DMM Revision: Changes to the Commercial Base Pricing Requirements for Priority Mail

Beginning October 1, 2008, the Postal Service™ is updating the requirements for commercial base prices by removing the electronic Confirmation Services requirement for Priority Mail® customers using permit imprint. Commercial base prices will be available for customers using permit imprint when a postal routing barcode matching the destination ZIP™ Code is on the mailpiece. Permit imprint customers mailing flat-shaped mailpieces meeting the criteria as stated in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 301.1.1, General Definition of Flat Size Mail, will be able to use a POSTNET™ or Intelligent Mail® barcode instead of the postal routing barcode to claim the commercial base prices.

The commercial base prices will continue to be available for Click-N-Ship $^{\circledR}$ customers, registered end-users of PC Postage $^{\intercal M}$ products when using a shipping label, and Priority Mail Open and Distribute customers using permit imprint with a service barcode on the address label.

- c. Customers using permit imprint when a postal routing barcode matching the destination ZIP Code is on the mailpiece (see 708.5.0). Flat-shaped mailpieces (see 301.1.1) with permit imprints may bear a POSTNET or Intelligent Mail barcode (see 708.4.0) instead of the postal routing barcode.
- d. Priority Mail Open and Distribute customers using permit imprint when a service barcode containing a

unique service type code 55 is on the address label under 705.16.5.7.

1.0 Basic Standards for Postage Payment

1.1 Postage Payment Options

[Revise text of 1.1 as follows:]

Commercial Priority Mail postage may be paid with Click-N-Ship; PC Postage (e.g., Stamps.com, endicia, Pitney Bowes) when registered end users use a shipping label; or permit imprint with a postal routing barcode on the mailpiece (see 708.5.0). Flat-shaped mailpieces with permit imprints may bear a POSTNET or Intelligent Mail barcode (see 708.4.0) instead of the postal routing barcode.

Publication 52 Revision: New Option for Mailing Cremated Human Remains

Effective September 25, 2008, Publication 52, Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail, is revised to offer a new option for mailing cremated human remains to domestic addresses and to eliminate the current requirement for requesting a return receipt when the remains are sent via Registered Mail™ service.

Currently, the only option for mailing cremated human remains is Registered Mail service with return receipt requested. We now also offer the option to use Express Mail® service as a faster alternative for mailing cremated remains domestically. Since verification of the date and time of delivery for both Registered Mail and Express Mail service is now available online or by telephone, there is no longer a need to require return receipt service and this requirement is now removed.



WORKPLACE HARASSMENT

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS! TAKE RESPONSIBILITY!

ELIMINATING WORKPLACE HARASSMENT

The United States Postal Service™ is committed to providing a work environment free of harassment based upon race, color, religion, sex (including sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender stereotyping), national origin, age (40+), mental or physical disability, or in retaliation for prior Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) activity and other inappropriate conduct.

The Postal Service workplace must be one in which all employees are treated with dignity and respect by supervisors, subordinates, and coworkers. There is no place in the Postal Service for intimidating, threatening, or coercive behavior.

STOPPING INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR

Although not every instance of inappropriate behavior may meet the legal definition of harassment, such behavior in the workplace undermines morale and violates the Postal Service's policies and standards of conduct. Disciplinary action may result even if the conduct does not rise to the level of harassment as defined under the law, as such conduct nonetheless violates Postal Service policy and will not be tolerated. The Postal Service owes its employees a safe, productive, and inclusive workplace and will tolerate nothing less.

WORKPLACE HARASSMENT IS AGAINST THE LAW

Under federal antidiscrimination laws, harassment is defined as unwelcome verbal or physical conduct that demeans or shows hostility or aversion toward an individual or group of individuals. Employees will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including removal, for engaging in harassing behavior such as, but not limited to:

- Making offensive or derogatory comments, nicknames, or slurs.
- Engaging in physically threatening, intimidating, or humiliating actions.
- Making or threatening to make employment decisions based on an employee's submission to, or rejection of, sexual advances or requests for sexual favors.
- Deliberate or repeated unsolicited remarks with a sexual connotation, or physical contact of a sexual nature that is unwelcome to the recipient.
- Behavior that creates a sustained hostile or abusive work environment so severe or pervasive that it unreasonably interferes with or changes the conditions of one's employment.

OBLIGATION TO REACT PROMPTLY

Postal Service employees who believe that they are the victims of workplace harassment or inappropriate conduct, or who have witnessed such harassment, should bring the situation to the attention of any one of the following:

- Your immediate supervisor or manager.
- Any supervisor or manager.
- The manager of Human Resources.
- A union representative or coworker to speak to a manager on your behalf.

CONFIDENTIALITY

The Postal Service, to the extent possible, protects the confidentiality of an employee's workplace harassment complaint.

WHAT USPS REQUIRES OF MANAGERS AND SUPERVISORS

Any manager or supervisor who receives a complaint must act to stop any inappropriate behavior, ensure that a prompt and thorough investigation is conducted, and ensure that harassing or inappropriate conduct does not recur—even if the behavior does not rise to the legal definition of harassment.

