Smarter Shipping in the Shorter Haul

The Postal Service™ is giving customers a “region” to ship with Priority Mail Regional Rate™ Boxes.

Since their debut last January, more than 11 million boxes have been ordered by commercial shippers. They recognize the value and convenience — the Priority Mail Regional Rate Box® offers smarter shipping in the shorter haul that can add up to significant savings for businesses in the long run.

“The boxes are a great fit for shippers who want expedited delivery and cost-effective pricing for shipping smaller packages within smaller delivery areas,” says Gary Reblin, vice president, Domestic Products. “E-tailers and companies that ship locally or regionally can save money when they use this product, and the boxes are free.”

There are two box types — A and B — each with top loading and side loading versions. Ship up to 15 pounds in Box A, and up to 20 pounds in Box B. Pricing is based on the box used and its destination zone.

The boxes can only be ordered online and are not available at retail. However, if entered at a USPS® retail location, Priority Mail® single-piece prices apply.

Stay tuned for upcoming announcements about enhancements for Priority Mail Regional Rate Boxes in the coming months.

Field Information Kit: USPS.com Fall 2011 New Features and Enhancements

This fall, USPS.com® will release several enhancements and new applications to the website. These include a new Multilingual option to view pages in Spanish and Simplified Chinese; the addition of PayPal for Click-N-Ship® users; a new Premium Forwarding Service® application; and the redesign of Hold Mail, Redelivery, and PO Locator applications. In addition, these services will be integrated into the customer's account allowing one centralized place to access all activity.

The following features and enhancements launched on October 3, 2011:

- **Multilingual (New)** (see Exhibit A, page 5) is all new to USPS.com. Users will now have the option of browsing USPS products in Spanish and Simplified Chinese. Other applications and content will be translated in future releases.
- **Hold Mail** has been redesigned to provide an improved customer experience by allowing customers to submit a Hold Mail request *up to 30* days prior to the hold mail 'start' date. In addition, users will have the convenience of integration with Address Book and Activity History (My Account) that will provide pre-populated fields.
- **Redelivery** has been redesigned to a more streamlined process and is integrated with customer account information, decreasing the steps to complete when submitting a redelivery request by pre-populating some required fields.
- **Carrier Pickup™** has been redesigned and integrated with Address Book and Account History to simplify request process for customers by pre-populating fields.

The following features and enhancements will launch later this fall:

- **The Postal Store®** (see Exhibit B, page 6) will be redesigned giving it an updated look and feel and streamlining the shopping and buying experience. Purchase activity and customer subscriptions are

now integrated into 'My Account', providing a central location for all activities.

- **Personalized Stamped Envelopes** will be redesigned to provide a new design interface allowing users to create and order envelopes right from their desktop.
- **Premium Forwarding Service® (PFS) (New)** (see Exhibit C, page 6) is a service where customers may request their local Post Office to collect their mail and reship it to another location once a week. Customers who apply for PFS online will enjoy access to new functionality including account authentication, pre-population of registration information, the ability to update registration information, and use of Address Book. Customers may also manage their PFS requests online and will no longer have to go to the Post Office to enroll.
- **PayPal (New)** will be available as a payment option within Click-N-Ship service on USPS.com. PayPal acts like a digital wallet where payment options such as bank account and credit card numbers are securely stored. Customers will simply click the PayPal checkout button, log into their PayPal account, and pay without leaving the USPS.com site. PayPal completes the payment process securely without sharing information with merchants and sellers.
- **PO Locator** (see Exhibit D, page 7) will be redesigned to help customers find where available services are offered in proximity of their location, based on the customer's needs. For example, customers will be able to search for retail locations with 24-hour access, alternate locations, and Village Post Offices.

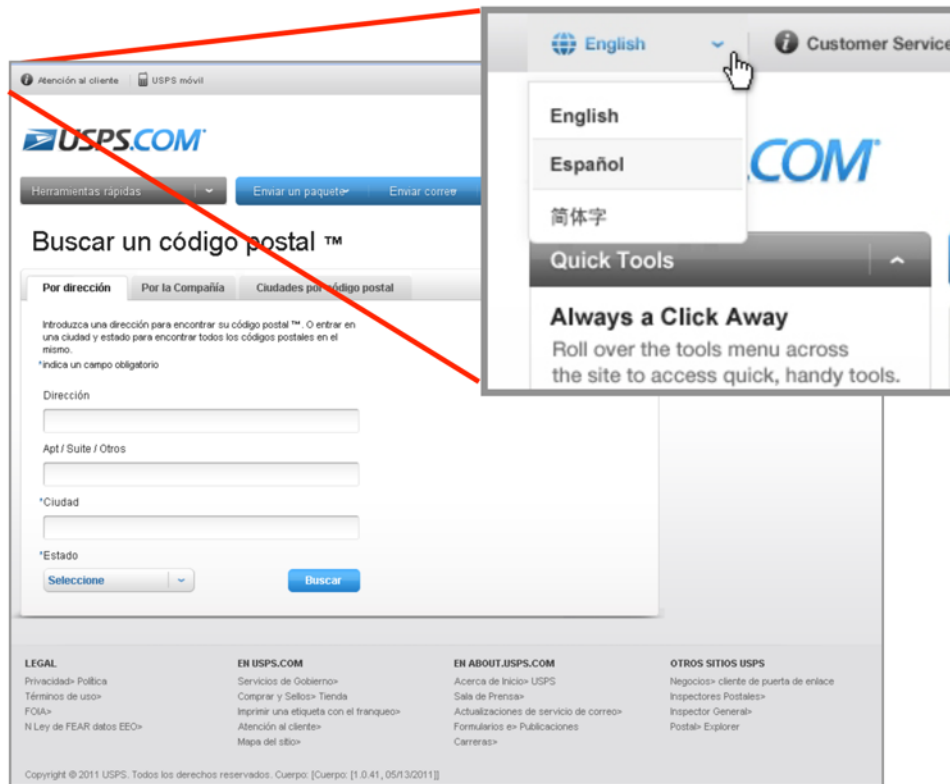

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Overall, what is new about the redesigned USPS.com?

A. The website has been redesigned to help customers do business with us more easily. This includes navigation that helps customers take action — whether they want to ship, send mail, manage their mail, or shop. “Quick Tools” appear on every page of the transactional site to keep the most popular functions on USPS.com at customers’ fingertips. There’s also an updated look and feel and a streamlined account signup.

