

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Elimination of SNA and InfoNet Networks

The Postal Service Information Systems organization will not support the SNA network and InfoNet VAN X.25 services after Fiscal Year (FY) 1996. These two networks will be replaced by the new Postal Routed Network (PRN), now in operation across the country.

The Postal Service has notified the vendor of the InfoNet VAN X.25 network that their services will no longer be required after FY96. This means that all users and applications that utilize SIMPC to dial into InfoNet must replace SIMPC with the new USPS standard for TCP/IP communications: FTP OnNet for Windows or FTP OnNet for DOS.

This new communications method must be in place and operational on all affected workstations before the end of FY96 (September 13, 1996). Users should take immediate action to contact their local Information Systems manager to determine if new hardware or software will be needed, or if assistance is required to comply with this announcement.

Revision to Handbook AS-709, Credit Card Policies and Procedures for Local Buying

Handbook AS-709, *Credit Card Policies and Procedures for Local Buying*, must be updated to reflect one correction and two policy updates.

Rationale and Summary of Changes

- Part 153 is changed by revising the last two sentences to reflect Finance's new capital accounting procedures.
- Part 334.82 is changed by replacing "parcel" with "surface" in line 3.
- Appendix A, paragraph j of Exhibit 3-4 is changed to include exceptions for use of the credit card.

Effective immediately, Handbook AS-709 is revised as follows:

The CAPITAL credit card is the only local means of buying capital equipment (equipment with a service life of over 1 year and costing \$2,000 or more). Officers, vice presidents, plant managers, district managers, and those reporting directly to them (if delegated in writing as having local capital buying authority) are the only employees authorized to approve issuance of CAPITAL credit cards to offices whose finance number has a capital budget. *Capital property purchases that involve trade-ins or add-ons to existing equipment should not be purchased with this card.*

Requests for this type of purchase are to be sent to the purchasing and materials service center (PMSC). Purchases made with the CAPITAL credit card will appear on PSFR line 68, sub-line 6X, under commitment account 87802 in the accounting period of the billing cycle. At the same time, the full amount of the purchase will be temporarily posted to line 44 under expense account 56930. When the St. Louis Accounting Service Center receives Form 8162, *Capital Property Record*, from the cardholder, the charge to account 56930 will be reversed (credited) and the equipment will be capitalized (posted to the appropriate asset account: 17201, 17401, or 17501).

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334.82 Nonmailable Merchandise

If the merchandise is not mailable and the merchant is not going to make delivery with his personnel and equipment, the merchant may send shipments exceeding 70 pounds but less than 500 pounds by a surface carrier and add the freight charges to the order. When a single shipment is to be handled as air freight, or is expected to exceed 500 pounds, ask your material management specialist to recommend whether the supplier or the Postal Service should route and pay for the shipment.

j. Hazardous waste clean-up and disposal

Regardless of the material type or size of job, hazardous waste clean-up and disposal services may not be obtained with the IMPAC credit card or any other type of local buying method unless 1) use of local buying has been approved by the Area or District Environmental Compliance Coordinator in writing, 2) use of the credit card is an authorized means of placing delivery orders under a contract or agreement issued by a PMSC or Headquarters, or 3) you are purchasing supplies that may contain hazardous substances as approved in Handbook AS-553, *Hazardous Waste Guide*.

Mailbox Improvement Week, May 20–25, 1996

Each year the Postal Service designates the third full week of May to encourage customers on city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 20–25, calls attention to the need for providing mailboxes that are:

1. Designed to protect the mail from weather.
2. Safe to use.
3. Conveniently located.
4. Neat in appearance.

Mailboxes that meet these four important requirements help delivery and collection operations, and improve service to the entire route. There are two approved styles of curbside mailboxes: (1) traditional design in three standard sizes (see Exhibit A); and (2) contemporary design, also in three sizes (see Exhibit B).

Notice 209

Notice 209, *Mailbox Improvement Week* (August 1994) (NSN 7610-03-000-9145), can be requisitioned from the material distribution centers by submitting Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*. Postmasters should send the notice to all rural and highway contract box delivery route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them of the event.

City Motorized, Rural, and Highway Contract Box Delivery Routes

Customers must use *only* approved traditional or contemporary curbside mailboxes for new installations or replacements. However, customers may use custom-built curbside mailboxes if the local postmaster gives prior approval and the mailbox conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured curbside mailboxes, relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction. Carriers on motorized city routes may continue to serve mailboxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery, which have been erected and served under previous regulations (see Exhibit C). However, carriers should advise customers they may use only approved curbside mailboxes when replacing these types of mailboxes. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional curbside mailboxes appeared in *Postal Bulletin* 21907 (11-23-95) and is updated below.

For motorized city routes, and where the use of street names and house numbers are authorized on rural and highway contract box delivery routes, the mailbox must display the number on the side of single mailboxes or on the

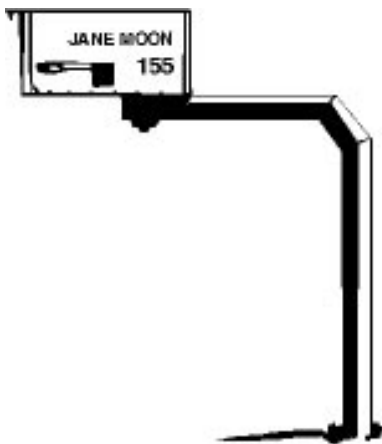
door of grouped mailboxes. If the mailbox is *on a street other than the one on which the customer resides*, the street name and house number must be on the mailbox. When rural and highway contract box delivery route customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single mailboxes or on the door of grouped mailboxes, visible to the approaching carrier. The street number, box number, and/or any other address information must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than one inch in height. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers should be encouraged to group mailboxes whenever practical, especially where many mailboxes are located at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or similar locations. Customers should also paint mailboxes and supports/posts and keep them rust-free. Advertising on mailboxes and supports/posts is prohibited. Section D041 of the *Domestic Mail Manual* contains additional information about curbside mailboxes.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semi-arch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit D), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under mailboxes without damaging supports and easy access to the mailboxes by carriers and customers.

