service and Sales districts, are responsible for ensuring proper premailing assistance to all committees of political parties, candidates for political office, and/or the candidates' campaign committees within their jurisdictions. Individuals designated by managers, Customer Service Support, as directly responsible for contacting the committees of political parties, political candidates, and campaign organizations must follow the requirements in 454.36.

##### **454.33 Identification of Candidates**

Managers, Customer Service Support, and managers, Customer Service and Sales districts, or their designees, must identify all candidates for election to political office who will be campaigning within their district's jurisdiction, as follows:

- a. *Presidential Candidates.* Contact state campaign headquarters. Determine locations of mailings and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- b. *Congressional Candidates.* Identify all candidates for election to the Senate and House of Representatives and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- c. *State Candidates.* In statewide elections, identify gubernatorial and other candidates and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- d. *Local Candidates.* Coordinate efforts with postmasters to identify all candidates and/or campaign organizations in those areas holding local elections for county, city, township, borough, parish, and other local offices, and ensure necessary follow-up.

##### **454.34 Political Campaign Information Sources**

State and local boards of election and offices of secretaries of state and county clerks generally can provide information on the names and headquarters of committees of political parties, candidates for federal, state, and local offices, and their campaign organizations.

#### 454.35 Equal Assistance

Equal assistance must be provided to all committees of political parties, candidates, and candidates' campaign committees, including those that do not represent major parties.

#### 454.36 Premailing Contact Requirements

Make contact with the committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations at the earliest opportunity to provide information on mail preparation requirements, mail handling procedures, and other matters discussed in 454.37. On-site assistance can be helpful, particularly with campaign volunteers, to identify problems in mail preparation and sack or tray labeling before deposit of the mailings. Emphasize the need to deposit the mailings at the earliest possible date before election day, particularly to candidates or organizations planning to avail themselves of the destination bulk mail center drop shipment rates. Keep records of all contacts, including a general summary statement covering the information provided to the candidates and campaign organizations.

#### 454.37 Mail Preparation and Handling Information

At a minimum, provide committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations with information on the following:

- a. Rates, including automation and destination entry drop shipment rates, and fees.
- b. Mailing permits and authorizations. See applicable sections of the DMM for instructions on obtaining permits and authorizations for mailing at various rates. National and state political committees may be given instructions on filing for special bulk third-class rates as a qualified political committee, as found in DMM E370. Instructions on obtaining authorization to mail at the special bulk third-class rates at additional offices are found in DMM E370.8.0.
- c. Restrictions on what may be mailed at the special bulk third-class rates for state and national political committees (see 454.73). See also 5-4, Political Committee Mailings, in Publication 417, *Special Bulk Third-Class Eligibility*.
- d. Preparation, makeup, and handling of mailings, including an explanation of endorsements, such as "Return Postage Guaranteed" and "Address Correction Requested," and address information products and services.
- e. Availability and use of mailing supplies and equipment.

► **Note:** Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*, identifies sacked and trayed campaign mailings during mail processing. Tag 57 is available from the material distribution centers and is reusable. When mail is trayed, the

mailers should place Tag 57 vertically in front of the mail.

- f. Business reply mail.
- g. Disposition of undeliverable pieces.
- h. Time frames for depositing mailings.

#### 454.4 Processing and Delivery

##### 454.41 General

All managers involved in processing and delivering political campaign mailings must ensure that each mailing is handled promptly and with equal care and attention.

##### 454.42 Late Deposit

Inform mailers who are attempting to deposit political campaign mailings that may be too late for delivery by the election date under USPS service objectives that their mailings may not be delivered by the election date.

##### 454.43 Reports of Delays

Give immediate attention to any reported delay in processing or delivering political campaign mailings and fully document inquiries made and subsequent action taken (see 454.53).

##### 454.5 Recordkeeping

##### 454.51 General

Detailed records provide the basis for a documented and factual explanation of any complaints alleging improper handling of political campaign mailings. Maintain premailing assistance and processing and delivery records for a period of 6 months.

##### 454.52 Premailing Assistance Records

Individuals designated to provide premailing assistance to committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations must keep records of all contacts, including a summary statement concerning the information provided to such mailers.

