### Flexible Spending Accounts: Grace period adds even more flex to tax-free spending



Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs) now are even more flexible, with a new grace period to make sure you don't lose a penny of your contributions.

The Internal Revenue Service has added a grace period, which will run from Jan. 1 through March 15, for FSA participants to use funds left in their accounts at the end of the previous plan year. This includes both health care and dependent care FSAs.

Here's an example. You sign up for a health care FSA for \$1,500. On Dec. 1 you see you've managed only \$1,000 in FSA expenses. Under the old rules, you'd have to spend your remaining \$500 on eligible expenses by Dec. 31, or forfeit the money. But now — thanks to the new grace period — you have until March 15 to spend and claim the remaining \$500.

The grace period is in effect beginning with 2005 FSAs and continues for 2006 and beyond. To take advantage of the grace period, employees need to remain as FSA participants on Dec. 31 of each year. Check the details in the FSA brochure you received in the mail.

As always, your FSA dollars are set aside tax-free, a considerable savings. This year's FSA open season runs through Dec. 31 at 5 P.M. CT.

The busiest mailing day is expected to be Monday, Dec. 19. The busiest delivery day will be two days later.

### Cataloging your next move



Used to be when you moved, your catalogs didn't follow you. Not any more.

Thanks to the new Catalog Request Card Service available through Mover's

Guide Online at USPS.com, that's changing.

The new service is a natural expansion of the Postal Service's Internet change-of-address form. After customers complete the online form, they have the option of selecting specific catalogs — current or new — or choosing "No Thanks." In the first month of the program, nearly 113,000 people requested more than 650,000 catalogs.

The service also is available with the printed *Mover's Guide*, available in Post Offices.

### National Consumer Protection Week theme announced



National Consumer Protection Week (NCPW) 2006 is Feb. 5–11. The Postal Service's theme is "Fighting Fraud: It's a Family Matter" for the eighth annual consumer awareness campaign.

NCPW was launched in 1999 to highlight consumer issues and promote education. Its mission is

to help people learn about their consumer rights and empower them to protect themselves from fraud and abuse in the marketplace.

### Take the train to savings: Transportation contract saves more than \$18 million

New contracts with rail and highway transportation will save the Postal Service \$18 million annually.

Contracts for the combined use of rail and highway networks — called intermodal transportation — cover the transport of mail and equipment on more than 1,300 one-way unscheduled transportation segments around the country.

Surface Operations, Surface Transportation and Supply Management worked with suppliers through a Web-based bidding tool to best match supplier capabilities and efficiencies with USPS operational requirements.

The result? A decrease of more than 15 percent for these rail and highway contracts — for a total impact of more than \$18 million annually.

It's just one example of how supply chain management delivers results.

### Revenue soars at Nevada air show: Nellis Air Force Base welcomes veterans

More than 125,000 people came to welcome America's veterans at Nellis Air Force Base, near Las Vegas. Many of them also welcomed two framed postal stamp art pieces and three collectible envelopes, including one honoring the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds.

Operation Welcome Home — a celebration to publicly honor, thank and recognize America's 2.7 million Vietnam veterans — was part of Aviation Nation 2005.

Moapa, NV, Postmaster Chris Pearce led a postal effort that raised \$12,000 at three retail booths on the flight line.

### WEBBATS UPDATE

### Rate and Fee Changes Will Be Transparent to WebBATS Users

The rate and fee changes that take effect January 8, 2006, will be transparent to WebBATS users. Changes to Post Office™ box fees and related fees (e.g., key deposit) will be implemented at the application host level, requiring no action on the part of the WebBATS user. *All sites will maintain their current fee group.*

Post Office box holders submitting payments on or after January 8, 2006, will pay the new Post Office box fees. WebBATS will allow users to post payments at the old Post Office box fees if the following two conditions are met:

- Payment is received (or postmarked, if mailed) before January 8, 2006.
- The payment date entered in the "Receipt Date" field of the Post Payment page is before January 8, 2006.

Mailers are encouraged to label according to these revised lists immediately, but *must* comply with these changes no later than February 19, 2006.

