Dear Fellow Postal Employee:

I am proud to announce the start of our 2002 U.S. Savings Bonds Campaign which runs from May 13 through June 7, 2002. The Savings Bonds Campaign is your chance to learn about U.S. Savings Bonds and to sign up for payroll deduction. For those of you who already participate, you can take this opportunity to review your financial plans, adjust your allotments, and add the Series I Bonds to your deductions.

This year we are offering both the Series EE and Series I Bonds through payroll deduction. The Series EE Savings Bond offers market-based interest rates. Payroll deduction for the Series EE Bonds will begin within two pay periods.

The inflation-indexed I Bond earns an adjustable interest rate that keeps your savings growing over and above inflation for up to 30 years. This means a rising cost of living will not erode your purchasing power. Requests for payroll deduction for the Series I Bonds will be taken during the Campaign period and held for processing later this year.

Earnings from U.S. Savings Bonds are exempt from local and state income taxes. Federal income taxes are deferred until you choose to redeem them, or your U.S. Savings Bonds stop earning interest at 30 years. You may even be able to avoid federal income taxes if you use your earnings to pay for qualified higher education expenses. This could be a very important feature for those of you with young families.

Enclosed are the following items: the U.S. Savings Bonds Program Brochure, the Series EE deduction card, the Series I deduction card, and a return envelope. Simply complete the appropriate deduction card(s), and return the card(s) in the prepaid envelope before June 7. Payroll deductions for Series EE Bonds will begin within two pay periods. Requests for Series I Bonds will be held for processing and payroll deductions will begin later this year. We will notify you before the effective date of the Series I Bond deduction.

Community Relations has prepared the enclosed publicity kit to assist you in planning local events for the upcoming *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp to be issued in New York.



*PUBLICITY KIT***Heroes of 2001 Semipostal Stamp****Events and Publicity**

On June 7, 2002, the U.S. Postal Service will issue the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp. The stamp will go on sale nationwide that day. This new stamp is expected to remain on sale through December 31, 2004, and will be sold for 45 cents. All sales of this semipostal stamp must be recorded in **AIC 087**. The difference between the sales price and the underlying First-Class Mail® rate constitutes a contribution to provide assistance to the families of the emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty in connection with terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. It is the second semipostal stamp the Postal Service has issued — the first being the *Breast Cancer Research* semipostal stamp that remains on sale until December 31, 2003.

Public Law #107-67 requires that funds raised from the sale of the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp (net of the Postal Service's reasonable costs) be transferred to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide assistance to the families of the emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in connection with the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

There are many ways to generate local interest in this very special *Heroes of 2001* stamp. Following are some methods to capture customer and media attention.

Stage a Kick-Off Event

Invite employees, local firefighters, emergency medical technicians (EMTs), law enforcement personnel, local politicians, chamber of commerce members, and others to make public purchases of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp and to mail letters using the stamp.

Other Event Ideas

(Remember, when planning events, make sure stamps are available.)

- Develop a "Celebration of Life," "Remembrance," or "Heroes" wall at your Post Office and invite EMTs, law enforcement people, firefighters, and/or family members to display a red, white, and blue ribbon in honor of our heroes.
- Plan an event at the local fire or police station or other public location and include a display of an enlargement of the new stamp. Invite appropriate speakers and/or present special awards to a local hero or heroes.
- Present a framed enlargement of the new stamp to your local fire, EMT, or police department.
- The Postal Service employs approximately 800,000 people, many of whom donate their time as EMTs, National Guardsmen, or volunteer firefighters. Recognize your local postal "heroes" at ceremonies. Ask Congressional, civic, and community leaders to participate.
- Hold ceremonies to welcome home the men and women of your community who served in Afghanistan.
- Coordinate groups of children — children of postal employees, YMCA camps, Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, etc., to write thank-you letters or notes to local police, EMTs, or firefighters. Have the children place the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamps on their letters and drop them in the mailbox at the Post Office. (Photo opportunity.)
- Coordinate an essay-writing contest or art contest for children using the *Heroes of 2001* theme. Get local newspaper editors to judge essays and select winners. Have local art teachers from community schools judge art entries. Invite winners of those contests to your ceremonies, recognize their work, and present them with a sheet of stamps or philatelic collectible. Display their work in your lobby.

Implement any of these ideas, or brainstorm with your employees to come up with ideas of your own. Using the publicity materials in this kit, be sure to publicize each and every event to your local newspaper, radio stations, and television stations. Send a letter or press release, and then follow up with a phone call.

Important Reminders

Funds from the sale of the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp will be used to provide assistance to the families of the emergency relief personnel who were killed or became permanently disabled in the line of duty in connection with the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks.

All sales for the *Heroes of 2001* stamp must be recorded in AIC 087.

Event Planning Checklist

When planning *Heroes of 2001* stamp events, keep the following suggestions in mind:

- Begin planning immediately.
- Set a date.
- Secure participants (business customers, postal employees who are heroes or have a tie to the tragedy, local politicians, celebrities, etc.).
- Order enlargements of the stamp image, flyers, and other supplies for the event.
- Prepare the special pictorial cancellation provided in this kit.
- Secure staging and sound equipment, if applicable.

- Plan signage, including a podium sign and banners.
- Launch a local publicity campaign using the materials in this kit.
- Draft a sequence-of-events agenda and speaker remarks.
- Plan retail opportunities encouraging sales of the stamp.
- Prepare ceremony programs and invitations, if applicable.
- Send news clippings to your area Public Affairs and Communications manager.

Heroes of 2001 Stamp Pictorial Cancellation

The Postal Service has authorized one pictorial cancellation design for field use to help spread awareness about the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp. Post Offices planning events are encouraged to use the design depicted below. Offices can offer this cancellation through mail-back service for 30 days.

As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking services widely known to collectors through advance publicity to avoid limiting the availability of these postmarks. Therefore, all pictorial cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services before local events. *Please use the announcement form on page 17 to report your use of the cancellation.*

Guidelines for Finalizing Heroes of 2001 Station Pictorial Cancellation Art

To finalize the *Heroes of 2001* Station pictorial cancellation art (see below), insert the date and the city, state, and ZIP Code of the physical location of your event within the postmark circle. Overall dimensions of the pictorial cancellation must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3 1/2 inches by 1 inch.

Licensing: Heroes of 2001 Pins for Sale

Use of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp image remains highly restricted. The Postal Service has now been granted the right to use the image on pins for Postal premiums.

The pins are not for resale.

Questions and Answers

How many Heroes of 2001 stamps will be printed?

The Postal Service will print 205 million self-adhesive *Heroes of 2001* stamps.

How is this stamp different from other postage stamps?

The *Heroes of 2001* stamp, also referred to as a "semi-postal," is the second U.S. stamp in history to have its net proceeds above postage (and the Postal Service's reasonable costs) earmarked for a specified cause. The first semi-postal was issued as a result of legislation enacted in 1997 to benefit breast cancer research.

Why is a semipostal stamp being issued to provide assistance for families of emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in connection with terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001?

Public Law #107-67 directs the Postal Service to issue the stamp. The legislation instructs the Postal Service to transfer the funds available from the sale of the semipostal to FEMA.

How much does the Heroes of 2001 stamp cost?

