Combined Federal Campaign



Display in Post Offices of "Most Wanted" Posters for Non-Payment of Child Support

Acting upon a Presidential request, the U.S. Postal Service and the Department of Health and Human Services have joined in a cooperative effort to focus attention on what has become a \$34 billion annual problem in America. That is the amount owed to American children by parents who have failed to pay child support payments.

Currently, 25 states have programs to publicly identify, locate, and prosecute these parents. One tactic used by these states is to publish quarterly "Most Wanted" posters and to post them in public places. It is in this capacity that the Postal Service has agreed to play a passive role.

State child support agencies will provide an adequate number of posters to each USPS district office in their state. States are solely responsible for the content and accuracy of the information contained on the posters. District offices will then ensure that the posters are distributed to all postal facilities within their Performance Clusters. These "Most Wanted" posters are to be displayed in post office lobbies until updated replacement posters are provided by the states and distributed, generally on a quarterly basis.

All inquiries about the posters or requests from individuals or local/county agencies to post additional, related notices in postal lobbies should be referred to the appropriate state child support agency. See inset for participating states and phone numbers of state agencies.

The U.S. Postal Service's role in this joint venture is to be entirely *passive*. Identification and apprehension of parents on the "Most Wanted" posters is strictly the responsibility of the state child support and law enforcement agencies.

Procedures for Accessing Material Logistics Bulletins on the Topeka Electronic Bulletin Board System

Active Purchasing and Materials *Material Logistics Bulletins* (MLBs) dating from 1988 to the present are now available via modem from the Topeka Electronic Bulletin Board System (TEBBS). Electronic access is being provided in

addition to the normal, hard copy distribution. All MLBs are in Microsoft Word 6.0 for Windows. Offices that cannot access TEBBS should request hard copies from their Purchasing and Materials service center. In the near future,

hard copy MLBs will be discontinued and replaced with electronic versions distributed via cc:Mail.

To access MLBs on TEBBS:

1. Set modem parity to none, data to 8, and stops to 1. TEBBS can support up to a 14.4K baud rate.
2. Dial either 800-808-6997 or 913-861-2875.
3. Read the screen prompts to log in as a user.
4. At the main menu, type "L" and press Enter for file libraries.
5. Type "S" to select MLB library and press Enter.

To list the available MLBs:

1. Type "F" and press Enter to find file.
2. Type "F" and press Enter by file name (alphabetically).
3. Press Enter to start at the beginning of the alphabet.
4. Type "C" and press Enter for the current library.

To download an MLB:

1. Type "D" and press Enter.
2. Type the MLB file name and press Enter.
3. Select the appropriate download method (Zmodem recommended for 9600 baud and above and Xmodem for below 9600).

To access information within the file:

1. Download "ALLMLB.DOC" to obtain a list of current MLBs. This list contains short descriptions and issuance and expiration dates.
2. Download "ALLMLB.EXE" to obtain a compressed MLB listing.
3. After the file has been loaded, locate it on your hard disk, type "MLB," and press Enter to decompress the ALLMLB.EXE file.

Ordering General Services Administration Items

Several General Services Administration (GSA) units of issue have changed recently, so please be aware when ordering GSA items that the unit of issue may have changed. The new units of issue can be obtained by referencing the April 1996 edition of Publication 247, *Supply and Equipment Catalog*, or when placing an order over the material distribution center (MDC) Touch-Tone Order Entry (TTOE) system (the units of issue are repeated to the customer after each line item is placed). If you have any questions, please call your servicing MDC.

Also, the April 1996 edition of Publication 247, *Supply*

and Equipment Catalog, inadvertently cited two standard forms (SF 1094, *US Tax Exemption Certificate*, and SF 1103, *Government Bill of Lading*) in the price list. These forms are normally found in Publication 223, *Directives and Forms Catalog*, which does not currently indicate the correct GSA unit of issue. The GSA unit of issue for SF 1094 is a package of 25, and the two units of issue for SF 1103 are (1) 100 single sheets and (2) a box of 350, marginally punched.

