KNOW FRAUD

Kicks off Anti-Identity Theft Campaign on July 10

Following the success of the initial KNOW FRAUD™ campaign in 1999, the KNOW FRAUD partnership is gearing up for a second campaign focusing on identity theft, a growing crime in which thieves illegally obtain a consumer's personal and financial information to purchase goods and services.

For example, a thief can use a consumer's name, date of birth, and Social Security number to open a credit card account, change the mailing address on a credit card account, establish cellular phone service, or open a bank account to write bad checks.

KNOW FRAUD partners, including the Postal Service, Department of Justice, Federal Trade Commission, and Social Security Administration Office of the Inspector General, are working with financial organizations to spread the identity theft message in billing statements and other customer contact methods to as many U.S. homes as possible.

This campaign will begin with a national kick-off on July 10. To learn more about the KNOW FRAUD campaign, visit www.consumer.gov/knowfraud. Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main post offices, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by NCMEC.

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all postal facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in post office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other postal facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service only as described above. If postal employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local post offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 1-800-843-5678.

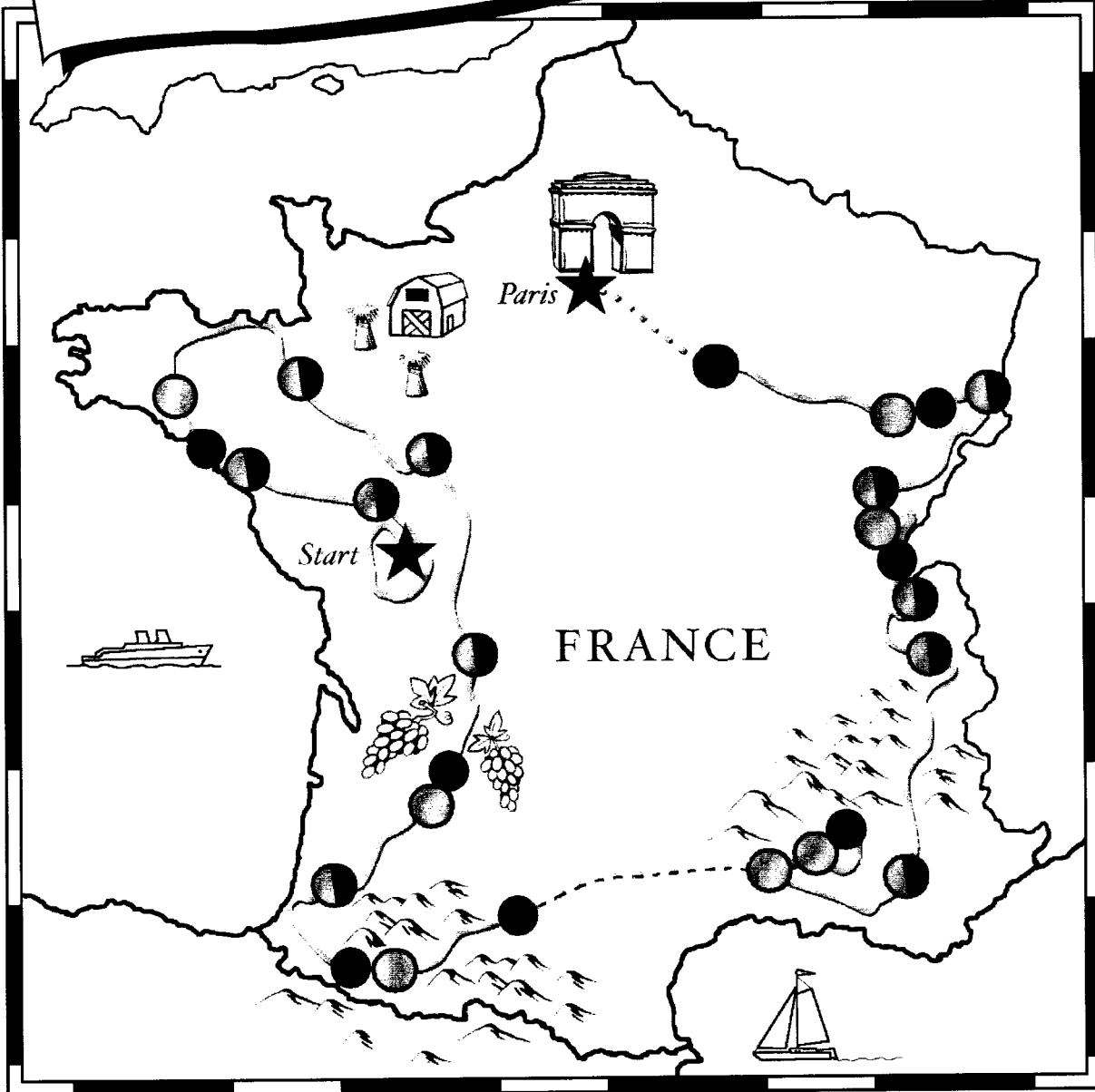

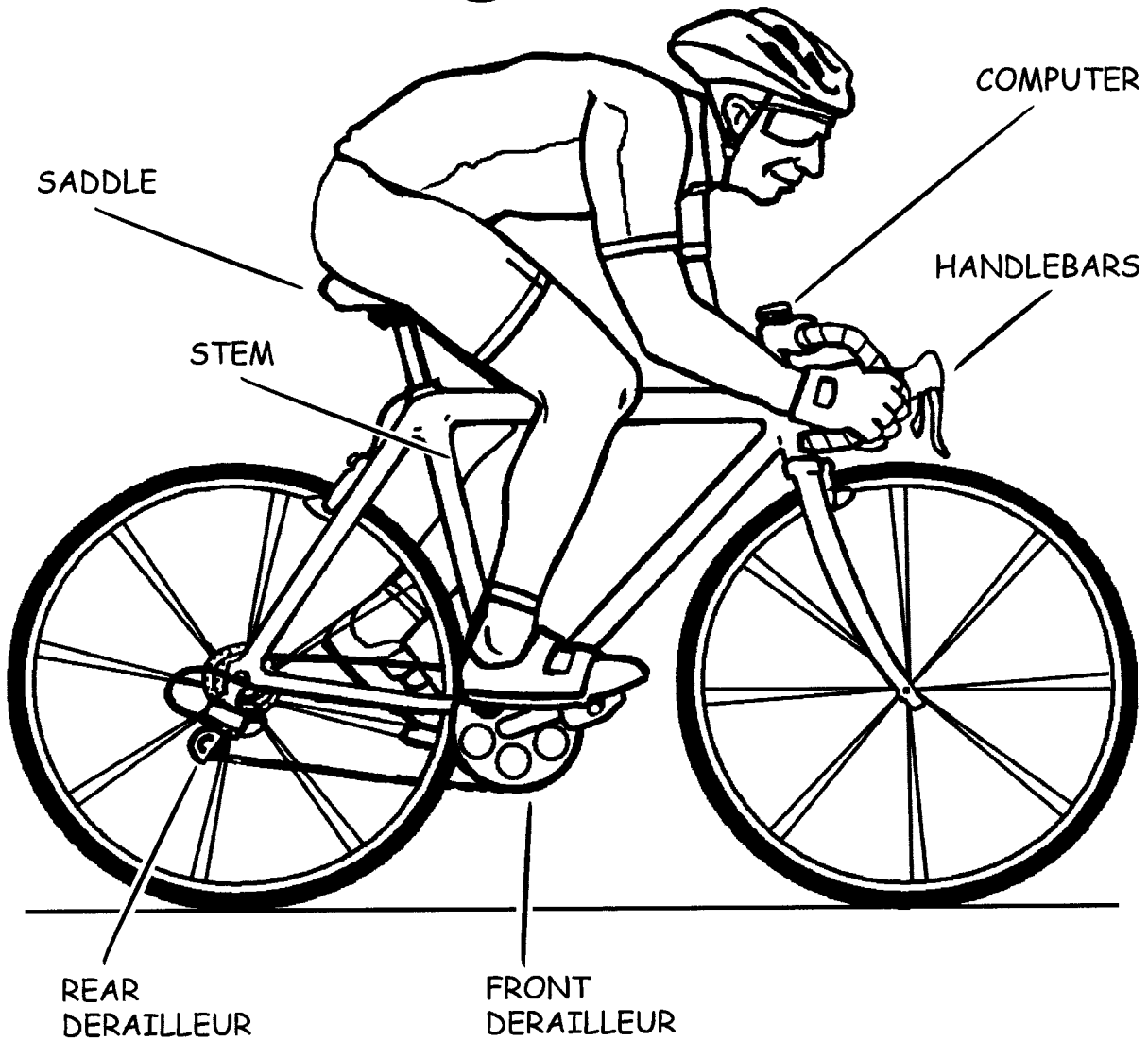

Typical Pro Cyclist Bike Measurements

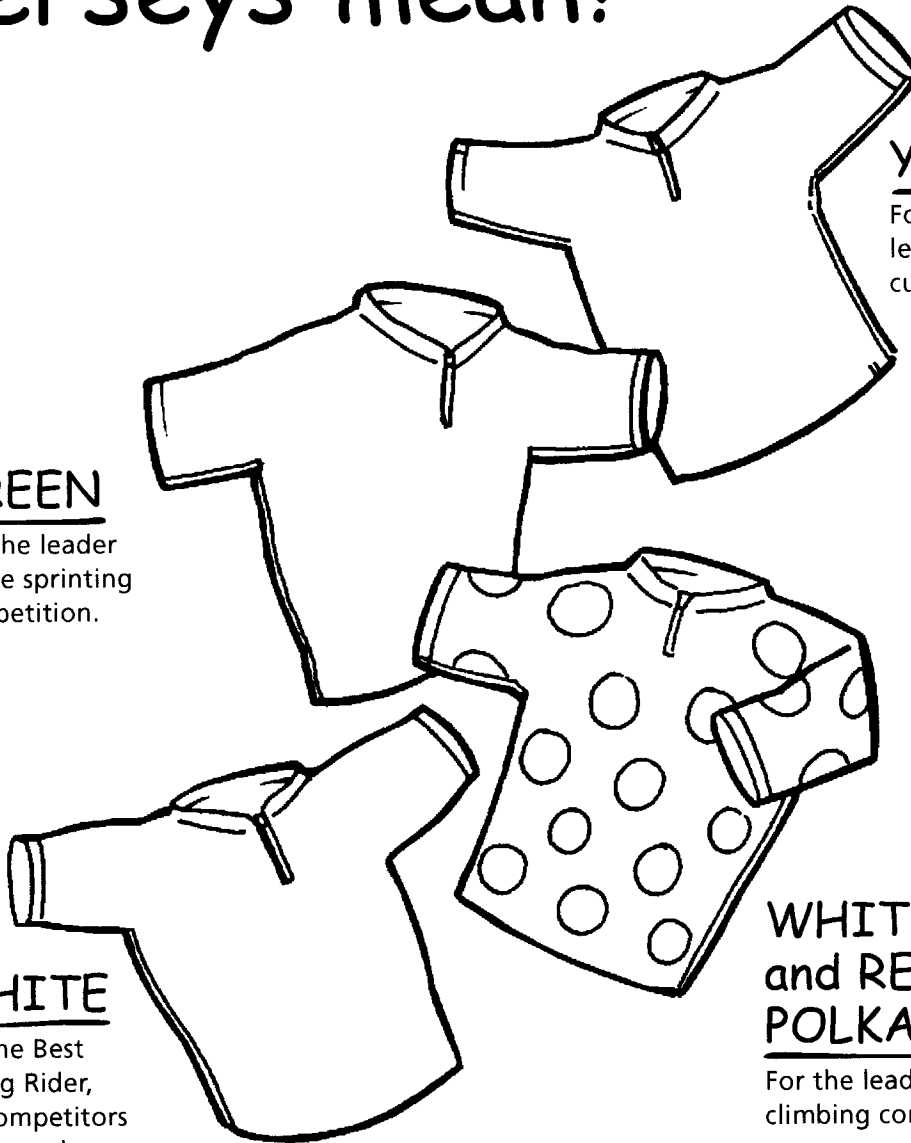