The price of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp is 45 cents and is valid for postage in the amount of the First-Class Mail single-piece, first-ounce letter rate in effect at the time of purchase, which is currently 34 cents. The difference between the price of the stamp and the First-Class Mail postage rate (minus Postal Service costs) will be transferred to FEMA.

Who receives the money?

Funds will be transferred to FEMA to provide assistance to the families of emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty in connection with the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

Who designed the Heroes of 2001 Stamp?

The art director is Derry Noyes. The photograph is by Thomas E. Franklin of the *Bergen Record* newspaper.

Has the Postal Service issued other stamps to promote social or health-related causes?

Yes. For six decades, the Postal Service has issued new stamps to help raise awareness of a variety of health and social issues including prostate cancer awareness, organ and tissue donation, hospice care, drug abuse, AIDS awareness, and environmental conservation. However, none of those were semipostal stamps.

Where will the stamp be available for sale?

The *Heroes of 2001* stamp may be purchased at Post Offices, in vending machines in postal and non-postal locations, by calling toll-free 800-STAMP-24, and by accessing the Postal Service Web site at www.usps.com.

When does the stamp go off sale?

The stamp may remain on sale no later than December 31, 2004.

Service Talk

The Postal Service, through its commemorative stamp program, has a long history of promoting awareness about a multitude of social causes that affect people throughout the United States and around the world.

On July 29, 1998, we issued our nation's first semipostal stamp, the *Breast Cancer Research* stamp, which is scheduled to be sold through December 31, 2003.

The *Heroes of 2001* stamp was developed to provide assistance for families of emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty in connection with the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. We recommend that you bring these stamps to your customers' attention and ask them to consider purchasing the *Heroes of 2001* stamp to use on their mailings.

To review, here's how sales must be handled:

- The Postal Service must track the exact number of stamps sold. The *Heroes of 2001* stamp must be sold for 45 cents under **AIC 087**. The *Breast Cancer Research* stamp will continue to be reported in its separate AIC number.
- The stamp is valid for postage equal to the First-Class Mail first-ounce letter rate in effect at the time of purchase. Customers may have to be reminded that the stamp is good for 34 cents postage, not 45 cents. The difference consists of a tax-deductible contribution.
- Every Post Office must have *Heroes of 2001* stamps available for sale. Each person responsible for ordering and maintaining stamp stock must make certain their office has adequate supplies of these stamps.
- If your customers indicate they want this stamp but do not want to pay the purchase price (45 cents), please remind them that the Postal Service must, by law, collect the extra amount above postage. Use of semipostal stamps is voluntary. Offer your customer an alternative stamp to purchase if they elect not to make a contribution.
- Advise customers interested in donating without buying the stamp that they can do so through local or national charitable organizations.
- Give all customers a receipt. For retail offices that cannot provide the customer with a POS ONE or IRT receipt, use PS Form 1096, *Receipt* (see page 10).
- This self-adhesive stamp can be sold individually over the counter. Each pane has been specifically die-cut for that purpose.

- **Vending Packets:** Effective May 29, 2002, the *Heroes of 2001* stamp vending packet, Item 367400, will be released for sale, will be priced at \$4.50, and will be sold from vend "D3" (168 vends) in all multi-commodity machines in service, specifically the PCM-1625A and PCM-1625B. This stamp will remain on sale through December 31, 2004. Product identifiers have been created and can be downloaded from the Self Service web site at <http://retail.usps.gov/html/programs/selfservice.html>. Each packet will contain 10 *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamps, one PS Form 1096, and one sheet of instructions for completing PS Form 1096.

Thank you for your help in promoting the *Heroes of 2001* stamp with our customers.

Retail Information — Postal Store

The *Heroes of 2001* stamp, as well as future *Breast Cancer Research* semipostal stamps, will be packaged for postal stores on a new specific "semipostal" backer card. A receipt form will be printed directly on the backer card with instructions on how to correctly compute the tax-deductible portion of this purchase. An automatic distribution of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp will be made to the postal stores as well as to the stamp distribution offices (SDOs). This stamp will be available for reorder from Minnesota Diversified Industries (MDI) by the SDOs and the Albuquerque postal stores. Distribution of this stamp will not be made to SDOs until first day of issue date is announced.

Taxpayers who purchase a *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp from the Postal Service are entitled to treat as a charitable contribution the difference between the price of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp, and the price of regular First-Class Mail postage. All sales of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp must be tracked under **AIC 087**.

Cash Receipts: Postage and Fees Refunds for Semipostal Stamps

Customers may exchange or convert semipostal stamps for their postage value (i.e., the price of the stamps less the contribution amount) to the extent that exchange or conversion of postage stamps is permitted under *Domestic Mail Manual* P014, Refunds and Exchanges. The postage the customer exchanges or converts is equal to the First-Class Mail single-piece rate in effect at the time of exchange. However, if the customer provides a receipt showing the date of purchase, the postage exchanged or converted is equal to the First-Class Mail single-piece rate in effect at the time of purchase. The contribution amount is not

refundable and is not included in the exchange or conversion value.

POS

All sales of the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp must be tracked under **AIC 087**.

Vending Packets

Effective June 7, 2002, the *Heroes of 2001* stamp vending packet, Item 367400, will be priced at \$4.50 and will be sold from vend D3 (168 vends) in all multi-commodity machines in service, specifically the PCM-1625A and PCM-1625B. Product identifiers have been created and can be downloaded from the Self Service web site at <http://retail.usps.gov/html/programs/selfservice.html>. Each packet will contain 10 *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamps, one PS Form 1096, *Receipt*, and one sheet of instructions for completing PS Form 1096.

Letter From Department of the Treasury

The letter on page 11 is from the Internal Revenue Service. It explains that the difference between the price of the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp and the price of regular First-Class Mail postage will be treated as a tax-deductible charitable contribution.

Advertising Plan

In order to maximize awareness of the *Heroes of 2001* stamp, the Postal Service has developed an advertising and promotional plan to support the issuance of this stamp. This plan uses national, local, and retail initiatives to create awareness and to generate sales of the stamp.

National advertising initiatives include placing print ads in *Parade*, *USA Weekend*, and *USA Today*. Other initiatives include placing local print ads in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *Smithsonian Museum Guide*, *The Hill*, *Roll Call*, *CQ Weekly*, *Federal Times*, and *Stars and Stripes*. All of the elements will include the stamp design, description of the program, and a call to action for consumers to purchase the *Heroes of 2001* stamp at their local Post Office or by calling 800-STAMP-24.

Retail

Post Offices will receive the following in-store messaging components to support the issuance of the *Heroes of 2001* semipostal stamp in early June. They are a lobby poster and a counter easel with take-one brochure.

The poster, counter easel, and take-one brochures will be shipped directly to Post Offices along with specific placement instructions.

Commissioner Rossotti has asked me to respond to your inquiry regarding the deductibility of amounts paid for postage stamps issued pursuant to the 9/11 Heroes Stamp Act of 2001, Pub. L. No. 107-67, § 652, 111 Stat. 514 (2001).

