SUBJECT: Honoring Veterans Stamp


The United States has nearly 25 million military veterans, representing 1 in every 10 adults and including thousands of U.S. Postal Service employees.

The Postal Service will have an opportunity to thank these men and women for their service to our country with the issuance of the *Honoring Veterans* stamp. The first day ceremony for the stamp will take place in front of the U.S. Capitol in Washington, DC, on May 23, 2001.

This occasion will also give us a chance to honor the many veterans who continue to serve their country, their fellow veterans, and their communities by becoming members of veterans service organizations. These organizations provide aid to veterans and their families, including assistance with benefit applications, transportation to Veterans Affairs medical facilities, and burial and memorial services. Local communities also benefit from the work of veterans service organizations through scholarship programs, youth sports activities, and other programs designed to promote civic pride.

We have designated the release of the *Honoring Veterans* stamp as a nationwide issuance, which ensures that the stamp will be available everywhere starting May 23. Therefore, we encourage you to host stamp dedication events in your districts and local Post Offices and to involve employees, civic leaders, and appropriate veterans organizations in your plans.

Let's make 2001 a year that is remembered fondly as a time when the Postal Service did its best to recognize the continued dedication of our nation's veterans.

#### HONORING VETERANS STAMP

#### Publicity Ideas to Interest the Media

Overview

The *Honoring Veterans* stamp will be issued on May 23, 2001, in Washington, DC, and will go on sale nationwide the same day. Local dedication ceremonies for the *Honoring Veterans* stamp can be held any time throughout the year.

The United States has more than 25 million veterans; therefore, this stamp is expected to be of interest to many people in our country.

For information on the Department of Veterans Affairs, visit their Web site at www.va.gov. Information on, and links to, veterans service organizations are available at www.va.gov/vso/view.asp.

Postal Service employees can find an electronic version of the *Honoring Veterans* Stamp publicity kit on the Intranet at <a href="http://blue.usps.gov">http://blue.usps.gov</a>. Click on *References*, then scroll down and click on *Postmaster Toolkits*. This electronic version makes it easy to complete the fill-in-the-blank materials included in this kit.

Local and national publicity help increase commemorative stamp sales at Post Offices long after the date of issuance. There are many ways to interest local media in your *Honoring Veterans* stamp event.

Here are some methods to capture a reporter's attention:

- Hold a stamp dedication ceremony (ceremonies can be held on or after May 23) at a local VFW (Veterans of Foreign Wars) or American Legion hall, Veterans Hospital, or your Post Office. Invite Congressional, community, and veterans service organization leaders to participate, and present them with panes of the stamp or an enlarged image of the stamp.
- The Postal Service employs approximately 800,000 people, many of whom have served in the armed forces and many of whom continue to serve their country and fellow Americans by actively serving in the National Guard or by working at veterans service organizations. Recognize your local postal "heroes" at an *Honoring Veterans* stamp ceremony. Invite Congressional, community, and veterans service organization leaders to participate.
- Hold a "Welcome Home" ceremony to the men and women of your community who have served in recent military actions or maneuvers.

- Organize a group letter-writing project for the children of Postal Service employees and local school children. Projects initiated in the summer could involve youngsters participating in YMCA camps and in organizations such as the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Campfire Girls. The project could feature the writing and sending of "Thank You" letters or notes to local or national veterans groups. A good photo opportunity for the media would be for them to witness the children applying Honoring Veterans stamps to their letters and mailing them. A follow up with the media could include coverage of the veterans receiving and reading the letters.
- Coordinate an essay-writing contest or art contest using an Honoring Veterans stamp theme. Ask local newspaper editors to judge essays and select winners. Have local art teachers judge art entries. And invite winners to your stamp ceremony to recognize their work and present them with a pane of stamps or other philatelic collectible.
- Hold a flag-raising ceremony at your Post Office and celebrate the community contributions made by local veterans and veterans groups. Invite Congressional, community, and veterans service organization leaders to participate. Stage a photo opportunity for the media that would feature these leaders purchasing the first Honoring Veterans stamps sold at your Post Office.
- Hold an open house at your Post Office or plant. Ask Postal Service employee veterans to be your honored guests and/or hosts. Invite Congressional, community, and veterans service organizations leaders.

