REMINDER

Address Information for Government Agencies

For years the Postal Service has provided customer address information to federal, state, and local government agencies when the agencies submit an Address Information Request to the post office serving the customer's last known address. Refer to *Administrative Support Manual (ASM)* sections 352.44d(1) and 352.44f for the procedures for providing this service. ASM Exhibit 352.44b shows the standard format that government agencies use for their requests. *Postal Bulletin* 21872 (7-21-94) explains this in detail.

There is no requirement in postal regulations for government agencies requesting address information pursuant to ASM 352.44 to submit their requests in duplicate, to supply postage paid self-addressed return envelopes, or to pay postage. Post offices may not impose such requirements.

New Features In Touch Tone Order Entry System

Two new features have been added to the touch tone order entry (TTOE) system. It now keeps track of the number of accepted items and the cost of the order for each caller. At the end of the ordering process, TTOE will repeat the customer order number and then give the caller the following information:

“Total transactions processed” <number processed>
“with an approximate cost of” <total cost of order>.

This response will alert the caller when:

1. The number of transactions accepted differs from the number they entered.

2. The item was ordered by the wrong unit of issue.
3. A Rapid Equipment Deployment Inventory (REDI) item was ordered in error.

All potential ordering problems can be corrected by dialing “0” at the end of your order. Your call will be transferred to a customer service clerk. If you have already exited your order, dial 800-332-0317 and press 3. By correcting these orders before processing, we can reduce your costs and possible returns.

PM REVISION

Purchasing Implications of the Year 2000

Introduction

The turn of the century will have a major impact on current and future Postal Service purchases. The widespread use of the two-digit year may prevent computers from recognizing the Year 2000 as succeeding the year 1999. In addition, any system that shares, manipulates, or takes action based on a date has the potential for failure or inaccurate operation. To avoid or correct these problems, certain statements of work, solicitations, and existing and future contracts will require specialized terms and conditions to ensure the ongoing effectiveness of Postal Service systems.

Effectively meeting this challenge will require purchase teams (groups of Postal Service internal business partners with an interest in a specific purchase or contract) to determine the need for (1) statements of work and specifications addressing Year 2000 implications; (2) contractual clauses requiring suppliers to be "Year 2000 compliant" (see below); and (3) modifying existing contracts as appropriate to ensure such compliance. Year 2000 compliance must be achieved before the involved system could take any date-related action that would cause the system to fail (this would primarily involve encountering dates past December 31, 1999, for calendar year actions and September 10, 1999, for fiscal year actions). Existing or future purchases potentially affected include not only those of information technology; they also include systems that are sensitive to date or date-related data, such as heating/ventilating and air conditioning or elevator systems. The following provides guidance in this effort, and includes necessary revisions to the *Purchasing Manual* (PM).

Solicitations and Statements of Work

Solicitations and statements of work should describe existing systems or products (firmware, middleware, etc.) to be used with the technology being purchased and, as appropriate, whether the existing systems and products are Year 2000 compliant, or efforts are underway to make them so. Statements of work must specifically list any items which must work together, whether or not the supplier will be liable for Year 2000 compliance of the total system. Any requirement that the supplier must provide Year 2000 compliance for an existing system or must provide a Year 2000 compliant interface with it must be specifically stated in the statement of work.

Existing Contracts

Purchase teams must examine existing contracts in order to determine if they should be modified to ensure Year 2000 compliance, particularly if the item purchased is one of those listed in 1.7.14.d.2 of the following PM revision. However,

contracts should not be modified without first obtaining an impact statement, and, if applicable, a cost proposal, from the supplier.

Purchasing Manual Revisions

These clauses will be included in the next release of the applicable contract-writing systems. This policy will be included in the next issuance of the *Purchasing Manual*. Until then, purchase teams must ensure that the clauses are manually included in the appropriate contracts.