In order to afford the public a direct and tangible way to provide assistance to the families of emergency relief personnel killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty in connection with the terrorist attacks against the United States on September 11, 2001, the 9/11 Heroes Stamp Act directs the United States Postal Service to issue special first-class postage stamps (Heroes stamps), to be sold for an amount at least 15 percent greater than the regular rate of first-class postage. The excess is to be transferred to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

When a taxpayer, with the intention of making a gift, purchases an item of value from a qualified charity, the excess of the payment over the value received is a charitable contribution. Accordingly, taxpayers who purchase a Heroes stamp from the United States Postal Service are entitled to treat as a charitable contribution the difference between the price of the Heroes stamp, and the price of regular first-class postage.



ASM REVISION

Photo Identification Requirements

Effective May 16, 2002, *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) 13, sections 277.1 and 277.233 are revised. We revised the sections to require that every postal employee; postal contractor; and temporary employee, including casual employees, have a PS Form 4098-F, *Employee Identification (face)*, or an equivalent photo identification card. Districts must comply with this requirement by the beginning of fiscal year 2003. Also, Postal Service managers must ensure that no part of the employee's social security number is displayed on the employee's photo identification card. This requirement applies to all employee photo identification cards issued after May 31, 2002.

We will incorporate this revision into the printed version of ASM 14 and into an incremental update of the online ASM 13, which is accessible through the Postal Service PolicyNet page on the intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov/cpim>; click on *Manuals*.

277.1 Purpose

[Revise section 277.1 to read as follows:]

Identification is issued for security control of access to postal premises and operations and to identify individuals as Postal Service employees. Every postal employee; postal contractor; and temporary employee, including casual employees, must have photo identification. Postal Service managers must ensure that no employee photo identification (i.e., photo identification) card displays any part of the employee's social security number. The Postal Inspection Service provides guidelines for all Postal Service identification programs.

277.233 Form 4098-F and Employee Identification

The responsible district manager issues Form 4098-F, *Employee Identification (face)*, or an equivalent photo identification card, to every postal employee; postal contractor; and temporary employee, including casual employees. All employees must wear and visibly display Form 4098-F or an equivalent photo identification card while officially employed and on duty (see section 277.3). All cards must include, at a minimum, the name of the employee, the facility to which they are assigned, and a photo of the employee. Each district manager is responsible for Form 4098-F or equivalent photo identification cards. Form 4098-F and equivalent photo identification cards provide visible identification of employees while on the workroom floor and serving customers outside of postal facilities. While on duty away from the facilities servicing customers, each employee must wear and display Form 4098-F or an equivalent photo identification card.

The March 2002 edition of Handbook AS-805 obsoletes Handbook AS-818, *Local Area Network and Personal Computer Security*; MI AS-830-92-11, *Electronic Messaging System Policy*; MI AS-840-95-12, *Employee Access to the Internet*; MI AS-850-97-3, *Security Certification and Accreditation of Sensitive Applications and Systems*; and MI AS-870-90-7, *Computer Virus Guidelines*. Please recycle all copies of these documents, as well as the April 1994 edition of Handbook AS-805.

The Postal Service relies extensively on computerized systems and electronic data to support its mission. The security of these systems and data is essential to avoid disruptions in critical operations, data tampering, fraud, and inappropriate disclosure of sensitive information. The revised Handbook AS-805 addresses the technologies that support the Postal Service and reflects industry and government prudent practices.

The policies in Handbook AS-805 apply to all Postal Service personnel, which includes employees, contractors, vendors, business partners, and any other authorized users of Postal Service information resources. The policies cover all information systems, applications, products, services networks, computer-controlled mail processing and mail handling equipment, and resources sponsored by, operated on behalf of, or developed for the Postal Service.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main Post Offices, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by NCMEC.

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all postal facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in Post Office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other postal facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service only as described above. If postal employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 1-800-843-5678.

ALL OFFICES WITH CITY MOTORIZED, RURAL, AND HIGHWAY CONTRACT BOX DELIVERY ROUTES

Mailbox Improvement Week, May 20–25

Each year, the Postal Service designates the third full week of May to encourage customers on city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 20–25, calls attention to the need for providing mailboxes that are:

1. Approved by the Postmaster General.
2. Designed to protect the mail from weather.
3. Safe to use.
4. Conveniently located.
5. Neat in appearance.

Mailboxes that meet these five important requirements help delivery and collection operations and improve service to the entire route. There are two approved styles of curbside mailboxes: (1) traditional design, in three standard

sizes (see Exhibit A on page 26); and (2) contemporary design, also in three sizes (see Exhibit B on page 26). USPS Std 7 governs the design and specifications of curbside mailboxes and includes provisions for improved quality of the product and a new category, locked mailboxes.

Notice 209

Postmasters should send Notice 209, *Mailbox Improvement Week*, to all rural and highway contract box delivery route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them of the event. Notice 209 can be requisitioned from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) as follows:

City Motorized, Rural, and Highway Contract Box Delivery Routes

Customers must use *only* approved traditional or contemporary curbside mailboxes for new installations or replacements. However, a customer may use a custom-built curbside mailbox if the local postmaster gives prior approval and the mailbox conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured curbside mailboxes relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction. Carriers on motorized city routes may continue to serve mailboxes that are designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery and that have been erected and served under previous regulations (see Exhibit C on this page). However, carriers should advise customers that they may use only approved curbside mailboxes when replacing these types of mailboxes. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional curbside mailboxes appears on pages 27–28.

For motorized city routes, and where the use of street names and house numbers is authorized on rural and highway contract box delivery routes, the mailbox must display the number on the side of single mailboxes or on the door of grouped mailboxes. If the mailbox is on a street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be on the mailbox. When rural and highway contract box delivery route customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single mailboxes or on the doors of grouped mailboxes, visible to the approaching carrier. The street number, box number, and/or any other address information must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than 1 inch in height. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers should be encouraged but not required to group mailboxes whenever practical, especially where many mailboxes are located at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or similar locations. Customers should also paint mailboxes and supports/posts and keep them rust-free. Advertising on mailboxes and supports/posts is prohibited.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semi-arch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit D), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under mailboxes without damaging supports and provides easy access to the mailboxes by carriers and customers.

Exhibit D



Generally, mailboxes are installed at a height of 41–45 inches from the road surface to the bottom of the mailbox or point of mail entry. Mailboxes are set back 6–8 inches from the front face of the curb or road edge to the mailbox door. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing mailboxes and supports.

Location

Customers must place mailboxes on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes so a carrier can safely and conveniently serve them without leaving his or her vehicle. The mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier’s travel direction in all cases where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left to reach the mailboxes, or where doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations (*Postal Operations Manual*, POM, 632.6, Apartment House Receptacles, exempts apartment houses and other multiple dwellings from this rule). On new rural and highway contract box delivery routes, all mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of the route line

of travel. Mailbox placement must conform with state laws and highway regulations. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede efficient delivery. Except when a mailbox is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the mailbox without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

The Postal Service does not regulate mailbox supports in any way except for purposes of carrier safety and delivery efficiency. Posts and other supports for curbside mailboxes are owned and controlled by customers, who are responsible for ensuring that posts are neat and adequate in strength and size. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away when struck by a vehicle. Post or support designs may not represent effigies or caricatures that disparage or ridicule any person. Customers may attach the box to a fixed or movable arm. POM 632.5, Curbside Mailboxes, specifies postal regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches, or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. According to FHWA, the mailbox must also be securely attached to its post to prevent separation if struck. See Exhibits E (page 33) and F (page 34) for examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA.

