### DMM Revision: New Optional Design for Letter-Sized Booklets

Effective June 7, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 201.3.15.1 to modify language that refers to the bound edge of a booklet as an edge and to rename the bound edge as the spine; to modify the reference to cover paper for one design format; to extend booklet design parameters; and to introduce a second folding option in the folded booklet category.

The Postal Service modifies the text of simple spine basic booklets in 201.3.15.5 in reference to cover paper.

Design parameters are extended for the basic format in the simple spine booklet category, which will allow mailers to prepare simple spine basic booklets with a front panel that is up to 1/4 inch shorter than the interior pages and back panel.

The Postal Service also introduces a second folding option in the folded booklet category. To accommodate the addition of this second format, the folding formats are defined by the position of the bound edge (spine) when the mailpiece is folded to letter size.

#### 3.15 Booklets

##### 3.15.1 Definition

[Revise the text of 3.15.1 as follows:]

Booklets must have a bound edge (spine.) Sheets that are fastened with at least two staples in the manufacturing fold (saddle stitched), perfect bound, pressed-glued, or joined together by another binding method that produces a spine where pages are attached together are considered booklets. Booklets are open on three sides before sealing, similar in design to a book. In general, booklets must be uniformly thick. Large bound booklets that are folded for mailing may qualify for automation and machinable prices if the final mailpiece remains nearly uniform in thickness and conforms to all other automation standards.

##### 3.15.5 Simple Spine

[Delete the last sentence of the introductory text of 3.15.5 to read as follows:]

The spine forms the bottom edge of the mailpiece. The length or method used to seal the booklet determines the weight of the paper forming the cover.

[Revise the last sentence of the Simple Spine Booklets header text regarding cover paper weight changing the paper weight from 70 to 80 pounds; and revise the content of the "Basic" booklet to read as follows:]

### 3.15.8 Folded Booklets

[Revise the introductory paragraph of 3.15.8 as follows:]

Folded booklets are mailpieces that are bound and then folded to letter size. The folded spine may be the leading edge or at the top of the booklet. If necessary, the booklet may be prepared with the spine as the trailing edge, however, this configuration is not recommended. The cover is at least 40-pound paper. Folded booklets must be sealed with nonperforated 1.5" tabs.

[Revise the last sentence of the Folded Booklets header text regarding cover paper weight; add new title "Vertical Spine" to the current folded booklet and revise the content of the booklet; and add new folded booklet "Horizontal Spine" to read as follows:]

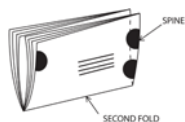

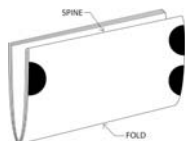
##### Vertical Spine



Cover paper weight: 40-pound paper

Two 1.5" nonperforated tabs on leading edge and one tab on trailing edge. Position upper tabs within 1" from the top edge. Position lower leading tab 0.5" from the bottom edge.

##### Horizontal Spine



Cover paper weight: up to 9" L = 50 lb.

over 9" L up to 10.5" = 60 lb.

Tabs: up to 2 oz. = 1.5" nonperforated tabs

over 2 oz. = 2" nonperforated tabs

Spine at top on address-side panel

Place one tab on the leading and trailing edge within 1" from the top; position one tab on the lower leading edge 0.5" from the bottom.

## DMM Revision: New Deflection Standards for Commercial Flat-Size Mail

Effective June 7, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 301.1.6 and 1.7 to implement new deflection standards on commercial flat-size mail.

On March 18, 2010, the Postal Service published a final rule in the *Federal Register* (75 FR 12981–12988) announcing deferred implementation of new deflection standards for commercial flat-size mail from January 4, 2010, to June 7, 2010, to allow mailers more time to transition to the new standards. The January implementation represented a delay from the originally planned implementation of May 2009.

The new deflection standards encompass all commercial flat-size mailpieces, except those Periodicals and Standard Mail® flats mailed at saturation and high-density flats prices and basic carrier route flats dropshipped to destination delivery units. The new deflection standards allow 1 inch less of vertical deflection (droop) than is currently allowed; as an example, 3 inches of deflection will be allowed for flats 10 inches or longer.