Generally, customers should install mailboxes with the bottom of the mailbox at a vertical height of between 3 1/2 to 4 feet from the road surface. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing mailboxes and supports.

Exhibit D



Location

Customers must place mailboxes on motorized city, rural, and highway contract routes so a carrier can safely and conveniently serve them without leaving his or her vehicle. The mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's travel direction in all cases where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left to reach the mailboxes, or where doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations (*Domestic Mail Manual Transition Book (DMMT) 155.6* exempts apartment houses or other multiple dwellings from this rule). On new rural and highway contract box delivery routes, all mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of the route line of travel. Mailbox placement must conform with state laws and highway regulations. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede efficient delivery. Except when a mailbox is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the mailbox without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

Posts and other supports for curbside mailboxes are owned and controlled by customers who are responsible for seeing that posts are neat and adequate in strength and size. Customers should be discouraged from using massive mailbox supports that, when struck, could damage vehicles and cause injury. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away when struck by a vehicle. Post or support designs may not represent effigies or caricatures that disparage or ridicule any person. Customers may attach the box to a fixed or movable arm. DMMT 151.5 specifies postal regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches, or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. The mailbox must also be securely attached to its post to prevent separation if struck. See Exhibits E and F for examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA.

Cantilever Mailbox Supports

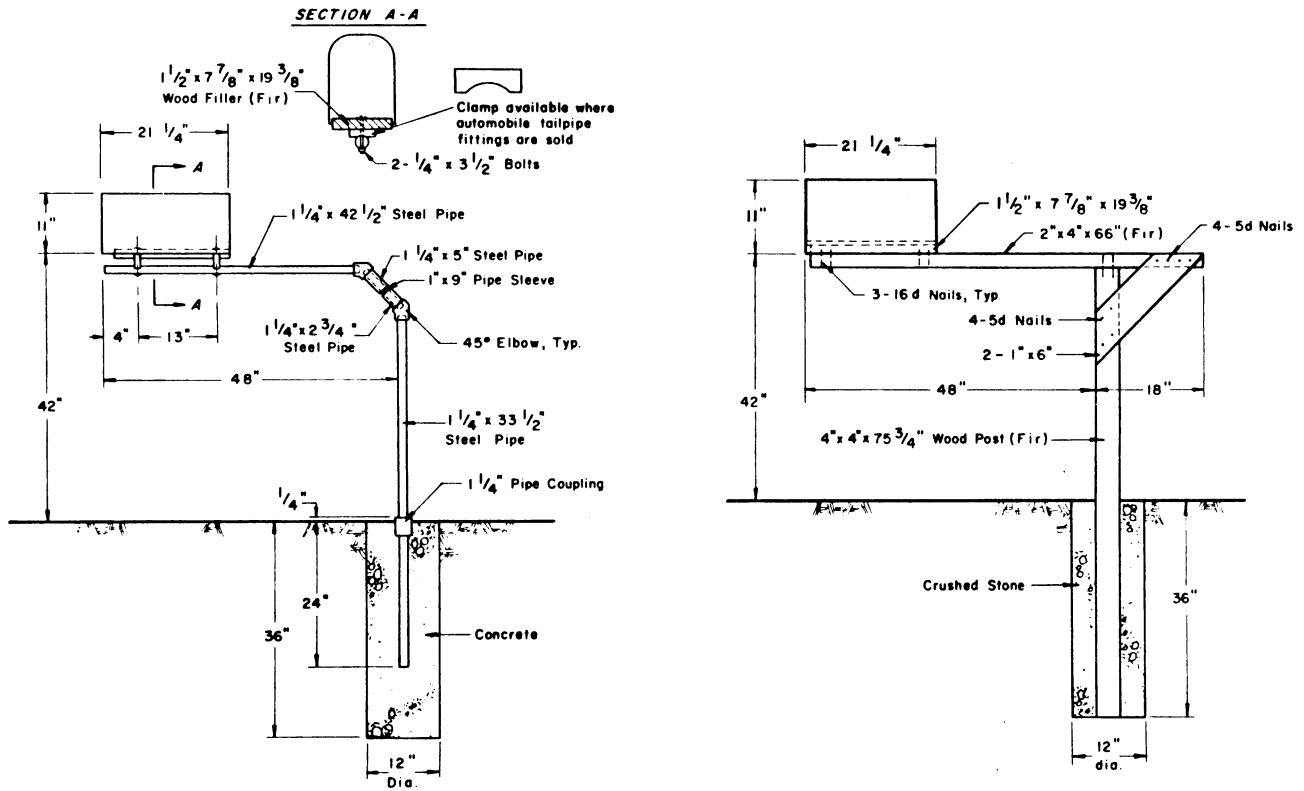
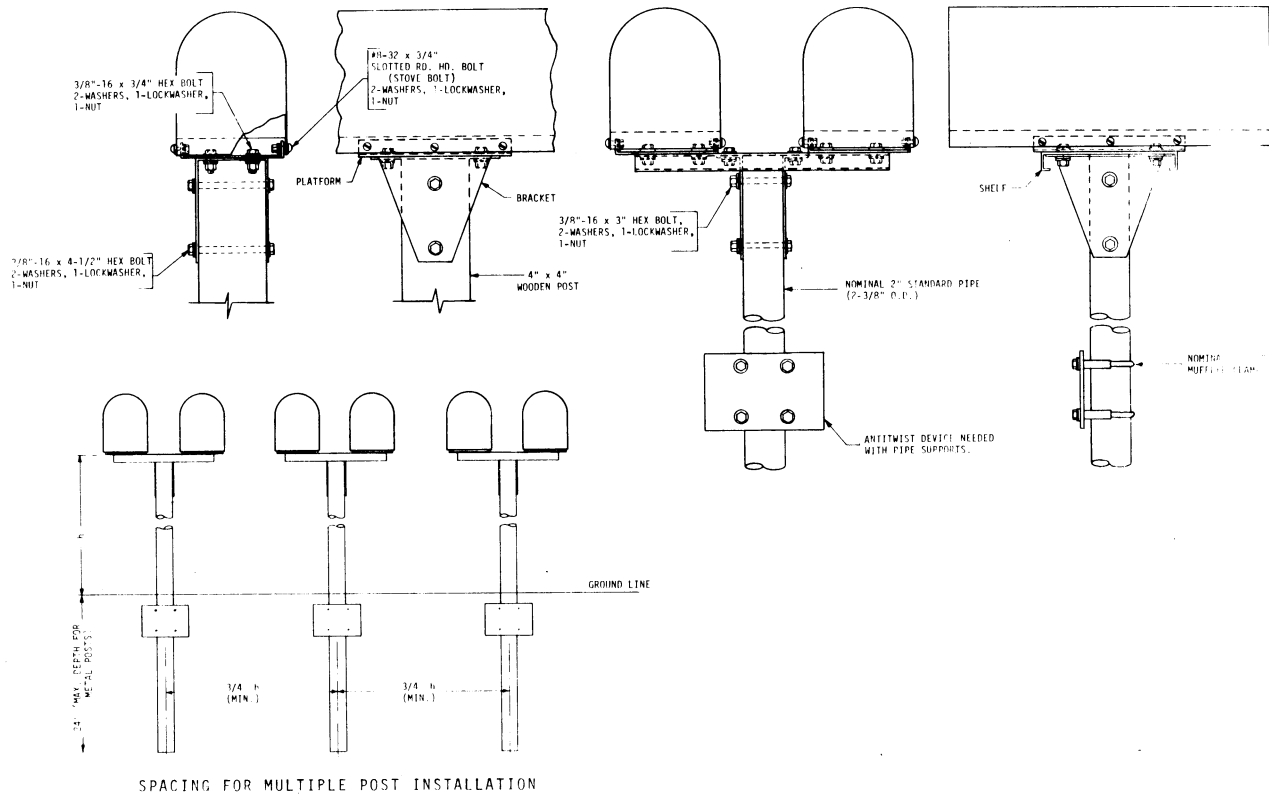


