USPS National Sponsorship — Dollars For Scholars

Again this year, the Postal Service is a national sponsor of Dollars for Scholars, an educational scholarship program. The sponsorship recognizes the Postal Service as the "Official Carrier of the National Dollars for Scholars Organization" for 1997. The Postal Service sponsorship of Dollars for Scholars began last year (see *Postal Bulletin* 21917 (4-11-96)). Dollars for Scholars was selected for sponsorship as part of the Postal Service Marketing Department's educational outreach program. The Postal Service's educational outreach efforts are intended to support education at the local level.

Dollars for Scholars consists of over 760 chapters nationwide. The chapters are community-based, volunteer-directed scholarship foundations affiliated with Citizens' Scholarship Foundation of America, Inc., headquartered in Minnesota. Established in 1958, Dollars for Scholars chapters have awarded over \$270 million to students throughout the country. In recent years, chapters have been established in neighborhoods and communities traditionally underrepresented when securing opportunities for post-secondary

education. In many communities, volunteers begin preparing students at the elementary school level. The goal of Dollars for Scholars is to provide every qualified student an opportunity to attain a college education. They hope to reach that goal by working with the Postal Service.

A list of Dollars for Scholars chapters has been provided to each area office. Anyone interested in volunteering should call Dollars for Scholars at 800-642-7207 for more information or contact the Area Sales Office (Advertising & Promotion) or Corporate Relations Center. Participation is voluntary and should be off-the-clock. Local chapters raise money for scholarships through a variety of means, including direct mail, phone-a-thons, sports tournaments, auctions, and bake sales. Last year some offices cosponsored special events with Dollars for Scholars to attract customers to the post office and to help raise funds for deserving students. Welcome Kit National Test

The Welcome Kit, a new value-added program for customers who move, was recently tested in the Boston, Buffalo, Indianapolis, San Antonio, and Sacramento metropolitan areas. The regional tests ran from May through August 1996, and received a very favorable customer reception. The program is now being expanded to a national market test over the next year. Production is scheduled to begin this month.

The Welcome Kit will be sent, one per household, to customers who submit a change of address order. Key benefits include reduced costs to the Postal Service, new net revenue and improved customer service. The Welcome Kit contains the address change Confirmation Notification Letters (CNL) mailed to new movers along with a variety of helpful move related items and services.

Often the very first mailpiece movers will receive at their new address, the Welcome Kit improves customer service by providing the following valuable information and items:

- The customer's address change Confirmation Notification Letter (CNL).
- The address and phone number of the local post office that serves the new address.
- A *Settling-In Savings* booklet containing helpful information typically needed just after moving.
- Consumer friendly change-of-address information for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, IRS, and voter registration.
- Local telephone numbers and addresses for important services in the customer's new area.

Based on feedback received from over 1,600 customers and 20 postmasters in the regional test markets, the national test is expected to be well received by customers and the media.

DMM NOTICE/REVISION

Barcoded Tray and Sack Labels

Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) M031 and M032 are revised to amend the standards for tray and sack labels. These revisions are effective immediately except for the clarification in DMM M032.2.1c that perforations are not permitted through the barcode or barcode quiet zones on barcoded tray labels. This clarification is effective July 1, 1997, to allow affected mailers time to procure new tray label paper stock. These revisions will appear in DMM Issue 52 (scheduled for release on July 1, 1997).

The revised standards for barcoded tray and sack labels loosen some specifications and clarify the language of some existing requirements. The revised standards also incorporate applicable provisions of DMM M031, general labels, into DMM M032, which pertains to barcoded tray and sack labels, so that all applicable standards for barcoded labels will appear in one place.

DMM M031 pertaining to general label requirements is revised to include changes to the specifications for the paper stock so that the same paper stock can be used for barcoded and nonbarcoded labels. DMM M031 is also revised to include provisions for using the City State File for city and state abbreviations. DMM M032 is reorganized and published in its entirety in this notice, except for the content identifier number (CIN) exhibits.

Following is a listing of other revisions made to DMM M032.

1. Physical Barcoded Tray Label Specifications

- a. *Basis Weight.* The basis weight of the paper stock is reduced from a minimum of 80-pound paper to a minimum of 70-pound paper.
- b. *Thickness.* The minimum thickness of tray labels is reduced from 0.007 to 0.005 inch, and the maximum thickness requirement is removed.
- c. *Height.* The minimum height of tray labels is reduced from 1.9 to 1.860 inches. This will allow use of label stock measuring 1-7/8 (1.875) inches high as well as provide some tolerance for variations in the height of such label stock.
- d. *Length.* The maximum length of tray labels is increased from 3.375 to 3.515 inches. This will allow standard business card paper stock to be used, provided that it meets the basis weight and other requirements.

- e. *Perforations.* A new section is added to clarify that perforations are not permitted through the barcode or barcode quiet zones on tray labels. These perforations can interfere with accurate reading of the barcode. Because the barcode must appear in the middle of the label, this effectively means that perforated paper stock (use of two sack labels to prepare a large tray label) is not permitted for tray labels.
- f. *Reflectance.* A cross-reference to the requirements for reflectance specifications is added to the physical requirements.

