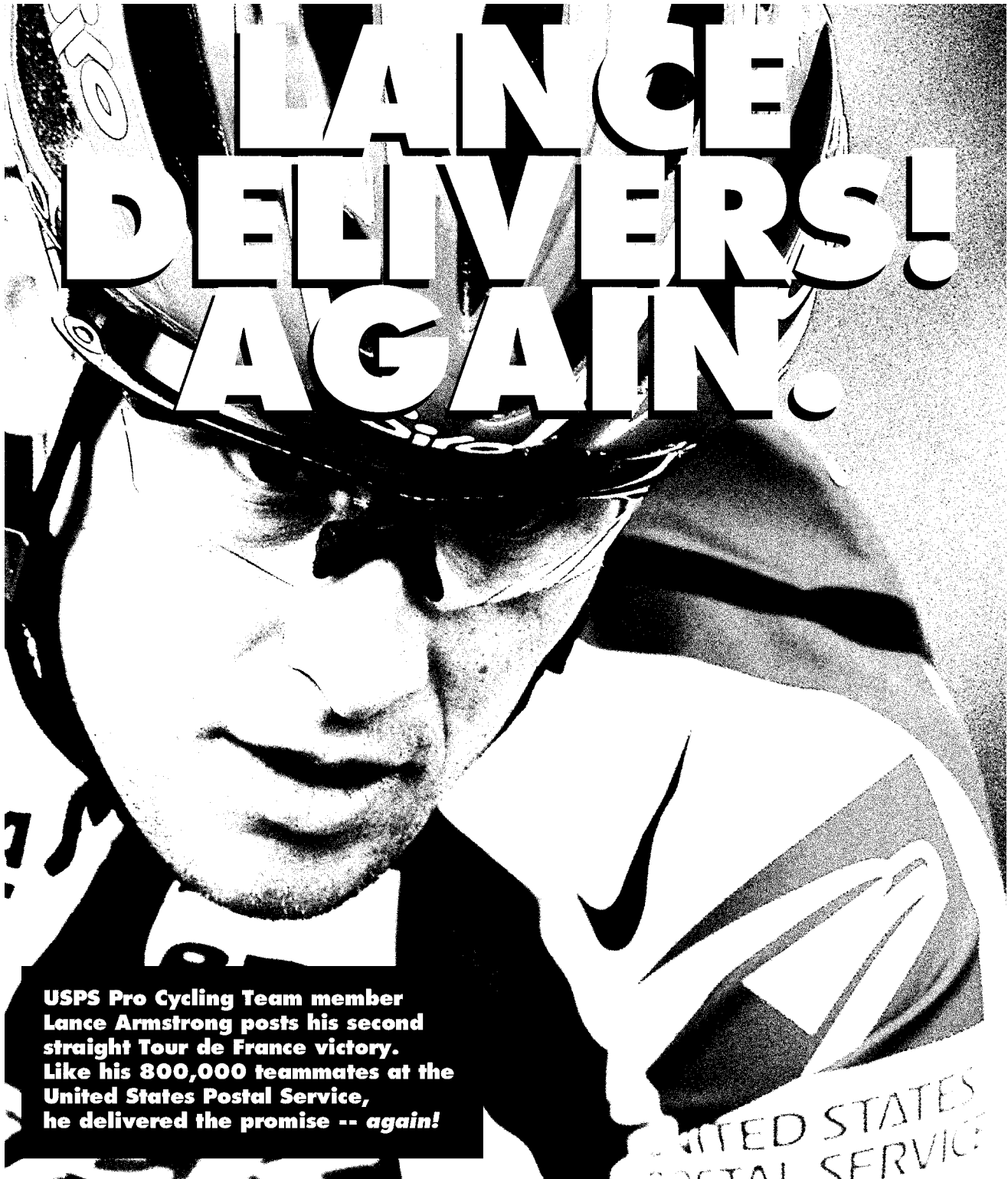

## Fiscal Year Closing Guidance


### *Message From the Controller*

I encourage each of you to continue your efforts to control expenses. It is important that we carry this effort through to the end of the fiscal year.

While we must make accruals for goods received and services rendered, we must also control discretionary activity. This does not mean curtailing business; but it does mean making prudent choices, deferring or eliminating noncritical activity, and not purchasing goods or services at year-end simply because we have available budget funds.

We need to encourage our contractors to bill us in a timely manner so we can recognize the expense prior to the close of accounting period 13.

The following instructions will assist you, when appropriate, in helping the Postal Service close its financial books in a timely and efficient manner. Please note that we have increased the minimum expense accrual from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

### I. Instructions for Fiscal Year Closing

All organizations are requested to limit their expenditures to essential spending. Accordingly, all vice presidents should review discretionary spending to ensure the Postal Service attains its financial target for this fiscal year (FY).

The government fiscal year comprises 365 days (366 in leap years) always ending on September 30. However, for internal reporting purposes, the Postal Service reporting cycle comprises 13 accounting periods (APs) of 28 days each, totaling 364 days. This year the Postal Service reporting cycle for internal reporting ends on September 8, 2000. AP 14 is an estimation period used to convert the Postal Service's internal reporting cycle to the government fiscal year.

The instructions and reporting dates in this *Postal Bulletin* supplement procedures followed during the normal AP or quarterly reporting schedule.

### II. Capital and Expense Commitment or Accrual Activities

#### A. Capital

Purchasing will not accept capital and expense requisitions after August 18 unless work is currently under way on advance requirements or the buying manager grants an exception. Capital commitments, particularly postal support equipment, should also be limited to essential needs.