DMM NOTICE

Nonprofit Classification Reform; Implementation Standards

This notice sets forth the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) standards adopted by the Postal Service to implement the Decision of the Governors of the United States Postal Service on the Recommended Decision of the Postal Rate Commission on Nonprofit Standard Mail, Nonprofit Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail, Nonprofit Periodicals, and Within County Periodicals, Docket No. MC96-2, Classification Reform II. This notice also contains the phased rates being implemented both for those subclasses as well as for Classroom Periodicals and Library Mail.

The proposed DMM standards have been adopted without change, except as noted below to reflect the absence of rate provisions for Classroom Periodicals in the PRC's Recommended Decision that was accepted by the Governors and approved for implementation at 12:01 a.m., Sunday, October 6, 1996.

Until July 1, 1996 (the implementation date for Classification Reform I), rate eligibility and mail preparation standards were generally similar for commercial mail and for nonprofit mail. After that date, new standards took effect for commercial rate categories, while the preexisting rules were generally retained for the "unreformed" nonprofit categories pending the resolution of Classification Reform II. The Postal Service, in line with its proposal in that case, recommended revised DMM standards for nonprofit rate categories that would substantively eliminate the preparation and rate eligibility distinctions between commercial and nonprofit mail that would exist after July 1, 1996.

Accordingly, the following units of the DMM are eliminated, having been established solely to contain former general standards that were applicable only to nonprofit rate categories during the interim period beginning July 1: E239, E249, E639, E649, L001, L897, L898, L899, M690, M692, M693, M695, M696, M697, M698, M890, M891, M892, M893, M894, M895, M896, M897, and M898. Sections of other units are also eliminated for the same reason, as shown in the detailed DMM text below.

In addition, the existing eligibility standards in E231 and E239 are consolidated into E230, and existing E241 and E249 are consolidated into new E240. The basic mail preparation standards in M010 through M070, as amended in the proposed rule, are also implemented as proposed for all nonprofit mail.

The DMM text presented below reflects other organizational revisions that do not constitute substantive changes: E621 through E625 are consolidated into E620; E631

through E634 are consolidated into E630; and E641 is redesignated as E640.

The "breakpoint" for Nonprofit Standard Mail is also amended. (Standard Mail (A) is subject to postage at either a minimum rate per piece or a compound rate consisting of a flat piece charge and a pound charge that varies according to the weight of the piece, whichever is higher. The breakpoint is the calculated piece weight at or below which the piece is subject to the minimum per piece rate; above this weight, the piece/pound rate must be paid. Because the breakpoint is based on the mathematical relationship of specific rate elements, it is adjusted whenever rates are changed.)

Because the implemented rates exclude changes for Classroom Periodicals that had been proposed by the Postal Service, the rates for Classroom Periodicals in DMM module R are revised to reflect only the Step 4 rates separately scheduled to take effect October 6, 1996, as prescribed by the Governors of the Postal Service. Under the same scheduled advancement to Step 4, revised rates for Library Mail also take effect October 6, 1996. (Revised Library Mail rates are shown below although not part of Classification Reform II.)

The PRC's Recommended Decision leaves the rate schedule for Classroom Periodicals unchanged, retaining ZIP+4 Classroom rates. However, the Postal Service has adopted standards for ZIP+4 Classroom rate mail that are simpler than and different from those published in DMM Issue 50. Because these standards were not proposed earlier by the Postal Service, they may be changed in the future, based on public comment. In general, the Postal Service proposes eligibility standards for ZIP+4 Classroom rate mail that parallel those for other automation rate Periodicals. Mail preparation standards for ZIP+4 Classroom rate mail would be similar to those for upgradable mail in other classes, except a ZIP+4 code would be required in the address. The Postal Service anticipates minimal adverse impact from this standard, given the applicability of ZIP+4 rates to only letter-size pieces and the likely absence of a significant volume of letter-size mail in the Classroom Periodicals subclass.