2. Printing of Human-Readable Information on Barcoded Tray Labels

- a. *Destination (Line 1).* The minimum height of letters on the destination line is reduced from 0.135 to 0.120 inch. The minimum height of the ZIP Code on the destination line is not changed and remains at 0.190 inch. This allows a standard size font to be used with labels. No change is made to the character-per-inch requirement for this line.
- b. *Content Line (Line 2).* The minimum height of the content line is reduced from 0.135 to 0.120 inch. The maximum character-per-inch requirement is raised from 12 to 17 characters.
- c. *Origin Line (Line 3).* The language pertaining to the existing requirement of a maximum character height of 0.085 inch is clarified. The character-per-inch limit for font density is deleted.
- d. *City/State Abbreviations.* Provisions are added to allow abbreviations for city and state names to be obtained from the City State File as well as from Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*.
- e. *Extraneous Information.* In addition to the current provisions for extraneous information in 6-point or smaller type above the destination line, provisions are made to allow extraneous information to appear at the bottom of the label. This information may begin 1.620 inches from the top of the label and extend to the bottom of the label. Within this lower area, the extraneous information may extend 2.75 inches to the right from the left edge of the label. There are no font restrictions for information printed in this area at the bottom of the

label with two exceptions. If information in this area resembles a day of the week or a USPS air stop code it must be in 10-point or smaller type, and internal mailer barcodes are not permitted in this space or anywhere else on the label, unless approved by USPS Headquarters Engineering (see DMM G043) on a case by case test basis.

3. Barcode Specifications for Barcoded Tray Labels

- a. *Quiet Zones.* The requirements for quiet zones are clarified to eliminate conflicting language. The specifications now clearly state that the quiet zones to the left and right of the barcode must each measure at least 10 times the X dimension, and the quiet zones above and below the barcode must each measure at least 0.070 inch.
- b. *X Dimension.* The definition is clarified in DMM M032.2.4f.
- c. *Printing Tolerances.* The definitions are clarified and examples added in DMM M032.2.4h.

4. Physical Barcoded Sack Label Specifications

Reflectance. A cross-reference to the requirements for reflectance specifications is added to the physical requirements.

5. Printing of Human-Readable Information on Barcoded Sack Labels

- a. *Font Density.* The number of characters per inch permitted on the human-readable lines is increased from 15 to 17 characters.
- b. *Barcode Numeric Line.* A provision for the optional inclusion of a barcode numeric line is added.
- c. *Extraneous Information.* The applicable restrictions on the placement of extraneous information on sack labels in DMM M031 are copied to DMM M032.
- d. *City/State Abbreviations.* A provision is added to allow abbreviations for city and state names to be obtained from the City State File as well as from Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*.

6. Barcode Specifications for Barcoded Sack Labels

- a. *X Dimension.* The definition of the X dimension is clarified in M032.3.3f.
- b. *Printing Tolerances.* The definitions are clarified and examples added in DMM M032.3.3h.

1.4 Line 3

Line 3 (office of mailing or mailer information line) must be the bottom line of required information and must show either the city and state of the entry post office or the mailer's name and the city and state of the mailer's location. It is recommended that the mailer's name also appear with the city and state of the entry post office.

1.6 Abbreviations

Lines 1 and 3 may contain abbreviated information if such abbreviations are those in the City State File or in Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*.

3.2 Specifications

A tray label must meet these specifications:

- a. Color: white or manila for First-Class Mail and Standard Mail (A); pink for Periodicals.
- b. Weight: minimum 70-pound paper stock (500 sheets, 24 by 36 inches).
- c. Height (perpendicular to printing): 1.860 inches minimum; 2.015 inches maximum.
- d. Length (parallel to printing): 3.250 inches minimum; 3.515 inches maximum.
- e. Thickness: 0.005 inch minimum.

M032 Barcoded Labels

[Revise the headings and text of M032 to read as follows:]

1.0 BASIC STANDARDS—TRAY AND SACK LABELS

1.1 Use

Only tray labels may be used for trays; only sack labels may be used for sacks. Effective July 1, 1997, barcoded tray labels are required for all mailings of automation rate First-Class Mail flat-size pieces and automation rate First-Class Mail, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) letter-size pieces.

Effective July 1, 1997, barcoded sack labels are required for all mailings of automation rate Periodicals and Standard Mail (A) flat-size pieces prepared in sacks. Barcoded tray and sack labels are encouraged for use with automation rate mail before that date, and are also encouraged on nonautomation rate mailings. Mailer-produced barcoded tray and sack labels must meet the standards below. Information on labels must be machine-printed. Revisions to preprinted barcoded labels (e.g., handwritten changes) are not permitted. Labels are to be inserted completely into the label holder to ensure that they do not fall out during processing.

1.2 Destination Line (Line 1)

The destination line must meet these standards:

- a. Placement. The destination line must be the top line of the label, placed in the position shown in Exhibit 1.0a or Exhibit 1.0b (above the barcode on tray labels and to the right of the barcode on sack labels). An exception is that one line of extraneous information may appear above the destination line on tray and sack labels as provided in 2.2f and 3.2f. The destination line must be completely visible when placed in the label holder. This visibility is ensured if the top line is no less than 1/8 (0.125) inch below the top of the label when the label is cut and prepared.
- b. Information. The destination line must contain only the information required by the applicable standards for the class, processing category, sortation level of the tray or sack, and the rates claimed. This information is contained in module L labeling lists for all sortation and rate levels except trays and sacks to carrier route, 5-digit carrier routes, and 5-digit destinations and trays to 5-digit scheme destinations. For carrier route, 5-digit carrier routes, and 5-digit trays and sacks, the city and two-letter state abbreviation of the destination 5-digit ZIP Code area must be shown. For 5-digit scheme trays, the city, two-letter state abbreviation, and ZIP Code for the destination scheme must be obtained from the City State File. The destination line may contain abbreviated city and state information if such abbreviations are those in the City State File or in Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*.
- c. Military Destinations. On carrier route, 5-digit carrier routes, and 5-digit trays and sacks for military destinations, the destination 5-digit ZIP Code of the mail contained in the tray or sack must be preceded by "APO" or "FPO," as applicable, and "AE" (for 090-098 ZIP Codes), "AA" (for 340 ZIPs), or "AP" (for 962-966 ZIPs), as applicable.

