FY 1998 Corporate Greeting Card Program

Headquarters Customer Relations will provide the field with corporate holiday greeting cards. Field Customer Relations offices and postmasters may choose between two versions to send to customers during the holiday period: one portrays a peace dove delivered from a postal envelope (this version is available *now*); the other card depicts a busy, winter postal scene (this version will be available on November 28). Both cards will be printed in English and in Spanish, and will be shrink-wrapped in packages of 25. They can be ordered from the material distribution centers. This is a no-cost item.

Those wishing to order the cards should follow their normal requisition procedure. The peace dove card may be ordered now. The winter postal scene card may be ordered on or after November 28. The information you will need for ordering is:

Postal Products Items

This is a reissue of the "Postal Products" article published in *Postal Bulletin* 21956 (10-9-97) to reflect the addition of new products.

The Postal Service has entered into an agreement with Postal Products Unlimited to fill orders for the items listed below. The unit of issue shown on the list on pages 3–6 is not necessarily what sites will receive. The minimum issue increment column indicates the minimum order for that item. Orders are in multiples of the minimum issue increment. For example, the minimum order for item C1000A is 2,000 feet. You will receive one box of 2,000 feet for a cost of \$180.00. Quantities above the minimum order will be rounded in multiples of the issue increment (i.e., order 2,500 feet and you will receive 4,000 feet at \$360.00). If sites do not want the amount in the issue increment column, smaller quantities may be ordered directly from Postal Products Unlimited. The prices shown in the list are lower due to the larger quantities and will not be the same as orders placed directly with Postal Products Unlimited. As other items are identified for addition-

al discounts under this agreement they will be added to the list. All prices are delivered, and will arrive either via the mail stream or common carrier. Charge-back will be via the FED-STRIP/Finance process. Items will be shipped directly to the ordering office from Postal Products Unlimited. DMM NOTICE

Ancillary Service Endorsements For Perishable Priority Mail

Effective November 7, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) F010.5.1 and F030.5.3 are amended to allow use of the endorsement "Change Service Requested" with perishable matter (excluding live animals) mailed at Priority Mail rates under two conditions: 1) the mail participates in electronic Address Change Service (ACS) and the pieces bear the proper ACS codes, and 2) the pieces bear the marking "Perishable." These amendments also exclude use of the endorsement "Change Service Requested" with live animals mailed at First-Class rates.

Under DMM F010.5.1, ACS mailers may opt to receive a notice of new address or reason for nondelivery by placing the endorsement "Change Service Requested" on prescribed subclasses of First-Class Mail. Consistent with DMM F010.5.1, undeliverable as addressed (UAA) pieces bearing this endorsement are disposed of by the Postal Service. Under previous standards, the "Change Service Requested" endorsement was available only for First-Class Mail letters and sealed parcels and stamped and postcard subclass mail (matter mailed at First-Class rates, but not Priority Mail rates) for which electronic ACS service has been elected. DMM F010.5.1 expressly provided that this endorsement option is not available in conjunction with Priority Mail.

Since the implementation of the "Change Service Requested" option on July 1, 1997, the Postal Service has received requests from mailers of perishable articles, such as fruits, to have the "Change Service Requested" endorsement apply to Priority Mail pieces. Some mailers of such items indicate that they would prefer that UAA pieces whose contents include perishables be destroyed, rather than returned or forwarded, because such items may spoil before reaching the addressee at a new address or the sender if returned. This measure would, moreover, improve customer satisfaction for these mailers, in that they would acquire the information that they need to send a fresh replacement to an

addressee at a new address, if appropriate, in lieu of having spoiled contents forwarded to the addressee or returned to sender. This measure also benefits the Postal Service by eliminating the need to forward or return pieces containing perishable items which would be of no use or value to either the sender or the recipient.

To accommodate mailers of perishable items, the Postal Service has determined to extend the availability of the "Change Service Requested" endorsement option to Priority Mail pieces that also bear the marking "Perishable" and for which electronic ACS service has been elected. Since this option is available only to ACS mailers and only for Priority Mail pieces bearing the additional "perishable" marking, and given that the use of this endorsement is already permitted for pieces sent via letters and sealed parcels, it is reasonable to conclude that all mailers who elect this option will be aware of the nature of the service provided and the consequences in the event a piece bearing the endorsement is undeliverable as addressed. This change is accordingly effective immediately. Refer to *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) section 691.522, Noninjurious Items, for USPS regulation on disposal of perishable mail.

The Postal Service is also amending DMM F010.5.1 for consistency with DMM C022.3.10 and C022.3.12, which establish procedures for acceptance and handling of mailpieces containing mailable live animals. The Postal Service does not intend that the handling procedures for the endorsement "Change Service Requested" will replace those established for accepting, marking, and handling of mail containing live animals; consequently, DMM F010.5.1 is amended to preclude mailers from electing the "Change Service Requested" option for mail pieces containing live, mailable animals.

These amendments will be included in DMM Issue 54 (scheduled for release on July 1, 1998).

