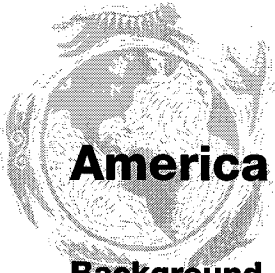

America Recycles Day

Background

America Recycles Day, which is being held for the first time on November 15, is a spin-off of Texas Recycles Day, a statewide public awareness event sponsored by Clean Texas 2000. First launched in 1994, Texas Recycles Day has been a great success, with 145,000 Texans pledging to increase their recycling efforts in 1996 alone. The Honorary Chair of America Recycles Day is Vice President Al Gore and Co-Chairs are Bill Heenan, Steel Recycling Institute and Fran McPoland, Federal Environmental Executive.

The Postal Service is on the organizing national Executive Committee for the event, along with the Environmental Council of the States, the Environmental Defense Fund, the National Recycling Coalition, the Office of the Federal Environmental Executive, the Solid Waste Association of North America, the Steel Recycling Institute, the U. S. Conference of Mayors, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Recycling Coalition of Texas, and the Union Camp Corporation.

The theme of America Recycles Day is "Keep Recycling Working: Buy Recycled," which is based on the goal of building consumer demand for recycled products and educating all Americans about the environmental and economic benefits of buying recycled products.



More than 1,000 local recycling and Buy Recycled events in 33 states are expected to be organized across the country. An American Green Dream House, built primarily with recycled content and energy efficient products will be the Grand Prize in a national random drawing from entries submitted by individuals who voluntarily pledge to recycle and buy recycled products.

Employees of the sponsoring organizations and their immediate families, including the Postal Service, are not eligible to participate in the Green Dream House Contest.

America Recycles Day

Questions and Answers

Q. What is America Recycles Day?

A. It is a day set aside to build consumer demand for recycled products and educate Americans about the environmental and economic benefits of recycling and buying recycled content products.

Q. Where did the idea for this day come from?

A. It is a spin-off of Texas' very successful "Texas Recycles Day" that was first held three years ago. Last year, 145,000 Texans pledged to increase their recycling efforts during Texas Recycles Day.

Q. What is the theme of America Recycles Day?

A. The theme is "Keep Recycling Working: Buy Recycled."

Q. Why is it important to buy recycled?

A. Buying products with recycled content creates a greater demand for the products, and a greater demand means that manufacturers will expand the use of recycled material.

Q. How do people find and recognize recycled content products?

A. Four materials always have a significant amount of recycled content even if they are not yet labeled recycled:

- Things made out of steel, including food cans, cars, appliances, nails;
- Aluminum, including beverage cans;
- Glass bottles and jars;
- Molded pulp containers, including egg cartons, fruit trays and flower boxes.

For all other materials, read labels carefully to see if the product has recycled content.

Q. Why is the Postal Service involved in America Recycles Day?

A. The USPS is one of the nation's leading recyclers with more than 20,000 recycling locations and is committed to promoting recycling both at home and on the job. The Postal Service is committed to providing its employees and customers with a safe and healthy environment. Recycling is not only the right thing to do, but it is also good business.

Q. Who else besides the Postal Service is sponsoring this event?

A. The USPS is partnering with the Steel Recycling Institute, the Environmental Protection Agency, the Office of the Federal Environmental Executive, the U. S. Conference of Mayors, the National Recycling Coalition, the Environmental Defense Fund, and others. Vice President Al Gore is honorary chairman of America Recycles Day.

Q. What other ways is the Postal Service involved in recycling?

A. The USPS buys about \$160 million worth of recycled content products every year. It is also involved in developing creative ways to recycle undeliverable mail, mail that has been read and discarded by the customer, and non-forwardable mail. The USPS is involved in a project in Texas to convert recycled mail into rich compost soil, and in Alabama, it's testing a project to use recycled mail to make pencils. Last year the USPS saw a 60 percent increase in revenues from recycling.

Q. What can average consumers do to help make America Recycles Day a success?

A. Buy recycled content products at home and on the job; reduce their consumption of goods and reuse and recycle what they do consume; ask store owners to stock more products with recyclable products; start a compost pile of their own; leave grass clippings on the lawn instead of dumping them in the trash; recycle motor oil; and they can help educate their children to recycle.

Q. Isn't mail bad for the environment?

A. No. Mail is made up of mixed paper waste which can be recycled, so there's no reason for any mail to end up in landfills. Shopping by mail also saves trips in cars, which contributes to a decrease in air pollution. That's why some people consider advertising mail to be a "mall in a mailbox."

Q. Does the Postal Service recycle?

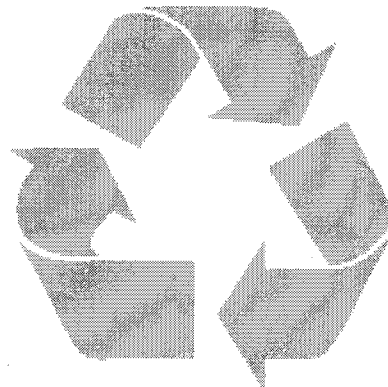
A. More than 1 million tons of wastepaper, cardboard, plastics, cans, and other material were recycled by the Postal Service last year.