1.3 Content Line (Line 2)

The content line must meet these standards:

- a. General. The content line must appear directly below the destination line as shown in Exhibit 1.0a or Exhibit 1.0b. This line must show the class, processing category, and effective July 1, 1997, the sortation level of the tray or sack as required by the applicable standards for the mailing. Until July 1, 1997, the applicable content line standards are obtained from either DMM Issue 51 or *Postal Bulletin 21937*. Beginning July 1, 1997, the content line standards in *Postal Bulletin 21937* will be required and will be incorporated into DMM Issue 52. If the content line standards in *Postal Bulletin 21937* are used, the appropriate content identifier number (CIN) in Exhibit 1.3c of *Postal Bulletin 21937* that corresponds to that content line must be used in the barcode. If the content lines in Exhibit 1.3a of DMM Issue 51 are used, the CIN that either matches or best describes the content of the tray from Exhibit 1.3a must be used.
- b. Periodicals. Periodicals publications must use either "PER" or "NEWS" as follows. "NEWS" is used for publications authorized newspaper treatment on March 1, 1984, or that are issued weekly or more frequently. "PER" is used for all other Periodicals publications.
- c. Additional Information. For all classes, as required by the applicable module L labeling list, the content information for some destinations must be followed by additional processing code information, which must be right-justified. For 3-digit scheme trays, the content line for some destinations must be followed by the letter "A," "B," or "C" as specified in the labeling list. For carrier route trays and sacks, the content information must be followed by a one-letter carrier route type description followed by a space and a 3-digit route number for the route to which the tray is destined.

1.4 Origin Line (Line 3)

The origin line must appear below the content line in a location appropriate for a tray or sack as shown in Exhibit 1.0a or Exhibit 1.0b. This line must show the city and state of the entry post office or the mailer's name and the city and state of the mailer's location. It is recommended that the mailer's name also appear with the city and state of the entry post office. The origin line may contain abbreviated city and state information if such abbreviations are those in the City State File or in Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*. A mailer code assigned by the USPS or such words as "Mailer," "From" (or "FR"), or "Entered at" may appear before the required information on this line.

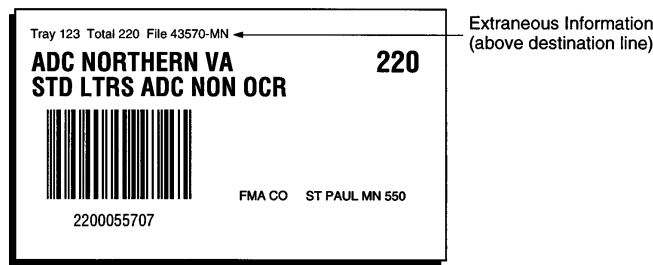
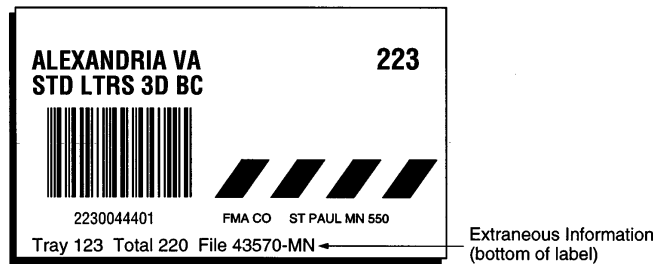
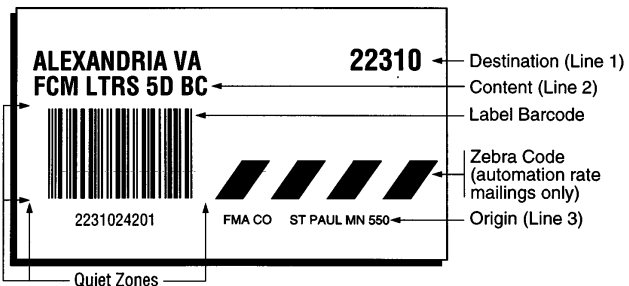


Exhibit 1.0a, Barcoded Tray Labels (not actual size)

Sack Labels, Barcoded

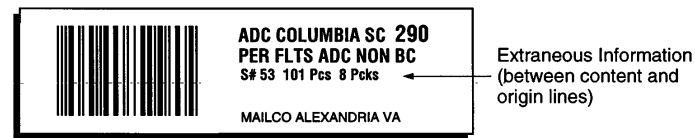
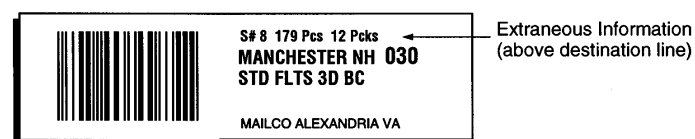
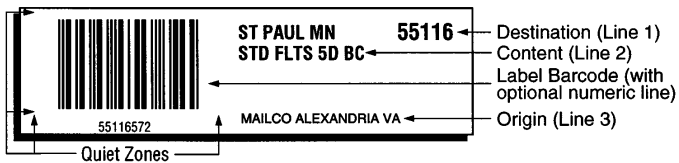


