Afterwards, Potter visited with employees at the Minneapolis and St. Louis Processing and Distribution Centers and toured the facilities.

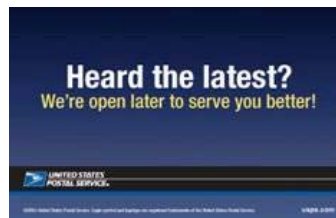
Now that’s service! 96% EXFC score extends service streak

USPS once again reached its all-time high-score of 96% on-time performance for overnight delivery of First-Class Mail® pieces. That makes 10 consecutive quarters with a 95 percent or better External First-Class (EXFC) score. The score — independently measured by IBM Consulting Services — was announced during the Board of Governors meeting in California earlier this month.

Two-day service performance increased two points from last quarter to 92 percent. Three-day, which is carried by air, gained 7 points to finish the quarter at 90 percent on-time delivery.

And with service levels consistently at a record high, it’s no surprise our customer satisfaction measurements also are top-notch, finishing at 93 percent for the quarter. This marks the 15th consecutive quarter USPS has earned a 93 percent or better customer satisfaction measurement score.

Open later to serve you better: Extended Retail Hours Plan helps keep USPS competitive



USPS is extending hours in selected Post Offices™ around the country — as late as 7 P.M. on weekdays and 3 P.M. on Saturdays. The message of the Extended Retail Hours Plan

is simple: “We’re open later to serve you better.”

The first locations with extended hours are seeing excellent results. Greater Indiana District increased walk-in revenue by more than \$400,000 when eight Indianapolis-area Post Offices began staying open until 7 P.M.

Office hours will be extended at 1,082 Post Offices this year. Offices selected for extended hours handle 30 percent of retail package volume and are located within 5 miles of a competitor's retail store.

The survey is quick, easy and you can do it on the clock. Your feedback is critical to the Postal Service's continued success. Every career employee has an opportunity to take the survey once during the year. So if you haven't gotten one so far, it's your turn to participate.

If you receive one this time around, take the time to fill it out. It only takes about 15 minutes. When it's completed, you can return it to your survey administrator or mail it back yourself in the envelope provided.

Not for snowbirds only: Premium Forwarding Service affordable, efficient

Premium Forwarding Service — an innovative idea created by USPS for "snowbirds," students and other customers who are on the road for an extended time — is now available. The new forwarding option moves mail to a customer's temporary address once a week for periods of at least 2 weeks and up to 1 year.

The product is priced for ease and convenience — with a flat fee of \$10 to sign up and \$10 a week for shipping and handling. Under the new service, the Postal Service will use Priority Mail[®] service to box and reship the forwarded mail.

Postal Service and Hershey's Pumpkin Decorating Contests

A fun, creative way to draw customers to Post Office™ lobbies to demo our suite of quick, easy, and convenient online solutions — right before the holiday season

Overview

Hershey Foods Corporation will nationally roll out its Hershey's Pumpkin Decorating Mix for the fall of 2005. To promote it, there will be a national competition — Hershey's Sweeten Up Your Pumpkin Decorating Contest — from August 1 to November 30. The national contest invites everyone from children to decorating experts to submit digital photographs of their Hershey's-decorated pumpkins for a chance to win one of ten \$10,000 prizes. Prizes will be awarded in four categories, and entries can be submitted through the mail or electronically by visiting www.usps.com/premiumpostcard. For additional information on the Hershey's national contest, go to www.trickortreats.com.

In addition to the Hershey's national contest, the Postal Service™ will sponsor a local contest for children, ages 6–12 on Saturday, October 22, 2005. Postmasters interested in hosting a contest should plan for the event to last approximately 2–3 hours beginning immediately after normal business hours.

Postmasters and/or their designee will select one winner and one runner-up, both of whom will receive a prize (see Contest Information on page 9). The winning pumpkin will be displayed in the Post Office lobby through Halloween day.

At the end of the local contest, postmasters will digitally photograph the winner with his/her pumpkin, upload the image onto NetPost®, and enter the winning pumpkin into the running for the Postal Service contest grand prize. Because photos must be taken digitally, postmasters are encouraged to purchase disposable digital cameras, save the photograph to disk and upload the photo to NetPost Premium Postcards. (See page 10 for details on how to enter winners using NetPost.)

