Field Implementation Kit: January 2010 Price Change

Highlights of Changes — Domestic and International Shipping Services

On September 22, 2009, the Governors of the Postal Service™ announced new prices and product features for our Shipping Services product line to be effective Monday, January 4, 2010. We also implement new mailing standards consisting of classification changes to support the price change, as well as other initiatives found in this edition of the *Postal Bulletin*.

The Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act of 2006 gives the Postal Service increased flexibility in pricing, product enhancements, and product introductions for Shipping Services. We will change only the Shipping Services prices in January. On October 15, 2009, the postmaster general announced that there would be no market dominant price increase for calendar year 2010. Market dominant services for domestic mail include First-Class Mail®, Periodicals, Standard Mail®, Package Services, and Extra Services. Market dominant services for international mail include First-Class Mail International™, International Priority Airmail™ (IPA®), International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®), and Extra Services.

The following Shipping Services prices will change for 2010:

- Express Mail®.
- Priority Mail®.
- Parcel Select®.
 - Destination delivery unit.
 - Destination sectional center facility.
 - Destination bulk mail center.
- Parcel Return Service.
- Global Express Guaranteed® (GXG®).
- Express Mail International® (EMI).
- Priority Mail International® (PMI).

Summary of Domestic Changes

Express Mail

On average, Express Mail prices increase by 4.5 percent. Express Mail flat-rate pricing is one flat rate regardless of the actual weight (up to 70 pounds) or domestic destination. The Sunday/holiday premium remains at \$12.50. No other fuel surcharges, Saturday delivery, or residential delivery charges apply. All Express Mail prices can be found in Notice 123, *Price List*, on the Postal Explorer® home page at <http://pe.usps.com>.

Express Mail Retail Prices

Retail prices increase 4.5 percent on average. Other than the flat-rate envelope, retail prices continue to be based on distance (zone) and weight. The Express Mail Flat Rate Envelope retail price will be priced at \$18.30. Other retail prices start at \$13.65.

Express Mail Commercial Base Prices

Commercial base prices increase 4.5 percent on average and continue to average 5 percent lower than retail prices. The Express Mail Flat Rate Envelope will be priced at \$17.40. Commercial base prices are available to customers who:

- Use an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA), including Federal Agency Accounts.
- Pay and print their postage online through Click-N-Ship® service.
- Are registered end-users of USPS®-approved PC Postage® providers using a qualifying shipping label.
- Pay postage using an information-based indicia (IBI) postage meter with an Express Mail label.

Express Mail Commercial Plus Prices

Commercial plus prices increase 4.4 percent on average and continue to average 14.5 percent lower than retail prices. The Express Mail Flat-Rate Envelope will be priced at \$14.96. Commercial plus prices are available to new and existing customers who:

- Have account volume exceeding a minimum threshold, or who have a customer commitment agreement with the USPS, *and*:
 - Use an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA), including Federal Agency Accounts, or
 - Are registered end-users of a USPS-approved PC Postage provider using a qualifying shipping label.

Priority Mail

On average, Priority Mail prices increase by 3.3 percent. Priority Mail flat-rate pricing is one flat rate regardless of the actual weight (up to 70 pounds) or domestic destination. Customers continue to have five convenient choices for flat-rate pricing: the flat-rate envelope, small flat-rate box, medium flat-rate box (two sizes), and the large flat-rate box.

The Priority Mail Flat Rate Envelope and Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box will now be priced separately. Additionally, the 1-pound price will now be based on the zone to which the item is sent. Previously, the 1-pound price was the same across all zones.

Priority Mail Retail Prices

Retail prices increase 3.9 percent on average. Other than the flat-rate packaging, retail prices — starting at \$4.90 — continue to be based on distance (zone) and weight. We continue to offer the Priority Mail Large Flat Rate Box to APO/FPO and DPO destination addresses at \$2 less than retail prices.

Priority Mail Commercial Base Prices

Commercial base prices increase 2.9 percent on average and continue to average 5.7 percent lower than retail prices. Commercial base prices are available for postage paid through:

- Click-N-Ship service.
- Registered end-users of USPS-approved PC Postage providers when using a qualifying shipping label.
- IBI postage meters (in conjunction with an approved shipping label that includes a Confirmation Services barcode with a postal routing code).
- Permit imprint.

Priority Mail Commercial Plus Prices

Commercial plus prices increase 0.9 percent on average and continue to average 9.6 percent lower than retail prices. Commercial plus prices are available to new and existing customers who meet specific volume, or who have a customer agreement with the USPS, and who are:

- Registered end-users of USPS-approved PC Postage products.
- Permit imprint customers.
- Priority Mail Open and Distribute customers.