Q. Does the Postal Service use recycled products?

A. The Postal Service used more than \$160 million worth of products last year that contain recycled material. We also are a national leader in the use of re-refined oil and retreaded tires. More than 100,000 vehicles currently use re-refined oil, and more than 100,000 retreaded tires are purchased every year.

Q. What else is the Postal Service doing to help protect the environment?

A. A few of the other things the Postal Service does to help the environment include encouraging and rewarding ridesharing, setting up a "No Smoking" policy in every post office to protect our employees and the environment they work in, and using environmentally friendly inks and glues on our stamps and products.






America Recycles Day

Media Tips

When contacting the media about America Recycles Day, be prepared with all the information necessary about the day's events to convey a clear message. If you are knowledgeable and refer to your local events, you will reinforce that the day is an effort with local roots, something in which the community has an important stake. Remember also to get the message across to the media about the significant contributions the Postal Service has made to protecting and preserving the environment. Here are some things you can do to encourage the media to cover your events.

- Send a letter to your local reporters for newspapers, radio, television, and cable stations encouraging them to write editorials about the importance of recycling.
- Get your mayor to issue a proclamation declaring recognition of America Recycles Day.
- Ask local VIPs for their support.
- Urge them to write the media or place their signatures on your letters and press releases.
- Run public service announcements on radio and television and include information about local community recycling efforts.
- Issue a press release (sample is included) right before the event.
- Be prepared with current recycling statistics and goals for America Recycles Day.

Bright Ideas for America Recycles Day

- Print America Recycles Day recycling pledge cards and make them available to all employees.
- Print posters or banners about America Recycles Day.
- Start or announce a new or enhanced recycling program.
- Collect and clean out files.
- If your post office does not have a recycle bin, take recyclables to places that do recycle.
- Make a collection point for office paper.
- Partner with recycling companies in the community for collection.
- Have a contest for the department that does the most recycling.
- Sponsor a poster or essay contest in the local schools.
- Include the phrase, "America Recycles Day, November 15, 1997," on all your correspondence you send out before November 15.
- Set up a display in your post office lobby with a recycling bin beside to advertise America Recycles Day events.
- Promote the mulching and composting of fall leaves.
- Collect America Recycles Day information for next year.



Sample Stand-Up Talk

AMERICA RECYCLES DAY

November 15 is the first annual America Recycles Day, which has a goal of building consumer demand for recycled products and educating all Americans about the environmental and economic benefits of buying recycled.

The Postal Service is a national leader in the protection and preservation of the national environment, and is one of the largest recyclers in the nation. I urge all of you to help the Postal Service in its environmental efforts by participating in this event. Talk to your family members, co-workers, and friends about the advantages of recycling and buying recycled products. Tell them:

- Thousands of recycled content products are available to consumers.
- The United States generates 4.3 pounds of solid waste per person per day.
- In 1996, the average American recycled 329 pounds of paper, a 9% increase over 1995 — so it can be done.
- In 1996, 42.3 million tons of paper were recycled in America. This is material that would have gone into landfill.
- In 1996, Americans recycled 63.5% of all aluminum cans produced.
- Recycling one glass bottle saves enough electricity to light a 100-watt bulb for four hours.
- Motor oil can be recycled, re-refined, and used again, reducing our reliance on imported oil—so recycle your motor oil.
- By making products from recycled materials, we conserve land and reduce the need to drill for oil and dig for minerals.
- It usually takes less energy to make recycled products. Using recycled aluminum, for example, takes 95% less energy than creating new aluminum.
- The recycling process creates more jobs rather than more landfills or incinerators.



TEN WAYS TO CELEBRATE AMERICA RECYCLES DAY

- 1 Commit to "Buy Recycled" at home and at work.
- 2 Think before you buy. Reduce, reuse, and recycle.
- 3 Start a paper recycling program in your office, school, or community.
- 4 Ask your local recycler about adding steel cans, glass bottles and jars, or plastic containers to your community recycling program.
- 5 Tell your local retailers you want them to stock more products made from recycled materials.
- 6 Encourage the use of recycled content products in your business.
- 7 Leave grass clippings on the lawn as a fertilizer and start a compost pile with yard trimmings and food scraps.
- 8 To help educate the next generation about the importance of recycling, take children to visit a recycling facility or a landfill in your community.
- 9 Recycle your used motor oil and oil filters at an approved collection center, and buy re-refined oil for your next oil change. Oil never wears out.
- 10 Make a pledge on America Recycles Day to recycle more and buy recycled products.

Administrative Services

1998 Year Type for Hand Stamp and Canceling Machines

The 1998 year type for hand stamp and canceling machines will be automatically distributed to all postal facilities that received 1997 year types for hand stamps and canceling machines. The material distribution centers (MDCs) mailed a postcard notification on October 10, 1997, to each postal facility that received 1997 year types. If your facility needs a different quantity or a different 1998 year type, make changes on the preaddressed postcard and mail it. If no changes are needed, do not mail the postcard. Complete instructions are on the postcard.

If your facility needs 1998 year type for hand stamp or canceling machines but has not received a postcard notification by October 20, 1997, contact Materials Customer Service no later than November 10, 1997. Be ready to give the customer service representative the PSIN number for the item needed, the quantity, and the FEDSTRIP number for the ordering facility.