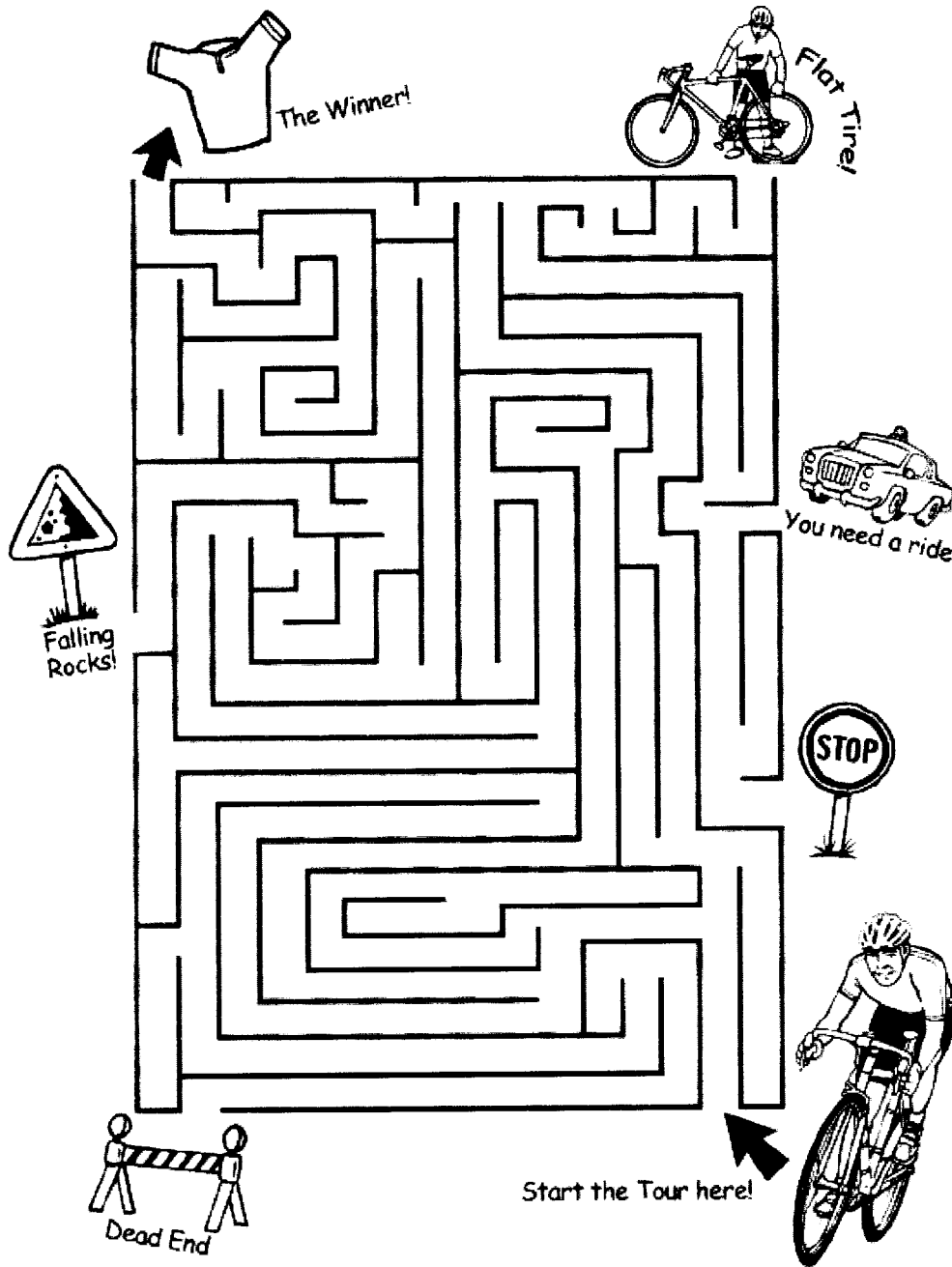

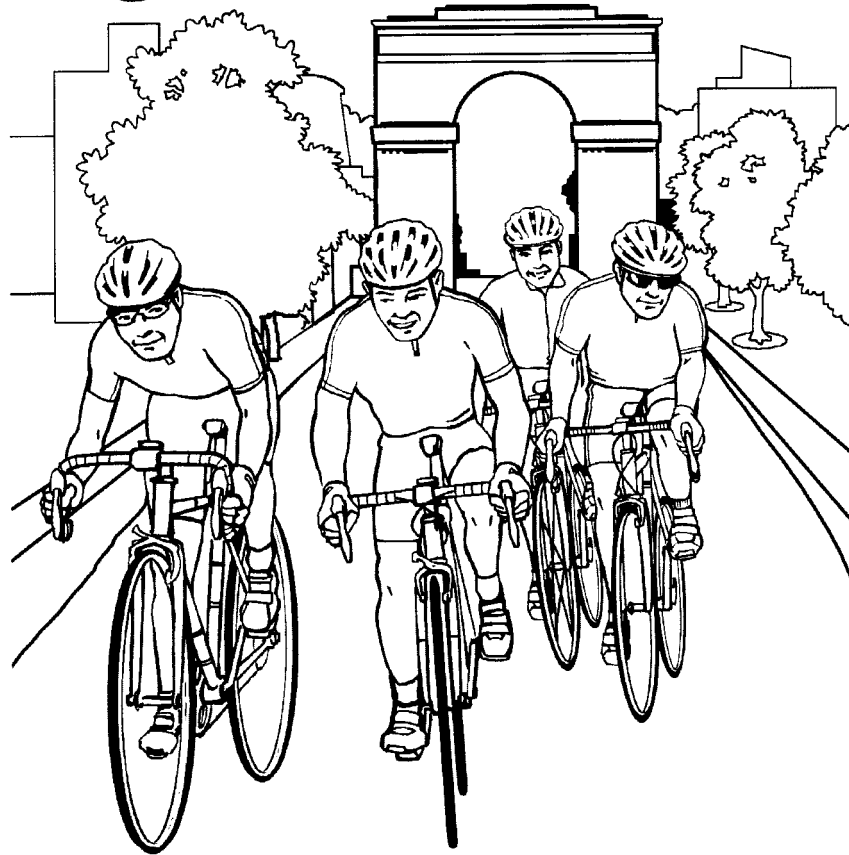

Cycling terms



Attack: To accelerate in order to pull away from a rider or group of riders.

Blocking: Team strategy where one rider gets in the way of other riders to prevent them from passing.

Break(away): One or more cyclists who have attacked to form a lead group.

Circuit Race: 50-160 mile (80-257 km) event usually on a hilly course creating a loop of two or more miles (3.2 km plus).

Criterium: Fast-paced, multi-lap race, rarely more than 62 miles (100 km) on a flat course a mile (1.6 km) or less.