Exhibit 1.0b, Barcoded Sack Labels (not actual size)

2.0 ADDITIONAL STANDARDS—BARCODED TRAY LABELS

2.1 Paper Stock, Size, and Color

A barcoded tray label must meet these specifications:

- a. Color: white or manila for First-Class Mail and Standard Mail (A); pink for Periodicals.
- b. Reflectance: all labels must meet the minimum reflectance requirements specified in 2.4i.
- c. Perforations: effective July 1, 1997, perforations are not permitted through the barcode and barcode quiet zone on labels.
- d. Weight: minimum 70-pound paper stock (500 sheets, 24 by 36 inches).
- e. Height: 1.860 inches minimum; 2.015 inches maximum.
- f. Length: 3.250 inches minimum; 3.515 inches maximum.
- g. Thickness: 0.005 inch minimum.

2.2 Printed Human-Readable Lines

The printed human-readable text lines must meet these specifications:

- a. General. The human-readable lines must be printed in uppercase letters, with no run-on letters or numerals. The letters and numerals in the destination, content, and origin lines must be easy to read. The character spacing can be proportional with respect to the type font used.
- b. Destination Line (Line 1). The printed destination line must have a minimum character height of 0.120 inch and a maximum character density of 17 characters per inch. The corresponding ZIP Code must have a minimum character height of 0.190 inch and a maximum character density of 10 characters per inch. The destination line must accommodate at least 21 characters for the destination city and state and any required prefixes, and 5 characters for the ZIP Code. Only the correct 3-digit ZIP Code prefix is to be printed when the required labeling for a tray includes only a 3-digit ZIP Code prefix for Line 1 (i.e., trailing zeros are not permitted).
- c. Content Line (Line 2). The printed content line must have a minimum character height of 0.120 inch. The content line must accommodate at least 21 characters and have an effective font density of no greater than 17 characters per inch.
- d. Origin Line (Line 3). The printed origin line must have a maximum character height of 0.085 inch and must accommodate at least 21 characters.
- e. Barcode Numeric Line. The barcode numeric line must consist of a numeric representation of the infor-

mation contained in the barcode as required by 2.4b (5-digit ZIP Code, CIN, processing code). The printed numeric barcode line must have a maximum character height of 0.085 inch, must accommodate 10 characters, and must be placed below the barcode and lower barcode quiet zone as shown in Exhibit 1.0a.

- f. Extraneous Information Lines. Extraneous information may be printed only at the top of the label and/or at the bottom of the label. The preferred location is the bottom of the label. If placed at the bottom of the label, the information must appear only in a rectangular area that begins 1.620 inches from the top of the label and extends to the bottom of the label. Within this lower area, the information may extend 2.75 inches to the right from the left edge of the label. See Exhibit 2.2f. Extraneous information at the bottom of the label must appear below the barcode numeric and origin lines. There are no font restrictions for information printed in this area at the bottom of the label with one exception: if information in this area resembles a day of the week or a USPS air stop code it must be in 10-point or smaller type. Extraneous information printed at the top of the label must have a maximum character height of 0.083 inch. Barcodes for a mailer's internal use may not be placed in extraneous information areas or anywhere else on the label, unless approved by USPS Headquarters Engineering (see DMM G043) on a case by case test basis.

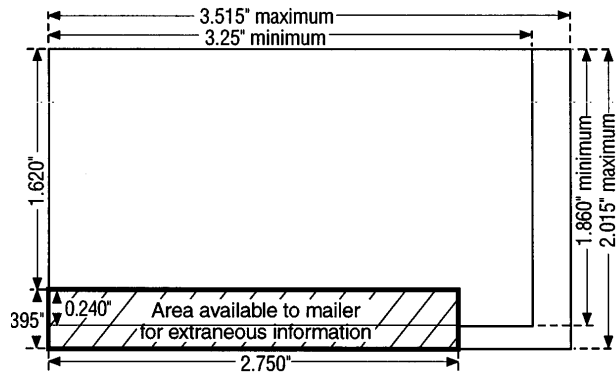


Exhibit 2.2f, Extraneous Information Area at Bottom of Label

2.3 Zebra Code

The zebra code is a series of diagonal or vertical marks to the right of the barcode that serves as a visual indication that a tray contains barcoded automation rate mail. It is required on tray labels in automation rate mailings. The zebra code must not appear on tray labels for nonautomation rate mail. The diagonal or vertical marks must each be from 0.25 to 0.375 inch high, and from 0.125 to 0.25 inch wide, separated by blank spaces equal in size to the diagonal or vertical marks.