The Postal Service is also revising the standard that prohibits the use of certain nonpaper, plastic-like materials (such as spun-bonded olefin) that do not accept the water-based ink used by the Postal Service to spray barcodes on mail. Although the current prohibition applies to pieces

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claimed at ZIP+4 rates, the Postal Service remains interested in optimizing its ability to "upgrade" (i.e., spray a barcode on) that volume of customer mail that was formerly prepared to qualify for the ZIP+4 rates (e.g., compatible with automated address recognition and automated processing) and that will not hereafter be barcoded before entry into the mailstream. For that reason, DMM standards prescribe simpler preparation standards for "upgradable" mail than for other nonupgradable pieces. Because the Postal Service seeks to barcode this mail by means similar to those used for ZIP+4 rate mail, the Postal Service will continue to ban certain nonpaper envelope materials for "upgradable" mail as it has in the past for ZIP+4 rate pieces. This ban is represented by the revision to C830.6.2 shown below.

All references to DMM sections are based on DMM Issue 50 (July 1, 1996).

That standard disregards address placement, except that, for automation rates, mail may be assigned to the other than letters category based on the standards in C820. Address placement is also used to apply the aspect ratio standard in C810 to letter-size automation rates.

The mailer whose permit imprint appears on pieces in a mailing paid with a permit imprint must show that permit number on the postage statement and must pay the annual bulk mailing fee for that permit; this fee is in addition to the fee for an application to use permit imprints.

Presort Accuracy Validation and Evaluation Certification

The United States Postal Service, in cooperation with the mailing industry, has developed a process of evaluating presort software known as PAVE (Presort Accuracy Validation and Evaluation) certification. The process is available only to software and hardware manufacturers who actually develop presort software or manufacture presorting equipment either for retail or for internal use. PAVE provides a common platform to measure the quality of presort products and determines their accuracy in sorting address files according to the requirements set forth in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM). The purpose of PAVE is to improve the accuracy of presorted mailings, thereby improving the flow of your mail.

The list below updates the one published in the August 1996 *Mailroom Companion* and includes all certified products as of August 20, 1996. The newly formatted list is grouped by type of developer and platform where applicable. The list also includes a price range. Please keep in mind these ranges are for quick reference purposes only; contact the developer directly for specifics concerning a product.

Each product provides the necessary standardized documentation needed for mailing under the mailing requirements effective July 1, 1996. Some products also pro-

vide postage statements, bag/sack tags, and additional documentation. These items are indicated by the footnotes noted in the far right column. Each product listed is certified through March 31, 1997.

Although this program evaluates and validates presort products manufactured by the developers, due to the human factor of mail makeup, PAVE *does not guarantee* acceptance of customer mail that was prepared by PAVE-certified hardware/software. Furthermore, while PAVE currently tests 11 different presort categories, not all possible scenarios can be tested. Therefore, if a certified presort product is later found to be in violation of a specific postal regulation, the certification does not allieviate the mailer from his responsibility to correct the violation.

Military Mail Restriction Changes

Effective immediately, the restrictions for mail addressed to, from, or between military post offices overseas have been changed to reflect the new customs forms, PS Form 2976 and PS Form 2976-A, and clarify the mailing restrictions that apply. Table 1 (Conditions Applied to Mail

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. It is also required on all articles that are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Mail order companies must either use Form 2976-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value.

B1. Form 2976 will be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in U.S. dollars) must be enclosed in the package.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length
 42" 72" length and girth combined
 over 42" to 44" 24" girth
 over 44" to 46" 20" girth
 over 46" to 48" 16" girth
 Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided that they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

I. New Account Numbers

Account Title

23432 Accounts Payable and Accruals — Other — Commercial Off the Shelf (COTS) Miscellaneous Undistributed Receipts (Minneapolis, San Mateo and St. Louis ISSCs)

This account is used to record miscellaneous undistributed receipts for the COTS accounts receivable system.

1. Balance (credit) represents collections in COTS accounts receivable for which the proper credit account has not been determined.
2. Credit entries include COTS collections.

CMRS Reporting Changes**CMRS Reporting for Pitney Bowes Discontinued**

Effective accounting period (AP) 1, fiscal year 1997, Pitney Bowes is no longer sending hard copy Computerized Meter Resetting System (CMRS) reports to post offices. The AP 13 CMRS resetting report is the final hard copy report that post offices will receive from Pitney Bowes. Therefore, post offices and district accounting offices are no longer required to report CMRS revenue on the statement of account for Pitney Bowes. The Minneapolis Accounting Service Center is continuing to post CMRS revenue to the applicable finance number as reported by Pitney Bowes.