The MDCs will ship the year type no later than November 21, 1997. Allow 10 to 14 days for delivery.

To determine the proper year type for canceling machines, check the model number on the machine nameplate. Use Publication 247, *Supply and Equipment Catalog* (April 1996), Exhibit 17, page 53, as a guide for ordering the correct type:

- PSIN O76E for Models D, K, and G new style canceling machines using 77, 225, and 218-A die hubs (SN 7520-01-363-9283)
- PSIN O103HD2 for Models HD-2 canceling machines (SN 7490-00-920-9277)

- PSIN O133E for Model Flier and M machines using 1207 die hubs (SN 7490-00-996-3084)
- PSIN O217E for Model G canceling machines using 218 die hubs (SN 7520-01-363-9279)
- PSIN O691G for Model Flier and M machines using 1207-G die hubs (SN 7520-01-363-9280)
- PSIN O702A for steel post marked, hammer type (SN 7520-01-363-9281)
- PSIN O718A for steel post marker, rotary type (SN 7520-01-363-9282)
- PSIN O642, rubber, for use on Nos. 550, 570, and 552 (SN 7520-01-000-9100)
- PSIN O744, steel, for use with No. 700 without flange (SN 7520-01-364-1911)
- PSIN O747, steel, for use with No. 700 with flange (SN 7520-01-364-3887)

The 1998 year type for Mark II Facer-Cancelers (SN 7490-03-000-4198) will be distributed automatically to all plant maintenance facilities that received the 1997 year type. This year type is also used on the MRC small canceling machine, Models 3601/3602, and the AFCS machine (both lead and trail). Only plant maintenance facilities may order this year type. Plant maintenance facilities are responsible for supplying this year type to all offices they service.

Ordering Procedures for Rubber Stamps and Steel Hand Canceling Stamps

Effective November 1, 1997, this article supersedes the article published in *Postal Bulletin* 21953 (8-28-97).

Ordering Procedures

- A. Form Number, Title, and Edition: PS Form 1567, *Requisition for Rubber and Steel Hand Canceling Stamps* (February 1996).
- B. Use a separate PS Form 1567 for each vendor.
Note: If using an impression on PS Form 1567, **be very careful to use the correct PSIN.** Vendors have been instructed to use the impression rather than the PSIN if the two do not match.
- C. Complete all Requester Information (Items 4 through 10).
- D. Method of Payment:
 - Place a check mark in the appropriate box.
 - If paying by USPS credit card, include the expiration date and number.
 - If paying by check or money order, make payable to the appropriate vendor.
- E. Send the completed forms to vendors at the addresses shown below.
- F. Expect delivery of requested stamps in approximately 30 days (note the exception for Hanley Postal Supply).
Note: Delivery charges are included in the cost of the stamps.

PS Form 1567 (February 1996, NSN 7530-01-000-9360, Quick Pick Number 132) may be ordered from TMDC on PS Form 7380 or via TTOE, or may be copied from PUB 247.

Offices with questions or problems should contact the Topeka Material Distribution Center, Customer Service Department, at 800-332-0317, Option 3. The Minneapolis PMSC no longer handles these calls.

Note: Any PSIN shown as an R series, for example R53, *Returned to Sender* (hand index), in Publication 247, *Supply and Equipment Catalog*, can be obtained only from the Topeka Material Distribution Centers (TMDC). To order year dates, submit a request on PS Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*, to TMDC, or order through TTOE.

DMM REVISION

Bulk Parcel Return Service and Shipper Paid Forwarding

Effective October 12, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) F010.5, F020.3, F030.2, and R600.10, are amended and new S924 is created to present the standards and fees adopted by the Postal Service to implement the Decision of the Board of Governors of the United States Postal Service on the Recommended Decision of the Postal Rate Commission for Bulk Parcel Return Service and Shipper Paid Forwarding, Docket No. MC97-4. These changes took effect at 12:01 a.m., Sunday, October 12, 1997, for Bulk Parcel Return Service and will take effect on January 4, 1998 for Shipper Paid Forwarding. The final rule announcing these changes was published in the *Federal Register* on October 15, 1997 (Volume 62, No. 199). These amendments will appear in DMM Issue 53 (scheduled for release January 1, 1998).

Regulatory History

On June 6, 1997, the United States Postal Service filed a Request with the Postal Rate Commission pursuant to sections 3622 and 3623 of the Postal Reorganization Act, 39 U.S.C. 101 *et seq.*, for a recommended decision on proposed changes in the Domestic Mail Classification Schedule (DMCS). The proposed revisions also included proposed new fees. The Postal Service requested the consideration of two changes affecting the forwarding and return of Standard Mail (A) parcels that were initially considered in Docket No. MC97-2. It requested that Bulk Parcel Return Service (BPRS) and Shipper Paid Forwarding (SPF) be established.

Pursuant to 39 U.S.C. 3624, on September 4, 1997, the PRC issued its Recommended Decision in Docket MC97-4 to the Governors of the United States Postal Service. That decision adopted the BPRS and SPF classifications and fees proposed in a Revised Stipulation and Agreement submitted by most of the parties in the proceeding. Pursuant to 39 U.S.C. 3625, the Governors acted on the PRC's Recommendation on October 6, 1997.

