Message From the Postmaster General

Help Fight and Build Awareness — Promote Sales of the Breast Cancer Research Stamp

In July of this year, the U.S. Postal Service for the first time issued a stamp — the *Breast Cancer Research* Stamp — not only to increase awareness of breast cancer, but also to help in funding the fight to cure this deadly disease. October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and I want to encourage everyone in our stations, branches, post offices, and retail units to aggressively promote and sell this stamp.

Sadly, too many of us know women who have been stricken by this disease; however, our efforts to promote and sell this stamp just might make a difference in research efforts or in encouraging women to see their physicians regularly and to have annual mammograms to facilitate early detection, diagnosis, and treatment.

The issuance of the *Breast Cancer Research* Stamp has historical significance as it is the first time a stamp — known as a "semipostal" — has been issued in which a portion of its price will go directly to a charitable cause. The Postal Service continues a long tradition of issuing stamps that call attention to social and health-related causes.

Remember, too, that seven million people travel through our postal lobbies every day, and through your efforts, our customers can help us fund the fight to find a cure for breast cancer. Please be mindful of your stamp supplies and re-order in anticipation of sales.

DMM NOTICE

Changes for Application for Post Office Box or Caller Service (PS Form 1093)

Effective July 31, 1998, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) D910.2.2 and D910.2.3 were amended to revise the requirements when applying for a post office box or caller service. Two forms of identification will now be required. One must bear a photo. Social Security cards are not acceptable as a valid means of identification. Identification of physical address will also be required.

These amendments will appear in DMM 54, which is scheduled for release January 10, 1999.

2.0 SERVICE

[Add new 2.2 to read as follows; redesignate current 2.2 as 2.4; redesignate current 2.4 as 2.3 and amend first sentence to read as follows; and redesignate current 2.3 as 2.5.]

2.2 Verification

At the time of application customers must present two types of valid identification, one photo bearing and the other showing the applicant's signature and a serial number or other indicia that can be traced to the bearer. Social Security cards are not valid forms of identification. Each person or representative of an organization authorized to receive mail at a specific post office box or caller number must also provide two forms of identification.

2.3 Proof of Physical Address

An applicant for post office box service, each person or representative of an organization authorized to receive mail at a specific post office box or caller number, or a current box customer seeking renewal must identify his or her physical address (i.e., an individual's residence or a business location) to the postmaster of the office where service is sought or provided.* .*.*

NOTICE

PS Form 1093 Has Been Revised

Customers applying for a post office box or caller service must submit a revised PS Form 1093, *Application for Post Office Box or Caller Service*, dated July 1998 (see page 12).

The following changes have been made to PS Form 1093:

Item 9 Enter two types of identification and ID nos. — one must be photo bearing (*Driver's license*, military ID, other)

[The person accepting the application must ensure that customers provide two types of identification, one bearing a photo, when submitting PS Form 1093.]

Item 11 Check eligibility for carrier delivery

- a. City
- b. Rural
- c. HCR
- d. None

[Due to the new policy on no-fee box service, this item has been added to verify eligibility for no-fee box service.]

Item 14 Identification and physical address verified by *(Initials)*

[The person accepting the application must verify **two** forms of identification, one bearing a photo, and the physical address of the applicant, and must enter her or his initials in the space provided.]

Item 15 Postmaster: The following named persons or representatives of the organization listed below are authorized to accept mail addressed to this (these) post office box(es) or caller number(s). Valid identification and proof of physical address must be provided with each name. Continue on back if necessary.

[Each person or representative of an organization authorized to receive mail at a specific post office box or caller number must provide two forms of identification, one bearing a photo, and proof of physical address.]

Note that postmasters and station managers must exhaust current supplies of PS Form 1093 before ordering the revised form.

Why Not Use a Box?


any people have discovered that post office box service is a safe, convenient way to receive their mail. People who run a club, business, or professional organization find that post office box service gives them more room for higher volumes of mail.

If your organization gets an extra-large volume of mail, caller service is the answer. Inquire about caller service at your post office.

Benefits. With either service, you can enjoy these benefits:

- Early Morning Mail. You can generally pick up your mail first thing in the morning and take care of business earlier in the day. Of course, you may also pick up your mail later in the day, if you prefer.
- Security. You can rest assured that checks, dividend payments, and other valuable correspondence are secure.
- Separate Business Address. You can separate your business mail from your personal mail. That makes it easier for you to keep track of checks, orders, responses, and important correspondence.
- Accessibility. You can easily retrieve your mail during post office operating hours. In addition, some of our lobbies and box sections are open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Check with your local post office for more information.
- Travel Convenience. You can go away on short business or vacation trips without worrying about your mail.