Q. Why are we changing USPS.com?

A. To improve the customer experience for households and small and medium-sized businesses (convenient, simple, consistent), to grow revenue (introduce new services to the web and be the preferred option against competitors), and to reduce costs (migrate transactions to lower cost channels).

Q. What are “Quick Tools?”

A. “Quick Tools” are the most frequently used applications on USPS.com that allow you to perform specific tasks such as Track and Confirm, Find a Post Office, Calculate a Price, and Look up ZIP Code.

Q. What is about.usps.com?

A. About.usps.com is a newly designed site separate from USPS.com that is designed to help customers find information about USPS more easily. It will contain corporate information such as press releases, annual reports, career information, and publications. It will be easily accessible from every page on www.usps.com via a link on the bottom of every page, similar to other websites.

Q. Can I still buy stamps at USPS.com?

A. Yes, you will still be able to purchase stamps through The Postal Store now found under the “Shop” link in the top navigation.

Q. Will I be able to print a shipping label?

A. Yes, Click-N-Ship service will still be available to create, manage, and print shipping labels, and will be found under the “Ship a Package” link in the top navigation.

Q. Will I be able to manage my mail (i.e., Hold Mail, Forward Mail, Change Address, and Schedule a Redelivery)?

A. Yes these applications have been redesigned to be more intuitive and to streamline the process. These and other services are found under the “Manage Your Mail” link in the top navigation.

New PayPal Payment Option

Q. What is PayPal?

A. PayPal is a service that enables you to pay for goods and services without revealing your financial information to merchants.

Q. What can I buy with PayPal on USPS.com?

A. You can now use PayPal to pay for Click-N-Ship labels. We hope to expand this option to other parts of the site in future releases.

Q. How do I pay for Click-N-Ship (CNS) labels with PayPal?

A. In your Click-N-Ship account, create the shipping labels you desire. When you are ready to check out, choose the PayPal button as your payment option. Click-N-Ship will direct you to log in to your PayPal account. To do this, simply enter your e-mail address and password and the payment will be processed without sharing any of your financial details.

Q. Is paying with PayPal just as fast as using my credit card?

A. Yes. You just need to enter your e-mail address and password to pay with PayPal.

New Multilingual Option

Q. What additional languages are offered on USPS.com?

A. USPS.com will be available in Spanish and Simplified Chinese. More languages will be offered in the future.

Q. How do I select a language?

A. To select a language, hover over the drop-down language selection in the grey header in the top far left of the page. Each time you visit USPS.com, the drop-down selection in the header will default to “English”. Select your preferred language to see the page displayed in that language. You can change your language for that page and USPS browsing session by performing the same action.

Q. What pages of the USPS.com website are available to be viewed in Spanish and Chinese?

A. All Product/Service description pages as well as all FAQs, many advertisements, and applications like Look Up a ZIP Code and Track and Confirm. Other applications and content will be translated in the future releases.

Enhanced “My Account”

Q. What is the enhanced “My Account”?

A. USPS.com is using a new eCommerce platform that will improve the customer’s online experience. It provides customers the ability to view their global activity history.

Hold Mail Redesign

Q. What is new for Hold Mail?

A. The main change to Hold Mail is the ability for customers to submit their request up to 30 days prior to the ‘start’ date instead of the current 14 days. Also, the Hold Mail application will be integrated with Address Book and Activity History making the process easier to complete through pre-population of fields.

Redelivery Application Redesign

Q. What is new for Redelivery?

A. The Redelivery application has been redesigned and is integrated with Customer Registration, Activity History, and the Product Tracking System to simplify the request process for customers by pre-populating fields.

Carrier Pickup Application Redesign

Q. What is new for Carrier Pickup?

A. The Carrier Pickup application has been redesigned and is now integrated with Address Book and Activity History. This will simplify the process for customers by pre-population of fields.

New Premium Forwarding Service (Coming Soon)

Q. What is Premium Forwarding Service?

A. Premium Forwarding Service is a service where customers may request their local Post Office to collect their mail and reship to another location once a week.

Q. Will customers be able to enroll online for Premium Forwarding Service?

A. Yes. Customers will soon be able to complete Premium Forwarding Service enrollment online — without going to the Post Office. Customers will also be able to modify or cancel their request from their desktop.

The Postal Store/Personalized Stamped Envelopes Redesign (Coming Soon)

Q. What is changing about The Postal Store?

A. The Postal Store will be redesigned with a new “look and feel” to improve the customer experience. It will offer the ability for cross-selling and upselling and will lay the groundwork for future enhancements.

Q. What are the changes for Personalized Stamped Envelopes?

A. The Personalized Stamped Envelopes application will be redesigned to allow customers to add multiple orders to the same shopping cart and to view an image of their envelope throughout the entire process. Customers will also be able to enter special characters (without calling the 1-800 line) and use ‘Address Book’ to select the return address.

PO Locator Redesign (Coming Soon)

A. The application will be in-house instead of being offered by a third-party. Also, PO Locator will offer search capability to numerous location types and to more services.

DMM Revision: Mailing Firearms — Clarification

Effective November 7, 2011, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 601.12.1 through 601.12.3 to clarify the standards surrounding the mailability of firearms.

These clarifications were prepared in collaboration with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), and neither expands nor limits the current requirements for the shipment of firearms through the U. S. Postal Service®. Prior to this clarification, firearms mailing options were only provided to the prospective mailer through an ATF contact. The primary purpose of this article is to provide clarity for those individuals seeking advice on the mailing of firearms and related items and to help reduce the number of questions submitted to the ATF.

Additionally, the Postal Service is providing guidelines for the mailing of air guns, which reflect reasonable practices commonly used in the industry.

Postmasters may provide these revised guidelines to firearms mailers immediately.

Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)

* * * * *

600 Basic Standards for All Mailing Services

601 Mailability

* * * * *

12.0 Other Restricted and Nonmailable Matter

[Revise title of 12.1 as follows:]

12.1 Firearms

12.1.1 Definitions

The terms used in this standard are defined as follows:

[Delete current items 12.1.1a and 12.1.1g in their entirety and replace with the following.]

- a. *Firearm* means any device, including a starter gun, which will, or is designed to, or may readily be converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive; the frame or receiver of any such weapon; any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; or any destructive device; but the term shall not include an antique firearm.

