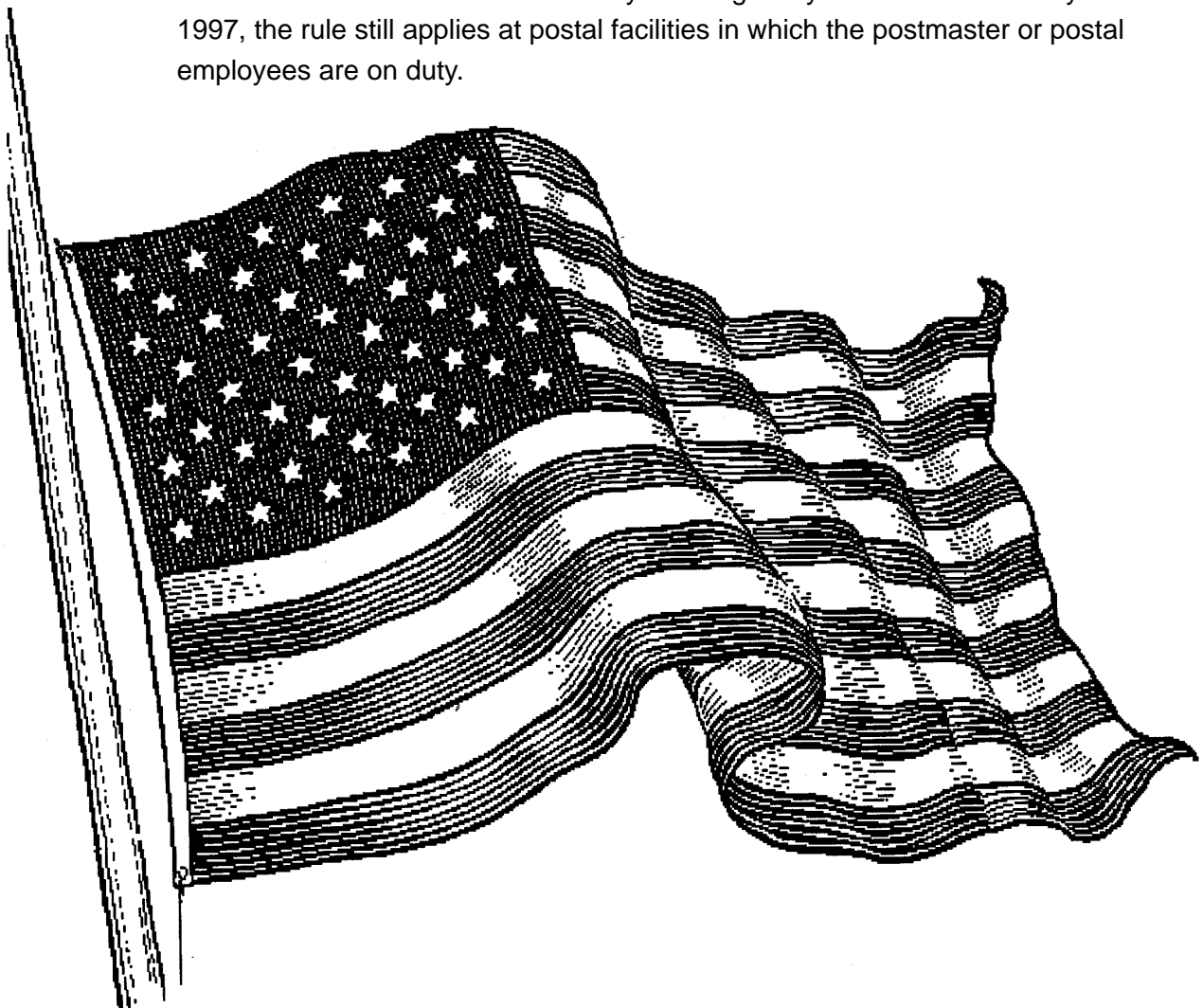

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In May of last year, Department of Energy Secretary Federico Peña sent a letter to Postmaster General Marvin Runyon outlining a new federal energy conservation program called "You Have the Power," and asking for the Postal Service's support for the campaign. The Postal Service has signed on to be a partner with the Department of Energy and will launch the program nationwide to all employees.

The campaign stresses the importance of using energy wisely and urges all employees to use their power to conserve energy, which translates into dollar savings and a cleaner environment. The Postal Service goal is to reduce energy consumption by 20 percent by the year 2000, and this campaign is one of the major strategies to accomplish this.

This is a "back to the basics" promotion, reminding people that even though we haven't had an "energy crisis" in several years, we do still need to conserve our natural resources. The program will remind employees to turn off lights, turn off computers and printers, turn off faucets and fix leaks, use mass transit whenever possible, and other simple, everyday things they can do to conserve energy, both at work and at home.

The Postal Service currently spends \$370 million on energy costs. By reducing consumption by as little as 3 to 5 percent, we could save more than \$15 million a year.

The program will be launched in August throughout the country. Activities to promote it include national distribution of workroom posters; coverage in LINK, Straight Talk, Update, FOCUS and other postal publications; radio public service announcements; and Department of Energy funded print ads.