Implement any of these ideas, combine them, or brainstorm with your employees to come up with an idea of your own. Be sure to publicize each and every event to your local newspaper, radio, and television stations via press releases, media advisories, letters to the media, and follow-up phone calls.

#### **Event Planning Checklist**

When planning *Honoring Veterans* stamp events, keep the following suggestions in mind:

- Begin planning immediately.
- Using the list in this kit, check with the nearest Department of Veterans Affairs office to see if they will participate in an *Honoring Veterans* stamp event in your city.

- Set a date (on or after May 23, 2001).
- Secure participants (Postal Service employee veterans, community leaders, etc.).
- Order enlargements of the stamp image, flyers, and other supplies for the event.
- Prepare any planned local pictorial cancellation.
- Secure staging and sound equipment, if applicable.
- Plan signage, including a podium sign and banners.
- Launch a local publicity campaign using the materials in this kit.
- Draft a sequence-of-events agenda and speaker remarks.
- Plan retail opportunities (booths, bag stuffers, etc.).
- Prepare ceremony programs and invitations.

#### **Suggested Public Relations Timeline**

2.	Send announcement and invitations to employees.	A few weeks before event.
3.	Distribute calendar/weekend advisory to newspapers.	A few weeks before event.
4.	Distribute public service announcement to radio/TV.	A few weeks before event.
5.	Distribute news release.	A few weeks before event.
6.	Distribute media advisory to newspapers, radio/TV.	1 week before event.
7.	Remind invited dignitaries about event via telephone.	5 days before event.
8.	Redistribute media advisory to all news media.	1 to 2 days before event.
9.	Make follow-up calls to local news media.	1 day before event.
10.	Distribute day-of-issuance news release.	Day of event.
11.	Send letter to newspaper editor thanking community.	Day after event.
12.	Send newspaper clippings and "media successes" summary to area PA&C office.	Within 1 week after event.

#### **Participation of Public Officials**

The issuance of the *Honoring Veterans* stamp is a perfect opportunity to involve public officials in an important and positive local event. There is likely to be keen interest on their part, as it provides elected representatives a chance to interact with constituents in a friendly, civic setting with secured media coverage.

You are encouraged to reach out directly to your federal, state, and local elected officials. Government Relations representatives are available to assist you in coordinating political involvement and would be pleased to help in any way.

This section of the Community Relations Publicity Kit contains simple guidelines, sample letters, a suggested invitation list, and the names and telephone numbers of your Government Relations contacts.

Before the Event

**Send a written invitation** (see sample), 4 to 6 weeks before the event, to your two U.S. Senators, your congressional representatives, the governor of your state, and the mayor of your community. Please include any other local elected officials you feel would be appropriate. The local postmaster should sign the invitations.

**Follow up** the written invitation with a telephone call to the elected official's scheduler within a week if you have not received a reply. You may need to call more than once.

**Keep in touch** with all elected officials who respond. If asked, provide updated information to the elected official's staff as it becomes available (e.g., who else is participating, where and when to meet, what his or her role will be, etc.). Stress that remarks should be brief and limited to the unveiling of the *Honoring Veterans* stamp and recognition of military veterans and veterans service organizations.

**Include names** of all participating elected officials on the official program as honored guests, and mention them in all media advisories, if applicable.

**Provide a courtesy copy** of the program to the elected official in advance.

After the Event

**Send a written thank you** to all elected officials who participated in the ceremony, expressing your appreciation.

**Provide copies** to their offices of any newspaper articles about the event. Even though they surely will see those articles on their own, you can take the opportunity to remind them of the press coverage the event received.

**Provide a supply of extra cachets** with the special cancellation, if applicable, to elected officials, even to those who could not attend. These make great giveaways and serve as a positive reminder of the event.

**Obtain and frame a photo** of the elected official posing beside the stamp image, and make an appointment to present it in person, if possible. A matted, framed photograph stands a good chance of being hung on the wall of the official's office, again serving as a positive reminder of the event.

