“The mail works!” Potter delivers keynote address at National Postal Forum



The forecast for the Postal Service and the mailing industry is very good. That's the message Postmaster General Jack Potter delivered to more than 6,500 mailers and advertisers at the National Postal Forum in Orlando, FL. It's a forecast based on a transformed Postal Service that will see a growth in direct mail as well as advances in technology that will track Postal Service performance and reduce costs.

Potter noted that mail volume last year reached a record 212 billion pieces. Marketers have found that using the mail, along with the Internet, has resulted in significantly larger orders than if they had relied on Internet advertising alone. “The public and the marketplace have spoken loudly,” he said. “The mail works.”

Potter also discussed the Postal Service's high levels of customer satisfaction, elimination of \$11 billion in debt and productivity increases six years in a row.

“We have enormous challenges,” Potter said. “But we have the ideas to grow this business. I know that we can be more successful than ever.”

E-mail scam targets Thrift Savings Plan participants

Scam artists are at it again — phishing for your personal information — and this time they're pretending to be from the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP). The TSP has posted a warning about this latest phishing attempt on its Web site:

You should never give any personal, credit or banking information in response to unsolicited e-mails. The TSP would never ask for this information via an e-mail. If you did provide this information, contact your credit card company and bank immediately for guidance. In addition, call the TSP at 877-968-3778 and ask to have your account access blocked.

If you receive the bogus TSP e-mail, do not try to access the TSP Web site by clicking on links in that or any other e-mail. They're trying to steal your personal information. Always access your TSP account only by

opening a new browser window, and typing <http://www.tsp.gov> into the address (URL) field.

The TSP is actively investigating this scam.

The results have been outstanding. Total retail revenue increased 7.7 percent compared with same period last year. ReadyPost revenue was up nearly \$2,000, for a 33 percent increase. And new OLRP sales were more than \$5,200 for the four-month period.

Delivering a data-packed barcode



The Postal Service has loaded a barcode with information that mailers can use to help build their business, cut their costs, better manage customer relationships and stay competitive.

Working with mailing industry partners, USPS has designated an innovative new barcode called the 4-state barcode to lead the effort. This new barcode looks a little different from the sorting barcode most of us are familiar with. Because it’s made up of four distinct, vertical bar types, it can carry more information than any previous postal barcode.

It performs multiple functions — using only one line of code. Up to now, separate barcodes were needed for sorting, tracking, service and customer information.

DMM REVISION

Reassignment of ZIP Code Range 880 for DBMC Mailings and Intra-BMC Parcel Post

Beginning July 6, 2006, mailers must prepare destination bulk mail center (DBMC) mailings for 3-digit ZIP Code™ 880 in containers for Dallas, Texas, and enter that mail at the Dallas bulk mail center (BMC) instead of the Albuquerque, New Mexico, auxiliary service facility (ASF). This change is due to changes in mail processing operations as shown in the labeling list revisions on pages 15–21 of this *Postal Bulletin*.

We will revise the DBMC Rate Eligibility exhibits for Standard Mail®, Parcel Post®, and Bound Printed Matter items in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* to reflect this change.

Also effective July 6, 2006, we will change the BMC/ASF exhibits for Parcel Post mailed at intra-BMC rates to reflect ZIP Code range 880 as served by the Dallas BMC.

DMM REVISION**Parcel Return Service**

Effective April 2, 2006, Parcel Return Service (PRS) is a permanent mail classification in section 507.11.0 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®). We ended the experimental Parcel Return Service offering at midnight on April 1, 2006, and implemented the permanent classification and fees.

PRS allows authorized permit holders or their agents to pick up parcels returned by consumers at return bulk mail centers and return delivery units across the country. All Postal Service™ customers can now use PRS, provided they meet all of the requirements in the new DMM 507.11.

There are two major changes in the permanent PRS classification as compared with the experimental service offering. We are not offering Bound Printed Matter (BPM) Return Service as part of the permanent set of rates for PRS, because there was no reported BPM volume during the experiment. Only Parcel Select Return Service is

available. And, at the request of PRS mailers, we now offer Certificate of Mailing as an extra service for PRS parcels. A mailer returning a parcel using PRS can bring it to a local Post Office™ facility and purchase a Certificate of Mailing as proof that the parcel was mailed.