Note: The following revisions are effective immediately and must be followed with respect to purchases made under Publication 41, *USPS Procurement Manual*, as well as the *Purchasing Manual*. Questions on this matter should be directed to Policies, Plans and Diversity, Purchasing and Materials at Headquarters (202-268-4638).

1.7.14 Year 2000 Compliance

a. Policy. Due to the important effect the turn of the century will have on systems used throughout the Postal Service, purchase teams must ensure that appropriate specifications and statements of work, and resulting contracts, address the subject of Year 2000 compliance (see 1.7.14.b). Specifically, solicitations and resulting contracts for information technology (see 4.6.5) and for any other systems affected by the turn of the century must:

1. Require that all systems be Year 2000 compliant; or
2. If the Postal Service wishes to accept offers from suppliers that do not have Year 2000 compliant products, the products must be upgraded to achieve Year 2000 compliance prior to when the product would encounter dates which would cause it to fail (this would primarily involve encountering dates past December 31, 1999, for calendar year actions and September 10, 1999, for fiscal year actions).

b. Definition. "Year 2000 compliance" means a system that accurately processes date data (including, but not limited to, calculating, comparing, and sequencing) from, into, and between the twentieth and twenty-first centuries, and leap year calculations. In addition, Year 2000 compliant systems, when used in combination with other information technology or controlled systems, must accurately process date data (and date-related data) if the other systems properly exchange date data with it.

c. Identifying Existing Systems. When appropriate, purchase teams must ensure that solicitations describe existing systems to be used with systems being purchased, and identify whether the existing system is Year 2000 compliant.

d. New Purchases.

1. When purchasing the items listed below, the purchase team must ensure that one of the clauses referenced in 1.7.14.e is included in the contractual documentation. If the purchase team is purchasing an item not listed, and is unsure if the item may be affected by the turn of the century, it should include one of the clauses described in 1.7.14.e in the contractual documentation. In these cases, purchase teams must thoroughly consider what is being purchased and its effect on Postal Service operations.

2. When purchasing any of the following, include one of the clauses referenced in 1.7.14.e:

(a) Information technology (see 4.6.5);

(b) Controlled systems (such as heating, ventilating and air conditioning, elevator, security or alarm, or uninterruptible power systems);

(c) Mail processing systems;

(d) Any item or product containing an imbedded computer chip or circuit board (such as calculators, FAX machines, security vaults, or testing and measuring equipment); and

(e) Services (such as systems development) involving the use of any of the above.

e. Clauses. Contracting officers must include Clause 1-12, *Year 2000 Warranty — Commercial Items*, or Clause 1-13, *Year 2000 Warranty — Noncommercial Items*, when required by 1.7.14.d.

The supplier warrants that each hardware, software, and firmware product delivered under this contract and listed below will be able to accurately process date data (including, but not limited to, calculating, comparing, and sequencing) from, into, and between the twentieth and twenty-first centuries, including leap year calculations, when used in accordance with the documentation provided by the supplier, provided that all listed or unlisted products (e.g., hardware, software, firmware) used in combination with such listed item properly exchange date data with it. If the contract requires that specific listed products must perform as a system in accordance with the foregoing warranty, then that warranty will apply to those listed products as a system. The duration of this warranty and the remedies available to the Postal Service for breach of this warranty will be as defined in, and subject to, the terms and limitations of the supplier's standard commercial warranty or warranties contained in this contract, provided that notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in such commercial warranty or warranties, the remedies available to the Postal Service under this warranty will include repair or replacement of any listed product whose noncompliance is discovered and made known to the supplier in writing within 90 days after acceptance. Nothing in this warranty may be construed to limit any rights or remedies the Postal Service may otherwise have under this contract with respect to defects other than Year 2000 compliance.

dance with the documentation provided by the supplier, provided that all listed or unlisted products (e.g., hardware, software, firmware) used in combination with such listed item properly exchange date data with it. If the contract requires that specific listed products must perform as a system in accordance with the foregoing warranty, then that warranty will apply to those listed products as a system. The duration of this warranty and the remedies available to the Postal Service for breach of this warranty will be as defined in, and subject to, the terms and limitations of the supplier's standard commercial warranty or warranties contained in this contract, provided that notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in such commercial warranty or warranties, the remedies available to the Postal Service under this warranty will include repair or replacement of any listed product whose noncompliance is discovered and made known to the supplier in writing within 90 days after acceptance. Nothing in this warranty may be construed to limit any rights or remedies the Postal Service may otherwise have under this contract with respect to defects other than Year 2000 compliance.

