NALC names national hero of the year

A Maine letter carrier who used his Navy life-saving skills to prevent a motorcyclist from bleeding to death after an accident is the 2005 National Hero of the Year, named by the 305,000-member National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC).

NALC Branch 92 member David Heald of Kennebunk, ME, re-

ceived a special NALC award.

Heald was driving home Sept. 1, 2004, when he came upon a car-motorcycle accident. The motorcyclist's leg had been severed 3 inches below the hip. Using life-saving skills he learned in the Navy, Heald covered the injury and applied a tourniquet to stop the bleeding. Police at the scene said the motorcyclist would have died before paramedics arrived if Heald had not made the tourniquet and used it correctly.

Letter Carrier Mike Miller rescues stranded neighbors

Kenner, LA, Letter Carrier Mike Miller named his houseboat Coton Haut, French for "High Cotton." A fitting name, given that after riding out Hurricane Katrina in the boat for a day and a half, he found himself tied up to the same pier — only 25 feet higher. When Miller

emerged from below deck after the storm, he saw total destruction everywhere. Boats were capsized, including the one moored next to him, which came to rest up against the Coton Haut.

What followed was a 4-day nonstop rescue mission.

Miller estimates he made 10–12 trips a day for 4 days, loaded with as many as 15 people per trip in a 17-foot boat he borrowed. He and his friend took them from rooftops to higher ground, often to a highway, since portions of I-10 became a boat ramp for them. They only stopped when official rescue personnel arrived and told them they could discontinue their efforts.

"All I was thinking about was 'these poor, old people," Miller said. "The thing was they probably couldn't leave because they had no way, or the means, to leave. I just wish I could have helped more people."

Three generations weather Katrina on roof

With Hurricane Katrina on the way, Bay St. Louis, MS, Letter Carrier Micki Clifton, her 16-year-old daughter and 72-year-old mother evacuated to her brother's home on higher ground — but it wasn't high enough to avoid the storm's surge. Realizing they were at risk inside,

they climbed on top of her brother's truck outside, then to the roof of the house.

All three clung to the chimney for more than 2 hours — and Clifton and her mom are not swimmers. "I remember hanging on to the chimney, hoping and praying it would stop rising," Clifton said. And, eventually it did.

With 50 percent of her route severely damaged, Clifton is encouraged to see the city clean up little by little each day. When customers are surprised to see her, she is proud to say, "We're up and moving again."

271.341 Security Reviews

[Revise text to read as follows:]

The SCO or designee conducts annual facility reviews using the security survey within the Facility Security Database. Upon completing the security survey, input the results into the database. Keep a copy of the survey for 2 years.

273.1 Protection and Access

[Revise the title of 273.12 to read as follows:]

273.12 Workroom and Restricted Area Access

273.121 Limitations

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Access to all workroom and restricted areas is limited to authorized on-duty Postal Service employees and authorized contractors. All other individuals are restricted unless they have legitimate business on the floor and are properly escorted.

273.122 Door Locks

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Installation heads are required to carefully evaluate the work-flow cycles of their units to determine when the work-room doors should be locked. Normally, the doors should be locked at all times, however, exceptions may be granted during heavy traffic periods when employees are reporting to or departing from work. To avoid keeping the doors unlocked during heavy traffic periods, consider upgrading the locking mechanism to a simple, single access control system (electromechanical system) or to electronic card access control.

273.123 Compliance

[Revise text to read as follows:]

All employees must comply with the policy governing access to workroom and restricted areas. Supervisory personnel must ensure compliance with the policy in order to afford maximum protection of Postal Service employees, funds, and property. Provide access to emergency exits in accordance with the NFPA 101 Life Safety Code.

[Revise text to read as follows:]

When entry is controlled by a card access system, employees must always use their card access device to gain entry. Employees must not allow tailgating or piggybacking into the controlled area. See Handbooks AS-503 and RE-5 for details of an access control system design.

273.46 Key Accountability

[Revise title and text of 273.461 to read as follows:]

273.461 Key and Access Control Device Accountability

Postmasters must keep an accurate inventory (including serial number and brand name lock, total number of keys available, location of lock by door and/or room number, how and when disposed of) of all building keys and signed receipts for all assigned keys. When keys are assigned, personnel receiving the keys must sign a copy of PS Form 1628, *Individual Key Record*. If the facility has a card access control system, postmasters must maintain an accurate inventory of assigned access control devices.