Headquarters representatives will select a grand prize winner from the pool of all local contest winners. *Note:* Postmasters will also enter the winning pumpkin into the Hershey's national contest. However, all pumpkins decorated at Post Office events are eligible to be entered into the Hershey's national contest by the participants' parents or guardians. Postmasters should encourage participants' parents or guardians to fill out the entry form, photograph

their pumpkin, and follow the instructions on the form to enter the Hershey's contest. Entry forms (trifold pamphlet) for the national contest will be available at participating Post Offices.

Participating postmasters will be eligible for prizes as well. (See Contest Information, Postmaster Eligibility, on page 9 for prize details.)

Contest Information

The Hershey's National Contest

Hershey's contest began on August 1, 2005, and ends on November 30, 2005 (all entries must be postmarked by November 30 and received by December 7).

Participants may use any materials (yarn, pipe cleaners, hay, etc.) to decorate their pumpkins, but if candy products are used, they must be made by Hershey Foods Corporation.

The photo submitted must not contain any identifiable person other than the person who decorated the pumpkin.

All entries submitted by children under the age of 18 (or under 19 in Alabama and Nebraska) must contain the parent or guardian's signature.

The contest is open to legal residents of all 50 states, with the exception of New Jersey, North Dakota, Tennessee, Vermont, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia, where these types of events are prohibited by law.

All entries become the property of Hershey's and will not be returned.

Judging will take place on or about December 21, 2005. The entries will be sorted into four categories for judging: ages 6–12, ages 13–17, ages 18 and over, and professional (defined as anyone 18 or over who is employed or has been employed within the past 5 years as a food artist or anyone who has entered and won a food design contest).

All entries will be judged on the following criteria: creative use of the product; relevance to Halloween theme; and originality.

Ten \$10,000 prizes will be awarded. Three grand prize winners will be chosen from each of the three age group categories for a total of nine prizes and one grand prize winner from the professional category. Checks will be awarded to the parent or guardian of all minors who are chosen winners.

The Postal Service Local Contest

The Postal Service contest runs for just 1 day — Saturday, October 22, 2005, after normal business hours — and is only for children 6–12 years old.

Because the Postal Service contest will be held as a local postal marketing initiative, residents of all 50 states are

eligible to participate. However, events taking place in New Jersey, North Dakota, Tennessee, Vermont, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia are subject to sweepstakes laws. Thus, residents of these states cannot enter into the Hershey's national contest.

Just like the Hershey's national contest, other materials may be used to decorate the pumpkins (such as yarn, pipe cleaners, hay, etc.) but the candy products used must be made by Hershey Foods Corporation.

Judging will take place onsite by the postmaster and/or designee using the same criteria as Hershey's national contest: creative use of the product; relevance to Halloween theme; and originality.

Local Postal Service Winners

There will be two winners for each local Postal Service event. One winner and one runner up each will receive an adorable Hershey's stuffed bear — a large "hugs" bear and a small "kiss" bear will be shipped to each participating Post Office.

Note: The winner's parent or guardian must completely fill out and sign the contest entry form. Postmasters must retain the form until the NetPost Premium Postcard returns (see page 10) — the signed form *must* be included with the Premium Postcard when submitting the winner's entry to the Hershey's national contest.

Postal Service Grand Prize Winner

The grand prize winner will be selected from the local entries mailed into Headquarters and will receive a digital camera. A Headquarters representative will select the winner on or about December 21, 2005.

Postmaster Eligibility

There will be a postmaster contest, as well. Postmasters will be judged on how many customers in their respective area use the NetPost Premium Postcards service from October 23 through December 31. The postmaster with the most revenue for NetPost Premium Postcards from October 23 through December 31 will receive credits for three hundred 4 1/4" x 6" NetPost Premium Postcards. Second place will receive 150 credits, and third place, 50 credits.

Frequently Asked Questions

1) **Q. Why is the Postal Service joining with Hershey's?**

A. The United States Postal Service® and Hershey's are two of America's oldest and most respected brands. It makes sense for these traditional and family-oriented companies to coordinate efforts to reach out into the community. This initiative combines the trusted familiarity of both the Postal Service and Hershey's in an atmosphere of family fun, while reinforcing the value of both brands.

2) **Q. What is the purpose of having a pumpkin decorating contest?**

A. Hosting a pumpkin decorating contest in retail lobbies or other Postal Service–sponsored locations is simply a fun, creative way to bring customers to us so we have an opportunity to let them know about our suite of quick, easy, and convenient online services.