5.1 Priority Mail and First-Class Mail

[Revise the "Change Service Requested" portion of the table in 5.1 to read as follows:]

* * * * *

"Change Service Requested"	<p>Separate notice of new address or reason for nondelivery provided; in either case, address correction fee charged, piece disposed of by USPS.</p> <p>Use of this endorsement is limited to mail participating in electronic Address Change Service (ACS). It may be used only for: 1) pieces mailed at First-Class rates (excluding live animals) that bear the proper ACS codes, and 2) mail pieces mailed at Priority Mail rates that contain perishable matter (excluding live animals), bear the proper ACS codes, and that bear the endorsement "Perishable."</p> <p>This endorsement must not be used for mail with special services (e.g., certified or registered mail) or for Priority Mail containing non-perishable matter, or for any mail that contains live animals.</p>

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5.0 RETURNING MAIL

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5.3 Express Mail, Priority Mail, First-Class Mail

[Amend 5.3 to read as follows:]

Undeliverable-as-addressed mailpieces sent as Express Mail, Priority Mail, and First-Class Mail (including stamped cards and postcards) that cannot be forwarded or delivered as addressed are returned when possible to the sender at no additional charge. Exception: First-Class Mail pieces, and Priority Mail pieces containing perishable contents, that bear the endorsement "Change Service Requested" and that cannot be forwarded or delivered as addressed and do not contain live animals are disposed of by the USPS. Mail of all other classes may be returned to the sender if appropriately endorsed to guarantee return postage.

Manifest Analysis and Certification (MAC) Vendors List

The Postal Service, working with the mailing industry, has developed an evaluation program of vendor-supplied manifest mailing software. Named Manifest Analysis and Certification (MAC), this voluntary annual certification program examines and certifies the accuracy of the software packages used to calculate postage payment for single-piece rate mailings at domestic and international rates. It also tests and certifies the software's ability to generate facsimile postage statements and other types of documentation that meet Postal Service standards.

MAC has helped to create a simplified and consistent application and approval process for manifest mailing systems. Mailers and postal personnel are assured that if a mailer

uses MAC-certified software correctly, then manifest documentation and postage payment will be reported accurately. (Use of MAC-certified software does not guarantee manifest mailing system (MMS) approval. To ensure that the system was properly installed, mailers must apply for MMS mailing privileges and be approved according to the requirements in Publication 401, *Guide to the Manifest Mailing System*.)

International Mail

International Customized Mail

On October 1, 1997, the United States Postal Service (USPS) entered into an International Customized Mail Service agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the USPS hereby makes public the following information about that service agreement:

- a. **Term:** October 10, 1997, through October 10, 1998.
- b. **Type of Mail:** Letter Mail: Every item must conform to the size requirements set forth in IMM 213 and 226.71. The average piece weight of the qualifying letter mail must range from 3.5 ounces to 4.0 ounces. Every item must comply with the preparation requirements for Express Mail or Global Priority Mail set forth in IMM 214 and 226.6. Every item must comply with the design requirements for international mail set forth in the IMM.
- c. **Documents/Brochures:** Every item must conform to the size and weight requirements set forth in IMM 213. The average piece weight must range from 5.6 pounds to 6.36 pounds. Every item must comply with the preparation requirements for Express Mail set forth in IMM 214. Every item must comply with the design requirements for international mail set forth in the IMM.
- d. **Destination Countries:** Worldwide.
- e. **Service Provided by the US Postal Service:** The USPS has agreed to: (1) furnish the mailer with the sacks, tags, and other supplies that the mailer is required to use for Qualifying Mail; (2) provide the mailer or mailing agent with the training necessary for them to prepare ICM mail in conformity with the requirements for Qualifying Mail; (3) arrange with air and surface carriers, as appropriate, for Qualifying Mail to be transported internationally for delivery by the destinating foreign postal administration.
- f. **Minimum Volume Commitments:** Letter Mail: 2,040 pieces. Brochures/Documents: 21,000 pieces.
- g. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to: (1) package mail in accordance with requirements set forth for Express Mail and Global Priority Mail set forth in IMM 214 and 226.6; (2) pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with IMM 212 and 226.5 using a system approved by the appropriate Rates and Classification Service Center (RCSC); (3) provide a measurement system, acceptable to the RCSC, as specified in the service agreement; (4) maintain an established number of pieces per pound over the course of the service agreement, and (5) tender qualifying mail to the USPS at the designated USPS facility; (6) coordinate a schedule of mailings and provide notifications as specified in the service agreement.
- h. **Rate:** Letter Mail EMS: \$12.00 per piece. Letter Mail GPM: Published Rates. Documents/Brochures EMS: \$5.89 per pound.

Global Package Link

GPL is a service that provides fast, economical international delivery of packages containing merchandise. GPL is designed to make it easier and less costly for mail-order companies to export goods. The Postal Service provides GPL on a destination country-specific basis pursuant to the terms and conditions stipulated in subchapter 620 of the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) and the Individual Country Listings.