Labeling List Changes

FASTforward

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Mailers may use $FAST forward^{\circledcirc}$ Multiline Optical Character Reader (MLOCR) to comply with the Move Update

requirement. FASTforward MLOCR allows users (mailers) to comply with the Move Update requirement as they process mail, provided that the mail is automation-compatible. Licensed FASTforward MLOCR users must obtain an approved interface from their MLOCR vendors. As mail is run through the MLOCR, the system automatically checks names and addresses against a national Postal Service database that is encrypted, contains updates from the previous 13 months, and contains only permanent COA records. If a COA is applicable, the correct address and barcode are imprinted on the mailpiece.

The new address information is obtained through a matching process. A name and address contained in the mailing list is compared to the national Postal Service encrypted database of permanent COA records. Address change information is provided only for records from the previous 13 months that have a matching name and an old address. When new address information is returned, the effective date of the move and the carrier information for the new address are also returned. Mailers must use the returned information to update their mailing lists.

Effective October 1, 2005, *FASTforward* Mailing List Correction (MLC) was no longer an option for fulfilling the Move Update requirement.



Handbook EL-312, Employment and Placement



[Revise the text of 232.3h to read as follows:]

h. Honorable conditions discharge — a separation from active duty in the Armed Forces where the character of service is honorable, under honorable conditions, or general. Though an under honorable conditions or general discharge is acceptable for veterans' preference or Veterans Recruitment Appointment, it indicates that there was a derogatory reason for the discharge that requires investigation during suitability screening (see 514.2). Discharges that are other than honorable, undesirable, bad conduct, and dishonorable do not meet the honorable conditions discharge requirement.

483 Kinds of Veterans' Preference

483.1 5-Point Preference

[Revise the introductory text of 483.1 to read as follows:]

For 5-point preference purposes, an individual must have served on active duty, been separated under honorable conditions (see 232.3h) from active duty in the Armed Forces, and served in one of the following:

* * * * *

483.2 10-Point Preference

483.21 Disabled Veterans

[Revise the text of 483.21 to read as follows:]

A veteran who has been separated from active duty in the Armed Forces with an honorable conditions discharge (see 232.3h) at any time is eligible for 10-point preference, provided the veteran meets the criteria in one of the following categories:

- a. Compensable disability preference (CP) Has a compensable service-connected disability that is at least 10 percent but less than 30 percent.
- b. Compensable 30 percent preference (CPS) Has a compensable service-connected disability that is 30 percent or more.
- c. Disability preference (XP) (1) received a Purple Heart, or (2) has a current service-connected disability or is receiving compensation, disability retirement benefits, or pension from the military or the Department of Veterans Affairs, but does not qualify as a CP or CPS.

483.22 Spouses of Disabled Veterans

[Revise the text and heading of 483.22 to read as follows:]

483.22 10-Point Derived Preference (XP)

Spouses, widows, widowers, or mothers of veterans are eligible for 10 points as described in 483.221, 483.222, and 483.223. This type of preference is *derived preference* because it is based on service of a veteran who is not able to use the preference through unemployment or death.

[Add new 483.221 to read as follows:]

483.221 Spouses of Disabled Veterans

The spouse of an Armed Forces' veteran on whose service a claim is based, is eligible for 10-point veterans' preference provided both of the following criteria are met:

- The veteran was separated under honorable conditions from active duty performed at any time.
- b. The veteran has a service-connected disability and is disqualified for a federal position along the general lines of his or her usual occupation. Such a disqualification may be presumed when the veteran is unemployed and (1) rated by appropriate military or Department of Veterans Affairs authorities to be 100 percent disabled or unemployable, or (2) has retired, been separated, or resigned from a civil service position on the basis of a disability that is service-connected in origin, or (3) has attempted to obtain a civil service position or other position along the lines of his or her usual occupation and has failed to qualify because of a service-connected disability.