Clause 1-13, Year 2000 Warranty — Noncommercial Items

The supplier warrants that each noncommercial item of hardware, software, and firmware delivered or developed under this contract and listed below ("listed below" refers to items that the supplier has identified as being Year 2000 compliant in response to the solicitation) will be able to accurately process date data (including, but not limited to, calculating, comparing, and sequencing) from, into, and between the twentieth and twenty-first centuries, including leap year calculations, when used in accordance with the item documentation provided by the supplier, provided that all listed or unlisted items (e.g., hardware, software, firmware) used in combination with such listed items properly exchange date data with it. If the contract requires that specific listed items must perform as a system in accordance with the foregoing warranty, then that warranty will apply to those listed items as a system. The duration of this warranty and the remedies available to the Postal Service for breach of this warranty will be as defined in, and subject to, the terms and limitations of any general warranty provisions of this contract, provided that notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary in such warranty provision(s), or the absence of any such warranty provision(s), the remedies available to the Postal Service under this warranty will include repair or replacement of any listed item whose noncompliance is discovered and made known to the supplier in writing within 90 days after acceptance. Nothing in this warranty will be construed to limit any rights or remedies the Postal Service may otherwise have under this contract with respect to defects other than Year 2000 performance.

Item PS O817A, Tin Band Seals

The Postal Service has modified Item O817A, Tin Band Ball Seal. Item O817A is used with PS Form 5398-A, *Contract Route Vehicle Record*, and fastened to the doors of highway and rail contract vehicles. In some cases, Item O817A may be used on mail transport containers. Item O817A is used only internally. The new Item O817A includes the following three changes, intended to enhance USPS operations:

1. Changed the color from silver to International Orange to increase visibility from a distance.
2. Included an I 2/5 symbology barcode to allow automated scanning and capture with the Transportation Information Management and Evaluation System (TIMES) hand-held scanners.

3. Removed the embossed words "U.S. Mail" and added "USPS-Mail" embossed in a smaller font to accommodate placement of the new barcode.

These changes **do not** affect manual use of the seals or manual procedures. They also do not affect Item O817C, which is used on registered mail containers.

New seals will be phased in at the end of May 1997, replacing old stock.

Please advise all employees immediately that the new indicia is valid for postage payment.

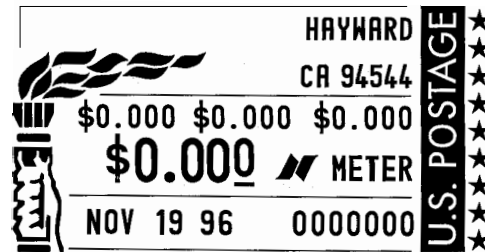

Statement of Account Submission — Accounting Period 9, FY 1997

The normal submission schedule for statement of accounts and standard field accounting system transmission to Minneapolis Accounting Service Center for accounting period 9, postal fiscal year (PFY) 1997, has been extended. Global Package Link

Effective June 8, 1997, the Postal Service is announcing a change in service and rates to Japan. The three levels of service will be reduced to two levels. The Express service is renamed Premium and the current Standard and Economy services are merged to a new Standard service. Insurance for this new Standard service is no longer available. Additionally, the discount rate and regular rates are adjusted slightly.

This change supersedes the information about GPL published in *Postal Bulletin* 21943 (4-10-97).