We chose to retain the name “Parcel Select Return Service” for labeling, rating, and data collection purposes. This continuity will allow mailers to use their existing label stock; no label redesign is necessary.

11.0 Parcel Return Service**11.1 Basic Information****11.1.1 Description**

The Parcel Return Service (PRS) standards in 11.0 apply to parcels that are retrieved in bulk by authorized permit holders or their agents. The permit holder guarantees payment of postage and retrieval of all PRS parcels mailed with a PRS label. When a merchant or other party provides an approved PRS label to its customers or others, the merchant or other party designates the permit holder identified on the label as their agent for receipt of mail bearing that label, and authorizes the USPS to provide that mail to the permit holder or its designee. The permit holder has the option of retrieving parcels at a designated return delivery unit (a postal facility designated as a pickup location for PRS parcels, also known for PRS purposes as an "RDU") or at the return bulk mail center (also known for PRS purposes as an "RBMC") that serves the post office where returned parcels are deposited by customers. Payment for parcels returned under PRS is deducted from a separate advance deposit (postage-due) account funded through the Centralized Account Processing System (CAPS).

11.1.2 Conditions for Mailing

Parcels may be mailed as PRS when all of the following conditions apply:

- a. Parcels contain eligible matter as described in 153.3 and 153.4.
- b. Parcels bear a PRS label that meets the standards in 11.4.
- c. Parcels show the permit number, and the permit holder has paid the annual PRS permit fee and the annual PRS accounting fee.

11.1.3 Services

Pieces using PRS may not bear an ancillary service endorsement (see 102.4.0 and 507.1.5). Only a Certificate of Mailing, when the fee is paid by the mailer returning the parcel, is available as an extra service.

11.1.4 Customer Mailing Options

Returned parcels may be deposited as follows:

- a. At any post office, station, or branch.
- b. In any collection box (except an Express Mail box).
- c. With any letter carrier.

- d. As part of a collection run for other mail (special arrangements may be required).
- e. At any place designated by the postmaster for the receipt of mail.

11.1.5 Application

Companies, who wish to participate in PRS, must send a request on company letterhead to the manager, Business Mailer Support (see 608.8.0 for address). The request must contain the following information:

- a. Company name and address.
- b. An individual's contact name, telephone number, fax number, and e-mail address.
- c. The rate category or categories to be used, and the proposed retrieval locations (delivery units and bulk mail centers).
- d. A description of the electronic returns manifesting system to be used to document returns listed by location and rate eligibility.

11.1.6 Approval

The manager, Business Mailer Support reviews each request and proceeds as follows:

- a. If the applicant meets the criteria, the manager, Business Mailer Support approves the letter of request. The USPS will require the customer to enter into a service agreement, may require additional documentation, and may conduct periodic review and inspection of each participant's PRS processing and accounting operations.
- b. If the application does not meet the criteria, the manager, Business Mailer Support denies the request and sends a written notice to the applicant with the reason for denial.

11.1.7 Cancellation

USPS may cancel a PRS permit for any of the following reasons:

- a. The permit holder fails to pay the required postage and fees for returned parcels.
- b. The permit holder does not maintain adequate available funds to cover postage and fees for returned parcels.
- c. The permit holder does not fulfill the terms and conditions of the PRS permit authorization.
- d. The return labels do not conform to the specifications in 11.4.

11.1.8 Reapplying After Cancellation

To receive a new PRS permit after cancellation under 11.1.7 the mailer must:

- Submit a letter to the manager, Business Mailer Support requesting a permit and a new agreement.
- Pay a new permit fee.
- Provide evidence showing that the reasons for cancellation no longer exist.
- Maintain adequate available funds to cover the expected number of returns.

11.1.9 Pickup Schedule

Permit holders or their agents must set up a recurring or standing appointment to retrieve PRS parcels. If the permit holders (or their agent) already have existing appointments to deliver Parcel Select parcels to a destination bulk mail center or to a destination delivery unit, those same appointments can be used for retrieving PRS parcels. Permit holders or their agents must retrieve parcels on a regular schedule as follows:

- From RBMCs, at a minimum of every 48 hours, excluding Sundays and USPS holidays.
- From RDUs, according to the service agreement.

