National PCC Day 2006: America's partnership

This year's National Postal Customer Council (PCC) Day theme is America's Partnership. The event is scheduled for Sept. 20, and we hope to have 100 percent participation by all PCCs. The host PCCs are Dallas and Fort Worth, TX. The two remote sites participating in this year's live satellite broadcast will be Lambeau Field in Green Bay, WI, and Miami-Dade County, FL (2005 PCC of the Year).

The live broadcast of Postmaster General Jack Potter's keynote address will be available inside the Postal Service on PSTN Channel 15 and USPS TV onDemand *LIVESTREAM*. Externally, it will be available on the DISH Network, Channel 9612 and on Ku Band Satellite — AMC 3, Transponder 3, Downlink Frequency 11760 Horizontal. The broadcast will be at 12 noon Eastern Daylight Time.

PCC is a network of business mailers and representatives of the U.S. Postal Service who gather regularly to discuss and resolve local mailing issues. On both the national and local levels, PCCs work to improve communication between the Postal Service and its customers.

EAS Leadership Development open season

Are you a high-performing and high-potential EAS Level 19 or above employee working in field operations? Do you see yourself driving your performance cluster to success as

a postmaster? How about as a Marketing manager or a manager of Distribution Operations? EAS Leadership Development (ELD) — a new Web-based leadership development tool — may be the key to opening up opportunities for you.

More than 14,000 EAS Level 19 and above area and cluster-level employees can apply for up to three developmental pools during ELD open season. Lead executives for each cluster and area determined which pools to offer to their employees based on their critical operational and support needs for the future. Laptop theft — What are you doing to prevent it?

A laptop stolen is a laptop unlikely to be returned to its owner, with 97 percent never recovered, according to computer industry experts. In past years, laptops were targeted for their hardware value. Now, they could be mined for the data they contain.

Information Technology and the Privacy Office remind you to protect yourself and the Postal Service by following these guidelines:

- Don't store sensitive or non-public employee, business or customer information on laptops unless there is a compelling business need, and only then with management approval. Remember that attachments in e-mail messages also pose a risk. Limit your distribution and retention of sensitive and non-public information in e-mail attachments.
- In the office, lock your laptop to its docking station. For added protection, use a cable lock to secure the laptop to a fixed object. Cable locks are portable. Use them when at home or on travel. Never leave the laptop in plain view at home, in your car or anywhere else.
- Consider whether the nature of your job requires you to have a laptop. If the answer is no, consider switching to a desktop workstation instead.

Protecting information is everyone's job.

USPS recycles trash contracts and saves money

When Supply Management's Eastern Services Category Management Center (CMC) realized USPS paid too much for removal of waste and recycled materials, it renegotiated its contracts.



The CMC turned to CombineNet for its software, which lets vendors offer bids based as much on their own strengths as on USPS requirements. Electronic bidding also lets specialty companies bid on individual or "bundles" of services.

USPS was able to reduce from 51 to 9 the number of suppliers needed to serve 254 facilities, with savings of more than \$779,000 annually.

Fairbanks, AK, Passport Fair



Fairbanks, AK, Post Office had great weather and a busy day during the passport fair.

It was 80 degrees and sunny on the day the Fairbanks, AK, Downtown Station held its passport fair. As a rule, Alaskans don't get to enjoy too many days of such fine weather.

Station Clerk Denise Hernandez organized the fair, along with Station Manager Carolyn Lindquist, Fairbanks Postmaster Robert Fimon and Alaska District Manager Dianne Horbuchuck.

The town had scheduled its "Golden Days" celebration for the same day. And the 54-year-old citywide celebration probably helped make the passport fair a success. Clerks processed 203 passport applications, handed out 75 renewal applications and took more than 123 sets of photos, gathering more than \$8,000 in revenue. "We never had a minute to spare," Hernandez said.

It was a golden day all around.