NMATS Provides Data

With the introduction of the daily electronic meter file transfer, the following changes in the recording of information result:

- National Meter Accounting and Tracking System (NMATS) provides meter information pertaining to customers, meter resets, meter movement activity, or inspection data.

- District accounting offices, upon request, provide CMRS meter revenue information to post offices.
- Post offices are not required to contact Pitney Bowes or meter customers to obtain meter revenue or readings.

CMRS Reporting for Ascom Hasler, Postalia, and Frieden

This change in reporting affects Pitney Bowes *only*. The CMRS reporting for Ascom Hasler, Postalia, and Frieden remains unchanged:

- Post offices continue to post CMRS revenue on the statement of account for those vendors.
- District accounting offices continue to input CMRS revenue for Ascom Hasler, Postalia, and Frieden via the DDE/DR on-line system and Standard Field Accounting System. These vendors will incorporate this process at a later date.

HANDBOOK F-11 AND HANDBOOK F-12 REVISION

Relocation — Threshold for Requiring Receipts

Effective immediately, the receipts requirement of the Postal Service relocation policy is raised to \$25 from \$15. Sections 220 and 421 of Handbook F-11, PCES Relocation Policy, and Sections 532 and 932.42 of Handbook F-12, Relocation Policy, are revised to reflect the new requirement for receipts supporting relocation expenses.

Chapter 2 Advance Round Trip to Seek Housing

220 Reimbursable Expenses

The following actual and reasonable expenses are reimbursable:

- a. Child care will be paid only if your child does not accompany you or your spouse on the advance round trip;
b. Pet care;
c. Coach air travel for you and your spouse and children (or automobile travel at the mileage rate currently allowed in Handbook F-10, Travel Policy, plus tolls and parking fees);
d. Lodging;
e. Automobile rental (excluding collision damage waiver or other insurance);
f. Meals;
g. Laundry and/or dry cleaning service; and
h. Personal phone calls home when you are not accompanied by your immediate family (limited to one 5-minute call per night of trip).

Note: You must provide receipts for all expenses, except for meals under \$25 and authorized personal phone calls.

420 Reimbursable Expenses

421 Actual Temporary Living Quarters Expenses

You will be reimbursed for actual temporary living expenses. Receipts are required for lodging and cleaning expenses. Receipts are required for meals where the combined cost (not the per person cost) of the meal exceeds \$25. Receipts are required for all food purchased at supermarkets, etc., for consumption by the employee and the employee's family. Travelers may not claim reimbursement for both restaurant expenses for every meal and reimbursement for foodstuffs purchased at food stores. Receipts are also required for other subsistence items in excess of \$25.

Subsistence items do not include items such as clothing, toothpaste or toothbrushes, razor blades, hair care products, or small kitchen appliances. Subsistence items do include consumable food products (except alcohol). While receipts for items less than \$25 are not required, you should keep a daily log of such expenses for reference when you prepare your reimbursement voucher.