The following list of curbside mailboxes approved by the postmaster general supersedes all previously published lists of approved manufacturers.

Cluster Box Units and All-Weather Parcel Lockers

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters and managers or their designees must review all cluster box units (CBUs), neighborhood delivery and collection box units (NDCBUs), and outdoor parcel lockers (OPLs) in their delivery areas to identify any hazards or irregularities, and they must record the results of the review. PS Form 8143, *Equipment Checklist and Follow-up Review*, is the suggested format to use in conducting and recording the reviews. PS Form 8143 is available only in this *Postal Bulletin* (see Exhibit G on page 35) and must be reproduced locally. Employees conducting the reviews must complete PS Form 1624, *Delivery/Collection Equipment Work Request*, for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to postal customers or employees. Requisition PS Form 1624 from the MDC using normal ordering procedures

(described on pages 25–26). The relevant ordering information for PS Form 1624 is as follows:

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees must use the CBU and parcel locker equipment checklist and follow-up review procedure when examining the condition of CBUs, NDCBUs, and OPLs. You must:

1. List the 5-digit, USPS-marked Postal ID number of the unit. This is usually visible on the front or side of the body or pedestal. If a Postal ID number is not available, list the unit location, equipment type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column. If you are able to access the back of the unit, list the unit's vendor-supplied serial number.
2. Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - a. OK — Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - b. X — Equipment needs attention for this item.
 - c. NA — Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
3. When examining the equipment, use the instructions below to complete PS Form 8143:
 - a. Check equipment. All CBUs, NDCBUs, and OPLs should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted with the customer compartments facing away from the street. Visually verify that four bolts/nuts are firmly in place securing the pedestal to the concrete pad and also to the CBU, NDCBU, or OPL. Apply hand pressure to the top edge of the unit from the front side. While the unit may flex under the load, verify that the pedestal stays firmly mounted to the concrete and that the unit does not separate from the pedestal.
 - b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds. For NDCBUs and OPLs only, tap the pedestal with a lightweight hammer, especially along the seams, to check for corrosion from the inside out or perforated corrosion.
 - c. For CBUs and NDCBUs, observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe whether it is bowed or warped and whether the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With

the carrier access door open, check whether restraining devices prevent the door from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.

- d. Ensure that the arrow lock operates smoothly and that the mounting hardware is tight. For NDCBUs and OPLs, the cover that protects the arrow lock from customer tampering must be serviceable and firmly attached.
 - e. For OPLs, the cover that protects the arrow lock from theft must be secured with the proper quantity of tamper resistant screw.
 - f. Ensure that all customer access doors are present, closed, and locked with no visible damage or signs of forced entry. Check that customer door numbers are readable.
 - g. Ensure that the exterior surface of the unit is free from rust and graffiti.
 - h. Examine the unit. Check it for defects or damage and whether it reflects a proper Postal Service image.
 - i. Check whether the unit and/or any protecting structure appears watertight and in good repair. Check whether there are any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail.
 - j. Note any other conditions that require attention. Also, look for signs of vandalism such as pry marks on doors and locks.
4. Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
 5. Submit the completed PS Form 1624 for each unit reviewed to the maintenance office responsible for centralized delivery equipment installation and/or repair in the area.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit PS Form 1624 reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should complete PS Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition, or Practice*, for items that pose an immediate threat to safety, such as an improperly secured or leaning CBU. Order PS Form 1767 from the MDC using normal ordering procedures (described on pages 25–26). The relevant ordering information for PS Form 1767 is as follows:

The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify by telephone the office responsible for repair of reported hazards. The postmaster or supervisor must follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. The office responsible for repair should use its local buying authority to accomplish the repairs.

In April 2001 national contract for CBUs were awarded to American Locker Security Systems, Auth-Florence Manufacturing, and Security Manufacturing. OPLs are available only through the national contract with American Locker. All orders for CBUs and OPLs must be placed against these national contracts and all orders must be placed through e-Buy.

State and Local Regulations

Some states have enacted laws that are more stringent and specific about the type of mailbox that may be used, the post or support that must be used to mount the mailbox, and the location of the delivery equipment. Regulations and recommendations published in this notice might not reflect appropriate requirements for your area. When providing guidance to the general public concerning mailbox placement and replacement, advise them not only of postal regulations but also of any mailbox regulations that you know have been enacted by state or local authorities.

Publicity

Postmasters should give these guidelines and suggestions maximum local publicity. Consult your area Public Affairs and Communications representative for further guidance and assistance in publicizing Mailbox Improvement Week. The news release on page 37 is provided for postmasters to distribute to daily or weekly newspapers or broadcast stations in their delivery area to promote Mailbox Improvement Week. Postmasters should retype the release double-spaced on Postal Service letterhead. It may also be helpful to alert the media to locations of particularly interesting mailboxes in your delivery area.

Responsibility

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers must cooperate to ensure the success of this endeavor and later report the results to the postmaster. Also, postmasters should use the most up-to-date list of manufacturers and mailbox suppliers when providing motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers with information about the type of box to install.