Purchasing will attempt to issue the required contract in time for the San Mateo Accounting Service Center (ASC) to process against FY 2000 funds. Contracts for requisitions requiring issuance of a solicitation or negotiation with vendors received prior to September 8 may not be issued in time for processing against FY 2000 funds. Requisitions

received September 8 and after will be processed against FY 2001 funds.

Purchasing will process all requisitions for the issuance of contracts against FY 2000 funds according to the following priorities:

#### **Priority 1 — Capital commitment requisitions.**

#### **Priority 2 — Expense commitment requisitions.**

Commitment documents with award dates prior to and including September 8 must be forwarded to reach the San Mateo ASC not later than September 11. Appropriate receiving reports or certified invoices for goods and services received by September 8 must be forwarded to the San Mateo ASC for receipt *no later than September 11*. Please expedite processing of receiving reports and certified invoices as these documents are used to charge costs to the proper FY.

#### **B. Unpaid Expenses or Accruals for goods and services received September 8 and prior. Expense accrual limit for FY 2000 has been changed from \$5,000 to \$10,000.**

If it is impossible to furnish a certified invoice in time to reach the San Mateo ASC by September 11, a *minimum of \$10,000* may be accrued per contract sequence number or miscellaneous (noncommitment) purchase or service. Complete PS Form 8163, *Request for Fiscal Year 2000 Expense Accrual*, a copy of which is found on page 5 of this *Postal Bulletin*. *Documentation supporting accruals must be attached (see PS Form 8163 for examples of proper vendor documentation)*. *Processing of all FY 2000 documents ends on September 15*. Documents received at the San Mateo ASC pertaining to activity occurring September 9 and later will be recorded in FY 2001.

### III. Liquidation of Accruals

When submitting an actual certified invoice, include the statement "Accrued to FY 2000" on the face of the document.

Accruals must be liquidated as soon as possible. Offices must monitor their accruals and payments to ensure that the accruals are properly liquidated. All FY 2000 accruals processed by the San Mateo ASC that remain unliquidated at the end of AP 06, FY 2001, will be reversed automatically as a prior year credit. Subsequent payments will be charged to the appropriate budget finance number as a FY 2001 expense.

#### Schedule I — Accrual Processing Information

The following are examples of items that *may* be accrued using PS Form 8163 if goods or services have been received September 8 and prior; no receiving report has been sent; the dollar amount of service rendered exceeds \$10,000; and you will not get an invoice to certify for payment by *September 8*:

##### Service Maintenance Contract — Copier

Review the last invoice processed to determine the amount to accrue from the service ending date through September 8.

To estimate the accrual amount, perform the following calculation:

- Calculate number of days to accrue.  
Billing period last invoice = 7/27 – 8/25  
Number of days to accrue = **14** (8/26 – 9/8)
- Calculate the daily rate.  
Divide the last invoice amount by the number of days in the billing period to determine a daily rate.  
Invoice amount = \$30,000  
Billing period = 30 days (7/27 – 8/25)  
Daily rate = **\$1,000** (\$30,000 / 30 days)
- Calculate the accrual amount.  
Multiply the daily rate calculated by the number of days that will be accrued.  
Accrual amount = \$1,000 x 14 = \$14,000

#### Utility Billing Accrual — Natural Gas

- Use the accrual amount calculation for service maintenance as shown above.

#### Other Goods or Services Accrual — Consultant Contract

- Calculate the accrual amount.

Check with the vendor to validate the cost of goods or services received during the period 8/15 – 9/8 and obtain the necessary supporting documentation.

**Note:** Do not accrue if the amount is less than \$10,000.

  - Bulk fuel deliveries, oil purchases, and vehicle parts
  - Capital
  - Carrier drive-outs
  - Citibank Government Travel Accounts (GTA) \*
  - Credit card purchases \*
  - FEDSTRIPs \*
  - FTS 2000\*
  - Gasoline credit card purchases \*
  - Government Printing Office (GPO) printings \*
  - Imprest funds
  - Incentive awards
  - Inventory
  - Nonpostal training
  - Nonmetered fuel
  - Relocation Management Firm (RMF) services\*
  - Tort claims
  - Travel
  - Uniform allowances
  - Vehicle repairs on PS Form 4541, *Order-Invoice for Vehicle Repair (Commercial Work Order)*
- \* Items will be accrued by National Accounting or the San Mateo ASC.

## DMM CORRECTION

### Parcel Post ZIP Code Corrections

Effective August 10, 2000, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E652 Exhibit 8.0 is amended to correct double destination delivery unit locations for ZIP Codes in the Parcel Post exception list. The listing for ZIP Code 37616 will reflect the correct state. These changes may be implemented before the effective date.

This revision will appear in the next printed version of the DMM and are included in the monthly update of the on-line DMM available via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

## REMINDER

### Congressional Franked Mail: Not to be Returned for Postage

We continue to receive reports of congressional franked mail being returned to the originating member's office marked "Return for Postage." *This mail should not be returned for collection of postage.*

Managers must take steps, through stand-up talks and, when appropriate, written notices, to ensure that all employees are aware of the proper handling of congressional franked mail. In lieu of postage or postage indicia in the upper-right corner of the envelope or address label, this mail bears the facsimile signature of a member of the U.S.

House of Representatives or the U.S. Senate. The signature is followed by the initials "M.C.," which stand for "member of congress," or "U.S.S.," which stand for "U.S. Senate." Postage for congressional franked mail is paid to the Postal Service in lump sums by the U.S. Treasury, according to established procedures. See *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) 491.13 for additional information.