Sizes for All. We offer several box sizes for different fees. (Some post offices may not have every size.) The approximate sizes are shown here:



Obtaining Box Service. It's simple! Just fill in the two-part tear-out card on the next page and turn it in to your local post office. Once we verify your information and receive your payment, we will begin providing your service.

Using Box or Caller Service

Post Office Box or Caller Address Use. We deliver to your box or caller address as printed on your mail, so be sure to provide correct and current address information to your correspondents. Your post office box or caller service number should appear on a separate line, followed by the post office's city, state, and ZIP + 4 (when we assign your box or caller service number, we will provide the corresponding ZIP + 4). Use the following example as a guide for proper addressing:

JOHN DOE PO BOX 1122 ANYTOWN NY 01234-1122

Fee Notification. Twenty days before the fee is due, we put a notice in your box (with caller service, we include the notice with your mail). If you go out of town after turning in a temporary forwarding order, we can mail the notice to your temporary address.

Fee Payment. With either service, you can pay in advance for six months or one year. It is your responsibility to pay your fee on time. If you pay by mail, we must receive your payment by the due date.

You can pay in cash, by check made out to "Postmaster", or with your credit or debit (ATM) card. Do not send cash by mail. If your check is returned by the bank, we must suspend your service until the check is made good. You may also incur a handling charge to cover our processing costs.

Late Payment. If you do not pay your post office box fee on time, we must close your box (or suspend caller service) and you will not be able to retrieve your mail. After 10 days of nonpayment, we remove the mail and treat it as undeliverable and suspend box/caller service. Closed boxes/suspended call numbers become available for assignment to new customers immediately.

Terms of Service. You may not use post office box or caller service just to avoid paying a forwarding charge or for any purpose prohibited by law or postal regulations. We will immediately terminate box or caller service if used for any unlawful purpose. Post office box or caller service may be provided to minors unless parents or guardians submit a written objection to the postmaster.

Accumulated Mail. We encourage you to remove your mail from your box regularly. You can make a special arrangement with the postmaster if you won't be able to pick up your mail for more than 30 days. Complete Form 8076, *Authorization to Hold Mail*, and we'll take care of it.

If the volume of your incoming mail repeatedly exceeds the capacity of the box you are using, we may require that you use caller service, change to a larger box (and pay applicable fees), or apply for service through one or more additional boxes.

Change of Address. If you choose to discontinue your box service, please complete a change of address (COA) form found in the *Mover's Guide*, available in the lobby, or on our website: www.usps.gov/moversnet. After completing the form give it to one of our clerks, or to your letter carrier, or you may mail it to your post office. Only you or your listed authorizied representative may file a COA order. We will forward mail addressed to you, your family, or your organization, but it will be your responsibility to forward mail for all individuals receiving mail at your box/caller service address.

Box Keys. We issue up to two keys for key-type post office boxes and issue an access code for combination lock-type post office boxes. A small deposit is required for each key, including the key you get when you first obtain box service. Whenever your box service terminates, turn in all keys to the Postal Service. We refund the deposits for up to two keys returned. Post office box keys may not be duplicated commercially.

Updating Information. The information on your application (Form 1093) must always be current. As soon as any information changes (such as address, telephone number, etc.), you are responsible for updating the form. Failure to update the application may result in a termination of service. We keep the form on file at the office where you use the service.

Use of Information. The U.S. Postal Service is authorized by 39 U.S.C. 403 and 404 to collect the information on Form 1093. We use the information in providing post office box or caller service to the applicant, but we may disclose it:

- To anyone authorized by law to serve judicial process.
- To a government agency, in performance of its duties.
- To anyone, if the box is used for doing business with the public.
- To a congressional office, if the boxholder requests it.
- In response to a subpoena or court order.
- When it pertains to a legal proceeding that involves the Postal Service.

The complete Privacy Act Statement is on the back of the application card.

DMM REVISION

New Specifications for Automated Flats

Effective October 4, 1998, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C820.1.0 through C820.7.0, C840.3.0, and M820.1.5 through M820.1.8 are revised, and C820.3.0 and C820.4.0 are added to describe the new specifications for automated flats. Newspapers, tabloids, catalogs, and many kinds of polywrap that cannot be processed on existing FSM 881 equipment can be processed on FSM 1000 equipment and will now be able to qualify for automated rates.