## FORMS

### Postage Statement Redesign — Obsolete Forms

Effective January 8, 2006, we are eliminating several postage statements as part of the postage statement redesign project. The new statements reduce the number of forms mailers need by providing one form with all rates for each category or class of mail, plus a simplified “EZ” form. Mailers will now find all First-Class Mail® and Priority Mail® rates on PS Form 3600-R, *First-Class Mail and Priority Mail*; all regular Standard Mail® rates on PS Form 3602-R, *Standard Mail*; all Nonprofit Standard Mail rates on PS Form 3602-N, *Nonprofit Standard Mail*; all Package Services rates on PS Form 3605-R, *Package Services*; and all Periodicals rates on PS Form 3541, *Periodicals — One Issue or One Edition*.

Although several of the new forms have multiple pages, mailers use only the pages needed for a particular mailing. The first page of PS Forms 3600-R, 3602-R, 3602-N, 3605-R, and 3541 includes a “Parts Completed” section, which allows mailers to identify the parts of the form they are using. Mailers complete the identified parts and include only those parts with the first page. To allow mailers to include extra services, PS Forms 3600-R, 3602-R, 3602-N, and 3605-R include a new Part S. Also, the Instructions page on each form contains additional information for mailers.

#### First-Class Mail (Including Priority Mail)

First-Class Mail and Priority Mail mailers will use PS Forms 3600-EZ (First-Class Mail only) or 3600-R, dated January 2006, for all mailings. The following First-Class Mail and Priority Mail postage statements are obsolete:

- PS Form 3600-P, *First-Class Mail — Postage Affixed* (8/2003)
- PS Form 3600-PM, *Priority Mail — Permit Imprint* (6/2002)

- PS Form 3600-PMX, *Priority Mail Flat-Rate Box Experiment — Permit Imprint* (11/2004)

#### Periodicals

Periodicals mailers will use PS Forms 3541 or 3541-M (for monthly mailings), dated January 2006, for all mailings. The following Periodicals postage statements are obsolete:

- PS Form 3541-A, *Periodicals — Condensed — One Issue or Edition* (6/2002)
- PS Form 3541-X, *Periodicals Co-Palletization Experiment* (4/2003)

#### Standard Mail

Regular Standard Mail mailers will use PS Forms 3602-EZ, 3602-C, or 3602-R, dated January 2006, and PS Form 3602-G, dated November 2001, for all mailings. The following regular Standard Mail postage statements are obsolete:

- PS Form 3602-HP, *Standard Mail Heavy Letters — Postage Affixed* (6/2002)
- PS Form 3602-HR, *Standard Mail Heavy Letters — Permit Imprint* (6/2002)

- PS Form 3602-PS, *Standard Mail Subject to Surcharge — Postage Affixed* (8/2003)

## Phase III Postage Meters Scheduled for Decertification

We remind Phase III postage meter users who plan to continue using a meter for postage that they must complete their transition to a more secure Postal Service™-approved postage meter by the December 31, 2006, decertification date established in 2001.

Phase III postage meters use older rotary (letterpress) technology to print postage and do not automatically disable if reset outside certain criteria. Customers using this technology should keep in mind that the automated funds downloading systems will not recognize Phase III meters once they are decertified.

In addition to this notice, the Postal Service has provided all commercial postage meter vendors with a letter outlining the transition requirements that they can distribute to their clients.

Postal Service employees should direct customers requesting specific information about approved replacement models to contact a commercial postage meter vendor. Mailing system representatives at these companies have received specialized training, can explain the features offered by each postage meter model, and can answer questions about this transition process.

### Thrift Savings Plan Policy Changes and *PostalEASE*

The following information is provided to assist personnel offices in conducting the election opportunity for 2006 tax-deferred Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) contributions. The booklet TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan*, August 2005, provides a good overview of the TSP. Newly eligible career employees receive a copy of TSP BK08 from Headquarters through a direct mailing. Offices can order additional copies from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) and use touch tone order entry (TTOE); call 800-332-0317, option 2. Use the following information to order TSP BK08:

#### TSP Policy Change — Elimination of TSP Percentage Caps

Public Law 108-469, signed on December 21, 2004, eliminates the TSP percentage limitations and the restrictions on contribution elections tied to them. This means that participants' contribution elections are limited only by the restrictions imposed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Code's elective deferral limit. The IRS deferral limit for 2006 is \$15,000. This change is effective pay period (PP) 01-2006. Postal Service™ employees will continue to use *PostalEASE* to make TSP contribution elections.