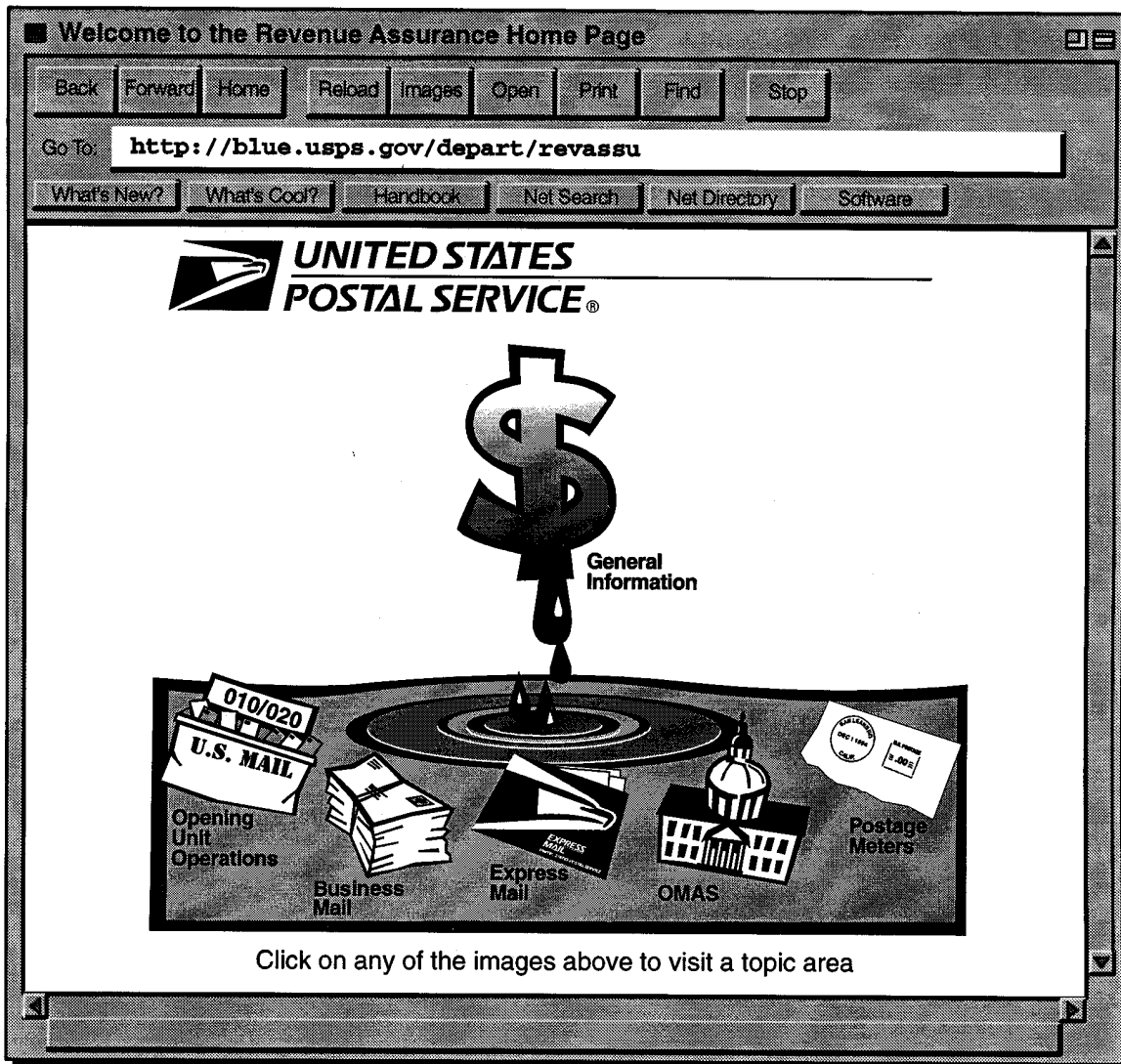

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail

postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

F. Scott Fitzgerald Commemorative Stamp (Literary Arts Series)

The Postal Service will honor F. Scott Fitzgerald with the issuance of a 23-cent commemorative stamp (Item 1073), marking the 100th anniversary of his birth, on September 27, 1996, in St. Paul, Minnesota. This second-ounce rate stamp will be issued in a pane of 50 and will go on sale nationwide September 28.

Designed by Michael Deas of New Orleans, Louisiana, the stamp features a portrait of Fitzgerald with a scene in the background that was inspired by a description from *The Great Gatsby*, one of his most widely read and recognized novels.

Fitzgerald, a great novelist, was born on September 24, 1896, in St. Paul, Minnesota, and was educated at Princeton University (1913–1917). His first novel, *This Side of Paradise* (1920), established him as the spokesman for the “Jazz Age” (a term he coined); his most ambitious work was *Tender Is the Night* (1934). F. Scott Fitzgerald died in Hollywood, California, on December 21, 1940.

Endangered Species Commemorative Stamps



National Stamp Collecting Month 1996 highlights these 15 species to promote awareness of endangered wildlife. Each generation must work to protect the delicate balance of nature, so that future generations may share a sound and healthy planet.

The Postal Service will issue fifteen 32-cent Endangered Species commemorative stamps (Item 4493), in a pane of 15, on October 2, 1996, in San Diego, California, kicking off National Stamp Collecting Month. The stamps go on sale nationwide the same day.