Changes to Acceptance Procedures for GPL

Effective October 29, 1997, IMM subchapter 620 is revised to announce new charges for GPL service. These new charges provide a discount for mailer-provided transportation of packages to a GPL processing facility and add, for mailers located more than 500 miles from a GPL processing facility, a surcharge for Postal-provided transportation. In addition, the current option for mailer processing is eliminated.

The new provisions are:

1. If the mailer transports the packages to a GPL facility, the mailer will receive a \$.20 per-pound discount, regardless of the distance from the mailer's plant to a GPL facility.
2. If the mailer's plant is more than 500 miles from a GPL facility, and the customer does not drop ship, the Postal Service will provide transportation at an additional rate of \$.40 per pound. If the mailer's plant is within 500 miles from a GPL facility, the Postal Service will continue to provide transportation without any additional charge.
3. The current option for mailers whose plants are more than 500 miles from a GPL processing facility, in which the customer processes the packages using a Postal-provided computer system, is eliminated.

Changes to GPL to Canada

Effective October 31, 1997, IMM subchapter 620 is revised to change GPL service to Canada. For Ground Courier service (henceforth to be referred to as GPL Standard), there are new prices and a change to some of the features. Ground Gateway service is eliminated. The new pricing for GPL Standard is based on origin and destination, and is, in most cases, a reduction in the rates previously established. Air Courier Service is renamed GPL Premium. There will be no other changes to the Air Courier service.

GPL Standard will differ from the existing Ground Courier service in the following ways:

1. Pricing will be based on four originating zones in the United States and local, regional, and national destination zones in Canada.
2. Insurance coverage will be increased. Insurance will be included in the price for up to \$100.00 (U.S.), and optional coverage of \$100.00 – \$1,000.00 (U.S.) will be available for a fee of \$.90 per \$100.00 of insurance over the first \$100.00, based on the value of the item declared.
3. For mail entering Canada through Vancouver (generally, mail originating in Zone C (Seattle) or Zone D (San Francisco)) there will be no changes other than those mentioned in items #1 and #2 above; that is, a new pricing structure and an increase in insurance availability.
4. For mail entering Canada through Toronto (generally, mail originating in Zone A (Buffalo, Chicago, New York City) or in Zone B (Dallas, Miami)), the following additional changes will take place:
 - The service standard is anticipated to be from three to five days after receipt by the U.S. Postal Service.
 - Preparation requirements will include that the customer place a Canada Post Xpresspost label on the package.

Rates for GPL to Canada

For GPL Standard, rates will differ based on origin processing site and destination, and will in most cases be substantially below current rates. There are four origin zones:

- Zone A. includes entry Chicago, New York, Buffalo;
- Zone B. Miami, Dallas;
- Zone C. Seattle;
- Zone D. San Francisco.

Mail originating in Zones A and B will generally be dispatched to Toronto; mail originating in Zones C and D will be generally dispatched to Vancouver. Mail entered in Dallas may be dispatched to either Toronto or Vancouver. There are three destination zones for each Canadian entry point: local, regional, and national, based on distance from Toronto or Vancouver.

In addition, for Canada Standard mail originating in GPL facilities located in New York City, Buffalo, Chicago, Dallas, and Miami, and dispatched through Toronto, the following restrictions apply:

- Maximum length, width, or depth is 78 inches.
- Maximum length plus girth is 108 inches.
- An oversize surcharge of \$4.00 US applies to each parcel if:
 - length, width, or depth exceeds 43 inches or
 - length, plus girth exceed 78 inches.
- Minimum Density requirements also apply to any parcel weighing less than 15 pounds that is over 84 inches length/width/girth will be rated as weighing 15 pounds and charged the 15-pound rate.

623.442 Transportation Drop-Shipment Discount
A discount of 20 cents per pound applies to mail that is transported by the mailer to a designated GPL facility. To compute the discount, multiply 20 cents by the number of pounds per country and per service level.

623.443 USPS Transportation Charge
If a mailer's plant is located more than 500 miles from a GPL facility, and the USPS transports the mail, the mail is subject to an additional transportation charge of 40 cents per pound. To calculate the transportation charge, multiply 40 cents by the number of pounds per country per service level.

In addition, customers using standard service to Canada whose mail originates in GPL processing facilities located in New York City, Buffalo, Chicago, Miami, or Dallas must apply a Canada Post Xpresspost product identification label.

625 Acceptance

625.1 Acceptance Location
A GPL mailing must be verified by USPS employees assigned to a detached mail unit (DMU) in the mailer's plant or at the origin post office serving the mailer's plant, according to a schedule agreed to by the Postal Service and the mailer. After verification, the mailing may be transported to a GPL facility by either the mailer or the Postal Service.

625.2 Transportation to GPL facility by the Mailer
The mailer will transport the packages as a drop-shipment to a GPL processing facility according to a schedule agreed to by the Postal Service and the customer. The mailer is eligible for a discount for drop shipment (see 623.442).