L.A. station renamed for fallen soldier

The Postal Service renamed the Hancock Post Office in Los Angeles to the John W. Marshall Station last week. Approximately 200 family members, friends and guests attended the ceremony to honor Marshall, who was killed in an ambush in Baghdad on April 8, 2003.

Congresswoman Maxine Waters authored the bill to initiate the name change. Senator Dianne Feinstein introduced the bill in the Senate, and it was enacted to law on July 12, 2005.

Marshall, 50 years old at the time of his death, was a career soldier about to retire who chose to enlist one last time to help in Iraq.

USING AUTOMATED FORMS

How To Work With Adobe Form Client Templates and Data

Although Adobe Form Client replaced F3 Fill as the current forms software standard, many people continue to use F3 Fill. However, you now should be using Adobe Form Client to assure that you have the current version of the form information and data. Below details how to work with templates and data in Adobe Form Client.

Accessing Form Client Templates

In Adobe Form Client, templates and data are separate. You can access the templates on the Postal Service™ Intranet.

1. Go to <http://blue.usps.gov>.
2. Under "Essential Links," click on *Forms*.
3. Browse the forms by either clicking on the number range or the title.
4. Once you have found your form, click on the green icon in the FC column.

Template Tip: If you need help filling out your form, press ALT+F1 from any field. On the upper right side will be the field name. If you click anywhere on the form, the help window will stay open and display each field-help as you tab from field to field.

Importing Saved Data

If you have previously saved your form data, you can import it.

1. If your form opens in your browser's window, select Form/Open Data. If your form opens in a separate Adobe Form Client window, select File/Open Data.

2. Select your data file.

Warning: Do not double-click on the data file because it brings up an old template.

Importing Data From One Form to Another

If you have previously saved data (e.g., your name, address, and Social Security number), you can often import that information into another form. Whenever possible, name the data fields the same. For example:

This Data Element...	Is Named...
First name	Firstname
Social Security number	SSN
The first line of an address	Address1

When the fields from different forms have the same name, you can import form data from one form to another. Just open the new form and then open the data file of the other form.

REVISED FORMS

Updated “Statement of Ownership” Forms for Periodicals Mailers

All publishers who are authorized to mail at Periodicals rates must file PS Form 3526, *Statement of Ownership, Management, and Circulation*, on or before October 1 of each year, at their original entry Post Office™. We updated PS Form 3526 and added a new PS Form 3526-R, *Statement of Ownership, Management, and Circulation (Requester Publications Only)*. Both the revised PS Form 3526 and the new PS Form 3526-R are designed to make the annual filing process easier for mailers and to clarify the circulation and other information that is required on the form.

Publishers may use either the new PS Forms 3526 and 3526-R, dated September 2006, or the last edition of PS Form 3526, dated October 1999, to meet the October 1, 2006, filing requirement. Next year, only the September 2006 editions may be used to meet the October 1 filing deadline.

Note that the new forms cannot be input into *PostalOne!* Therefore, we remind Post Offices to maintain paper files

for all PS Forms 3526 and 3526-R, and to track the completion of these forms outside of *PostalOne!*

The original entry Post Office must ensure that it receives a PS Form 3526 or 3526-R for each publication authorized, and must also review all of the information on the form, including the following:

- Review information regarding the publication, on page 1.
- Check the publication's distribution, on page 2.
- Determine whether to schedule an eligibility review.

In addition, please remind publishers of general and requester publications to publish their PS Form 3526 according to the standards in section 707.8.3 of *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®). The DMM is available on Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

You can order the updated PS Form 3526 and the new PS Form 3526-R from the Material Distribution Center via

touch-tone order entry (TTOE). Call 800-332-0317 and choose option 2.

To register to use TTOE, call 800-332-0317 and choose option 1, extension 2925. Then follow the prompts to leave

a message. Wait 48 hours after registering to place your first order. The following publications are in stock and ready to order now using the following information:

Computer Battery Recall

Beginning August 25, 2006, consumers may mail recalled laptop computer batteries using Parcel Return Service (PRS).

