

Third Quarter Voice of the Employee Surveys are in the Mail

The Voice of the Employee (VOE) survey is the nation largest survey of employee engagement, and an important component of measuring our success on the Employee Engagement Delivering Results Innovation Value and Efficiency (DRIVE) initiative. Every year, all employees are invited to take the survey and share their opinions on the work environment on such dimensions such as communication, trust, safety, and diversity.

Why is employee engagement so important to the Postal Service?

Engaged employees enjoy what they do and feel valued for doing it. They have a positive attitude toward the Postal ServiceTM and its values and are motivated to help it succeed. Engaged employees understand their role in contributing to the organization success and share ownership for improving the work environment.

What drives employee engagement?

Employees are engaged when they have the right tools, training, information, and leadership that they need to do their jobs. The VOE survey is a way to tell us where we are doing well in these areas, and where we can improve.

What can managers and supervisors do to increase employee engagement?

Keep employees informed about what is going on in your installation and in the entire organization. Give them individual recognition and feedback on how they are performing and coach them to be the best they can be. Give them opportunities to develop and grow professionally. Watch your VOE scores each quarter to see how you are doing. Share your VOE survey results with employees and listen to their ideas for making improvements.

Let your opinions be heard.

Participation in the VOE survey is voluntary and entirely confidential. Employees are given 15 minutes on the clock to complete the survey, and responses are mailed to a third-party vendor who tabulates the results. Results are reported in summary form — no individual responses can be identified by the Postal Service.

ASM Revision: Postal Service Corporate Library

Effective April 19, 2012, the *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) is revised to clarify that the Postal Service™ Corporate Library no longer serves as a cost control center in the acquisition of specialized print publications and electronically formatted commercial information for individual departments.

In addition to the other services specified in ASM 67 (printed below in full), the Corporate Library continues to provide access to commonly used business and legal reference materials as well as access to select subscription databases to employees nationwide via its website at http://blue.usps.gov/grweb/corplib_home.htm.

67 Postal Service Corporate Library

The Postal Service Corporate Library is responsible for providing commonly used business and legal reference materials and information services required to assist Postal Service managers with decision making. Corporate library services include the following:

 a. Providing research and reference services to support Postal Service business needs through in-house and commercial databases, networks, and print materials.

- Providing library loan services for Postal Service personnel and user access to commercial electronic subscription services for Postal Service personnel.
- c. Providing orientation and training to Postal Service staff on effective search and retrieval of content from the Internet, Postal Service Intranet, and commercial electronic subscription services that the Corporate Library manages.
- d. Providing support for content management, information monitoring, intelligence gathering, and the integration of commercial business information to meet customer information needs.

DMM Revision: Change in Dimensions for Standard Mail Saturation Flats With Simplified Addresses

Effective May 7, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 301 and 602 to change the size of pieces allowed as Standard Mail® saturation flats when those pieces bear simplified addresses.

This change to physical standards determines mailability of a piece as a Standard Mail flat only for pieces bearing simplified addresses and that are mailed at saturation (carrier route) prices. Specifically, flats mailed under the above conditions are defined either as they are currently (with at least one dimension larger than a letter-size maximum dimension) or as pieces that are longer than 10-1/2 inches, with a minimum height of 3-1/2 inches. This new option for

the categorization of flats allows pieces addressed to city routes and city PO Box™ sections that are currently determined to be letters to be prepared and priced as saturation flats when they bear simplified addresses. We retain the current option for mail with simplified addresses to be letter-size or flat-size when pieces are addressed for rural route delivery. Although items addressed for rural route delivery may be mailed as flats under the revision, we expect that when mailers are able to send such items as letters they will continue to do so. Current standards that set the maximum dimensions and the minimum height and thickness for flats will remain.

This revision will allow the use of "Business Customer" as a simplified address to city routes with 100 percent business deliveries. We will also remove the current requirement to print the delivery city, state, and ZIP Code™ on Standard Mail saturation flats with simplified addresses that are not entered directly at destination delivery units.