**Keep in touch** with your elected officials. Good relationships are built over time.

#### Display Flags at Half-Staff on May 15, Peace Officers Memorial Day

As stated in *Administrative Support Manual*, Issue 13, section 472.23, Postal Service facilities must display the flag at half-staff on May 15 of each year, Peace Officers Memorial Day.

In 1994, former President Clinton signed into law Public Law 103-322, requiring all government agencies, police organizations, businesses, and private citizens to lower the American flag to half-staff on May 15 as a special tribute to the more than 15,000 law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty. A memorial to these men and women, the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, was dedicated in 1991 by former President George Bush.

The names of six employees of the Postal Inspection Service are inscribed on the memorial's marble walls. The name of a seventh Inspection Service employee will be added on May 15, 2001, Peace Officers Memorial Day.

### Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main post offices, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by NCMEC.

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all postal facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in post office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other postal facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service only as described above. If postal employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local post offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 1-800-843-5678.

### Congressional Franked Mail: Do Not Return for Postage

We continue to receive reports of congressional franked mail being returned to the originating House or Senate member's office marked "Return for Postage." *This mail should not be returned for collection of postage.* 

Managers must take steps, through stand-up talks and, when appropriate, written notices, to ensure that all employees are aware of the proper handling of congressional franked mail. In lieu of postage or postage indicia in the upper-right corner of the envelope or address label, this mail bears the facsimile signature of a member of the U.S. House of Representatives or the U.S. Senate. The signature is followed by the abbreviation "M.C.," which stands for "member of congress," or "U.S.S.," which stands for "U.S. Senate." Postage for congressional franked mail is paid to the Postal Service in lump sums by the U.S. Treasury, according to established procedures.

# Standard Operating Procedures for Handling Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Applications

The following procedural guidelines are for dissemination to postal employees who accept and process applications from customers who want to participate in the Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) program. QBRM is a subset of business reply mail (BRM) for automation-compatible letter size pieces that qualify for automation postage rates and reduced per piece charges. These procedures are updated from *Postal Bulletin* 21996 dated 4-22-99, to include recent changes incorporated in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) 56 that apply to BRM (S922) and QBRM (E150) and to Quick Service Guide 922. These procedures are also included in Publication 25, *Designing Letter and Reply Mail*.

#### **BRM Permit Holder Responsibilities**

To participate in the QBRM program, a BRM permit holder:

- Pays the annual BRM permit fee. If you are using a corporate permit, submit a copy of the receipt that shows the annual permit fee was paid. Payment of one annual fee per permit number allows you to receive BRM under that permit number at multiple locations. You are still responsible for paying the accounting fees at your local Post Office.
- Pays the annual BRM accounting fee. Although you
  must pay the fee and establish an advance deposit
  account, you are not required to use this account
  solely to pay for BRM charges (DMM S922.3.3).
- 3. Has the option to pay the quarterly fee, in addition to the annual accounting fee, to qualify for high-volume QBRM per piece charges. Like the annual accounting fee, the optional quarterly fee must be paid at each Post Office where mail is returned and for each separate billing desired. The quarterly fee can be paid for any three consecutive calendar months and mailers can choose not to renew from one 3-month period to the next. (DMM S922.7.0).
- 4. Completes page one of PS Form 6805, *Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) Application and Approval*, and submits it to the manager, Business Mail Entry (District) or postmaster of the Post Office(s) where the mail will be returned.

- Obtains the formatting instructions for designing and printing the mailpiece from the Postal Service along with the mechanical barcode and facing identification mark (FIM) positive. Each BRM letter or card must contain FIM C.
- Uses a unique BRM ZIP+4 Code assigned by the Postal Service for each rate category (postcard, 1-oz letter, or 2-oz letter). The unique ZIP+4 Code must appear on each BRM piece in the specified location.
- 7. Chooses one of the following two options to qualify BRM pieces for QBRM rates:
  - a. Option 1: Submits 10 BRM printed samples for review with the completed QBRM application.
  - b. Option 2: Submits 10 paper samples cut to the size of a finished QBRM piece, a pre-production sample, or completed artwork for review (include samples of ink colors with pre-production samples or artwork) with the completed QBRM application.
- Certifies that all future QBRM envelopes/cards will be produced with equivalent paper stock and will meet paper thickness dimensions by signing PS Form 6805.
- Receives written notification of acceptance or rejection in QBRM program.
- Makes corrections(s) and resubmits samples for testing and design approval if samples are rejected for the QBRM program.
- Provides a finished QBRM sample (after printing) to the mailpiece design analyst (MDA) who approved the pre-production sample for the Post Office(s) where the mail is returned.