Consumers must package these batteries in the containers provided by the manufacturer (or its agent) and send them only by surface transportation using Parcel Return Service. The label on each box is marked "Consumer Commodity ORM-D — Surface Mail Only" on the address side.

The batteries can be mailed only within the contiguous 48 states, where surface transportation is assured. Postage is paid by the PRS agent.

ELM REVISION

Contests

Effective August 31, 2006, *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 620, Contests, is revised to clarify policies related to contests, including types of awards and approval authority. In addition, the allocation of expenditures for contests based on employee population has been abolished, and guidance is added to show that projected operational savings resulting from the contest should be used as a guideline for determining expenditures. Editorial changes, made throughout the chapter for accuracy and consistency of style, are not substantive.

ELM 620 is published in its entirety below.

[Revise 620 to read as follows:]

620 Contests

621 Scope

This subchapter establishes the policy and procedures for contests and related awards.

622 Objective

Contests are intended to provide a motivational tool for improving performance in particular functions. Such programs can be used for, but are not limited to, safety awareness and sales promotion. Each contest must have a specific start and end date, and the purpose must be clearly defined.

623 Responsibilities

623.1 Approval Authorities

The appropriate district manager, senior plant manager, area vice president, or Executive Committee member approves a proposed contest. The level of approval is determined by the geographic scope of the contest.

623.2 Districts and Plants

The district manager or senior plant manager approves all proposed contests for a district or below. The approving official:

- Determines the appropriateness of each proposed contest in terms of specific objectives to be achieved

and approves or disapproves the contest and the awards to be presented.

- Oversees the accountability of an approved contest in terms of monetary benefits, improved safety, improved customer services, etc.
- Forwards a copy of the proposal for an approved contest to the area functional manager and the area Human Resources manager.
- At the conclusion of each contest, evaluates the results against the objectives and submits a full report to the area functional manager.

623.3 Areas

623.31 Area Vice President

The area vice president approves all proposed area contests.

623.32 Area Functional Managers

The appropriate area functional manager:

- Together with the area Human Resources manager, monitors each area contest to determine compliance with program criteria in 624.1.
- Announces the contest winners.
- Analyzes the results of each contest to determine its benefits to the Postal Service (for example, reduction in the number of motor vehicle accidents, or increase in the number of firms using ZIP+4) and provides the district manager or senior plant manager with any guidance appropriate for future contests.

623.4 Executive Committee Member

The appropriate Executive Committee member:

- Approves all proposed national contests.
- Monitors national contests to ensure compliance with program criteria in 624.1.
- Announces contest winners.

624 Establishment

624.1 Criteria

Responsible officials:

- Establish clear objectives, guidelines, and rules in advance.
- Specify start and end dates.

- c. Structure the contest to make it competitive. (If individual competition is involved, at least 10 employees must be included.)
- d. Establish objectives that are clear and measurable.

624.2 Structure

To achieve the broadest possible participation and facilitate control, responsible officials ensure that each contest:

- a. Is divided into competitive units, such as competition among plants or Post Offices. Competition may also be arranged between comparable units on a single tour, tour against tour, or station or branch against other stations or branches.
- b. Includes all individuals involved in the activity at the organizational level of the contest.
- c. Is conducted within a specific time frame, such as a month, a quarter, or a year.
- d. Has objectives that (1) clearly state what is to be accomplished (for example, reduction in the number of motor vehicle accidents, or increase in the number of firms using ZIP+4); and (2) can be measured.

624.3 Contest Rules

Responsible officials ensure that all rules and procedures (1) are made clear before the contest begins; (2) are posted or distributed to each employee involved; and (3) state the measurable objective that will be used to determine the winners.

625 Implementation

625.1 Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in all contests without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, or physical or mental handicap.

625.2 Evaluation

625.21 Winners

Responsible officials ensure that (1) award decisions are based on the rules and procedures established for each contest; and (2) selection of the winning individual or group is based on a predetermined measurable objective.