Designed by James Balog of Boulder, Colorado, the stamps feature fifteen pictures of wildlife found on the Endangered Species list of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.

Big Band Leaders/Songwriters Publicity Kit

The Big Band Leaders and Songwriters stamps highlight some of America's best known and most beloved musicians. They will naturally appeal to the generations who first enjoyed this music in the 1930s and 1940s, but they will also appeal to music fans of all ages.

The bandleaders featured on the Big Band Leaders stamps — Count Basie, Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey, Benny Goodman, and Glenn Miller — were music pioneers whose place in the history of jazz and popular music cannot be overstated. Although the "Swing Era" is closely associated with the decade 1935–1945, the music has retained its popularity throughout the years. Evidence of the popularity of the Big Bands is all around: American Movie Classics regularly plays *The Glenn Miller Story*, *The Benny Goodman Story*, and other features with the Big Bands; Swing music is prominently featured in many movies, such as "A League of Their Own" and "Swing Kids." Big Band music, which has changed and progressed since the Swing Era, is still a major force in music. Just check the racks of Big Band CDs at any music store.

Likewise, the songs written by our Songwriters subjects — Harold Arlen, Hoagy Carmichael, Dorothy Fields, and Johnny Mercer — remain as fresh today as they were when they were first performed. Any album by artists such as Frank Sinatra, Tony Bennett, or Barbra Streisand is sure to include songs by one or more of these outstanding composers. Hoagy Carmichael's *Georgia on My Mind* was featured many times during the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.

The audience for these stamps is there, but we need you to help us get the word out. You will be receiving lobby promotional materials including lobby posters, take ones, counter cards, and banners for the large post offices. Following are some simple tools to help you plan activities and garner media attention for these stamps. These include:

- Suggested promotional activities.
- A fill-in news release.
- Media advisory.
- A list of radio stations that you can contact.
- Background information on the artists.

These ideas are just a start. Many of you will surely come up with your own creative ideas. We know that you will have a lot of fun with these stamps and your promotions. Good luck with your media coverage and enjoy.

Publicity Ideas to Interest the Media

As you plan an event to promote the Big Band Leaders/Songwriters stamps, the most important thing to keep in mind is to have fun. Reporters are sure to respond to an event which sounds like it will be fun to cover, and will be enjoyable for their readers, viewers, and listeners. So here are some ideas to capture the media's attention:

- Contact local bands to play in your lobby or outside your office. Many swing bands will be interested in playing for the publicity they will get. Contact a local high school which may have a jazz band or ensemble that will be available to play. Don't limit yourself to the first day that the stamp is available (September 12). You may have better luck getting a band on a Saturday. Have a "Swing Era" day in your lobby, with music and dancing. Have your clerks dress up in World War II vintage clothing.
- Many cities still have ballrooms that have regular Big Band dances. Work with the owners and operators of these ballrooms to create a joint promotion. Have the stamps available for sale at the ballroom. Provide a pictorial cancellation for the evening. (Be sure to follow the guidelines for timely requests for cancellations.)
- Hundreds of radio stations have a Big Bands or "Nostalgia" format, featuring standard popular music by artists of the 40s and 50s. (A list of these stations by state is included on pages 86-87. Since the coverage area of radio stations overlap greatly, coordinate any calls to radio stations through your local Corporate Relations Center.) Contact the program director at a station in your area and offer to be interviewed about the stamps. (Background information on the stamp subjects follows.) Offer philatelic items as prizes for a trivia contest on the radio. Listeners could call in with requests for their favorite songs by the Big Band Leaders and Songwriters.
- Play Big Band music in your lobby for the month of September. Hundreds of CDs and tapes are available featuring one or more of the artists.

Implement any of these ideas, combine them, or brainstorm with your employees and come up with ideas of your own. Be sure to publicize each and every event to your local newspaper, radio and television stations via press releases, media advisories, letters to the media, and follow-up phone calls.

Big Band Leaders and Songwriters Swing into (Your City) Post Office

Your City — Some of America's most beloved musical artists of this century will return to the stage on September 11, as the Postal Service issues the Big Band Leaders and Songwriters stamps, the latest additions to the Legends of American Music stamp series. Five of the greatest band leaders from the Swing Era are portrayed on the four Big Band Leaders stamps: Count Basie, Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey, Benny Goodman, and Glenn Miller. The four subjects for the Songwriters stamps are among the most popular and successful composers of all time: Harold Arlen, Hoagy Carmichael, Dorothy Fields, and Johnny Mercer.