625.3 Transportation to GPL facility by the USPS

For mailers who do not transport the mail as a drop-shipment, the Postal Service will transport the packages by truck to the GPL processing facility according to a schedule agreed to by the Postal Service and the customer. For mailers whose plants are located within 500 miles from a GPL facility, there will be no charge for the transportation. If the plant from which the GPL mailing originates is located more than 500 miles of a GPL processing facility the mailing is subject to a transportation charge (see 623.443).

626 Service Available

626.1 Delivery Options

626.11 Premium Service

Premium service is available to all countries except France. Packages sent through premium service are transported to the destination country by air where they receive special handling and expedited delivery. The mailer can track premium service packages through delivery. Reports of delivery performance are furnished to the mailer in the formats and at the frequencies agreed upon by the Postal Service and the mailer.

626.12 Standard Service

Standard service is available to France, Japan, Canada, Singapore, and the United Kingdom. Packages sent through standard service are transported to the destination country by air (or a combination of air/ground to Canada) for delivery. The mailer can track standard service packages through dispatch from the GPL processing facility for Japan and through delivery for the United Kingdom and Canada. In Mexico, standard service provides for customer pickup of parcels at selected, secured, customer service centers with tracking to pickup.

1997 Commemorative Collection

On November 3, the 1997 Commemorative Collection went on sale throughout the country and by mail order from:

The 1997 Commemorative Collection (Item 8997) is a 64-page hardbound book that contains 103 commemorative stamps with mounts (approximately \$34 in postage) and sells for \$39.95. This beautifully illustrated book contains colorful pictures and stamp subjects such as Bugs Bunny, Classic American Aircraft, Classic American Dolls, and The World of Dinosaurs, and 23 other subjects celebrated on 1997 commemorative stamps.

Distribution to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) began on October 24 with completion scheduled for the last week of November. Distribution of the books will be made in two waves. Each SDO will receive approximately 60% of their allocated books in wave one, with the remaining sets coming in wave two.

The books and stamp packets are being shipped to SDOs separately, from different suppliers. SDOs must verify receipt of the quantities of stamp packets, as recorded on their advice of shipment. The books are being shipped in cartons of 15 to equal the total number of books received. The stamp packets are shipped in cartons of 150 packets. SDOs should report all differences between quantities shown on the advice of shipment and those actually received. SDOs must verify that they have received equal quantities of books and stamp packets.

Those SDOs that serve retail stores will receive additional quantities of the 1997 Commemorative Collection with stamp packets enclosed (Item 8997E). SDOs must use this item only to fill orders for postal stores.

To obtain an initial supply of this product, all post offices must submit separate Forms 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their designated SDO.

Offices should report all sales of this product in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales, on Form 1412-A, *Daily Financial Report*.

SDOs and Stamp Distribution Networks (SDNs) will receive an automatic distribution based on the following table:

Celebrate the Century™ Will Let the Public Put Its Stamp on History

In early 1998 the Postal Service will launch the largest stamp program ever: Celebrate the Century™ (CTC). For the first time ever, Americans can select stamp subjects honoring significant people, events, and trends of the 20th century. This 2-year program will involve all postal employees and customers.

The program was introduced to the media at an event hosted by Postmaster General Marvin Runyon on November 5 in Washington. In the next several weeks postmasters, station and branch managers, and other management officials will receive their own information with the first transmit-

tal of the CTC Employee Guidebook. The guidebook is a permanent reference document that will be added to every 6 to 8 weeks until the end of the year 2000, when CTC ends.

How CTC Works

Over the next 2 years, the Postal Service will issue special commemorative stamps honoring the first half of the century, while the American public will be voting on stamp subjects for the latter part of the century. Approximately every 3 months between February 1998 and the year 2000, the Postal Service will issue a sheet of 15 commemorative

stamps heralding the most significant events of each decade of the 20th century. Ballots for each decade beginning with the 1950s will be made available to the public at local post offices, special promotional events, selected magazines, and in schools nationwide.

For example, in February 1998, the stamp sheets for the first two decades — for the 1900s and 1910s — will be issued. At the same time the Postal Service will present a ballot identifying the people, events, and trends that shaped the 1950s. Americans can vote for their favorite '50s events and people. A few months later, while stamps are issued reflecting the 1920s, the public will vote on subjects from the 1960s.

The public will be able to put its "stamp on history" by selecting stamp subjects for the 1950s through the 1990s from the following categories:

- People and Events
- Arts and Entertainment
- Lifestyle
- Sports
- Science and Technology

An important part of CTC is the education component. Over 270,000 classrooms of students, primarily in grades 3–6 nationwide, will begin to learn about the 20th century as part of the CTC Education Series developed by the USPS. Students will be encouraged to vote, as their class reviews the 20th century — aided by this cross-curricular program that uses stamps as a way of teaching about art, geography, computer technology, and history.

Kids' Stamp Design Contest

The Postal Service currently is working with several postal administrations from around the world on a kids' stamp de-

sign contest that will be known in the United States as Stampin' the Future. It will be part of an international youth stamp design program expected to involve several dozen countries worldwide. This international program has the potential of being CTC's pinnacle in the year 2000. Children will be encouraged to submit stamp designs that express their vision of the future.