The law does not affect the waiting period that new employees covered by the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) must serve before they become eligible for agency automatic (1 percent) and agency matching contributions to their accounts. In addition, the law does not affect contribution allocations or interfund transfers, which can be made at any time. Furthermore, the law does not affect the TSP Catch-Up Contribution election for employees age 50 and over.

During December 2005, Headquarters will mail a letter of notification about the elimination of TSP percentage

limitations along with TSP enrollment information and *PostalEASE* instructions to career employees at their mailing addresses of record.

For further information regarding the elimination of TSP percentage restrictions, see TSP Bulletin 05-10, *Elimination of Percentage Restrictions on Employee Contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan*, July 27, 2005.

#### Effective Dates

*PostalEASE* automates the processing of TSP elections. The windows of opportunity for employees to make TSP open season elections and the resulting effective dates are as follows:

- The 2006 initial election can be made effective the first pay period in 2006 (PP 01-2006) using *PostalEASE*, starting on Saturday, December 24, 2005. (PP 01-2006 begins on December 24, 2005, and ends on January 6, 2006, with a pay date of January 13, 2006.)
- Employees must complete an election using *PostalEASE* by 12 noon Central Time (CT) the second Wednesday (day 12) of each pay period for the election to be effective in that pay period. An election completed *after* 12 noon CT on the second Wednesday of a pay period will be effective the next pay period.

#### TSP Basic Pay Contribution Limit

All participants are eligible to contribute up to the IRS Code's annual deferral limit. The contribution per pay period must not exceed 90 percent of the employee's basic pay. FERS and Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) employees get the same tax break for deferred taxes on their TSP contributions; however, only FERS employees get agency matching contributions (on the first 5 percent of their contributions). That's why FERS employees must ensure that they don't maximize their contributions before the end of the calendar year. FERS employees can avoid losing any matching contributions by dividing the IRS annual deferral limit of \$15,000 by 26 (the number of pay periods in 1 year). That equals \$577 per pay period (rounded **up** so employees don't lose any matching money for the last pay period). CSRS employees get the tax advantage but do not receive agency matching money. Therefore, CSRS employees who contribute more than \$577 each pay period and reach the maximum before the end of the calendar year don't lose anything.

*Note:* TSP-1, *Thrift Savings Plan Election Form*, is no longer in use. If an employee brings TSP-1 to your personnel office, return the form and tell the employee to use *PostalEASE* to make contribution elections (per instructions provided in the December 2005 mailing).

### Using PINs to Make TSP Elections

Two PINs are needed to make TSP elections: USPS PIN and TSP PIN.

#### USPS PIN

The Postal Service maintains USPS PINs. Employees using *PostalEASE* need USPS PINs to (1) initiate, (2) change, or (3) cancel TSP participation. An employee who does not know his or her USPS PIN should contact *PostalEASE* at 877-4PS-EASE (877-477-3273) and follow these steps when prompted:

1. Press 1 for *PostalEASE*.
2. Enter Employee ID number (found on the earnings statement).
3. When prompted to enter the PIN, pause and then press 2.

The USPS PIN will be mailed to the employee's address of record, usually by the next business day.

*Note:* When an employee requests his or her USPS PIN, the USPS PIN does not change; the employee's old USPS PIN remains valid. (The USPS PIN is the same PIN employees use for telephone bidding and computerized bidding.)

#### TSP PIN

This PIN is maintained by TSP. Employees need their TSP PIN to make fund investment choices via the TSP Web site or the TSP ThriftLine. TSP participants who do not

know their TSP PIN can use either of these methods for having a new TSP PIN mailed to their address of record:

1. Go to the TSP Web site at *www.tsp.gov* and select *Account Access*.
2. Call the TSP ThriftLine or TSP Service Office toll-free at 877-968-3778 (TDD, 877-847-4385) and follow the instructions.

