



Cover Story

Every Employee Has a Voice at the Postal Service

The Voice of the Employee (VOE) survey is the Postal Service's™ measure of employee engagement. What is employee engagement? Engagement is the extent to which people enjoy and believe in what they do, and feel valued for doing it. It is a positive attitude held by the employee toward the organization and its values that influences employees to invest and spend discretionary effort to help the organization succeed. High levels of employee engagement drive desirable organizational outcomes such as customer satisfaction, productivity, safety, and talent retention.

Each quarter, 25 percent of employees are invited to take the survey and give their feedback on key drivers of employee engagement such as trust, communication, and respect. Survey participation is voluntary and completely confidential — employees can fill out their surveys on the clock and mail them directly to a third-party vendor who tabulates and summarizes the results. Groups with less than ten responses are combined with the responses in the next higher level. No one in the Postal Service can identify individual respondents.

Last quarter, over 71,000 employees let their opinions be heard through the VOE survey. Survey feedback is used to identify improvement opportunities and measure our progress over time. Quarter two VOE surveys are being mailed out now. Employees who receive a survey are highly encouraged to confidentially complete it and send it in by February 20th.

Handbook F-101 Revision: POS ONE Retail Floor Stock Limit Change

Effective January 27, 2012, a POS ONE system enhancement will no longer require the authorized temporary increase Reason Codes 001 and 002 for retail floor stock limit. The increase in the retail floor stock limit provides the flexibility to reflect additional stamp stock inventory at the retail floor stock level.

If additional stamp stock is required that exceeds the retail floor stock limit, the POS system will prompt with the following message: "A supervisor override is required to exceed the maximum stock transfer allowed amount." This requires the unit supervisor to log on with his or her login ID to authorize the transaction.

stock limit when there are no SPLY sales to use for calculating the retail floor stock limit as described earlier. The DFM will provide the unit with a written authorization with the amount established, effective date, and expiration date.

For the purpose of establishing the retail floor stock limit, the calculation to determine same period last year (SPLY) stamp sales is to take the total amount reported in AIC 852 on the unit's PS Form 1412 and subtract AICs 011, 086, and 094.

If additional stamp stock is required that exceeds the Retail Floor Stock limit, the POS system will request a Supervisor Override. The unit supervisor will log on with his or her POS ONE login ID and authorize the transaction.

Publication 75, Mover's Guide, News

The January 2012 issue of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, is in process of being shipped to all Post Office™ facilities. All shipments should have been received by December 31, 2011. As of January 1, 2012, recycle all expired versions.

The *Mover's Guide* shipments will now include Intelligent Mail Package Barcodes (IMpb). Please scan these codes per standard procedure upon shipment arrival.

The cover of the *Mover's Guide* envelope now includes color-coded up/down arrows along with the in-market dates to convey its effective quarter. The corresponding color code of the up/down arrow for the January 2012 issue is **black**.

Mover's Guide Information

- Offices will receive copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments will arrive at the end of December. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later. Shipments are sent in quantities of 25, 100, and 300.
- Your facility may receive copies of *Mover's Guide* addressed to other offices. Break down each pallet in accordance with the posted plaque, check the labels, and forward the guides as appropriate.

Behind the Counter Program

Below are a few points about program compliance:

- Effective immediately, sales and service associates may no longer distribute more than three copies of *Mover's Guide* per customer. Instruct customers who need more than three copies to change their additional address(es) online at www.usps.com.
- Copies of *Mover's Guide* must be kept behind the counter. No copies of *Mover's Guide* should be placed in the inner or outer lobby or on the clerk counters. *If you have copies of the Mover's Guide in the lobby at this time, remove them and place them behind the counter.*
- Retail associates should first encourage their customers requesting change-of-address materials to go online at www.usps.com. Internet change-of-address (ICOA) transactions provide customers with the most convenient, safe, and secure way to change their address.

- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, unopened copy of *Mover's Guide*. The envelope contains instructions and valuable offers that generate revenue for the Postal Service™. When you throw out the envelope and its contents, the Postal Service loses money.

Note: The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is part of the ad-hoc section of the 2010 Retail Customer Experience Program, so it is critical that your Post Office be compliant with the program throughout the year by keeping copies of *Mover's Guide* out of Post Office lobbies.

ICOA Message Card Information

- If your Post Office has an ICOA Message Card display, *do not throw it away*. The display is required to be in the lobby and expected to have the ICOA Message Cards in it at all times. Replenishment cards and updated banners are mailed with your *Mover's Guide* shipments.
- If your Post Office does not have an ICOA Message Card display, you must call the replenishment phone number below for ICOA Message Card replenishment.
- If any Post Office runs out of ICOA Message Cards between shipments, call Imagitas at 800-816-6837 for replenishment.
- All Post Offices must have ICOA Message Cards in their lobbies for customer reference.

Revision: PS Form 1509, Sender's Request for USPS Package Intercept Service

Effective January 22, 2012, PS Form 1509, *Sender's Request for USPS Package Intercept Service*, has been revised for use with the Postal Service's new Package Intercept™ Service, which replaces the Recall of Mail service.

Changes to PS Form 1509 include the following:

- Renamed from *Sender's Application for Recall of Mail to Sender's Request for USPS Package Intercept Service*.
- Requests the required information about item to be intercepted, such as class of mail, shape of the item, and extra service tracking number.
- Upon signature by the applicant, confirms the applicant's understanding that the Package Intercept service fee is nonrefundable; there is no guarantee that the item can be intercepted before delivery; and the

item may incur additional postage due upon delivery to the sender.

- Provides detailed instructions for completing the form.
- A copy of PS Form 1509 is available on pages [45–46](#).

International Reply Coupons and Price Change

Effective January 22, 2012, the price change affects the selling price of the International Reply Coupon (IRC). The new selling price is \$2.20 per coupon. Post Offices™ and postal retail units (PRUs) should use their existing supply of \$2.10 IRCs, and at the time of sale, add a 10-cent postage stamp.

Offices must follow the below procedures now that the price change went into effect on January 22, 2012. When affixing the postage stamps, leave the bottom-right corner of the IRC clear. This provides space for the foreign post that exchanges the coupon to cancel it.

If you use a 10-cent postage validation imprinter (PVI) label or postal postage meter, make sure you affix these labels only to the back of the IRC and do not cover any portion of the IRC's barcode.

Post Offices and PRUs must ensure that an adequate supply of 10-cent stamps are on hand. No accounting entries are required to adjust the value of IRCs in inventory. Record the sale of the additional 10-cents postage applied to the IRC as AIC 090, Postage Stock Sales, or AIC 109, Postage Validation Imprinter, on the retail associate's PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*.

Federal Income Tax Withholding

Effective as soon as possible, payroll checks will reflect a change in the withholding of federal taxes. The biweekly personal exemption value for each federal tax allowance will change to \$146.15. All information in this article is based on a biweekly payroll period (PP) and the withholding tables in Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Publication 15, (*Circular E*), *Employer's Tax Guide*.

Contributions made by employees to the following are treated as pre-tax monies for federal tax computations:

- Commuter Program pre-tax (CPP).
- Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).
- Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB).
- Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA).
- Health Savings Account (HSA).
- Thrift Savings Plan (TSP)

When calculating your taxes, remember to subtract your withholding allowances and all of these contribution amounts from your gross earnings.

Note: There are two technical exceptions to this pre-tax rule. TSP contributions are tax-deferred; however, they are deducted during these computations. Additionally, in rare instances, if an employee has signed a pre-tax waiver for FEHB benefits, they are considered to be taxable income and not used in these calculations.