Exhibit F

CBUs and All-Weather Parcel Lockers

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters, managers, or their designees must also review cluster box units (CBUs) and all-weather parcel lockers in their delivery areas to identify any hazards or irregularities. They must record the results of the review. Form 8143, *Equipment Checklist and Followup Review* (April 1996), is a suggested format to use in conducting and recording the reviews (see Exhibit G). This form should be reproduced locally. Employees conducting the reviews must complete Form 1624, *Delivery/Collection Equipment Work Request* (NSN 7530-01-000-9392), for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to postal customers or employees. Use Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*, to requisition Form 1624 from the material distribution centers.

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees should use the CBU and parcel locker equipment checklist and follow-up review procedure when examining the condition of CBUs and parcel lockers. They should:

1. List the unit location, type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column (list serial number where available).
2. Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - OK = Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - X = Equipment needs attention for this item.
 - NA = Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
3. When examining the equipment, use the instructions below to complete Exhibit G:
 - a. Check equipment. It should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted. Attempt to shake the unit; it

should hardly move. If equipment is not firmly mounted, note whether it is the connection at ground level that is loose or the connection between the pedestal and customer compartments that needs attention.

- b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds. Tap the pedestal with a plastic hammer, especially along the seams, to check for corrosion from the inside out or perforated corrosion.
 - c. Observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe whether it is bowed or warped and that the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With the carrier access door open, check whether restraining devices prevent the door from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.
 - d. Ensure that the arrow lock operates smoothly and that the mounting screws are tight. The cover that protects the arrow lock from customer tampering must be serviceable and firmly attached.
 - e. Ensure that all customer access doors are present, closed, and locked with no visible damage or signs of forced entry. Check that customer door numbers are readable.
 - f. Ensure that the exterior surface of the unit is free from rust and graffiti.
 - g. Examine the unit. Check it for defects or damage and whether it reflects a proper Postal Service image.
 - h. Check whether the unit and/or any protecting structure appear watertight and in good repair. Check to see if there are any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail.
 - i. Note any other conditions warranting attention.
4. Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
 5. Submit the completed Form 1624 for each unit reviewed to the maintenance office responsible for CBU installation and/or repair in the area.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit Form 1624 reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should complete Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition, or Practice* (NSN 7530-01-000-9422), for items that pose an immediate threat to safety, such as an improperly secured or leaning CBU. The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify by telephone the office responsible for repair of reported hazards. The postmaster or supervisor must follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. The office responsible for repair

should use its local buying authority to accomplish the repairs.

Effective April 1996, the following are approved manufacturers of centralized delivery equipment.

Apartment style boxes are approved for installation; however, the Postal Service is prohibited from purchasing this equipment at this time. You may order replacement parts for Postal-owned equipment that was installed in the past.

- P = Parcel Locker
- V = Vertical Apartment Style Boxes.

State and Local Regulations

Some states have enacted laws which are more stringent and specific about the type of mailbox that can be used, the post or support which must be used to mount the mailbox, and the location of the delivery equipment. Regulations and recommendations published in this notice may not reflect appropriate requirements for your area. When providing guidance to the general public concerning mailbox placement/replacement, in addition to postal regulations, advise them of any mailbox regulations known to you which have been enacted by state or local authorities.

Publicity

Postmasters should give these guidelines and suggestions maximum local publicity. Consult your area Corporate Relations Center for further guidance and assistance in publicizing this event. The following news release is provided for postmasters to use in promoting Mailbox Improvement Week for daily or weekly newspapers or broadcast stations in their delivery area. Postmasters should retype and double space the release on Postal Service letterhead paper. It may also be helpful to alert the media to locations of particularly interesting mailboxes in your delivery area.