Productivity on the FSM 881 is higher than that of the FSM 1000, and migration of the flats that are sorted on the FSM 881 to the FSM 1000 would adversely affect service and costs.

When prepared with polywrap, FSM 881-sized pieces must continue to meet all the polywrap criteria in DMM C820.4.0; pieces to be processed on the FSM 1000 may be prepared with polywrap that is exempted from all but property number 2 (haze) of the polywrap specifications given in Exhibit C820.4.1a.

Testing has shown that larger pieces can be processed on the FSM 1000 than on the FSM 881. The FSM 1000 can process a mailpiece up to 12 inches high by 15-3/4 inches in length. For the FSM 1000, the length is the longest edge unless the piece is folded or has a bound edge, in which case the dimension parallel to the folded or bound edge is the length. This is different than the definitions of length and height for mailpieces processed on FSM 881 for these pieces because the height is defined as parallel to the folded or bound edge. The dimensions for folded pieces or pieces with a bound edge that are processed on the FSM 1000 increase 3-3/4 inches in length (the bound edge) but decrease 3 inches in height (the edge perpendicular to the bound edge). The minimum height and length dimensions for all flats processed on the FSM 1000 is 4 inches by 4 inches provided the mailpiece is greater than 1/4-inch. Mailpieces less than 5 inches in length must be greater than 1/4-inch thick. The minimum thickness for pieces 5 inches or more in length is 0.009 inch.

Testing of flat mailpieces demonstrated that as the length of the piece decreases, the thickness may increase. The maximum thickness requirement for the FSM 1000 is 1-1/4 inches if the length of the mailpiece is less than or equal to 13 inches in length. For pieces over 13 inches, the thickness cannot exceed 7/8 inch.

The maximum weight for First-Class Mail processed on the FSM 1000 is 11 ounces (13 ounces after rate case implementation, January 10, 1999), less than 16 ounces for Standard Mail (A), and 6 pounds for Periodicals. Flat mailpieces must meet the uniformity requirements contained in C820.8.0.

Since newspapers are double-folded, they pose no problem for processing on the FSM 1000. However, many flatsized pieces are not currently bound or double-folded; therefore, unbound flat-sized mailpieces will be required to be prepared with two folds. The second fold must be perpendicular to the original fold. In order to give publishers and printers the opportunity to make adjustments to their periodicals design to comply with this requirement, the Postal Service has decided to suspend the effective date of this requirement until October 4, 2000.

Business Mail Entry Managers will receive instructions regarding acceptance procedures prior to the October 4, 1998, implementation date.

These changes will be included in DMM Issue 54 (see pages 23 and 24).

C820 Flats

[Amend 1.0 by changing the term "2.0" to "1.0" and "7.0" to "9.0" and adding additional standards for FSM 881 and FSM 1000 pieces to read as follows:]

1.0 BASIC STANDARDS

Flats claimed at automation rates must meet the standards in 1.0 through 9.0 and the general and specific standards for mailability and the class of mail and rate claimed. Pieces meeting the dimensions for FSM 881 processing under 2.0 (height, length, thickness, and weight) must also meet the turning ability and deflection requirements in 7.0 in order to qualify for the automation flats discount. If polywrap is used with FSM 881 pieces meeting the dimensions under 2.0, the polywrap must meet all of the physical properties in Exhibit C820.4.1a of section 4.0 in order to qualify for the automation flats discount. Pieces that do not meet the dimensions for height, length, thickness, and weight under 2.0 (FSM 881 pieces), but that do meet the dimensions in 3.0 are eligible for processing on the FSM 1000. Such FSM 1000 pieces need not meet the turning ability and deflection requirements in 7.0. If prepared with polywrap, the polywrap for FSM 1000 pieces must meet only physical property number 2 (haze) in Exhibit 4.1a.

[Amend the heading of 2.0 to read as follows.]

2.0 DIMENSIONS FOR FSM 881 PROCESSING

[Delete the second sentence of section 2.3 b(2).]

[Redesignate 3.0 through 7.0 as 5.0 through 9.0, respectively. Insert new 3.0 and 4.0 to read as follows.]