11.1.10 Parcels Endorsed Hold For Pickup

PRS participants must pay the appropriate Parcel Return Service RDU rate under 11.3 for any unclaimed, refused, undeliverable as addressed, or recalled parcels that are endorsed "Hold For Pickup" (under 455.4.6 and 508.1.3) and that bear the marking "PARCEL RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED" or "PRS REQUESTED" followed by a unique 569 prefix ZIP Code.

11.2 Postage and Fees

11.2.1 Postage

There are two PRS rate categories:

- Parcel Return Service* — RDU. Parcels returned as Parcel Post to, and retrieved in bulk from, a designated delivery unit.
- Parcel Return Service* — RBMC. Parcels returned as Parcel Post to, and retrieved in bulk from, a designated BMC.

11.2.2 Permit Fee

The participant must pay a \$160.00 permit fee annually at the post office where the PRS permit is held.

11.2.3 Advance Deposit Account and Annual Accounting Fee

The participant must pay postage through an advance deposit account and must pay an annual accounting fee of \$500.00.

11.3 Rates

11.3.1 Parcel Return Service — Return Delivery Unit

Regardless of weight (up to the maximum weight of 70 pounds), any parcel that measures more than 108 inches (but not more than 130 inches) in combined length and girth must pay the oversized rate.

Length plus Girth	Rate
Not over 108 inches	\$2.11
Oversized (Over 108 inches up to 130 inches)	\$7.92

11.3.2 Parcel Return Service — Return BMC Machinable

Parcels that weigh less than 15 pounds but measure more than 84 inches in combined length and girth are charged the applicable rate for a 15-pound parcel.

11.3.3 Parcel Return Service — Return BMC Nonmachinable

Parcels that weigh less than 15 pounds but measure more than 84 inches in combined length and girth are charged the applicable rate for a 15-pound parcel. Regardless of weight, any parcel that measures more than 108 inches (but not more than 130 inches) in combined length and girth must pay the oversized rate. See Exhibit 11.3.3, *Parcel Return Service — Return BMC Nonmachinable*.

11.4 Label Formats

11.4.1 Label Preparation

PRS labels must be certified by the USPS for use prior to distribution as defined in the service agreement. In addition, permit holders must obtain USPS certification for barcode symbologies. Any photographic, mechanical, or electronic process or any combination of these processes may be used to produce PRS labels. The background of the label may be any light color that allows the address, barcodes, and other required information to be easily distinguished. If labels are electronically transmitted to customers for their local printing, the permit holder must advise customers of these printing requirements as part of the instructions in 11.4.3.

11.4.2 Labeling Methods

If all applicable contents and formats are approved (including instructions to the user), permit holders or their agents may distribute a PRS label by any of the following methods:

- As an enclosure with merchandise when initially shipped as part of the original invoice accompanying the merchandise, or as a separate label preprinted by the permit holder. If the reverse side of the label

bears an adhesive, it must be strong enough to bond the label securely to the mailpiece.

- b. As an electronic file created by the permit holder for local printing by the customer.

11.4.3 Instructions

Regardless of label distribution method, permit holders or their agents must always provide written instructions to the user of the PRS label that, at a minimum, direct the user to do the following:

- a. "If your name and address are not already printed in the return address area, please print them neatly in that area or attach a return address label there."
- b. "Attach the label provided by the merchant squarely onto the largest side of the mailpiece, unless you need to use another side to make the parcel more stable. Place the label at least 1 inch from the edge of the parcel, so that it does not fold over to another side. If you are using tape to attach the new label, do not put tape over any barcodes on the label, even if the tape is clear."
- c. "If you are reusing the original container to return the merchandise, use the label to cover your original delivery address, barcodes, and any other postal information on the container. If it is not possible to cover all that information with the label, remove the old labels, mark them out completely with a permanent marker, or cover them completely with blank labels or paper that cannot be seen through. If that cannot be done, or if the original container is no longer sound, please use a new box to return the merchandise and attach the return label to the new box."
- d. "Once repackaged and labeled, mail the parcel at a post office, deposit it in a collection box, or leave it with your letter carrier."