Drafting: Riding behind another cyclist to decrease wind resistance.

General Classification: Describes a rider's overall standing in all of the events that comprise a stage race.

Individual Time Trial: Each individual rider races a set distance against the clock. Riders start at set intervals.

Lead Out: Tactical move where a rider takes the lead in a race and allows a teammate to drift behind, usually for the final sprint.

Peloton: Main group of cyclists in a race. Also known as the field or main pack.

Prologue: Very short time trial, generally under 6.2 miles (10 km), held at the start of stage race events to determine the initial race leader.

Road Race: A road/highway race generally spanning 75-160 miles (120-257 km) from point A to point B.

Stage Race: A single event consisting of different races (time trials, road races, etc.) or 'stages' that span a number of days.

Team Time Trial: Two or more riders, positioned one behind the other, race against the clock over a set distance.

Parcel Post ZIP Code Addition

Effective June 28, 2001, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E751 Exhibit 7.0 is revised to add a ZIP Code to the Parcel Select exception list. Parcel Post for ZIP Code 59102 should now be deposited at the Billings Post Office, 841 S 26th Street, Billings, MT 59101-9998, in order to qualify for destination delivery unit rates.

DMM REVISION

Information Required on Pallet Labels

Effective June 14, 2001, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M031.4 is amended to clarify the required information that must appear on a pallet label. This revision provides descriptions of what must appear on the destination line (Line 1), content line (Line 2), and office of mailing or mailer information line (Line 3), of pallet labels. The change corrects the omission of the required Line 3 information on pallet labels in the DMM. In addition, this section is amended to provide consistency with DMM M045, Palletized Mailings.

Incorporating these changes makes clear what constitutes the correct contents for a pallet label, including extraneous matter.

4.5 Destination Line

[Revise 4.5 by adding the following to the beginning of the paragraph:]

The destination line (line 1 of required information) must be the first visible line on the label. It must be completely visible and legible when placed on the pallet. The destination line must contain only the information specified by standard, including the appropriate destination facility prefix (e.g., "ADC"). Two zeros may follow 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes used as required by labeling standards. On 5-digit carrier routes and 5-digit pallets for military destinations, the destination 5-digit ZIP Code of the mail contained on the pallet must be preceded by "APO" or "FPO"; and "AE" (for 090–098 ZIP Codes), "AA" (for 340 ZIPs), or "AP" (for 962–966 ZIPs).***

4.6 Content Line

[Revise 4.6 as follows:]

The content line (line 2 of required information) must be the second visible line on the label. This line must show the class and processing category of the mail on the pallet and other information as specified by standard. If the content line of a pallet label does not provide enough space for all required information, the content information may be continued right-justified on the line immediately below the content line and above the office of mailing or mailer information line.

[Add new 4.7 as follows. Redesignate current 4.7 through 4.12 as 4.8 through 4.13, respectively:]

4.7 Office of Mailing or Mailer Information Line

The office of mailing or mailer information line (line 3 of required information) must be the bottom line of required information and must show either the city and state of the entry Post Office or the mailer's name and the city and state of the entry Post Office.

4.10 Extraneous Information

[Revise items c, d, and f to include information about the office of mailing or mailer information line:]

Extraneous information is permitted on pallet labels if:

- c. It does not appear on or between the lines reserved for USPS required information (blank lines are permitted). Exception: For combined mailings of Standard Mail and Package Services machinable parcels, mailer codes and extraneous information may appear between the content line and the office of mailing or mailer information line.

- d. It is below the office of mailing or mailer information line.

- f. On the office of mailing or mailer information line, the mailer's name or abbreviation, "Mailer," "From" (or "FR"), "Entered at," or a similar notation precedes the required information, or mailer codes or other extraneous information appear to the right of the required information.

DMM REVISION

New Guidelines for Shipping Labels

Effective July 1, 2001, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) S919.2.1c, S919.3.3a, and Exhibits S919.2.1c and S919.3.3 are revised to reflect standard guidelines for creating package shipping labels. These guidelines identify the requirements and specifications for mailers designing their own shipping labels. S913.2.5 is changed to reflect new information in Publication 91, *Confirmation Services Technical Guide*.

2.5 Integrated Barcodes

[Revise 2.5 as follows:]

There are other options available for mailers who print their own labels:

- a. An integrated barcode may be used by Confirmation Services electronic option mailers who wish to combine insurance with Delivery Confirmation or insurance with Signature Confirmation into a single barcode on the shipping label to eliminate multiple labels and barcodes on packages. Additional information on the integrated barcode solution can be found in Publication 91, *Confirmation Services Technical Guide*.
- b. Mailers have a third option for privately printed labels with insurance (see Exhibit 2.5). The privately printed label must meet the specifications described in Publication 91. Applicable certification procedures must be followed, also as specified in Publication 91.