* New for customers eligible for commercial plus pricing beginning in January include:

- A 1/2-pound price for items weighing up to 1/2 pound.
- A flat-rate padded envelope.
- Cubic pricing for flats and parcels.

Priority Mail Commercial Plus Cubic Pricing

Customers qualify for commercial plus cubic pricing with an annual total volume of 250,000 pieces or more or have a customer commitment agreement with the Postal Service. Each mailpiece must measure 0.50 cubic foot or less, weigh 20 pounds or less, and carry the marking for the applicable tier level.

Five pricing tiers, based on cubic measurement and zone, offer a convenient way for mailers to ship small, dense items.

Items are measured by multiplying the length, height, and width in inches, and rounding off the total. The total is then divided by 1728 and the resulting number will determine which price tier to use. Prices start at \$4.22.

Note: Commercial base and commercial plus prices apply to postage only, and do not include Extra Services such as insurance and Pickup on Demand service.

Parcel Select

On average, Parcel Select prices increase by 4.9 percent. Prices for origin bulk mail center (OBMC), presorted BMC, and barcoded nonpresorted Parcel Select are not changing.

The increase pertains to destination entry only as follows:

- Destination delivery unit (DDU) — 3.9 percent.
- Destination sectional center facility (DSCF) — 6.9 percent.
- Destination bulk mail center (DBMC) — 6.9 percent.

Parcel Select items require a 50-piece minimum when using permit imprint or metered postage. However, new in January, the 50-piece minimum is not required for barcoded nonpresort mailings, provided that postage is paid using approved PC Postage products.

Loyalty and Growth Rebates, established in June 2009, continue to be offered until May 31, 2010.

Parcel Return Service

On average, Parcel Return Service prices increase 3.0 percent as follows:

- Return delivery unit (RDU) — 2.1 percent.
- Return bulk mail center (RBMC) — 3.3 percent.

Parcel Return Service is a companion product for Parcel Select and a convenient way for merchants who receive a large volume of returns to provide a label to their customers for return of merchandise. The merchant guarantees the return postage for these returns.

Summary of International Changes

In addition to the following international Shipping Services changes, the Postal Service adds an individual country listing for Kosovo to reflect its independence from the Republic of Serbia. All services currently available to Serbia will be available to Kosovo, with the exception of Express

Mail International service and Priority Mail International insurance.

We also clarify terminology in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM[®]) by making it consistent with language currently used in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM[®]) and, therefore, delete the use of the term “circular” when it pertains to parcels and change it to “nonrectangular.”

Global Express Guaranteed

On average, Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) prices will increase 4.1 percent. We continue to offer 10 percent lower-than-retail prices when customers prepare and pay for their shipments using commercial base pricing options. GXG is our premier expedited service through an alliance with FedEx Express to over 190 countries. Prices start at \$33.95.

Express Mail International

On average, Express Mail International (EMI) prices will increase 2.9 percent. We continue to offer 8 percent lower-than-retail prices when customers prepare and pay for their shipments using commercial base pricing options.

EMI service provides reliable, high-speed delivery service to over 190 countries with a date-certain, money-back guarantee to select destinations. Prices start at \$26.95.

Priority Mail International

On average, Priority Mail International (PMI) prices will increase 3.0 percent. We continue to offer 5 percent lower-than-retail prices when customers prepare and pay for their shipments using commercial base pricing options.

Unlike domestic offerings, the Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelope and Priority Mail International Small Flat Rate Box remain the same for pricing.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. When are Postal Service[™] shipping prices changing?

A. January 4, 2010. This includes new prices for our shipping services: Express Mail[®], Priority Mail[®], Parcel Select[®] (destination entry only), Parcel Return Service, Global Express Guaranteed[®] (GXG[®]), Express Mail International[®] (EMI), and Priority Mail International[®] (PMI).

Q. Are First-Class Mail prices changing in 2010?

A. No. On October 15, 2009, Postmaster General John Potter announced that the Postal Service will not seek an increase in prices for First-Class Mail[®], Standard Mail[®], Periodicals, Parcel Post[®], and some other services.

Q. Where are the new prices listed?

A. The January 2010 new prices are available on Postal Explorer[®] at <http://pe.usps.com>.

Q. How does the USPS price change compare to the other shipping companies' price changes?

A. Postal Service shipping prices increase by 3.3 percent, on average. By comparison, competitors have announced price increases of nearly 6 percent. Unlike other shipping companies, the Postal Service does not impose surcharges for fuel, residential delivery, or Saturday delivery.

Q. Why are prices going up?

A. The costs of doing business — for things like transportation, utilities, and health care benefits — have continued to increase. Many people do not realize that postal operations are not subsidized by tax dollars. We rely on the sale of postal products and services to cover our operating costs.