The Governors approved the PRC's recommendations, and set an implementation date of October 12, 1997, for BPRS. Due to software and other support modifications needed for Computer Forwarding Sites and the Address Change Service network to support SPF, the Governors set January 4, 1998, for the effective date of SPF.

Under current practice, forwarding and return of bulk Standard Mail (A) parcels are obtained by endorsing pieces "Forwarding Service Requested" (or until December 31, 1997, "Forwarding and Return Postage Guaranteed") or "Address Service Requested" (or until December 31, 1997, "Forwarding and Return Postage Guaranteed, Address Correction Requested"). The postage charged at the time that a parcel is returned is a weighted fee that is 2.472 times the applicable single-piece rate. This fee indirectly pays for forwarding service of other parcels: 1.472 is the average number of pieces forwarded for every piece that is returned. Multiplying 1.472 by the single-piece rate is intended to cover the cost of forwarding service. BPRS and SPF provides mailers other options.

BPRS, through bulk handling of returned parcels, lowers the average cost of return service. Mailers authorized to use BPRS will pay a flat fee of \$1.75 per returned parcel. An annual permit fee of \$85 is also required. BPRS mailers must arrange pickup of their returned parcels in bulk at a specified frequency at a designated postal facility, or arrange to have their returned parcels delivered to them in bulk by the Postal Service. Only machinable parcels weighing less than one pound, with the required endorsements, are eligible for BPRS. A minimum requirement of 10,000 returned parcels per year at each site (return address) is required. BPRS mailers must individually document their returned parcel volume and maintain an advance deposit account. Beginning January 4, 1998, when SPF becomes effective, mailers will be able to combine BPRS and SPF services. Until that time, mailers using BPRS will not be able to request forwarding services.

SPF will allow mailers to pay forwarding postage (the applicable single-piece rate) directly, through the use of the tracking capabilities of the existing electronic Address Change Service (ACS). The ACS change notification fee will also be charged. Only Standard Mail (A) machinable parcels, with the required endorsement, ACS participant code, and correct keyline will be eligible. Current ACS users will be required to request a new participation code to use this option. SPF is available today for most Standard Mail (B). For information on ACS and SPF, contact the National Customer Support Center.

2.0 ADDRESS CHANGE SERVICE (ACS)

2.1 Description

Address Change Service (ACS) centralizes, automates, and improves the processing of address correction requests for mailers. ACS involves transmitting address correction information to a central point where the changes are consolidated electronically by unique publication or mailer identifier. These records are sequentially organized by USPS assigned codes and distributed to each participating mailer. ACS can also be used to pay forwarding postage on most Standard Mail pieces using Shipper Paid Forwarding under 2.5.

Shipper Paid Forwarding (SPF) is an ACS fulfillment vehicle. 1.0 BASIC INFORMATION

1.1 Description

Bulk Parcel Return Service (BPRS) provides a method whereby high-volume parcel mailers may have undeliverable-as-addressed machinable parcels returned to designated postal facilities for bulk pickup by the mailer at a predetermined frequency prescribed by the Postal Service, or delivered by the Postal Service in bulk in a manner and frequency prescribed by the Postal Service. Mailers using this service pay only the BPRS per piece fee for each parcel returned.

1.2 Availability

BPRS is available only for the return of machinable parcels, as defined in C050, initially prepared and mailed as Regular or Nonprofit Standard Mail (A) machinable parcels. Mail for which BPRS is requested must bear one of the BPRS endorsements in F010 and a return address that is in the delivery area of the post office that issued the BPRS permit. Effective January 4, 1998, BPRS may also be combined with the Shipper Paid Forwarding service (F030). Any Standard Mail (A) parcel that qualifies for a single-piece Standard Mail (B) rate under the applicable standards, and that contains the name of the Standard Mail (B) rate in the mailer's ancillary service endorsement is not eligible for BPRS.

1.3 Payment Guarantee

The permit holder guarantees payment of fees on all returned parcels from a centralized advance deposit postage due account.

1.4 Where Service Established

BPRS may be established at any post office in the United States and its territories and possessions or at any U.S. military post office overseas (APO/FPO). It is not available in any foreign country.

2.0 Permits

2.1 Application Process and Participation

To participate in BPRS, the mailer must make a written request to the postmaster at each post office where parcels are to be returned. The request must:

- Demonstrate receipt of 10,000 returned machinable Standard Mail (A) parcels at a given delivery point during the previous 12 months, or
- Demonstrate a high likelihood of receiving a minimum of 10,000 returned machinable Standard Mail (A) parcels at a given delivery point in the coming 12 months.

The written request must be submitted with the annual permit fee, a description of the mail (e.g., size, packaging), a sample of the documentation to be used to substantiate individually, the number of parcels returned each day, and the requested frequency and location of the pickup or delivery of the parcels. If the mailer's request is approved, the USPS issues the mailer an authorization letter and agreement with the BPRS permit number (which will be used solely for account and annual fee tracking). The BPRS permit number is not to appear on the mail. The mailer must have a valid postage due advance deposit account and pay the annual BPRS permit fee to participate in BPRS.