11.4.4 Label Format Elements

There is no minimum size for PRS labels; however, the label must be big enough to accommodate all of the label elements and standards in this section. All PRS label elements must be legible. Except where a specific type size is required, elements must be large enough to be legible from a normal reading distance and be separate from other elements on the label. See the PRS label format examples in 11.4.5a and 11.4.5b. The following elements are required:

- a. *Postage guarantee.* The imprint "No Postage Necessary If Mailed in the United States" must appear in the upper right corner.
- b. *Horizontal bars.* A minimum of three horizontal bars must appear directly below the imprint in the upper right corner. The bars must be uniform in length, at least 1 inch long, 1/16 inch thick, and evenly spaced.

- c. *Parcel Return Service legend.* The legend must be placed directly above the address and must include:

- 1. Line 1: In capital letters at least 3/16" high, "PARCEL SELECT RETURN SERVICE" (or "PARCEL SELECT RTN SVC").
- 2. Line 2: In all capital letters, the permit holder's name, left justified, followed by "PERMIT NO.", followed by the actual permit number.

- d. *Customer's return address.* The return address of the customer using the label to mail the parcel back to the permit holder must appear in the upper left corner. If it is not preprinted by the permit holder or merchant, space must be provided for the customer to enter the return address.

- e. *Address for Parcel Return Service labels.* The address must contain the unique PRS ZIP Code (569 prefix) assigned by the USPS to the particular customer or agent. The address must consist of two or three lines in all capital letters, as specified below. The ZIP Code must be printed in at least 12-point type on a line directly below the Parcel Return Service line.

- 1. Line 1: PRS AGENT'S OR MERCHANT'S NAME.
- 2. Line 2: "PARCEL RETURN SERVICE" (or "PARCEL RETURN SVC").
- 3. Line 3: The unique PRS 569## ZIP Code assigned by the USPS in the service agreement. The unique ZIP Code may alternatively be located as part of the second line of the address.

- f. *Parcel Return Service barcode.* A PRS barcode must be printed directly on the label. The barcode may appear in any location on the label except the upper left, upper right, and lower right corners. The barcode must meet the standards for barcodes in Publication 91, *Confirmation Services Technical Guide*, with the following exceptions:

- 1. The barcode must be produced using the UCC/EAN Code 128 barcode symbology.
- 2. The service type code (STC) contained in the barcode on PRS labels must contain the value "58."
- 3. Text above the barcode must read "USPS PARCEL RETURN SERVICE" (or "USPS PARCEL RTN SVC"). If the barcode is a single concatenated barcode with the postal routing code described in 11.4.4g, the text above the barcode must read "BMC ZIP – USPS PARCEL RETURN SERVICE" (or "BMC ZIP – USPS PARCEL RTN SVC"). In the text below the barcode, the leading application identifier ("420"), ZIP Code

information, and subsequent numbers must be parsed as shown in 11.4.5b.

4. The clear zone between the barcode, the human-readable text, and the horizontal bar above and below the barcode must be at least 1/16 inch.
- g. *Postal routing barcode.* If a single concatenated barcode is not used for the PRS barcode, a postal routing barcode also must be printed directly on the label. The barcode may appear in any location on the label, except the upper left, upper right, and lower right corners. Postal routing barcodes must meet the standards in 708.5.0, except that the text below the barcode must read “BMC ZIP –,” followed by the unique PRS ZIP Code assigned by USPS in the service agreement.
- h. *Mailer identification (ID).* The permit holder assigns a mailer ID to each individual client (merchant). An individual mailer ID must appear in the lower right corner as follows:
 1. The mailer ID must consist of a single, uppercase alpha character followed by a two-, three-, or four-digit number, with no spaces or dashes. For example: X0123.
 2. The mailer ID must be at least 3/16 inch high and be surrounded by a box, with a clearance of at least 3/16 inch between the mailer ID characters and the edges of the box.
 3. The mailer ID may be reverse-printed.
- i. *Additional information.* Additional information (e.g., company logo, return authorization number, inventory barcode) is permitted on the PRS label if it does not interfere with any required format elements. Inventory barcodes must not resemble the barcodes described in 708.5.0, *Barcoding Standards for Parcels*.