3) **Q. What do we get out of this event?**

A. The Postal Service is a respected member of local communities around the country. Programs such as this increase community goodwill and can be used to build customer awareness and use of new and traditional Postal Service programs, products, and services.

4) **Q. Why can't certain states participate in the national contest?**

A. New Jersey, North Dakota, Tennessee, Vermont, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia cannot participate in the national contest because those locations prohibit sweepstakes of all kinds.

How to Use NetPost Premium Postcards to Enter Local Winners Into Hershey's National Contest and Into the Running for Headquarters Grand Prize

6. Confirm your registration by clicking *continue*, then click on *trusted business partner* link. You are now on the Premium Postcard site.
7. Scroll down to the "Upload Your Own Image" box and click on *Browse*.
8. Locate the digital image of the winning pumpkin on your computer — it will be a JPG image (e.g., winner.jpg or 22151.jpg).
9. Confirm this is the winning entry and the correct image and click *Next*.
10. Leave the message text box blank and click *Next*.
11. Click on *Add an Address* and enter your Post Office's address. Click on *Continue and Add Another* and enter your Area Office address. Click *Continue and Add Another* and enter the Headquarters address (see below). Click *Continue*.

12. Check the box next to each of these addresses in your address book.
13. Review your postcard (you should have three recipients) and then click *Send*.
14. Click *Repeat this card* if you would like to send more cards to your office. Follow steps 9, 10, 12, and 13. You can repeat step 14 if you want even more cards.

How To Create “Frankie”



1. Sponge green paint onto the pumpkin and let dry.
2. For the eyes, use felt for the white portion and Cotton Candy Bubble Yum for the blue. Roll two pieces of gum into balls and then flatten into ovals. Glue the whites of the eyes to the pumpkin and let dry. Squish the Bubble Yum onto the felt. The brown on the eye is a Whopper — a Reese's Pieces will work better.
3. For the nose, use three pieces of Bubble Yum for the round part and one piece cut in half for the nostrils. Roll the nostril pieces into balls and glue into place.
4. For the lip, use a single piece of Bubble Yum. Then shape and apply a Twizzlers Pull-n-Peel for the smile line. Use a separate piece under the lip.
5. For the cheeks, use two strands of Twizzlers Pull-n-Peel rolled together and glued. The smile is a separate strand that connects the two on the open end.
6. The unibrow is a Kit Kat bar above the eyes.
7. For the hair, instead of the entire Twizzlers Pull-n-Peel as shown in the picture, it is recommended that you use individual strands to avoid them falling off.

Postal Service collection box; you can take them to your local Post Office, hand them to your delivery carrier, or schedule a pickup online.

There's no special equipment or supplies needed. All you need is an Internet connection, your home or office PC, and a laser or quality inkjet printer. Labels can be printed on 8 1/2" x 11" paper and glued or taped securely to the package. Self-adhesive labels can also be used and purchased online.

- International mail using Click-N-Ship postage-paid labels can be left for your mail carrier to pick up but cannot be deposited into a blue street mailbox.
- Packages being mailed using postage stamps and weighing 16 oz. and over can be left for your mail carrier to pick up but cannot be deposited into a blue street mailbox. (See www.usps.com/clicknship.)

What is Click-N-Ship service?

Click-N-Ship service is the Postal Service's quick, easy, and convenient online shipping service. Using Click-N-Ship service, you can create and pay for shipping labels for Express Mail, Priority Mail, Global Express Mail, and Global Express Guaranteed items with postage using your credit card, personal computer, and printer — or without postage for no fee. Click-N-Ship service will calculate postage rates, find ZIP Codes, and standardize and save addresses and all shipping history information.

How do I know the weight of my Click-N-Ship items?

It is recommended you use a scale. Five- and ten-pound scales can now be purchased online at www.usps.com/shop. Please keep in mind that if the package weighs more than the weight you entered, it will require additional postage — either at the time of mailing or delivery. A convenient alternative to a scale is our Flat-Rate Priority Mail or Express Mail boxes and envelopes. For one low price, you can mail any amount of material, regardless of weight, that fits inside the flat-rate box and envelope. Boxes require \$7.70 in postage and envelopes require \$3.85 in postage.

For what destinations can I create Click-N-Ship labels?

You can create online Express Mail and Priority Mail labels for shipping to the 50 states, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico. Global Express Mail and Global Express Guaranteed labels are available for up to 200 countries and territories.