3.0 DIMENSIONS FOR FSM 1000 PROCESSING

3.1 Determining Length and Height

The length and height of an automation compatible flat-size mailpiece eligible for FSM processing is not determined by the orientation of the address. It is determined by the following:

- a. For a piece prepared as a single sheet or in an envelope, full-length wrapper, or full-length sleeve, the length is the longest dimension. The height is the dimension perpendicular to the length.
- b. For a piece that has a bound or folded edge (e.g., a newspaper, tabloid, and catalog), the length is the dimension parallel to the bound or folded edge. The height is the dimension perpendicular to the length. If the piece is folded more than once or bound and then folded, the length of the mailpiece is based on the final fold.

3.2 Address Placement and Folded Pieces

- a. A flat-size mailpiece with a final fold must be designed so that the address is in view when the final folded edge is to the right and any intermediate bound or folded edge is at the bottom.
- b. Unbound flat-size mailpiece will be required to be double-folded on October 4, 2000.

3.3 Shape and Size

Pieces must meet the following requirements:

- a. Height: no more than 12 inches or less than 4 inches.
- b. Length: no more than 15-3/4 inches or less than 4 inches.
- c. Minimum thickness:
 - (1) For pieces at least 5 inches long, 0.009 inch.
 - (2) For pieces at least 4 inches long, but less than 5 inches long, 0.25 inch thick.
- d. Maximum thickness:
 - (1) For pieces 13 inches long or less, 1.25 inches.
 - (2) For pieces longer than 13 inches up to and including 15-3/4 inches, 7/8 inch.

3.4 Maximum Weight

Maximum weight limits are as follows:

- a. For First-Class Mail, 11 ounces (13 ounces as of January 10, 1999).
- b. For Periodicals, 6 pounds.
- c. For Standard Mail (A), less than 16 ounces.

4.0 COVERINGS

4.1 Polywrap Films

The Postal Service will allow plastic manufacturers to use the results of their American Standard Testing Methods (ASTM). Product tests must be used to certify that the polywrap films meet or exceed the minimum requirements for the physical properties outlined in Exhibit 4.1a and 4.1b.

Automation flat pieces that meet the height, length, thickness, and weight dimensions for the FSM 881 in 2.0 must meet all seven properties. Exhibit 4.1b Wrap Instruction

- The polywrapped flat shall be machinable according to USPS-STD-28A and as outlined in section C820. Shrinkwrapped mailpieces shall be approved if they conform to the machinable flat requirements according to USPS-STD-28A and as outlined in DMM 54 section C820.
- Wrap direction shall be specified as around the shorter axis of the mailpiece so that the seam is along the addressed side of the mailpiece, oriented from top to bottom. This seam must not cover any part of the address and barcode read areas (FSM 881 mailpieces only)
- 3. Overhang around edges:
 - a. For FSM 881 mailpieces, overhang (selvage) of not more than 1.5 inches of polywrap shall be allowed at the top of the mailpiece when the contents are at the bottom of the package. Overhang on each side shall not be more than .25 inch, however. The piece shall not be wrapped so tightly as to cause the product to bend.
 - b. For FSM 1000 mailpieces, overhang (selvage) cannot exceed 3/4 inch from any edge.

4.2 Polywrap Certification Process

The polywrap certification program requires plastic manufacturers to provide to the producer of the polywrapped flats an official ASTM certification of conformance verifying that their polywrap product meets the physical properties described in Exhibit 4.1a. Prior to the initial mailing with that polywrap product, the producer of the polywrapped pieces must submit for evaluation barcoded sample pieces that meet both applicable DMM mailing standards for automated flats and the minimum standards for polywrapped flats including the configuration requirements described in Exhibit 4.1b. Mailpiece design analysts (MDAs) may authorize the producer of the polywrapped flats that it may claim the automation rates for their initial mailing of flat-size barcoded pieces if both of the following conditions are met: (A) The pieces are prepared in a polywrap product for which the plastics manufacturer provides an official ASTM certification of conformance; (B) The prepared mailpiece meets all other mail preparation standards for polywrapped flats such as overhang, seam, and barcode readability. The MDA who authorizes the producer of the polywrapped flats that it may claim the automation rates will notify the applicable business mail entry unit of the authorization.

4.3 Submission of Samples for Evaluation

A producer of polywrapped flats who wishes to obtain authorization to claim automation rates for that polywrap product must submit samples to the Manager of Business Mail Entry for review by an MDA. Each sample submitted must consist of at least 30 polywrapped and barcoded sample mailpieces with a certification of conformance verifying that the polywrap material meets the physical property specifications in Exhibit 4.1a and Exhibit 4.1b, for either the FSM 881 mailpieces or the FSM 1000 mailpieces. If the address is placed on the outside of the polywrapped FSM 1000 flat, the submission of test pieces is not required.