- b. *Firearm frame or receiver* is the part of a firearm that provides housing for the hammer, bolt or breechblock, and firing mechanism and that is usually threaded at its forward portion to receive the barrel.
- c. *Handgun (including pistols and revolvers)* means any firearm that has a short stock and is designed to be held and fired by the use of a single hand and subject to 12.1.1a, or a combination of parts from which a handgun can be assembled.
- d. *Other firearms capable of being concealed on the person* include, but are not limited to, short-barreled shotguns and short-barreled rifles.
- e. *Short-barreled shotgun* means a shotgun that has one or more barrels less than 18 inches long. The term short-barreled rifle means a rifle that has one or more barrels that are less than 16 inches long. These definitions include any weapon made from a shotgun or rifle, whether by alteration, modification, or otherwise, if such weapon as modified has an overall length of less than 26 inches. A short-barreled shotgun or rifle of greater dimension may be regarded as nonmailable when it has characteristics to allow concealment on the person.
- f. *Federal Firearms Licensee (FFL) manufacturer, dealer, or importer* of firearms means a manufacturer, dealer, or importer duly licensed by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) under Chapter 44, Title 18, United States Code (U.S.C.).
- g. *Curio and relic collector* means an individual licensed by ATF to transfer or receive only those firearms defined as curios or relics by ATF under Title 27, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), section 478.11.
- h. *Antique firearm* means any muzzle loading rifle/shotgun/pistol that is designed to use black powder or a black powder substitute and that cannot use fixed ammunition (except those that incorporate a firearm frame or receiver, any firearm that is converted into a muzzle loading weapon, or any muzzle loading weapon that can be readily converted to fire fixed ammunition by replacing the barrel, bolt, breechblock, or any combination thereof); or any firearm (including those with a matchlock, flintlock, percussion cap, or similar type of ignition system) manufactured on or before 1898, or any replica thereof, if such replica:

1. Is not designed or redesigned for using rimfire or conventional centerfire fixed ammunition.
2. Uses rimfire or conventional centerfire fixed ammunition that is no longer manufactured in the United States and that is not readily available in the ordinary channels of commercial trade.

i. Air gun means a gun that fires a projectile by means of compressed air or other gas (including paintball and pellet guns).

12.1.2 Handguns

[Revise 12.1.2 as follows:]

Handguns and other firearms capable of being concealed on the person are nonmailable unless mailed between the parties listed in 12.1.3 and 12.1.5 after the filing of an affidavit or statement required by 12.1.4 and 12.1.6, and are subject to the following:

- a. Firearms meeting the definition of a handgun under 12.1.1b, and the definition of curios or relics under 27 CFR 478.11 may be mailed between curio and relic collectors only when those firearms also meet the definition of an antique firearm under 12.1.1g.
- b. Firearms meeting the definition of a handgun under 12.1.1b that are certified by the curator of a municipal, state, or federal museum that exhibits firearms to be curios or relics of museum interest may be accepted for mailing without regard to 12.1.3 through 12.1.6.
- c. Air guns that do not fall within the definition of firearm under 12.1.1a that are capable of being concealed on a person are mailable; but must include adult signature service under 503.8.0. Mailers must comply with all applicable state and local regulations.
- d. Parts of handguns are mailable, except for handgun frames, receivers, or other parts or components regulated under Chapter 44, Title 18, U.S.C.
- e. Mailers are also subject to applicable restrictions by governments of a state, territory, or district.

12.1.3 Authorized Persons

[Revise introductory sentence of 12.1.3 as follows:]

Subject to 12.1.4, handguns may be mailed by a licensed manufacturer of firearms, a licensed dealer of firearms, a licensed importer of firearms, or an authorized agent of the federal government or the government of a state, territory, or district, only when addressed to a person in one of the following categories for use in the person's official duties:

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 12.1.5 as follows:]

12.1.5 Manufacturers, Dealers, and Importers

Handguns may also be mailed between licensed manufacturers of firearms, licensed dealers of firearms, and licensed importers of firearms in customary trade shipments, or for repairing or replacing parts.

[Revise the title and text of 12.1.6 as follows:]

12.1.6 Certificate of Manufacturers, Dealers, and Importers

A federal firearms licensee manufacturer, dealer, or importer need not file the affidavit under 12.1.4, but must file with the postmaster a statement on Form 1508 signed by the mailer that he or she is a licensed manufacturer, dealer, or importer of firearms. The mailer must also state that the parcels containing handguns, or parts and components of handguns under 12.1.2d, are being mailed in customary trade shipments or contain such articles for repairing or replacing parts, and that to the best of their knowledge the addressees are licensed manufacturers, dealers, or importers of firearms.

[Revise the title and text of 12.1.7 as follows:]

12.1.7 Federal and Other Law Enforcement Agencies

Handguns may be mailed without regard to 12.1.3 through 12.1.6 if the item is:

- a. Addressed to a scientific laboratory or crime detection bureau of any federal, state, or local law enforcement agency whose members are authorized to serve warrants of arrest or commitment.
- b. Sent by an authorized agent of the federal government as an official shipment to any qualified addressee in 12.1.3, or to a licensed manufacturer, dealer, or importer of firearms, or to a federal agency.

- b. A shotgun or rifle owned by a non-FFL may be mailed outside the owner’s state of residence by the owner to himself or herself, in care of another person in the state, where he or she intends to hunt or engage in any other lawful activity. These mailpieces must:
 - 1. Be addressed to the owner.
 - 2. Include the “in the care of” endorsement immediately preceding the name of the applicable temporary custodian.
 - 3. Be opened by the rifle or shotgun owner only.
 - 4. Be mailed using services described in 12.2a.
- c. Rifles and shotguns may be mailed by a non-FFL owner domestically to a FFL dealer, manufacturer, or importer in any state. USPS recommends these items be mailed using those services described in 12.2a.
- d. Except as described in 12.1.2a, licensed curio and relic collectors may mail firearms meeting the definition of curios or relics under 27 CFR 478.11 domestically to FFL licensed curio and relic collectors in any state. USPS recommends these items be mailed using those services described in 12.2a.

- e. Firearms that are certified by the curator of a municipal, state, or federal museum that exhibits firearms to be curios or relics of museum interest may be accepted for mailing without restriction.
- f. Air guns that do not fall within the definition of firearm under 12.1.1a are mailable. A shipment containing an air gun with a muzzle velocity of 400 or more feet per second (fps) must include an Adult Signature service under 503.8.0. Mailers must additionally comply with all applicable state and local regulations.