This change modifies the test process in accordance with suggestions from members of the mailing community. It also describes the applicable prices in the event that a flat-size piece does not meet the deflection standard. The price consequences are deferred until October 3, 2010, to allow mailers even more time to comply with the new standards.

Many mailers have redesigned their pieces, but there are still some flats that exhibit too much “droop” to comply with the deflection standards. We strongly recommend that mailers with “droopy” flats redesign their pieces by a variety of methods such as using heavier paper, adding tabs, repositioning spines, or other means as soon as possible to enable USPS® to process more flats on automated equipment, increasing efficiency and providing timely service for these mailings.

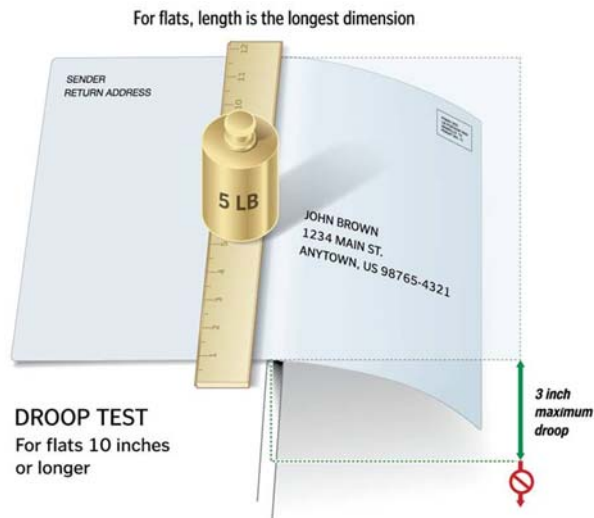

#### **1.6 Maximum Deflection for Flat-Size Mailpieces**

Flat-size mailpieces must be flexible (see 1.3) and must meet maximum deflection standards. Flat-size pieces mailed as high density or saturation carrier route pieces, and basic car-

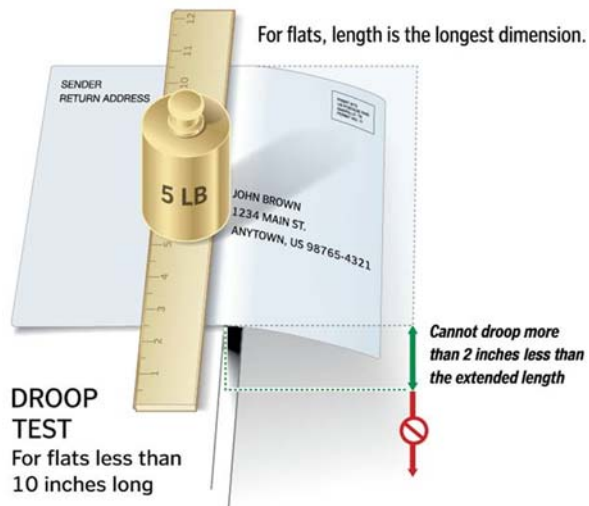
rier route pieces entered by the mailer at destination delivery units (DDUs), are not required to meet these deflection standards. Flat-size pieces mailed as basic carrier route pieces that are not entered at DDUs are not exempt from meeting the standards. Test deflection as follows:

- a. For pieces 10 inches or longer (see Exhibit 1.6a):
  1. Place the piece on a flat, straight-edge surface with the length perpendicular to the edge of the surface, and extend the piece 5 inches off the edge of the surface. Test square-shaped bound flats by placing the bound edge parallel to the edge.
  2. Place a flat 12-inch ruler (or other similar flat object 12 inches or longer) on top of the mailpiece with the length parallel to the edge of the surface and as close to the edge as possible so that the 5-pound weight (see 1.6a3) does not extend past the edge.
  3. Place a certified 5-pound weight on the center of the ruler to hold the piece in place.
  4. Determine the vertical deflection in inches.
  5. Turn the piece around 180 degrees and repeat the process.
  6. The piece is mailable as a flat if it does not droop more than 3 inches vertically at either end.



- b. For pieces less than 10 inches long (see Exhibit 1.6b):
  1. Place the piece on a flat, straight-edge surface with the length perpendicular to the edge of the surface, and extend the piece one-half of its length off the edge of the surface. Test square-shaped bound flats by placing the bound edge parallel to the edge.