News Release

Mailbox Improvement Week Arrives in Time for Spring Cleaning

The U.S. Postal Service is asking all (city name) homeowners to inspect and repair their mailboxes during Mailbox Improvement Week May 20–25, says Postmaster (full name).

“Repairing suburban and rural mailboxes improves the appearance of our community and makes delivering and receiving mail safer for our carriers and customers,” (last name) says.

The Postal Service makes this yearly request because of the wear and tear that occurs to mailboxes every year. (If applicable) This is especially important after the effects of last winter, (he/she) adds.

Some of the typical activities that may need to be taken include:

- Replacing loose hinges on mailbox door.
- Repainting a mailbox that may have rusted or started peeling.
- Remounting a mailbox post if loosened.
- Replacing or adding house numbers.

If a homeowner plans to install a new mailbox or replace a worn one, he or she must use only USPS-approved traditional or contemporary mailboxes, said (last name). Customers may use a custom-built mailbox, but they must consult with my office to ensure it conforms to guidelines applying to flat, size, strength and quality of construction.

For more information on the use of names or numbers on mailboxes, or answers to any other questions, call me at (phone number) or stop by the (city name) post office at (address).

Responsibility

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers must cooperate to ensure the success of this endeavor and later report the results to the postmaster. Also, postmasters should use the most up-to-date list of approved manufacturers and mailbox suppliers when providing motorized city, rural, or highway contract box delivery route customers with information about what type of box to install.

Revisions to Booklet-Type Mailpieces

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C810.9.0 is revised to clarify that booklet-type mailpieces may be tabbed at the leading and trailing edges (sides) when those pieces are prepared for an automation rate mailing. This standard, based on a ruling printed in *Classification Currents* (November 1993), pertains only to the location of tabs or wafer seals used to secure booklet-type mailpieces for automation mailings — not to the physical standards for tabs or seals. This revision will appear in DMM Issue 50 (July 1, 1996).

9.0 BOOKLET-TYPE PIECES

The front and back covers of a booklet-type mailpiece must be prepared from paper with a minimum basis weight of 20 pounds (measured weight for 500 17-inch by 22-inch sheets). The bound edge (spine) must be the longest edge of the piece and at the bottom, parallel to the address. The unbound edge (top) must be secured with at least two tabs or wafer seals. One tab or wafer seal must be placed within 1 inch of the left edge of the piece; the second tab or seal, within 1 inch of the right edge of the piece. As an alternative, one tab or wafer seal must be placed within 1 inch from the top left side (trailing edge) of the piece; the second tab or seal, within 1 inch from the top right side (leading edge) of the piece.

DMM NOTICE

Small Barcoded Parcels — Experimental Classification and Rate

Effective April 28, 1996, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) G091 is added to permit the mailing of nonpresorted barcoded small parcels at First-Class and Priority Mail rates under a 2-year experiment. Eligible parcels are to be processed on small parcel and bundle sorters (SPBSs) equipped with barcode scanners. Currently, such SPBSs are installed at three postal facilities: the Southeastern, PA, Processing and Distribution Center (P&DC); the Philadel-

phia, PA, Airport Mail Center (AMC); and the St. Petersburg, FL, P&DC. These facilities will be the test sites for the experiment.

On December 19, 1995, the Postal Service filed with the Postal Rate Commission (PRC) a request for a recommended decision on an experimental rate category for

specific types of barcoded First-Class and Priority Mail. The Postal Service requested permission to establish automation rate categories and 4-cent-per-piece discounts for certain nonpresorted bulk barcoded First-Class and Priority Mail small parcels entered for outgoing primary distribution at three test sites on a 2-year experimental basis. The 4-cent discount is based on the estimated cost difference between keying a nonbarcoded parcel and scanning a barcoded parcel.

The main goals of this experiment are as follows:

- To determine whether it is feasible to offer an automation discount for nonpresorted barcoded First-Class and Priority Mail small parcels.
- To gauge mailer interest and acceptance of this discount.
- To confirm the increase in sortation quality and productivity when comparing the automated processing of nonpresorted barcoded small parcels with the manual keying of the same or similar pieces.

The PRC on March 13, 1996, issued to the Governors of the Postal Service its Recommended Decision. The PRC recommendation substantially followed the mail classification structure and rates requested by the Postal Service. After reviewing the PRC's Recommended Decision, the Governors approved the PRC's recommendations, and the Board of Governors set an implementation date of April 28, 1996.

1.0 BASIC ELIGIBILITY

1.1 Applicability

The standards in G091 apply to pieces claimed at the experimental automation rates for First-Class and Priority Mail small parcels. All pieces in an automation rate small parcel mailing under G091 must:

- a. Meet the basic standards for First-Class Mail and Priority Mail in E110 and E120, respectively, and the specific standards in 2.0 through 7.0.
- b. Be part of a single mailing of at least 50 pieces of either First-Class Mail or Priority Mail, eligible for and claimed at the automation rate for small parcels. The same mailing may not contain both First-Class and Priority Mail pieces.
- c. Meet the applicable physical standards in 2.0.

- d. Bear a delivery address that includes the correct ZIP Code or ZIP+4 code.
- e. Meet the address quality and coding standards in 4.0, A800, and A950.
- f. Bear an accurate barcode meeting the standards in 3.0.
- g. Be marked and prepared as specified in 5.0.
- h. Meet the documentation and postage payment standards in 6.0 and P012.
- i. Be deposited at a post office served by one of the test sites designated in 1.4.

1.2 Rate

Each piece in an automation small parcel rate mailing qualifies for the corresponding single-piece First-Class or single-piece Priority Mail rate shown in 7.0.