Why was my address changed from what I entered?

Addresses are compared to the U.S. Postal Service® current address database and then standardized. Standardized addresses help us process and deliver your mail more

efficiently. This database is very accurate and is updated regularly to include new delivery addresses.

Why isn't there an additional fee for Delivery Confirmation when I print a Priority Mail online label?

When you print an online label, an electronic record of your transaction is sent to the Postal Service. This meets the requirements for electronic rate Delivery Confirmation™ service; no additional fees are required when used with Priority Mail service.

Can I print an online shipping label for First-Class Mail, Parcel Post, Media Mail, Bound Printed Matter, or Library Mail using Click-N-Ship?

Click-N-Ship service offers only Priority Mail and Express Mail domestic services. We recommend you try a PC Postage service provider if you wish to print labels for all services. These companies offer a wide array of additional features and can be located at www.usps.com/postagesolutions/pc_post.htm.

Can I purchase Insurance online?

Yes. You can insure your package up to \$200.

Can I return merchandise using Click-N-Ship labels?

Yes, returning merchandise is easy. Simply complete the address information for the return, choose your service option, and print a label with or without postage. You can hand your Priority Mail and Express Mail packages with postage paid online to your letter carrier, drop in a collection box, or take to one of our convenient retail outlets.

What types of credit cards can I use on Click-N-Ship service?

The Postal Service accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover cards.

Can I place packages with online labels and postage in the blue Postal Service street mailboxes?

Yes, but only if the following apply: the package has a domestic Express Mail or Priority Mail label complete with PC Postage, a return address was paid for with a credit card, and it fits in the blue street mailbox opening. Larger packages may be dropped at your local Post Office, handed to your letter carrier, or picked up after you schedule a pickup online.

Do I need to use Postal Service boxes and packaging to mail my item?

No. However, it is recommended that you use Postal Service boxes and other packaging and stickers when using Click-N-Ship labels so that your package is clearly marked regarding the type of service purchased. You can order free Express Mail, Priority Mail, Global Express

Guaranteed, and Global Express Mail shipping supplies on www.usps.com.

What size package can I mail with Click-N-Ship service?

Click-N-Ship packages may measure up to 108 inches in length and width and weigh a maximum of 70 pounds.

If I'm mailing several items to the same person, why can't I make photocopies of the same label?

Each label has a unique barcode and number assigned to it. If you use photocopied labels with identical numbers, you will not get valid delivery information. Labels are monitored for possible duplication. Intentional use of duplicate labels constitutes fraud.

How should I attach the labels to the package?

Labels must be placed on the address side of the package and not folded over package edges. Use clear shipping tape to securely affix labels on all four sides and to cover address areas. Do not tape over the "Postal Use" area on the Express Mail label, over on the barcodes, or over the stamps.

Why can't I tape over the barcode?

Barcodes with tape over them cannot be scanned by our equipment.

Internet Change-of-Address Service

Internet change-of-address service is a prime example of how the quick, easy, and convenient Postal Service is saving customers time and energy. In the United States, approximately 17 percent of the population moves every year — this equates to the Postal Service receiving in excess of 44 million address change requests annually. Instead of coming to the Post Office, customers can skip the trip and submit change-of-address information securely online, without having to submit a printed form to their local Post Office. (See <https://moversguide.usps.com>.)

Is there a charge to change my address online?

Yes, \$1.00. When you enter your credit card number and billing address, we electronically verify that information with the bank that issued your credit card. The \$1.00 processing fee pays for this verification service, which helps us verify your address and provide a secure online transaction.

If you prefer not to pay the \$1.00 processing fee, you will be offered the option to print and mail a change-of-address order.

How long will it take before I get mail at my new address?

After you have notified the Postal Service of your change of address, it could take several days for mail to begin arriving at your new address. There are several factors to be considered such as:

- What date did you request to have your mail forwarded?
- How far did you move?
- How far in advance did you notify the Postal Service of your move?

How does the Postal Service Internet change-of-address confirmation process work?

After you enter your change-of-address and credit card information, you will be asked to enter a series of letters to confirm your change-of-address request. This process is used to prevent fraudulent use of your address information. The letters are case-sensitive, so please enter them exactly as they appear on the screen.