The guidebook provides general program information and detailed information on a few specific planned promotions. Later transmittals of the employee guidebook will provide additional information as stamp subjects are announced for the first five decades, and as the balloting subjects are announced for the second five decades. For each promotion, transmittals will include news releases, scripts for standup talks, and other helpful items.

Additional Resources

Included on page 49 in this *Postal Bulletin* is a general news release and fact sheet on CTC, and a time line for the program. For additional information contact an Area Stamp Facilitator or the District Stamp and Retail Coordinator in a performance cluster. Their names and telephone numbers are included in the resources section of the guidebook. They can answer questions about CTC or help obtain necessary materials. They also will be instrumental in planning special local CTC events.

The end of one century and the beginning of another is a unique event most Americans have never experienced. To mark the occasion, the Postal Service will lead the nation in recognizing events, people, places, and historic achievements that have helped make this nation what it is today. With your help and that of your employees, we can accomplish this goal and together put our "stamp on history."

POSTAL SERVICE ANNOUNCES MILLENNIUM CELEBRATION

All Americans Invited to Put Their Stamp on History

WASHINGTON DC — The U.S. Postal Service today unveiled plans for Celebrate the Century™, a new stamp program that is expected to be a premiere millennium observance. Celebrate the Century™ is scheduled to begin in February 1998 and will continue through the year 2000. U.S. postage stamps will depict the most memorable events, people, places, and trends of the 20th century. And for the first time ever, the public will be invited to vote for subjects that will be featured on stamps.

Every few months between February 1998 and the year 2000, the Postal Service will issue a sheet of 15 commemorative stamps heralding the most significant occurrences of each decade of the 20th century.

The stamps will be sold in a special souvenir sheet that can be saved as a collectible. "We hope that through Celebrate the Century™ Americans can save the past as they look forward to the future. U.S. postage stamps have been integral to

the fabric of American life since the founding of our great country, and they continue to be a source of learning and pride for all Americans,” said Postmaster General Marvin Runyon. He added that Celebrate the Century™ will be one of the nation’s largest and most inclusive commemorations of the 20th century.

Americans Choose Stamp Subjects

Subjects for these stamps will be determined two ways: first, the Postal Service has selected stamp subjects for the years 1900–1949; second, the American public will be invited to vote on subjects for Celebrate the Century™ stamps representing the years 1950–1999.

Americans—including kids—will vote on stamp subjects for the 1950s–1990s decades because market research showed that people are most familiar with the significant events that occurred during their lifetime. The public will be able to put its mark on history by selecting stamp subjects from the following categories: People and Events, Arts and Entertainment, Lifestyle, Sports, and Science and Technology.

How the Program Works

Ballots for each decade will be made available to the public at all post offices, at special promotional events, and in selected publications. Beginning in February 1998, the Postal Service will issue stamp sheets for the first two decades (the 1900s

and the 1910s), while a ballot identifying the people and events that shaped the 1950s will be presented to the American public. In May 1998 the American public will vote on stamp subjects from the 1960s, while the Postal Service issues stamp sheets from the 1920s.

For each voting period, the public will have 1 month to mail in their ballots. An independent firm will tabulate votes for the Postal Service. The number of times you may vote is unlimited provided proper postage is affixed to each ballot.

An Education in Culture and History

The Postal Service, working with leading education associations, will involve over 270,000 classrooms of students primarily in grades 3–6 nationwide as part of an extensive in–school education program. Students will be encouraged to vote and will have the opportunity to learn about subject matter from the 20th century, allowing them to make informed voting decisions. To expand on the educational component, the Postal Service is working with several postal administrations from around the world on an International Stamp Design Contest. Plans call for children ages 8–12 to submit a stamp design that expresses their vision of the future. Winning designs will be selected from each participating country, with

Fact Sheet for Celebrate the Century™

A sheet of 15 commemorative stamps will be issued for each decade from the 1900s through the 1990s, beginning in February 1998 and leading up to the year 2000.

Americans will be invited to vote on stamp subjects for the years 1950 through 1999 using ballots available at post offices nationwide. In addition, ballots will be available at special promotional events and in selected publications.

Celebrate the Century™ stamp subjects encompass a variety of significant events, achievements, and people who affected the 20th century. The following are the designated stamp categories:

- People and Events
- Arts and Entertainment
- Lifestyle
- Sports
- Science and Technology

Celebrate the Century™ stamp issues will be in addition to the traditional commemorative stamp program produced by the Postal Service each year.

Designed to celebrate and educate, Celebrate the Century™ will include an in-school program that will be available nationwide for students in grades 3–6. The program will teach young Americans about the most notable events, people, places, and trends of the 20th century.

Questions and Answers

As Celebrate the Century™ (CTC) is introduced, there undoubtedly will be questions about the program from employees, customers, elected officials, and the media. These questions and answers are provided to help you respond to these inquiries. Additional Q&A sheets will be provided as the program develops.