1.3 Participation in Test

Participation in the test is subject to these conditions:

- a. A mailer wishing to participate in preparing test mailings under G091 must submit a written application to the Customer Mail Preparation manager (for address, see G043) at least 14 days before the earliest requested mailing date. The application must describe the mailpieces to be presented; preparation level and containerization mode (as applicable); typical daily and annual volumes and a schedule of mailings; deposit sites for mailings; postage payment method; sites of any corresponding authorizations for precanceled stamps, postage meters, or permit imprints. The mailer must also submit sample barcoded parcels to the plant manager of the test site where pieces are to be processed so that the accuracy and readability of the barcodes can be determined; the plant manager specifies the sample size. The mailer is notified of any corrective action.
- b. If the barcodes on the submitted parcels are found accurate, correctly prepared, and readable, mailings may begin when approved by the Customer Mail Preparation manager, subject to the conditions in the authorization letter; no further notice is required except as specified under 6.0.
- c. An authorization is subject to amendment on 10 days' written notice to the mailer and ends automatically at the end of the test period (April 28, 1998). The mailer may end participation on 10 days' written notice to the Customer Mail Preparation manager. The USPS may terminate an authorization on 10 days' written notice to the mailer for failing to meet the eligibility standards in G091 or in accordance with a material change in the terms and conditions of the experimental classification. The mailer may file a written appeal of a denied application or revoked authorization, within 30 days of receipt of the notice

of denial or revocation, with the Marketing Systems vice president (for address, see G043), who issues the final agency decision.

1.4 Test Sites

As specified in the authorization letter, mail prepared under G091 must be entered at a post office for which outgoing primary distribution is performed as follows:

- a. For Priority Mail, at either the St. Petersburg, FL, Processing and Distribution Center (P&DC) (3-digit ZIP Code area 337 and 5-digit ZIP Codes 33504, 34634, 34635, 34640–34649, and 34664–34666) or the Philadelphia, PA, Airport Mail Center (080–084, 189–194, and 197–199).
- b. For First-Class Mail, at either the St. Petersburg, FL, P&DC (3-digit ZIP Code area 337 and 5-digit ZIP Codes 33504, 34634, 34635, 34640–34649, and 34664–34666) or the Southeastern, PA, P&DC (3-digit ZIP Code areas 189, 193, and 194).

2.0 PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

2.1 Automation Compatibility

Only pieces that do *not* meet the dimensional and other physical standards in C810 or C820 may be claimed at the automation small parcel rates, subject to 2.2 and 2.3. Pieces must not have loose string, packaging material, or other protrusions that might snag or jam in processing equipment or impede or damage the mail or mail processing equipment. Pieces may not be prepared in envelopes or as unenclosed bound or unbound pages. Pieces may be prepared in padded mailing envelopes or in paper or plastic containers if the wrapper and dunnage can protect the contents during automated processing.

2.2 Measurement

The dimensions of an irregularly shaped piece are based on the size of the smallest cube that could contain the piece when placed in a stable position for processing. The dimensions of other pieces are those of the largest surface area of another surface area that faces up when the piece is oriented for stable processing.

2.3 Dimensions and Weight

All pieces are subject to these size and weight limits:

- a. The two horizontal dimensions (length and width) must be no less than 3.5 by 5 inches but no more than 12 by 15.5 inches.
- b. The vertical dimension (thickness) must be no more than 8 inches but:
 - (1) More than 0.25 inch if the horizontal dimensions are 6.125 by 11.5 inches or less; or
 - (2) At least 0.01 inch if the horizontal dimensions are more than 6.125 by 11.5 inches.

- c. The maximum weight of a piece must be no more than 20 pounds.

3.0 BARCODE CHARACTERISTICS

3.1 Basic Standards

Every addressed piece mailed at the automation small parcel rates must bear the correct 6-digit barcode (a 5-digit ZIP Code and a 1-digit verifier character) in Interleaved 2 of 5, Code 39, or Code 128 format. Technical specifications for these three barcode formats appear in Uniform Symbology Specification (USS) documents USS-I2/5, USS-39, and USS-128, respectively, available from Automatic Identification Manufacturers (AIM), Material Handling Institute, Inc., 1326 Freeport Rd., Pittsburgh, PA 15238-3131. Only one 6-digit barcode ending in a "9" character may appear on the mailpiece. The barcode must be located as specified in 4.1. No printing may appear in an area 0.125 inch above, below, and on either side of the barcode, regardless of location.

3.2 Dimensions

Narrow bars and spaces must be at least 0.013 inch wide; wide bars and spaces, at least 0.030 inch wide. All bars must be at least 0.75 inch high. The gap between characters must equal the narrow bar width if Code 39 is used. The ratio of wide to narrow bar width may be in one of two ranges:

- a. If only one 6-digit barcode appears on the address side of the mailpiece, the ratio must be between 1.9:1 and 3.2:1, inclusive, for the Interleaved 2 of 5 and Code 39 formats.
- b. If more than one 6-digit barcode appears on the address side of the mailpiece, the ratio must be between 1.9:1 and 2.2:1, inclusive, regardless of barcode format.

3.3 Verifier

The verifier character must be the last digit of the 6-digit barcode. The correct verifier digit is always 9. The verifier appears only as part of the barcode and is not printed as part of the human-readable ZIP Code.

3.4 Reflectance

When measured in the red spectrum (633 nanometers \pm 5%) by a USPS or USPS-licensed reflectance meter, the minimum white bar (space) reflectance (Rs) must be 25%, and the maximum black bar reflectance (Rb) must be less than 30%. The minimum print reflectance difference (Rs-Rb) is 35%.

4.0 ADDRESS INFORMATION

4.1 Address

The address and barcode must be on the mailpiece side with the largest surface area, *except that* the address and

barcode must be on the top surface of the mailpiece when its shape requires specific orientation for stability during automated processing. The delivery address and/or the barcode may be printed on an attachment or on an enclosure in a window envelope, subject to the reflectance standards in 3.4.