**Note:** After receiving approval for the QBRM program, the customer is not required to either reapply or submit additional samples when pieces are reprinted with the ZIP+4 Code assigned under that approval. Nevertheless, it is recommended that mailers work with their MDA to ensure pieces meet postal standards.

#### **Post Office Responsibilities**

The manager, Business Mail Entry (District) or postmaster at the Post Office(s) where mail will be returned forwards the application and accompanying samples to the MDA or designee for review.

#### Mailpiece Design Analyst (MDA) Responsibilities During Approval Process

QBRM applications must be processed within 5 business days of receipt. If it is not possible to process the application within 5 business days for any reason, notify the applicant. In addition, the MDA or designee:

- Provides the mechanical barcode and facing identification mark (FIM) positive. Note: For pieces distributed under QBRM, the address must include a unique ZIP+4 Code assigned to the piece. The ZIP+ 4 Code identifies the permit holder and rate category.
- 2. Provides support materials, such as:
  - a) Quick Service Guide 922.
  - b) DMM references S922 and E150.
- Reviews the samples and completes page two of PS Form 6805. Note: Determine QBRM eligibility by evaluating the samples by DMM standards and not by running them on mail processing equipment.
- 4. If the sample meets all requirements:
  - a. Provide the customer with the approved PS Form 6805 and pre-production samples marked "Approved."
  - b. If the customer chose Option 1, forward one QBRM sample to the Post Office(s) where the mail will be returned.
  - c. If the customer chose Option 2, forward one QBRM sample to the Post Office(s) where the mail will be returned when the customer submits the sample pieces after printing.
  - Maintain copy of PS Form 6805 and QBRM sample (paper samples or pre-production artwork) for records.
- 5. If the sample does not meet standards:
  - a. List reasons and applicable DMM references on page two of PS Form 6805.
  - b. Provide the customer with a copy of the disapproved PS Form 6805.
  - c. Recommend corrections to meet the standards in DMM S922, E150, C810, and/or C840.
  - d. Maintain a copy of PS Form 6805 and QBRM sample (paper samples or pre-production artwork) for records.
  - e. Return additional samples to the applicant with disapproved PS Form 6805.
  - f. If the customer disputes the disapproval of PS Form 6805, advise the customer of appeal rights under DMM G020.3.0.

After receiving approval for the QBRM program, the customer is not required to either reapply or submit additional samples when pieces are reprinted with the ZIP+4 Code assigned under that approval. However, since the ZIP+4 Code identifies the rate category, the customer must submit a new application for the QBRM rate if he or she plans to distribute pieces in a different rate category. For example, if the customer is authorized the QBRM rate for 1-ounce letters but subsequently decides to print and distribute cards, a separate PS Form 6805 must be submitted to receive the cards under the QBRM program. Under this scenario, the customer will be assigned a separate ZIP+4 Code for accounting purposes that must appear on the card rate pieces.

#### **Reporting QBRM Irregularities**

If QBRM pieces are found to cause problems during processing, such as jamming automation equipment or damage to the pieces themselves, report the problem on PS Form 6806, *Mailpiece Irregularity/Resolution*. PS Form 6806 is available for employees through the Postal Service Web site (click on *Forms* and then *All Online PDF Forms in Numeric Order* at *www.usps.com*). The form may be reproduced locally as needed.

Employees who report a processing problem on PS Form 6806 must:

- 1. Make a copy of the mailpiece.
- 2. Send the PS Form 6806 and the copy of the mailpiece to the manager, Business Mail Entry (District) serving the delivery address on the piece.