2. Place a flat 12-inch ruler (or other similar flat object 12 inches or longer) on top of the mailpiece with the length parallel to the edge of the surface and as close to the edge as possible so that the 5-pound weight (see 1.6b3) does not extend past the edge.
3. Place a certified 5-pound weight on the center of the ruler to hold the piece in place.
4. Determine the vertical deflection in inches.
5. Turn the piece around 180 degrees and repeat the process.
6. The piece is mailable as a flat if it does not droop more than 2 inches less than the extended length at either end. For example, a piece 8 inches long would be extended 4 inches horizontally off a flat surface. It must not droop more than 2 inches vertically at either end.



### 1.7 Flat-Size Pieces Not Eligible for Flat-Size Prices

[Revise text of 1.7 to read as follows:]

Effective October 3, 2010, flat-size mailpieces that do not meet the standards in 1.3 through 1.5 or the standards in 302.2.0 must pay applicable higher prices as noted in either 1.7a or 1.7b below.

- a. Flat-size pieces that do not meet flexibility, uniform thickness, or polywrap standards in 1.3 through 1.5 must pay these applicable prices:
  1. First-Class Mail—parcel prices.
  2. Periodicals—parcel prices.
  3. Standard Mail—Not Flat-Machinable or parcel prices.
  4. Bound Printed Matter—parcel prices.
- b. Flats that do not meet deflection standards in 1.6 must pay the applicable prices as noted in Exhibit

1.7b. Under the column heading “eligibility as presented,” flats will be considered to be presented as automation flats only if they meet all other eligibility standards for automation flats.

Effective October 3, 2010, “nonmachinable” barcoded flats claiming the machinable flats-barcoded 5-digit price must meet the deflection standards in 301.1.0.

### Handbook F-101 Revision: PS Form 3294 Stamp/Cash Count Report at POS ONE Offices

Effective March 29, 2010, with the release of R41 in the point of service (POS ONE) system, a system-generated PS Form 3294 along with system-generated count sheets replaced the requirement to use a manual hard copy of PS Forms 3294-P & 3294-C. The system-generated PS Form 3294, *Cash and Stamp Stock Count Summary*, prints automatically after a cash and stamp credit count is entered and accepted into POS ONE.

Currently, POS ONE prints only one copy of PS Form 3294, a second (required) copy of PS Form 3294 must be printed by going to the back office reports. To print a second copy, go to Non-Retail Roles > Back Office > Back Office Reports > Inventory > Cash/Stamp Credit Count > select desired count. The functionality to automatically print two copies of PS 3294 will be included in a future POS ONE system enhancement.

#### Retail Floor Stock Count

The system-generated PS Form 3294 for retail floor stock counts now includes a section that reflects the qualified sales since last count, the threshold amount, whether or not the threshold was exceeded, and if a unit reserve stock count is required.

**Note:** For the first initial count, after the software update, the unit must calculate the retail floor stock threshold on actual sales since its last count. Disregard any amount that pre-populates in this section. For subsequent retail floor stock counts, POS ONE will calculate the qualified sales since last count, the threshold amount, and whether or not the threshold was exceeded.

#### Exams of PS 3977 and Lock and Key Exams

In addition, the POS ONE system now includes a new workflow to record the examination dates for the semi-annual examination of PS Form 3977, *Duplicate Key, Combination and Password Envelope*, and the annual examination of keys and locks. POS units must continue to maintain hard copy PS Form 3902, *Form 3977 Log and Lock Examination*. A new report is being developed which will replace PS Form 3902 in POS ONE units.

At POS ONE units, the supervisor must do the following:

- Log on to POS as the back office supervisor.
- Select <Count Inventory and Cash>, <Start New Count>, and follow the prompts.
- Enter the results of all counts performed in the POS system.

After the supervisor has finished entering the count into the system, the system sends the count summary to the employee to whom the stamp credit is assigned. The employee must then review and acknowledge the count summary.

PS Form 3294 prints automatically after a cash and stamp credit count is entered into and accepted by the accountability owner in POS ONE. Retain the system-generated PS Form 3294, *Cash and Stamp Stock Count Summary*, along with system-generated count sheets.