12.3 Legal Opinions on Mailing Firearms

Each address, except for mail bearing an alternative address format (under 602.3.0), in a mailing at commercial First-Class Mail presorted or automation prices, First-Class Package Service presorted parcel prices, or Standard Mail prices is subject to the Move Update standard and must meet these requirements:

- a. Each address and associated addressee used on the mailpieces in a mailing must be updated within 95 days before the mailing date, with one of the USPS-approved methods in 5.2.

- b. The Move Update standard is met when an address used on a mailpiece in a mailing at any class of mail is updated under 5.2, and the same address is used in a First-Class Mail, First-Class Package Service, or Standard Mail mailing within 95 days after the address has been updated.

5.2 USPS-Approved Methods

The following methods are authorized for meeting the Move Update standard:

- a. Address Change Service (ACS).
- b. National Change of Address Linkage System (NCOA^{Link}).
- c. *FASTforward* MLOCR processes, for letters only, if used each time before mail entry. If a mailpiece that initially uses *FASTforward* MLOCR processing is rejected and then entered into a Direct View Encoding Desk (DVED) operation (or similar system), the piece does not meet the Move Update standard. The name and address information on the piece must then be processed through a *FASTforward* RVE system to meet the Move Update standard. *FASTforward* RVE processes also meet the Move Update standard if used each time before mail entry.
- d. Applicable ancillary service endorsements under 507.1.5.1 or 507.1.5.3, except “Forwarding Service Requested.”
- e. For First-Class Mail, and First-Class Package Service only: Mailer Move Update Process Certification and USPS-approved alternative methods for mailers with legitimate restrictions on incorporating USPS-supplied change-of-address information into their mailing lists. The National Customer Support Center (see 608.8.1 for address) administers and approves both Mailer Move Update Process Certification and alternative methods.

5.3 Mailer Certification

The mailer’s signature on the postage statement certifies that the Move Update standard has been met for each address in the corresponding mailing presented to the USPS.

6.0 ZIP Code Accuracy Standards

6.1 Basic Standards

Except for mail bearing a simplified address, addresses used on pieces in a mailing at commercial First-Class Mail,

- b. If an address used on a mailpiece in a mailing at one class of mail and price is verified and corrected with an approved method, the same address may be used during the following 12 months to meet the ZIP Code accuracy standard required for mailing at any other class of mail and price.

6.2 USPS-Approved Methods

The following methods meet the ZIP Code accuracy standard:

- a. For computerized lists, Coding Accuracy Support System (CASS)-certified address matching software and current USPS City State Product, within a mailer’s computer systems or through an authorized service provider.
- b. For manually maintained lists or small computerized lists, options include the following:
 1. Surveys of addressees on mailer’s address list inquiring about the accuracy of ZIP Code information.
 2. Any mailing list service in 507.7.0.
 3. An authorized service provider.
 4. CASS-certified matching software.
 5. USPS Web site www.usps.com.

6.3 Mailer Certification

The mailer’s signature on the postage statement certifies that the ZIP Code accuracy standard has been met for each address in the corresponding mailing presented to the USPS.

DMM Revision: Combined Mailings of Standard Mail and Periodicals Flats

Effective January 22, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to add a new 705.15, providing optional standards for combining Standard Mail® flats and Periodicals flats within the same bundle, when placed on pallets; and for combining bundles of Standard Mail flats and bundles of Periodicals flats on the same pallet. The Postal Service will also revise DMM 708.1.1 to describe the new optional endorsement line (OEL) standards corresponding to these options

Mailers using this option may combine different-class mailpieces within the same bundle (comail), or combine separate same-class bundles (of different classes) on the same pallet (copalletize) to maximize presorting or to qualify for deeper destination entry discounts. All mailpieces prepared under this option are required to be bundled and placed on pallets. Combined mailings enhance operational efficiencies within postal processing by allowing mailers to place mailpieces in bundles on pallets that might have been placed in sacks if prepared separately.

In 2007, the Postal Service introduced a pilot program for mailers to combine Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats. The program was restricted to a limited number of participants, and to date, most of the original participants continue to mail under pilot standards. The pilot program generally allowed for entry, transport, and processing of the combined mailings similar to that currently provided for Periodicals flats.

Standards for the program have since been modified to more closely align preparation and processing of these mixed class bundles with those currently provided for Standard Mail bundles. These modified standards were initially provided via a *Federal Register* proposed rule (75 FR 16588–16592) on March 24, 2011. Final standards were provided on June 28, 2011, in a *Federal Register* final rule (76 FR 37655–37659), and are described below.

These revised standards will not change current DMM content and eligibility standards applicable to Periodicals and Standard Mail. Mailers using these options will continue to be required to meet the minimum volume standards for Standard Mail of 200 pieces or 50 pounds. Periodicals publications must be authorized or have a pending authorization to mail at Periodicals prices. The current processes that identify and isolate Periodicals origin mixed area distribution center (OMX) mailpieces, for integration into the First-Class Mail® mailstream, will not be available when combining Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats on pallets. All mailpieces included in a combined mailing of Standard Mail and Periodicals flats on pallets must be machinable in accordance with DMM 301.3.0.

Mailers wishing to combine Standard Mail and Periodicals flats under these options will be required to submit a request for authorization, in writing, to the manager, Business Mailer Support.

Mailers combining Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats will not have the option to form area distribution center (ADC) pallets or to dropship to ADCs. As a result, Periodicals publications included in combined mailings will not have access to DADC prices. Other specific prices for Periodicals flats in a combined mailing will be assessed as follows:

- The bundle prices applicable to the ADC container level will be applied to the auxiliary service facility (ASF)/network distribution center (NDC) container level.
- The container prices applicable to the ADC pallet level will apply to the ASF/NDC pallet level.
- The bundle price applicable to the ADC bundle placed on the ADC container level will apply to mixed ADC bundles placed on mixed NDC pallets.
- The container price applicable to the mixed ADC pallet level (expected to be provided on January 22, 2012) will apply to the mixed NDC pallet level.

Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats combined on pallets will be processed as Standard Mail; and the Periodicals mailpieces included within these combined mailings may receive deferred handling and will be subject to the USPS® service standards applicable to Standard Mail. These mailings must also be identified as Standard Mail when scheduling dropship appointments in the Facility Access and Shipment Tracking (FAST®) system.