4.4 Mailpiece Identification

Producers of polywrapped flats authorized to claim the automation rates must endorse the flats to show that they are automation-compatible polywrapped flat-size pieces. The mailer may meet this requirement by adding "USPS (product name of polywrap) FSM 881 Approved Automatable Polywrap" or "USPS (product name of polywrap) FSM 1000 Approved Automatable Polywrap," as applicable, on the address side of the piece, preferably below the postage area or in another visible location on the outside of the mailpiece. The polywrap marking must not interfere with the delivery address or the recognition of the barcode. The polywrap marking may also be printed directly on the polywrap material. Producers of polywrapped flats not currently using the appropriate mailpiece identification marking will have until October 4, 1999, to comply with this standard. For a list of USPS-approved polywrap manufacturers, refer to the USPS website.

4.5 Suspension of Approval

Any mailing found to be improperly prepared will not be accepted at the automation rates for flats. The repeated submission of nonmachinable mailings is cause for exclusion from the polywrap flat automation rates for polywrap pieces. [Delete renumbered 5.1. Renumber 5.2 and 5.3 as 5.1 and 5.2.]

6.0 TABS, WAFER SEALS, TAPE, AND GLUE

[Amend the first sentence in renumbered 6.0 to clarify that tabs, seals, tape, and glue are not required, to read as follows:]

Although not required, mailpieces may be prepared with tabs, wafer seals, cellophane tape, or permanent glue (continuous or spot) if these sealing devices do not interfere with the recognition of the barcode, rate marking, postage information, and delivery and return addresses.

7.0 TURNING ABILITY AND DEFLECTION

7.1 Turning Ability

[Amend the first sentence of renumbered 7.1 by adding "881" to read as follows:]

A flat-size mailpiece meeting the FSM 881 dimensions in 2.0 must fit between two concentric arcs drawn on a horizontal flat surface, one with a radius of 15.72 inches and the other with a radius of 16.72 inches in one of these ways:

7.2 Deflection

A flat-size mailpiece meeting the FSM 881 dimensions in 2.0 must be sufficiently rigid so that, when placed flat on a surface to extend unsupported 5 inches off that surface, no part of the edge of the piece that is opposite the bound, folded, or final folded edge (as applicable) deflects more than 1-3/4 inches (if the piece is less than 1/8 inch thick) or more than 2-3/8 inches (if the piece is from 1/8 to 3/4 inch thick). See Exhibit 7.2.

3.0 BARCODE LOCATION — FLAT-SIZE PIECE

[Revise 3.0 to read as follows:]

On any flat-size piece claimed at an automation rate, the barcode may be anywhere on the address side that is at least 1/8 inch from any edge of the piece. For FSM 1000 pieces, it is preferred that the barcode be placed at least 2 inches from the dimension that is the length for that type of automation piece (the longest edge, or for pieces with a folded or bound edge, the folded or bound edge). That portion of the surface of the piece on which the barcode is printed must meet the reflectance standards in 5.0. The address side may bear only one POSTNET-format barcode (i.e., the correct barcode for the delivery address on the mailpiece). Other mailer-applied non-POSTNET barcodes may appear on the address side if their format is not intelligible or not confusing to automated postal equipment. Address block barcodes are subject to the standards in 2.5a through 2.5e.

1.5 Package Preparation

All pieces must be prepared in packages. Firm packages must not be included in mailings prepared under M820. Pieces meeting the size dimensions for the FSM 881 under C820.2.0 must be prepared in separate packages from pieces that do not meet the FSM 881 dimensions (but that meet the dimensions for FSM 1000 processing). Each FSM 881 package and each FSM 1000 package must separately meet the package size minimum number of pieces in M820.2.1, 3.1, or 4.1 as applicable for the class of mail. When the total number of FSM 881 or FSM 1000 pieces for a specific presort destination (e.g., the 5-digit ZIP Code 12345) meets or exceeds the applicable minimum package size, the pieces for that presort destination must be prepared into a package or packages labeled to that presort destination in accordance with the standards for the rate claimed. The physical size of each package for that specific presort destination may contain the exact package minimum, more pieces than the package minimum, or fewer pieces than the package minimum depending on the size of the pieces in the mailing or the total quantity of the pieces to that destination. Rate eligibility is not affected when a physical package for a presort destination contains fewer pieces than the minimum package size for the above reasons, provided the total number of FSM 881 pieces physically packaged for that presort destination, or provided the total number of FSM 1000 pieces physically packaged for that presort destination, meets or exceeds the rate eligibility package minimum under E140, E240, or E640.