Once your credit card information has been successfully validated, you will be e-mailed a confirmation notice. Please follow the instructions in the confirmation notice, which will direct you to a specific Web page. Once on the Web page, type the Security ID Code in the designated field, exactly as it was given to you. If it is not entered correctly, your change-of-address request will not be submitted.

It is important to note that, for security purposes, you must enter your Security ID Code within the time specified in the confirmation notice e-mail. Otherwise, your change-of-address request will be deleted and you will have to re-enter it.

A reminder e-mail will be sent to you before your change-of-address request is deleted.

Why do you need my credit card information?

When you enter your credit card number and billing address, we electronically verify that information with the bank that issued your credit card. The processing fee pays for this verification service, which helps us verify your address to provide a secure online transaction.

Will I still receive confirmation of my address change in the mail?

Yes, you will receive all of the official documentation as if you went in person to change your address at the Post Office. The Postal Service will promptly mail you a Move Validation Letter (MVL) to the address you are leaving. For

your privacy, it will not mention your new mail forwarding address.

You will also receive a Confirmation Notification Letter (CNL) or a Welcome Kit in the mail 7–10 days after your online change. Please retain this Official Change of Address Confirmation page for your records as local agencies and/or resources may require it for proof of your move.

Can I purchase insurance online?

Yes, indemnity coverage is available online for up to \$200 for lost, rifled, or damaged articles.

What classes of mail are insurable online?

Depending on the online postage solution (Click-N-Ship or eBay), insurance is available with Express Mail, Priority Mail, Parcel Post, Media Mail, and First-Class Mail parcels. Express Mail service provides insurance up to \$100 at no additional cost.

Are the online fees the same as at a Post Office?

Yes, insurance purchased online costs the same and the fees are based on the amount of coverage needed up to \$200.

What if I need to purchase insurance for more than \$200?

Visit any Post Office. Insurance can be purchased for up to \$5,000. Insurance purchased online cannot be combined with insurance purchased at a Post Office.

Is everything insurable?

No, coverage is not provided for consequential losses, delay, concealed damage, spoilage of perishable items, articles improperly packaged, articles too fragile to withstand normal handling in the mail, or prohibited articles. These policies can be found at www.usps.com/insuranceclaims. For additional information, please see *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®).

How and where do I file a claim?

A claim may be filed in one of the following ways:

- Visit the How to File Insurance Claims page on usps.com at www.usps.com/insuranceclaims for instructions on how to file a claim for insurance purchased online.
- Download and complete PS Form 1000, *Domestic Claim or Registered Mail Inquiry*.
- Take a completed PS Form 1000, proof of insurance (i.e., online label record or shipping history printout), and evidence of value (i.e., sales receipt or invoice) to any Post Office for processing.

Is requesting a carrier pickup available for items insured online?

Yes, this is available with Priority Mail and Express Mail service. After purchasing an online label with insurance, please visit www.usps.com/carrierpickup to request a pickup for your item(s). Just prepare your package before your carrier arrives — including postage. Your carrier will pick it up the next Postal Service delivery day.

Postal Locator

The Postal Service Web site offers a “find post office” search option that lists Post Offices in close proximity to the address entered. Now, there is the added search option of “buy stamps” that lists the nearest retail locations that sell stamps. Once the list appears, click on one of the options and a map appears with directions to that location. The list includes the local Post Offices as well as retail outlets such as grocery stores and ATMs.

The Postal Service provides alternative access for our customers to purchase stamps at more than 27,500 vending machines; nearly 25,000 commercial retail outlets such as supermarkets, convenience, drug and gift stores; nearly 19,000 banking and credit union automated teller machines; and 2,500 automated postal centers located across the country. (See www.usps.com/locator.)

Postal Store

From the convenience of your home or office, simply go online to buy stamps and shop for licensed U.S. Postal Service merchandise at the Postal Store.

At the Postal Store you can search for stamps by rate, subject, or format; stock up on holiday stamps and other stamp collections; and also sign up for a stamp subscription such as Fast Stamps Plus and have stamps delivered to you automatically at periodic intervals. You can also eliminate a step when mailing Priority Mail items by purchasing Prepaid Priority Mail Flat-Rate envelopes, which are now available in convenient packs of 5 and 10. Prepaid Priority Mail Flat-Rate envelopes 16 oz. and over cannot be deposited into blue collection boxes. These envelopes can be picked up by carriers.

All Offices Must Use November 1999 Version of PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt

The November 1999 version of PS Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, is required to be stocked by all offices in order to secure optimum optical scanning recognition of the form. The November 1999 version of PS Form 3849 includes the placement of the text "USPS" on the bar-coded side of the form, below the delivery section.