Q. What is Celebrate the Century™?

A. Celebrate the Century™ is a new 2-year stamp program sponsored by the U.S. Postal Service that will give the American public the chance to vote on the most notable events, people, places and trends of the 20th century, which will then be featured on commemorative stamps. The Postal Service has selected stamp subjects for the 1900s through the 1940s. The public (including kids) will vote to determine the stamp subjects for the 1950s through the 1990s.

Q. How will these stamps be issued?

A. Beginning in February 1998, the Postal Service will issue a sheet of 15 stamps commemorating the 1900s and one commemorating the 1910s. At the same time, the Postal Service will release a ballot to the American public for determining who and what shaped the 1950s. Voters will have 1 month to mail their ballot to an independent firm handling voter tabulation for the Postal Service. A time line for the next 3 years follows, which outlines voting periods for the public and stamp issue dates for the Postal Service.

Q. What types of stamp subjects will voters choose from?

A. For each decade, stamp subjects will be selected in each of five categories: People and Events, Arts and Entertainment, Lifestyle, Sports, and Science and Technology.

Q. What is the voting procedure?

A. Celebrate the Century™ ballots will be available at all post offices, at special promotions, and in selected publications. Only ballots with postage affixed qualify. An independent firm will tabulate the votes. There are no age limits to voting. Anyone can vote as often as they like, provided each ballot has postage and is submitted in accordance with balloting rules.

Q. How were the stamp subjects chosen?

A. The Postal Service designated the stamp subjects from the 1900s to the 1940s because extensive market research showed the public was more familiar with events from the latter part of the century. The same research showed the public preferred a program structured with voting for events pertaining to their lifetime.

Q. How are you involving children in this historic event?

A. Education is the cornerstone of this program. To date, the Postal Service is supported by the leading educational government agencies and over a dozen education-related associations. These organizations are currently working with the Postal Service to develop classroom materials. The Postal Service anticipates reaching at least 10 million students. In addition, children ages 8 to 12 will have the opportunity to participate in a special kids' stamp design contest. Winning designs will be selected from each country and issued in the year 2000. Winners from participating countries and kids throughout the United States will attend the first World Kids Congress to be held in the United States in the year 2000.

Q. Who or what are the candidates for the stamps?

A. Designs for the 1900s and 1910s stamps are scheduled to be presented in early 1998 at a series of special events. The stamp subjects for the 1950s will be presented to the American public to vote on in February 1998. Subject matter for subsequent decades, from the 1960s through the 1990s, will be announced every few months thereafter. (See the time line.)

Q. Will Celebrate the Century™ replace the Postal Service's traditional commemorative stamp program?

A. No. Celebrate the Century™ stamp issues will be in addition to the traditional commemorative stamp program produced by the Postal Service each year.

Q. Why is the Postal Service undertaking this program?

A. The Postal Service has developed Celebrate the Century™ as an educational way to commemorate the 20th century through the issuance of new postage stamps. Since the 18th century, stamps have been a historical archive of major events, people and achievements that have shaped this country. Stamps have been a tool to teach our country's history to every generation of Americans.

Q. Are tax dollars being used to promote Celebrate the Century™?

A. No tax dollars are used to support CTC or any other Postal Service program. In fact, the last time taxpayer dollars supported the Postal Service was 1982. Postal operations today are entirely self-sufficient. (Congress does appropriate funds that cover the cost of free or reduced postage for certain mailers designated by law.) The additional revenue generated by programs such as CTC has a positive long-term effect on the Postal Service's future by helping to hold postage rates steady.

Q. Can I get additional information online?

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 97-22

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-

mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.


Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Thrift Savings Plan Open Season

The next Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) open season is November 15, 1997, through January 31, 1998. TSPBK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (March 1997), provides an overview of TSP. The following information should assist personnel services offices in conducting this open season.

Direct Mailing to Employees

Career employees receive a direct mailing from the national level of TSP1197, *TSP Open Season*, at their mailing addresses of record. Career employees newly eligible to participate in TSP also receive a direct mailing from the national level of an enrollment package that contains a cover letter; TSPBK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (March 1997); and TSP-1, *Election Form* (July 1997). Career employees should receive these materials no later than the end of November.

The return address for undeliverable enrollment packages for newly eligible employees is the employing office of record. While the disposition of returned enrollment packages is at the discretion of the Customer Service and Sales district office or other administering office, forwarding a returned enrollment package to an employee offers that employee an opportunity to submit a correct PS Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*. (PS Form 1216 may be ordered from the material distribution centers (MDCs)

using postal Stock Number (SN) 7530-02-000-7354 or Quick Pick number 118.)

Eligibility

Career employees hired before July 1, 1997, are eligible to participate in this open season. Also, career employees hired before January 1, 1998, previously eligible to participate in TSP during a prior appointment are eligible.

All employees who participated in TSP and stopped their TSP contributions after July 31, 1997, are not eligible to participate in this TSP open season. They must wait for the TSP open season beginning May 15, 1998.