Q. Are any prices going down?

A. Yes. For example, the retail price for the Priority Mail Flat Rate Envelope will be reduced from \$4.95 to \$4.90.

Q. Has the Postal Service considered cutting costs rather than raising prices?

A. During fiscal year 2009, which ended September 30, cost reductions totaled more than \$6 billion, while the organization continued to deliver high quality service.

Like many other businesses, the Postal Service cannot fully make up for the increase in its expenses by cutting costs. Many costs are influenced by outside factors such as transportation and economic conditions. However, for each of the past several years, the Postal Service has taken more than a billion dollars in costs out of the system.

Q. Are there any changes to the Express Mail and International price structures?

A. No.

Q. Are there any changes to the Priority Mail price structure?

A. Yes. The Priority Mail 1-pound price now will vary by distance shipped (zone).

In addition, there are new commercial plus prices including a new 1/2-pound price applying to packages weighing up to 8 ounces, a new flat-rate padded envelope priced at \$4.95, and a new cubic volume-based pricing option.

Q. What is Commercial Base pricing?

A. Commercial base pricing is available for qualifying Express Mail and Priority Mail shippers who use the following postage payment methods: Click-N-Ship[®] service, approved PC Postage[®] providers, permit system, and an approved IBI metering device. Express Mail shippers also qualify when they use an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) — including Federal Agency Accounts.

Commercial base pricing is available to GXG shippers who pay postage using IBI postage metering systems, who use Click-N-Ship service, or who are registered end-users of approved PC Postage providers.

Commercial base pricing is available to EMI and PMI shippers who pay postage using IBI postage metering systems and transmit customs forms electronically, who use Click-N-Ship service, or who are registered end-users of approved PC Postage providers. Additional price incentives are available for high volume EMI and PMI shippers.

Q. How much do customers save with Commercial Base pricing?

Q. What is commercial plus pricing?

A. Commercial plus pricing applies to large-volume shippers who qualify for commercial base pricing and who ship more than 100,000 Priority Mail or 6,000 Express Mail packages a year or who have a customer commitment agreement with the Postal Service.

Q. How much do customers save with commercial plus pricing?

A. Compared to retail prices, the savings are as follows:

- Priority Mail — 9.6 percent (on average).
- Express Mail — 14.5 percent.

Q. Who qualifies for the new cubic volume-based pricing option?

A. Priority Mail commercial plus shippers who send 250,000 or more packages a year, or who have a customer commitment agreement with the Postal Service, are qualified.

Q. How exactly does the new Priority Mail commercial plus cubic volume-based pricing option work?

- A. The new option consists of five cubic volume price tiers. Packages are priced based on their size (cubic volume) rather than their weight. The smaller the package, the lower the price. Packages can range in size up to half a cubic foot and weigh up to 20 pounds. The traditional option of paying by weight remains available to all shippers.
- Q. *What are some benefits of the new Priority Mail commercial plus cubic volume-based pricing option?*
- A. Shippers can save money by using the new option. More generally, the new option encourages smaller and more space-efficient packaging. This saves the Postal Service transportation costs and continues our commitment to eco-friendly practices.
- Q. *Are there any changes to Parcel Select mailing standards?*
- A. Yes. The 50-piece volume minimum has been eliminated for barcoded nonpresort packages that are paid using PC Postage.
- Q. *Are there any Parcel Select prices that don't change?*
- A. Yes. There are no price changes for the barcoded nonpresort, BMC-presort, and OBMC-presort categories.
- Q. *How much longer will the Loyalty and Growth Rebate Incentives be available for Parcel Select?*
- A. The Loyalty and Growth Rebate Incentives will be available to qualifying Parcel Select shippers until May 31, 2010.

Statistical Programs Price Change Software Release

The January 2010 Price Change software release provides updates, corrections, and revisions for the following data collection systems:

- City Carrier Cost System (CCCS).
- Rural Carrier Cost System (RCCS).
- In-Office Cost System (IOCS).
- Origin-Destination Information System — Revenue, Pieces, and Weight (ODIS-RPW).
- Transportation Cost System (TRACS).
- System for International Revenue and Volume Outbound — International Origin-Destination Information System (SIRVO-IODIS).
- System for International Revenue and Volume Inbound (SIRVI).

We will automatically distribute the software release to Statistical Programs laptops connected to the Postal Routing Network. We will provide a CD for sites using a dial-up connection. Statistical Programs employees will be notified of the software release, software release notes, and the update CD via e-mail and as a news item on the Statistical Programs webpage on the corporate Intranet.

Statistical Programs employees observe employee work activities and sample live mail at randomly selected points throughout the postal system. Local Operations and Customer Services employees can assist us with the price change by:

- Providing accurate information when data collectors conduct IOCS telephone readings of employee activities.
- Helping data collectors locate employees and mail in Post Offices™ and plants.
- Informing the district manager of Statistical Programs about changes in mail processing, delivery operations, and dispatch schedules.