625.22 Ties

Responsible officials resolve ties by chance drawing or other equitable form of elimination.

626 Types of Awards

626.1 Acceptable

Acceptable awards are characterized as follows:

- a. Only noncash items such as trophies, plaques, pins, or gift certificates may be awarded.

- b. The value of each award may vary from contest to contest or be graduated within a contest with progressive levels of competition.
- c. To ensure maximum interest, prizes should be alternated periodically, or a variety of prizes should be made available for individual selection from a catalog.
- d. Prizes offered must be appropriate for both sexes.
- e. The maximum value of a contest award cannot exceed \$500. Awards worth more than \$50 must be reported in eAwards. (See ELM 470 for more information on awards.)

626.2 Unacceptable

Cash and cash equivalent items are not authorized as prizes.

627 Limitations

627.1 Number and Types of Contests

The following guidelines apply:

- a. Sponsoring organizations may conduct no more than four contests per year.
- b. Identical contests may not be carried over automatically from year to year.
- c. Approval must be received before each contest, even if it is similar, or identical, to a previously authorized contest.

627.2 Expenditures

627.21 District and Plant Contests

The district manager or senior plant manager determines the total annual expenditure (publicity, printing, awards, pictures, certificates, etc.) for each contest. The expenditure should be offset by operational savings.

627.22 Area Contests

The area vice president determines the amount allocated for areawide contests.

627.23 National Contests

The appropriate Executive Committee member grants prior approval of the amount allocated for nationwide contests.

Election Campaigns — Hatch Act and Other Requirements

Hatch Act Requirements for Postal Service Employees

The Hatch Act affects some political activities, including off-duty activities, for Postal Service™ employees. The Office of Special Counsel, which investigates possible Hatch Act violations, has prepared examples of permitted and prohibited activities for federal, including Postal Service, employees:

Postal Service employees may:

- Be candidates for public office in nonpartisan elections.
- Register and vote as they choose.
- Assist in voter registration drives.
- Express opinions about candidates and issues.
- Contribute money to political organizations.
- Attend political fundraising functions.
- Attend and be active at political rallies and meetings.
- Join and be an active member of a political party or club.
- Sign nominating petitions.
- Campaign for or against referendum questions, constitutional amendments, and municipal ordinances.
- Campaign for or against candidates in partisan elections.
- Make campaign speeches for candidates in partisan elections.
- Distribute campaign literature in partisan elections.
- Hold office in political clubs or parties.

But, Postal Service employees may not:

- Be candidates for public office in partisan elections.
- Use their official authority or influence to interfere with an election.
- Collect political contributions unless both individuals are members of the same federal labor organization or employee organization and the one solicited is not a subordinate employee.

- Knowingly solicit or discourage the political activity of any person who has business before the agency.
- Engage in political activity while on duty.
- Engage in political activity in any government office.
- Engage in political activity while wearing an official uniform.
- Engage in political activity while using a government vehicle.
- Solicit political contributions from the general public.
- Wear political buttons on duty.

Campaigning on Postal Service Premises

Postal Service regulations (see *Postal Operations Manual* 124.54; 39 CFR 232.1; and *Poster 7, Rules and Regulations Governing Conduct on Postal Property*) prohibit campaigning for election to public office on leased or owned Postal Service property. Tell individuals who ask about the availability of Postal Service property for such purposes about the prohibition, and give them a copy of the regulations. The following points will help you interpret and apply the regulations:

- The focus of the regulations is to identify activities that are “prohibited.” Activities that are not prohibited by any of the regulations are permitted. For example, in the context of political campaigning, informational leafleting would be permitted, so long as the information in the leaflet itself is not political campaigning and the leafleting was carried out in a way that does not disrupt Postal Service business.
- Campaigning for election to public office is prohibited on Postal Service property, even if the candidate is independent of any political party.
- The regulations do not prohibit all activities related to political issues. For example, distributing literature pertaining to a referendum or ballot measure is per-

mitted. The regulations do prohibit, however, the solicitation of signatures on petitions, polls, and surveys.