2.2 Permit Renewal

An annual renewal notice is provided to each BPRS permit holder. The notice must be returned to the post office that issued the permit with the fee payment or authorization for the postmaster to deduct the fee from the advance deposit account by the expiration date of the permit. Written authorization is not needed for permit renewal if there is no change to the authorization on file at the post office where the parcels are to be returned. If, after notice, the permit holder does not renew a BPRS permit, the USPS endorses the mail "Bulk Parcel Return Service Canceled" and charges postage due at the single-piece Standard Mail (A) rate. If the single-piece Standard Mail (A) rate is not paid, the mail is then forwarded to the nearest mail recovery center for final disposition.

2.3 Procedure

An approved BPRS permit and fee payment must be on file at every post office to which parcels are returned.

2.4 Permit Cancellation

The USPS may cancel a permit if the permit holder fails to meet the minimum requirements, refuses to accept and pay the required fee for parcels returned, fails to keep sufficient funds in the advance deposit account to cover fees due for returned parcels, or fails to meet terms of the authorization (e.g., fails to pickup mail on agreed upon frequency).

2.5 Reapplying After Cancellation

To receive a new permit at the same post office after a BPRS permit is canceled, the applicant must resubmit a letter to that office; pay a new permit fee; provide evidence that the reasons for the permit cancellation are corrected; and provide and keep funds in an advance deposit account to cover normal returns for at least 2 weeks.

3.0 POSTAGE AND FEES

3.1 Permit Fee

A permit fee is charged once each 12-month period on the anniversary date of the permit. The fee may be paid in advance only for the next year and only during the last 30 days of the current service period. The fee charged is that which is in effect on the date of payment.

3.2 Payment

The permit holder must pay BPRS per piece fees by an advance deposit account. The post office delivers parcels under this service only when estimated sufficient funds are in the account to pay all applicable fees. The permit holder may establish a unique advance deposit account or use an existing one to pay postage under BPRS.

Mailpiece Quality Control Training Program

The following is a clarification of the article on the Mailpiece Quality Control (MQC) training program in *Postal Bulletin* 21952 (8-14-97). A revised order form appears on page 19 of this *Postal Bulletin*.

Due to Classification Reform, the MQC training program has been revised and is now available to mailers. The MQC training program is a self-study course designed to assist mailers' employees in the design of mailpieces that meet USPS specifications for processing on automated equipment. This program is a vital tool in helping mailers receive postal discounts and improving the deliverability of their mail. It is available to all types of mailers, printers, and mailer organizations. The MQC Certification includes self-study training modules on the following:

- Barcoding specifications and requirements
- Classes of mail
- Mail processing categories
- Addressing and return address information
- Endorsements
- Reply mail
- Permit imprints
- Guidelines for mailing hazardous materials

The revised program reflects the implementation of Classification Reform and contains additional tools we believe will be beneficial to mailers and their staff. As before, upon successful completion of the MQC training program, participants will be awarded certification as an MQC specialist.

DELIVERY REMINDER

Delivery of Standard Mail (A) in Apartment Boxes

Recent customer feedback indicates there is a serious failure to comply with Standard Mail (A) delivery procedures in apartment building environments. Our customers have voiced concerns because their mail is being left in apartment vestibules rather than delivered into mailboxes as is required by Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carriers Duties and Responsibilities*, Part 320, Delivery of Ordinary Mail. When the Postal Service fails to properly deliver mail into mail receptacles, recipients see no difference between the service we provide and that of an alternative delivery service. We are devaluing both our customers' products and our service.

Carriers must deliver to the proper mail receptacle all mail bearing the exceptional address format (example: Mr. John Doe or current resident/occupant) on the mailing label as addressed. This mail is undeliverable only if the house, apartment, office, or building is unoccupied or nonexistent. The delivery employee must endorse undeliverable pieces as "N.O.V.M." and bundle them with other No Obvious Value Mail for verification and proper handling.

In apartment buildings, carriers must deliver mailings *with* apartment numbers addressed to "Occupant," "Postal Customer," etc., to the proper mail receptacle as specified in the mailing address. Carriers must deliver mailings *without* apartment numbers beginning at the lowest numbered mail receptacle and continuing upward until they complete delivering one piece to every receptacle. Where mail receptacles are unnumbered or not in sequential order, carriers should deliver mail into the receptacles working from left to right as

if the mail receptacles were in sequential order. If there are more pieces than there are mail receptacles, the delivery employee must endorse undeliverable pieces as "N.O.V.M." and bundle them with other No Obvious Value Mail for verification and proper disposal.

Carriers must not leave mail undelivered on racks, tables, shelves, or other fixtures. In apartments and other centralized delivery environments, carriers may leave mail addressed to full mail receptacles in a designated location that affords adequate protection for the mail with the permission of the addressee or after leaving a Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, notifying the addressee. Carriers must always deliver both components of detached label mailings, the letter-size address label and accompanying flat or sample piece, at the same time.

These procedures do not apply to simplified address mail (boxholders) received for delivery on a rural route. Rural carriers must follow the procedures outlined in Handbook PO-603, *Rural Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, Part 320, Delivery of Ordinary and Simplified Address Mail.