OPERATIONAL TEST

**Friend-to-Friend Mail Test Begins August 7**

The Postal Service is conducting a test of the operational and accounting feasibility and procedures for a proposed product called *Friend-to-Friend Mail*. Friend-to-Friend Mail lets advertisers provide their customers with postage-paid-by-advertiser cards that can be sent to any third party. The advertiser will not put live postage on the mail. Instead, the Postal Service will deduct the postage from a deposit account only when the card is mailed, similar to business reply mail. Postage on each piece is charged at the First-Class Mail single piece rate.

Note that this is a test only, and that adjustments to the product may be made based on the results. Before this product can be offered beyond the test stage, the Postal Service must file a case with the Postal Rate Commission.

For the test, the front of the mailpiece will contain indicia as shown in the samples on pages 12–17, plus a PLANET code identifying the advertiser and a facing identification mark (FIM) B. *Note that the mailpiece samples do not contain the PLANET codes or the FIM Bs, but the actual mailpieces will.* The Postal Service will spray on a POSTNET code with the third party's address at origin. Combined, the PLANET code and the POSTNET code will provide the piece with a unique identifier that will enable the Postal Service to bill the advertiser after the piece is scanned at destination. See "Flow for Friend-to-Friend Postcards" (right) for more operational detail.

The test customer is VarTec Telecom, Inc., which is located in Dallas, TX, where the First-Class Mail permit for the test mail has been issued. VarTec Telecom will send a total of 2 million Friend-to-Friend cards enclosed in outer mailpieces. These outer mailpieces will not have PLANET barcodes and will not be tracked as part of the test. VarTec Telecom will send the mailpieces to a national mailing list of customers, primarily in semimetro areas, who may then mail the cards to any third party in any location. Thus, both the origin and the destination of the cards could be any office.

VarTec Telecom will conduct a total of 10 mailings throughout the months of August and September 2000, as follows:

VarTec Telecom has been given 20 different 5-digit customer-identification PLANET codes for use during the test.

The test will cover a period of six months, beginning on August 7, 2000, the date of the first outer pieces mailing, and ending on February 1, 2001. Return pieces will still be accepted and processed after the test period, and VarTec Telecom will maintain postage in the account.

Since we need to successfully scan both the POSTNET and the PLANET codes at destination to bill the advertiser, it is important to apply a readable POSTNET barcode.

**Flow for Friend-to-Friend Postcards**

1. The advertiser deposits funds in a First-Class Mail permit account to cover return postage for a percentage of cards.
2. The advertiser mails cards to households. Cards have PLANET codes identifying the advertiser and a FIM B.
3. Cards are mailed by households to any third party.
4. The Postal Service processes cards at entry.
  - a. The Postal Service sprays POSTNET barcodes on cards. POSTNET barcodes, combined with PLANET barcodes, provide a unique identifier for the card.
  - b. The Postal Service scans the barcodes. Data are automatically generated showing that the card has been scanned.
5. The Postal Service processes cards and delivers them to intended recipients.
6. Every two weeks a report of the number of unique cards scanned, including their origin and destination, is sent to the mailing requirements manager at the office where the permit is held. Every two weeks, the advertiser's account is debited, and, if necessary, the advertiser deposits additional money in the account.

## RESTRICTIONS

### LEGEND

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**B.** Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

**Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length	
42" .....	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" .....	24" girth
over 44" to 46" .....	20" girth
over 46" to 48" .....	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

## HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

### Postal Meter Resetting System

Effective immediately, Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 714.2, is revised to permit the use of remote-set postage meters at authorized contract postal units (CPUs) by using the Postal Meter Resetting System (PMRS). The PMRS system enables the resetting of remote meter products at CPUs without requiring advance payment.

CPUs may use remote-set meters under the following conditions:

- The CPU operator must lease the meter, at his or her expense, from an authorized postage meter manufacturer.
- The meter must be used exclusively for affixing postage to postal customer mailings. The postage meter must not be used for affixing postage to business mailings of the contractor or any other mailing unrelated to the CPU's postal customer activity.
- A contract officer representative (COR) must authorize all postage meters in use at CPUs that use the PMRS meter account system.

To use a remote-set postage meter under the PMRS system, a CPU must first obtain written authorization from the COR. Before providing authorization, the COR must review the CPU's bond limit to ensure that the combined value of postage stock accountability and postage meter value after setting does not exceed the bond limit. The maximum allowed value to be set in a postage meter will be the bond limit less the postage stock accountability. In no case will a CPU be allowed to request a postage meter setting in excess of \$25,000.

The COR must include the CPU's finance number, standard field accounting system (SFAS) unit ID, and ZIP Code in the letter of authorization to the CPU and must provide a copy of the authorization letter to the district accounting office (DAO). The CPU operator will provide a copy of the written authorization to the meter manufacturer and will maintain a copy of the authorization at the CPU.

Meter manufacturers will establish a PMRS meter account only after verification of a letter of authorization from the COR. The meter manufacturer must perform the following when establishing a PMRS meter account:

- Complete Form 3601-C, *Postage Meter Activity Report*.

- Record the agency code as 600.
- Record the SFAS unit ID in the cost code field.
- Establish records on their system to allow setting without prepayment.

CPUs using a PMRS meter account must report daily meter revenue on Form 3602-PO, *Postage Collected Through Post Office Meter*; Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*; and AIC 110, *Postage Meters — Post Office*. The CPU must call the meter manufacturer to add postage to a postage meter using a PMRS meter account. The CPU must report additional postage added to the meter on Form 3602-PO.

In non-SFAP post offices (statement of account offices), the employee reviewing the CPU's Form 1412 financial documentation must review all Forms 3602-PO and report any postage meter resettings to the Meter Accounting Tracking System (MATS) coordinator at the DAO.

For CPUs reporting under SFAS directly to the DAO, the accounting technician must review all Forms 3602-PO and report any postage meter resettings to the MATS coordinator at the DAO. The MATS coordinator will verify the resetting against the MATS system to ensure validation and confirmation of each setting with the meter manufacturer.