##### 454.53 Processing and Delivery Records

Managers, Business Mail Entry, and postmasters must keep documented records of all political campaign mailings that are deposited or received at their offices, with particular attention to those deposited or received too late for timely delivery. At a minimum, these documented records must include the following:

- a. The name of the mailer.
- b. A sample, photocopy, or description of the mailing.
- c. The date and time the mailing was received for dispatch or delivery.
- d. The election day deadline and, if applicable, the date of requested delivery.
- e. If applicable, the approximate number of pieces not delivered before the election day deadline and/or the

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date of requested delivery and the reasons why delivery was not timely.

- f. The approximate volume of any third-class mail consigned to waste upon instruction by the mailer.

#### **454.6 Answering Requests for Information**

##### **454.61 General**

Answer requests for information concerning political campaign mailings as provided in regulations implementing the Freedom of Information Act (see ASM 352). Do not compile information not regularly compiled for Postal Service use to respond to requests.

##### **454.62 Chief Field Counsel Assistance**

If uncertain regarding the disclosure of information concerning political campaign mailings, consult the appropriate Chief Field Counsel.

##### **454.63 Questionable Requests**

Promptly report to the Postal Inspection Service any questionable attempts to obtain information concerning political campaign mailings not properly subject to disclosure.

#### **454.7 Revenue Protection**

##### **454.71 Special Bulk Third-Class Rates**

Qualified political committees may mail at the special bulk third-class rates of postage. See section 454.23 for definitions of qualified political committees. See also DMM E370.3.0 and E370.5.9 for general information on special bulk rate eligibility.

##### **454.72 Mailings Ineligible for Special Bulk Third-Class Rates**

Individual candidates and their campaign committees do not qualify to mail at the special rates. Also, qualified political committees may mail only their own matter at the special rates. Qualified political committees may not make cooperative mailings at the special rates involving matter on behalf of, or produced for, individual candidates or political organizations that do not qualify for special rates. Such cooperative mailings must be paid at the applicable regular third-class rate of postage. See Form 3602-N, Form 3602-PC, and Form 3602-PVN for the certifications required of special bulk rate mailers. Also see 5-4, Political Committee Mailings, in Publication 417, *Special Bulk Third-Class Eligibility*.

##### **454.73 Application of the Cooperative Mail Rules**

###### **454.731 General**

Qualified political committees are subject to the cooperative mailing requirements. However, unlike cases involving cooperative mailings between an authorized nonprofit organization and a commercial organization, there is often an ongoing relationship between the qualified political com-

mittee and the committee's candidate. A political candidate may be connected to the authorized political committee mailer by being a member of and/or financial contributor to the political party represented by the committee. The committee is, of course, interested in promoting, encouraging, and supporting the candidate's election. Postal laws and regulations do not prohibit the candidate from contributing to the committee or the committee from supporting the candidate. The concern under postal laws and regulations is whether the political candidate's financial contribution to the authorized political committee is in return for the mailing or mailings that support the candidate.

##### **Example — Proper use of contributed funds**

- ▶ Politician A is a member of the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee plans to include in a mailpiece information supporting politician A's candidacy for office and has asked the candidate for a biographical sketch. The candidate provides the information and makes a contribution to the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee will retain authority to accept or reject information provided by the candidate, and the contribution by the candidate is not a contribution to pay for the mailing. This is not considered to be a cooperative mailing since the qualified political committee retained discretion over the decision to mail and the contents of the mailing.

##### **454.732 Maintaining Committee Control**

The following rules must be followed to ensure that the authorized political committee maintains control:

- a. *Mailings.* An authorized political committee may mail election-related materials, including but not limited to candidate endorsements and sample ballots, at the special bulk third-class rates if the materials are exclusively those of the authorized political committee. An authorized political committee may make political mailings in support of its candidates, provided that no monies contributed by the candidate to the qualified committee shall be specifically earmarked for use in making the political mailing or in return for the political mailing.