2.4 Barcode

The label barcode must meet these specifications:

- a. Type of Barcode. The barcode must be an interleaved 2-of-5 code according to the Automatic Identification Manufacturers' Uniform Symbology Specification (AIM/USS-I 2/5) with the exceptions noted below.
- b. Information. The barcode must represent the following information: the 5-digit ZIP Code destination of the tray (for trays with a 3-digit destination, this is the 3-digit ZIP Code prefix followed by two zeros); the 3-digit content identifier number (CIN) applicable to the content of the tray in either Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin 21937* or Exhibit 1.3a in DMM Issue 51; and the applicable 2-digit USPS processing code. The CINs in Exhibit 1.3a may be used only through June 30, 1997. When Exhibit 1.3a is used, the CIN that best describes the content must be used when there is not an exact match to the content description required by standard. The CINs in Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin 21937* may be used now and will be required effective July 1, 1997. When Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin 21937* is used, the exact CIN for the level of tray for the applicable mailing must be used. The 2-digit processing code "01" is used for automation rate and upgradable letters and for automation First-Class Mail flats. The processing code "07" is used for all other mail.
- c. Placement. The barcode must be on the left side of the tray label, below the destination and content lines. The top of the barcode must be not less than 0.6 inch from the top of the label. The bottom of the barcode must be no more than 1.5 inches from the top of the label. The barcode must not extend more than 2.0 inches to the right from the left edge of the label.
- d. Quiet Zones. Two quiet zones (clear areas) must be maintained, one to the left and one to the right of the barcode, each measuring at least 10 times the X dimension (see 2.4f) and extending the full height of the barcode. Two additional quiet zones must be maintained, one above and one below the barcode for its full width, each measuring at least 0.070 inch. The quiet zones must meet the space reflectance specification in 2.4i.
- e. Height. The height of the barcode must be from 0.65 to 0.75 inch.
- f. X Dimension. The width of the narrow bar element and narrow space element is defined as the X dimension. It must be selected as a single dimension and it must be uniform within the barcode. The minimum X dimension or narrow element width is 0.012 inch and the maximum is 0.016 inch. The optimum X dimension or narrow bar/space width is 0.015 inch.

- g. Wide-to-Narrow Bar Ratio. The wide-to-narrow ratio for bars and spaces within the barcode must be between 3 to 1 and 2.3 to 1 and uniform within the barcode. The optimum ratio is 3 to 1.
- h. Printing Tolerances. The maximum irregularity in the edge straightness of any bar element is 0.3 times the X dimension. The printing tolerance for any (narrow or wide) bar or space is ± 0.004 inch and is not cumulative. Example 1: If an X dimension of 0.015 inch is selected, each individual narrow bar or narrow space element on the printing of the barcode must not be less than 0.011 inch or more than 0.019 inch. Example 2: If the wide bar/space dimension of 0.045 inch is selected, each individual wide bar or space must not be less than 0.041 inch or more than 0.049 inch.
- i. Reflectance. When measured at 633 nanometers, bar reflectance must be less than 30% and space reflectance must be more than 40%. The bar-to-space reflectance difference must be more than 40%.

[Add new 3.0 to read as follows:]

3.0 ADDITIONAL STANDARDS—BARCODED SACK LABELS

3.1 Paper Stock, Size, and Color

A barcoded sack label must meet these specifications:

- a. Color: white or manila for First-Class Mail and Standard Mail; pink for Periodicals.
- b. Reflectance: all labels must meet the minimum reflectance requirements as specified under 3.3i.
- c. Weight: minimum 70-pound paper stock (500 sheets, 24 by 36 inches).
- d. Height: 0.937 inch minimum; 0.980 inch maximum.
- e. Length: 3.250 inches minimum; 3.375 inches maximum.

3.2 Printed Human-Readable Lines

The printed human-readable text lines must meet these specifications:

- a. General. The human-readable lines must be printed in uppercase letters, with no run-on letters or numerals. The letters and numerals in the destination, content, and origin lines must be easy to read. The character spacing can be proportional with respect to the type font used, and should not exceed 17 characters per inch. When the information cannot be shortened by acceptable postal abbreviations, it may be printed in a compressed font. The information must appear to the right of the right barcode quiet zone.
- b. Destination Line (Line 1). The printed destination line must have a minimum character height of 0.083 inch.

The corresponding ZIP Code must have a minimum character height of 0.111 inch. The destination line must accommodate at least 22 characters.

- c. Content Line (Line 2). The printed content line must have a minimum character height of 0.083 inch. The content line must accommodate at least 21 characters.
- d. Origin Line (Line 3). The printed origin line must have a minimum character height of 0.083 inch.
- e. Barcode Numeric Line. A barcode numeric line is optional. If used, the numeric line must consist of a numeric representation of the eight digits of information contained in the barcode as required by 3.3b (5-digit ZIP Code and CIN). The printed numeric barcode line must have a maximum character height of 0.085 inch. It must be placed a minimum of 0.070 inch below the barcode (see Exhibit 1.0b).
- f. Extraneous Information Lines. Extraneous information may be printed only to the right of the right quiet zone if it does not interfere with scanning and sorting by automated equipment. Extraneous information may be placed (1) below the origin line; (2) above the destination line; or (3) either between the content and origin lines or to the right of required information on the origin line, provided that the information does not consist of numerals that resemble a ZIP Code or 3-digit ZIP Code prefix. It is recommended that this information be placed below the origin line. If placed above the destination line, the maximum height of the type is 0.083 inch, and it is further recommended that the information be printed in a size of type much smaller than the size used on the destination line. Extraneous information must not be placed between the destination and content lines.