This September marks the third annual American Music Stamp Festival, which in the past has included Popular Singers, Jazz and Blues Singers, and Jazz Musicians among its stamp issues.

"The music of these great artists appeals to just about everybody," says Postmaster (your name). "And I'm sure the stamps will be as popular as their music."

The "Big Band Era" of Swing Music enjoyed its greatest success beginning in the 1930s through World War II. The astounding success of the Benny Goodman Orchestra in 1935 led to the creation of scores of big bands competing for fans. After World War II, most of the bands disappeared, mostly for economic reasons, although several leaders, such as Count Basie and Duke Ellington, continued to lead big bands for many years. Although jazz bands are still a part of the American music scene, especially in schools, the "Big Band Era" remains closely identified with the decade from 1935-1945.

Popular songwriting in America reached its zenith during much the same time period, encouraged by the growth of the musical theater, radio, and the recording industry. Popularized by swing bands and vocalists such as Frank Sinatra, Ella Fitzgerald, Barbra Streisand, and countless others, the works of the great American songwriters have become standards, known and loved by young and old alike.

Background on Big Band Leaders Stamp Subjects

William "Count" Basie (1904–1984)

The most enduring of all the Big Band leaders, Basie's first orchestra in the 1930s perfected the Kansas City style of jazz, a precursor of the Swing Era. The orchestra became a permanent jazz institution with Basie as jazz's elder statesman. Basie's eminence as a bandleader overshadowed his considerable accomplishments as a jazz pianist.

Tommy Dorsey (1905–1956) and Jimmy Dorsey (1904–1957)

The Dorsey Brothers were celebrated as much for their individual musicianship as for their skills as band leaders. They formed a series of bands together, but reached their greatest success with their separate bands.

Jimmy Dorsey, an accomplished clarinetist and alto saxophonist, became known as "King of the Jukebox," as many of his band's recordings became dance hits, including *Tangerine*, *Brazil*, and *Green Eyes*.

Regarded as one of the greatest trombonists of all time, Tommy Dorsey's more jazz-oriented orchestra was also successful, with such hits as *I'm Getting Sentimental Over You* (his theme song), *Marie*, and *I'll Never Smile Again*.

Benny Goodman (1909–1986)

The early success of the "King of Swing" in the 1930s is generally regarded as the beginning of the Big Band Era. The first jazz musician to appear at Carnegie Hall, Goodman was equally at home with classical music as with jazz. He was among the first white bandleaders to feature black players. Among his hits were *Moonglow*, *Flying Home*, and *Don't Be That Way*.

Glenn Miller (1904–1944)

Perhaps the most popular and best remembered of the Big Bands was the Glenn Miller Orchestra. In a relatively brief period, cut short by his death in World War II, Miller established an unforgettable sound with a string of hits, including *In the Mood*, *Moonlight Serenade*, *String of Pearls*, and *Pennsylvania 6-5000*.

Background on Songwriters Stamp Subjects

Harold Arlen (1905–1986)

Harold Arlen's inventiveness as a composer combined aspects of musical theater, Tin Pan Alley, blues, and jazz. His many familiar songs include *Come Rain or Come Shine*, *One for My Baby*, *That Old Black Magic* (all with Johnny Mercer), *Get Happy*, *The Man That Got Away*, and the Academy Award winning *Over the Rainbow*.

Hoagy Carmichael (1899–1981)

Carmichael's easy-going style came through in his singing, piano playing, and acting, as well as his songwriting. His songs frequently celebrated small-town and rural America. His most famous composition, *Stardust*, is one of the most recorded songs of all time. Other well-known Carmichael songs include *The Nearness of You*, *Skylark* (with Johnny Mercer), and *Georgia on My Mind*.

Dorothy Fields (1904–1974)

One of the few women to achieve success in the male-dominated world of songwriting, Fields' career spanned six decades, from *I Can't Give You Anything But Love* in 1927, to the Broadway musical *Seesaw* in 1973. Other classic Fields lyrics include *On the Sunny Side of the Street* and *Big Spender*. She won the Academy Award for *The Way You Look Tonight* in 1936.