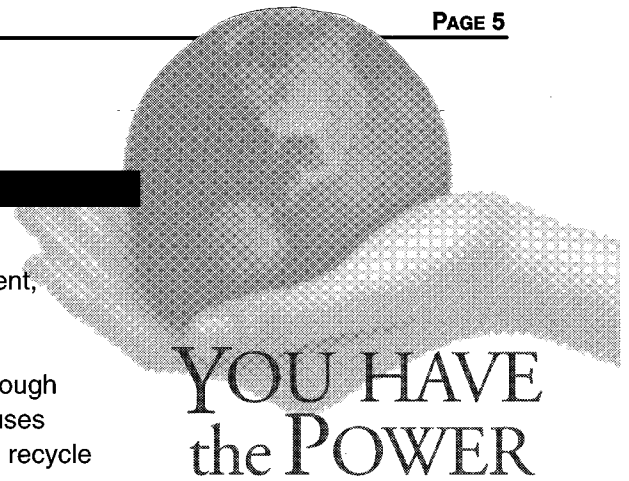

## 12 Energy Tips

1. Recycle paper. It cuts pollution by 50 percent, water use by 60 percent, and energy consumption by 70 percent.
2. Recycle aluminum cans. Recycling just one aluminum can saves enough energy to power your PC for half a day, and the average American uses 364 aluminum cans every year. Be an above-average American and recycle every one.
3. Turn equipment off when it's not in use. Example, the Pittsburgh Remote Encoding Center (REC) shut off all computers at 4:30 a.m. until just before start-up, reducing their electricity costs by 40 percent or \$3,100 per month.
4. Set facility temperatures during non-operating hours. Reduce heat and air conditioning at night and on Sundays, and keep doors and windows closed.
5. Caulk and weather-strip doors, windows, vents, and other openings.
6. Label switches and shut off unneeded lighting and equipment. Shutting off one two-lamp fluorescent fixture for 10 hours a day saves \$230 in one year.
7. Use light appropriate to your task. It's not necessary to light an entire area to read at your desk.
8. Use compact fluorescent lights instead of incandescent lights where possible. And clean fixtures and replace bulbs as required.
9. Turn off running faucets and fix any leaks. A leaky faucet that fills a coffee cup in 10 minutes wastes a swimming pool of water in a year.
10. Lower hot water tank temperature and add additional insulation to tank and piping.
11. Change/clean filters on a regular basis and keep heating and cooling systems in good repair.
12. Relax. Carpool or take mass transit and use 25 times less energy. Or ride your bike to work and burn carbohydrates, not hydrocarbons.

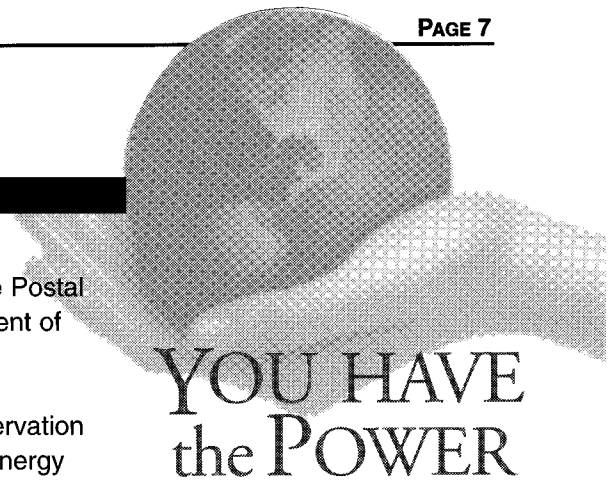

**INTERNAL QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

**Q: The Postal Service is launching a new program called "You Have the Power." What does "You Have the Power" mean?**

A: The Postal Service is working in partnership with the Department of Energy. The DOE asked us to join with them in this energy-saving program, and they are sharing some of the costs of promoting it, providing posters, advertisements, and public service announcements.

**Q: Why is the Postal Service getting involved in this?**

A: The USPS is an award-winning, nationally recognized environmental leader with an ongoing concern for preserving the environment. And in addition to being good for the environment, this program is good for the Postal Service bottom line, which means it's good for customers and employees.

**Q: Why is this program necessary?**

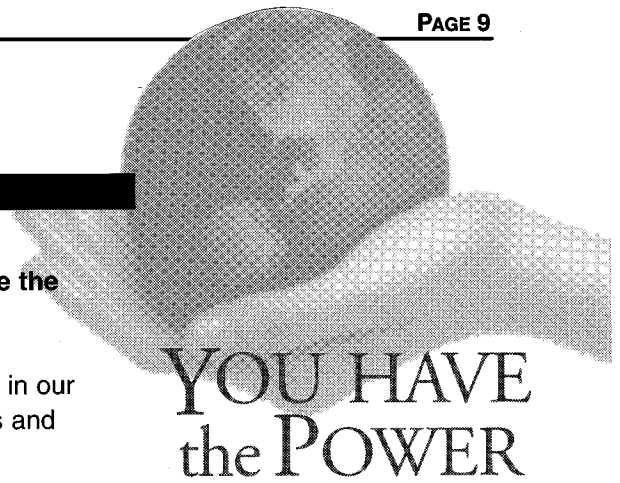
A: It's been a while since we've heard much about the "energy crisis," and we have perhaps gotten a bit complacent about energy consumption. This program reminds us that we have the power to save energy by just taking a few simple conservation steps.