3.3 Barcode

The label barcode must meet these specifications:

- a. Type of Barcode. The barcode must be an interleaved 2-of-5 code according to the Automatic Identification Manufacturers' Uniform Symbology Specification (AIM/USS-I 2/5) with the exceptions noted below.
- b. Information. The barcode must represent the following information: the 5-digit ZIP Code destination of the sack (for sacks with a 3-digit destination, this is the 3-digit ZIP Code prefix followed by two zeros); and the 3-digit content identifier number (CIN) applicable to the content of the sack in Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin* 21937 or Exhibit 1.3a in DMM Issue 51. The CINs in Exhibit 1.3a may be used only through June 30, 1997.

When Exhibit 1.3a is used, the CIN that best describes the content must be used when there is not an exact match to the content description required by standard. The CINs in Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin* 21937 may be used now and will be required effective July 1, 1997. When Exhibit 1.3c in *Postal Bulletin* 21937 is used, the exact CIN for the level of sack for the applicable mailing must be used.

- c. Placement. The barcode must be on the left side of the sack label.
- d. Quiet Zones. Two quiet zones (clear areas) must be maintained, one to the left and one to the right of the barcode, each measuring at least 10 times the X dimension (see 3.3f) and extending the full height of the barcode. The quiet zones must meet the space reflectance specification in 3.3i.
- e. Height. The height of the barcode must be at least 0.700 inch.
- f. X Dimension. The width of the narrow bar element and narrow space element is defined as the X dimension. It must be selected as a single dimension and it must be uniform within the barcode. The minimum X dimension or narrow element width is 0.012 inch and the maximum is 0.016 inch. The optimum X dimension or narrow bar/space width is 0.015 inch.
- g. Wide-to-Narrow Bar Ratio. The wide-to-narrow ratio for bars and spaces within the barcode must be between 3 to 1 and 2.3 to 1 and be uniform within the barcode. The optimum ratio is 3 to 1.
- h. Printing Tolerances. The maximum irregularity in the edge straightness of any bar element is 0.3 times the X dimension. The printing tolerance for any (narrow or wide) bar or space is ± 0.004 inch and is not cumulative. Example 1: If an X dimension of 0.015 inch is selected, each individual narrow bar or narrow space element on the printing of the barcode must not be less than 0.011 inch or more than 0.019 inch. Example 2: If the wide bar/space dimension of 0.045 inch is selected, each individual wide bar or space must not be less than 0.041 inch or more than 0.049 inch.
- i. Reflectance. When measured at 633 nanometers, bar reflectance must be less than 30% and space reflectance must be more than 40%. The bar-to-space reflectance difference must be more than 40%.

DMM NOTICE

Business Reply Mail—Address Block Barcoding Approved

Effective March 1, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E060.11.0, S922.4.0, and S922.5.0 are amended to give any business reply mail (BRM) permit holder who uses window envelopes or address labels the option of printing ZIP+4 barcodes as part of the delivery address block for prebarcoded BRM letter-size and flat-size pieces.

The address block barcode style may be used only if the address block is printed either on an insert that shows through a window of a window envelope or on a label affixed to the outside of the mailpiece. The permit holder may continue using the lower right corner of the BRM piece for printing the ZIP+4 barcode directly on the piece or on an insert or label that shows through a window in the lower right barcode clear zone. In either case, only ZIP+4 barcodes assigned by the Postal Service may be used for BRM.

DMM E060.11.0 is also amended to clarify the requirements for official government BRM enclosed in automation rate mailings. The headings for DMM S922.6.0 and S922.7.0 are retitled to set off the different physical characteristics of standard BRM and BRM sent under the automated Business Reply Mail Accounting System (BRMAS).

If the address block barcode option is used, the barcode must meet the technical specifications in DMM C840.2.5, including clearance around the barcode and positioning of the barcode. When the barcode is part of the address block, the barcode must be placed in one of the following positions:

- Above the top address line (usually the line containing the recipient's or company's name).
- Below the bottom address line (the line containing the city, state (or two-letter state abbreviation), and ZIP Code or ZIP+4 code).
- Above or below any keyline information (nonaddress information used by the BRM permit holder) printed above the address block.

These amendments will be included in DMM Issue 52 (scheduled for release on July 1, 1997).

- a. The address may be printed, typewritten, or hand-stamped directly on the mailpiece or printed on a label affixed in the address area. The address must not be handwritten. BRM enclosed in automation rate mailings must meet the standards in C810 and S922.

4.8 Delivery Address

[Revise the introductory text of 4.8 and 4.8b to read as follows:]

Unless printed on a label or on an insert for a window envelope under 5.0 and 6.0, the complete address (including the permit holder's name, street address and/or post office box number, city, state, and ZIP Code) must be printed directly on the mailpiece, subject to these conditions:

- b. Preprinted labels with only delivery address information (including a ZIP+4 block barcode under 5.0) are permitted for addressing BRM but the permit holder's name must still be printed on the BRM. Permit holders are liable for the postage and fees on BRM returned with improper addressing.