- The regulations prohibit depositing posters or literature on Postal Service property, obstructing entrances, any activity that tends to impede or disturb the public in transacting Postal Service business, the sale of goods, and the solicitation of contributions on Postal Service property.

- The regulations cover activity only on Postal Service premises. Activity outside Postal Service property, even if it affects our premises, is not governed by our regulations.

Holiday Snowflakes Stamps

The Postal Service™ will issue 39-cent *Holiday Snowflakes* special stamps in four designs, on October 5, 2006, in New York, New York (Mega Stamp Show). The stamps, designed by Richard Sheaff of Scottsdale, Arizona, go on sale nationwide October 6, 2006.

In celebration of the winter holiday season, the Postal Service will produce these four stamps featuring photographs of snowflakes. The stamps are photographs of two basic snowflake patterns by physicist Kenneth Libbrecht of Pasadena, California. The patterns are stellar dendrites, which form branching treelike arms and sectoral plates, which form platelike arms.

Because fallen snowflakes start to melt and lose their shape in mere minutes, Libbrecht quickly transferred the snowflakes from cardboard to a glass slide using a paintbrush. He then snapped the photos inside a temperature-regulated enclosure using a digital camera attached to a high-resolution microscope.

The stamps will be issued in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 568600), a double-sided booklet of 20 stamps (Item 675600), a folded vending booklet of 20 stamps (Item 675500), and an ATM sheetlet of 18 stamps (Item 569400).

The Postal Service™ will issue a 39-cent *Christmas: Chacón Madonna and Child with Bird* special stamp in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) double-sided book of 20 stamps (Item 674900), on October 17, 2006, in Denver, Colorado. The stamp, designed by Michael Osborne of Berkeley, California, goes on sale nationwide October 18, 2006.

The stamp features an oil-on-canvas painting with gold details titled *Madonna and Child with Bird*. Dating to around 1765, the painting is attributed to Ignacio Chacón — an artist active from about 1745 to 1775 in Cuzco, Peru. The painting is now part of the Engracia and Frank Barrows Freyer Collection of Peruvian colonial art at the Denver Art Museum.

Michael Osborne slightly cropped the painting's floral “frame” and surrounded the entire composition with a gold border that echoes Chacón’s use of gold-leaf embellishments.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.

- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

over 42" to 44"	24" girth
over 44" to 46"	20" girth
over 46" to 48"	16" girth
	Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main Post Offices™, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in Post Office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other Postal Service facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

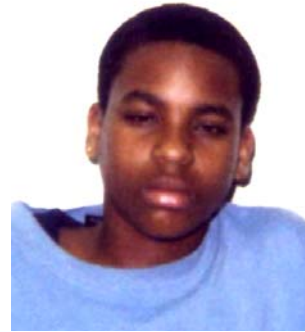

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

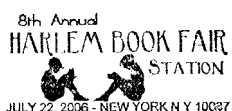
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

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POM REVISION

Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents

Effective August 31, 2006, we are revising 146.112 of the *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) to include a reference to the new PS Form 2856, *Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents*, which appears on page 68 of this *Postal Bulletin*. The form was created to ease compliance with 146.112.d, which requires an accepting employee to document damage to support indemnity claims.

[Revise 146.112 items d and e to read as follows:]

- d. For damage claims, indicate the location of the damaged article on PS Form 1000; complete PS Form 2856, *Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents*; and handle under 146.3. Provide any other information that may help in the adjudication of the claim.
- e. Detach copy 2 of PS Form 1000 and give it to the customer to retain until the claim is settled. Forward copy 1 of the claim form and supporting documentation to the St. Louis Accounting Service Center for processing. (For unnumbered Insured Mail, do not mail copy 1 of PS Form 1000 to the St. Louis Accounting Service Center until **after** processing locally as described in 146.122.)