##### **Example — Committee discretion retained**

- ▶ Politician B, a candidate for a statewide political office, mails a check to authorized political committee C, the state committee for his party. Politician B encloses a note with the check that says: "This check is for my pro rata share of a sample ballot." Committee C has mailed a sample ballot to state residents for the past five elections. However, committee C makes the decision on whether to send sample ballots on an election-by-election basis. Committee C has not had any discussions with politician B on this subject, nor has it reached an understanding with politician B that



sample ballots will be produced and mailed. Committee C deposits politician B's check into its general fund to be used for committee expenses. Committee C will not return the check even if it decides not to mail sample ballots. Committee C later decides to mail sample ballots for the election in which politician B is a candidate. Notwithstanding politician B's contribution, this is not considered to be a cooperative mailing because committee C retained discretion whether or not to mail the sample ballots.

- b. *Contributions.* A candidate may make or solicit contributions to a qualified political committee, provided that the committee retains absolute discretion over how the funds are spent. If the candidate or other non-qualified entity pays the preparation, printing, or postage costs for the mailing in return for the qualified political committee's agreement to make the mailing, that mail matter is not eligible for the special bulk third-class rates.
- c. *Mailing Support.* A political candidate may provide suggested copy, pictures, biographical information, or similar assistance requested by a qualified political committee that is preparing a mailing in support of the candidate. The qualified political committee may also ask a candidate to review a proposed mailpiece for accuracy. However, the qualified political committee must have final authority over the decision to mail the political matter and the contents of that matter.

**Example — Improper candidate funding**

- ▶ Authorized political committee D announces the creation of a "Candidate's Coordinated Mailing Fund."

Contributions to the fund will be used exclusively for mailings supporting candidates. Candidates E, F, G, and H contribute to the fund, and committee D makes a multicandidate endorsement for candidates E, F, G, H, and I. This would be considered a cooperative mailing. It would not be a cooperative mailing if (a) the fund created is not announced as one that will be used exclusively for mailings, and (b) committee D retained absolute discretion as to whether or not to make the mailings at all.

**454.733 Endorsements on Mail**

Mailings by qualified political committees often bear endorsements such as "Paid for by [committee] and authorized by [candidate]." These endorsements are often required by federal or state law. The presence of these endorsements alone does not disqualify the mailing from being sent at the special bulk third-class rates. The presence of factors discussed in the preceding sections of this chapter is required to find the mailing ineligible for the special rates.

**454.74 Identification**

The name and return address of the qualifying organization must appear either on the outside of the mailpiece or in a prominent location on the material being mailed at the special bulk third-class rates.

integrated retail terminal (IRT) to determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and what conditions of mailing apply. For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, refer to Handbook PO-514, *Express Mail Military Service*, and the local EMMS directory.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**B.** Form 2966-A is required. Prepaid mail from a contractor addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.

**B1.** Form 2966-B is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

**B2.** Form 2966-A is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.

**B3.** Form 2966-A is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotape, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

**E3.** Radio transceivers or cordless telephones are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length

- 42" . . . . . 72" length and girth combined
- over 42" to 44" . . . . . 24" girth
- over 44" to 46" . . . . . 20" girth
- over 46" to 48" . . . . . 16" girth
- Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM part C021, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 12 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

## Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-19

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail post-

age (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 Code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

## James K. Polk Commemorative Stamp

The Postal Service will honor James K. Polk on the 200th anniversary of his birth with the issuance of a 32-cent commemorative stamp (Item 1024) on November 2 in Columbia, Tennessee. The stamp goes on sale nationwide November 3.

James Polk served as the eleventh President of the United States (1845–1849), the youngest successful presidential candidate under age 50 up until that time, and was perhaps the most successful President at fulfilling his campaign promises. During his term, he cut tariffs to expand trade, strengthened the federal treasury, settled the Oregon boundary dispute, and expanded the territorial gains along the Pacific coast and in the Southwest. Polk is also regarded as the first “dark horse” nominee in the history of the presidency.

Born in Mecklenberg County, North Carolina, on November 2, 1795, Polk accompanied his family to Tennessee as a young boy. He later returned to North Carolina and graduated from the University of North Carolina at the head of his class. He then returned to Tennessee, where he began practicing law. His political career included serving in the Tennessee House of Representatives, the U.S. House of Representatives, and as the Governor of Tennessee. At the end of his presidential term, Polk settled into a quiet retirement in Nashville where he fell ill only 3 months after leaving office. He died in June 1849.