2.1 Types of Labels

[Revise 2.1 as follows:]

Mailers may use one of the three Signature Confirmation label options shown in Exhibit 2.1. Additional information may be found in Publication 91, *Confirmation Services Technical Guide*. The three labels are as follows:

- c. Privately printed barcoded labels that meet the requirements in 2.0 and 3.0 (see Exhibit 2.1c). On the Priority Mail label, mailers must use the registered trademark symbol following the Priority Mail text or add the following statement at the bottom of the label in at least Helvetica 6-point type: "Priority Mail is a registered trademark of the U.S. Postal Service."

3.3 Printing

Labels printed by mailers must meet the following specifications:

[Replace item a with the following:]

- a. Each barcoded label must bear a return address and a unique Signature Confirmation PIC barcode as specified in 3.2. The text "USPS SIGNATURE CONFIRMATION" (if using retail service option as specified in 1.4) or "e/USPS SIGNATURE CONFIRMATION" (if using electronic service option as specified in 1.4 and the postage is evident on the mailpiece) must be printed between 1/8 inch and 1/2 inch above the barcode in minimum 12-point bold sans-serif type. Additionally, mailers approved for the electronic service option, at their discretion, may print the text "ELECTRONIC RATE APPROVED #[D-U-N-S® NUMBER]" in minimum 8-point bold sans-serif type directly below the bottom horizontal identification bar (see Exhibit 3.3). Human-readable characters that represent the barcode ID must be printed between 1/8 inch and 1/2 inch under the barcode in minimum 10-point bold sans serif type. These characters must be parsed in accordance with Publication 91, *Confirmation Services Technical Guide*. A minimum 1/8-inch clearance must be maintained between the barcode and any printing. The preferred range of widths of narrow bars and spaces is 0.015 inch to 0.017 inch. The width of the narrow bars or spaces must be at least 0.013 inch but no more than 0.021 inch. All bars must be at least 3/4 inch high.

Minimum 1/16-inch bold bars must appear between 1/8 inch and 1/2 inch above and below the human-readable endorsements to segregate the Signature Confirmation barcode from other areas of the shipping label. The line length should extend across the width of the label but must extend the length of the barcode at a minimum (see Exhibit 2.1c). Only information relating to Signature Confirmation and other special services must be placed between these lines. Mailers are required to comply with this change by October 5, 2001.

By signing a waiver on Form 5541, a mailer sending an Express Mail Custom Designed Service item under a service agreement may instruct the USPS to deliver the item without obtaining the signature of the addressee or addressee's agent, if the addressee or addressee's agent is not available. In those circumstances, completing the waiver authorizes the delivery employee to sign upon delivery. The item must be left in a secure location. Customers who waive the signature requirement will be provided only the delivery date and not an image of the signature when accessing delivery information on the Internet or when calling the toll-free number. Waiver of signature is not available for Express Mail COD.

3.3 Waiver of Signature

[Revise 3.3 to read as follows:]

A mailer sending an Express Mail item may instruct the USPS to deliver an Express Mail Next Day Service or Express Mail Second Day Service item without obtaining the signature of the addressee or the addressee's agent, if not available, by signing a waiver on Label 11-B or Label 11-F. Completion of the waiver authorizes the delivery employee to sign for the delivery of the item. The item must be left in a secure location. Customers who waive the signature requirement will be provided only the delivery date and not an image of the signature when accessing delivery information on the Internet or when calling the toll-free number. Waiver of signature is not available for Express Mail COD or Express Mail Military Service.

3.3 Agent Authorization

[Revise 3.3 to read as follows:]

An addressee who regularly receives restricted delivery mail may authorize an agent by Form 3801 or by letter to the postmaster. The addressee must make the notation "this authorization is extended to include restricted delivery mail" on Form 3801 (in the area for signatures of authorized agents) or in the letter to the postmaster. Form 3849 may be left for the authorization if the Post Office has no standing delivery order or letter on file. The addressee may enter the name of the person designated as the authorized agent in the space provided on Form 3849 and sign the authorization. The agent must sign for receipt of the article on Form 3849 in the delivery section.

Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, may be left for authorization if the Post Office has no standing delivery order (Form 3801) or letter on file. The addressee may enter the name of the agent designated to sign for the article in the space provided on Form 3849 and sign the authorization. At delivery, the agent must sign and print his or her name on the back of the form in the delivery section. The delivery employee from an electronic record management office must scan/enter the mailpiece barcode, enter the authorized agent event code, and scan and properly complete the corresponding Form 3849.