4.2 Numeric Barcode

In addition to the ZIP Code or ZIP+4 code included in the delivery address, human-readable characters representing the numeric equivalent of the barcode (but omitting the verifier character), preceded by the word "ZIP," must be printed near the barcode but outside the barcode clear zone in a type size equal to or larger than that used in the delivery address.

4.3 Address Quality

Effective January 1, 1997, addresses appearing on all pieces claimed at automation rates must be updated within 6 months before the mailing date by a USPS-approved address update tool (e.g., the "Address Correction Endorsement," ACS, or NCOA). Mailers must certify that this standard has been met when the corresponding mail is presented to the USPS. This standard applies to each address individually. If a USPS-approved address update tool is used, a valid update is obtained regardless of the class of mail on which the address is placed. An address meeting this standard may be used in mailings at any other rate to which the standard applies throughout the 6-month period following its most recent update.

5.0 MAIL PREPARATION

The standards in 5.0 apply exclusively to pieces claimed at the experimental automation rates for First-Class and Priority Mail small parcels. Pieces are subject to the basic eligibility standards in E100 applicable to First-Class or Priority Mail and the general standards in M010, M020, and M030. Mail may be deposited at an eligible entry post office, regardless of destination. No packaging is required or permitted. No sortation or package labeling is required. First-Class pieces must be marked "EX-AUTO" and either "First-Class" or "Priority Mail," as appropriate. Pieces must be prepared in sacks or other containers labeled as directed by the test site plant manager. Use the city/state/ZIP for that facility on Line 1. For Line 2, use FCM PP BC WKG; if required by the plant manager, the applicable processing code must be right-justified on Line 2 under the ZIP Code on Line 1.

6.0 POSTAGE PAYMENT AND DOCUMENTATION

Full postage must be affixed to each piece by meter or precanceled stamps, or paid by permit imprint, under an authorization issued by the entry post office (which must be

an eligible facility listed in 1.4); plant-verified and other forms of drop shipment may not be used to deposit mail at an authorized entry post office. A complete, signed postage statement, using the correct USPS form or an approved facsimile, must accompany each mailing. No other documentation is required.

7.0 RATES AND FEES

7.1 First-Class Mail

First-Class Mail weighing 1 ounce or less may be subject to a nonstandard surcharge under E100. Pieces weighing 11 ounces or less not mailed as Priority Mail:

Delivery of Bulk Business Mail in Apartment Boxes

Recent customer feedback indicates there is a serious failure to comply with bulk business mail (BBM) delivery procedures in apartment building environments. Our customers have voiced concerns because their mail is being left in apartment vestibules rather than delivered into mailboxes as is required in Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carriers Duties and Responsibilities*, Part 320, Delivery of Ordinary Mail. When the Postal Service fails to properly deliver mail into mail receptacles, recipients see no difference between the service we provide and that of an alternative delivery service. We are devaluing both our customers' products and our service.

Carriers must deliver to the proper mail receptacle all mail bearing the exceptional address format (example: Mr. John Doe or current resident/occupant) on the mailing label as addressed. This mail is undeliverable only if the house, apartment, office, or building is unoccupied or non-existent. The delivery employee must endorse undeliverable pieces as "Other UBBM" and bundle them with other UBBM mail for verification and proper handling.

In apartment buildings, carriers must deliver mailings *with* apartment numbers addressed to "Occupant," "Postal Customer," etc., to the proper mail receptacle as specified in the mailing address. Carriers must deliver mailings *without* apartment numbers beginning at the lowest numbered mail receptacle and continuing upward until they complete delivering one piece to every receptacle. Where mail receptacles are unnumbered or not in sequential order, carriers should deliver mail into the receptacles working

from left to right as if the mail receptacles were in sequential order. If there are more pieces than there are mail receptacles, the delivery employee must endorse undeliverable pieces as "Other UBBM" and bundle them with other UBBM mail for verification and proper disposal.

Carriers must not leave mail undelivered on racks, tables, shelves, or other fixtures. In apartments and other centralized delivery environments, carriers may leave mail addressed to full mail receptacles in a designated location that affords adequate protection for the mail with the permission of the addressee or after leaving a Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, notifying the addressee. Carriers must always deliver both components of detached label mailings, the letter-size address label and accompanying flat or sample piece, at the same time.

These procedures do not apply to simplified address mail (boxholders) received for delivery on a rural route. Rural carriers must follow the procedures outlined in Handbook PO-603, *Rural Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, Part 320, Delivery of Ordinary and Simplified Address Mail.

Please take the necessary steps to ensure that all delivery personnel are aware of our customers' concerns and deliver all their mail in compliance with Postal Service policy. Providing quality delivery will ensure a visible difference between Postal Service delivery and alternate delivery services.

Mail addressed to, from, or between military post offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The tables below outline these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Code through the use of footnoted mailing restriction codes, which appear on the page following Table 2.

Acceptance clerks should use these tables with the

integrated retail terminal (IRT) to determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and which conditions of mailing apply. For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, refer to Handbook PO-514, *Express Mail Military Service*, and the local EMMS directory.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2966-A is required. Prepaid mail from a contractor addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.

B1. Form 2966-B is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

B2. Form 2966-A is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.

B3. Form 2966-A is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length

- 42" 72" length and girth combined
- over 42" to 44" 24" girth
- over 44" to 46" 20" girth
- over 46" to 48" 16" girth
- Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including thoseailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Agency Code = 3-digit code identifying each federal agency. Component units of an agency share the same 3-digit number with their parent agency.

Permit Imprint Number = Authorized penalty permit imprint numbers assigned to each agency.

BRM Permit Number = Business reply mail (BRM) permit numbers assigned to each agency.

Express Mail Number = Only those agencies with their agency code listed in this column can use the "Federal Agency Code" block on Express Mail labels. All other agencies must place postage on their Express Mail.