[Renumber 1.6 and 1.7 as 1.7 and 1.8, respectively, and insert new 1.6 to read as follows:]

1.6 Sack Preparation

Mailers may combine FSM 881 packages and FSM 1000 packages in the same tray (First-Class Mail) or in the same sack (Standard Mail (A) and Periodicals).

[Amend the heading of renumbered 1.8 to read "Exception — Periodicals Packages."]
[Insert new 1.9 to read as follows:]

1.9 Exception — Periodicals Automation and Nonautomation

For Periodicals, packages of automation mail (both FSM 881 and FSM 1000 packages) prepared under 3.1 and packages of nonautomation mail prepared under M200.2.4c through f may be sacked together under 3.2d through 3.2e. Automation and nonautomation packages may not be combined in 5-digit sacks. Under this exception, documentation required under P012 must identify the mail claimed at each rate by

package and sack sortation level. Under this exception, nonautomation mail continues to qualify for rates under E230 and automation mail continues to qualify for rates under E240 (i.e., rates for pieces in automation flats packages are based on the package level and rates for pieces in nonautomation flats packages are based on the package and sack level).

Overview

Pieces designed for automated flats processing (C820) could include pieces that, if not prepared as an automation flat, would be considered flat-size, letter-size, or irregular parcels under C050. For eligibility and preparation standards for specific rate discounts, see the appropriate Quick Service Guides: 141 First-Class Automation Flats, 241 Periodicals Automation Flats, or 641 Standard Mail Automation Flats. Size, weight, thickness, and flexibility standards vary for mail processed on the Flat Sorting Machine (FSM) 881 and the FSM 1000.

Characteristics and Content (C820)

Shape: rectangular. Dimensions: see reverse

Maximum Weight:

- First-Class Mail: 11 ounces, effective January 10, 1999, 13 ounces.
- Periodicals: 16 ounces for FSM 881, 6 pounds for FSM 1000.
- Standard Mail (A): less than 16 ounces.

Prohibitions: polywrapped, polybagged, and shrinkwrapped pieces are prohibited unless specifically approved by a manager, business mail entry (a list of approved polywrap and polywrap manufactures is available on the USPS web site). Clasps, strings, buttons, or other protrusions (C820.5).

Adequate flexibility and rigidity required for pieces meeting all FSM 881 dimensions. Each piece in an automation flat-size mailing must contain a complete delivery address (A010). Pieces that meet the dimensions for the FSM 881 in C820.2 must continue to meet flexibility and rigidity standards in C820.7 and, if prepared with polywrap, meet all polywrap criteria in C820.4.

FSM 1000 pieces may be prepared with polywrap that meets only property number 2, haze, in Exhibit C820.4.1a (not required if address label is on the outside of polywrapped piece).

Polywrapped pieces must be endorsed to show they are automation-compatible (C820.4.4), Folded publications:

- A flat-size piece with a final fold must be designed so that the address is in view when the final folded edge is to the right and any intermediate bound or folded edge is at the bottom.
- Effective October 4, 2000, unbound tabloids must have two folds. The second fold must be perpendicular to the original fold.

Mailpiece Length and Height

Length and height of an automation-compatible flat-size piece are determined by the following: For FSM 881 and FSM 1000

- For pieces prepared as a single sheet or in an envelope, full length wrapper, or full length sleeve, the length is the longest dimension. The height is the dimension perpendicular to the length. For FSM 881 (C820.2)
- For a piece with a bound or folded edge (e.g., newspaper, tabloid, or catalog) the height (vertical dimension) is the dimension parallel to the bound, folded, or closed edge. The length is the dimension perpendicular to the height. If the mailpiece is folded more than once or is bound and then folded, the height of the piece is based on the final fold. For FSM 1000 (C820.3)
- For a piece with a bound or folded edge (e.g., newspaper, tabloid, or catalog) the length is the dimension parallel to the folded or bound edge. The height (vertical dimension) is the dimension perpendicular to the bound folded or closed edge.

Barcodes

Barcodes must be in one of these four positions:

(C840)

- Above the address line containing the recipient's name.
- Below the city, state, and ZIP Code line.
- Above or below the keyline information.
- Above or below the optional endorsement line.