All offices should examine the PS Form 3849 in their inventory and recycle any versions with a date prior to November 1999.

Offices can secure copies of PS Form 3849 preprinted with their address through the eBay Web site:

- Click *Create a New On Catalog Requisition*.
- Click *Add Item*.
- Click *Browse Catalogs*.

- Two items appear; one for blank forms and one for overprinted forms. Choose "FORM, DELIVERY NOTICE/REMINDER/RECEIPT, **OVERPRINTED**" if you want your address information printed on the PS Form 3849.
- Enter the quantity amount, then click *Add To*.
- For overprinted forms, enter your address, phone number, hours, etc., on each line exactly as the entries should be printed. Make any necessary changes and click *OK*.
- From here complete your requisition as usual. (Return to View Summary, add justification, verify shipping address and approval process, and submit).

ELM REVISION

Clarification of Law Enforcement Allowance for State or Jurisdiction Duty

Effective August 18, 2005, *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 517.43, Law Enforcement Allowance, is revised to clarify the circumstances under which eligible employees are granted additional paid military leave over and above the general allowance to perform military aid to enforce the law in their state or jurisdiction. No new policy is intended, but the language is reorganized and modified to clarify what activities do and do not qualify the employee for this additional allowance.

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the ELM and also into the online update, available on the Postal Service™ PolicyNet Web site:

517.4 Military Leave Allowances

517.43 Law Enforcement Allowance

517.431 State or Jurisdiction Duty

[Revise 517.431 to read as follows:]

Eligible full-time and part-time employees who are members of the National Guard are granted additional paid military leave over and above the general allowance if they are ordered by appropriate authority to provide *military aid to enforce the law* of their contracted state or their chartered jurisdiction (e.g., the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or a territory of the United States). See approval procedures in 517.3. The following provisions apply:

a. *Evaluation of Circumstances.*

- (1) *Qualifying Circumstances.* *Military aid* is the kind of work characteristic of, or typically performed by, soldiers. *Military aid to enforce the law* means engagement in the suppression of riots, violent assembly, widespread looting, and civil disorder where the guardsman is ordered to perform state military duty under a state law that specifically confers law enforcement powers on the guardsman or under the authority of an executive order of the governor (or the highest authority of the jurisdiction) pursuant to state law that specifically confers on the governor the authority to confer law enforcement powers on activated guardsmen. Orders to provide assistance or support to law enforcement agencies do not constitute an order conferring law enforcement powers. The mere fact that national guardsmen in uniform perform a given function does not necessarily transform that function into military aid. The duty performed must be evaluated. Such additional military leave is granted only when an employee's military orders (or other official documentation from the employee's guard unit) specify that he or she was engaged in one or more of the activities and under the authority

referenced above for the particular periods of military duty.

- (2) *Nonqualifying Circumstances.* Additional military leave is *not* granted when military orders do not specify one or more of the duties and statutory requirements referenced in 517.431a(1) above. For example, it is *not* granted when an employee's military orders simply indicate the employee was ordered to duty "for law enforcement purposes," "to enforce the law," "for state emergency active duty," etc. It is *not* granted if the duties are top secret and the actual duties cannot be verified as meeting these requirements. It is not granted if the military orders state that the duty is to provide aid to civil authorities to protect life, preserve property, or prevent injury. Circumstances that do not qualify the employee for additional military leave include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (a) Activities that, although prompted by emergencies, *do not involve directly enforcing the law*, such as when guardsmen are engaged in fighting fires, controlling floods, controlling routine crowds, cleaning up following natural disasters, eradicating controlled substances, providing transportation and/or services to persons engaged in law enforcement or other activities, or providing security for such missions.
- (b) Activities that, although they may have a collateral effect of enforcing the law, *do not involve military aid*, such as when guardsmen are engaged in directing vehicular traffic, which may concern enforcement of traffic laws, or when a guardsman provides security for public events, buildings, or places, these duties do not constitute military aid to enforce the law.
- (c) Activities whose principal purpose is to protect the United States and its territories from attack by foreign enemies or domestic agents aligned with foreign enemies.

b. *Amount Granted.* Law enforcement military leave is granted, upon the presentation of qualifying military orders, as follows:

- (1) *Full-time employee* — 22 workdays (176 work-hours) each fiscal year.
- (2) *Part-time employee* — 1 hour of military leave for each 13 hours of service performed as a part-time employee in the fiscal year preceding the

request provided both of the following conditions apply:

- (a) The employee has worked at least 1,040 hours during the preceding fiscal year.