NA = Agencies electing to prepay postage for all their mail. These agencies are not authorized to use any form of penalty mail except under DMM E060.5.7.

144.2 Global Priority Mail (Express)

Global Priority Mail is the United States Postal Service equivalent of foreign administrations' "Express" mail. Global Priority Mail provides a highly reliable international mail service, averaging 4-day delivery to designated countries in Europe, the Pacific Rim, and Canada, capable of ensuring consistent delivery performance. Global Priority Mail is offered from every Express Mail Eagle Market within the United States. The product is intended to carry documents, correspondence, and merchandise up to 4 pounds and will be clearly identifiable as Global Priority Mail by using one of two unique envelope designs or a sticker, all of which include the "Express" symbol.

144.3 Acceptance Processing of Outbound Global Priority Mail (Express)

144.31 Acceptance Units

Acceptance units will forward Global Priority Mail along with Express Mail to the processing Express Mail Unit at the P&DC, P&DF, AMC, or AMF.

144.32 Express Mail Units

The Express Mail Units of each P&DC, P&DF, AMC, or AMF will receive and process Global Priority Mail along with Express Mail from their service areas by Critical Entry Time (CET) for Eagle Network Express Mail. Global Priority Mail transportation to meet CET at the gateway office.

144.33 P&DC, P&DF, AMC, and AMF

144.331 Distribution

Distribute Global Priority Mail in Express Mail sacks to the appropriate designated Gateway Office. Refer to the individual country listing in Chapter 7 for consolidation.

144.332 Dispatch

b. Scanning, Distribution, and Dispatch

Scan, distribute, and dispatch Global Priority Mail in separate international blue mail bags and attach a Tag 8. Use dedicated full bags if volume warrants. Never dispatch Global Priority Mail in the F-bag.

c. Dispatch to Canada

Attach Tag 8 to each flat tub of Global Priority Mail destined for Canada and dispatch in accordance with bilateral agreement.

d. MIDAS

Make dispatches via the MIDAS system.

e. Misrouted and Missent Pieces

Scan misrouted and missent pieces and make appropriate entries into scanning equipment. Dispatch misrouted and missent pieces to destination if transportation is available. If transportation is not available, pieces should be routed to appropriate gateway office for dispatch.

144.4 "Exprès" Inbound

Inbound International "Exprès" is the equivalent of United States Postal Service "Global Priority Mail." Capture

inbound International "Exprès" letter size pieces at the opening unit. Process and dispatch them with domestic First-Class Mail. Capture inbound "Exprès" flats and parcels at the opening unit. Process and dispatch them with domestic Priority Mail.

144.5 Shortpaid Items

Process shortpaid and unpaid mail according to existing international shortpaid procedures outlined in IMM chapter 4 and Handbook T-5 subchapter 45.

POSTAL EMPLOYEES

Thrift Savings Plan Open Season

The next Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) open season is May 15, 1996, through July 31, 1996. TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (July 1995), provides a good overview of TSP. The following information should assist personnel services offices in conducting this open season.

Direct Mailing to Employees

Career employees receive a direct mailing from the national level of leaflet TSP-0596, *TSP Open Season*, at their mailing addresses of record. Career employees newly eligible to participate in TSP also receive a direct mailing from the national level of an enrollment package that contains a cover letter; TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (July 1995); and TSP-1, *Election Form* (February 1991). Career employees should receive these materials no later than the end of May.

Undeliverable enrollment packages for newly eligible employees are returned to the employing office of record. While the disposition of returned enrollment packages is at the discretion of the Customer Service and Sales district office or other administering office, giving a returned enrollment package to an employee offers the employee an opportunity to submit a correct Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*.

Eligibility

Career employees hired before January 1, 1996, are eligible to participate in this open season. Also, career employees hired before July 1, 1996, previously eligible to participate in a TSP open season during a prior appointment are eligible.

All employees who were participating in TSP and stopped their TSP contributions after January 31, 1996, are not eligible to participate in this TSP open season. They must wait for the TSP open season beginning November 15, 1996.

Effective Dates

The effective dates for TSP open season elections are as follows:

Personnel services staff must initiate completion of Form 6886, *Thrift Savings Plan Request for Retroactive Contributions*, for all Forms TSP-1 not processed by the applicable processing date shown in the above chart, whether the reason for the delay is a belated election or an administrative error. The effective dates for these elections must be made retroactive to July 6, 1996, or July 20, 1996, depending on the date the employee initially filed his or her election form with the personnel services office. (Form 6886, which was published in *Postal Bulletin* 21665 (3-31-88), must be reproduced locally as needed.)

Open Season Materials

In addition to the direct mailing of TSP information to employees, the material distribution centers (MDCs) will automatically distribute residual supplies of the open season leaflet (TSP-0596), election form (TSP-1), and summary (TSP BK08) to Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units. (The September 1990 version of the TSP-1 is still valid and may be used if the February 1991 version is unavailable. All prior versions are obsolete and must be destroyed.) Offices that would like any other TSP materials for use during the open season must order a supply from the appropriate MDC.

Participant Statements

Employees with a TSP account will receive a participant statement from the TSP Service Office in May 1996.

Publicity

Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units will receive a supply of posters this open season from TSP. Installations that receive the posters must widely distribute and post them through July 31, 1996.

To assist in publicizing the TSP open season, all offices must post the open season notice on page 61 on bulletin boards through July 31, 1996. Also post the current TSP fact sheet on bulletin boards.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 96-9

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail

postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

The Postal Service will issue a 32-cent commemorative stamp in recognition of Georgia O’Keeffe’s artistic achievements (Item 5509), in a pane of 15, on May 23, 1996, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The stamp goes on sale nationwide May 24.

Designed by Margaret Bauer of Washington, D.C., the stamp features Georgia O’Keeffe’s 1927 painting entitled *Red Poppy*. The pane combines a photo of O’Keeffe with the 15 stamps.