Online Express Mail Label Program

Effective July 2, 2001, the Postal Service is introducing a new Web tool — on a beta-test basis — that provides customers who use the Internet the ability to generate and print Express Mail® labels from their personal computer. This application program interface (API) produces a single-ply, black and white *Online Express Mail* label (Exhibit 1) and a PS Label 11-D, *Customer Online Record* (Exhibit 2), that conform to the new guidelines for shipping labels published in *Postal Bulletin 22047* (4-5-01, pages 7–9). The *Online Express Mail* label will be available via the USPS Express Mail API only and will be limited by the following requirements.

Postage Payment

Postage for *Online Express Mail* labels must be paid with adhesive stamps, meter stamps, or PC postage. The use of Express Mail Corporate Accounts (EMCA) will be added to this program as a future enhancement.

Service Criteria

The basic service criteria remains unchanged as they relate to service guarantees and delivery of the mail. Use of *Online Express Mail* labels will be restricted to Post Office-to-Addressee domestic shipments to U.S. destinations, including Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. They cannot be used for international shipments, shipments to APO/FPOs, or shipments to the remaining U.S. territories, possessions, and freely associated states. This exclusion is necessary due to the inability of these sites to support electronic record keeping for signature capture.

Special Services

Express Mail shipments using the *Online Express Mail* label may be combined with return receipt, COD, or additional insurance. Items requiring any of these special services must be presented for acceptance at a designated postal facility.

Acceptance Criteria

The acceptance criteria for shipments with *Online Express Mail* labels are the same as the current multi-ply Express Mail labels (PS Label 11-B, *Express Mail Post Office to Addressee*). Items can be deposited in an Express Mail collection box, picked up by a carrier or Postal Service employee, or presented at a designated postal facility. The requirements for acceptance are listed in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E500.

Offices with POS ONE/IRT terminals should process the Express Mail items with the online label in the same way as the current multi-ply Express Mail label. *Exception:* There is neither a finance copy to file nor a customer copy attached to the label.

Manual offices (without POS ONE/IRT terminals) will use a daily log form to record the Express Mail information and send it to the Expedited Services Office for data entry. We have provided a draft version of this form to the Expedited Service Specialists in each district. The final version of the form will be published in a future *Postal Bulletin*.

Procedure Modifications

To support the implementation of this program, we have modified certain standard operating procedures:

- For modifications to the procedures for retail acceptance, see page 25.
- For modifications to the procedures for handling of short paid items, see page 27.

The procedures for processing service failure refunds and indemnity claims remain the same with the exception of substituting the customer copy of PS Label 11-B with PS Label 11-D, *Customer Online Record* (refer to Exhibit 2).

Standard Operating Procedure

***Online Express Mail* Label Retail Acceptance (Domestic Mail Only)**

1. Greet customer.
2. Inquire for service requested. Customer presents Express Mail® package. Identify that customer is using an *Online Express Mail* label.
3. Place item on scale.
4. Ensure customer has affixed a properly completed label to the package.
5. Determine postage, weight, and service commitment.
6. If postage is affixed, determine if correct. If additional postage is required, ensure mailer is charged proper amount.
7. Follow existing acceptance procedures for domestic Express Mail service.
8. Complete **POSTAL USE ONLY** portion of the label.
 - Customer receipt is generated electronically by customer along with electronic label.
 - Finance copy is eliminated.
 - Manual offices should complete the daily log form for each piece of online Express Mail and send the log with the traditional Express Mail finance labels to the designated location for data entry every day.
9. Affix postage, if appropriate.
10. Round date the *Online Express Mail* label in a clear area. Complete Label 11-D, *Customer Online Record*, if presented. Round date and make corrections (to weight, special services, etc.), if necessary.
11. Complete the retail transaction and accept payment, if appropriate.
12. Place Express Mail article in sack designated for Express Mail service.
13. Close sack and properly tag using a slide label for the designated AMC/AMF or processing facility.
14. Dispatch articles daily as required, at specified dispatch times.



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Standard Operating Procedure

Handling Short Paid Items for the *Online Express Mail* Label

If the office of mailing receives an item without sufficient adhesive or meter stamps, the mailer is contacted to correct the deficiency before dispatch (*Domestic Mail Manual* P011.1.6). If the mailer does not immediately correct the deficiency, the acceptance employee will:

1. Determine the amount to collect from sender.
2. In place of a Customer Copy of Label 11-B, *Express Mail Post Office to Addressee*, complete PS Form 1096, *Receipts*, in the amount of postage due. Make sure to record the Express Mail® item number in the “purpose” area. Round date and sign.
3. Place PS Form 1096 into a G-10 envelope (instead of the traditional EP-13 envelope) and seal. Place the return address of the postmaster of acceptance in the upper left-hand corner (return address), and address the envelope to the sender of the short paid item.
4. Endorse the envelope with “Postage Due” and write in the amount due.
5. Dispatch with outgoing mail.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

Exceptions: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

42"	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44"	24" girth
over 44" to 46"	20" girth
over 46" to 48"	16" girth
Maximum length 48"	

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those available under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) *will not* receive an automatic distribution of Item 778700, nondenominated, *Woody Wagon*, presorted postcard rate (15-cent value), pressure sensitive adhesive (PSA) coil of 10,000. Automatic distributions will be provided to accountable paper depositories (APDs) and stamp service centers (SSCs).