Data from our systems is used to set prices, fulfill regulatory reporting requirements, measure workloads, detect fraud, prepare budgets, and make operational decisions. Cooperation of all employees is critical to ensure the integrity and accuracy of statistical sampling.

Contract Postal Unit Price Change

On Monday, December 28, 2009, Contract Access Retail System (CARS) at contract postal unit (CPU) sites will receive an automated software update, release 14, effective at 12:01 A.M. on January 4, 2010. This release will include all price and product changes to support the January 4, 2009, Shipping Services price change.

Additionally, on December 28, 2009, integrated retail terminal (IRT) sites will receive an updated diskette, version 85, which will be shipped to the IRT coordinators. District coordinators should distribute the updated diskettes as soon as possible and ensure installation is complete for the price change implementation date.

CPUs with an electronic scale must contact their vendor for update information.

DMM Revision: Pricing and Mailing Standards Changes for Shipping Services

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), to reflect changes to prices and mailing standards for the following Shipping Services:

Express Mail®

On average, Express Mail prices increase 4.5 percent as follows:

- Retail prices — 4.5 percent.
- Commercial base prices — 4.5 percent.
- Commercial plus prices — 4.4 percent.

Priority Mail®

On average, Priority Mail prices increase 3.3 percent as follows:

- Retail prices — 3.9 percent.
- Commercial base prices — 2.9 percent.
- Commercial plus prices — 0.9 percent.

The Priority Mail Flat Rate Envelope and Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box are now separately priced as follows:

- Retail:
 - Flat-rate envelope — \$4.90.
 - Small flat-rate box — \$4.95.
- Commercial base:
 - Flat-rate envelope — \$4.75.
 - Small flat-rate box — \$4.85.
- Commercial plus:
 - Flat-rate envelope — \$4.70.
 - Flat-rate padded envelope — \$4.95.
 - Small flat-rate box — \$4.80.

The 1-pound price for Priority Mail is now priced according to weight and zone based on seven zone separations as follows: (Local, 1, 2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), and (8).

Commercial Plus Prices

New and convenient shipping options for Priority Mail commercial plus mailers are introduced as follows:

- New Priority Mail 0.5-pound price — for items weighing up to 0.5 pound.
- New flat-rate padded envelope — priced slightly higher than the conventional flat-rate envelope.
- New commercial plus cubic prices — for flats and parcels.

Commercial Plus Cubic Prices

To qualify for commercial plus cubic prices, each mail-piece must measure 0.50 cubic foot or less and weigh 20 pounds or less. Mailings must qualify for commercial base prices with an annual total volume of 250,000 pieces or more, or mailers must have a customer commitment agreement with the USPS®. Prices are available to:

- Registered end-users of USPS-approved PC Postage® products.
- Customers who pay postage with permit imprints and use the Electronic Verification System (eVS®) program or submit an electronic postage statement* and a computerized manifest. Mailings must consist of at least 200 pieces or 50 pounds of mail; mailpieces are not required to be identical in weight.

***Note:** *Until further notice, hard copy postage statements will be allowed.* The Postal Service will provide advance notice for mandatory compliance with electronic postage statement submission.

Markings

The appropriate commercial plus cubic price markings are required.

Prices

There are five price tiers, as follows:

- Tier 1 — Mailpieces measuring up to 0.10 cubic foot.
- Tier 2 — Mailpieces measuring more than 0.10 up to 0.20 cubic foot.
- Tier 3 — Mailpieces measuring more than 0.20 up to 0.30 cubic foot.
- Tier 4 — Mailpieces measuring more than 0.30 up to 0.40 cubic foot.
- Tier 5 — Mailpieces measuring more than 0.40 up to 0.50 cubic foot.

Each tier is priced according to the tier level (cubic foot) and zone based on seven zone separations: (Local, 1, 2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), and (8).

Parcel Select®

On average, Parcel Select prices increase 4.9 percent for destination entry only as follows:

- Destination delivery unit (DDU) — 3.9 percent.
- Destination sectional center facility (DSCF) — 6.9 percent.

- Destination bulk mail center (DBMC) — 6.9 percent.

There is no price increase for the following Parcel Select price categories:

- Origin bulk mail center (OBMC).
- Presorted BMC.
- Barcoded nonpresorted.

Parcel Select mailers who pay postage using USPS-approved PC Postage® and request the barcoded nonpresorted price will not have to meet the minimum volume requirement of 50 mailpieces. However, barcode requirements apply. When requesting destination entry and presorted prices, the 50-piece minimum volume requirement applies for mailers using PC Postage.

Parcel Select Loyalty and Growth Rebates will be eliminated effective May 31, 2010.

Parcel Return Service

On average, Parcel Return Service prices increase 3.0 percent as follows:

- Return delivery unit (RDU) — 2.1 percent.
- Return bulk mail center (RBMC) — 3.3 percent.

- Tier 1 — Mailpieces measuring up to 0.10 cubic foot.

For shipping convenience, there are multiple Priority Mail flat-rate boxes as follows: Small flat-rate box to domestic, APO/FPO, and DPO destinations; regular/medium flat-rate boxes (FRB-1) or (FRB-2) to domestic, APO/FPO, and DPO destinations; large flat-rate box or “special version of this box” to APO/FPO and DPO destinations; and large flat-rate box to domestic destinations only. The large flat-rate box to APO/FPO and DPO destinations or “special version of this box” is priced less than the conventional domestic large flat-rate box. Items sent to APO/FPO and DPO destination addresses may be shipped in the Priority Mail large flat-rate box or in a special version of the box identified with the additional logo: “Americasupportsyou.mil.” If the special version of the APO/FPO flat-rate box is used for non-APO/FPO and DPO destination addresses, the domestic or international large flat-rate box prices will apply. Only USPS-produced flat-rate boxes are eligible for the flat-rate box prices. Each USPS-produced Priority Mail flat-rate box is charged a flat rate regardless of the actual weight (up to 70 pounds) of the mailpiece or domestic destination. See Notice 123, *Price List*, for applicable prices.

IMM Revision: Peru — Service Update for Express Mail International

The postal administration of Peru recently informed the Postal Service that Express Mail Service (EMS®) is now available to *all* destinations in Peru. Consequently, in the IMM’s Individual Country Listing for Peru, in the Express Mail International section, under “Areas Served,” we now indicate “All” (previously, we listed only 20 specific areas).

IMM Revision: Customer Deposit of International Mailpieces

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 123.5, 123.712, 215.2, 225.1, 235.1, and part 245 to codify the authorized deposit methods for outbound international mail.

Consistent with the *Federal Register* final rule (74 FR 52144–52147) published October 9, 2009, these changes require that all international outbound mailpieces weighing more than 13 ounces and bearing only postage stamps be presented to an employee at a retail service counter in a Post Office™ facility. Comprehensive revisions are made to the IMM sections discussing mail entry and deposit for Global Express Guaranteed®, Express Mail International®, Priority Mail International®, and First-Class Mail International® services. These revisions identify the authorized places to deposit international mailpieces based on their classification, weight, postage payment method, and customs declarations requirements.

A customer may *not* deposit a Global Express Guaranteed item weighing more than 13 ounces and bearing only postage stamps into a collection box, Postal Service lobby drop, Automated Postal Center (APC) drop, or customer mailbox, or at a Postal Service dock or other unattended location. In addition, these mailpieces are precluded from Pickup on Demand service under 215.3 and Carrier Pickup service under 215.4. Customers must present such items to an employee at a Post Office retail service counter. The Postal Service will return improperly presented items to the sender for proper entry and acceptance.

215.24 Acceptance of Shipments

For purposes of computing the delivery guarantee, Postal Service acceptance of a Global Express Guaranteed ship-

ment occurs when it is received and scanned at a participating Global Express Guaranteed Post Office facility. Collection box deposit and Carrier Pickup service do not constitute Postal Service acceptance of a Global Express Guaranteed shipment. Acceptance occurs when the shipment is brought back to the Post Office facility and the acceptance office performs a retail system scan and verifies the weight, dimensions, and postage of the shipment. For items paid with Click-N-Ship service, the customer will receive an e-mail verification of the acceptance date, time, and weight, as well as a verification of the amount of postage applicable for the shipment.

Note: Customers paying postage online must enter their shipment via any of the authorized methods outlined in 215.21 within 24 hours of the time when the label is printed, or the transaction will be void.

- c. Through Carrier Pickup service (see 235.3).
- d. Into a Postal Service lobby drop.
- e. Into an Automated Postal Center (APC) drop.

Customers must present such items to an employee at a Post Office retail service counter. The Postal Service will return improperly presented items to the sender for proper entry and acceptance.

245.4 Payment Methods Other Than Postage Stamps

IMM Revision: Size Requirements for Express Mail International and Priority Mail International Parcels

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 221.42 and 231.22 and adding a new section 231.23 to better define and clarify our size requirements for Express Mail International® and Priority Mail International® parcels.

Consistent with Article RC 115 of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) Parcel Post Regulations, and to better describe the maximum size dimensions for Priority Mail International parcels, we have deleted our previous reference to “circular parcels” and “rectangular parcels” in IMM 231.22. In the past, parcels that were neither circular nor rectangular were technically nonmailable, but the revised text incorporates parcels of different shapes.

To further assist mailers, we have added new section 231.23, which includes an exhibit that provides five examples on how to determine dimensions of length or length and girth combined for rectangular and nonrectangular parcels. We have also made a corresponding reference in 221.42 to direct Express Mail International customers to this same exhibit for determining dimensions of length or length and girth combined.

IMM Revision: Authorized Personal Correspondence Permitted in Priority Mail International — Update

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 232.2 and 232.3 to authorize certain correspondence to be included in Priority Mail International® parcels. In the IMM's Individual Country Listings, we are making appropriate revisions by deleting the references that indicate that personal correspondence in Priority Mail International parcels is not permitted. In each Individual Country Listing, these references appeared twice in the Priority Mail International section (in a note under the price table and in the "Flat Rate" section).

This revision is consistent with adopted Proposal 20.15.3 Rev. 1, amending Article 15 of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) Convention to authorize certain correspondence to be included in Priority Mail International parcels, including the Priority Mail International regular/medium and large flat-rate boxes.

In part, this resolution was adopted by UPU members in recognition that the current prohibition against enclosing correspondence in parcels is an inconvenience to many customers who want to send merchandise (particularly gifts) and also want to include some form of current greeting or note of congratulations for a special occasion. The same is true for a business that would like to enclose a brief note of gratitude for the customer's business or some other

business-related correspondence such as a personalized advertisement. Moreover, other regulations might require that parcels include some types of correspondence, such as invoices or statements of account (which can be viewed as current and personal correspondence). UPU members agreed that there is no longer a sound business reason to prevent such incidental enclosures.

In addition, this revision will allow businesses to use Priority Mail International service to ship documents having the character of personal correspondence (such as records or files) from one location to another, even when they are not exchanged between the sender and the addressee.

Note, though, that this revision does not permit the use of Priority Mail International parcels for sending letter-post items addressed to multiple addressees for local distribution, thereby preserving the existing prohibition against re-mail activities.

IMM Revision: Nonmailable Items Prohibited in All Outbound International Mail — Update

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) part 136 to include additional items that are nonmailable in outbound international mail, regardless of mail classification.

As adopted by the 24th Congress of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in Geneva, Switzerland, from July 23–August 12, 2008, and consistent with Proposals 20.15.2 and 20.15.6, which amend Article 15 of the UPU Convention, we are revising IMM 136 by renaming the title from "Nonmailable Dangerous Goods" to "Nonmailable Goods." The previous information contained in IMM 136 is redesignated as 136.1, and we are inserting two new sections — 136.2, "Inert Replica and Explosive Devices," and 136.3, "Counterfeit and Pirated Items."

Consistent with UPU Resolution 20.15.2, the revision to IMM 136.2 to make inert replica and explosive devices nonmailable is intended to apply to devices that were originally designed for military or combative use (including training) and is also extended to replicas of such items. However, this prohibition does not extend to children's toys or such articles that do not represent the items in a

realistic manner. Consequently, IMM 136.2 codifies that replica and inert explosive devices and military ordnance, including inert grenades, inert shells, and the like, are nonmailable in any classification of outbound international mail.

Consistent with UPU Resolution 20.15.6, the revision to IMM 136.3 to make counterfeit and pirated articles nonmailable is intended to reduce the circulation of such articles between UPU members. The prohibition also illustrates that UPU members actively support the World Customs Organization's current campaign to thwart production and circulation of counterfeited and pirated products such as dangerous toys and electrical items, dangerous counterfeit medicines, and those counterfeit branded goods that do economic harm to domestic and international companies. Consequently, IMM 136.3 codifies that counterfeit or pirated articles are nonmailable in any classification of outbound international mail.

The following dangerous goods (hazardous materials, as defined in DMM 601) are prohibited in outbound international mail:

- a. Explosives or explosive devices.
- b. Flammable materials.
 1. Pyrophoric, flammable, or combustible liquids with a closed cup flash point below 200°F.
 2. Flammable solids, including matches.
- c. Oxidizers.
- d. Corrosives, liquid or solid.
- e. Compressed gases.
 1. Flammable.
 2. Nonflammable with an absolute pressure exceeding 40 psi at 70°F or 104 psi at 130°F.
- f. Poisons, irritants, controlled substances, and drug paraphernalia.

- g. Magnetized material with a magnetic field strength of 0.002 gauss or more at a distance of 7 feet.
- h. Dry ice (carbon dioxide solid).

136.2 Inert Replica and Explosive Devices

The following types of replica or inert explosive devices are prohibited in outbound international mail:

- a. Military ordnance, ammunition, and shells.
- b. Grenades.
- c. Similar devices that were originally designed for military or combative use (including training).

This prohibition does not extend to items such as children's toys or articles that do not represent the above items in a realistic manner.

136.3 Counterfeit and Pirated Items

Any type of counterfeit or pirated article is prohibited in outbound international mail.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPO/DPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The Postal Service™ is required to post the information provided below regarding the Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act of 2008 (“GINA”), which took effect on November 21, 2009. This information should be posted on all employee bulletin boards adjacent to Poster 72, *EEO is the Law*.

Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act (GINA)

IMM Revision: Return Address Requirement for All Mailpieces in Outbound International Bulk Mailings

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 122.2, 292.41, and 293.41 to codify that mailpieces prepared as a bulk mailing must bear a U.S. return address.

We are making this change to be consistent with amended regulation Article RL 123.10 of the Universal Postal Union’s Letter Post Regulations. This amendment requires that mailpieces prepared as a commercial bulk mailing must bear a return address located in the mailing’s country of origin and that the return address must be visible on the outside of the mailpiece. For Postal Service purposes, an international “bulk mailing” is any International Priority Airmail™ (IPA®) or International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®) mailing, or any other mailing paid with an advance deposit account and presented to the Postal Service for acceptance.

122.2 Return Address

122.21 General

Due to heightened security, many foreign postal administrations require complete sender and addressee information in roman letters and Arabic numerals on postal items. All outbound international mail should bear a complete return address of the sender. Only one return address may be used, and it must be located so that it does not affect either the clarity of the address of destination or the application of service labels and notations (postmarks, etc.).

122.22 Required Use of Return Address

In the case of bulk mailings, all mailpieces must bear a U.S.-origin return address visible on the outside of the mailpiece. For the purpose of this section, a “bulk mailing” is any IPA or ISAL mailing, or any other mailing paid with an advance deposit account and presented to the U.S. Postal Service for acceptance.

122.23 Return Address Elements and Placement

For U.S.-origin mailpieces, minimum elements must include a complete street number and name (or Post Office box num-

ber), city name, state name (or authorized two-letter state abbreviation), and the correct 5-digit ZIP Code or ZIP+4 code. The return address should appear in the upper left corner of the address side of the envelope, card, flat, or package. It is also recommended that U.S.-origin mailpieces include “United States” on the last line of the return address. Unregistered items bearing a return address in another country are accepted only at the sender’s risk. Items authorized to bear a return address in another country must include the proper return address elements (including the country name) to ensure the proper return of the mailpiece. The return address should appear in the upper left corner of the address side of the envelope, card, flat, or package.

IMM Revision: Special Drawing Right Values and Indemnity Limits for Ordinary Priority Mail International Parcels and Registered Mail Service

Effective January 1, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising the following sections in *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) to reflect a change in the conversion rate between special drawing right (SDR) values and U.S. dollars, and to reflect changes to the indemnity limits for ordinary Priority Mail International® parcels and Registered Mail™ items (which are affected by the SDR values):

- a. Exhibit 232.63.
- b. Section 324.12.
- c. Exhibit 324.12.
- d. Section 333.2.
- e. Section 934.2.
- f. The Individual Country Listing for each country that offers Registered Mail service.

Postal Service retail employees use this information, and the limits listed in exhibit 232.63, when a customer presents an ordinary parcel for mailing. Postal Service retail employees use section 324.12 and exhibit 324.12 when a customer presents an insured parcel for mailing, subject to availability in the destination country. For insured parcels, employees must write the insured amount, stated in terms of both dollars and SDR values, in the designated blocks on PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note – CP 72*.

IMM Revision: Updates to Various Individual Country Listings

Effective January 4, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) in various parts of the Individual Country Listings (ICLs) for Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Mongolia, Philippines, Russia, Sudan, and Uzbekistan. These changes are made and adopted at the request of these individual countries at the 24th Congress of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) held in Geneva, Switzerland, from July 23–August 12, 2008, or at previous Congresses as demonstrated by the Final Protocol to the UPU Convention.

- a. Consistent with Final Protocol Articles VII and VIII, Iran does not accept letters or parcels containing articles contrary to the principles of the Islamic religion. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are modifying the second prohibition to read as follows: “Books, newspapers, printed matter, writing, records, pictures, emblems and any other articles of a seditious or immoral nature or contrary to the principles of the Islamic religion or accepted customs.”