1.1 General Definition of Flat Size Mail

[Revise the introductory text of 1.1 as follows:]

Flat-size mail must have the following characteristics:

[Revise item 1.1a as follows:]

a. Be more than 11-1/2 inches long, or more than 6-1/8 inches high, or more than 1/4 inch thick, other than automation flats under 3.0 or as allowed for Standard Mail pieces with simplified addresses under 2.2.2.

2.2 Standard Mail

[Renumber current 2.2.2 as new 2.2.3 and add a new 2.2.2 as follows:]

2.2.2 Dimensions for Standard Mail Flats with Simplified Addresses

Standard Mail flats with simplified addresses for which saturation flats prices are paid must have at least one dimension that is greater than a letter-size maximum dimension as noted in 1.1a. The minimum thickness must be at least 0.007 inch up to a maximum 0.75 inch. As an exception to the minimum length, flats with simplified addresses may have a length shorter than a letter-size maximum length, under all of the following conditions:

- a. The length must be greater than 10.5 inches up to a maximum 15 inches.
- b. The height must be at least 3.5 inches up to a maximum height of 12 inches, but the height must be no greater than the length.
- c. If the piece is also entirely within letter-size dimensions under 201, the piece must bear an "EDDM" marking directly after the "ECRWSS" marking required in 302.3.2c.

- d. When the piece is mailed as part of a saturation flats mailing under applicable conditions in 602.3.2.
- e. Letter-size pieces that meet the size standards in 301.2.2.2a and b and that are addressed to rural routes may be mailed as letters or flats with simplified addresses at the mailer's option.

3.2 Simplified Address

3.2.1 Conditions for General Use

The following conditions must be met when using a simplified address on commercial mailpieces:

[Revise the introductory text of item 3.2.1b as follows:]

b. Standard Mail, Periodicals, and Bound Printed Matter flat-size mailpieces (including Standard Mail pieces allowed as flats under 3.2.1c), and Standard Mail and Periodicals irregular parcels for distribution to a city route or to Post Office boxes in offices with city carrier service, may bear a simplified address, but only when complete distribution is made under the following conditions:

[Delete current item b5 in its entirety. Redesignate current item b4 as new b5 and add a new item b4 as follows:]

4. When preparing mail to routes with 100 percent business deliveries, mailers may use "Business Customer" to indicate that delivery is intended to all active business deliveries.

[Revise redesignated item b5 as follows:]

5. Use of the word "Local," or the Post Office and state name, is optional; however, the Postal Service recommends using the Post Office, state, and ZIP Code for mail not entered at or dropshipped directly to a destination delivery unit.

[Add a new item 3.2.1c as follows:]

c. Standard Mail flats with simplified addresses must have one dimension larger than a letter-size maximum dimension, except under 301.2.2.2. Standard Mail pieces, when mailed under conditions in 301.2.2.2, are considered to be flats and are charged postage for Standard Mail saturation flats. Letter-size pieces that meet the size standards in 301.2.2.2 and that are addressed to rural routes may be mailed as letters or flats with simplified addresses at the mailer's option.

IMM Revision: International Priority Airmail and International Surface Air Lift Service — Country Suspensions

Effective May 7, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 292.452 and 293.452 to temporally suspend International Priority Airmail™ (IPA®) to Cuba, Iran, North Korea, Sudan, and Syria, and International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®) service to Cuba, Iran, Sudan, and Syria.

The five countries affected by this revision are currently included in the sanctioned Country Group E:1 listing in 15 C.F.R. Part 740, Supplement 1. As such, temporary measures are being implemented due to the complexity of monitoring outbound shipments to these countries until such time as export sanctions are removed or exports to these countries can be suitably monitored. These changes do not affect any other class of mail to these countries. For example, First-Class Mail International service remains available to send letter-post items to these destinations.