When TSP receives a request, TSP gives a new TSP PIN to the employee and the old TSP PIN is no longer valid.

**Direct Mailings to Employees**

Headquarters will mail the TSP enrollment information letter with *PostalEASE* instructions to career employees at their mailing address of record during December 2005.

Soon after a newly eligible career employee's PS Form 50, *Notification of Personnel Action*, is processed, Headquarters sends TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan*, to the employee's mailing address of record along with the TSP enrollment information letter with *PostalEASE* instructions.

The employing office of record is the return address for undeliverable TSP enrollment information sent to newly eligible employees. The disposition of returned items is at the discretion of the district office or other administering office. An employee who receives an enrollment package forwarded to the employing office of record should submit PS Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*, June 1993. (Employees with access to Web job bidding on the Intranet should use the Web to report address changes; others should submit PS Form 1216 to their personnel office.)

Personnel offices should maintain a supply of PS Forms 1216, which they can obtain from the Postal Service Web site, <http://blue.usps.gov>; under "Essential Links," click *Forms*. Or they can order PS Form 1216 from MDC using the following information:

**TSP Publications and Forms**

Most TSP publications and forms have been revised for TSP's new record-keeping system implemented in June 2003.

The MDC automatically distributes all new and revised TSP items it receives to Human Resources at district offices, area offices, PDC/Fs, BMCs, AMC/Fs, remote encoding centers, the Office of Inspector General, Postal Inspection Service divisions, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units.

**Ordering TSP Items**

Offices may order TSP forms and publications from the MDC as needed. However, it is not necessary to maintain a large stock of TSP BK08 because Headquarters mails this booklet to each newly eligible and newly hired career employee. In addition, offices can check the TSP Web site for new or revised items.

*Note:* Form TSP-50 is available only from MDC, not from TSP.

**Participant Statements**

Employees with TSP accounts may view their statements online. The TSP Service Office mails quarterly statements to participants who have elected to receive paper copies.

**Publicity**

MDC regularly sends TSP posters to Human Resources at district offices, area offices, PDC/Fs, BMCs, AMC/Fs, remote encoding centers, the Office of Inspector General, Postal Inspection Service divisions, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units. Installations that receive the posters must distribute them widely and post them on bulletin boards.

To assist in publicizing the 2006 TSP enrollment opportunity, all offices must post the following on bulletin boards through December 31, 2006:

- The 2006 TSP enrollment information notice provided on page 49.
- The current TSP fact sheet.

## 2006 Thrift Savings Plan Catch-Up Contributions for Participants Age 50 and Older, and *PostalEASE*

The following information is provided to assist personnel offices in conducting the election opportunity for 2006 tax-deferred Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) Catch-Up Contributions. These contributions, available to TSP participants who are at least age 50 during 2006, supplement regular TSP contributions and do not count against the statutory contribution percentage limitations or the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Code's elective deferral limit. However, the Catch-Up Contributions have their own annual limit (the "annual Catch-Up limit") and eligibility criteria.

### 2006 Initial Election

The 2006 initial election can be made effective no earlier than the first pay period (PP) in 2006 (PP 01-2006) using *PostalEASE*. Employees will have access on Saturday, December 24, 2005. PP 01-2006 begins on December 24,

2005, and ends on January 6, 2006, with a pay date of January 13, 2006. After that, employees can elect their 2006 Catch-Up Contributions at any time.

Employees must complete their election using *PostalEASE* by 12:00 noon Central Time (CT) the second Wednesday (day 12) of each pay period in order for the election to be effective in that pay period. Any elections completed *after* 12:00 noon CT on the second Wednesday of each pay period will be effective the next pay period.

### Annual Catch-Up Contribution Limit

For 2006, the maximum Catch-Up Contribution is \$5,000. This contribution election is in addition to the IRS annual deferral limit for 2006, which is \$15,000. See the following table for contribution limits.