Mailers combining Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats on pallets must populate field 10, "Product or Publication Title or Names," of PS Form 8125 and/or field 11b, "Product Name/ID," of PS Form 8125C with "MIX COMAIL" when preparing dropship documentation for these mailings.

Each Standard Mail and Periodicals mailpiece prepared under a combined mailing of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats will be required to be identified as containing mixed classes through the use of an optional endorsement line (OEL) in accordance with the proposed standards.

On March 14, 2011, the Postal Service published a proposed rule, *Federal Register* notice, *New Origin Entry and Containerization Standards* (75 FR 13704–13767). If that proposal is adopted, standards for combined mailings of Standard Mail and Periodicals flats will be modified to reflect these new preparation standards, including one significant change that will require the separation of mixed ADC pallets into an origin NDC pallet (required over 150 pounds), if not already prepared, and a Tier 2 Network pallet.

Effective January 22, 2012, the Postal Service will also amend 39 CFR Part 121.2 by adding a new item “c” to describe the USPS processing of Periodicals mailpieces included in combined mailings of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats, and specifying that Periodicals mailpieces included in these mailings will be assigned the service standards applicable to Standard Mail pieces.

- a. Each mailpiece must meet the standards in 340 for Standard Mail and 707 for Periodicals. Periodicals publications must be authorized or pending original or additional entry at the office of mailing.
- b. Mailers must prepare pieces in bundles on pallets.
- c. All mailpieces must be machinable in accordance with 301.3.0.
- d. Mailers must pay all annual mailing fees at the office of mailing.
- e. Each mailing must include at least 200 pieces or 50 pounds of Standard Mail.
- f. All mailpieces combined within bundles, in accordance with 14.0, must be similar in size so as to create

stable bundles. Bundles placed on pallets under this provision must be prepared to create stable pallets.

- g. When residual pieces are included in a combined mailing of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats on pallets, these pieces must be bundled and placed directly on mixed NDC pallets.

15.1.1 Service Objectives

The Postal Service handles combined mailings of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats as Standard Mail. Periodicals flats included within mailings of combined Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats are subject to the USPS service standards applicable to Standard Mail.

15.1.2 Postage Payment

Postage for all Standard Mail pieces must be paid with permit imprint using a special postage payment system in 2.0 through 4.0 at the Post Office location serving the mailer’s plant. Postage for Periodicals may be paid through an advance deposit account or through a Centralized Account Payment System (CAPS) account.

15.1.3 Documentation

Mailers must present standardized electronic documentation according to 708.1.0. This documentation must accurately reflect the final piece count in the combined mailing. In addition, mailers must provide:

- a. An edition or version summary for all pieces in the mailing. The summary may be part of the USPS qualification report and must include version ID, product or edition code, class of mail, piece weight of each version, and number of pieces by version; and for Periodicals, USPS or permit number (or pending permit number), issue date, and advertising percentage.
- b. A consolidated postage statement register and postage statement for each Periodicals publication in the combined mailing.
- c. A consolidated postage statement register and postage statement for each Standard Mail mailing in the combined mailing. Mailers may provide a single consolidated postage statement and a consolidated postage statement register of all Standard Mail mailings if they are itemized.
- d. When pallets are dropshipped, a register of Forms 8125 (or PS 8125C) that consolidates all of the mailings into the destinations where the mail is dropshipped.
- e. Documentation to support zones and bundle totals, if requested.
- f. When requested, a copy of a notification document signed and dated by the Periodicals publisher, acknowledging their participation in a combined mailing of Standard Mail and Periodicals and the

potential for their mailpieces to receive deferred USPS handling.

- g. Any additional documentation to support postage payment system records, if requested.

15.1.4 Authorization

A mailer must submit a written request to the manager, Business Mailer Support (see 608.8.1 for address) to combine mailings of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats. The request must show the mailer's name and address, the mailing office, evidence of authorization to mail using a special postage payment system under 2.0 through 4.0, procedures for combining the mailing, the expected date of first mailing, quality control procedures, and a sample of all supporting mailing documentation, including postage statements and the USPS Qualification Report. Business Mailer Support will review the documentation and provide written authorization. A mailer may terminate an authorization at any time by written notice to the postmaster of the office serving the mailer's location. Business Mailer Support may terminate an authorization by written notice if the mailer does not meet the standards.

15.1.5 Price Eligibility

Apply prices based on the standards in 340 for Standard Mail. Prices are based on the standards in 707 for Periodicals and as modified under the standards for this program.

15.1.6 Piece Prices

Apply piece prices based on the bundle level. Pieces contained within mixed class bundles may claim prices based on the presort level of the bundle.

15.1.7 Applying the Periodicals Bundle Charge

Apply bundle charges as follows:

- a. Calculate the percentage of Periodicals copies in a bundle.
- b. Convert the percentage to four decimal places, rounding off if necessary (for example, convert 20.221% to 0.2022, or 20.226% to 0.2023). Multiply by the applicable bundle charge.
- c. Allocate the resulting charge across the Periodicals titles and editions based on the number of copies of each in the bundle.

15.1.8 Applying the Periodicals Container Charge

Apply container charges to pallets as follows:

- a. Calculate the percentage of the weight of Periodicals copies on each pallet.
- b. Convert the percentage to four decimal places, rounding off if necessary (for example, convert 20.221% to 0.2022, or 20.226% to 0.2023). Multiply by the applicable container charge.

- c. Allocate the resulting charge across the Periodicals titles and editions based on the number of copies of each on the pallet.

15.1.9 Other Periodicals Pricing

Other prices for Periodicals flats in a combined mailing of Standard Mail and Periodicals flats on pallets will be assessed as follows:

- a. The bundle prices applicable to the ADC container level will be applied to the ASF/NDC container levels.
- b. The container prices applicable to the ADC pallet level will apply to the ASF/ NDC pallet levels.

15.1.10 Bundle Reallocation to Protect the SCF or NDC Pallet

Mailers may reallocate bundles under 8.11 or 8.13 to protect the SCF or NDC pallet.

15.2 Combining Standard Mail Flats and Periodicals Flats in the Same Bundle

15.2.1 Bundling and Labeling

Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats may be combined in carrier route, 5-digit (scheme), 3-digit, ADC, and Mixed ADC bundles when prepared according to 707.19.0 and these additional standards:

- a. Each bundle containing combined Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats must contain a minimum of 10 pieces. Bundles of only Standard Mail flats must contain a minimum of 10 pieces. Bundles of only Periodicals flats must contain a minimum of 6 pieces.
- b. Firm bundles must contain only Periodicals flats.