Please take the necessary steps to ensure that all delivery personnel are aware of our customers' concerns and deliver all their mail in compliance with Postal Service policy. Providing quality delivery will ensure a visible difference between Postal Service delivery and alternate delivery services.

Reassignments Affecting the Zone Chart Program**ZIP Code Prefixes 068, 069, 124–127**

Originating three-digit ZIP Codes 068, 069, and 124–127 have been reassigned from the Springfield MA Bulk Mail Center (BMC) 05500 to the New Jersey NJ Bulk Mail Center 00102. This reassignment is due to recent operational changes in mail processing. These changes were announced in *Postal Bulletin* 21949 (7-3-97), and are effective on and after September 17, 1997. Therefore, 068, 069, and 124–127 do not qualify for the intra-BMC or DBMC rates for mail labeled to BMC Springfield MA 05500. ZIP Codes 068, 069, and 124–127 do qualify for the intra-BMC or DBMC rates for mail labeled to BMC New Jersey NJ 00102.

All postal facilities should make manual changes to their 1997 Official National Zone Charts and *Domestic Mail Manual* L601 and L602 labeling lists to assign 068, 069, and 124–127 correctly to the New Jersey NJ BMC 00102 and notify their customers to make similar changes.

Customers may obtain the official zone chart data (single page) for originating mail at no cost from their local post office.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. **Exceptions:** Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Known Mailers may use either Form 2976-A on each item or Form 2976 (or facsimile) with a mail manifest in conjunction with a packing list. Form 2976 must state "packing list enclosed." The packing list must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO/FPO ZIP Code of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value. The packing list should be enclosed in the parcel or attached to the outside of the parcel. The mail manifest which itemizes all parcels that a Known Mailer deposits will be given to Postal Official at Business Mail Acceptance Unit. Form 2976 may be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in US dollars) must be enclosed in the package.

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

over 42" to 44"	24" girth
over 44" to 46"	20" girth
over 46" to 48"	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The last day of sale for the 32-cent Comic Strip Classic Collection commemorative stamps (Item 5523), and all related products, will be held on November 1, 1997. In observance of the last day of sale, a stamp ceremony will be held in New York, New York, on November 1, 1997, in conjunction with the Postage Stamp MEGA Event.

The Postal Service will offer a last day of sale cancellation, dated November 1, 1997, which will be applied to customers' covers or other items with the stamp affixed, and will be available on a hand-back basis only all four days (October 30 to November 2, 1997) at the Postage Stamp MEGA Event. Any covers submitted for servicing and return through the mailstream will not be entered into the mails until the date appearing on the cancellation. This is the fifth time the Postal Service has offered a "last day of sale" cancellation.

How to Order the Last Day of Sale Postmark

Customers have 30 days to obtain the last day of sale postmark by mail. They may purchase the stamps through November 1, 1997, at their local post office (although this is a Saturday and many offices will be closed), at the Postage Stamp MEGA Event (October 30 to November 2) in New York, New York, or by mail order from the Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center, affix the stamps to an envelope of their choice, address the envelope (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 97-21

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-

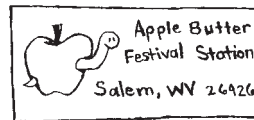
mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Postal Employees

Flexible Spending Accounts Open Season

Open season for the Flexible Spending Account (FSA) program for career employees is November 10 through December 8, 1997. MetraHealth for the Travelers Insurance Company administers the FSA program for the Postal Service.

FSAs provide employees with the ability to set aside a portion of their pre-tax earnings for certain types of out-of-pocket health care and dependent care expenses. The money withheld for FSAs is not subject to income, Medicare, or Social Security taxes. FSA BK1, *Flexible Spending Accounts* (November 1997), provides a good overview of FSAs. The following information should assist personnel services offices in conducting this open season. Enrollments received during this open season are effective for the 1998 plan year (January 1 through December 31, 1998). To assist in publicizing FSA open season, all offices must post the open season notice found on page 75 of this *Postal Bulletin* on bulletin boards through December 8, 1997.

Headquarters (HQ) Compensation is coordinating two mailings — first a leaflet and then a kit that contains a brochure, an enrollment form, and a withdrawal request form — to career employees at their mailing address of record. The return address for undeliverable kits is the employing office of record. While the disposition of returned kits is at the discretion of the Customer Service and Sales district office or other administering office, giving a returned kit to an employee offers the employee an opportunity to submit a correct PS Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*. (PS Form 1216 may be ordered from the material distribution centers (MDCs) using postal stock number (SN) 7530-02-000-7354 or Quick Pick number 118.)

Eligibility

Participation in the FSA program is limited to career employees. In addition, to make an election during the open season, career employees must complete at least 26 full pay periods of postal career service based on their current appointment by the end of Pay Period (PP) 26-97 (December 19, 1997). Career employees who are in a leave without pay (LWOP) status that has lasted for more than eight consecutive full pay periods as of December 19, 1997, are *not* eligible to participate in the FSA program.