Cantilever Mailbox Supports

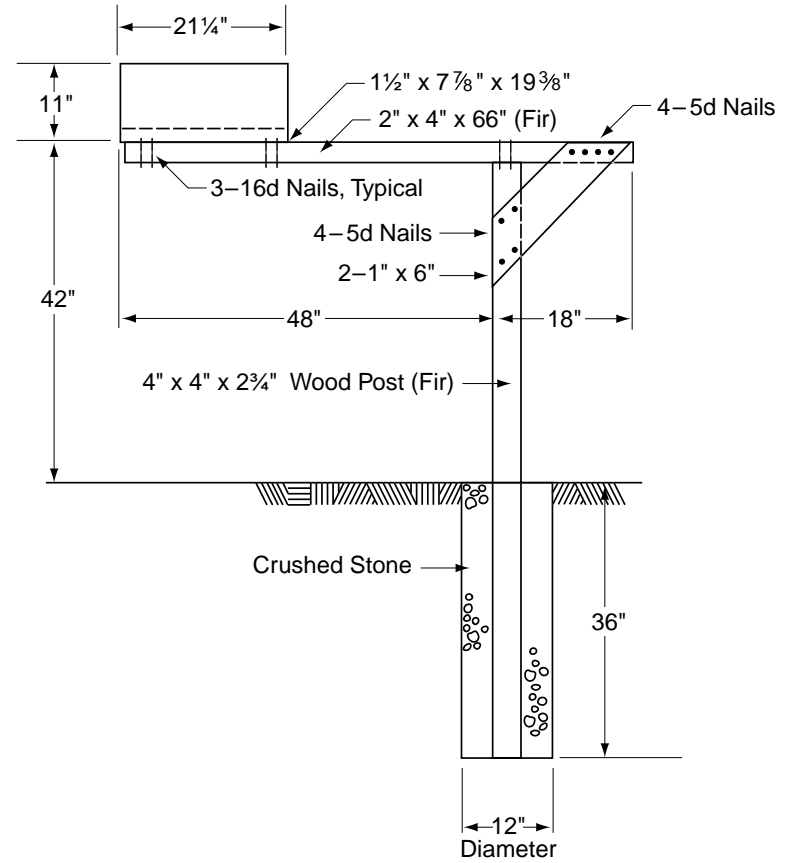
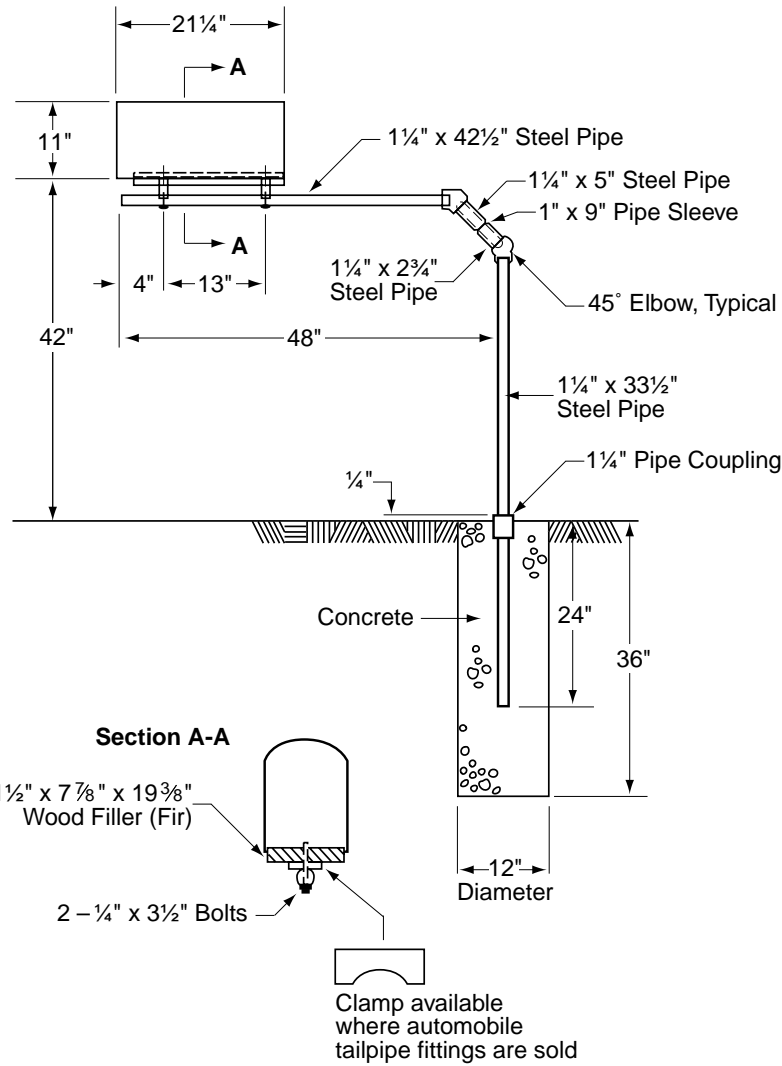
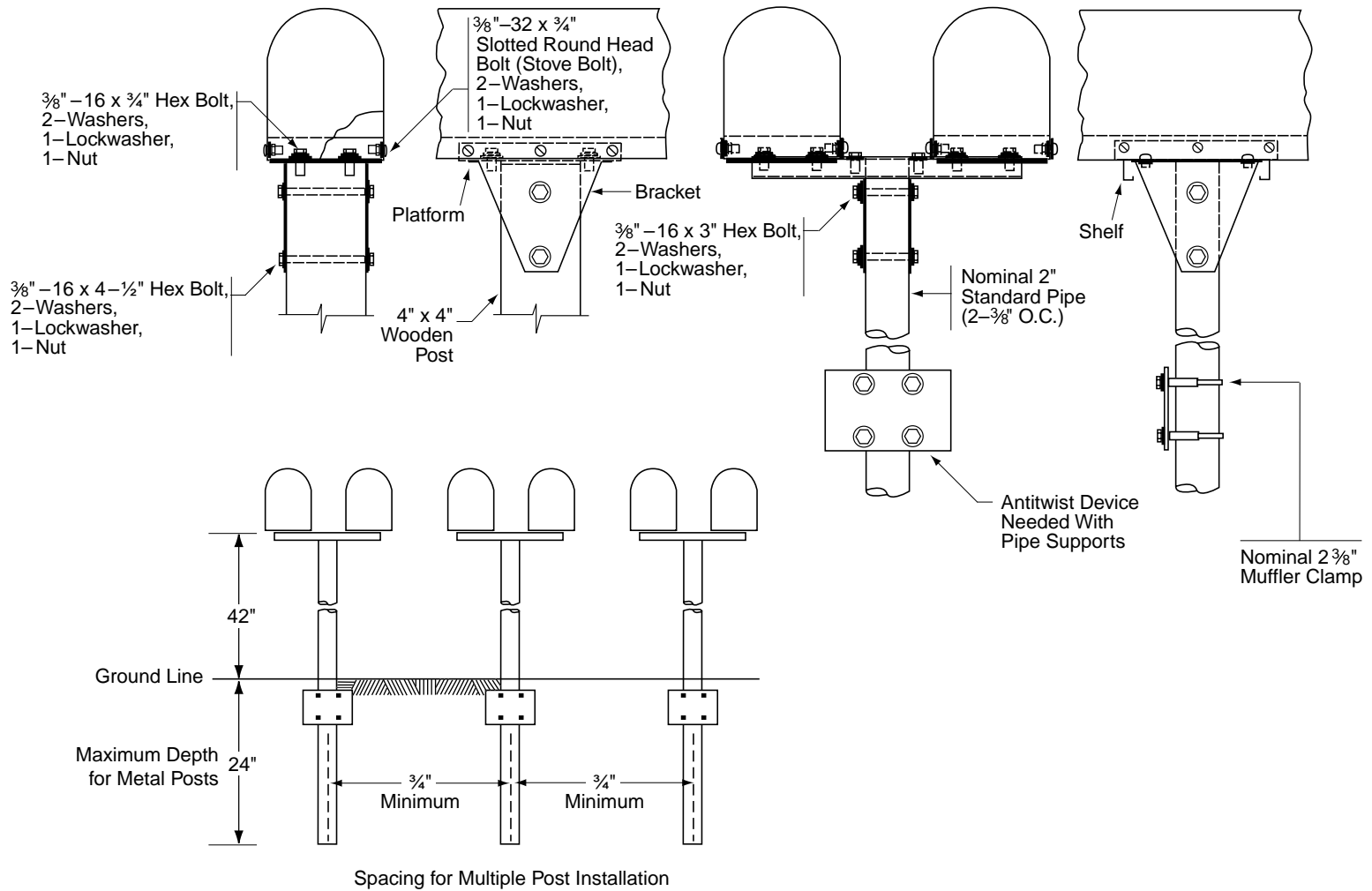

R2001-1 PAVE Cycle F Testing and Certification

On April 15, 2002, Presort Accuracy, Validation, and Evaluation (PAVE) Cycle F certification testing became available for all presort software developers. Presort software that is certified during Cycle F will support all of the changes required by the R2001-1 rate case.

Timeline

The timeline for the PAVE Cycle F testing and certification process is as follows:

Start of Cycle F	April 15, 2002
Cycle E certifications expire	June 29, 2002
Rate Case Implementation Date	June 30, 2002
Cycle testing fees take effect	July 16, 2002
End of Cycle F	October 15, 2002

PAVE Verifies Presort Accuracy

The PAVE testing and certification process verifies only the presort accuracy of the software. For testing purposes, PAVE supplies the software developers with address files that include all of the necessary information for each address to ensure that the mailpiece is presorted correctly.