To determine the amount of withholding, follow steps 1 through 9 as follows:

1. Determine normal biweekly gross wages from earnings statement.
2. Determine normal biweekly TSP contributions from earnings statement.
3. Determine normal biweekly FSA contributions from earnings statement. If applicable, add the amounts from both the FSA Dependent Child (FSADC) sub-account and the FSA Health Care (FSAHC) sub-account.
4. Determine normal biweekly FEHB pre-tax employee contribution from earnings statement (abbreviated as HB).

5. Determine normal CPP employee contribution from earnings statement.
6. Determine normal FEDVIP employee contribution from earnings statement.
7. Determine normal HSA contribution from earnings statement.
8. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the new biweekly exemption value of \$146.15 (withholding allowance). The federal tax line on the earnings statement shows the number of exemptions claimed (e.g., S1 = single with one exemption, M3 = married with three exemptions).
9. Subtract the amounts in step 2 (TSP), step 3 (FSA), step 4 (FEHB), step 5 (CPP), step 6 (FEDVIP), step 7 (HSA), and step 8 (exemptions) from step 1 (biweekly gross wages). The balance is the amount subject to withholding.
10. Determine which range this amount falls into on the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table, and follow the instructions listed in the table.

The following is an example of how to compute federal income taxes for a Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) employee who claims married with three exemptions and makes pre-tax contributions to the TSP, FSA, FEHB, CPP, and FEDVIP.

Example: A FERS employee receives \$3,826.35 as biweekly gross wages. The employee makes the following contributions: 11 percent of basic earnings (for this example, all of the gross \$ is basic, X .11 = \$420.90) per pay period (PP) to the TSP; \$65 per PP to the FSADC Sub-Account; \$95 per PP to the FSAHC Sub-Account; \$131.48 per PP for FEHB, \$105 for this PP to the CPP; and \$43 for the GEHA PPO High Option Dental Biweekly Premium. The employee

claims “married” with three exemptions (M3 on the federal tax line of the earnings statement). Using the information provided in the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table in this article, federal taxes are computed as follows:

1. Total biweekly gross wages	\$3,826.35
2. Thrift Savings Plan contributions	420.90
3. Flexible Spending Account Dependent Child contribution	65.00
Flexible Spending Account Health Care contribution	95.00
Total Flexible Spending Account contribution	160.00
4. Federal Employees Health Benefits contribution	131.48
5. Commuter Program pre-tax contribution	105.00
6. Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program contribution	43.00
7. Exemptions (3 x \$146.15)	438.45

Computation continues as follows:

To complete the computation, refer to the Married/Biweekly segment of the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table. The amount of wages subject to withholding (\$2,527.52) falls within the “over \$981 but not over \$3,031” range. USPS Package Intercept Service: Enabling Customers to Redirect Delivery of Shipments

As part of the January 22, 2012, price change, the Postal Service™ began implementing a new mailer service called Package Intercept™. Package Intercept™ is a new domestic service that replaces the current recall of mail service as follows:

- Package Intercept can be used for any mailable Express Mail®, Priority Mail®, First-Class Mail®, First-Class Package Service, Parcel Select®, and Package Services, letter, flat, or parcel with a tracking barcode.
- Package Intercept is available by submitting PS Form 1509, *Sender's Request for USPS® Package Intercept Service*, and paying a nonrefundable per-piece fee to initiate the process at the Post Office™ of mailing.
- Items located will be redirected to sender.

For all mailpieces that are redirected to the sender, the sender may be subject to payment of the applicable postage. Package Intercept is not available to international and APO/FPO/DPO destinations or on mailpieces requiring a customs label. USPS® does not guarantee the interception of a mailpiece.

Parcels may not measure more than 108 inches in length and girth combined. Package Intercept is not available for any mailpiece that indicates surface-only transportation such as Label 127, *Surface Mail Only*, or bears other hazardous materials markings such as "Consumer Commodity ORM-D".

Future phases of the Package Intercept service are scheduled for 2012, and plans include introducing an online application process and expanded options to include redirecting items to a new address or to a Post Office™ as Hold For Pickup. Following the final implementation phase, PS Form 1509 will then be retired.