[Add new 483.222 to read as follows:]

483,222 Widows or Widowers of Veterans

The widow or widower of a veteran who received an honorable conditions discharge and who was not divorced from the veteran and has not remarried is eligible for 10-point veterans' preference provided one of the following criteria are met.

- a. The veteran served during a war or during the period April 28, 1952, through July 1, 1955, or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign medal has been authorized.
- b. The veteran died while on active duty that included service described immediately above, under conditions that would not have been the basis for other than an honorable or general discharge.

If the widow or widower remarries and the remarriage is annulled, the former widow or widower may apply for restoration of preference. Evidence of divorce of the widow or widower is not a basis to restore widow or widower preference, since the act of remarriage, rather than a remarried state, terminates eligibility for preference. Thus, widow or widower preference can only be restored if the act of marriage is annulled.

[Add new 483.223 to read as follows:]

483.223 Mothers of Veterans

Mothers of veterans are eligible for 10-point preference under the conditions described below.

- a. Mother of a Deceased Veteran. The mother of a veteran who died under honorable conditions while on active duty during a war or during the period April 28, 1952, through July 1, 1955, or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign medal has been authorized; and
 - She is or was married to the father of the veteran; and
 - She lives with her totally and permanently disabled husband (either the veteran's father or her husband through remarriage); or
 - 3. She is widowed, divorced, or separated from the veteran's father and has not remarried; or
 - She remarried but is widowed, divorced, or legally separated from her husband when she claims preference.
- b. Mother of a Disabled Veteran. The mother of a living disabled veteran if the veteran was separated with an honorable or general discharge from active duty performed at any time and is permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected injury or illness, the mother is or was married to the father of the veteran, and meets one of the following criteria:
 - 1. Lives with her totally and permanently disabled husband (either the veteran's father or her husband through remarriage).
 - 2. Is widowed, divorced, or separated from the veteran's father and has not remarried.
 - 3. Has remarried, but is widowed, divorced, or legally separated from her husband when she claims preference.

484 Proof of Preference Claimed

[Revise the text of 484 to read as follows:]

The applicant is responsible for providing the necessary proof. Veterans claiming 5-point preference must provide proof of required service and an honorable conditions discharge (see 232.3h) when their scores are reached for employment consideration. See 485 for adjudicating 5-point preference. Eligibles claiming 10-point preference provide proof by completing an SF 15, *Application for 10-Point Veteran Preference*, and attaching the documents described on the SF 15 when they come within reach for

consideration. See 486 for adjudicating claims for 10-point veterans' preference.

485 Adjudicating Claims for 5-Point Preference

[Revise the text of 485 to read as follows:]

The veteran must present a copy of the appropriate DD Form 214, *Certificate of Release or Discharge From Active Duty,* showing length and character of service. All applicants who have been separated from active duty in the Armed Forces should be able to produce a DD Form 214 to document the preference claimed. The original DD Form 214 that is presented for a claim must be returned to the veteran after adjudication. The adjudicator verifies entitlement for 5-point preference by reviewing the DD Form 214. The adjudicator determines whether the veteran meets the criteria in 483.1, and either approves or denies the claim for 5 points. Applicants claiming veterans' preference who are still on active duty will be granted 5-point preference if their applications show that they have the required military service, such as service in a war, campaign, or expedition.

When an expeditionary medal is required, a veteran's DD Form 214 showing the award of an Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal is acceptable proof. The DD Form 214 does not have to show the name of the theater or country of service for which that medal was awarded. However, the Armed Forces Service Medal is *not* qualifying for veterans' preference. (A complete list of campaigns and expeditions is provided in Exhibit 485, which comes from the *VetGuide* on the Web site of the Office of Personnel Management.)

486 Adjudicating Claims for 10-Point Preference

486.1 Nature of Discharge

[Revise the text of 486.1 to read as follows:]

Human resources must verify the veteran's honorable conditions discharge. A statement from the records of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs showing that the veteran was discharged under honorable conditions will meet this requirement. Alternatively, the honorable conditions discharge may be verified from the character of service block on the DD Form 214, *Certificate of Release or Discharge From Active Duty.* (See 232.3h for a description of honorable conditions discharges.)