## Antique Autos Commemorative Stamps

As a tribute to the spirit of invention they inspire, the Postal Service will issue five Antique Autos 32-cent commemorative stamps (Item 4497) in New York, New York, on November 3. The stamps go on sale nationwide November 4.

The five motorcars included in these designs are the 1893 Duryea, the 1894 Haynes, the 1898 Columbia, the 1899 Winton, and the 1901 White. These motorcars represent the three primary methods of propulsion that were available to the United States automobile builders at the time. The Duryea, Haynes, and Winton were gasoline powered, the Columbia was electric, and the White was steam propelled. They serve as excellent examples of the nation's pioneering success in mechanical ingenuity.

STAMP DISTRIBUTION

**32-Cent U.S. Naval Academy Commemorative Stamp (Item 4478)**

The 32-cent U.S. Naval Academy commemorative stamp, Item 4478, goes on sale October 10 in Annapolis, Maryland. This stamp commemorates the 150th anniversary of the establishment of the U.S. Naval Academy. The stamp goes on sale nationwide on October 11.

**Distribution**

All stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive half their standard automatic distribution quantities of 20-stamps-per-pane commemorative stamps, rounded to the master carton size (70,000 stamps). SDOs and SDNs will make shipments to post offices for half their standard automatic distributions, using Forms 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*. SDOs must not distribute stamps to post offices before September 27.

**Philatelic Requirement**

SDOs and SDNs with authorized philatelic centers will receive automatic distributions of this stamp in eight positions in the following quantities to provide subsequent automatic distribution to each philatelic center:

**Additional Supply**

Each accountable paper depository (APD) will receive 560,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders with the exception of the SDNs in Kansas City, Missouri, and Dulles, Virginia, which will each receive 770,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from their appropriate APD, using separate Forms 17, *Stamp Requisition*. All other post offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO on separate Forms 17, or SDN, using separate Forms 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*.

### How to Care for Post Office Murals

Although the sculptures have fared well over the years and, for the most part, need little restoration, years of soot, pollution, and grime have taken their toll on the murals. About 90 percent of post office murals were painted in oil, or oil and tempera, on canvas and then glued to the wall. These generally fared better than frescoes painted directly on plaster walls. All of this art is fragile and needs the expert care of painting conservators trained in both art and science. Nevertheless, there are a few things you can do, or watch out for, right now:

- DO save our murals from air conditioners and strong lighting or sunlight, which are aggressive mural-destroyers.

Make sure vents do not blow directly on the mural. Constant changes from hot to cold and wet to dry cause the paint pigments to flake off. Strong spotlights directed at a mural may enhance it but will also prematurely fade the pigmentation and color.

- DO NOT touch your mural unnecessarily. Leave that to someone trained in the field. Sometimes detachment of the pigment is not visible to the eye, and paint can come off with a single light-fingered stroke.

- DO be very careful when painting areas around the mural.

Be mindful that paint spatters. When it is time to repaint the walls, ceiling, or woodwork in the lobby areas, take special care to cover and protect the mural.

- DO take care in routine maintenance of the mural. Unless there is excessive dirt or soot in the air, an annual, very light dusting with a feather duster is all that is necessary. Beyond that, call a conservator.
- DO involve Facilities people immediately when you know your office is planning to relocate. Postal policy is to relocate our New Deal art (murals and sculptures) to the new facility, another postal facility, or a government building, in that order.
- DO NOT relocate murals to outside walls. The continual dramatic changes in temperature on outside walls cause the same damage as air conditioners.
- DO get a copy of Management Instruction AS-510-88-16, *Artwork in USPS-Owned Buildings*. This describes postal directives on maintenance and relocation responsibilities and is available at material distribution centers.

The C Fund is invested in the Wells Fargo Equity Index Fund, which tracks the S&P 500 stock index. The F Fund is invested in the Wells Fargo U.S. Debt Index Fund, which tracks the Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond index. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings for the month, after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and assume that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

The C and F Fund returns vary from Wells Fargo returns because of C and F Fund expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.