#### 13-9.2 Recording Unit Cash Reserve Counts

[Revise text to read as follows:]

After a physical count of the unit cash reserve, record counts as follows:



- a. Use PS Form 3294 or system-generated PS Form 3294 to document each unit cash reserve count with signatures of employees that performed the count.
- b. In POS units:
  - Use the POS ONE “Count Inventory and Cash” workflow.
  - Enter the results of the count performed in POS.
  - A system-generated PS Form 3294 will print after the employee assigned to the unit cash reserve reviews and acknowledges the count.
  - The system-generated form will record the electronic signature of the employee assigned to review and accept the count. If a witness is used for this count, the witness must sign the system-generated PS Form 3294 in lieu of an electronic signature. The supervisor initiating the count must sign the system-generated PS Form 3294.
  - Retain the system-generated PS Form 3294 along with the system-generated count sheets.
- c. Record the results of the unit cash reserve counts on PS Form 3368-P.
- d. For discrepancies of \$100 or more, complete and submit PS Form 571 to the appropriate OIG field office (see Appendix B-2 for the list of OIG field offices). Forward a copy of PS Form 571 to the district finance manager (DFM).
- e. File PS Form 3294 or system-generated PS Form 3294, 3368-P, and 571 (if applicable) in the employee’s stamp and cash credit files. (For information on filing and retaining forms, see part 13-1.3.)

**13-9.5 Recording Cash Retained Counts**

*[Revise text to read as follows:]*

After a postal retail unit’s (PRU’s) supervisor performs a physical count of the cash retained credit, together with the employee to whom the credit is assigned or that employee’s witness, (see part 3-8.3 for designated witness procedures), record counts as follows:

- a. Use the POS ONE “Count Inventory and Cash” workflow.
- b. Enter the results of the count performed in POS.
- c. Print the system-generated PS Form 3294 after the employee assigned to the cash retained credit reviews and acknowledges the count.
- d. Sign the system-generated PS Form 3294. The form will record the electronic signature of the employee assigned to review and accept the count. If a witness is used for this count, the witness must sign the system-generated PS Form 3294 in lieu of an electronic

signature. The supervisor initiating the count must sign the system-generated PS Form 3294.

- e. Retain the system-generated PS Form 3294 along with the system-generated count sheets.
- f. Post results of the counts to PS Form 3368-P.
- g. For discrepancies of \$100 or more, complete and submit PS Form 571 to the appropriate OIG field office (see Appendix B-2 for the list of OIG field offices).
- h. Forward a copy of PS Form 571 to the DFM.
- i. File the system-generated PS Form 3294, along with PS Forms 3368-P and 571, if applicable, in the employee’s stamp and cash credit files. (For information on filing and retaining forms, see part 13-1.3.)

**14.2 Retail Floor Stock**

**14-2.6 Count Procedures**

*[Revise text to read as follows:]*

An independent count of the retail floor stock must be performed by two employees. One of the participants must be the postmaster, manager, or supervisor responsible for the unit.

Do not conduct floor stock counts during business hours. The procedure for conducting a retail floor stock count is as follows:

- a. Resolve any differences between the clerk balance list and the unit’s PS Form 1412.
- b. Initiate the retail floor stock count in POS to print the system-generated inventory count sheets.
- c. Perform the physical count of the retail floor stock.
- d. Enter all value amounts into the POS ONE “Count Inventory and Cash” workflow.
- e. After the count is entered and accepted in POS, a system-generated PS Form 3294, *Cash and Stamp Stock Count and Summary*, will automatically be printed.
  - The POS system-generated PS Form 3294 will reflect the following:
    - The qualified sales since last count.
    - The threshold amount.
    - Whether or not the threshold was exceeded.
    - If a unit reserve stock count is required.
    - Any overages posted to AIC 239.
    - Any shortages posted to AIC 639.

The system-generated PS Form 3294 will record the electronic signature of the retail associate who is assigned to review and accept the count. The supervisor initiating the count must sign the system-generated PS Form 3294.

There is no tolerance applied to the floor stock count.