### Eligibility for Catch-Up Contributions

Catch-Up Contributions are supplemental contributions available to TSP participants who are age 50 or older. There is no "lookback" provision to see what the participant could have contributed but did not. Eligible participants simply have the right to contribute additional funds up to the annual Catch-Up Contribution limit.

To elect Catch-Up Contributions, employees must:

- Be in a pay status. Make contributions from basic pay through payroll deductions only.
- Have on file either (1) a regular election to contribute the maximum percentage of basic pay, or (2) an election where the maximum IRS elective deferral limit will be reached during the calendar year.
- Be age 50 or older, or turn age 50 in the calendar year the election is submitted and processed.
- Not be in the 6-month noncontribution period following the receipt of a financial hardship in-service withdrawal.

- Self-certify that they are contributing (in all equivalent employer plans) the maximum amount that will result in reaching the IRS elective deferral limit by the end of the relevant calendar year.

In addition, the following rules will apply to the 50 and older Catch-Up Contributions:

- Once the plan is implemented, participants can start, change the amount, or stop at any time. Termination of Catch-Up Contributions does not affect a participant's regular contributions.
- A new election must be submitted each year (deductions will not continue into the next calendar year).
- The annual amount of the contribution will be combined with regular tax-deferred contributions in the deferral block of Form W-2 as follows:
  - If the amount shown exceeds the IRS limit, the IRS will check the date of birth with the Social Security Administration and assume any amount

over the limit is attributable to the Catch-Up Contributions.

- If the participant exceeds the Catch-Up limit (usually by contributing to more than one plan), the participant may contact the TSP and request a refund of the excess Catch-Up Contributions.
- If applicable, the participant is eligible to make up missed Catch-Up Contributions under the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA).

### Other Catch-Up Contributions Information

Participants can make more than one election in any given calendar year (as long as the annual catch-up limit is not exceeded). Beginning with the initial election period for the calendar year, participants can make Catch-Up Contribution elections at any time during the calendar year via payroll deductions.

Employees will need to make a new election for each calendar year in which they wish to participate in the Catch-Up Contribution election.

Catch-Up Contributions will be invested in an employee's account based on the most current contribution allocation on file with the TSP. Remind employees that contribution allocations must be made using one of these methods: (1) TSP Web site; (2) TSP ThriftLine; or (3) Form TSP-50, *Investment Allocation*.

There are no Postal Service™ matching contributions associated with TSP Catch-Up Contributions.

### Termination of Catch-Up Contributions

Employees can stop or restart Catch-Up Contributions at any time without penalty. Termination of Catch-Up Contributions does not affect the employee's regular contributions.

If a participant receives a financial hardship in-service withdrawal, then the participant's Catch-Up Contributions and regular employee contributions must stop for 6 months.

The Catch-Up Contribution election terminates automatically with the last pay date of the calendar year to which it applies (PP 26 in 2006) unless the employee has previously terminated the election or has reached the annual Catch-Up Contribution limit.

## HAZMAT

### NOTICE

### Properly Marking Re-Used Boxes That Contained Hazardous Materials

To protect the health and safety of Postal Service™ employees and the general public, the Postal Service has procedures for the safe acceptance, handling, and delivery of hazardous materials. Postal Service employees must prevent packages containing hazardous materials from entering the mailstream unless the package meets all Postal Service requirements for mailing. Employees are instructed to remove nonmailable items from the mail and isolate them for retrieval by the customer. Employees at processing facilities assume that the markings and labels on the outside of a package indicate the actual contents of the package.

We all need to be aware of the items we are accepting from customers. We can become aware by asking the HAZMAT question and by examining the package closely to look for nonmailable markings and labels.

#### Re-used Boxes

For mailing packages, customers often use boxes that originally contained common hazardous or nonmailable materials (e.g., bleach, cosmetics, household cleaners, and liquor). It is acceptable for customers to re-use such boxes for mailing provided that all original markings and labels on the box have either been removed or are completely obliterated (see images below). If any of the box's former markings or labels of nonmailable contents are visible, the Postal Service cannot accept the box for mailing.