15.2.2 Mailpiece and Bundle Identification

Each Standard Mail and Periodicals mailpiece prepared under a combined mailing of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats must be identified as being part of a mixed class mailing through the use of an optional endorsement line (OEL) in accordance with the standards in 708.7.1.8.

15.2.3 Pallet Presort and Labeling

Mailers must prepare pallets according to the standards in 8.0 and in the sequence listed below. Merged 5-digit scheme through NDC pallets must contain at least 250 pounds of combined Standard Mail and Periodicals mailpieces, except as allowed under 8.5.3. Pallets must be labeled according to the Line 1 and Line 2 information listed below and under 8.6. Pallet placards must be white and measure at least 8 inches by 11 inches, unless prepared under 708.6.6.6. Prepare pallets according to the preparation, sequence, and labeling instructions in 15.4.1.

15.3 Combining Bundles of Standard Mail Flats and Periodicals Flats on the Same Pallet

15.3.1 Bundling and Labeling

Mailers must prepare bundles according to the standards for the class of mail and the prices claimed.

15.3.2 Mailpiece and Bundle Identification

Each Standard Mail and Periodicals mailpiece prepared under a combined mailing of Standard Mail flats and Periodicals flats must be identified as being part of a mixed class mailing through the use of an optional endorsement line (OEL) in accordance with standards in 708.7.1.8.

15.3.3 Pallet Presort and Labeling

Mailers must prepare pallets according to the standards in 8.0 and in the sequence listed below. Merged 5-digit scheme through NDC pallets must contain at least 250 pounds of combined Standard Mail and Periodicals, except as allowed under 8.5.3. When reallocating bundles under 8.11 or 8.12, mailers do not have to achieve the finest pallet presort level possible. Pallets must be labeled according to the Line 1 and Line 2 information listed below and under 8.6. Pallet placards must be white and measure at least 8 inches by 11 inches, unless prepared under 708.6.6.6. Prepare pallets according to the preparation, sequence, and labeling instructions in 15.4.1.

15.4 Pallet Preparation

15.4.1 Pallet Preparation, Sequence and Labeling

When combining Standard Mail and Periodicals flats within the same bundle or combining bundles of Standard Mail flats and bundles of Periodicals flats on pallets, bundles must be placed on pallets. Preparation, sequence, and labeling:

a. *Merged 5-digit scheme, optional.* Not permitted for bundles containing noncarrier route automation-compatible flats under 301.3.0. Required for all other bundles. Pallet must contain barcoded carrier route bundles and barcoded noncarrier route 5-digit bundles for the same 5-digit scheme under L001. For 5-digit destinations not part of L001, merged 5-digit pallet preparation begins with 15.4.1d. Labeling:

1. Line 1: L001.
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS CR/5D;" followed by "SCHEME" (or "SCH"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."

b. *5-digit scheme carrier routes, required.* Pallet must contain only carrier route bundles for the same 5-digit scheme under L001. For 5-digit destinations not part of L001, 5-digit carrier routes pallet preparation begins with 15.4.1c. Labeling:

1. Line 1: L001.

2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS"; followed by "CARRIER ROUTES" (or "CR-RTS"); followed by "SCHEME" (or "SCH"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."

c. *5-digit carrier routes, required.* Pallet must contain only carrier route mail for the same 5-digit ZIP Code. Labeling:

1. Line 1: city, state, and 5-digit ZIP Code destination (see 8.6.4c for overseas military mail).
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS"; followed by "CR/5D"; followed by "MIX COMAIL."

d. *Merged 5-digit, optional.* Not permitted for bundles containing noncarrier route automation-compatible flats under 301.3.0. Required for all other bundles. Pallet must contain barcoded carrier route bundles and barcoded noncarrier route 5-digit bundles for the same 5-digit ZIP Code. Labeling:

1. Line 1: city, state, and 5-digit ZIP Code destination (see 8.6.4c for overseas military mail).
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS"; followed by "CR/5D"; followed by "MIX COMAIL."

e. *5-digit, required.* Pallet must contain only mail for the same 5-digit ZIP Code or same 5-digit scheme under L007 (for automation flats only under 301.3.0). 5-digit scheme bundles are assigned to 5-digit pallets according to the OEL "label to" 5-digit ZIP Code. Labeling:

1. Line 1: city, state, and 5-digit ZIP Code destination (see 8.6.4c for overseas military mail).
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS 5D"; followed by "BARCODED" (or "BC"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."

f. *3-digit, optional,* but not available for bundles for 3-digit ZIP Code prefixes marked "N" in L002. Pallet may contain mail for the same 3-digit ZIP Code or the same 3-digit scheme under L008 (for automation-compatible flats only under 301.3.0). Three-digit scheme bundles are assigned to pallets according to the OEL "label to" 3-digit ZIP Code in L008. Labeling:

1. Line 1: L002, Column A.
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS 3D"; followed by "BARCODED" (or "BC"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."

g. *SCF, required.* Pallet may contain carrier route or automation mail for the 3-digit ZIP Code groups in L005. Labeling:

1. Line 1: L002, Column C.
2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS SCF"; followed by "BARCODED" (or "BC"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."

h. *ASF, required unless bundle reallocation used under 15.1.10.* Pallet may contain carrier route or automation mail for the 3-digit ZIP Code groups in L602. ADC bundles are assigned to pallets according to the "label to" ZIP Code in L004 as appropriate. Labeling:

- 1. Line 1: L602.
- 2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS NDC"; followed by "BAR-CODED" (or "BC"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."
- i. *NDC, required.* Pallet may contain carrier route or automation mail for the 3-digit ZIP Code groups in L601. ADC bundles are assigned to pallets according to the "label to" ZIP Code in L004 as appropriate. Labeling:
 - 1. Line 1: L601.
 - 2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS NDC"; followed by "BAR-CODED" (or "BC"); followed by "MIX COMAIL."
- j. *Mixed NDC, required, no minimum.* Pallet may contain carrier route or automation mail. Pallet includes MXD ADC bundles, prepared according to the "label to" ZIP in L009, as appropriate. Unless authorized by the processing and distribution manager, pallet must be entered at the NDC serving the 3-digit ZIP Code of the entry Post Office. Labeling:
 - 1. Line 1: "MXD" followed by the information in L601, for the NDC serving the 3-digit ZIP Code prefix of the entry Post Office.
 - 2. Line 2: "STD/PER FLTS;" followed by "BAR-CODED" (or "BC"); followed by "WKG;" followed by "MIX COMAIL."