Commercial customers requesting Package Intercept should contact their Postal Service sales specialist or business service network representative for assistance.

The purpose is to build Every Door Direct Mail Retail volume by letting customers know that Every Door Direct Mail Retail is a way to reach every customer in their neighborhood, without needing names or addresses, and that each USPS retail office accepts Every Door Direct Mail Retail mailings for all ZIP Codes™ served by its carrier routes (5,000 pieces per mailer per unit per day).

The poster comes with instructions for posting. Retail teams are asked to place the poster in a frame, if possible, or to use adhesive backing and display it on the wall of the full-service lobby so it is visible from the queue.

On January 22, 2012, with other 2012 price changes, postage for Every Door Direct Mail Retail flats went from 14.2 cents to 14.5 cents per piece.

In 2005, the application was a four-part form and “Distribution: Copy 3 — HQ” was sent to Headquarters. The form has been revised multiple times and “Distribution: Copy 3 — HQ” has not been a part of the application for several years, but we continue to get copies of the application. Many offices continue to use the 2005 or 2006 edition of the form, and others are making copies of “Distribution: Copy 1 — Post Office” and sending it to HQ.

Please use the most current, January 2011, edition of the form. It has a new format and the Terms and Conditions have been updated. You can order the current edition of the form from the Material Distribution Center and use touch-tone order entry (TTOE). Call 800-273-1509.

Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Reviewing and Posting EHS/OSHA Form 300A

Installation or establishment heads are required to complete, review, sign, and post the EHS/OSHA Form 300A. When you sign on the Company Executive line, you are certifying that you have verified that the entries on the EHS/

OSHA Form 300A — and its supporting documents — are true, accurate, and complete.

The following steps are required for completing and posting the EHS/OSHA Form 300A:

1. Estimate the average number of all employees at your establishment or installation for the calendar year. Place this number of employees in the location designated as number 1.
2. Enter the installation's CY 2011 total hours worked (exposure hours). Place these hours in the location designated as number 2.
3. As installation or establishment head, sign your name, and provide your job title, office telephone number, and date in the location designated as number 3.
4. Make a copy of the completed and signed document. File the copy in local files and post the original document where it can be viewed by all employees. Post on employee bulletin boards from February 1, 2012, through April 30, 2012. Document the date posted and date removed on the backside of the EHS/OSHA 300A. Retain this form for 5 years.

From February 1 through April 30, 2012, facility heads must post a completed and signed copy of the EHS/OSHA Form 300A for CY 2011 in a conspicuous place at every establishment where employees work or report to work. You must post an EHS/OSHA Form 300A even if you did not experience any OSHA injuries or illnesses in the calendar year.

Note: You do not need to post the EHS/OSHA Form 300 log with the EHS/OSHA Form 300A. Pull down the original Form 300A after April 30, 2012, and maintain it in your file system for 5 calendar years.

Retaining Forms

Ensure that an EHS/PS Form 1769/301, Equivalent, is on file for each entry on the EHS/OSHA Form 300. Postal Service installations must retain EHS/OSHA Forms 300, 300A, and 1769/301 for 5 calendar years. PS Form 1769, *U.S. Postal Service Accident Report*, often used before completing EHS forms and in conjunction with the OSHA forms, also must be retained for 5 years.

Reminder: Federal Reporting Requirements on Hazardous and Toxic Chemicals

Any postal facility that stores 500 pounds or more of an extremely hazardous substance or 10,000 pounds or more of hazardous and toxic chemicals, at any time within the year, must comply with the reporting requirements of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), a stand-alone provision of Title III, Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) enacted in October 1986.

EPCRA, along with Executive Order 13514, Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance, reiterated the need for federal agencies to lead by example in their environmental considerations. They provide guidance to our continuing commitment to preserve our country's national resources and to meet our environmental objectives.