Effective Dates

Personnel services staff must initiate completion of Form 6886, *Thrift Savings Plan Request for Retroactive Contributions*, for all Forms TSP-1 not processed by the applicable processing date shown in the above chart. This form must be completed for either a belated election or an administrative error. The effective dates for these elections must be made retroactive to January 3, 17, or 31, 1998, depending on the date the employee initially filed his or her election form with the personnel services office. (Form 6886, which was published in *Postal Bulletin* 21665 (3-31-88), must be reproduced locally as needed.)

Note: Processing deadlines and the closing date of this TSP open season require using a third pay period effective date for elections received January 29 through January 31, 1998.

Open Season Materials

In addition to the direct mailing of TSP information to employees, pending receipt of materials from TSP, the MDCs will automatically distribute extra supplies of the open season leaflet (TSP1197), election form (TSP-1), and summary (TSPBK08) to Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, the Employee Service Center for the DC Metro Area, the Office of Inspector General, Inspection Service divisions, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units. (The February 1991 and September 1990 versions of TSP-1 are still valid and may be used if the July 1997 version is unavailable. The August 1996 and July 1995 ver-

sions of TSP BK08 are still valid and may be used if the March 1997 version is unavailable. All prior versions of these items are obsolete and must be discarded or recycled where appropriate.) The MDCs expect to distribute the extra materials listed above by the end of November 1997. Offices that would like any other TSP materials for use during the open season must order a supply from the MDC, which will fill the order if the materials have been provided by TSP.

Participant Statements

Employees with a TSP account will receive a participant statement from the TSP Service Office in November 1997.

Publicity

Human Resources at Customer Service and Sales district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, Office of Inspector General, Inspection Service divisions, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units will receive a supply of posters this open season from TSP. Installations that receive the posters must widely distribute and post them on bulletin boards.

To assist in publicizing the TSP open season, all offices must post the open season notice on page 77 of this *Postal Bulletin* on bulletin boards through January 31, 1998. Also post the current TSP fact sheet (published monthly in the *Postal Bulletin*) on bulletin boards.

Penalty Overtime Exclusion

The December period referenced in Article 8, Sections 4 and 5, of the USPS/APWU and the USPS–NALC National Agreements, during which penalty overtime regulations are not applicable, consists of four consecutive service weeks. This year, the period begins Pay Period 26, Week 1 (December 6, 1997), and ends Pay Period 1, Week 2 (January 2, 1998).

Rural Carriers Christmas Pay Procedures

The 1997 Christmas period for rural carriers begins December 6, 1997 (Week 1, Pay Period 26-97), and ends December 26, 1997 (Week 1, Pay Period 1-98). Christmas overtime is automatically computed by the system; therefore, no manual calculations are needed (see exhibit 1). Timekeepers, including postmasters, supervisors, and other employees, responsible for rural carrier time and attendance recording should become familiar with Article 9.2.J., Christmas Allowances and Procedures, of the 1995–1999 USPS/National Rural Letter Carriers Association (NRLCA) agreement and pertinent Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) requirements.

Exhibits are given to assist you in completing Form 1314, *Regular Rural Carrier Time Certificate*, and Form 1314-A, *Auxiliary Rural Carrier Time Certificate*, during the Christmas period.

1. X Days During Christmas

From the beginning of the guarantee year 1998, starting November 8, 1997, to the last day of the Christmas period, December 26, 1997, if a regular rural carrier (designation 71, FLSA code B) **is required to work** on her or his relief day (R day), the carrier must receive a relief day worked (X day) in the same pay period. Employees must take all X days accumulated before the beginning of the guarantee period after the Christmas period.

a. Required to Work

When the assigned carrier is **required to work** her or his assigned R day during the Christmas period because no replacement is available, enter an R for working on the relief day. The regular carrier is entitled to a relief day off (X day) in the **same pay period** for working the relief day **during** the Christmas period. If the assigned relief day worked is December 26, the relief day off must be taken no later than January 2, 1998 (PP 01-98) (see exhibit 2).

b. Requests to Work

If replacement carriers are unavailable and the carrier agrees to work when requested on the assigned R day during the Christmas period, enter an R for the relief day. The regular carrier is entitled to a paid day off (X day) **after** the designated Christmas period.

2. FLSA Code A Employees

Report on Form 1314 all hours worked by assigned carriers. No special requirement is needed. Compensation is paid at the regular rate for all hours worked up to 8 per day and 40 per week, and at the overtime rate for all hours worked in excess of 8 per day or 40 hours per week. FLSA code A employees are not entitled to any X days, as they are paid for working the relief day (see exhibit 3).

3. FLSA Code B Employees

Overtime is paid for hours over 12 in a day and 56 in a week. Total all hours over 12 hours in a day and enter them in the **Daily Overtime** block. Do not enter the hours over 56 in a week in the Daily Overtime block. Do not compute Christmas overtime (see exhibit 4).

a. Route Types H and M

No Christmas Assistant Work Hours are allowed for route types H or M. Report all hours worked by the assigned carrier in the Actual Weekly Work Hours block.

b. Route Types J and K

(1) Holiday on Relief Day

When the holiday falls on the employee's scheduled relief day (J or K day), the preceding work day is the employee's designated holiday. Therefore, when December 25 is the scheduled relief day, December 24 is the employee's designated holiday. The same is true for the New Year's Day holiday, January 1, 1998.