486.2 Documentation

[Revise the text of 486.2 to read as follows:]

The adjudicator must have a fully completed SF 15, *Application for 10-Point Veteran Preference*, for any claim for 10-point preference. Applicants who claim 10-point preference must provide all of the documentation described on the SF 15 for the type of preference they are claiming.

[Add new 486.21 to read as follows:]

486.21 Disabled Veterans Preference

The adjudicator determines if the documentation described on the SF 15 and the completed SF 15 submitted by an applicant provide sufficient proof for one of the following categories:

- a. Compensable disability preference (CP) Has a compensable service-connected disability that is at least 10 percent but less than 30 percent.
- b. Compensable 30 percent preference (CPS) Has a compensable service-connected disability that is 30 percent or more.
- c. Disability preference (XP) (1) received a Purple Heart, or (2) has a current service-connected disability or is receiving compensation, disability retirement benefits, or pension from the military or the Department of Veterans Affairs but does not qualify as a CP or CPS.

[Add new 486.22 to read as follows:]

486.22 Spouse, Widow, or Mother Preference

Claims for spouse, widow, or mother preference are dependent on the current marital status of the claimant attested to on the SF 15. (A copy of the marriage license or certificate

must always be included with the SF 15.) Under the law, nonservice-connected disabilities cannot be considered in the allowance of spouse preference, even though the nonservice-connected disability is total or permanent.

[Add new 486.221 to read as follows:]

486.221 Claims for Spouse Preference

Headquarters issues instructions for adjudication of spouse preference and designates the organization that adjudicates the preference.

[Add new 486.222 to read as follows:]

486,222 Claims for Widow or Widower Preference

Human Resources is responsible for adjudicating preference claims for widows or widowers who meet the criteria listed in 483.222, Widows or Widowers of Veterans (XP – 10-Point Other), and have the proof described on SF 15, including a copy of the marriage license or certificate.

[Add new 486.223 to read as follows:]

486.223 Claims for Mother Preference

Headquarters issues instructions for adjudication of mother preference and designates the organization that adjudicates the preference.

[Revise the text of 614.2 by adding the following note at the end:]

Note: The maximum number of applicants to be requested and placed on a Hiring Worksheet is the number of applicants who can be processed for selection within 31 days. If more names are needed for a hiring event, then applicants are divided among multiple Hiring Worksheets. One Hiring Worksheet must be closed before another Hiring Worksheet is issued.

627.13 Reasons for Objection or Pass Over

The only acceptable reason for passing over an eligible who has veteran's preference and appointing an eligible without preference who is lower on the Hiring Worksheet is that there is evidence that indicates the preference eligible fails to meet suitability requirements (see 51, Employment Eligibility and Suitability, and 52, Determining Eligibility and Suitability).

[Revise the text of Exhibit 743.21 by changing the second "c," and continuing to the end of the exhibit, to read as follows:]

- c. Establish a list of eligible applicants in descending score order, observing veterans' preference as follows:
 - (1) Group 1, compensable disability Veterans with a compensable service-connected disability rating of 10 percent or more are placed in descending order of the final score, including 10 points for veterans' preference. Apply the Social Security number tie-breaking rule where numerical scores are the same. (See 414.4 c, Breaking Ties.)
 - (2) Group 2, all other eligibles All other applicants, including preference eligibles with 10-point veterans' preference (XP) and 5-point veterans' preference (TP) are placed on the list in descending score order, including veterans' preference points. Where preference-eligible applicants have the same score, applicants with an XP preference are placed ahead of applicants with a TP preference, who are placed ahead of non-preference eligible applicants with the same score. Apply the Social Security number tie-breaking rule where numerical scores are the same. (See 414.4 c, Breaking Ties.)

Make selections in accordance with the applicant's standing after meeting all other suitability criteria, and in compliance with 623, Selection From Three Highest Ranked Eligibles; 624, Applying the Rule of Three in Selection; 625, Selection Sequence; 626, Selection Decision; and 627, Objection to or Pass Over of Preference Eligible.

For EAS positions designated as Scientific and Professional (see 414.5), Groups 1 and 2 are combined. The order to use is described in 414.5.