**Q: What kinds of things can employees do to help save energy?**

A: We're not talking about drastic lifestyle changes. Just a few simple things can help conserve energy — recycling paper and aluminum cans can cut pollution and water and energy use by 50 to 70 percent; turning off running faucets and fixing leaky ones; carpooling or using mass transit; turning off vehicles, computers and printers when they're not in use; turning off lights; closing doors and windows when using air conditioning. It's a matter of common sense and a back to the basics approach to energy conservation.

**Q: Why should employees participate in this program?**

A: The Postal Service spends \$370 million a year on energy costs. If we reduce our energy use by as little as 3 to 5 percent, we can save more than \$15 million a year, which can help keep postage rates down and preserve our jobs. And just as important, we can help keep the environment safe and clean for our children and grandchildren.

### **Multiline Accuracy Support System Extension**

The July 31, 1997, Multiline Accuracy Support System (MASS) certification deadline is extended until September 30, 1997. This applies only to MASS-certified product users, including multiline optical character systems (MLOCs), video encoding systems, and direct view (desktop) encoding system users. Production limitations have delayed the MASS test to manufacturers, delaying, in turn, manufacturer release of software compliant with the 1997–1998 MASS requirements.

Users of MASS-certified systems may continue to use their current MASS-certified software through September 30, 1997. This extension does not change the requirement for the use of current database products as specified in DMM A950.3.1.

Postal Service business mail entry unit personnel are instructed to accept all PS Forms 3553 presented after July 31, 1997, as valid if they show a valid product listed in the 1996–1997 *CASS/MASS Certified Products Guide* and the “current” database product. After September 30, 1997, all MASS-related product users must be certified and listed in the 1997–1998 *CASS/MASS Certified Products Guide* to be eligible for automation discounts.

This one-time MASS extension does not change the established cycle period. The 1997–1998 CASS/MASS cycle will end July 31, 1998.

The table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Codes through the use of footnoted mailing restriction codes, which appear on the page following the table.

Acceptance clerks should use this table with the inte-

grated retail terminal (IRT) to determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and which conditions of mailing apply. For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, refer to the local hardcopy EMMS directory.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**B.** Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. **Exceptions:** Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organizations for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Known Mailers may use either Form 2976-A on each item or Form 2976 (or facsimile) with a mail manifest in conjunction with a packing list. Form 2976 must state "packing list enclosed." The packing list must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO/FPO ZIP Code of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value. The packing list should be enclosed in the parcel or attached to the outside of the parcel. The mail manifest which itemizes all parcels that a Known Mailer deposits will be given to Postal Official at Business Mail Acceptance Unit. Form 2976 may be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in US dollars) must be enclosed in the package.

**B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length	
42" . . . . .	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" . . . . .	24" girth
over 44" to 46" . . . . .	20" girth
over 46" to 48" . . . . .	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

### George Halas Commemorative Stamp

The Postal Service will honor football coach George Halas with the issuance of a 32-cent commemorative stamp, in a pane of 20 (Item 4448), on August 16, 1997, in Chicago, Illinois. The stamp will go on sale statewide **in Illinois only** on August 18. The stamp may also be purchased by mail order from the Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center.

Designed by Carl Herrman of Laguna Niguel, California, and illustrated by Daniel Moore of Birmingham, Alabama, the stamp features a portrait of George Stanley Halas in a familiar scene associated with his career as a professional football coach. Halas coached the Chicago Bears in the National Football League for approximately 40 years and led them to seven league championships.

**Distribution**

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive approximately double the standard automatic distribution for a 50-stamps-per-pane issue. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size (150,000 stamps).

SDOs and SDNs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to post offices for their full standard automatic distribution quantities using Form 3309, *Advice of*

*Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, and Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, respectively. SDOs and SDNs must not distribute stamps to post offices before August 13, 1997.

*Philatelic Requirement*

SDOs and SDNs with authorized philatelic centers will receive an automatic distribution of these stamps in six positions for subsequent distribution to each philatelic window.

All APDs and SDNs will receive 1,500,000 additional stamps for filling supplemental orders.

SDOs, SDNs, and authorized CAG A-G post offices requiring additional stamps in bulk quantities may submit Form 3356, *Stamp Requisition — Bulk Quantities*, for Item 5506 to the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Orders must be submitted in the following quantities: 25,000; 50,000; 75,000; 100,000; and multiples of 150,000 to a maximum of 6,000,000 stamps per requisition.

All other post offices requiring additional stamps in less than bulk quantities should requisition them from their designated SDO or SDN, using a separate Form 17.

## Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 97-15

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*


All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-

mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.


Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.