PAVE Does Not Verify Address Information

PAVE does not verify the origin of address information or the assignment of addressing components. For PAVE purposes, addressing components such as County ID for In-County eligibility, ZIP+4[®] codes, and line-of-travel or carrier route information are provided to the developer. Some presort products provide this information to its users, while other presort programs rely upon the user to furnish accurate address components.

Because PAVE does not verify how software companies obtain address information, it is the responsibility of the mailer to verify that the address information is correct. The mailer should determine how the software acquires the County ID, ZIP+4 code, and line-of-travel or carrier route information to ensure that the information is correct. Incorrect components could effect the proper presorting of the mail. Consequently, the mail owner could be subject to additional postage.

Fees

In Cycle F, there are changes to the length of time that free testing is available. Cycle F testing is free to those who start and complete testing by July 15, 2002. Presort software developers who begin testing after July 15 or who have not completed testing by that date will be assessed the following fees:

- Test file — initial test (file generation, postage, and handling), \$50.00.
Each additional test requested, \$10.00.
- Certification — results evaluation (presort analysis and documentation review), \$200.00.
Each additional test evaluated, \$25.00.
- Minimum fee per product, \$250.00.

Fees are also assessed in the following situations:

- Any product that has failed electronic testing three times (Gold certification) in any one test category.
- Any product that has failed hardcopy review two times (Gold or Standard certification) in any one test category.

Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) — Negative Account Balances

Recent audits have shown that the number of negative balances for Express Mail Corporate Accounts has increased. Procedures for managing Express Mail Corporate Accounts are listed in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P500.2.0, Corporate Account.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

	over 42" to 44" 24" girth
	over 44" to 46" 20" girth
	over 46" to 48" 16" girth

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

International Mail

ICM UPDATES

International Customized Mail

We have combined ICM updates into one *Postal Bulletin* article to save space and paper. Five ICM updates are included in this article.

On April 12, 2002, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** April 30, 2002, through April 30, 2003.
- b. **Type of mail:** Global Express Mail™ Service (EMS). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination country:** Japan.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 1. Furnish Mailer, or Mailing Agent(s), with the postal equipment and postal supplies required for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 2. Provide Mailer with the preparation requirements and training necessary to prepare mail shipments in conformity with the requirement for Qualifying Mail.
 3. Perform on-demand and scheduled pickup service at the request of the Mailer at the published rate for this service in accordance with IMM 220.
- e. **Minimum volume commitment:** The Mailer has agreed to tender at least 50,000 pieces of Qualifying Mail on an annualized basis for the duration of the Agreement.
- f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for all Qualifying Mail by use of an Express Mail® Corporate Account.
- g. **Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for Global EMS to Japan at a discount of fourteen (14) percent off the published rate.

On April 24, 2002, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** April 26, 2002, through April 30, 2005.
- b. **Type of mail:** International Priority Airmail™ Service (IPA), International Surface Air Lift™ Service (ISAL), and Global Bulk Economy Service (GBE). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Worldwide.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 1. Furnish the Mailer with the postal equipment and postal supplies required for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 2. Provide the Mailer with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training necessary to prepare ICM Mail in conformity with the requirements for Qualifying Mail.
 3. Arrange with carriers to transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.

- e. Minimum volume commitment:** The Mailer has agreed to tender to the Postal Service mail intended for delivery outside the United States that generates at least \$25 million in actual postage in each year beginning on the effective date of this Agreement and ending on each anniversary of this date for the duration of the Agreement.
- f. Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:
1. Tender at least ninety-nine (99) percent of IPA Qualifying Mail in drop shipments to the appropriate locations specified in IMM 292.153.
 2. Tender at least ninety-nine (99) percent of ISAL Qualifying Mail in drop shipments to the appropriate locations specified in IMM 293.32.
 3. Tender no more than one (1) percent of IPA and ISAL Qualifying Mail to other postal facilities at the national rate or full service rate as appropriate.
 4. Drop-ship GBE Qualifying Mail at the New Jersey International and Bulk Mail Center.
 5. Provide the Postal Service with notification of intent to drop ship Qualifying Mail at a specific International Service Center (ISC) 2 weeks before the initial shipment to that ISC.
 6. Provide the Postal Service with notification of new dedicated permit numbers 2 weeks in advance of using the new dedicated permit numbers.
 7. Provide the Postal Service with projections of mailings to include the intended date of mailing, weight, and volume of the mailings.

On April 23, 2002, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. Term:** May 7, 2002, through May 6, 2003.
- b. Type of mail:** Global Express Mail™ Service (EMS). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for EMS.
- c. Destination countries:** Worldwide.
- d. Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to transport EMS to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authorities.
- e. Minimum volume commitment:** The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized minimum of 600 pieces of EMS.

8. Pay postage to the Postal Service for GBE using an exclusive permit imprint number.
 9. Pay postage to the Postal Service for ICM Qualifying Mail using dedicated permit imprints.
- g. Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for
1. GBE at rates discounted sixteen (16) percent off the base rates contained in Exhibit 1.
 2. Qualifying Mail at discounted rates as detailed in Exhibit 2, based on a commitment of at least \$25 million in actual postage on an annualized basis.

 8. Return Global Express Mail Service (EMS) items and Airmail Parcel Post items receiving Customs Pre-Payment in Great Britain, whether refused by an addressee or undeliverable, to the Mailer at the same fees as for Merchandise Return Service.
 9. Provide the Mailer with tracking reports, if applicable to the service, and delivery performance reports on a regular basis.
 10. Provide a customized binding Proposal detailing the number of hours required to complete a harmonization process at the Mailer's request.
 11. Apply a Postal Service shipping label and Customs documentation to each package.
 12. Send an electronic data file to Great Britain that will allow the Customs officials to review the contents of each shipment before the packages arrive.

5. Provide the Postal Service with a schedule of mailings, including the intended date of tender, weight, volume, and location where the mail will originate.
6. Present the mailings to the Postal Service at the Detached Mail Unit at the Mailer's plant.
7. Pay for any requested harmonization at a rate of \$250 per hour.

g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage:

1. For Global Express Mail Service (EMS), Airmail Parcel Post, Return Service for unopened items, and Merchandise Return Service according to the following charts.

The stamp, designed and illustrated by Terrence W. McCaffrey, U.S. Postal Service, Washington, DC, goes on sale nationwide June 7, 2002. No official ceremony is planned.

The stamp will be issued in a water-activated (WAG) pane of 100 (Item 103800); pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) automated teller machine (ATM) sheetlet of 18 (Item 563100); PSA pane of 20 (Item 563200); PSA convertible book of 20 (Item 671100); PSA vending book of 20 (Items 671200 and 671211); PSA double-sided book of 20 (Item 671600); and a PSA coil of 100 (Item 781100).

The stars and stripes of "Old Glory" are featured on this definitive stamp.