DMM Revision: Suspension of Periodicals Privileges

Effective November 7, 2011, the Postal Service™ will revise the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 707.8.3.4 to amend the authority for noncompliance from the postmaster to the Pricing and Classification Service Center (PCSC) when a publisher does not file PS Form 3526, *Statement of Ownership, Management, and Circulation (All Periodicals Publications Except Requester Publications)*, or publish the information provided on the form.

Publishers for each publication approved for Periodicals pricing must file PS Form 3526 on or before October 1 every year. Publishers of Periodicals approved as general or requester publications must publish the details reported on this form in an issue of the publication to which it relates. The information must be printed either as a reproduction of PS Form 3526 or as data in an issue whose primary mailed distribution is produced not later than October 10 for publications issued more frequently than weekly; or not later than October 31 for publications issued weekly or less frequently but more frequently than monthly; or in the first issue whose primary mailed distribution is produced after October 1 for all other publications.

Handbook F-101 Revision: Repaying Travel Advances

Effective October 6, 2011, Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, is revised to reflect the process regarding taxes owed on unreturned business travel advances. If your business travel advance remains outstanding for a period of 120 days after your travel is complete, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) considers that advance to be reportable compensation, and, therefore, subject to withholding federal income taxes, Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) taxes, and Medicare taxes.

Consequently, the IRS requires employers, such as the Postal Service™, to report any outstanding advances to them, include the amounts in your Form W-2, *Wage and Tax Statement*, and deduct the appropriate taxes even though you later repay the advance. These regulations apply to both bargaining unit and non-bargaining unit employees. You still must either account for or repay these outstanding amounts to the Postal Service.

Revenue Service (IRS) considers that advance to be reportable compensation, and, therefore, subject to withholding federal income taxes, Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) taxes, and Medicare taxes.

Note: If you have any outstanding advance(s) subject to federal income tax from IRS, you will be notified via an invoice statement from the U.S. Postal Service. You will be asked to either repay the outstanding amount or provide reasonable substantiation you used the money for business travel (receipts) as indicated in the invoice statement to U.S. Postal Service Disbursement Office, Eagan, Minnesota.

Handbook F-101 Revision: Postal Quarter Counts for Cash Retained Credit and Cash Reserve

Effective October 6, 2011, Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, is revised to include the new count frequency as well as the new authorized tolerance amount for employee cash retained credits and unit cash reserve. Postmasters, managers, and supervisors at POS ONE postal retail units (PRUs) under Segmented Inventory Accountability (SIA) must perform employee's cash retained credit counts and unit cash reserve counts randomly at least once per postal quarter. Frequency of employee cash retained credit and unit cash reserve counts in SIA offices changed from at least once a month to no less frequently than once each postal quarter.

With the new count frequency of once each postal quarter, each employee is authorized a tolerance amount of \$10 during his or her cash retained credit count regardless of the amount of the cash retained credit. As always, no tolerance is applied when conducting a final count of a cash retained credit.

Cash retained credits must be counted randomly at least once each postal quarter.

Counts can be conducted any day within the postal quarter, but should be conducted randomly to avoid establishing a pattern. This includes bargaining and nonbargaining employees and postmaster reliefs.

Cash retained credit counts (including those with a \$0 balance) must be conducted using the POS workflow. Each employee's domestic and international (MP-1) money orders must be counted in conjunction with the cash credit count. (See the *POS ONE Procedures Guide*, subchapter 12-5, for instructions on conducting counts in the POS system.)

If an employee has a reassigned portion of the unit cash reserve, it must be counted in conjunction with the cash retained credit count.

The assigned employee and another employee, one of whom must be a nonbargaining employee, perform the count(s).

Note: If a nonbargaining employee is not domiciled at the unit, the postmaster, manager, or supervisor responsible for the unit is required to perform independent cash credit count no less than once every postal quarter.

13-8.4 Cash Retained Count Tolerance

Each employee is authorized a tolerance of \$10 during his or her cash retained credit count regardless of the amount of the cash retained credit.

The cover of the *Mover's Guide* envelope now includes color-coded up/down arrows along with the in-market dates to convey its effective quarter. The corresponding color code of the up/down arrow for the October 2011 issue is *orange*.

Mover's Guide Information

- Offices will receive copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments arrived at the end of September. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later. Shipments are sent in quantities of 25, 100, and 300.
- Your facility may receive copies of *Mover's Guide* addressed to other offices. Break down each pallet in accordance with the posted plaque, check the labels, and forward the guides as appropriate.

Behind the Counter Program

Below are a few points about program compliance:

- Effective immediately, sales and service associates may no longer distribute more than three copies of *Mover's Guide* per customer. Instruct customers who need more than three copies to change their additional address(es) online at www.usps.com.
- Copies of *Mover's Guide* must be kept behind the counter. No copies of *Mover's Guide* should be placed in the inner or outer lobby or on the clerk counters. *If you have copies of Mover's Guide in the lobby at this time, remove them and place them behind the counter.*
- Retail associates should first encourage their customers requesting change-of-address materials to go online at www.usps.com. ICOA transactions provide customers with the most convenient, safe, and secure way to change their address.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, unopened copy of *Mover's Guide*. The envelope contains instructions and valuable offers that generate revenue for the Postal Service™. When you

throw out the envelope and its contents, the Postal Service loses money.

Note: The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is part of the ad-hoc section of the 2010 Retail Customer Experience Program, so it is critical that your Post Office be compliant with the program throughout the year by keeping copies of *Mover's Guide* out of Post Office lobbies.