IMM REMINDER

Insured Parcels To Brazil

The New Jersey International and Bulk Mail Center (NJI&BMC) reports that it repeatedly receives insured surface parcels that are for dispatch to Brazil. Because that constitutes a mail entry irregularity, operational personnel at that postal installation are returning improperly insured parcels to the U.S. sender when they are detected. This procedure results in additional piece handling, increased cost, and, in many instances, reduced customer satisfaction.

In an effort to rectify this situation, acceptance employees are hereby reminded that **only air parcels** to Brazil may be insured. Surface parcels mailed to that country are *not* eligi-

ble for insurance coverage, irrespective of their content or value.

When responding to customer inquiries about this limitation on parcel insurance to Brazil, acceptance employees should make reference to the mailing restriction, at the bottom of the Insurance Fee Chart, in the Individual Country Listing for Brazil in *International Mail Manual* Issue 17.

International Customized Mail

On February 26, 1997, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail service agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information about that service agreement:

- a. **Term:** March 1, 1997, through December 31, 1997.
- b. **Type of Mail:** Every item must comply with design requirements for international mail set forth in the IMM except as those requirements conflict with the applicable Specific Requirements set forth in the Service Agreement. Printed matter: The piece weight over the term of the agreement must be no less than 2 ounces and no greater than 3.5 pounds for a certain type of bulk printed matter. Every item must comply with the size limits for printed matter set forth in IMM 246.8, IMM 247.2, or IMM 283. Parcels: Every item must comply with the size limits as set forth in IMM 213 or IMM 623.3. The average piece weight for EMS parcels shall not be less than 10 pounds over the term of the agreement.
- c. **Destination Countries:** Printed matter and parcels destined worldwide during the term of the agreement.
- d. **Services Provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to (1) furnish the mailer or mailer's mailing agents with the required international mail equipment; (2) to provide the mailer or mailer's mailing agents training necessary to comply with requirements for qualifying mail; (3) to contract with air and surface carriers, as appropriate, for qualifying mail to be transported internationally for delivery by the destinating foreign postal administrations.

- e. **Minimum Volume Commitments:** The mailer has agreed to use the Postal Service for all of its international mailings of a certain type as provided in the service agreement while their service agreement is in effect. The mailer is required to meet an overall minimum annual volume commitment for the following: (1) 240,000 pieces of a certain type of bulk printed matter as either VALUEPOST/Canada, ISAL, or IPAS; (2) 40,000 pieces for parcels mailed as either GPL or EMS; (3) the country relationship should not have more than a +/- 20% variance for printed matter and EMS parcels based upon the supplied data. The mailer has agreed to tender parcels to certain countries in accordance with the requirements of Global Package Link.
- f. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to tender a certain type of bulk printed matter to the Postal Service at the designated Postal Service facilities.
- g. **Rates:** Postage for printed matter destined to Canada will be \$0.99 per pound and \$0.10 per piece. Postage for shipments of printed matter to all countries except parcels to a certain countries, the mailer will abide by published rates for GPL. Postage for all other parcels mailed via EMS will be \$3.05 per pound and \$1 per piece.

All packages must be large enough to accommodate the necessary labels and customs forms on the address side.

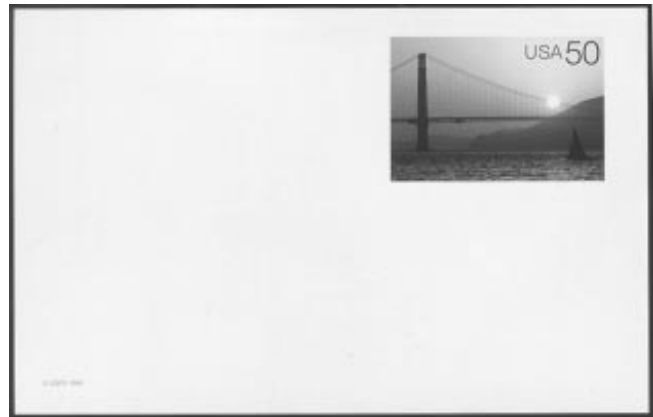

Initial Supply

SDOs and SDNs must not distribute these postal cards to post offices before May 27, 1997.