344.5 Nonselection of a Veteran

[Revise the text of 344.5 to read as follows:]

A veterans' preference eligible may not be passed over to select a nonpreference eligible who is lower on the Hiring Worksheet, unless the selecting official objects to the veteran and the objection is sustained. See Handbook EL-312, 627, *Objection to or Pass Over of Preference Eligible,* for requirements for passing over a veteran.

363 Conversions

363.1 Definition

[Revise the text of 363.1 to read as follows:]

Conversion refers to the process of changing a noncareer employee's status to a career appointment in one personnel action. The selected noncareer employee should not be separated and then given a career appointment unless the employee's appointment expires before the employee can be converted to career status. If a postmaster relief/level replacement (PMR/LR) employee is being converted to career status, the PMR/LR must be separated before being given a career appointment.

[Revise the text and heading of 363.2 to read as follows:]

363.2 Competitive and Noncompetitive Authority

A conversion to career status based on a competitive authority occurs when a selection is made from a Hiring Worksheet and the Hiring Worksheet documents the selection. A conversion to career status based on a noncompetitive authority occurs when a selection is made due to noncompetitive eligibility such as reinstatement, transfer from another agency, or veterans recruitment appointment.

Documentation for Absences Due to FMLA Qualifying Conditions

- Clarify the types of documentation necessary for absences due to Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA)-qualifying conditions in all or in particular cases.
- Add a reference to Form WH-380, Certification of Health Care Provider, to document FMLA qualification of health conditions.
- Eliminate leave without pay (LWOP) from the section on employee incapacitation, which requires documentation only for paid leave, in accordance with Department of Labor (DOL) regulations.

515 Absence for Family Care or Illness of Employee

* * * *

515.5 Documentation

* * * * *

515.52 Particular Circumstances

[Revise 515.52 to read as follows:]

515.521 New Son or Daughter

An employee requesting FMLA-covered time off because of the birth of the employee's son or daughter and to care for the son or daughter, or because of the placement of a son or daughter with the employee for adoption or foster care, may be required to substantiate the relationship and provide the birth or placement date.

515.522 Care of Others for Medical Reasons

An employee requesting FMLA-covered time off because the employee is needed to care for a spouse, parent, son, or daughter who has a serious health condition may be required to:

- a. Substantiate the relationship.
- b. Provide documentation from the health care provider using either Form WH-380, Certification of Health Care Provider, or equivalent documentation stating the date the serious health condition began, probable duration of the illness, appropriate medical facts, nature of the need to care for, and when the employee will be needed to provide such care or psychological support.

Note: The medical certification provision that an employee is "needed to care for" a family member encompasses both physical and psychological care. It includes situations where, for example, because of a serious health condition, the family member is unable to care for his or her own basic medical, hygienic, or nutritional needs or safety, or is unable to transport him- or herself to the doctor, etc. The term also includes providing psychological comfort and reassurance that would be beneficial to a child, spouse, or parent with a serious health condition who is receiving inpatient or home care.

515.523 Employee Incapacitation

An employee requesting FMLA-covered time off because of his or her own incapacitation must satisfy the documentation requirements for sick leave in 513.31 through 513.38 in order to receive paid leave during the absence. If medical opinions are required in addition to initial documentation, they are administered as described in 515.53.

515.524 Return to Work After Employee Incapacitation

To return to work from an FMLA-covered absence because of his or her own incapacitation, an employee must provide certification from his or her health care provider that the employee is able to perform the essential functions of his or her positions with or without limitations. Limitations described are accommodated when practical. In addition, a bargaining unit employee must comply with collective bargaining agreements, which include Postal Service policies in 865 (summarized in section VI of Publication 71), 513.37, and other handbooks and manuals.

[Delete current 515.53 and replace with new 515.53 to read as follows:]

515.53 Additional Medical Opinions

A second medical opinion by a health care provider who is designated and paid for by the Postal Service may be required. A health care provider selected for the second opinion may not be employed by the Postal Service on a regular basis. In case of a difference between the original and second opinion, a third opinion by a health care provider may be required. The third health care provider is jointly designated or approved by management and the employee, and the third opinion is final. The Postal Service pays the health care provider for the third opinion. Recertifications of a medical condition, for which the employee bears the cost, may also be required. Such medical opinions are obtained off the clock.