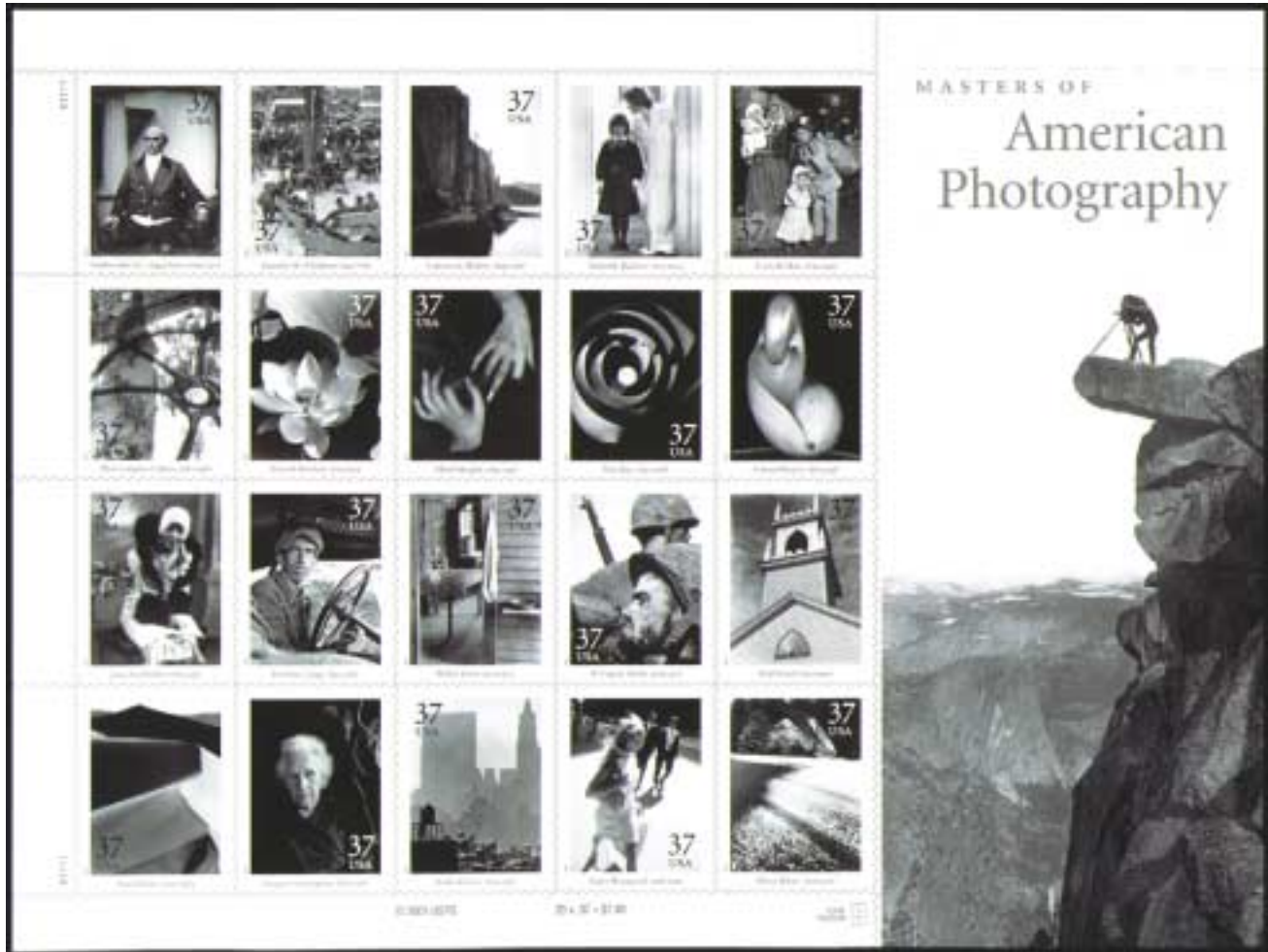

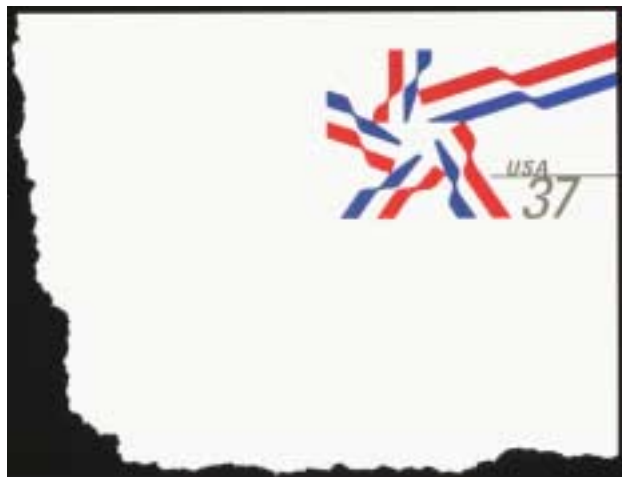

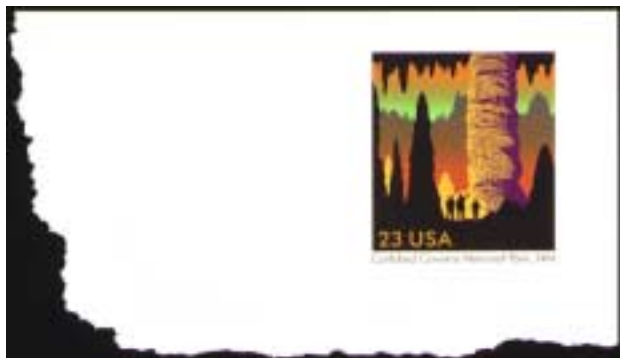

The Postal Service will issue 23-cent *Carlsbad Caverns National Park* single-cut stamped card (Item 221100) on June 7, 2002, in Carlsbad, New Mexico. The card, designed by Carl Herrman, Carlsbad, California, and illustrated by Tom Engeman, Brunswick, Maryland, goes on sale nationwide June 7, 2002. The stamped card will also be produced in double-cut reply cards (Item 221200); sheet of 40 cards (Item 221300); and 5-card banded (Item 222000).

More than 1,000 years ago prehistoric Native Americans ventured into Carlsbad Cavern in New Mexico seeking shelter. Much later, in the 1800s, settlers discovered the cavern, drawn to it by the spectacle of hundreds of thousands of bats rising up out of the natural entrance in the evening. The natural wonders of this extraordinary place eventually spread to Washington, DC. In 1923, the U.S. Interior Department sent inspectors to investigate the cavern and determine whether it was truly an outstanding natural scenic wonder. Later that year, Carlsbad Cavern was proclaimed a national monument. On December 6, 1995, the cavern was designated a World Heritage Site. Finds in recent years include the Guadalupe Room in 1966, which is the second largest room in the cavern, the exceptionally colorful and much decorated Bifrost Room in 1982, and the Chocolate High in 1993. Research is slowly answering many questions about the complex creation of the cavern, the unfamiliar world of bats and other members of the cave community, and the effects of man's activities on the cave.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp service centers (SSCs) will receive two waves of three-fourths of their standard distribution in each wave of item 566000. Wave 1 shipments began March 19, 2002, and completed April 9, 2002. Wave 2 shipments began April 16, 2002, and completed May 9, 2002.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO or SSC, using a separate PS Form 17.

The San Francisco, Chicago, and Memphis APDs will receive 4,000,000 additional stamps; the Denver APD will receive 2,000,000 additional stamps; and the New York APD will receive 6,000,000 additional stamps. For fulfilling supplemental orders, the Kansas City SSC will receive 5,000,000 additional stamps.