When PS Form 6806 is received, the manager, Business Mail Entry (District) refers the matter to the appropriate MDA/designee.

#### Mailpiece Design Analyst Responsibilities During Irregularity Review Process

- Review the copy of the piece accompanying the PS Form 6806 and compare it to the QBRM samples on file.
- Contact the customer to resolve discrepancies between the samples on file and the piece reported on PS Form 6806.
- 3. If the samples do not meet QBRM standards, request 10 additional samples from the customer for testing.
- 4. If the 10 additional samples do not meet QBRM standards, revoke the QBRM rates and advise the customer that new samples must be submitted under Option 1 or 2 to reapply for the QBRM program.

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- **B.** Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:
  - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
  - All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
  - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions**: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
  - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
  - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

- **G.** Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.
- H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
  - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

  - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
  - L. All official mail is prohibited.
  - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
  - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
  - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.
- **R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
  - U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
  - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.



HANDBOOK F-21 REVISION

#### QWL/EI Service Performed by Replacement Rural Carriers

Handbook F-21, *Time and Attendance*, is revised effective April 21, 2001 (pay period 10-2001), to reflect the establishment of new rural route type A994 to record work by replacement rural carriers (Designation Codes 73, 74, 75, 76, 78, and 79) in Quality of Work Life/Employee Involvement (QWL/EI) activities. There is no change to procedures for recording time for regular rural carriers involved in the QWL/EI process.

Record actual workhours by a replacement rural carrier working on QWL/EI on PS Form 1314-A, *Auxiliary Rural Carrier Time Certificate*. Enter A994 in the route number block and the number of hours in the "Actual Wkly Hrs" block. Only workhours may be recorded on this PS Form 1314-A. Do not enter equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) for route number A994. Reimbursable mileage for QWL/EI activities is paid locally as a local travel reimbursement.



#### 586.3 Compliance with FLSA Requirements

[Revise 586.3 to read as follows:]

Sections 586.4-586.6 apply to regular rural carriers. Section 586.7 applies to replacement rural carriers.

[Add new 586.7 to read as follows:]

#### 586.7 Replacement Rural Carriers

Record QWL/EI service by a replacement carrier on Form 1314-A using A994 in the "Rt. No." block. Record actual workhours spent performing authorized QWL/EI duties in the "Actual Wkly Hrs" block. Do not enter EMA on this form. Any mileage in excess of the normal commute is paid at the standard postal mileage rate for local travel.

On March 23, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. Term: April 6, 2001, through January 31, 2002.
- b. Type of mail: Global Direct Canada Lettermail. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.

- d. Service provided by the Postal Service: The Postal Service has agreed to:

The Postal Service will issue a 34-cent Honoring Veterans commemorative stamp (Item Number 450700) nationwide on May 23, 2001, with a first day ceremony in Washington, DC 20066. The stamp, designed by Carl Herrman of Carlsbad, CA, is based on a photograph from Harold Lambert Studios, Inc. This pane may be split, and the stamps may be sold individually.

With the issuance of this stamp, the Postal Service honors the patriotic dedication of all the men and women who have served in the U.S. armed forces. The present population of U.S. veterans is estimated at nearly 25 million.

The stamp art is a photograph of the United States flag. One of the most recognized symbols of freedom in the world, the U.S. flag also symbolizes the patriotic service to the nation — in peace and in war — of all U.S. veterans. The phrase "Honoring Veterans" appears at the top of the stamp, and the phrase "Continuing to Serve" appears at the bottom.

#### Acadia National Park International Rate Stamp

The Postal Service will issue a 60-cent *Acadia National Park* international rate stamp (Item Number 561300) in Bar Harbor, ME 04609, on May 30, 2001. The stamp, designed by Ethel Kessler of Bethesda, MD, is based on a photograph by Carr Clifton of Taylorsville, CA. There is no first day ceremony, and the stamp goes on sale nationwide May 31, 2001. This pane may be split, and the stamps can be sold individually.

Acadia National Park in Maine encompasses more than 45,000 acres across several islands, including Mount Desert Island and the Schoodic Peninsula. As the first national park created east of the Mississippi River, it was first established as Sieur de Monts National Monument in 1916 and then as Lafayette National Park by President Woodrow Wilson in 1919. It received its current name in 1929.