ELM REVISION

Reassignment to Bargaining Unit Positions

Effective October 13, 2005, Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 414, Reassignment (formerly Reassignment to Nonbargaining Unit Positions), is revised and renumbered to add compensation policy for the voluntary reassignment of nonbargaining unit employees to bargaining unit positions.

Section 414.1 incorporates all of the information on reassignment to nonbargaining unit positions (formerly 414.1, 414.2, and 414.3), with minor title and reference changes. The new section 414.2 adds new policy describing how to determine the basic salary when an employee in the Executive and Administrative Schedule (EAS) voluntarily chooses reassignment to an equivalent grade in a bargaining unit pay schedule. There is no longer a section 414.3.

Summary of Changes

414, Reassignment (formerly Reassignment to Nonbargaining Unit Positions), is revised to add information concerning the voluntary reassignment of nonbargaining unit employees to bargaining unit positions.

Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM)

Pay Administration

410 Pay Administration Policy for Nonbargaining Unit Employees

* * * *

[Revise the title of 414 and renumber its sections as shown below:]

414 Reassignment

[Renumber 414.1 as 414.11 and add new 414.1 as follows:]

414.1 Reassignment to Nonbargaining Unit Positions

414.11 Definition

[Revise 414.11 to add the word Exhibit as follows:]

A reassignment to a nonbargaining unit position is the permanent change, with or without relocation, of an employee to an established EAS position from a position with the same or equivalent grade. (For changes between pay schedules, see Exhibit 418.1.)

[Renumber 414.2 as 414.12, 414.21 as 414.121, and 414.22 as 414.122 as follows:]

414.12 Rate Adjustment

414.121 Nonbargaining Unit Employees

[Revise the new 414.121 to correct the text as follows:]

An EAS employee's salary is not changed as a result of reassignment within the EAS schedule except when the employee is reassigned to an exempt EAS-15 through EAS-19 position that involves directly supervising two or more full-time equivalent bargaining unit employees. In this case, the salary must be no less than the supervisory differential adjustment (SDA) rate, as described in Exhibit 412.1b.

414.122 Bargaining Unit Employees

Bargaining unit employees reassigned to nonbargaining unit positions continue to receive their former basic salary provided that it is not below the minimum or above the maximum for the new position.

If the person is reassigned to an EAS-19 or below position and has served 52 weeks or more in the bargaining unit position since the last step, promotion, or other equivalent increase, the salary is advanced by 3 percent, provided all of the following conditions are met:

- a. An equivalent increase (one equal to the most prevalent step in the salary schedule for the former position) is not received at the time of the reassignment.
- b. The employee has satisfactory service.
- c. The new salary is below the new maximum.

[Renumber 414.3 as 414.13. Revise the title and item b to correct the reference as follows:]

414.13 A-E Postmasters

When an A-E postmaster is reassigned to another A-E Post Office with a different number of service hours, or when the service hour category of an A-E Post Office is changed pursuant to the Workload Service Credit System (WSCS), the postmaster's basic hourly rate remains the same as before, regardless of the number of service hours.

When an employee is reassigned to an A–E postmaster position from a position in a grade equivalent to the grade for A–E postmasters, the following applies:

- a. The employee is placed (1) at minimum of the hourly rate range for A–E postmasters or (2) at the discretion of the appointing official, up to the highest basic salary the employee has received that does not exceed the rate for the maximum of the hourly rate range for A–E postmasters.
- b. If previously full-time, the employee's former annual salary is divided by 2080 hours. The resultant hourly rate is used to place the employee in the hourly rate range for A–E postmasters as provided in 414.13a.

[Add new 414.2 as follows:]

414.2 Reassignment to Bargaining Unit Positions

414.21 Definition

A reassignment from a nonbargaining unit position to a bargaining unit position is the permanent change, with or without relocation, of a nonbargaining unit employee to an established bargaining unit position with an equivalent grade (see Exhibit 418.1).

414.22 Rate Adjustment

414.221 Former Bargaining Unit Service in an Equivalent Grade

If the employee has performed prior service in an equivalent bargaining unit grade, the step and next step date are determined as if service had been continuous in the equivalent bargaining unit grade.