3> If the contract postal unit (CPU) is using a remote-set postage meter under the Postal Meter Resetting System (PMRS), treat the meter as a post office-owned meter. The meter must be used exclusively for mailings of customers. The CPUs must report daily meter revenue on Form 3602-PO, *Postage Collected Through Post Office Meter*, and on Form 1412 in AIC 110. The CPU must report the initial setting and additional postage settings added to the meter on the Form 3602-PO.

In non-SFAP offices, the employee reviewing the CPU's Form 1412 financial documentation must review all Forms 3602-PO and report any postage meter resettings to the Meter Accounting Tracking System (MATS) coordinator at the DAO.

For CPUs reporting under SFAS to the DAO, the accounting technician must review all Forms 3602-PO and report any postage meter resettings to the MATS coordinator. The MATS coordinator will verify the resetting against the MATS system to ensure validation and confirmation of each setting with the meter manufacturer.

HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

**Daily Closeout of the Accountbook**

Effective accounting period (AP) 12, fiscal year (FY) 2000, Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, is revised to include the requirement that district accounting offices (DAOs) close out the accountbook and transmit the statement of account timely. The accountbook must not be more than two prior business days behind the current calendar date business on a daily basis in the standard field accounting system (SFAS). The only exception would be on Monday and Tuesday because of weekend activity. The following chart is provided for clarification:

Accounting Business Day	Close No Later Than Close of Business
Thursday/Friday	Monday
Saturday/Sunday	Tuesday
Monday	Wednesday
Tuesday	Thursday
Wednesday	Friday

The trust and suspense system (TASS) must be no more than two days later than the current 1412 date in SFAS. The DAO must transmit the AP statement of account (SOA) by the close of business on Monday following the end of each AP or by the close of business on Tuesday if Headquarters gives an extension.

**223 Posting the Accountbook**

[Revise 223.1 to read as follows:]

**223.1 District Accounting Office — SFAP Units**

The DAO consolidates daily financial activities into a single accountbook and closes out the accountbook in the 1412 module of SFAS as indicated in the table below. The trust and suspense system (TASS) must be no more than 2 days behind the current 1412 date in SFAS.

If all required support documentation has not been received and verified at the time the 1412-day is closed in SFAS, a file of missing documents must be maintained and monitored. If adjustments are required when the documentation is received, they are to be entered on the current 1412 business date being processed in SFAS. If the support

documents are not received at the DAO within 5 business days, make adjusting entries to place the unsupported entries into trust or suspense, and issue the appropriate Form 1908(s), *Financial Adjustment Memorandum(s)*, to the unit. For offices that submit a printed Form 1412, the Form 1412 and money order data should be entered into the Money Order Voucher Entry System (MOVES) using the current business date being processed. The TASS business date should be no more than 2 days behind the 1412 business date in SFAS.

## 224 Preparing the Statement of Account

[Revise 224.1 to read as follows:]

### 224.1 District Accounting Office — SFAP Units

SFAP units send financial data to the DAO each day. The DAO consolidates and manages the information for the SOA. At the end of each AP, the DAO transmits the SOA to the ASC no later than the close of business (COB) Monday following the end of each AP. If Monday is a holiday and Headquarters gives an extension, the DAO must transmit by COB on Tuesday.

## REMINDER

### Yearly Mailing Address Verification for Employees

The current mailing address for each employee is preprinted on his or her check and/or earnings statement one pay period (PP) each year to assist in address verification and for disaster contingency purposes. For this year, the preprinted address will be displayed PP 16-00, pay date August 4, 2000. Every employee should verify his or her address and make any changes on PS Form 1216-X, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*, which will be provided as a payroll stuffer for employee convenience.

If the listed mailing address information is not correct, employees should return the completed PS Form 1216-X to their local personnel office for processing. Please be aware that incorrect addresses can cause delays in an employee's receipt of important postal information. Displaying this address on the check and/or earnings statement

serves to remind employees to immediately report any and all changes to their personal mailing address.

All personnel are reminded that the information displayed on the paycheck and earnings statement is a private matter and *is not* to be disclosed to or discussed by anyone. All information relating to the addresses, wages, and deductions of Postal Service employees must be held in the highest confidence. References to the importance of the confidentiality of this information can be found in section 822.1 of Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 353.3 of the *Administrative Support Manual (ASM)*, and 5 U.S.C. section 552a(l).

**Accountbooks and Statement of Accounts for Postal Fiscal Year 2001**

The material distribution center (MDC) is making an automatic distribution of PS Form 1551, *Accountbook for Post Offices and Financial Reporting Units — CAGs A–L*, and PS Form 1555, *Statement of Account for CAGs H–L*, for postal fiscal year (PFY) 2001. *These forms are to be used by CAG H–L offices only.* These forms are being distributed in bulk quantities to district accounting offices (DAOs) only and distributed by the DAOs to the field no later than August 25, 2000. If your office does not receive its forms by this date, contact your DAO, not the MDC.

All CAG H–L offices that submit a manual statement of account (SOA) are to begin using the new forms at the beginning of PFY 2001 (9-9-00). The current accountbooks and SOAs have edition dates of June 2000. *All old, unused versions of PS Forms 1551 and 1555 should be recycled after PFY 1999 ends.*

PS Forms 1551 and 1555 are changed from last year as follows:

1. AIC 490 formula has been corrected to show the proper makeup of the AIC.
2. A total line has been added on the SOA for postage stock received.

An accountbook consists of PS Forms 1551, sections A–G, banded or shrinkwrapped as a set. Each CAG H–L office that maintains an accountbook should receive one set.