SDOs requiring quantities of Item 778700 must order them from the appropriate APD using a separate PS Form 17.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

Post Offices requiring quantities of Item 778700 must order them from their designated SDO using a separate PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. SDOs must not distribute stamps to Post Offices before July 27, 2001.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from the appropriate APD using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the Chicago APD will receive 2,400 coils; the Washington and Memphis APDs, 800 coils; the San Francisco and New York APDs, 400 coils; and the Denver APD, 200 coils.

The Kansas City SSC will receive 8,800 coils for fulfilling supplemental orders from the APDs.

All users of mail transport equipment (MTE) are requested to promptly identify, "red tag," and isolate damaged or defective wheeled containers used to transport mail. Damaged rolling stock must be removed from service and placed in a holding area for return to the servicing mail transport equipment service center (MTEESC).

Although all MTE items passing through the MTEESCs are scanned for obvious defects, use of the orange PS Form 4707, "Out of Order" tag, will ensure that broken rolling stock is identified and scheduled for repair. Please help the MTEESC network keep your rolling stock serviceable by tagging all defective containers.

NOTICE AND CORRECTION

Removal of Trash From Mail Transport Equipment

Please disregard the article titled "Notice: Removal of Trash from Mail Transport Equipment" in Postal Bulletin 22051 (5-31-01, page 59). The article that appears here has the correct information.

Mail processing centers and facilities must immediately stop shipping excess or broken office and workroom furniture, equipment, garbage, and trash to the mail transport equipment service centers (MTEESCs) in excess containers or cardboard boxes. Incidents of this type have increased sharply during 2001. This practice creates environmental health and safety problems at the receiving MTEESCs, which must spend unbudgeted funds to dispose of the refuse through waste management contractors.

Future shipments of this type will be returned to the originating offices, which will be billed for the additional shipping and handling expenses.

Refer to Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, for instructions on disposing of unneeded or broken equipment.

RURAL CARRIERS

Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes

In accordance with provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.3 of the Rural Carrier National Agreement, effective June 15, 2001 (pay period 15-01), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will increase from 39.5 cents per mile to 40.5 cents per mile.

The EMA is 40.5 cents per mile, or a minimum of \$16.20 per day, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.5, receive an EMA of 40.5 cents per mile or \$4.65 per hour, whichever is greater. This EMA should not exceed the amount provided in the special EMA for the route stops and miles.

EMA Rate Schedule

The EMA rate schedule on pages 91–92 supersedes all previously published EMA schedules for employees receiving EMA.

Optional EMA Rate

The optional EMA rate, effective November 4, 2000, remains at 65 cents per mile.

Wanted: Louis Holley — Seeking Information on His Location

Holley's female friend has cooperated with the Inspection Service. She indicated that on Saturday, June 2, she found an envelope containing the registration to Holley's vehicle. Holley signed over his most recent paycheck to her. The friend says that she has no idea where Holley is or might be and has not heard from or seen him since 8:30 p.m. on Friday, June 1, 2001.

Most Recent Sighting

What is known is that Holley abandoned a rented Nissan Sentra in Boise, Idaho. The Arizona tag, 255DPX, was removed from the Sentra and has not been recovered. On June 4, 2001, he purchased a 1995 Black Jeep Cherokee Limited with gold trim and gold wheels, roof rack, sunroof, tinted windows, tan leather interior, Idaho temporary tags (white with blue trim) # 0194853. The Jeep Cherokee's VIN # is 1J4GZ78YXSC653454. The Jeep was last seen in Spokane, Washington, on June 8, 2001.

On Thursday, June 14, 2001, an arrest warrant was issued for Holley.

Use Voyager Fleet Card at Speedway SuperAmerica

On May 24, 2001, the Postal Service and Speedway SuperAmerica entered into an agreement that provides a special fuel pricing discount by using the U.S. Bank Voyager fleet card. This discount is based on a sliding scale of consumption. At its current consumption level, the Postal Service will receive the maximum discount of 2 cents a gallon.

Of equal importance to this discount, Speedway SuperAmerica is working with Voyager Fleet Management to remove all appropriate state taxes (both excise and sales) from the billing process. The net amounts billed to each Postal Service site using the Voyager fleet card will exclude these taxes.

Speedway SuperAmerica operates over 2,600 locations in AR, FL, GA, IA, IL, IN, KY, LA, MI, MN, MO, MS, NC, OH, PA, SC, SD, TN, TX, WI, and WV.