- (b) Additional leave granted under this section does not exceed 160 workhours in a fiscal year.

REMINDER

Noncash Awards

Noncash awards valued at \$50, as well as those valued at less than \$50, need not be entered in eAwards. Such awards are considered *de minimus*, which means that their value does not equal the minimum amount arbitrarily set by the Postal Service™ for property or service so small that accounting for it would be unreasonable or impractical as outlined in the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) section 132(e).

Noncash items valued at \$51 or more, however, must be reported in eAwards.

REMINDER

Procedures for Transfers and Withdrawals From Customer Trust Accounts

We are providing the following reminders to assist all Post Offices™, retail units, and *PostalOne!* sites in the proper procedures for disbursing funds from a customer trust account:

- Transfers — movement of funds from one trust account to another.
- Withdrawals — disbursements made to customers from their permit trust accounts.

Transfers of Funds

If both trust accounts are maintained at the same unit:

- Regardless of the amount, local units process transfers between trust accounts when both accounts are maintained at the same unit.
- Units do not make any entries on PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*.
- The employee responsible for maintaining customer trust accounts must enter the transfer in the *PostalOne!* system or record the transfer on the customer's PS Form 25, *Trust Fund Account*.

If the trust accounts are not maintained at the same unit:

- Units submit the completed PS Form 3533, *Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage, Fees, and*

Services, along with supporting documentation to validate an entry to AIC 280, Disbursement Sent to ASC, to the Scanning and Imaging Center for processing.

- Regardless of the amount, the San Mateo Accounting Service Center (ASC) processes transfers between trust accounts when the trust accounts are not maintained at the same unit.

Withdrawals

- Units submit the completed PS Form 3533 along with the supporting documentation to validate an entry to AIC 280 to the Scanning and Imaging Center for processing.
- Regardless of the amount, the San Mateo ASC disburses withdrawals from trust accounts. Local offices are not authorized to disburse withdrawals.

Information Technology

Departing Personnel

Security policy requires all managers to ensure that access to information resources is immediately revoked when no longer required due to a change in personnel job responsibilities, transfer, routine separation, or adverse termination. The applicable portion of Handbook AS-805, *Information Security*, outlining this requirement is reprinted below for your convenience.

6.7 Departing Personnel

6-7.1 Routine Separation

Routine separation of personnel occurs when an individual receives reassignment or promotion, resigns, retires, or otherwise departs under honorable and friendly conditions. Unless adverse circumstances are known or suspected,

the individual will be permitted to complete his or her assigned duties and follow official employee departure procedures. When personnel leave under nonadverse circumstances, the individual’s manager, supervisor, or contracting officer must ensure the following:

- a. All accountable items, including keys, access cards, laptop computers, and other computer-related equipment are returned.
- b. The individual’s computer logon ID and building access authorizations are terminated coincident with the employee’s or contractor’s effective date of departure, unless needed in the new assignment.
- c. All sensitive information, in any format, in the custody of the terminating individual is returned, destroyed, or transferred to the custody of another individual.

6-7.2 Adverse Termination

Removal or dismissal of personnel under involuntary or adverse conditions includes termination for cause, involuntary transfer, and departure with pending grievances. In addition

to the routine separation procedures, termination under adverse conditions requires extra precautions to protect Postal Service information resources and property. The manager, supervisor, or contracting officer of an individual being terminated under adverse circumstances must:

- a. Ensure that the individual is escorted and supervised at all times while in any location that provides access to Postal Service information resources.
- b. Immediately suspend and take steps to terminate the individual's computer logon ID(s), access to Postal Service information systems, and building access authorizations.
- c. Ensure prompt changing of all computer passwords, access codes, badge reader programming, and physical locks used by the individual being dismissed.

- d. Ensure the return of accountable items and correct disposition of "RESTRICTED INFORMATION" as described under routine separation (see 6-7.1).
- e. Notify the Inspection Service.

* * * * *

Managers must also periodically review access authorizations granted to personnel under their supervision to be sure that the access is still required for personnel to perform their duties. (See Handbook AS-805, 9-4.2.5.)