**Acceptable Box**

Postal Service employees may not remove, cross out, or obliterate markings or labels on a mailpiece, even if directed to do so by a mailer. Preparing a box for mailing may only be performed by the mailer or the mailer's authorized representative. By correctly packaging mail at initial acceptance, customers avoid the inconvenience of having to retrieve a nonmailable parcel.

Remember to closely inspect each mailpiece and ask customers about markings or labels that indicate potential hazardous materials.

# International Mail

## IMM REVISION

### Changes in International Mail

Effective January 8, 2006, we are revising the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) to reflect decisions made by the Bucharest Congress of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) and by the Postal Operations Council (POC).

#### Indemnity Coverage

Indemnity coverage is now provided for all ordinary, uninsured international airmail and economy mail parcel post. This new coverage is provided at no additional charge and protects mailers against loss, damage, or rifling. Coverage is limited to the actual value of the contents or the maximum indemnity based on the weight of the article, whichever is less. The January 2006 edition of PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*, is modified to accommodate this change.

Mailers may still purchase additional insurance to many countries. When international insured service is purchased, it replaces the indemnity coverage provided on ordinary parcel post.

#### Other Changes

Also effective January 8, 2006, in compliance with the UPU and POC, we are making the following changes:

- The addressee is the payee on claims for international registered letter-post items and international ordinary and insured parcel post items delivered in damaged condition or with contents missing.
- Mailers must package the contents of a shipment to prevent deterioration or degradation.
- Mailers sending items to “General Delivery” must show the country of destination.
- Mailers may place only one addressee’s address on envelopes or wrappings.
- We are updating the list of “valuable articles” to include watches.
- We are clarifying that additional protection and security for registered mail items is provided in the United States and that registered mail items are handled in destination countries according to their own internal procedures.
- We are clarifying that items bearing an address in pencil or any erasable format are not acceptable for registered mail service.
- Insurance for parcel post is no longer available to the Philippines.

- The weight of M-bags to Great Britain is limited to 20 kg. (44 lbs.).
- We will accept inquiries on international registered items, recorded delivery items, insured parcel post items, and ordinary parcel post items. We will not accept inquiries for ordinary letter-post items, including Global Priority Mail® (GPM) items.
- The maximum indemnity for registered mail items to Canada is \$44.86.

- a. Parcels containing coins; banknotes; currency notes, including paper money; securities of any kind payable to the bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver; precious stones; jewelry; watches; and other valuable articles.
- b. Consequential losses, delay, concealed damage, spoilage of perishable items, articles improperly packaged, articles too fragile to withstand normal handling in the mail, or prohibited articles.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

42" . . . . .	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" . . . . .	24" girth
over 44" to 46" . . . . .	20" girth
over 46" to 48" . . . . .	16" girth
	Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

### Catalog Address Change and Request Card Service

The next deadline date for ordering Stamps at Your Door™ (Stamps by Mail® — Stamps Delivered to Your Door) brochures is **December 12, 2005**. This print run will be for the year-round brochure design and include the **new rate stamps**. To order brochures, submit PS Form 3227-0,

The cost per unit of 500 is \$11.00. This cost includes overprinting the address of the fulfillment office placing the order. You may pay for orders with local IMPAC credit cards, checks, or money orders. However, Cyril-Scott Company cannot process the order until it receives payment. Local ebuy procedures may also apply (refer to local procurement procedures).

Postal Service™ Headquarters has funded a national procurement for the December 12 print run for 5 million brochures for the Stamps by Mail centralized processing sites. The distribution amount for each site is available by referencing column K (5MM) of the centralized site address spreadsheet. These quantities are based on revenue generated by site. No local order placement is required to receive brochures from this distribution. However, centralized sites may order **additional** quantities from Cyril-Scott Company from local funds by following the ordering instructions contained within this article.

All other local Post Offices™ should follow the ordering instructions contained within this article and utilize local funds.

### Special New Rate Print Run

Our goal is to provide quick, easy, and convenient methods for our customers to purchase stamps. To assist in reaching this goal and to ensure there is no interruption in the Stamps by Mail service, a special print run for the new rate stamp brochures took place November 14, 2005. Funds have been provided for the brochures to be distributed as follows:

- Two million brochures for the centralized sites (50 national computerized processing sites). Individual site carton counts are based on the column H distribution on the centralized site spreadsheet.
- Two million brochures distributed among the decentralized sites (local Post Offices, stations, and branches) that placed orders for the October 3, 2005 print run. These sites will receive approximately 15% of the quantities ordered in October.