PS Form 1555 is shrinkwrapped in sets of 16. Each CAG H–L office that prepares a quarterly SOA should receive one set.

A future *Postal Bulletin* article will give ordering information for DAOs requiring additional forms after the automatic distribution.

## Missing, Lost, or Stolen U.S. Money Order Forms

### Do Not Cash — Upon Receipt, Notify Local Postal Inspectors

## Pricing for Express Mail International Service and Express Mail Corporate Accounts

Express Mail International Service (EMS) is a reliable high-speed mail service designed to meet customer needs for Custom Designed and On Demand services. The Postal Service will automatically apply a 5 percent discount to published EMS rates for all mailers who pay for EMS through an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) beginning August 12, 2000. Federal agencies will also be eligible for the discount when they use their federal agency numbers for payment. The discount will be available only for Express Mail sent internationally. The discount will be deducted from the total postage amount on the mailer's monthly account, rather than from each piece.

The 5 percent discount will be offered on postage only; it does not apply to pickup fees, any special service fees, or postage for shipments made under an International Customized Mail (ICM) agreement. There will be no change in the operations of the POS/IRT equipment and financial reporting. The regular rates will be charged during the retail transaction. The postage discount will be deducted from the mailer's monthly account.

Effective immediately, the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) is amended to add new subchapter 590, which outlines the requirements for exporting wildlife and protected plants. This revision will be incorporated into both the printed version of IMM Issue 24 and the online IMM, which can be accessed via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

**590 Exporting Wildlife and Protected Plants**

**591 Special Requirements for Wildlife and Certain Plant Exports**

Exports of wildlife items and products may be subject to declaration, license, marking, and permit requirements enforced by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). Similar requirements also apply to plants protected as endangered or threatened under U.S. law or international treaty. Live wildlife and dead animals, with only a few exceptions, may not be exported via the U.S. Postal Service (see 139.1).

**592 Declaration Requirements**

**592.1 Declaration of Wildlife Exports**

The following wildlife exports must be declared to USFWS and must receive clearance prior to export:

- a. Commercial exports of wildlife products.
- b. Shipments of items not intended for commercial use valued at \$250 or more.

- c. Noncommercial shipments of items that require a permit for export (e.g., products made from endangered species or migratory birds) regardless of the dollar value of the shipment.

To declare a wildlife export, shippers must complete and file Form 3-177, *Declaration for Importation or Exportation of Fish or Wildlife*, with USFWS. Copies are available from wildlife inspection offices (see 598), from the U.S. Customs Service, or on the Internet at <http://www.le.fws.gov/le/FAQs/FAQs.htm>.

**592.2 Declaration of Scientific Specimens or Parts**

Form 3-177 is not required at the time of export for shipments of dead, preserved, dried, or embedded scientific specimens or parts when:

- a. The shipment does not require a permit from USFWS.
- b. The shipment is exported by an accredited scientist or accredited scientific institution for taxonomic or systematic research purposes.

Instead, the scientist or scientific institution (or an agent acting on their behalf) must file Form 3-177 with the assistant regional director for law enforcement in the USFWS administrative region from which the export was mailed within 180 days of export. Contact information is available on the Internet at <http://www.le.fws.gov> (click on *Contacts*).

**592.3 Declaration of Plant Exports**

The export of protected plants is regulated by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS). Shippers should contact the Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ) division for additional information about export requirements for protected

plants. Exporters who engage in the commercial trade of plants listed under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) must obtain a general permit from APHIS/PPQ in addition to meeting the permit requirements described in 596. All plant exports are subject to phytosanitary inspection and certification rules administered by APHIS/PPQ. Information about plant export requirements can be found on the APHIS/PPQ Web site at <http://www.aphis.usda.gov/ppq>.

### **593 Export Licenses and Inspection Requirements for Commercial Wildlife Exports**

Individuals or companies that commercially export wildlife must have a valid import/export license from USFWS. Exporters must notify USFWS and make their shipments available for inspection at least 48 hours before the planned exportation date. Exporters must pay appropriate inspection fees.

### **594 Marking Requirements for Wildlife Exports**

All packages containing wildlife products must be marked clearly with the name and address of both the shipper and the recipient. Information identifying the contents as fish or wildlife and specifying the quantity and species involved must accompany the shipment. Federal regulations (50 CFR Part 14, Subpart H) explain how to comply with wildlife marking requirements. See 597.

### **595 Permit Requirements for Wildlife and Plant Exports**

Permits are required to export any of the following by mail or other means:

- a. Any wildlife or plant (including parts and products) where the species is listed under CITES. A list of species protected under this treaty is maintained by USFWS at <http://international.fws.gov>.
- b. Any wildlife or plant (including parts and products) where the species is listed as endangered or threatened under the U.S. Endangered Species Act. A list of these species can be found at <http://endangered.fws.gov/wildlife.html>.
- c. Migratory birds, parts, feathers, nests, eggs, or items made from them. Permit requirements for export and numerous other protections apply to more than 700 bird species safeguarded under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. A list can be found on the Internet at <http://migratorybirds.fws.gov/intrnltr/mbta/mbtand.html>.

CITES-listed herbarium specimens; other preserved, dried, or embedded museum specimens; and live plant material may be exported as a noncommercial loan, donation, or exchange between registered scientists or registered

scientific institutions using a CITES-authorized label instead of an export permit.

### **596 Obtaining and Using Permits for Wildlife and Protected Plant Exports**

#### **596.1 Export Permits**

Shippers who need export permits or other documentation required under CITES or the Endangered Species Act should contact USFWS Office of Management Authority (800-358-2104) for the appropriate application forms and instructions. Some CITES-listed species also require permits from the importing country before they can be legally exported.