Election Opportunities

- Health and Dependent Care FSAs. Eligible career employees may elect to participate in either or both of two FSAs — the Health Care FSA and the Dependent Care FSA. Each FSA covers eligible expenses for services received during the 1998 plan year (January 1 through December 31, 1998). Employees who elect to participate must submit an FSA enrollment form to their personnel services offices no later than close of business (COB) December 8, 1997. The brochure employees receive in the mail describes eligible expenses and guidelines for estimating future expenses.
- Contribution Levels. During the 1998 plan year, career employees may elect to contribute up to \$2,600 to the Health Care FSA and up to \$5,000 to the Dependent Care FSA. Contributions are withheld in equal amounts through payroll deductions covering 26 pay periods (PP 01-98 through PP 26-98). The minimum annual contribution employees may make to either FSA is \$130, which equals \$5 per pay period.

Election Changes and Enrollment Processing

Participants may not change or cancel enrollments or contribution levels during the plan year except following qualified life status changes, as explained in the brochure.

Personnel services offices that are Distributed Data Entry/Data Reporting (DDE/DR) sites are responsible for processing FSA enrollments through the DDE/DR system. Offices process elections received during the FSA open season (November 10 through December 8, 1997) using the DDE/DR system's FSA open season screen. *Offices must process FSA enrollment forms received during the open season by no later than December 19, 1997.*

Open Season Materials

Leaflet

All career employees will receive at their mailing address of record:

- FSA LF1, *Flexible Spending Accounts Overview and Tax Savings Estimator* (October 1997), a leaflet that outlines how FSAs work in a simple question-and-answer format and that also contains a tax savings estimator.

Enrollment Kit

Shortly after receipt of the leaflet, all career employees will receive at their mailing address of record an enrollment kit that contains:

- FSA BK1, *Flexible Spending Accounts* (November 1997), a brochure explaining plan policies and provisions.
- PS Form 8200, *Flexible Spending Account Enrollment Form* (November 1997), the election form used to elect to establish an FSA from which reimbursements may be withdrawn.
- FSA1, *Flexible Spending Account (FSA) Withdrawal Request* (November 1997), the form used to request to withdraw funds from an FSA for reimbursement of eligible expenses for services received during the plan year.

Extra Supplies of Materials

HQ Compensation will coordinate the distribution of extra supplies of the leaflet, brochure, enrollment form, and withdrawal request form to Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, the Employee Service Center for the DC Metro Area, the Office of Inspector General, Inspection Service divisions, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units by the beginning of the open season.

Additional copies of the following FSA items will *not* be available for ordering until after the distribution of extra supplies has been completed:

- FSA LF1 (SN 7610-MD-000-7253, no Quick Pick number)
- FSA BK1 (SN 7530-02-000-9910, no Quick Pick number)
- PS Form 8200 (SN 7530-02-000-9846, no Quick Pick number)
- FSA1 (SN 7530-02-000-9911, no Quick Pick number)

When available, FSA LF1 can be ordered using PS Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*. FSA BK1, PS Form 8200, and FSA1 can be ordered using PS 7380 or TTOE.

Administration Manual

HQ Compensation is also coordinating the distribution to Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices and area offices of a small stock of FSA BK2, *FSA Administration Manual* (November 1997), which outlines for personnel services offices how to process enrollment forms, follow FSA procedures, and maintain appropriate records. This item is not available from the MDCs.

Information for Other Offices

Installations receiving the administration manual must ensure that subordinate installations know their responsibility to verify and forward FSA enrollment forms to their DDE/DR processing sites expeditiously.

FSA Videotape

A videotape providing an overview of FSAs entitled *It's Your Money You Save* (November 1994) was distributed in noncaptioned and open-captioned versions during the 1994 FSA open season. Although the videotape provides no open season information, personnel services offices are strongly encouraged to use the videotape to promote the FSA open season. In addition, the videotape may be used throughout the year, for example, in orientations for new career employees. Refer employees who view the videotape to the brochure for more detailed information.

Responsibilities of Personnel Services Offices

The *FSA Administration Manual* explains personnel services office responsibilities and processing procedures. Responsibilities include (1) determining eligibility to participate, (2) accepting and processing enrollment forms, (3) determining eligibility to change contribution levels during the plan year based on participants' qualified life status changes, and (4) filing Copy 1 of PS Form 8200 in employees' official personnel folders.

In particular:

- Offices will be excluded from using D20M. SDI 39, FSA in the DDE/DR system from PP 24-97 through PP 26-97. During this time, offices must use FSA Open Season verb D370 in the DDE/DR system to process FSA open season elections, and offices must send all FSA transactions related to the 1997 plan year to the Minneapolis Accounting Service Center for processing.
- Offices are reminded that career employees who are in an LWOP status that has lasted for more than eight consecutive full pay periods as of December 19, 1997, are *not* eligible to participate in the FSA program. The DDE/DR system will properly reject FSA enrollments for such employees when they are processed during the open season processing window. Offices must not process such enrollments again during PP 01-98 because the DDE/DR system may reset and erroneously permit the enrollment.
- Offices may refer to the *FSA Administration Manual* for instructions on processing FSA elections in cases of belated election or administrative error.