[Revise 5.0 to read as follows:]

5.0 PREBARCODED BRM

5.1 General Format Standards

Prebarcoding of BRM is optional except for letter-size BRM enclosed in automation rate mailings and for BRM processed through the Business Reply Mail Accounting System (BRMAS). Prebarcoded BRM must meet all general format

standards in 4.0, the applicable barcoding standards in C840 and exceptions to C840 in 5.2 through 5.6, and these standards:

- a. Facing identification mark (FIM) C must be used.
- b. The ZIP+4 codes and barcodes assigned to the BRM permit holder by the USPS must be used. Delivery point barcodes are not permitted on BRM.
- c. The ZIP+4 barcode must be placed on the address side of the piece and positioned in either of these two locations:
 - (1) As part of the delivery address block under C840 if printed on an insert placed in a window envelope or on a label affixed directly to the piece.
 - (2) Within the barcode clear zone in the lower right corner of the piece if printed directly on the piece or if printed on an insert or a label affixed to an insert and placed in an envelope with a barcode window under 5.3 or a delivery address window under 5.4.

5.2 Lower Right Barcode

If the barcode is printed on the piece in the lower right corner, these standards must be met:

- a. The barcode clear zone must contain only the barcode.
- b. The boundaries of the barcode clear zone must, at a minimum, be within these boundaries:
 - (1) Left: 4-1/2 inches (or expanded to 4-3/4 inches at the mailer's option) from the right edge of the piece.
 - (2) Right: right edge of the piece.
 - (3) Top: 5/8 inch from the bottom edge of the piece.
 - (4) Bottom: bottom edge of the piece.
- c. The leftmost bar of the barcode must be between 3-1/4 and 4 inches from the right edge of the piece (or, at the mailer's option, between 3-1/2 and 4-1/4 inches if the expanded barcode clear zone is used that measures 4-3/4 inches from the right edge of the piece).

5.3 Barcode Window

A barcode window may be used to display a barcode on an insert in the barcode clear zone defined in 5.2 if the window meets these standards:

- a. A nontinted clear or transparent material must cover the window, with all edges securely glued to the envelope. When viewed through the window material, the barcode must meet the reflectance standard in C840.
- b. The boundaries of the rectangular area of the window (defined by its four edges) must meet these minimum dimensions:
 - (1) Left: 4-1/2 inches from the right edge of the piece.

- (2) Right: 1/4 inch from the right edge of the piece.
- (3) Top: 5/8 inch from the bottom edge of the piece.
- (4) Bottom: bottom edge of the piece.

- c. The bottom edge of the window must be of wrap-around construction.

5.4 Delivery Address Window

If a barcode is part of the delivery address block printed on an insert (or a label affixed to an insert) and appears through a window, the barcode must meet the standards in 5.1 and the standards in C840 for location and optional placement in the address block. If the barcode is not part of the delivery address block and appears through a window in the barcode clear zone, the barcode location must meet these standards:

- a. During the full range of motion of the insert within the envelope, these minimum clear spaces must be maintained:
 - (1) 1/8 inch between the barcode and the left and right window edges.
 - (2) 1/25 inch between the barcode and the top window edge.
 - (3) 3/16 inch between the barcode and the bottom edge of the mailpiece.
- b. Only the ZIP+4 barcode is permitted in the barcode clear zone.
- c. Horizontally, the leftmost bar of the barcode must be between 3-1/4 and 4 inches from the right edge of the mailpiece.
- d. Vertically, the barcode must be within an area between 3/16 and 7/16 inch from the bottom edge of the piece; the bottom of the barcode must be 1/4 inch ($\pm 1/16$ inch) from the bottom edge of the piece.

5.5 BRMAS

BRM prepared by a BRMAS participant must be ZIP+4 barcoded and must meet the applicable barcode standards in C840 and in 5.1 through 5.4.

5.6 Samples

The mailer may submit preproduction samples of BRM to the USPS for approval.

5.7 Error Notification

If the USPS discovers a BRM format error, the responsible permit holder or authorized permit user receives written notification of the error and applicable specification. The permit holder must correct the error and make sure that all future BRM pieces distributed by any means meet appropriate specifications. The repeated mailing of BRM with a format error, as determined by the USPS, is grounds for revoking a business reply permit. To obtain a new permit after a BRM permit is revoked for not following BRM format specifica-

tions, a former permit holder must complete a new application on Form 3615, pay the required BRM permit fee, pay a new business reply accounting fee if applicable, and submit two samples of each BRM format to the appropriate post office for approval for the next 2-year period.

DMM REVISION

Placement of Ancillary Service Endorsements

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) A010.4.2 and M012.4.0 are amended to clarify the required use and placement of a return address on mail with an ancillary service endorsement (a specific marking required under DMM F010 for address correction, forwarding, and return services) and to expand from one to four locations on a mailpiece where a mailer may print ancillary service endorsements.

In addition to the current location under the return address, these ancillary service endorsements may be placed immediately above the delivery address block, immediately below the postage area (postage stamps, meter stamps, or permit imprints), or immediately to the left of the postage area.

All other physical standards for these endorsements are unchanged (such as a clear space of at least 1/4 inch around the endorsement, read direction of the endorsement and return address, minimum 8-point type size for the lettering, and color contrast with the background of the mailpiece).

4.2 Ancillary Services

The USPS uses the return address to provide ancillary services requested by the mailer (e.g., “Return Postage Guaranteed”). The return address on any mailpiece endorsed for an ancillary service must identify where the piece is to be returned and where the mailer is prepared to pay applicable postage and fees for pieces returned or for ancillary service provided at the mailer’s request. The return address must be

placed in the upper left corner of the address side of the piece or the upper left corner of the addressing area. If a return receipt is used, both the piece and the affixed return receipt must bear the return address of either the mailer or the mailer’s agent.