DMM REVISION

Combining Package Services Parcels

Effective April 13, 2006, we are revising 705.7.0 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to allow mailers to combine different subclasses of Package Services machinable parcels for destination BMC entry and, where applicable, at destination bulk mail center (BMC) rates. Currently, mailers dropshipping parcels to BMCs may commingle different subclasses of Package Services machinable parcels *only* when they are combined with Standard Mail® machinable parcels. To provide consistency, we are adding a new section to authorize mailers to combine different subclasses of Package Services machinable parcels to destination BMCs without the inclusion of Standard Mail machinable parcels.

At the same time, we are revising DMM 705.6.1 and 7.1 for clarity.

6.1 Combined Machinable Parcels — DBMC Entry

6.1.1 Qualification

[Revise 6.1.1 for clarity as follows:]

Mailers may combine Standard Mail and Package Services machinable parcels for entry at a BMC when authorized by the USPS under 6.1.5. These parcels may be eligible for Standard Mail, Parcel Post, Parcel Select DBMC/ASF, single-piece and Presorted Media Mail, single-piece and Presorted Library Mail, Bound Printed Matter DBMC, and single-piece and Presorted Bound Printed Matter rates. Mailers may not combine Carrier Route Bound Printed Matter with other parcels.

6.1.2 Basic Standards

[Revise the title and text in 6.1.2 as follows:]

Standard Mail and Package Services parcels must meet the following conditions:

- a. Each piece in a combined Standard Mail and Package Services machinable parcels mailing must meet the criteria for machinable parcels in 401.1.5.
- b. Each parcel in a combined machinable parcels mailing is subject to the applicable content and rate eligibility standards for the rate claimed.
- c. Mailers must be authorized under 6.1.5.
- d. Mailers must pay all applicable presort mailing and destination entry mailing fees.
- e. Minimum volume requirements for Standard Mail, Parcel Select, Presorted Bound Printed Matter, Presorted Library Mail, and Presorted Media Mail must be met separately and are based solely on the quantity of pieces eligible for each rate at the required presort level. Pieces claimed at other rates in the same sack or on the same pallet do not count towards these minimum volume requirements.
- f. Parcels may be claimed at single-piece, Presorted, and DBMC/ASF destination entry rates as applicable.
- g. Mailers must prepare all parcels in sacks under 6.1.6, or on pallets or in pallet boxes under 8.0, to achieve the finest level of sortation.
- h. Mailers must deposit combined machinable parcels at BMCs under applicable standards in 705.15.

Mailers must pay all applicable fees for presort and drop shipment and must meet the minimum volume requirements for Presort rates and Parcel Select rates. Combined Package Services

mailings must meet the standards in 456.2.0 and 466.2.0 through 5.0, except as provided by this section. Mailers may not combine Carrier Route Bound Printed Matter with other parcels. Parcels entered at SCFs and DDUs are not eligible for the barcoded discount.

7.2.1 Qualification

Mailers may combine Package Services machinable parcels for entry at a BMC when authorized by the USPS under 7.5. These parcels may be eligible for Parcel Post, Parcel Select DBMC/ASF, single-piece and Presorted Media Mail, single-piece and Presorted Library Mail, Bound Printed Matter DBMC, and single-piece and Presorted Bound Printed Matter rates. Mailers may not combine Carrier Route Bound Printed Matter with other parcels.

7.2.2 Basic Standards

Package Services parcels must meet the following conditions:

- a. Each piece in a combined Package Services machinable parcels mailings must meet the criteria for machinable parcels in 401.1.5.
- b. Each parcel in a combined Package Services machinable parcels mailing is subject to the applicable content and rate eligibility standards for the rate claimed.
- c. Mailers must be authorized under 7.5.
- d. Mailers must pay all applicable presort mailing and destination entry mailing fees.

- e. Minimum volume requirements for Parcel Select, Presorted Bound Printed Matter, Presorted Library Mail, and Presorted Media Mail must be met separately and are based solely on the quantity of pieces eligible for each rate at the required presort level. Pieces claimed at other rates in the same sack or on the same pallet do not count toward these minimum volume requirements.
- f. Parcels may be claimed at single-piece, Presorted, and DBMC/ASF destination entry rates as applicable.
- g. Mailers must prepare all parcels in sacks under 6.1.6, or on pallets or in pallet boxes under 8.0, to achieve the finest level of sortation.
- h. Mailers must deposit combined Package Services machinable parcels at BMCs under applicable standards in 705.15.