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146.124 Damage Claim Filed by Addressee

[Revise 146.124 to read as follows:]

If the addressee files a damage claim, part B of PS Form 1000 must be completed to show that the damaged article and mailing container, including any wrapping, packaging, and any other contents they received, were presented for inspection when the claim was filed. Complete PS Form 2856, *Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents*, and handle under 146.3. Provide any other information that may help in the adjudication of the claim. The St. Louis ASC will make payment to the person designated in section A 3a of PS Form 1000 provided the original proof of insurance is submitted with claim. If a dual claim is filed, the claim with the original mailing receipt will be honored.

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Exhibit 146.124

Processing Claims for Damage or Partial Loss of Contents

[Revise Exhibit 146.124 to read as follows:]

All Claims for Damaged/Missing Contents

- Complete PS Form 1000, part B, to show that the damaged article and mailing container, including wrapping, packaging, and any other contents that were received, were presented for inspection when the claim was filed.
- If necessary, return the article to the customer so that an appraisal or estimate can be obtained.
- Use PS Form 3831, *Receipt for Article(s) Damaged in Mails*, to provide a receipt for damaged articles. Note the condition on the form.
- Payment is made to the customer presenting the mailing receipt or to the addressee when designated by the sender as payee.

Exception: (For numbered Insured Mail articles only)

If the addressee paid for repair to a partially damaged article and the endorsement on the wrapper shows that enough insurance was bought to cover the cost of repairs, payment will be made to the addressee unless a claim payment has already been made on the numbered Insured Mail article.

- If the article has no salvage value (below \$10.00), allow the customer to keep it if the customer wants it; otherwise, destroy it.
- If the completely damaged Insured Mail, COD, or Express Mail article has salvage value, retain it until the claim and all appeals are settled, and then forward it to the appropriate mail recovery center.
- For Registered Mail claims, retain the article and the packaging until released by notification from the St. Louis ASC.
- Detach copy 2 of PS Form 1000 and give it to the customer to retain until the claim is settled.
- Complete PS Form 2856, *Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents*. Provide any other information that may help in the adjudication of the claim.
- Forward copy 1 of the claim form PS Form 1000; a copy of PS Form 2856, *Damage Report of Insured Parcel and Contents*; and supporting documentation to the St. Louis Accounting Service Center for processing. (For unnumbered Insured Mail, do not mail copy 1 of PS Form 1000 to the St. Louis Accounting Service Center until after processing locally as described in 146.122.)
- Retain copies of all forms and documentation locally.

* * * * *

146.3 Disposition

146.31 Damaged Article

[Revise 146.31 to read as follows:]

For a completely damaged article with little or no salvage value (under \$10.00), allow the customer to keep the article if the customer wants it; items that may be of a hazardous nature to employees must be destroyed. If the completely damaged Insured Mail, COD, or Express Mail article has salvage value, retain it until the claim and all appeals are

settled, then forward it to the appropriate mail recovery center. For Registered Mail damage claims, retain the article and packaging at the Post Office until released by notification from the St. Louis ASC. Provide the customer with PS Form 3831, *Receipt for Article(s) Damaged in Mails*.

St. Louis ASC will notify the customer in writing that the claimant has 30 days from the date of denial action to recover the article and that he/she has no recourse if, subsequently, the item is disposed of after the 30 days. Articles on which claims are paid, on which the customer has not filed an appeal, or on which the customer fails to recover, should be forwarded to the appropriate mail recovery center on the next weekly dispatch. The status of a claim can be obtained by calling the St. Louis ASC Help Desk at 866-974-2733. Articles being sent to the mail recovery center should not be stripped of the insured labels and must include a copy of the paid claim letter or notice that the item is ready for auction. Always document disposition of damaged articles. Make sure the disposition of the damaged article is clearly annotated on PS Form 1000.