Postal Service™ facilities have been reporting under Section 312 of EPCRA for hazardous and toxic chemicals and extremely hazardous substances stored onsite. The

reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds or greater of any chemical present (e.g., heating oil, gasoline, sand, and de-icing compounds) and 500 pounds or the threshold planning quantity for any extremely hazardous substance (e.g., sulfuric acid and sulfuric acid in batteries) stored at a facility at any one time during the preceding calendar year.

Reporting Process

As applicable, all Postal Service installation heads should submit the emergency and hazardous chemical inventory reporting form (EPCRA Tier-2 Form) annually by March 1 to the following:

- The state Emergency Response Commission.
- The local Emergency Planning Committee.
- The local fire department that would respond to an emergency at your facility.

Commonly reported substances/thresholds include the following:

- Lead Acid Batteries — Threshold 500 pounds of sulfuric acid. This threshold can be met by having more than six tow motor batteries onsite. Estimate the threshold by multiplying the battery weight by 18 percent.
- Gasoline, diesel, or heating fuel. — The 10,000-pound threshold can be met at 1,433 gallons of gasoline or 1,223 gallons of diesel/heating fuel.
- Ice melt/anti-skid products (e.g., rock salt, calcium magnesium acetate, and sand). — Whether delivered in one bulk location or on pallets dispersed on the site, the substance must be reported if it exceeds 10,000 pounds.

Many states have moved to electronic reporting; however, if software that is not authorized on Postal Service ACE systems is required for electronic reporting, we will

continue to report by hardcopy communications. Each state's individual reporting requirements, procedures, and forms can be accessed at <http://www.epa.gov/osweroe1/content/epcra/tier2.htm>.

Stamp Announcement 12-19: Heart Health

On February 9, 2012, in Washington, DC, the Postal Service™ will issue a *Heart Health* commemorative stamp (Forever® priced at 45 cents), in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 468700).

With the issuance of this stamp, the U.S. Postal Service® hopes to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining a healthy heart. The stamp art, which features a bright yellow sun disc, a leafy green trees icon, and a blue swirl of a sky, evokes the feelings of wellness and vitality that come from physical exercise — a key element in controlling and preventing coronary heart disease, or CHD, the leading cause of death among women and men in the United States each year. The striding figure at the center of the stamp has a full red heart. At the figure's feet, a large red apple represents a well-balanced diet. Art director Derry Noyes worked with the artist Nicholas Wilton to create this fresh and positive approach to a difficult subject.

The stamp will go on sale nationwide February 9, 2012.

Distribution: Item 468700, Heart Health Commemorative (Forever priced at 45 cents) PSA Pane of 20 Stamps

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution centers (SDCs) will receive their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane stamp. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 40,000 stamps.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs/SDCs will make subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 45 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm. SDOs/SDCs must not distribute this commemorative sheet to Post Offices before January 26, 2012.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional quantities of Item 468700 must requisition them from their designated SDO/SDC after the first day of issue using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-STAMP-24. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*


All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.



The next Semi-Annual Capital Property Review is scheduled to begin on February 1, 2012; the completion deadline is February 15, 2012. During the week of February 1, 2012, National Materials, Customer Service in Topeka, Kansas, will send out via e-mail the list of items to be verified by the selected finance numbers.

The Semi-Annual Capital Property Reviews are a Sarbanes-Oxley requirement. A list of offices with finance numbers that receive a Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report but that do not submit the report on time will be provided to senior management.

As needed, the Asset Accountability Service Centers (AASCs) will be contacting Headquarters, area, district, and

local managers to verify the points of contact for the upcoming February 2012 Semi-Annual Capital Property Review. The AASCs will provide instructions and guidelines on how the Semi-Annual Capital Property Reviews are to be conducted by the field and Headquarters groups.

Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, is under revision; instructions and guidelines provided by the AASCs will supersede those in Handbook AS-701 where there are conflicts.