**Note:** Do not include packaging or retail products in this count.

#### 14-2.7 Documenting Count Results

Document the retail floor stock count results as follows:

- a. Use the system-generated PS Form 3294 and count sheets to document counts of the retail floor stock.
- b. Record results of retail floor stock counts on PS Form 3368-P.
- c. For discrepancies of \$100 or more, complete and submit PS Form 571, *Discrepancy of \$100 or More in Financial Responsibility*, to the appropriate Office of Inspector General (OIG). See Appendix B-2 for the list of OIG field offices.

- d. Forward a copy of PS Form 571 to the district finance manager (DFM).
- e. File documents locally as supporting documentation for retail floor stock count (For information on filing and retaining forms, see part 13-1.3.).

## Handbook F-101 Revision: Bank Deposits

Effective May 20, 2010, Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, was revised to update the procedure for recording and remitting bank deposits. All postal retail units (PRUs) must record bank deposits in AIC 751 and/or AIC 752. **Exception:** Those units that generate less than \$100 (total of cash and check items) on a daily basis for a bank deposit must record the postal funds in AIC 753. They must continue to record funds on subsequent days in AIC 353 and AIC 753 on their PS Form 1412 until the funds available for deposit equal or exceed \$100 (or within 5 business days for check items). Additionally, the funds recorded in AIC 753 must be retained securely in a safe or vault until remitted as a bank deposit.

#### 9-1.2 Banking Procedures for Postal Retail Units

*[Revise 9-1.2 to read as follows:]*

Postal retail units (PRUs) consolidate funds generated from daily transactions into one bank deposit (or two deposits if you must deposit cash separately from checks).

PRUs must not make bank deposits for less than \$100.

**Exception:** Check items (checks, money orders, traveler’s checks, etc.) should be deposited within 5 business days, even if the total deposit is less than \$100. The PRU will not prepare a bank deposit for amounts less than \$100, but will record the funds in AIC 753, Cash Retained, on the unit’s PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*. The following business day, this amount will be recorded in AIC 353, Cash Retained on Hand From Previous Day, and continue to be reported in AIC 753 and AIC 353 on subsequent business days until the funds available for deposit equal or exceed \$100 (or within the 5 business days for check items). Postal funds recorded in AIC 753 must be retained in a secure location (see subchapter 3-2).

**Note:** The office must continue to report all financial transactions daily on PS Form 1412.

When funds exceed normal operating needs during the day, retail associates (RAs) must remit advance deposits and record into AIC 751, Cash Remitted Advance, in addition to the final bank deposit in AIC 752.

If excess funds are generated throughout the day, PRUs may prepare a consolidated advance deposit. In the event that the financial institution requires separate deposits for cash and checks, no more than four (4) bank deposits may be prepared on a business day.

### 9-1.2.1 Reporting Bank Deposits

[Revise 9-1.2.1 to read as follows:]

Report bank deposit remittances on PS Form 1412 in the appropriate AIC as follows:

Record...	On PS Form 1412 in...
Advance remittance of funds	AIC 751
Postal funds remitted as final bank deposit at the close of business (see Note)	AIC 752
Authorized unit cash reserve, retail associates cash retained, and unit postal funds not to exceed \$100 for retained bank deposit	AIC 753

**Note:** Bank deposits that cannot be dispatched on the same business day due to extended retail service hours or early dispatch schedules must be reported in AIC 752, Cash Remitted Final, and registered to the unit's safe or vault as a completed bank deposit and remitted to the bank on the next business day's earliest dispatch.

### 9-1.2.2 Preparing and Dispatching Bank Deposits

[Revise 9-1.2 to read as follows:]

The procedure for preparing and dispatching bank deposits is as follows:

- a. The preparer completes a two-part deposit ticket: the original for the bank and the copy for the unit.
- b. The preparer enters the amount of currency on the deposit ticket by denomination. *Do not* deposit coins.
- c. The preparer ensures that all check items (checks, money orders, traveler's checks, etc.) are properly initialed and endorsed by the accepting employee (see subchapter 9-3).
- d. The preparer enters the total amount of check items (checks, money orders, traveler checks, etc.) on the deposit ticket. Enclose a system-generated list or an adding machine tape showing the value of each check item.
- e. The preparer counts the funds in the presence of a witness (see "Note" below).
- f. The witness (if available) counts the funds in the presence of the preparer.
- g. Both the preparer and the witness (if available) must sign the deposit ticket.
- h. Both the preparer and the witness (if available) must ensure that the original deposit ticket, cash, check items (checks, money orders, traveler checks, etc.) and the list of check items are included in the tamper-evident plastic bag. Only use the tamper-

evident plastic bags, ordered through the national contract, for remitting bank deposits.