M012 Markings and Endorsements

[Revise the heading of 4.0 to read as follows:]

4.0 ENDORSEMENTS—DELIVERY AND ANCILLARY SERVICE

[Amend 4.0 by revising 4.1, 4.2, and 4.3; by revising and combining current 4.4, 4.5, and 4.6 into new 4.4; and by revising and redesignating current 4.7 as 4.5 to read as follows:]

4.1 General

The mailer must place the correct endorsement on each mailpiece to provide delivery instructions (retention period under F030 or carrier release under D042) or to request an ancillary service (forwarding, return, or address correction) under F010, subject to the corresponding standards for use and availability.

4.2 Return Address

A return address as presented in A010 must be used and placed in the upper left corner of the address side of the mailpiece or the upper left corner of the addressing area. If the return address is a multiple delivery address, it must show a unit designation (e.g., an apartment number).

4.3 Placement

The placement of the endorsement on the mailpiece is determined as follows:

- a. The carrier release endorsement must be immediately below the return address. If any other endorsement is used, the carrier release endorsement must be sepa-

- rated by the equivalent of one blank line of the type size used.
- b. A retention period specified by the mailer must be immediately above the return address.
- c. Any ancillary service endorsement must be placed in one of these four positions:
 - (1) Immediately below the return address.
 - (2) Immediately above the delivery address area (which includes the delivery address block and any related nonaddress elements such as a barcode, keyline, or optional endorsement line).
 - (3) Immediately to the left of the postage area and below any rate marking.
 - (4) Immediately below the postage area and below any rate marking.

4.4 Other Physical Standards

The endorsement or, if combined, endorsements, must meet these physical standards:

- a. The type size of the endorsement must be at least 8 points.
- b. The read direction of the endorsement and return address must be the same as the delivery address.
- c. The color contrast between the endorsement and the mailpiece background must be kept at a reasonable degree. A brilliant colored background or reverse printing is not permitted.
- d. A clear space of at least 1/4 inch around (above, below, and both sides) the total area containing the endorsement(s) must be kept.

4.5 OCR Read Area

Any printing (including an endorsement or return address) on upgradable letter-size First-Class Mail or Standard Mail (A), or on letter-size ZIP+4 Classroom Periodicals, must not interfere with the delivery address lines within the OCR read area defined in C830.

POM REVISION

Approved Curbside Mailbox Manufacturers and Models

Effective immediately, *Postal Operations Manual (POM)* 632.518 is revised to update the list of approved manufacturers of curbside mailboxes for use on city and rural delivery routes. Also, for your convenience, POM 632.511 and 632.512 are reprinted below.

The list of approved manufacturers of curbside mailboxes should be shared with delivery personnel and customers. If a customer is currently using a mailbox that is not on the approved list, they cannot be forced to replace the mailbox unless it poses a hazard to the carrier or does not protect the mail. Encourage your customers to replace old and damaged mailboxes quickly.

Mailboxes must be placed so they can be safely and conveniently served by carriers without leaving their vehicles. They must be on the right side of the road in the direction of travel of the carrier in all cases where traffic conditions are such that it would be dangerous for the carriers to drive to the left to reach the boxes, or where their doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations. Generally, boxes should be installed with the bottom of the box at a vertical height of between 3-1/2 to 4 feet from the road surface and placed to conform to state laws and regulations. Since road and curb conditions vary, the USPS recommends that customers be advised to contact their postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing their mailboxes and supports.

Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) D041 contains additional information about curbside mailboxes.

Pacific 97 Stagecoach and Ship Triangular Commemorative Stamps

The Postal Service will issue two 32-cent Pacific 97 commemorative stamps in a pane of 16 (Item 4432) on March 13, 1997, in New York, New York. The stamps go on sale nationwide on March 14.

Designed by Richard D. Sheaff of Norwood, Massachusetts, the stamps feature two designs, one of a U.S. Mail stagecoach and one of a clipper ship, both from the 1800s. These will be the first triangular stamps the United States Postal Service has ever issued. The sheet of 16 stamps will form an unusual configuration of four squares, each square being formed by four connecting triangles. There is also a small type header identifying the place and dates of the Pacific 97 International Stamp Exhibition.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 30 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase the new stamps at their local post office, affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

Distribution

All stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive two distributions of half the standard for a 16-stamps-per-pane issue, rounded to the nearest master carton size (56,000 stamps). SDOs and SDNs will make one distribution to post offices equaling half their standard automatic distribution using Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, and Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. SDOs and SDNs must not distribute stamps to post offices before March 5, 1997.

Philatelic Requirements

SDOs and SDNs with authorized philatelic centers will receive automatic distributions of this stamp in six positions in the following quantities for subsequent distribution to each center:

Additional Supply

Post offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO, using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, or designated SDN, using a separate Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from their designated accountable paper depository (APD), using a separate Form 17.

The Washington, D.C.; Memphis, Tennessee; Chicago, Illinois; Denver, Colorado; and San Francisco, California, APDs will receive 2,856,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders. The New York, New York, APD and Kansas City, Missouri, SDN will receive 2,912,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders.

Sales Policy

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale, usually 1 year from the date of issue. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities through their normal ordering procedures.

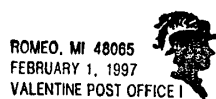

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-

mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap.