Note: Reassignment to PS Schedule 2 must include service the employee would have had in PS Schedule 1 before conversion to PS Schedule 2.

414.222 No Former Bargaining Unit Service in an Equivalent Grade

If the employee has never performed prior service in an equivalent bargaining unit grade, the step is determined by moving the nonbargaining unit salary to the equivalent grade in the bargaining unit pay schedule. If the current salary falls between two steps, the higher step is assigned. To establish the next step date, creditable service is allowed since the last nonbargaining unit pay-for-performance increase or salary adjustment. The provisions contained in 422.124c(4) also apply.

Note: If the employee's nonbargaining salary exceeds the amount associated with the top step in the bargaining unit schedule, the employee is placed at the top step.

Health Benefits Open Season

The 2005 Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) open season is scheduled for November 14 through December 13, 2005. Many open season changes may be made via self-service on *PostalEASE*. During this open season, eligible employees may make any one, or a combination, of the following changes:

- Enroll if not enrolled.
- Change from one plan to another plan.
- Change from one option to another option.
- Change from Self Only to Self and Family.
- Change from Self and Family to Self Only.
- Cancel enrollment.
- Change from pre-tax to post-tax payment of health insurance premiums, or vice versa.

Enrollment changes and new enrollments made during the 2005 open season will be effective January 7, 2006 (Pay Period 02-06).

Distribution of Open Season Materials

Employees

Before the start of open season, the 2006 Guides to Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Plans for (1) career employees (RI 70-2); (2) Postal Inspection Service and Office of Inspector General (OIG) employees (RI 70-2IN); and (3) Certain Temporary (Noncareer) employees (RI 70-8PS) will be mailed from the national level to each employee's address of record. Each 2006 guide includes:

- An overview of FEHB program eligibility requirements and election choices during open season.
- A comparison of biweekly premium costs of participating plans.
- An explanation of the pre-tax payment feature, including a current listing of qualified life status changes.
- Enrollee survey results provided by the individual health plans.
- Information about accreditation of the key systems and processes that managed care organizations use.

Installations

To assist in publicizing this FEHB open season, all installations must post the open season notice provided on page 47 of this *Postal Bulletin* through December 13, 2005, on bulletin boards.

Compensation will make an automatic distribution of brochures indicated below to the same offices that receive Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) and Flexible Spending Account (FSA) materials. This distribution is to all customer service district offices, processing and distribution centers, airport mail centers, bulk mail centers, remote encoding centers, the Office of the Inspector General, selected Postal Inspection Service divisions, and selected Headquarters field units.

Final Report

At the end of each campaign, the Eagan ISC prepares a report from the Postal Payroll System of CFC contributions through payroll deduction (as of pay period 02) as the annual report of national CFC contributions. Each performance cluster manager receives a copy.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - **C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

- Change from Self and Family to Self Only.

Enrollment changes and new enrollments made during the 2005 open season will be effective January 7, 2006 (Pay Period 02-06). New premium payments will be reflected in paychecks dated January 27, 2006.

Under the standards of ethical conduct, a postal employee may not use, or permit the use of, his/her position, title, or any authority associated with his position, to endorse non-postal products, services, or enterprises.

Customs Transactions Procedures

The Money Order Voucher Entry System (MOVES), which processes financial data input from a PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report,* is being phased out. The Electronic Money Order Voucher System (eMOVES) will replace MOVES.

Post Offices™ and retail postal units converting from MOVES to eMOVES will no longer send payments to the U.S. Customs Service by issuing a no-fee money order. The accounting service center (ASC) will process a monthly Intra-Governmental Payment and Collection (IPAC) payment for the amounts reported into AIC 054 to Customs.

Effective with the conversion date to eMOVES, Post Offices and retail postal units must follow the procedures below for customs transactions.

Collection of Customs Fees — eMOVES Offices

- Use AIC 054, Customs Collections, to report funds held for payment to the U.S. Customs Service.
- Collect the exact amount from the "Postmaster Collect" field, on Customs Form 3419A, Mail Entry—Customs.

- Each mail entry number along with its corresponding amount must be entered into eMOVES.
- Keep PS Form 2944, Receipt for Customs Duty Mail, in office records.
- Customs Form 3419A is retained locally, but submitted at the close of the reporting period to the U.S.