Additional Supply

The Government Printing Office (GPO) will disburse *all* of these commemorative postal cards to SDOs and SDNs; therefore, they will not have any cards for reordering. The New York accountable paper depository (APD) and Kansas City SDN will receive 25,000 postal cards of each issue for filling supplemental orders. All other APDs and the Dulles SDN will receive 20,000 cards of each issue for filling supplemental orders. SDOs requiring additional postal cards must order them from their appropriate APD, using a separate PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. All other post offices requiring additional postal cards must requisition them from their designated SDO on a separate PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, or SDN, using a separate PS Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs with authorized philatelic centers will receive their standard quantities for a commemorative postal card to provide subsequent automatic distribution to each philatelic center.

Sales Policy

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative postal card as long as customer demand exists or until it is officially withdrawn from sale, generally 1 year from the date of issue. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities through their normal ordering procedures.

The Marshall Plan Commemorative Stamp

The Postal Service commemorates The Marshall Plan with the issuance of a 32-cent stamp, in a pane of 20 (Item 4422), on June 4, 1997, in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The stamp goes on sale nationwide June 5.

Designed by Richard Sheaff of Norwood, Massachusetts, the stamp depicts a map of Europe with an inset portrait of former Secretary of State George C. Marshall. The United States sponsored The Marshall Plan to help jump-start the economies in Europe devastated by World War II and, in turn, prevent further expansion of Soviet-style communism. The plan was unveiled by George C. Marshall on June 5, 1947, during the Harvard University commencement, and launched operationally in April 1948.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 97-10

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-

mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. 11.20 Extending an In-House Rehabilitation Job Offer — ICCO

- When a job offer can be made, proceed with the rehabilitation effort as outlined (see Section 11.5, Responding to the Results of the Medical Examination, through Section 11.10, Extending the Job Offer), except where OWCP involvement or notification is cited. Normally, there is no OWCP participation during the job identification through job offer process of the "in-house" program.

SEE Exhibit 11.7b, Rehabilitation Assignment Priority.

11.21 Responding to the Employee's Refusal of the In-House Rehabilitation Job Offer — ICCO

- When the injured employee refuses the job offer, prepare a letter for the signature of the district HR manager with a copy to the appropriate functional manager, advising the employee or designee of the following:
 - That because his or her disabilities have been determined to be permanent, he or she is no longer eligible for a limited duty assignment.
 - That he or she may still accept the offered assignment, which will remain open until OWCP determines its suitability and gives due process.
 - That OWCP will be advised that a permanent assignment was offered in good faith and rejected by the employee.
 - That the employee will remain in his or her limited duty assignment until OWCP makes a suitability determination on the rehabilitation job offer.

SEE Exhibit 11.21, Sample Letter: Termination of Limited Duty Assignment for Refusal of In-House Rehabilitation Program Job Offer.

- Advise management against any premature personnel action.

OWCP has the sole authority in determining if a job offer is valid. Additionally, under FECA provisions, the employee must be provided with another opportunity to accept the offer. Keep the offered position available until a final decision is made by OWCP (see Section 11.12, Responding to the Employee's Refusal of, or Refusal to Respond to, the Job Offer, for information concerning OWCP's due process).

- Send a complete package to OWCP claims examiner consisting of the following:
 - A summary letter of the actions taken.
 - The job offer and refusal.
 - The job description.
 - Supporting medical documentation.
 - The employee notification letter.

- If OWCP determines that the rehabilitation job offer is suitable, the employee is no longer entitled to limited duty. If the employee still refuses an in-house rehabilitation job offer after due process has been provided, terminate the limited duty assignment and direct the employee to personnel services office for other options available.