#### **596.2 CITES Permit**

The original CITES permit must accompany the shipment. All wildlife exports requiring a CITES permit that are shipped by mail, including personal items mailed overseas, must be declared to USFWS and made available for inspection and permit validation by USFWS wildlife inspectors. Exports of CITES-protected plants must be declared to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service; permits for these shipments must be validated by that agency before export.

#### **596.3 Export of Migratory Birds**

The export of migratory birds, their parts, feathers, eggs, or nests, or products made from them, is prohibited except with a permit from USFWS. Permit applications and information are available from the regional Migratory Bird Permit Offices located in Albuquerque, NM; Anchorage, AK; Atlanta, GA; Denver, CO; Fort Snelling, MN; Hadley, MA; and Portland, OR.

### **597 How to Obtain Additional Information**

Additional information about exporting wildlife products and protected plants can be found in the following sections of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR):

- a. 50 CFR Part 14, Importation, Exportation, and Transportation of Wildlife
- b. 50 CFR Part 23, Endangered Species Convention
- c. 50 CFR Part 24, Importation and Exportation of Plants

These and other Federal regulations, including those governing endangered species (50 CFR Part 17) and migratory bird permits (50 CFR Part 21), may be accessed online at <http://www.access.gpo.gov/nara/cfr/index.html>.

## ICM UPDATE

**International Customized Mail**

On April 28, 2000, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) amended an International Customized Mail (ICM) service Agreement dated June 9, 1999. The information concerning the basic Agreement was published on page 38 of *Postal Bulletin* 22002 (7-15-99). The Amendment modifies the Agreement to add Express Mail International Service to the Agreement. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information about the Amendment:

- a. **Term:** July 11, 2000, through December 31, 2000.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Express Mail International Service (EMS)*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for qualifying mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Australia, Brazil, Japan, and Mexico.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to: Provide at the end of each Postal Accounting Period a statement status of the mailer's Corporate Account. Other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in force.
- e. **Minimum revenue commitment:** The mailer has agreed to a minimum annual requirement of \$25 million in international mail postage in Postal Fiscal Year (PFY) 2000 and each subsequent PFY, and to tender a minimum of 1,000,000 EMS pieces annually.

f. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to:

1. Prepare mail in accordance with the applicable USPS requirements as set forth in IMM 214 for EMS.
2. Pay postage in accordance with permit imprint payment methods, subject to the general conditions stated in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P500.
3. Other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in force.

**International Customized Mail**

On June 30, 2000, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** July 26, 2000, through June 30, 2001.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Express Mail International Service (EMS)*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for qualifying mail.
- c. **Destination country:** Japan.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
  1. Furnish the mailer, or mailing agent, with the equipment and supplies necessary to prepare qualifying mail.

2. Provide the mailer, or mailing agent, with the training necessary to prepare qualifying mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
3. Provide pickup service on-call and scheduled pickup service in accordance with IMM 212.
4. Provide direct transportation from the United States to destinations.
5. Arrange for appropriate air and surface transportation for qualifying mail.
6. Provide a system, which will include a computer workstation, in-line scale, printers, and manifesting software.
7. Provide a Corporate Account mailing statement at the end of each postal Accounting Period.

e. **Minimum volume commitment:** The mailer has agreed to tender annually a minimum of \$2 million in postage, with 87,000 pieces of EMS at approximately 3 pounds each to Japan.



- f. Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to:
1. Prepare mail in accordance with the applicable USPS requirements.
  2. Pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with payment methods as referenced in the IMM and the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) for Express Mail Corporate Accounts (EMCAs).
  3. Provide a schedule of mailings in accordance with instructions provided by the USPS.

- g. Rates:** The mailer will pay a rate of \$11.47 per piece plus \$4.10 per pound for EMS shipments to Japan.

### Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard).

Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

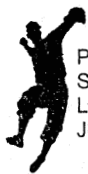
Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

### NEW PUBLICATIONS

#### Handbooks AS-554-A and AS-554-D

Handbooks AS-554-A, *Water Management Guide for Facility Managers*, and AS-554-D, *Water Permitting Guide*, are now only available on the Postal Service intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov/environmental>. At this time we do not plan to print these handbooks. Those persons responsible for or interested in these programs, such as vice presidents of Area Operations, facility and site managers, and environmental professionals, can access and/or print the handbooks from the online copy.

Handbook AS-554-A, *Water Management Guide for Facility Managers*, provides guidance to Postal Service facility and site managers to define, implement, and monitor an efficient and cost-effective water management program. This handbook presents water management issues and provides guidance on water issues that are relevant to the Postal Service. It also outlines practices that are either required or recommended for the management of water at a postal facility. This handbook discusses the following key water issues: water sources, water distribution systems, water use, collection system components, wastewater treatment systems, and pollution prevention.

Handbook AS-554-D, *Water Permitting Guide*, provides guidance to Postal Service environmental professionals in assisting facility and site managers to define, establish, implement, and monitor a water permitting program that can reduce operational costs, ensure compliance with required regulations, and enhance environmental stewardship. This handbook is a reference tool for implementing the water permitting program in postal facilities. The handbook provides Postal Service environmental professionals with the technical tools necessary to assess the need for water-related permits. It also describes specific federal permitting requirements and provides information essential for facility and site managers and other responsible parties to accomplish their water permitting responsibilities.

ELM REVISION AND HANDBOOK EL-312 ADDITION

## Retired Military Personnel Leave Accrual Credit and Veterans' Preference for Service in Kosovo

President Clinton has issued an executive order establishing the Kosovo Campaign Medal for service in that country or its waters or air space after March 24, 1999, through a closing day yet to be determined. An entry for Kosovo consequently will be incorporated into the list of wars, campaigns, and expeditions of the armed forces since 1937 provided by the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). This military service confers eligibility both for partial leave accrual credit for military retirees and for veterans' preference.