NOTICE

Standard Operating Procedures for the Handling and Processing of Hazardous Materials for Customer Service Distribution Clerks and Mail Handlers

Hazardous materials (HAZMAT) that are improperly accepted, handled, and transported represent a significant threat. Employees in customer service units are the "first line of defense" for hazardous materials entering the mailstream.

Over the past weeks, Delivery and Retail has issued to customer service facilities a copy of the Postal Service ™ standard operating procedures (SOP) for the handling and processing of HAZMAT for customer service distribution clerks and mail handlers.

The SOP serves to assist employees responsible for customer service distribution activities during the handling, processing, and transporting of mail containing, or believed to contain, HAZMAT. By following the SOP, employees will continue to keep the mail safe by screening the mail at its entry points and by ensuring that only properly prepared mailable items get through.

The detailed instructions are designed to:

- Provide a safer workplace for our employees.
- Safeguard the general public.
- Maintain the reliability and security of the mail by increasing employee awareness and understanding of HAZMAT in the mailstream.

The instructions apply to properly prepared mailable HAZMAT and to nonmailable HAZMAT and packages displaying nonmailable markings or labels.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office $^{\text{TM}}$ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POST-MARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

Setting Clocks for Standard Time

Managers must ensure that before opening for business on Monday, October 31, 2005, the clocks in all integrated retail terminals (IRTs) and debit/credit card terminals under their control are set *back* (in most locations) 1 hour to reflect the change to Standard Time. Facilities with Saturday night operations should reset the time as soon as possible after the 2 A.M. start time, Sunday, October 30, 2005.

The correct system time in IRTs is critical since their internal clocks are used to verify Express Mail® and Global Express Guaranteed™ acceptance times and service commitments. The IRT system time is also printed on customer receipts and employee reports. It is very important that the debit/credit card terminal clocks be set to the correct day, date, and time as this will help reduce the possibility of accepting an expired debit/credit card.

Integrated Retail Terminals (IRTs)

On the UNISYS III Supervisor Disk, select menu item 11, Set System Date and Time, from the Control menu, and perform the following steps:

- 1. Observe that the date appears.
- 2. Press the ENTER key to accept the current date. The time appears.
- 3. Press the CE key to clear the time.
- 4. Enter correct Standard Time in military format (examples: 8 A.M. = 0800, 1:30 P.M. = 1330).
- 5. Press the ENTER key to save the corrected time. The Control menu appears.
- 6. Observe that the corrected time is displayed in the upper right-hand corner of the screen.

Tranz 380 Debit/Credit Card Terminals

However, all RCU operators should validate the correct time and date when they log on to the RCU on Monday, October 31, 2005, and notify Raleigh if the time and date are incorrect.



- 2. On Sept. 12, 2005, Passport Services began transitioning from processing through Mellon Bank to CitiGroup's east and west coast operations. Passport Acceptance Facilities will be notified by their Passport Services Customer Service Manager for effective date of change.
- 3. Updated forms: DS-11 Application for a US Passport, DS-82 Application for a US Passport by Mail, DS-3053 Statement of Consent: Issuance of a Passport to a Minor Under Age 14, DS-5504 US Passport Re-Application, and DS-4085 Application for Additional Visa Pages.
- 4. Forms will be automatically distributed to Passport Acceptance Facilities in Oct. 2005.

2006 Year Type for Hand Stamp and Canceling Machines

In the article "2006 Year Type for Hand Stamp and Canceling Machines" in *Postal Bulletin* 22164 (9-29-05, page 132) there are two corrections.

- In the fourth paragraph, text was missing. This text is given below in bold. The paragraph should read as follows: You should contact the MDC at 800-332-0317 by November 10, 2005, if your facility has not received the MDC notification by November 1, 2005, and you need 2006 year type for hand stamp or canceling machines. Please be ready to give the customer service representative the PSIN for the item needed, the quantity you need, and the FEDSTRIP number for the ordering facility.
- In the fifth paragraph, the date in the first sentence was incorrect. The corrected sentence follows with the corrected date in bold: The MDC will ship the 2006 year type no later than December 14, 2005.