ICOA Message Card Information

- If your Post Office has an ICOA Message Card display, *do not throw it away*. The display is required to be in the lobby and expected to have the ICOA Message Cards in it at all times. Replenishment cards and updated banners are mailed with your *Mover's Guide* shipments.
- If your Post Office does not have an ICOA Message Card display, you must call the replenishment phone number below for ICOA Message Card replenishment.
- If any Post Office runs out of ICOA Message Cards between shipments, call Imagitas at 800-816-6837 for replenishment.
- All Post Offices must have ICOA Message Cards in their lobbies for customer reference.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of an e-mailed Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed as noted above for 30 days unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The e-mail network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

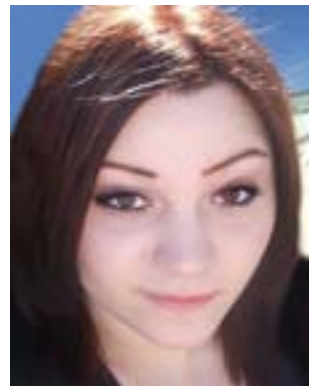

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes

Rural Carriers

In accordance with provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.3 of the Rural Carrier National Agreement, effective October 8, 2011 (pay period 22-11), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will decrease from 73.5 cents per mile to 72.0 cents per mile. The EMA is 72.0 cents per mile, or a minimum of \$28.80 per day, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.5,

receive an EMA of 72.0 cents per mile or \$7.80 per hour, whichever is greater. This EMA should not exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance allowance for the route stops and miles.

EMA Rate Schedule

The EMA rate schedule on pages 78–79 supersedes all previously published EMA schedules for employees receiving EMA.

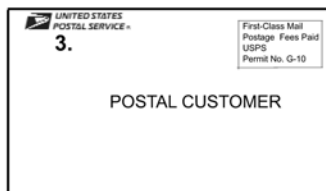
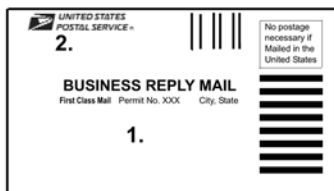

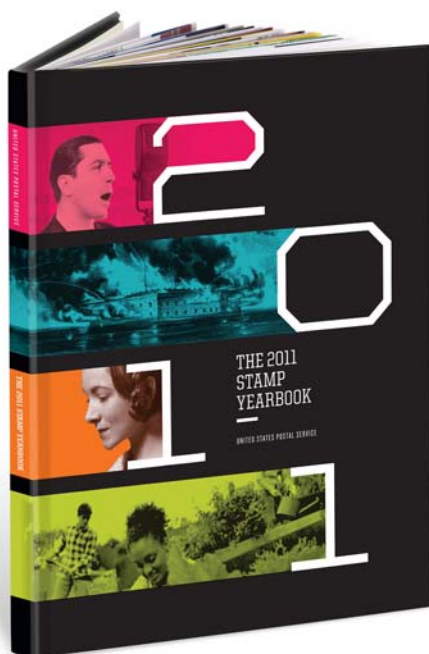

Initial Supply to Designated Post Offices

Minnesota Diversified Industries (MDI) will ship supplies of the *2011 Stamp Yearbook* to approximately 4,168 designated Post Office locations. About 2,638 offices will receive supplies of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps — 38th Edition*. Both books are to be sold upon receipt in mid October. Offices currently selling the *2010 Stamp Yearbook* and *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps — 37th Edition* and those that ordered the books this past year will receive automatic shipments of the newer publications. Quantities sent to each unit will be based on past sales and will include nonaccountable sample books for display purposes.

POS ONE offices must reflect stamp yearbooks and stamp guides (not including display samples) along with all philatelic products in Retail Floor Stock to ensure inventory detection and accurate replenishment. Failure to do so will trigger additional shipments of unwanted products causing unnecessary accountability inflation.

Offices that currently receive the quarterly full philatelic product assortment will receive the remainder of their Quarter 1, Fiscal Year 2011 philatelic products in a separate shipment in mid October. Upon receipt, offices should display the philatelic products and sample books on their “Featured Items” section of slatwall. The *2010 Stamp Yearbook* should be removed from display but may still be sold until it is officially withdrawn from sale.

Ordering Instructions for All Other Post Offices

Offices not receiving automatic shipments of the *2011 Stamp Yearbook* (Item #991100), and *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps — 38th Edition* (Item #891100), can order the books from their assigned Stamp Distribution Center (SDC) or Stamp Distribution Office (SDO) via the Stamp Services System online ordering system. Use PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*, and provide the appropriate item number(s) when placing orders. Sales of the stamp yearbook and stamp guide must be reported in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales.

The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps — 37th Edition (Last Year’s Edition)

As the 38th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* becomes available, Post Offices must withhold all

remaining copies of the 37th edition (Item 891000) from sale. Actions should be taken as described below:

1. *Retail Outlets*. Collect remaining copies of the 37th edition of the guide from stamp credits and immediately return them to main stock using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*.
2. *Post Offices*. Consolidate all remaining copies of the 37th edition of the guide, if any, into the unit reserve stock. Prepare all 37th editions of the guide in accordance with procedures established for disposing of obsolete and redeemed stock, and submit according to local district quarterly stamp destruction or return schedules.
3. *Local Office Philatelic Programs*. Submit PS Form 17 to the local SDO or SDC for the number of 37th editions of the guide (Item 891000) needed for philatelic/promotional programs. One or more copies may be donated to local schools, libraries, student groups, stamp clubs, and retirement homes.
4. *Stamp Distribution Offices/Centers*. Stamp all copies of the guide used in promoting philatelic programs “NOT FOR RESALE.” The SDO/SDC custodian of accountable paper must verify that each item is stamped and prepare a PS Form 17, endorsed “PHILATELIC PRODUCTS GIVEN TO PHILATELIC PROGRAMS.” Program coordinators must acknowledge receipt of Item 891000 and be responsible for its control.

Note: The instructions for providing obsolete editions of the guide for philatelic and promotional purposes are an exception to general guidelines for destruction of accountable items, especially regarding obsolete (withdrawn from sale) items. In this instance, it is Postal Service policy not to destroy copies of the previous year’s edition of the guide when they can be used for valid promotional and/or educational purposes.

Disposition of Excess Guides

Dispose of all remaining copies of the 37th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* (Item 891000) in accordance with Handbook F-1, *Accounting and Reporting Policy*, 45, Destroying Stamp Stock. Because disposition instructions are issued annually for past issues of the guide, *your office should have only the new 38th edition in inventory after completing the above procedures*. If previous editions are on hand, dispose of them immediately, in accordance with Handbook F-1, 4-11.6.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears here. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

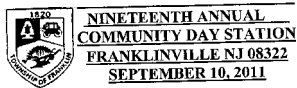
Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.