With mountains, rocky shorelines, lakes, and forests, the park draws more than 3 million visitors a year. Forty-five miles of rustic carriage roads — a legacy of John D. Rockefeller, Jr. — provide bicyclists, horse riders, runners, and hikers freedom from automobile traffic. More than 273 species of birds have been identified in the Mount Desert Island area. Each year park naturalists anticipate the return of peregrine falcons, which have been known to nest in the cliffs overlooking Frenchman Bay and Jordan Pond.

#### **Pictorial Cancellations Announcement**

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. 





#### POM REVISION

#### **Philatelic Policies and Procedures**

Effective April 19, 2001, *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) 8, subchapter 21, Philatelic Policies and Procedures, is revised to reflect changes to the criteria that the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee uses to recommend all U.S. postage stamps and stationery. The changes reflect recent developments in the U.S. stamp program, including the issuance of semipostals. In addition to the substantive changes, we also corrected typographical errors, references to certain stamp products, and addresses.

We will incorporate these revisions into the online POM 8, which is available via the Policies and Procedures Web page located at *http://blue.usps.gov/cpim;* select *Manuals*. We will also publish these revisions in the printed version of POM 9.

#### 212 Stamps and Stationery Subjects

212.1 Selection

\* \* \* \* \*

[Add a new 212.2, renumber the current 212.2 as 212.3, revise 212.3, and add a new 212.4 to read as follows:]

#### 212.2 Criteria for Eligibility

The Postal Service and the members of the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee (CSAC) use the following basic criteria to determine the eligibility of subjects for commemoration on U.S. stamps and stationery:

- a. It is a general policy that U.S. postage stamps and stationery primarily feature American or Americanrelated subjects.
- b. No living person is honored by portrayal on U.S. postage.
- c. Commemorative stamps or postal stationery items honoring individuals usually are issued on or in conjunction with significant anniversaries of their birth, but no postal item is issued sooner than 10 years after the individual's death. The only exception to the

10-year rule is the issuance of stamps honoring deceased U.S. presidents. They may be honored with a memorial stamp on the first birth anniversary following death.

- d. Events of historical significance are considered for commemoration only on anniversaries in multiples of 50 years.
- e. Only events and themes of widespread national appeal and significance are considered for commemoration. Events or themes of local or regional significance may be recognized by a philatelic or special postal cancellation, which may be arranged through the local postmaster.
- f. Stamps or stationery items are not issued to honor fraternal, political, sectarian, or service and charitable organizations. Stamps or stationery are not issued to promote or advertise commercial enterprises or products. Commercial products or enterprises might be used to illustrate more general concepts related to American culture.
- g. Stamps or stationery items are not issued to honor cities, towns, municipalities, counties, primary or secondary schools, hospitals, libraries, or similar institutions. Due to the limitations placed on annual postal programs and the vast number of such locales, organizations, and institutions in existence, it would be difficult to single out any one for commemoration.
- h. Requests for observance of statehood anniversaries are considered for commemorative postage stamps only at intervals of 50 years from the date of the state's first entry into the Union. Requests for observance of other state-related or regional anniversaries are considered only as subjects for postal stationery, and again only at intervals of 50 years from the date of the event.
- Stamps or stationery items are not issued to honor religious institutions or individuals whose principal achievements are associated with religious undertakings or beliefs.
- j. Stamps or postal stationery items with added values, referred to as semipostals, are issued every 2 years in accordance with Public Law 106253. Semipostals are not considered part of the commemorative program, and separate criteria apply.
- k. Requests for commemoration of universities and other institutions of higher education are considered only for stamped cards and only in connection with the 200th anniversaries of their founding.
- No stamp will be considered for issuance if one treating the same subject has been issued in the past 50 years. The only exceptions to this rule are traditional themes such as national symbols and holidays.