Georgia O’Keeffe is considered one of the foremost American painters of the twentieth century. Her flower paintings attracted attention with their spectacular size, vivid color, and detailed views; they were extremely controversial but also extremely popular. She used not only flowers as the basis for her art but also abstracts, desert landscapes, city views, bones, shells, and other natural forms.

The words “USA” in blue and “Bulk Rate” in red appear below the eagle. The stamp has the same design as the one originally issued on December 13, 1991, but will be issued in a new format of a self-adhesive coil of 10,000.

St. John's College Postal Card



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The Postal Service commemorates the 300th anniversary of St. John's College with the issuance of a 20-cent postal card (Item 2283) on June 1, 1996, in Annapolis, Maryland. The St. John's College postal card, the latest addition to the Historic Preservation series, goes on sale nationwide June 3.

Designed by Harry Devlin of Mountainside, New Jersey, this postal card features the original historic building of St. John's College located in Annapolis, Maryland.

St. John's College was chartered in 1784. In 1786 the school was consolidated with King William's School, which had been founded in 1696 by the Petitionary Act for Free Schools. In 1742, Maryland Governor Thomas Bladen began building a mansion intended to serve as his home. By 1750, the building, unfinished and deteriorating, was known as "Bladen's Folly." In 1784, the law establishing the college granted the building and four acres to the college

board. Named for the college's first president, John McDowell, it was the only building on campus until 1837. McDowell Hall is considered one of the oldest academic buildings in continuous use in this country. The college opened a second campus in Santa Fe, NM, in 1964.

Designed by Phil Jordan of Falls Church, Virginia, the stamp features a photograph, taken by Pulitzer prize winner Robin Hood, of the Tennessee State Capitol Building. In the foreground is an equestrian statue of General Andrew Jackson.

Tennessee became the 16th state admitted to the Union on June 1, 1796. Its nickname, "The Volunteer State," relates back to the War of 1812, when thousands of Tennesseans volunteered as soldiers. Tennessee lies in the upper South of the eastern United States. More than half of its land area is covered by forests. The state enjoys four distinct seasons, but experiences a mild climate year round. Opryland, the home of the "Grand Ole Opry," located just outside the capital city of Nashville, and Grace-land, home of the late entertainer Elvis Presley in Memphis, are two well-known tourist attractions in Tennessee.

instructions above. Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service returns the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark. All orders must be postmarked by August 29, 1996.

First day covers remain on sale for at least 90 days after the stamp's issuance.

Distribution of Pane of 50 Stamps, Item 4485

All stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive approximately one-half their standard automatic distribution quantities for a 50-stamp per pane rounded to the nearest master carton lot size of 125,000.

SDOs and SDNs will ship to post offices half their standard automatic distribution quantity, using Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, and Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. SDOs and SDNs must not distribute stamps to post offices before May 23.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs with authorized philatelic centers will receive their standard automatic distribution for a four-position commemorative.

Additional Supply

Each accountable paper depository (APD) except Memphis, Tennessee, and the Kansas City, Missouri, SDN will receive 1,625,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders. The Memphis APD will receive 2,126,000 stamps and the Kansas City SDN will receive 2,250,000 stamps. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from

their appropriate APDs, using separate Forms 17, *Stamp Requisition*. All other post offices should requisition them from their designated SDO on a separate Form 17 or SDN, using a separate Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*.

Sales Policy

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale, generally 1 year from the date of issue. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities through their normal ordering procedures.

Distribution of Booklet of 20 Self-Adhesive Stamps, Item 6654

A limited quantity of these booklets has been printed. The state of Tennessee will receive a directed distribution of these booklets. Accordingly, just the two SDOs in Tennessee will receive this booklet of 20 self-adhesive Tennessee Statehood stamps for distribution to post offices in the Tennessee area *only*. Memphis, Tennessee, will receive

960,000 booklets and Nashville, Tennessee, will receive 861,000 booklets.

Philatelic Requirement

Sales outside Tennessee are restricted to philatelic centers *only*. SDOs must not distribute these booklets before May 23.

New Publication 9, *Free Stamp Catalogs*

A new Postal Service mail-order catalog of stamps and stamp products, *USA Philatelic*, will debut in late April (the cover date is "Spring 1996"). This new catalog supplements, rather than replaces, Publication 9, *Stamps etc.* The introduction of *USA Philatelic* begins a new marketing effort which includes different mailings and different catalogs to different customers. A new "take-one" brochure is being prepared to be used in place of catalogs at most post office windows and lobbies. This will allow customers to order a specific stamp catalog; it will also allow the Postal Service to capture the customer's name and address. In the past, when a customer took a catalog from a post office, the Postal Service had no way of making subsequent contact.

The *Stamps etc.* publication will no longer have a number; instead, it will be available to customers through the new brochure, *Free Stamp Catalogs*, which will be designated Publication 9. The new Publication 9, *Free Stamp Catalogs*, will not be available from the material distribution centers (MDCs) until June 1996. The new Publication 9 will provide customers with a business reply card with which to order either *Stamps etc.* or *USA Philatelic*. Coupled with the 800-STAMP-24 number, this brochure allows postal customers to order any stamp or philatelic product not available locally, and send for a catalog to receive regular information. Post offices will continue to receive an information copy of all catalogs and direct mail offerings when they are sent to our customers.

The next edition of *Stamps etc.* will appear in June and will be available to new customers only through the *Free Stamp Catalogs* brochure. Most copies will be mailed directly to our catalog customers. It will be designed for a more general audience, aimed primarily at customers sometimes called "casual" collectors. It will be less technical and less comprehensive than *USA Philatelic*, which is designed for our frequent customers, including the "serious" collectors.

Post offices may have occasional needs for catalogs. Limited additional supplies will be produced and made available for purposes such as stamp shows and temporary stations. In most instances, however, the *Free Stamp Catalogs* brochures will be just as efficient and far more cost-effective. Post offices may request limited quantities of catalogs from:
