

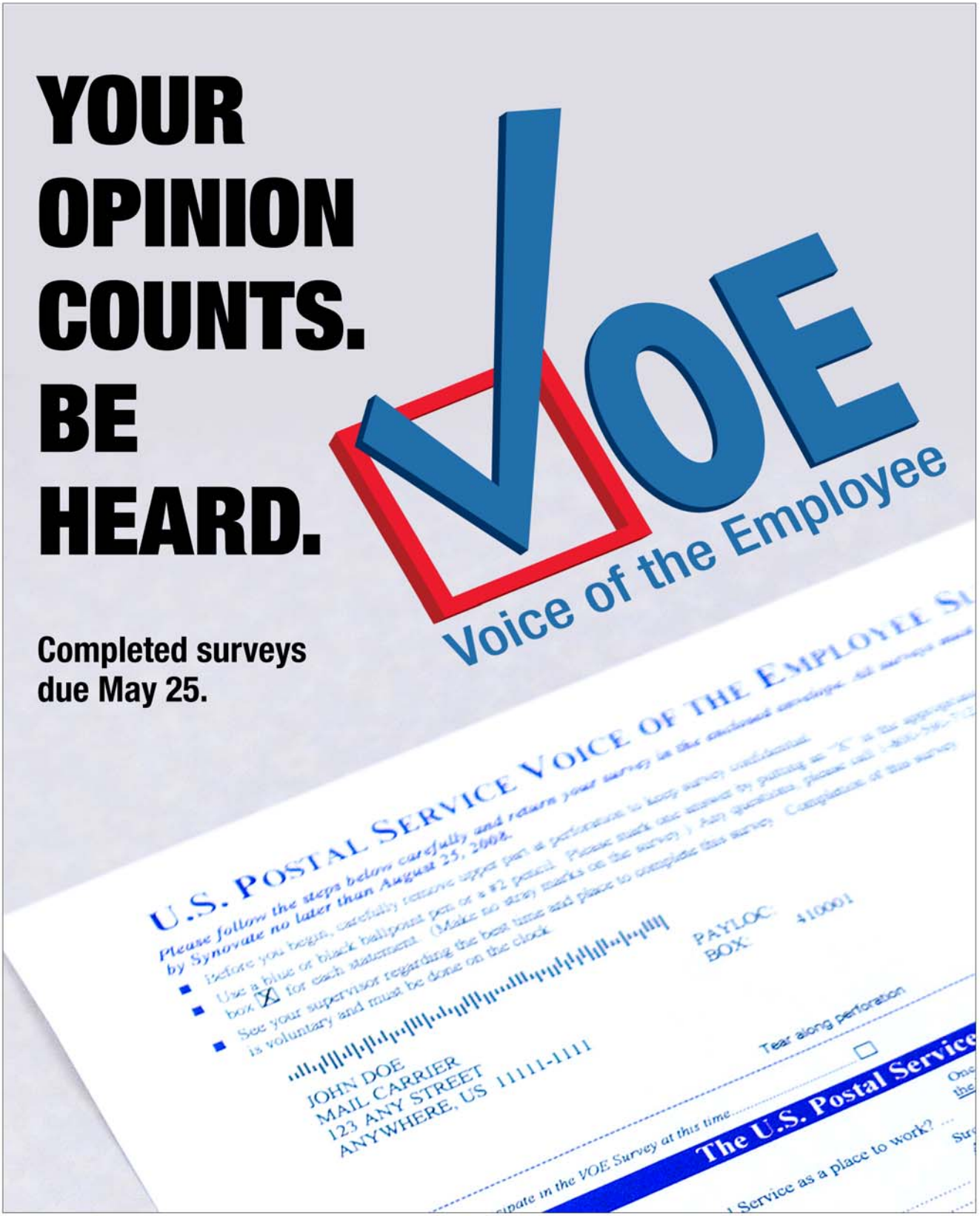

## Manuals

### DMM Revision: Click-N-Ship Insurance Indemnity Coverage Increase — Feasibility Test Extension

Effective June 7, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 709.4 to extend the feasibility test period that permits the purchase of domestic Click-N-Ship® online insurance coverage up to \$5,000.00.

The feasibility test was previously scheduled to end on May 14, 2010. With this extension, the Postal Service reserves the right to end the test prior to or extend it beyond November 14, 2010. Additional mailing and claims data will be analyzed during the program to determine whether this should be a permanent offering, revised, or terminated.

The feasibility test increases online insurance indemnity coverage for domestic Express Mail® service and Priority Mail® service from \$500.00 to \$5,000.00 when purchased through Click-N-Ship service. Increased online insurance indemnity will not be available for any other class of mail, even when postage is paid through Click-N-Ship service.

#### **4.0 Click-N-Ship Indemnity Increase for Express Mail and Priority Mail**

##### **4.1 Basic Information**

### DMM Revision: New Facing Identification Mark E Pattern

Effective June 7, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 708.9 to add a new facing identification mark (FIM) E pattern that will be used for future customized services. Currently, other FIM patterns are used for Business Reply Mail® items, Courtesy Reply Mail™ items, meter reply mail, information-based indicia (IBI) meters, and PC Postage® systems.

The new FIM E pattern will be used to orient, separate, and capture an image of the mailpiece on the Advanced Facer Canceler System (AFCS). It is limited to specific programs currently under development by the Postal Service. Customers must be participating in one of these programs and pre-approved to use FIM E on mailpieces.

The FIM E pattern is introduced to support the testing of a new consumer postage payment option that provides an

easy, convenient way to mail single-piece First-Class Mail® items without affixing postage.

A limited number of postcards bearing the new FIM E pattern have been printed and will be inducted into the mailstream. The postcards will feature the following four elements that will ensure postage is collected:

- **Intelligent Mail Barcode (IMb):** The IMb consists of a two-digit barcode identifier, a three-digit service type code, a six- or nine-digit Mailer ID, and a six- or nine-digit serial number. The routing code is not included in the IMb. The mail processing equipment reads customer and tracking information encoded in the IMb and generates important operational data.
- **Legend:** The legend contains the class of mail, permit number, city, and state where the permit is held, and

identifies the business customer responsible for paying the postage.

- FIM: The new FIM E will be used to orient, separate, and capture an image of the mailpiece on the AFCS.
- Imprint: “No Postage Necessary If Mailed in the United States” appears in the upper right corner of the address side of the mailpiece in lieu of postage.

## **236 Other Special Philatelic Postmarks**

### **236.1 Philatelic Service Postmarks**

Philatelic service postmarks are permanent pictorial rubber hand stamps that are permitted for large city Post Offices with philatelic centers or windows. Postmarking service is available only at authorized philatelic centers or philatelic windows and is generally used for postmarking mail entering the mailstream. The use of philatelic service postmarks outside of a philatelic center or window (e.g., tourist sites and museums) must be reviewed and approved by Stamp Services.

### Revised Handbook AS-805-C, Information Security for General Users

Effective immediately, Handbook AS-805-C, *Information Security for General Users*, is revised. The April 2010 edition has been updated to reflect the following:

- Passwords: Encourage use of longer passwords, discourage poorly constructed passwords, and recognize that passwords may be written down but must be protected.
- Use of Information Resources: Update section for current technology and threats.
- Network Connectivity Review Board (NCRB) Request Form: Indicate where to find the current version of the NCRB Request Form.
- Sensitive Information: Update classification terminology and protection requirements.
- Incidents: Add additional examples of incidents and two new payment card industry requirements.

### Publication 75, Mover's Guide, News: the May 2010 Mover's Guide Has Been Distributed

The May 2010 issue of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, has been shipped to all Post Offices™. Recycle all expired versions.

#### Mover's Guide Schedule Information

- *Mover's Guide* is printed and distributed three times per year — December (for January use), April (for May use), and August (for September use).
- Offices will receive their copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments arrived in mid-April. The second shipments will arrive 4 to 6 weeks later. Shipments will be sent in quantities of 25, 100, and 300.
- Your facility may receive *Mover's Guide* copies addressed to other offices. Please check the labels and forward the guides as necessary. Remember to scan delivery confirmations affixed to each box.

#### Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program

The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is here to stay! Below are a few reminders about program compliance:

- Continue to keep *Mover's Guide* copies behind the counter. No *Mover's Guide* copies should be placed in the inner or outer lobby or on the retail counters.
- Retail associates should *encourage* their customers requesting change-of-address information to go online to [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com). Internet change-of-address (ICOA) transactions provide customers with the most convenient, safe, and secure way to change their address. Furthermore, ICOA transactions reduce processing time, improve address accuracy, and generate significant revenue for the Postal Service.
- Advise customers to take an ICOA Message Card to reinforce the online change-of-address message.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com) should be given a complete, unopened *Mover's Guide*.

**Note:** The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is part of the ad-hoc section of the 2010 Retail Customer Experience Program. While offices are not scored in this

section of the Retail Customer Experience evaluation, it is still imperative that your Post Office be compliant with the program throughout the year by keeping *Mover's Guide* copies out of Post Office lobbies.

#### ICOA Message Card Information

- If your Post Office has an ICOA Message Card display, *do not throw it away*. Expect to receive ICOA Message Card replenishment boxes labeled with red text with your *Mover's Guide* shipments. Inside you will find more ICOA Message Cards and an updated banner for your display.
- If your Post Office *does not* have an ICOA Message Card display, you must call 800-816-6837 for replenishment.
- If any Post Office runs out of ICOA Message Cards between shipments, call 800-816-6837 for replenishment.
- *All* Post Offices must have ICOA Message Cards in their lobbies for customer reference.

### Stamp Announcement 10-16: Oscar Micheaux

On June 22, 2010, in New York, New York, the Postal Service™ will issue a 44-cent, *Oscar Micheaux* commemorative stamp in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 464900). The stamp, designed by Derry Noyes, Washington, DC, goes on sale nationwide June 22, 2010.

The 33rd stamp in the *Black Heritage* series honors pioneering filmmaker Oscar Micheaux, who wrote, directed, produced, and distributed more than 40 movies during the first half of the 20th century. An ambitious, larger-than-life figure, Micheaux thrived at a time when African-American filmmakers were rare, venues for their work were scarce, and support from the industry did not exist. Micheaux's entrepreneurial spirit and independent vision continue to inspire new generations of filmmakers and artists.

The stamp features a stylized portrait of Oscar Micheaux by artist Gary Kelley, Cedar Falls, Iowa. The artwork is based on one of the few surviving photographs of Micheaux, a portrait that appeared in his 1913 novel, *The Conquest*.

The diary page comes with a maxi card with the *Oscar Micheaux* stamp affixed and cancelled, plus a pane of 20 stamps (Item 464976, \$13.95).

## Distribution: Item 464900, 44-cent Oscar Micheaux PSA Pane of 20 Stamps

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution centers (SDCs) will receive approximately 50 percent of their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA sheet stamp. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 40,000 stamps.

## Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs/SDCs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices of 25 percent of their standard automatic distribution quantity using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*. SDOs must not distribute this commemorative sheet to Post Offices before June 8, 2010.

## Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional quantities of Item 464900 must requisition them from their designated SDO/SDC using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional commemorative sheets must order them from the appropriate SDC using PS Form 17. For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the Kansas City, Dulles, Atlanta, Binghamton, Phoenix, and Portland SDCs will receive additional commemorative sheets.

## Sales Policy

All Post Offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists, until inventory is depleted, or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

# Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

## U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

### How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

### Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



*Note 1:* When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

*Note 2:* On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

## POW-MIA Flag

### How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

### Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

*Stamp Distribution Offices and Stamp Distribution Centers.* SDOs and SDCs will only receive an automatic distribution of Item 334300. Automatic distributions to SDOs and SDCs began May 1, 2010, and will be complete by May 30, 2010. There will *not* be an automatic distribution of this stamp to Post Offices. SDOs/SDCs must not distribute the *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation* stamps to Post Offices before June 11, 2010.

*Post Offices.* To allow postmasters to order the 2010–2011 *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation* stamps in quantities approximating customer demand, there is no minimum ordering quantity. Postmasters should review their previous year’s sales records to determine the appropriate number of the 2010–2011 *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation* stamps to requisition.

**Pictorial Postmarks Announcement**

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

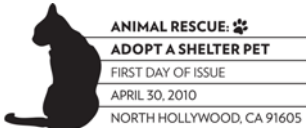

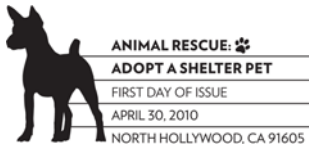

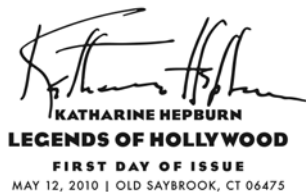

### Stop Sending Copies of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application, to Headquarters

Offices are no longer required to send a copy of PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service® (PFS®) Application*, to Headquarters (HQ). This requirement ended in 2007 when the application was revised and page 4 (HQ copy) was removed. In 2005, the PFS program office at HQ required a copy of page 4 when PFS was an experiment. However, the experiment ended in 2007 when PFS became an official product offering. Offices that still send copies to HQ are wasting workhours and money — especially some offices that send them by Express Mail®, Registered Mail®, and Priority Mail® service.