MANAGEMENT INQUIRY

All managers and supervisors should follow the Management Inquiry Process materials available in Publication 552 when a complaint is brought to their attention. If workplace harassment or inappropriate conduct is found, managers must take prompt and appropriate remedial action.

ADDITIONAL RELIEF

In addition, employees can seek relief through the EEO complaint process, grievance arbitration procedures established through the collective bargaining agreements with the unions, and the nonbargaining grievance procedures described in the Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM), 650. Employees pursuing an EEO complaint must contact the EEO Centralized Intake Center within 45 days of the act or acts giving rise to the claim in order to preserve their rights under federal law.

CRIMINAL ASSAULT

Report all possible criminal misconduct, sexual or otherwise, to local law enforcement, Postal Management, and the Postal Inspection Service.

RETALIATION IS ILLEGAL


Retaliation against employees who raise a claim of workplace harassment, report inappropriate conduct, or provide evidence in any investigation is illegal and can result in disciplinary action.

ZERO TOLERANCE

The Postal Service will not tolerate any workplace harassment based on race, color, religion, sex (including sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender stereotyping), national origin, age (40+), mental or physical disability, or in retaliation for prior EEO activity, or other inappropriate conduct in the workplace.

Express Mail Hold For Pickup Option Expands to USPS.com

Beginning October 2, customers who want the convenience of picking up packages on their schedule, or who want the peace of mind that comes with secure delivery, can choose the Express Mail[®] Hold For Pickup option through Click-N-Ship[®] service on USPS.com[®].

There are many uses for the service:

- Businesses sending critical parts for repair can put materials in the hands of technicians based on their routes.
- Business and leisure travelers can pick up documents and valuable items at their destination.
- Customers can choose to pick up valuable or larger items at the Post Office[™].
- Parents can send care packages to their kids attending college.

Express Mail Hold For Pickup service notifies the recipient by phone (retail option only), e-mail, or Short Message Service (SMS)/text message (online option only) that the package is available for pickup and, if required, sends a reminder notice on calendar day 3 and a notice that the shipment has been returned to the sender on day 5.

The new Express Mail Hold For Pickup service option for Click-N-Ship service allows customers to locate more than 31,000 convenient Post Office locations where Hold For Pickup is available, pay postage, and print shipping labels.

Customers will receive the following automated notifications via phone, e-mail, or text message informing them of the status of their Express Mail Hold For Pickup shipments:

- Day One An available for pickup notice.
- Day Three A reminder that an Express Mail shipment is available for pickup at the Post Office.
- Day Five A notice that the shipment has been returned to the sender.

Additionally, Post Offices will be automatically notified through the My Post Office application when Express Mail Hold For Pickup shipments do not arrive or are not picked up.

International Mail

New Shipping Requirements

Effective September 30, 2008, the U.S. Census Bureau is requiring mandatory filing of export information through the Automated Export System (AES) or through AESDirect for all international shipments where a Shipper's Export Declaration (SED) was previously required. This requirement was published on June 2, 2008 (Federal Register, June 2, 2008, Volume 73, Number 106, pages 31547–31590, codified at 15 C.F.R. Part 30) as an amendment to the Foreign Trade Regulations (FTR). The regulation impacts all companies, including the U.S. Postal Service[®], that accept outbound international shipments containing goods.

This regulation mandates that Electronic Export Information (EEI) be filed when any type of goods (per Schedule B Export Codes at http://www.census.gov/foreign-trade/schedules/b) is valued at more than \$2,500 or requires an export license under U.S. law. The EEI must be filed through the Census Bureau's AES or AESDirect website by the mailer or authorized agent (USPS never acts as an authorized agent). This information was formerly filed in hardcopy on Commerce Form 7525-V, Shipper's Export Declaration. Paper copies of the SED will no longer be accepted by the U.S. Postal Service. Postal employees will direct customers to the Census Bureau's websites and hotline phone number identified at the end of this article.

When the mailer or authorized agent has filed the EEI, AES will provide an alphanumeric Internal Transaction

Number (ITN), which confirms that EEI was successfully filed. Mailpieces presented to the Postal Service™ must bear the Proof of Filing Citation (PFC), which consists of the letters "AES" followed by the ITN. If the AES is unavailable at the time of filing, the mailer or authorized agent must provide an AES Downtime Citation, instead of the PFC, which consists of the letters "AESDOWN," the user's identification number, and the date. Customers must legibly write the PFC or EEI on the applicable Customs form without obstructing the barcode on the label. On PS Form 2976, Customs Declaration CN 22 — Sender's Declaration, customers may write the number anywhere on the 'green' portion of the form; and on the PS Form 2976-A, Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note - CP 72, they may write it at the top of the form or in any clear space. USPS® is in the process of redesigning both Customs forms to accommodate the electronic export information filing number.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal ServiceTM money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured

state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction. **A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohib-

"Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

 $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.



Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of an e-mailed Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed as noted above for 30 days unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The e-mail network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service[®] only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.



As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. 