### Retired Military Personnel Leave Accrual

Partial leave accrual credit for military retirees is provided in accordance with *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 512.223. ELM Exhibit 512.223a is updated with the addition of the entry for Kosovo and will appear in the next online incremental update or paper publication of the ELM.

### Veterans' Preference

Those eligible for the medal qualify for veterans' preference in hiring and layoff protections if they served in the military for at least 24 months and were released from active duty under honorable conditions. Reservists are eligible if

they were released under honorable conditions for the full period for which ordered or called to active duty.

Employing officials must ensure that all personnel responsible for adjudicating veterans' preference claims are made aware of the Kosovo Campaign Medal. Applicants and employees who wish to claim veterans' preference for time served in the campaign must submit DD Form 214, *Certificate of Release or Discharge From Active Duty* (Member Copy 4), showing receipt of the medal.

The updated list will be incorporated into the new Handbook EL-312, *Employment and Placement*, which replaces Handbook EL-311, *Personnel Operations*. HANDBOOK M-39 AND HANDBOOK M-41 REVISION

## City Letter Carrier Delivery Point Sequence Work Methods

Effective immediately, Handbook M-39, *Management of Delivery Services*, and Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carriers Duties and Responsibilities*, are revised to incorporate the Memoranda of Understanding dated March 21, 2000. The memoranda represent final agreement between the U.S. Postal Service and the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) regarding selection of the more efficient method for city delivery routes in delivery units where delivery point sequencing (DPS) has been, or will be, implemented. The two approved DPS work methods are the composite bundle work method and the vertical flat casing DPS work method. Management may convert those routes that have vertical flat cases and are currently using the composite bundle work method to the vertical flat case DPS work method.

Additionally, clarification is provided to the sections of Handbook M-41 pertaining to numbers of bundles of sequenced mailings that may be required of city carriers serving mounted routes. The parties agree that there is no prohibition to the number of bundles that may be carried on a mounted route.

District managers should ensure that copies of the Handbook M-41 changes are made for each city delivery route in their district and that each city delivery route book is updated. Future editions of Handbooks M-39 and M-41 will include these revisions.

Carrier case, Item 124, is the basic letter case for use on all letter carrier routes. The delivery unit manager must determine the need for wing cases for letter mail (Items 143 or 144) using criteria outlined below:

- a. *Case Configurations.* Carrier cases will be six (6) equally spaced shelves for casing letters in a non-DPS environment where either one, two, or modified two-bundle systems are used, and in DPS environments where the composite bundle work method is used. In delivery units where the vertical flat DPS work method is selected by management, carrier cases will be six (6), five (5), or four (4) equally spaced shelves for casing.

The system or systems that best meet the requirements of the unit should be used. However, for efficiency and economy, some degree of uniformity should be maintained. Use of the most advantageous system, including the proper use of all authorized equipment, is required.
- b. On Delivery Point Sequence (DPS) Routes, the proper use of all authorized equipment is required. The manager will select the most appropriate work method for each route from the following:
  - (1) Case residual letters in the same separations with vertically cased flat mail, pull down and carry as a single bundle.

- (2) Case residual letter mail separately into delivery sequence order, pull down and carry as a composite (third) bundle.

Curblines carriers pull down using the same work methods outlined for foot routes; but they must place letter and flat mail in delivery sequence in trays without strapping out. The standard city carrier case normally may utilize four, five, or six evenly spaced shelves with 40 one-inch separations in each. The individual dividers are removable so that the separations can be widened when necessary. Management will determine the number of shelves and separations to be used for each route. The basic case may be further modified by adding wings, to provide for greater capacity.

**222 Systems for Casing and Preparing Mail**

As a general rule, three basic systems are commonly used for casing and preparing mail for delivery in a non-DPS environment. Management may prescribe any one of these methods, but for efficiency and economy, some degree of uniformity should be maintained. However, more than one casing system at an installation may be used for the particular type of route served. The three basic systems are:

- a. One-Bundle System: Arrange all separations on case(s) for letter mail. Case magazines, newspapers, and flats with letter-size mail. Withdraw and strap out letter and flat mail together. **Note:** When a one-bundle system is used, sequenced mailings shall not be cased but shall be handled as additional bundles. When directed by management to deliver sequenced mailings, handle mailings as follows:
  - (1) Carriers serving foot or park and loop deliveries will not be required to carry more than three bundles.
  - (2) Carriers serving other types of deliveries are not limited to three bundles of mail.
- b. Two-Bundle System: Case letter-size and other mail separately. Withdraw and strap out in separate bundles.
  - (1) Carriers serving foot or park and loop deliveries will not be required to carry more than three bundles.
  - (2) Carriers serving other types of deliveries are not limited to three bundles of mail.
- c. Modified Two-Bundle System: Arrange all separations on case for letter mail. Case newspapers, magazines, and flats first in letter separations and withdraw and strap out before casing and tying out letter-size mail. Do this only when First-Class Mail, including markups, will not be delayed.
  - (1) Carriers serving foot or park and loop deliveries will not be required to carry more than three bundles.
  - (2) Carriers serving other types of deliveries are not limited to three bundles of mail.

In addition to the systems described in a, b, and c, above, there are options concerning how residual mail in a Delivery Point Sequencing environment is to be cased and handled. Listed below are the two approved methods;

management will select one of these methods for each route.