#### 212.3 Submission

Ideas for subjects must be submitted at least 3 years in advance of the proposed date of issue. This allows the committee enough time to consider the idea and to design and produce the stamps, if the subject is approved. Send ideas for stamp subjects that meet the criteria to the following address:

#### 212.4 Approval and Design

Once a subject is approved, the Postal Service usually relies on design coordinators to help select artists who execute the designs. The Postal Service does not review or accept unsolicited artwork.

All Post Offices receive initial supplies of new stamp issues without requisition. Stamp products such as annual, commemorative stamp yearbooks, and the *Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* are generally distributed automatically to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and accountable paper depositories (APDs). Then they should prepare their own covers by affixing new stamps to the upper right corner of envelopes or postcards of their choice, and address

those envelopes, postcards, or postal stationery items to themselves or others. (Postage must equal the current First-Class Mail rate.) For sturdiness, include a card of postcard thickness in each cover (envelopes only) submitted, and tuck in the flap. Place the cover in a larger envelope addressed to: NAME OF ISSUE, POSTMASTER, CITY, STATE, and ZIP CODE (followed by -9991). Covers submitted for first day of issue cancellations may include additional uncancelled stamps only if the uncancelled stamps were issued before the first day of issue of the new stamps or postal stationery items. All orders must be postmarked on or before the deadline indicated below.

The U.S. Postal Service offers uncacheted first day covers for new stamp issues and postal stationery items postmarked with the official first day of issue cancellation. Each item has its own catalog number in *USA Philatelic*, issued quarterly. SUBJECT: Workplace Security Poster 66

Enclosed is a copy of the new *Poster 66* which is intended to remind postal employees about workplace security. It is the next step in the national security messaging campaign.

The poster reminds employees to wear their identification badges (ID), politely question those without ID, secure doors to prevent unauthorized entry, and identify and report security deficiencies. This poster should be placed in an area of high visibility to employees in your facility. The poster repeats the theme of the national security messaging campaign: "Workplace Security: It's Good Business and It's Personal."

The campaign reiterates existing postal policy on security. You are encouraged to give service talks to make sure your employees understand the message of the poster. For example, employees should know the proper method of approaching a stranger in the workplace. They should also be advised that locking doors does not mean impeding exit from a facility in case of emergency, or locking doors which must remain open to satisfy Occupational Safety and Health Administration requirements.



Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.


The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

See the Supplier Item and Pricing Chart in Exhibit 12 on page 52 for details on supplier names, prices, and item numbers.
- b. Prepare a check or money order (attach these to PS Form 1567) payable to the appropriate supplier for the total amount of the order, or enter your Postal Service International Merchant Purchase Authorization Card (I.M.P.A.C.) VISA credit card number and expiration date in block 12 of PS Form 1567.
- c. Submit the completed PS Form 1567 and check or money order directly to the appropriate supplier at the address shown in Exhibit 12 on page 52.
- d. The supplier will ship the items ordered about 30 days after receiving the order (60 days for orders from Hanley Postal Supply Co. Inc.). Shipping charges are included in the price of the items.

## PS Form 8185, Vending Equipment License Agreement

PS Form 8185, Vending Equipment License Agreement, was revised in January 1999. Headquarters legal staff, along with Purchasing Policy and Self Service, updated the form to provide a consistent vehicle for placement of vending equipment at non-Postal Service locations.

District retail managers have the delegated authority to sign PS Form 8185. It offers flexibility for retail managers working with customers in placing, maintaining, and extracting Postal Service property. Additionally, the form is required for annual reporting to Purchasing Policy on placing equipment in minority- and women-owned businesses.

Remember to use PS Form 8185 in all instances where Postal Service equipment will be placed at non-Postal Service locations.

## **Setting Mechanical Meters Is Prohibited**

Effective September 3, 1999, setting *mechanical* postage meters was discontinued. The withdrawal of mechanical meters remaining with customers and discontinuance of all settings is a result of the high security risk these meters pose to our revenue. Although no longer authorized, some offices have continued to set these meters, which is hindering our effort to eliminate the security risk. Our effort to withdraw mechanical meters from service relies on your cooperation in not setting mechanical meters.

Mechanical postage meters are those that require a Postal Service employee to open the meter and *physically* move registers to add postage.