- i. Prepare the tamper-evident plastic bag following instructions in the *Bank Deposit Preparation Quick Reference Guide* available at the accounting website. The direct Web site address is [http://blue.usps.gov/accounting/\\_pdf/BankDepositPrepGuide.pdf](http://blue.usps.gov/accounting/_pdf/BankDepositPrepGuide.pdf).
- j. Dispatch the tamper-evident plastic bag containing the bank deposit via Registered Mail service following established procedures for accepting and handling Registered Mail items.
- k. Maintain the duplicate copy of the deposit ticket as supporting documentation for the unit PS Form 1412. The duplicate copy of the deposit ticket must show the preparer signature and the witness signature (if applicable).
- l. If there are no bank deposits on a scheduled business day, do not prepare a zero bank deposit ticket. Report a "nil-bill" or "no deposit" to registry, as applicable, following procedures in Handbook DM-902, *Procedures for Preparing a Postal Bank Remittance for Mailing*, chapter 2.

**Note:** A witness must be used to verify the unit's bank deposit whenever possible. When a witness is not available, the preparer signs the deposit ticket on the "Verifier" line, and the "Witness" line is left blank. The preparer of the bank deposit has a financial responsibility regardless of whether a witness is or is not available.

It is the responsibility of the postmaster or unit manager to ensure proper procedures are followed in preparing daily bank deposits by monitoring banking differences issued by Accounting Services. Postmasters or unit managers must ensure expenses from banking reconciliations are researched and resolved in a timely manner (see subchapter 8-3).

## Handbook F-101 Revision: Ordering Banking Supplies

Effective immediately, Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, is revised to instruct postal retail units (PRUs) to order deposit tickets, endorsement stamps, and bank address stamps through eBuy2. The supplier, Harland Clarke, Inc., will no longer take order requests by phone or fax. All orders must be placed through eBuy2. PRUs without eBuy2 access may contact another PRU or eBuy2 requisitioner to order their banking supplies and charge the requesting office. ##### 9-1.4.1 Offices With Computer Access

Offices with computer access must use eBuy2 to order banking supplies.

Place orders for bank deposit tickets approximately 6 weeks before the current supply runs out.

##### 9-1.4.2 Offices Without Computer Access

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Offices without computer access must order banking supplies as follows:

- Request another PRU or eBuy2 requisitioner to place the order.
- For contract postal units (CPUs), the host Post Office will order deposit tickets.

All CPU orders will be mailed to the host Post Office.

To verify that the order was successfully submitted, do the following:

- Wait 2 days.
- Go to <http://blue.usps.gov/corptreasury>.
- Select the *Bank Relations* link and then the *Harland Reject Report* link.

If the order is not listed, the requisition was successfully executed and the order is being processed.

- Eliminating the workplace environment analyst position as a TAT core member.
- Updating the steps in the Incident Response section to facilitate TAT action.
- Changing the compliance measures to clarify TAT requirements.

We will send a copy of Publication 108 to each area and district Human Resources manager.

## Finance

### Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by our customers in U.S. households. The Postal Service™ uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the Household Interview. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. Sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the Mail Diary. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number

of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, *The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes*. The report is published in hard copy and an electronic file. ## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

# Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

## U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

### How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

### Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



*Note 1:* When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

*Note 2:* On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

## POW-MIA Flag

### How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

### Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

For more detailed information about flying the U.S. flag and the POW-MIA flag, see the following parts in the *Administrative Support Manual (ASM)*:

## Intelligent Mail and Address Quality

### Post Office Changes

### Customer Service Standardization Business Reply Mail Standard Operating Procedures

A national Business Reply Mail® Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) has been developed based upon Sarbanes-Oxley (SOX) Act documentation review. The SOP documents procedural changes. The updated procedures for Business Reply Mail include 1) the need to obtain secondary concurrence on bundles held for funds and 2) the requirement that all sites maintain a log on PS Form 3584, *Postage Due Log*, or on PS Form 3867, *Accountable Mail Matter Received for Delivery*, for all bundles held for funds.