Local Post Offices and centralized Stamps by Mail sites will automatically receive distributions from the November print run, starting on December 1, 2005, and ending by December 24, 2005.

Additional orders will be automatically filled from the December 12 print run.

Stamps by Mail order forms with the old rates must not be used after the rate change. Ensure that old forms are removed.

After the rate change, customers who submit an order paid according to the old rates should have their orders fulfilled with new stamps equal to their payments. Their order should be sent with the letter provided below:

Dear Stamps by Mail Customer:

The Postal Service has changed its rates and fees for all classes of mail and services, effective January 8, 2006.

We have received your Stamps by Mail order; however, you placed your order using an old form. Rather than return your order unfulfilled, we have sent you the value of new stamps equal to your payment. We are also enclosing an order form with the new rates. If you need to place another order, please use the enclosed order form.

Thank you for your understanding and we hope you continue to use our Stamps by Mail program.

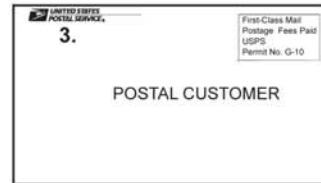

## POP base kits are coming

Start the new year with a fresh look. New point-of-purchase (POP) base kits will arrive the week after Christmas with promotional elements for display Jan. 1 through June 30. This kicks off a new signage strategy that's designed to drive revenue increases for retail by delivering targeted messages for key products. Some offices may receive either a Package Services poster or a counter mat featuring Priority Mail® service with Delivery Confirmation™ service and Insurance.

Post Offices will receive a new base kit every 6 months — not every 3–4 months like previous drive periods. There will be fewer but more targeted POP elements in the kits. Additional promotional materials — like standees — will be distributed throughout the year.

New menuboard hardware is also available for kits 1 and 2. Check your POP kit for information on how to place an order for the hardware, at no expense to your location. This offer ends Jan. 31.

## New rate change/continuity kits

New rates and fees go into effect on Jan. 8. Post Offices will receive rate change/continuity kits by Jan. 3. A holiday sale decal, a continuity POP catalog, and a POP removal guide that is part of the retail standardization effort are also included.

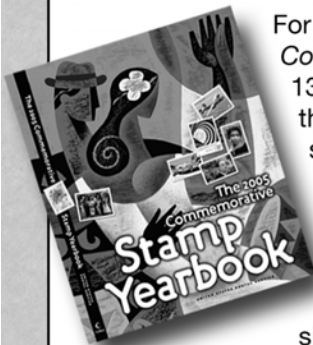

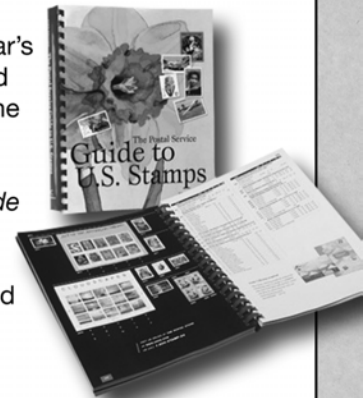

INSTALLATION HEADS/MAOs

## Semiannual Review of Capital Records

Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, Section 541.28, Internal Reviews, contains procedures for conducting a semiannual review of capital records. The procedures state that either the installation head or material accountability officer (MAO) is to conduct a semiannual internal review and evaluation of the status of property records and files.

If you are an installation head or MAO, you must complete the review and evaluation process by following these steps:

- Meet with delegated MAO assistants (if you have them) and discuss the material accountability background of the installation.

- Review the local standard operating procedures.
- Randomly select and inventory 10 percent of capital items and 10 percent of sensitive items.
- Review files and records to verify that they are being maintained in accordance with procedures outlined in Handbook AS-701, Chapter 5, Asset Accountability.
- Review the past six property changes for the month to ensure they have been properly verified.