7.2.3 Sacking Presort and Labeling

Preparation sequence, sack size, and labeling:

- a. 5-digit scheme (optional); 10-piece or 20-pound minimum; labeling:
 - 1) Line 1: Use L606, Column B.
 - 2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH 5D SCH."
- b. 5-digit (optional except for Bound Printed Matter); required for 5-digit rate for Media Mail and Library Mail; 10-piece or 20-pound minimum; labeling:
 - 1) Line 1: Use city, state, and 5-digit ZIP Code on mail (see 705.8 for overseas military mail).
 - 2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH 5D."
- c. ASF (optional; allowed only for mail deposited at an ASF to claim DBMC rate); 10-piece or 20-pound minimum; labeling:
 - 1) Line 1: Use L602, Column B. DBMC rate eligibility is determined by Exhibit 705.6.1.6.
 - 2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH ASF."
- d. BMC (required); 10-piece or 20-pound minimum; labeling:
 - 1) Line 1: Use L601, Column B. DBMC rate eligibility is determined by Exhibit 705.6.1.6.
 - 2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH BMC."

7.2.4 Pallet Presort and Labeling

Mailers must prepare pallets in the sequence listed below and complete each required level before preparing the next optional or required level. Unless indicated as optional, all sort levels are required under the conditions shown. Destination entry rate eligibility applies only to Parcel Select (see 456.2.0) and Bound Printed Matter (see 466.2.0). Mailers may, at their option, prepare all Package Services

machinable parcels for destination entry (see 705.7.0). Mailers must label pallets according to the Line 1 and Line 2 information listed below and under 705.8.

- a. 5-Digit Scheme (optional). Pallet may contain parcels for the same 5-digit scheme under L606. Pallets need not be prepared for all 5-digit scheme destinations. For 5-digit destinations not part of L606, or for which scheme sorts are not performed, prepare 5-digit pallets under 2.4. Pallet labeling:
 - (1) Line 1: Use L606, column B.
 - (2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH 5D," as applicable; followed by "SCHEME" (or "SCH").
- b. 5-Digit (optional except for Bound Printed Matter). Required for 5-digit rate eligibility for Media Mail and Library Mail. Pallet must contain parcels only for the same 5-digit ZIP Code. Pallet labeling:
 - (1) Line 1: Use city, state, and 5-digit ZIP Code destination (see 705.8 for military mail).
 - (2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH 5D," as applicable.
- c. ASF (required if claiming DBMC rates, otherwise optional). Not available for the Buffalo, NY, ASF. Pallets must contain only parcels for the 3-digit ZIP Code groups in L602. Pallet labeling:
 - (1) Line 1: Use L602, column B.
 - (2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH ASF," as applicable.
- d. BMC (required). Pallets must contain only parcels for the 3-digit ZIP Code groups in L601. Pallet labeling:
 - (1) Line 1: Use L601, column B. DBMC rate eligibility is determined by Exhibit 446.3.1.
 - (2) Line 2: "PSVC MACH BMC," as applicable.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

over 42" to 44"	24" girth
over 44" to 46"	20" girth
over 46" to 48"	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No 0817E or 0818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

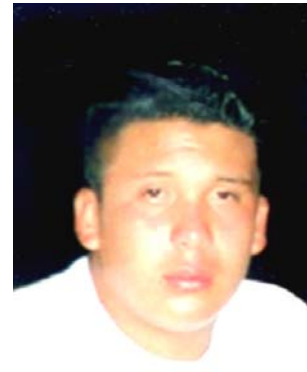

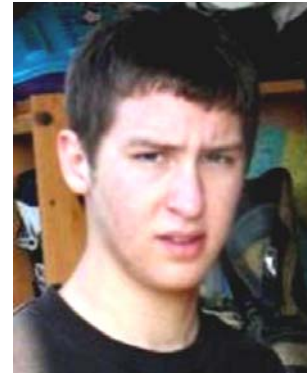

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main Post Offices™, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in Post Office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other Postal Service facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

Publication 417, *Nonprofit Standard Mail Eligibility: Nonprofit and Other Qualified Organizations*, is updated and available on Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>. Publication 417 provides important information to help mailers understand nonprofit authorization and the content standards for mailings sent at the Nonprofit Standard Mail® rates. HANDBOOK F-66 REVISION

General Investment Policies and Procedures

Effective April 13, 2006, Handbook F-66, *General Investment Policies and Procedures*, is revised to clarify the Delegation of Approval Authority for Capital Investments and update the supporting information in exhibit 2-1.