Johnny Mercer (1909–1976)

One of the most prolific songwriters of any era, Mercer covered an enormous range of styles. His lyrics often incorporated Southern vernacular into a more sophisticated urban genre. Winner of four Academy Awards, Mercer's most familiar songs include *Moon River*, *Fools Rush In*, *Autumn Leaves*, *Hooray for Hollywood*, *I Thought About You*, *I'm Old Fashioned*, *Laura*, *Satin Doll*, *Summer Wind*, and *Tangerine*.

POSTAL EMPLOYEES

The Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) and Sick Leave for Dependent Care for Rural Carriers

A new Form 1314-F, *Rural Carrier FMLA Certificate* (August 1996), has been developed to identify FMLA and Sick Leave for Dependent Care hours.

For information on FMLA, review *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 515; Publication 71, *Notice for Employees Requesting Leave for Conditions Covered by the Family and Medical Leave Act* (May 1995); and the Guidelines for Sick Leave for Dependent Care.

Rural carriers (designations 71, 72, and 74) are always charged leave in 8-hour increments. Enter the Days Assigned Carrier Absent (DACA) code on Form 1314, *Regular Rural Carrier Time Certificate*. Enter only those hours taken for FMLA reasons on Form 1314-F. FMLA hours should never exceed the number of hours charged.

Rural carriers may take up to 80 hours of earned sick leave for dependent care in a postal leave year. Enter leave in the DACA block on Form 1314 for rural carriers (designations 71, 72, and 74). Enter 8 hours under sick leave for dependent care on Form 1314-F. If sick leave for dependent care hours are to be used for an FMLA-covered condition, enter only those hours taken under FMLA sick leave for dependent care on Form 1314-F.

Replacement carriers (designations 77 and 79) in a leave-earning status who have accrued sick leave may take sick leave for dependent care in hourly increments. The number of hours taken under FMLA Sick Leave (SL) dependent care or non-FMLA sick leave for dependent care are recorded on Form 1314-A, *Rural Carrier Auxiliary Certificate*, and on Form 1314-F. If a replacement carrier is unavailable and it is due to an FMLA reason, record the time on Form 1314-F under replacement carrier unavailable. Complete Form 1314-F using route type and number A996 and submit with the other time certificates for processing at the end of the pay period.

The examples of rural carriers on FMLA given below correspond to the exhibits on pages 90–93.

Exhibit 1. Ms. Smith on route K001 had to leave the route when her daughter became ill at school. Ms. Smith requested SL dependent care for the day. Even though she worked the route for a short period of time, 8 hours is recorded for SL on Form 1314, and 8 hours of SL dependent care is recorded on Form 1314-F.

Exhibit 2. Mr. Roberts must go for physical therapy for a serious health condition every Wednesday. Form 1314 will indicate SL for the entire day but only the hours actually required for physical therapy are recorded as FMLA SL.

Exhibit 3. Mr. Kane must take his wife for chemotherapy on Friday, week 2. Mr. Kane will be charged 8 hours of SL on Form 1314 because he elected to take SL dependent care. Since her illness falls under FMLA, the 4 hours spent in chemotherapy plus the hours transporting her there will be entered under FMLA SL Dependent Care.

Exhibit 4. Ms. Jones is a replacement carrier. She is scheduled to work every Saturday on route K001. Her husband is undergoing treatment for cancer and she is unavailable to work for the next four weeks. Form 1314-F is completed to indicate that she was unavailable due to an FMLA situation. Record the evaluated hours of the route under FMLA replacement carrier unavailable.

An initial distribution of Form 1314-F, *Rural Carrier FMLA Certificate* (August 1996) (PSN 7530-03-000-8007) will be made to all post offices. Additional stock may be obtained from the MDCs in late September. The form on page 94 of this *Postal Bulletin* may be reproduced locally until the initial supply is received.

The C Fund is invested in the Barclays Equity Index Fund, which tracks the S&P 500 stock index. The F Fund is invested in the Barclays U.S. Debt Index Fund, which tracks the Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond index. Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.

The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.