- d. Composite Bundle: Residual mail is cased and strapped out separately. For each relay, street, block, etc., the residual bundle of letter mail is carried along with the DPS letter mail bundle. Flats are carried separately from these letter bundles.
- e. Casing Letters in the Vertical Flat Case: Residual mail is cased in the same case with the vertically cased flats. Letters and flats are withdrawn and strapped out together in a single bundle. The DPS letter mail is carried separately as a second bundle.

**Note:** In both DPS methods (d and e), carriers serving foot or park and loop deliveries may carry up to three bundles of mail. Carriers serving curblines, central, or dismount deliveries are not restricted to a specific number of bundles of mail.

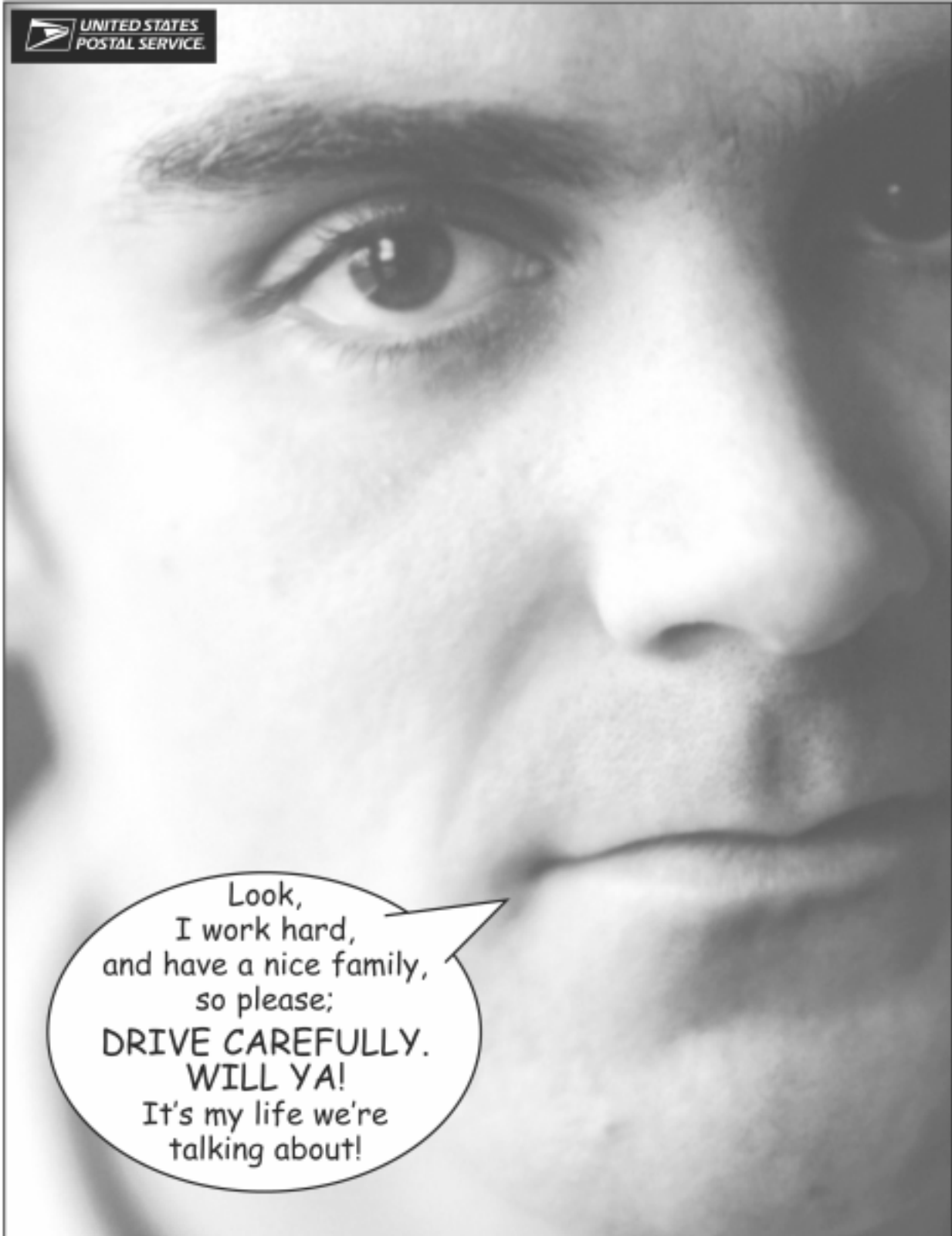

The C Fund is invested in the Barclays Equity Index Fund, which tracks the S&P 500 stock index. The F Fund is invested in the Barclays U.S. Debt Index Fund, which tracks the Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond index. Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.

The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

## Cleaning Routines for Vending Machines

Servicing employees, self-service postal center (SSPC) technicians, and employees responsible for efficient operations of Postal Service vending equipment are reminded of the mandatory requirement for timely cleaning of vending equipment.

Documentation associated with the four family types of equipment specifies required cleaning schedules. Examples of how to conduct cleaning are provided within the documentation for each machine. The Maintenance Technical Support Center (MTSC) has issued instructions with regard to cleaning. (See MWO-008-97, *Postal Booklet and Stamp Machine (PSBM-624) Cleaning Procedures.*) Current cleaning instructions are being updated and new cleaning instructions for other machines are being generated and will soon be sent to the field.

Cleaning instructions on any one or all of the four family types of equipment are found in the maintenance manuals or in newer equipment's operator handbooks. If you have any questions concerning cleaning instructions please call your district certified field trainer (CFT) or the Central Repair Facility Vending Help Desk (1-800-451-4196).

Maintenance Management Order MMO-005-99, *Ordering MS Handbooks, COTS and OEM Documents, and Videos*, contains more information on available documentation. Maintenance Management Orders are available online at <http://www.mtsc.usps.gov> (click on *Bulletins*, then *MMO*).