(2) Assigned Rural Carrier Works Designated Holiday

- a. Assigned rural carriers are compensated for working the designated holiday and are not entitled to a day off (X day). Enter V in the appropriate block on Form 1314 (see exhibit 5).
- b. Include the hours worked on the designated holiday with all other work hours for that week in the Actual Weekly Work Hours block.

(3) Assigned Rural Carrier Providing Christmas Assistance

The assigned carrier may provide any Christmas assistance necessary on the assigned carrier's relief day (J or K day).

- a. Enter the Christmas assistance hours worked by the assigned carrier in the Christmas Assistant Work Hours block on Form 1314. (Do not include these hours in the Actual Weekly Work Hours block.) If additional Equipment Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is due for work performed on the relief day, enter the mileage traveled in whole miles in the Route Deviation block for the appropriate week (see exhibit 6).
- b. The replacement carrier is paid for the relief day and the trip.

(4) Designations 72 and 74 Work Relief Day or Holiday

- a. Substitute rural carriers (designation 72) and rural carrier associates (designation 74) are compensated for working the relief day and are not entitled to an X day.
- b. When the carrier works on the designated holiday, include the work hours with the other work hours for that week in the Actual Weekly Work Hours block. Do not enter a V for working the designated holiday. It is a regular work day. Enter the relief day (J or K day) in the block for Thursday (a holiday). Substitute or replacement carrier data is not needed to crossfoot Form 1314 for the holiday (see exhibit 7).

(5) Designation 74 Works Relief Day Providing Christmas Assistance

Designation 74 may work on the J or K day as a Christmas auxiliary assistant. Enter the Christmas auxiliary assistance time on Form 1314 in the XMAS Assist Work Hours block. These hours are not included in the Actual Weekly Work Hours block. Enter the (J or K day) in the block on Form 1314; the replacement carrier works a full day on the route (see exhibit 8).

4. Auxiliary Rural Route Carriers

Carriers serving any **auxiliary** route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during both weeks of PP 26-97 and week 1 of PP 1-98. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route.

5. Replacement Rural Carriers Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants on a Regular Route

- Manually prepare Form 1314-A. Do not enter more than one carrier on Form 1314-A. Submit a separate certificate for each regular route.
- Complete required indicative data at the top of the certificate, including the employee's name, finance number, Social Security number, designation/activity code (70/0,70/1,73/0,75/0, or 78/0), route type (H, J, K, or M), the three-digit route number of the regular route, FLSA code P, the year, and pay period.
- Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate week 1 and/or week 2 Christmas Assistant Work Hours block.
- Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate week 1 and/or week 2 EMA blocks (see exhibit 9).

6. Replacement Rural Carriers Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants on an Auxiliary Route

All replacement carriers serving as Christmas auxiliary assistants are compensated at their regular rate for actual hours worked up to 40 per week, and at the FLSA overtime rate for actual hours worked in excess of 40.

- a. Manually prepare Form 1314-A. Enter route type and route number A998. Use this route type and number for overburdened service or Christmas assistance on auxiliary routes only.
- b. Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate week 1 and/or week 2 Christmas Assistant Work Hours block.
- c. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate week 1 and/or week 2 EMA blocks if applicable.
- d. If Christmas assistance is performed on two or more auxiliary routes in the same pay period, combine all work hours and EMA data on one manually prepared Form 1314-A (see exhibit 10).

7. Rural Carrier Associate (Designation 79) Provides Christmas Auxiliary Assistance on Assigned Auxiliary Route

- a. If a designation 79 performs Christmas assistance for her or his assigned auxiliary route, record the hours in the Christmas Assistant Work Hours block on the carrier's Form 1314-A certificate for her or his assigned route. Record **Christmas assistance** on the actual route worked **only** when a rural carrier associate **works her or his designation 79 position**.
- b. Add in EMA (hours and miles) with the total for the appropriate week. Trips may not exceed the number of days worked in the **No Service** block (see exhibit 11).

8. Postal Employees (Other Than Rural) Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

Postal employees (other than designation 7X) who provide Christmas assistance on rural routes are compensated at their regular rate of pay for actual time worked. Use the following reporting procedure:

- a. Report the hours worked on the rural routes as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants on Form 1230, *Time Card*.
- b. Manually prepare Form 1314-A for EMA compensation when a personal vehicle is used. Complete required indicative data at the top of the certificate, including the employee's name, finance number, Social Security number, designation/activity code 76/0, route type (H, J, K, or M), FLSA code P, and the three-digit route number of the regular route, year, and pay period. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate week 1 and/or week 2 EMA blocks. If a government vehicle is provided, do not prepare Form 1314-A (see exhibit 12).