2-4 Delegated Authority for Capital Investments

[Revise item 2-4b(1) to read as follows:]

- (1) **Area vice presidents** — May approve all projects originating in their area or function with total capital investments up to \$5 million (except fixed mechanization and developmental real estate projects). Field-initiated projects that cost \$250,000 or more and the purchase of real property (land and buildings) and all new construction projects (including land purchases, expansions, and new construction-leased) must be presented to the area CIC for review and recommendation before being sent to the area vice president for approval. Up to 20 percent of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate managers for repairs or alterations and vehicle and other equipment projects. Any portion of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate PCES managers.

[Revise item 2-4b(2) to read as follows:]

- (2) **Vice president of Engineering** — May approve all fixed mechanization projects up to \$5 million. Up to 20 percent of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate managers for repairs, or alterations and vehicle and other equipment projects. Any portion of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate PCES managers. Fixed mechanization projects

in excess of \$100,000 also require the approval of the area vice president (or designee). The area vice president's signature indicates concurrence with the intent of the fixed mechanization project and with any operational impacts (if applicable), but does not include approval of funding.

[Revise item 2-4c to read as follows:]

- c. **Deputy postmaster general (DPMG), chief operating officer, chief financial officer, chief marketing officer, senior vice presidents, general counsel, chief technology officer, chief postal inspector, and inspector general** — May approve projects within their purview up to \$7.5 million. Up to 20 percent of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate managers for repairs or alterations and vehicle and other equipment projects. Any portion of this authority may be re-delegated in writing to subordinate PCES managers.

8-4.1 Investment-Related Modifications

For modifications that request investment-related changes, the contracting officer or the contracting officer's representative advises the sponsor or the sponsor's representative (usually the manager of the facilities service office) of an investment change and the reasons for the change. The preparer of the DAR then prepares the DAR Modification Request following the prescribed format, revises the

economic analysis and cash flow, and coordinates the necessary review and approvals. The preparer must also make sure that the sponsor has been advised of the need for a modification request.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Retail Standardization FAQ

Q: “Our Facilities department says it can’t cover the cost of some of the projects we need to get done in order to standardize our location. What do I do?”

A: These projects are, for the most part, considered discretionary and not absolutely necessary under the criteria that have been established by HQ Facilities. These criteria assign priority to projects that involve life safety, are legally required, impact security, are operationally required, or are needed to maintain the asset. Your Facilities Service Office (FSO) will defer projects that don’t meet these criteria. However, if the district determines it wants to perform this work and is willing to fund it, your FSO will be glad to help.

So, if the district determines that the work is needed, the appropriate funding document needs to be approved and signed, and then a call may be placed to the Facilities Single Source Provider (FSSP) Response Line by the person responsible for coordinating your facilities work. ReadyPost® Point-of-Sale Replenishment (POSR) is a perpetual inventory system that automatically places orders and manages inventory. By maximizing product availability and minimizing retail inventories, POSR will help offices yield significant revenue increases. At the end of March, over 4,000 locations will be using POSR. By October 1, over 11,000 locations will be converted.

This inventory management tool eliminates the need to manually place orders through eBay. POSR will automate ReadyPost ordering, maximize turnover, and reduce inventory stock levels, stock outages, and ordering time. To optimize POSR's effectiveness, we must adhere to the following procedures:

- All products sold must be scanned or manually entered correctly in POS ONE to credit sales to the appropriate item number.
- Use the proper barcode and avoid entering a sale as a generic AIC 093 transaction to prevent skewing your inventory levels.

Look for a POP Refresh: Your Post Office™ will be receiving a POP Refresh Kit in late April, which will include material to be posted in-store 5/1/06 to 6/30/06. A new POP Base Kit, for the next four-month time period, will be arriving in late June.