- b. Consistent with adopted Proposal 23.8.4 and 23.9.3, Kazakhstan will no longer accept Registered Mail™ items, ordinary parcels, or insured parcels containing coins, banknotes, credit notes or any securities payable to bearer, checks, precious metals (whether manufactured or not), precious stones, jewels and other valuable articles, and foreign currency. Kazakhstan will not accept liability in cases of loss or damage to such items if they are accepted. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are adding a prohibition to read as follows: “Coins, banknotes, credit notes or any securities payable to bearer, checks, precious metals (whether manufactured or not), precious stones, jewels and other valuable articles, and foreign currency are prohibited. Kazakhstan will accept no liability for loss of or damage to such items.” In addition, in the Restrictions section, we are deleting the restriction that reads as follows: “Coins, banknotes, letters of credit or securities payable to bearer, checks, precious

- metals (whether manufactured or not), precious stones, jewels, or other valuable articles may be mailed only as insured Priority Mail International parcels.”
- c. Consistent with adopted Proposal 23.4.1, Kazakhstan limits the maximum weight of inward and outward M-bags to 20 kilograms. Consequently, in the First-Class Mail International section, we are revising the weight limit for airmail M-bags to 44 pounds (reduced from 66 pounds).
- d. Consistent with adopted Proposal 23.8.3, Kyrgyzstan no longer accepts ordinary, registered letterpost items containing coins, currency notes or securities of any kind payable to bearer, travelers checks, platinum, gold, or silver (whether manufactured or not), precious stones, jewels, or other valuable articles. Kyrgyzstan will not accept liability in cases of loss or damage to such items if they are accepted. Consequently, in the Restrictions section, we are adding the following restriction: “Coins; currency notes or securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler’s checks; platinum, gold, or silver (whether manufactured or not); precious stones; jewels; or other valuable articles may be mailed only as insured Priority Mail International parcels. Kyrgyzstan will not accept liability in cases of loss or damage to such items if they are accepted.”
- e. In Final Protocol Article VIII, Lebanon identifies the prohibited items that it will not accept. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are adding the following entry: “Liquids, easily liquefiable elements, and glass or similarly fragile articles.”
- f. In Final Protocol Article VIII, Mongolia identifies the prohibited items that it may not accept in parcels. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are adding the following entry: “Coins, bank notes, securities payable to bearer, and traveler’s checks.”
- g. In Final Protocol Articles VII and VIII, the Philippines identifies the prohibited items that it will not accept in letters and in parcels. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are deleting the following entry: “Coins; banknotes; currency notes; traveler’s checks; or securities of any kind payable to bearer in **ordinary** mail. Such articles are only permissible in Registered Mail.” In addition, also in the Prohibitions section, we are adding the following two entries:
1. “Coins; currency notes or securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler’s checks; platinum, gold, or silver (whether manufactured or not); precious stones; or other valuable articles.”
 2. “Liquids, easily liquefiable items, and glass or similarly fragile articles.”
- h. Consistent with adopted Proposals 23.8.5 and 23.9.2, Russia no longer accepts registered items or ordinary or insured parcels containing bank notes in circulation, securities of any kind payable to bearer, or foreign currency, and it accepts no liability in cases of loss or damage to such items. Consequently, in the Restrictions section, we are adding the following entry: “Bank notes in circulation, securities of any kind payable to bearer, or foreign currency may be mailed only as insured Priority Mail International parcels. Russia will not accept liability in cases of loss or damage to such items if they are accepted.”
- i. In Final Protocol Article VIII, Sudan identifies the prohibited items that it will not accept. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are adding the following entry: “Liquids, easily liquefiable items, and glass or similarly fragile articles.”
- j. Consistent with adopted Proposal 23.9.2, Uzbekistan no longer accepts ordinary or insured parcels containing bank notes in circulation, securities of any kind payable to bearer, or foreign currency, and it accepts no liability in cases of loss or damage to such items. Consequently, in the Prohibitions section, we are modifying the first prohibition to read as follows: Coins, bank notes in circulation, checks, postage stamps, currency, securities of any kind payable to bearer, or foreign currency. Uzbekistan will not accept liability in cases of loss or damage to such items if they are accepted.
- k. Consistent with adopted Proposal 23.4.1, Uzbekistan limits the maximum weight of inward and outward M-bags to 20 kilograms. Consequently, in the First-Class Mail International section, we are revising the weight limit for airmail M-bags to 44 pounds (reduced from 66 pounds).

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the IMM and into the monthly update of the online IMM, which is available via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

POM Revision: Detention of Mail

There have been recent reports of the improper disposition of franked mail found in Postal Service™ collection mail. Section 491.523 of the *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) prohibits Postal Service employees from detaining franked mail, except in situations involving mail security. In addition, Postal Service employees who suspect abuse of franked mail privileges should refer the matter to officials of the Pricing and Classification Service Center (PCSC).

Effective December 3, 2009, the POM is revised to reflect the title of the PCSC and to clarify the chain of referral for suspected abuse of franked mail privileges.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.