Barcodes must be at least 1/8 inch from any edge of the address side (for FSM 1000 pieces, at least 2 inches from the length, as defined above, is preferred). No more than one POSTNET barcode per piece. Additional standards apply for address block barcodes.

NEW MANAGEMENT INSTRUCTION RELEASED

Piece Count Recording System

Effective September 26, 1998, MI PO-610-1998-3, *Piece Count Recording System*, replaced MI PO-610-85-3, *Daily Unit Volume Recording*. These guidelines apply to all post offices and station and branch operations that require mail volume recording.

The revised management instruction is available on the IntraNet at http://blue.usps.gov/cpim/manage/welcome1.htm by title or document number. The document will also be available through the MDCs upon completion of printing in mid-October. Please note that any requests phoned into the MDCs prior to that time will be placed on back order until the shipment is received.



PALLET SAFETY

Loading Pallets Safely Into Trailers

Offices that dispatch pallets (either with or without mail on them) must load those pallets into trailers in a safe manner to ensure the integrity of the load. Improperly loaded pallets can shift or slide, causing the contents to topple in transit or when the trailer door opens.

Plastic postal pallets are designed to nest. The capacity for a 45-foot trailer is 22 stacks of 45 nested pallets. Load nested pallets side by side and secure in trailers with straps.



CFR REVISION

Conduct on Postal Property

Effective June 25, 1998, the Postal Service revised title 39 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) to amend its regulations concerning conduct on postal property. The final rule promulgating the new regulations was published in the *Federal Register* at 63 FR 34599 and appears in section 232.1 of the July 1998 edition of title 39 CFR.

The new regulations add the following prohibitions:

- No smoking in postal buildings.
- No soliciting of signatures on petitions, polls, or surveys on postal property except as otherwise authorized by postal regulations.
- No impeding ingress to or egress from postal buildings.
- No leafleting, picketing, and demonstrating by members of the public in lobbies and other interior areas of postal buildings open to the public.
- No public assembly and address, except when conducted or sponsored by the Postal Service, in lobbies and other interior areas of postal buildings.

- No placement of tables, chairs, freestanding signs or posters, structures, or furniture of any type on postal property except as part of postal activities or as otherwise permitted by these regulations.
- No storage of weapons and explosives on postal property except for official purposes.

The new regulations add rules for voter registration activities on postal property.

The new regulations provide that, in addition to guide dogs, animals used to assist persons with disabilities may be brought on postal property.

The new regulations provide that, in addition to postal inspectors and postal police, Office of Inspector General special agents and persons designated by the Chief Postal Inspector may enforce Postal Service property regulations.

A future issue of the *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) will include these changes in the CFR regulations.

ALL POST OFFICES WITH RURAL DELIVERY SERVICE

Rural Carrier Guarantee Period

Postal managers must effectively manage rural carriers who work under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), section 7(b)(2). Those carriers are paid overtime for all hours actually worked in excess of 2,080, up to 2,240, within the 52-consecutive-week guarantee period.

If a carrier works more than 2,240 hours within the guarantee period, the agreement under FLSA, section 7(b)(2), is considered void, and the carrier must be compensated for all hours worked during the guarantee period in accordance with FLSA, section 7(a).

It is important that we make every effort to minimize the number of hours rural carriers work over 2,080 and strictly monitor these carriers to ensure that no carrier works in excess of 2,240 actual work hours.

Last year's guarantee period was from Saturday, November 8, 1997, through Friday, November 6, 1998. The guarantee period for this year runs from Saturday, November 7, 1998, through Friday, November 5, 1999.

CAMPAIGN SEASON NOTICE

Political Campaign Mail

One of the most important public policy functions of the Postal Service is serving as a trusted partner in our nation's electoral process. Candidates for thousands of federal, state, and local offices are relying on us to bring their message to America's voters. Voters and candidates will also be judging the service of the USPS during the fall campaign season.

Direct mail remains a critical component of the media mix used by many candidates. Political consultants describe it as the most personal of all media, as it is the only one that permits pinpoint focusing on specific elements of the electorate.

Over the next several weeks, our system will experience a huge influx of political campaign mail. It is our job to make sure it is handled and delivered promptly and correctly. Equally important is the proper identification of political mail as it moves through our processing, delivery, and transportation network. The use of the distinctive red Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*, is designed to ensure that our people recognize this mail at every step along the way. More detailed information about the processing of political campaign mail is contained in *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) 492.