- Offices should make sure that employees specify annual, not pay period, contribution amounts and that they provide the correct employing office finance number and pay location in Part A of PS Form 8200.
- Offices may wish to remind employees to include health care expenses for dependents in the Health Care FSA contribution amount, not in the Dependent Care FSA. Although the brochure and the enrollment form advise employees of this provision, some employees did not understand this distinction in past open seasons.
- Offices may also wish to remind employees of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) annual limits on the Dependent Care FSA contribution — \$5,000 per family and \$2,500 for a married employee filing a separate return. These limits are explained fully in the brochure.
- Offices do not process form FSA1 (request to withdraw FSA funds for the reimbursement of eligible expenses). Participants are responsible for mailing these directly to the FSA Customer Service Center at the address on the form.
- Offices must not provide tax advice. Offices must refer employees with tax questions to their tax advisor or the IRS toll-free information line, 800-TAX-1040 (800-829-1040). A section of the brochure also presents certain tax information related to FSAs.
- Offices should refer employees with questions about the FSA program to the toll-free hotline described below.

FSA Customer Service Center Toll-Free Hotline

The FSA Customer Service Center provides a toll-free hotline for inquiries about FSAs. Employees with FSA questions may use the hotline by calling 800-842-2026. Following enrollment, participants may use the hotline to make account inquiries, discuss expenses eligible for reimbursement through the FSA program, and obtain other plan information. The FSA Customer Service Center also provides a Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD) line for the hearing impaired: 801-523-6955. The FSA Customer Service Center encourages employees using the TDD line to place an advance call to the toll-free hotline.

Health Benefits Open Season

The 1997 Federal Employees Health Benefits Open Season is scheduled from November 10 through December 8, 1997, according to the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). Eligible employees may make any *one* — or a *combination* — of the following changes:

- Enroll if not enrolled.
- Change from one plan to another plan.
- Change from one option to another option.
- Change from Self Only to Self and Family.
- Change from Self and Family to Self Only.
- Cancel enrollment.

Enrollment changes and new enrollments made during the 1997 open season are effective January 3, 1998 (Pay Period 02-98) for postal employees.

Distribution of Open Season Materials

Employees

Prior to the start of open season, the *1998 Guides to Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Plans* for (1) career employees, (2) Office of Inspector General (OIG) and Inspection Service (IS) employees, and (3) certain noncareer (temporary) employees will be mailed from the national level to each employee's address of record. Each *1998 Guide to FEHB Plans* — RI 70-2 for postal career employees, RI 70-2IN for postal OIG and IS employees, and RI 70-8PS for noncareer postal employees — includes an overview of FEHB Program eligibility requirements and election choices during open season, a comparison of biweekly premium costs of participating plans, an explanation of the pre-tax payment feature, information on which plans are accredited by the National Committee on Quality Assurance (NCQA), and the results of a Customer Satisfaction Survey conducted by OPM.

Installations

Some of the required materials will be distributed automatically, while the personnel services offices must requisition others, using the item number, name, and postal stock number (SN). All customer service district offices, processing and distribution centers, airport mail centers, bulk mail centers, the OIG and selected IS divisions, and selected Headquarters field units, will obtain open season materials in the following manner.

- RI 70-2, *1998 Guide to FEHB Plans* (postal career employees) — SN 7690-03-000-3774.
- RI 70-2IN, *1998 Guide to FEHB Plans* (postal Office of Inspector General and Inspection Service employees). Only the OIG and IS Operations Support Group offices will receive this guide.
- RI 70-5, *1998 Guide to FEHB Plans* (temporary continuation of coverage and coverage under the spouse equity law or similar statutes providing coverage to former spouses) — SN 7690-03-000-3772.
- PS Form 8201, *Pre-Tax Health Insurance Premium Waiver/Restoration Form* (November 1996).
- Most fee-for-service plan brochures.

Additional Information

Publication 12, *Health Benefits Open Season Administrative and Processing Information* (November 1997, SN 7610-03-000-5937), will be issued again this open season to address FEHB open season administrative issues in more detail. Copies of Publication 12 will be distributed to personnel services offices directly with further distribution to the same postal facilities that receive the *Postal Bulletin*. The document will be published in late October and will contain:

- Information on distribution of open season materials, including details of when and how to requisition a residual supply of materials.
- Eligibility requirements for coverage.
- A list of participating health plans and their premium rates.
- A list of health maintenance organization contacts.
- A list of FEHB health plan withdrawals and other changes.
- Additional instructions pertaining to open season administration.

Annual Leave Exchange Option

The annual leave exchange option provides the opportunity for eligible employees to receive a lump sum payment in exchange for a portion of the annual leave that would otherwise be advanced at the beginning of the 1998 leave year. Eligible employees include all career nonbargaining employees and employees represented by the National Postal Mail Handlers Union (NPMHU) or the International Association of Machinists (IAM) who meet the designated criteria. (Note: Annual leave earned and accumulated through the 1997 leave year, which ends January 2, 1998, cannot be exchanged for cash.)

A letter providing details of the eligibility criteria and an annual leave exchange option election form will be mailed to eligible employees at their address of record by November 15, 1997. Undeliverable election forms will be returned to the

personnel office, which should ensure that they are forwarded to the employee's work location along with Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*.

Employees who meet the eligibility criteria and desire to exercise this option must submit their completed election form to the local Finance office no later than December 15, 1997.

Payment under the Leave Exchange Option will be a lump sum calculated on the employee's base salary as of the first day of the 1998 leave year (January 3, 1998). Paychecks dated January 23, 1998, will include the 1998 lump sum payment.