DVD Equipment Deployment and General Information

Information Technology has deployed over 17,000 DVD recorders and players to all field and Headquarters offices with a business need for this equipment. The DVD technology and equipment will enable creating training and informational DVDs, duplicating them (within copyright limits), and viewing content on every ACE desktop. DVDs also take up less storage space and are easier and less costly to distribute by mail.

No More VHS Format. Information Technology has been working with Employee Development and other training content owners to insure that all training videos and courses are now provided on DVD format, versus the previous VHS tape format. Effective immediately, no further training videos or courses in VHS format should be sent to the field or any Headquarters facility.

Excessing Nonstandard Equipment. Included in this project is the removal of all VHS/VCR (non-integral to TVs) and non-standard DVD systems from these offices, once the new DVD systems are installed. Such equipment is to be shipped to the Material Distribution Center, Topeka, Kansas, using the PS Form 969, *Material Recycling and Disposal*, process.

Registering New Equipment. Once you've installed your new equipment, be sure to register online at <http://IT-DVD-Registration>. Registering your equipment is an important step that further protects the Postal Service™ and starts the enforcement of covered warranty service.

Standards for Creating DVDs. The standards for commercially prepared 'pressed' DVDs are DVD5 or DVD9 for-

mats. These are industry standards and have been in use for some time. For DVDs created internally, the standard is DVD+R (for write once-read many) or DVD+RW (for read and write many times). The DVD+RW format is most like your experience recording and/or re-recording of VHS tapes. Internal Postal Service creators of DVDs should use DVD+RW formatted discs to make 'master recordings' for further duplication needs. DVDs that are intended to be played repeatedly, or disseminated to other locations to be played on DVD players or ACE workstations/laptops, are to be recorded only on DVD+R formatted discs. This will insure playability with the largest set of devices, and provide protection from erasing or recording over the recorded content. To further insure consistent best quality results, internal Postal Service creators are directed to use only the Verbatim DVD+R and +RW formatted discs, available from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) in Topeka, Kansas.

Ordering Supplies. Order supplies for DVD equipment from the MDC using Touch Tone Order Entry (TTOE): Call 800-332-0317, option 2. *Note:* You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

For answers to questions or concerns, contact Materials Customer Service at 800-332-0317, option 1, 1, then 4.

- Register before using TTOE for the first time.

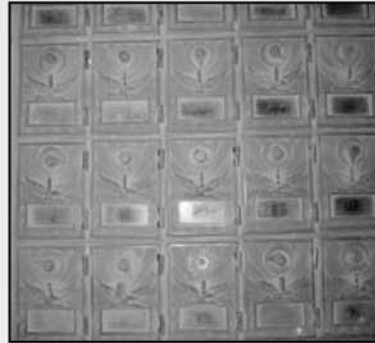

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Let's Dance/Bailamos Stamps

The Postal Service™ will issue 37-cent, *Let's Dance/Bailamos* commemorative stamps in four designs, on September 17, 2005, in Miami, Florida, and New York, New York. The stamps designed by Ethel Kessler of Bethesda, Maryland, go on sale nationwide on September 18, 2005.

With the issuance of these stamps, the U.S. Postal Service® honors the contributions of Latino art to American culture featuring images that showcase one of four popular dances on each stamp.

Four Latino artists present their personal interpretations of the dances.

- For the Merengue stamp, Rafael Lopez uses a warm palette of colors, from red and orange to yellow and lime green, all suggesting the tropical sunlight and vegetation of the Caribbean islands.
- Capturing motion in the billowing skirts of a salsa dancer, José Ortega uses palm leaves to refer to salsa's tropical roots in the Caribbean, and a cityscape to suggest its New York City birthplace.

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- In creating his design for the Cha-Cha-Cha stamp, Edel Rodriguez effectively juxtaposes the warmth of the dancers' suntanned skin and the sinuous line formed by their bodies with the coolness suggested by their white clothing and waving palm fronds.
- Sergio Baradat evokes elegance in his design for the Mambo stamp. Here, the red of a woman's dress offsets the nighttime purple and gold hues of the ambient light, while a drum-shaped moon seems to join the orchestra's saxophone and timbales.

Designer Ethel Kessler borrowed the dance-school convention of step patterns for the margins of the stamps. All descriptive texts and headers are in English and Spanish.

The *Let's Dance/Balemos* stamps will be issued in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 (Item 457700) and a booklet of 20 stamped cards (Item 980800).