PACKAGING UPDATE

New FIRSTCLASS PHONECARD™ Packaging

There are now two types of FIRSTCLASS PHONECARD packaging: cards in the original "dollar bill" size packaging and a new, wider package for use in displays at retail counters in card selling sites.

Retail locations selling FIRSTCLASS PHONECARDS should display the new, wider packaging in their acrylic displays and can also continue to sell cards in the "dollar bill" package until that inventory is exhausted. Future shipments for retail sites will contain only cards in the new packaging.

Vending personnel must place only "dollar bill" size packaging in their PCM-1625B machines. The original "dollar size" packaging will be shipped only to those sites that are vending FIRSTCLASS PHONECARDS.

To ensure receipt of correct inventory, any employee ordering FIRSTCLASS PHONECARDS must specify whether the order is for "retail" or for "self service (vending)." This will help guarantee that they receive cards in the appropriate packaging.

YEARBOOK UPDATE

1998 Stamp Yearbook

On Monday, November 2, 1998, the 1998 Stamp Year-book, formerly known as the "Commemorative Collection," will go on sale throughout the country and by mail order from:

STAMP FULFILLMENT SERVICES PO BOX 419636 KANSAS CITY MO 64179-0996

Selling for \$39.95, the 1998 Stamp Yearbook (Item #8998) is a 64-page hardbound book that contains 80 commemorative stamps (approximately \$30 in postage) with mounts. This beautifully illustrated book contains colorful pictures and stamp subjects such as: Sylvester & Tweety, Four Centuries of American Art, Tropical Birds, Space Discovery, and 21 other subjects celebrated on 1998 commemorative stamps.

Distribution to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) will take place in three waves:

- Wave 1 all postal stores, October 19.
- Wave 2 102,570 copies to SDOs beginning October 12 with completion by October 29.
- Wave 3 135,195 copies to SDOs beginning October
 13 with completion by November 19.

Distribution quantities are based on the January 1998 stamp distribution survey.

The books and stamp packets are being shipped to SDOs separately from different suppliers. SDOs must verify receipt of the quantities of stamp packets, as recorded on their advice of shipment. The books are being shipped with 15 books per carton to equal the total number of books received. The stamp packets are shipped in quantities of 150 packets per carton. SDOs should report all differences between quantities shown on the advice of shipment and those actually received. SDOs must verify that they have received equal quantities of books and stamp packets.

Those SDOs that serve retail stores will receive additional quantities of the 1998 Stamp Yearbook (with stamp packets enclosed) (Item 8998E). SDOs must use this item to fill orders for postal stores only. To obtain an initial supply of this product, all post offices must submit separate PS Forms 17, Stamp Requisition, to their designated SDO. Offices should report all sales of this product in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales, on PS Form 1412-A, Daily Financial Form.

SELF SERVICE

"H" Stamp Vending

On November 9, 1998, the Postal Service will issue the nondenominated "H" Hat stamps in Washington, DC. These stamps support the new postage rates effective January 10, 1999. In support of the Postal Service's Self Service operations, these stamps are packaged in 20-stamp, \$6.60 vending booklets.

For the convenience of our customers, please ensure that sufficient quantities of these stamp booklets are stocked beginning November 10, 1998. Stock booklets in Postal Booklet and Stamp Machines (PBSM-624) and in the following Postal Commodity Machine (PCM) models: PCM-1625A, PCM-1625B, PCM-21, and 21-CE-72.

For the period between November 10, 1998, and January 10, 1999, stock these machines with **BOTH** the nondenominated "H" Hat stamps and an existing 32-cent booklet. Beginning January 10, 1999, replace the 32-cent booklets with the "H" Hat stamps or another suitable denominated alternative.

PCM-1625A and PCM-1625B must have the new prices entered into the control board via the keypad. Procedures for price setting are in Section 2 of Handbook MS-121, *Postal Commodity Machine, PCM-1625* and Handbook MS-134, *Postal Commodity Machine, PCM-1625B.*

The PCM-21 and 21-CE-72 PCM modified with the Applied Micro Technology (AMT) "in-site" controller have pricing instructions silk-screened on the cover over the controller board located on the inside of the cabinet door.

PBSM-624 must have the new prices entered into the control board via the keypad. Procedures for price setting are in Section 2 of Handbook MS-139, *Postal Booklet and Stamp Machine*, *PBSM-624*.


Postal Service Partners With President's Council on Y2K Conversion