The changes to the Business Reply Mail procedures can be found in the *USPS National BRM SOP May 2010 Changes* document. For clerks new to Business Reply Mail, a complete SOP is available in the *USPS National BRM SOP 2010-05* document. The document will be posted on the retail site at <http://blue.usps.gov/retail/L2F4ProductOperations.htm>.

Familiarize yourself with the revisions to your work processes. The field should have the revised procedures fully implemented by the effective date of July 5, 2010.

The forms listed here, except PS Form 3633-G, *Daily Activity Recap for Official Mail*, may be obtained from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) located in Topeka, Kansas. Use the eBuy On-Catalog system to obtain these forms from the MDC. Search for items using the postal stock numbers (PSNs) listed here without the dashes.

If your office does not have access to eBuy, you may order using touch-tone order entry (TTOE): Call 800-273-1509. **Note:** You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and fol-

low the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

### Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

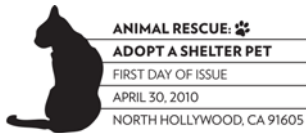

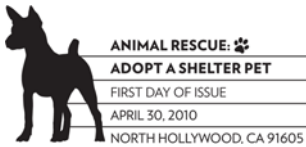

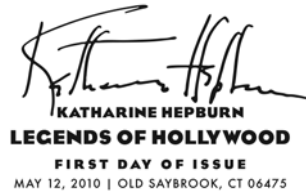

### Stamps by Mail — Brochure Ordering Information

This article publishes the Stamps by Mail® print run cut-off schedule for fiscal year (FY) 10. Each date has a designation whether it is for the year-round (YR) brochure or the holiday (HOL) brochure. The FY 10 print cycle cut-off dates are as follows:

- June 25, 2010 (YR).
- August 20, 2010 (HOL).

To order brochures, submit PS Form 3227-O, *Stamps by Mail Brochure Order Form* (January 2009), to Cyril-Scott Company:

The cost per unit of 500 is \$12.51. This cost includes overprinting the address of the fulfillment office placing the order. You may pay for orders (under \$10,000) with local IMPAC credit cards, checks, or money orders. However, Cyril-Scott Company cannot process the order until it receives payment. Local eBay procedures may also apply (refer to local procurement procedures). Cyril-Scott Company must receive orders placed by mail by close of

business the day of the print run cut-off date listed here. Orders received after the cut-off date will be processed the next print run date.

All local Post Offices™ and centralized sites should follow the ordering instructions contained within this article and utilize local funds.

#### For Orders Exceeding 10,000

Use eBay to process both centralized and decentralized brochure orders that exceed \$10,000.00. In the Purchasing Method field, select “Route Req to Supply Mgmt,” then in the After Approval Route field, select “Eastern Services CMC (Memphis, TN).” Include completed PS Form 3227-O with imprint information with the eBay order.

**Note:** These approved eBay orders must be received by Supply Management at least 10 days prior to a published run cut-off date to be included in that run.

Cyril-Scott Company will deliver orders within 35 calendar days after printing. Printing begins 1 week after the deadline date, and actual receipt of the order will depend on the ultimate destination and the corresponding delivery service standard. You should save copies of all orders placed at your local Post Office until the order has been received. Ensure procedures are in effect locally for proper verification of receipt.

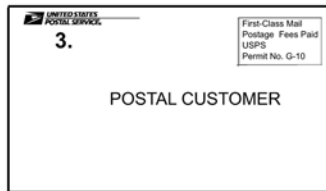
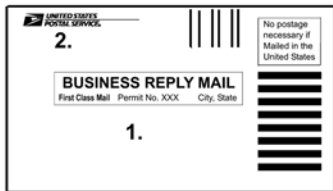

### Omega Transaction Fee Schedule Change

Since USPS® was able to maintain an online reservation adoption rate of 80 percent and above, the transaction fee for TripManager has dropped to \$5.50 from \$6.50, effective May 1st. This is in addition to the \$2.00 decrease that the Postal Service™ was able to negotiate earlier this year.

The intervention fee charged by Omega (e.g., to fix an incorrect credit card number in a traveler's profile) will increase by \$1 to \$13.50.

The transaction fee for a call-in reservation remains unchanged at \$19.