Sales Policy

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary Post Office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

HANDBOOK EL-806 REVISION

Seizures/Epilepsy — New-Hire Applicants

Effective May 16, 2002, Handbook EL-806, *Health and Medical Service*, is revised. The new language about seizures, seizure disorders, and epilepsy applies to applicants for Postal Service employment.

153.4 New-Hire Candidates

Any applicant for Postal Service employment who has a history of or presently has seizures, a seizure disorder, or epilepsy must present documentation to the Postal contract physician, medical director, or occupational health nurse administrator that fully describes the extent of the disorder, treatment program, prognosis, and any other relevant information. This documentation must contain information addressing the applicant's level of seizure control such as medication levels and/or period of time seizure free and will be introduced as part of the documentation considered during the medical assessment/suitability process. The medical director or occupational health nurse administrator may request additional information from the applicant if deemed necessary. Special emphasis will be placed upon the ability of the individual to work safely.

MI EL 410-2002-1, Process for Completing EAS Merit Performance Evaluations and Setting Objectives

Management Instruction (MI) EL 410-2002-1, *Process for Completing EAS Merit Performance Evaluations and Setting Objectives*, dated March 22, 2002, provides guidance on setting objectives and assessing the performance of executive and administrative schedule (EAS) employees. Specifically, the instructions in the MI:

- Acquaint all EAS employees, full- and part-time, with the Postal Service's performance management objectives and philosophy.
- Provide the framework and guidance for managers and their staffs to establish performance objectives at the beginning of each year.
- Emphasize the manager's role in motivating EAS employees on an ongoing basis to achieve an optimum performance level in support of the work unit's mission.
- Clarify the manager's obligation to take constructive action in improving unsatisfactory performance.
- Provide direction for preparing the Midyear Review and the Narrative of Work Accomplishments.

Managers and supervisors with EAS employees have the option of developing a Success Improvement Plan. Jointly developed by the manager and employee, the plan is structured to help employees overcome performance issues.

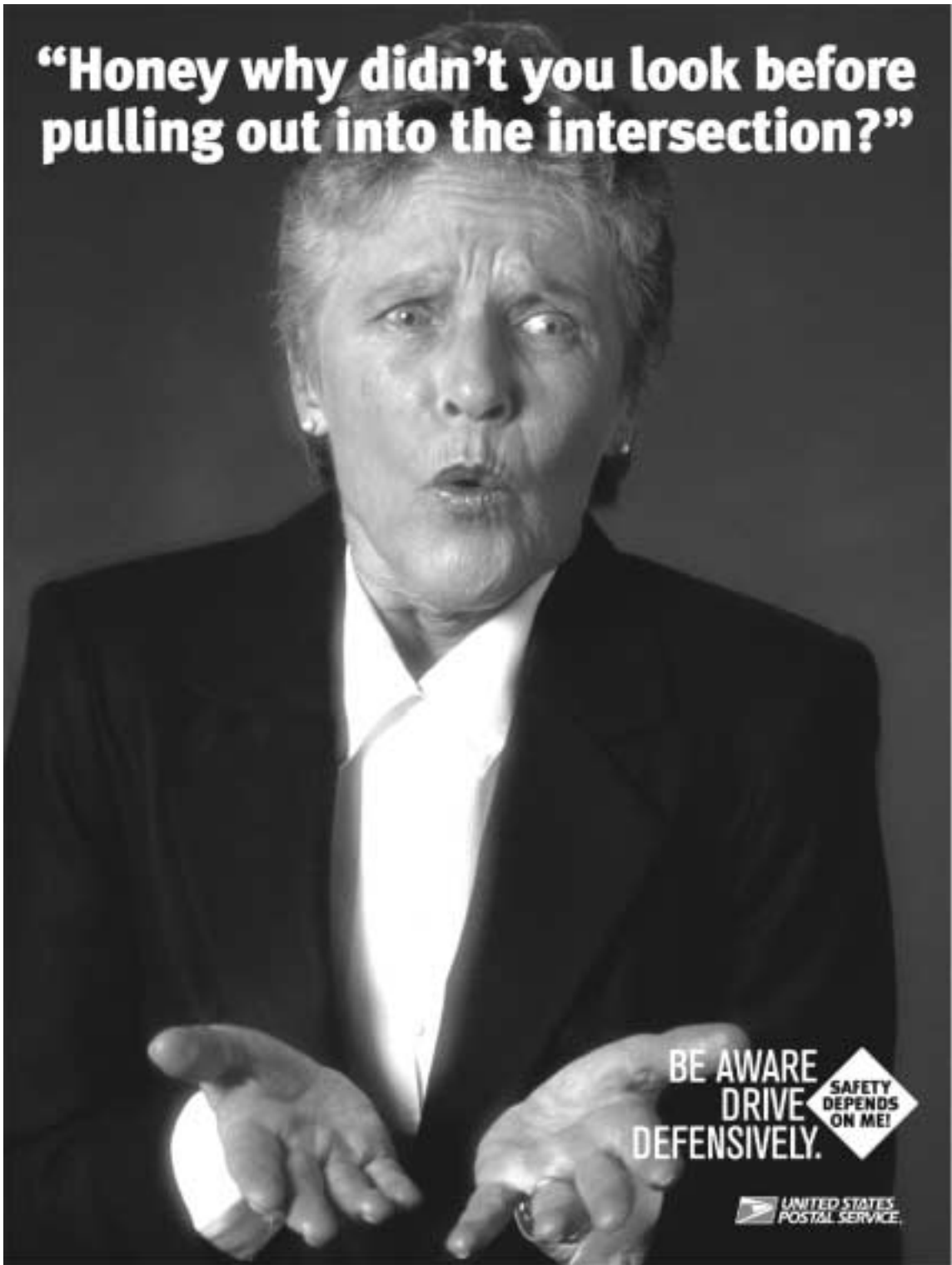

FIELD NOTIFICATION

E-Mail Notification for Resetting Electronic Manually Reset Meters

Effective May 1, 2002, postal employees stopped resetting meters for customers unless the customer had an original meter resetting authorization letter as described in *Postal Bulletin 22072* (3-21-02, page 108). Unfortunately, errors occurred and some customers did not receive reset authorization letters. Many of those errors were brought to our attention as customers received follow-up letters.

When manufacturers were notified of a problem, they sent information to Postage Technology Management (PTM) requesting that new letters be issued; however, some customers needed immediate assistance. In order to minimize any disruption to those mailer's businesses, PTM sent an emergency e-mail message to the customer. The message authorized local postal employees to reset the meter(s), described by manufacturer, model, and serial number, for a specific date range that never exceeded seven (7) calendar days. After the expiration date, as

stated in the e-mail, the customer needs an original, valid authorization letter printed on the special security paper. The e-mail provided names and telephone numbers of Headquarters employees to contact in case of questions.

If customers do not have the original meter resetting authorization letter, please instruct them to contact their meter manufacturer at the corporate level, and not to contact their local meter representative. We published the appropriate contacts in *Postal Bulletin 22075* (5-2-02, page 132), *Postal Bulletin 22074* (4-18-02, page 110), and *Postal Bulletin 22073* (4-4-02, page 74–75). PTM will send an e-mail to customers if the manufacturer provides supporting justification.