Publications

Publication 75, Mover's Guide, News

The April 2012 issue of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, has been shipped to all Post Office™ facilities. All shipments should have been received by March 31, 2012. As of April 1, 2012, recycle all expired versions.

Mover's Guide News

Beginning with this April 2012 shipment, the total quantity of *Mover's Guide* copies sent to your facility may have been reduced. In an effort to reduce waste and account for more customers submitting change-of-address orders online, fewer *Mover's Guide* copies are needed. There are several things you can do to conserve as well:

- Make sure customers are aware that USPS.com[®] is the most convenient, safe, and secure way for customers to submit a change-of-address order.
- Encourage carriers to carry ICOA Message Cards on their routes instead of *Mover's Guide* copies.
- Give Mover's Guide copies out to moving customers only.

The *Mover's Guide* shipments now include Intelligent Mail Package Barcodes (IMpb). Scan these codes per standard procedure upon shipment arrival.

The cover of the *Mover's Guide* envelope includes color-coded up/down arrows along with the in-market dates to convey its effective quarter. The corresponding color code of the up/down arrow for the April 2012 issue is *green*.

Mover's Guide Information

- Offices will receive copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments should have arrived at the end of March. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later. Shipments are sent in quantities of 25, 100, and 300.
- Your facility may receive copies of *Mover's Guide* addressed to other offices that must be distributed to their respective offices. Break down each pallet in accordance with the posted plaque, check the labels, and forward the guides as appropriate.

Behind the Counter Program

Below are a few points about program compliance:

- Effective immediately, sales and service associates may no longer distribute more than three copies of *Mover's Guide* per customer. Instruct customers who need more than three copies to change their additional address(es) online at www.usps.com.
- Copies of Mover's Guide must be kept behind the counter. No copies of Mover's Guide should be placed in the inner or outer lobby or on the clerk counters. If you have copies of the Mover's Guide in the lobby at this time, remove them and place them behind the counter.
- When customers approach the counter requesting change-of-address materials, retail associates should

first encourage their customers to go online at www.usps.com. Internet change of address (ICOA) transactions provide customers with the most convenient, safe, and secure way to change their address.

■ Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, unopened copy of Mover's Guide. The envelope contains instructions and valuable offers that generate revenue for the Postal Service[™]. When you throw out the envelope and its contents, the Postal Service loses money.

Note: The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is part of the ad-hoc section of the 2010 Retail Customer Experience Program, so it is critical that your Post Office be compliant with the program throughout the year by keeping copies of *Mover's Guide* out of Post Office lobbies.

ICOA Message Card Information

If your Post Office has an ICOA Message Card display, do not throw it away. The display is required to be in the lobby and expected to have the ICOA Message Cards in it at all times. Replenishment cards and updated banners are mailed with your Mover's Guide shipments.

- If your Post Office does not have an ICOA Message Card display, you must call the replenishment phone number below for ICOA Message Card replenishment.
- If any Post Office runs out of ICOA Message Cards between shipments, call Imagitas at 800-816-6837, or visit our website at http://imagitas.com/contact/postal-request-form/ for replenishment.
- All Post Offices must have ICOA Message Cards in their lobbies for customer reference.

BMEU/DMU

The Postal Service™ is continuing to realize Sarbanes-Oxley Act (SOX) compliance. Business Mail Entry Unit/ Detached Mail Units (BMEU/DMUs) serve as an integral part of the SOX compliance program. The SOX program continues to test key controls at these facilities to ensure SOX compliance standards are met.

During the mail entry process, it is important to thoroughly ensure each control activity is executed in accordance to policy, job-aids, and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). The SOX Key Control Guide: FY 2011 Spring Edition at http://blue.usps.gov/sox/Current_Key_Control_Guide.pdf lays out the proper procedures and required documentation for BMEU/DMU processes. For example, during electronic postage statement check-in, you should remember to review all data in PostalOne!® and initiate the posting of the statement for further processing by checking the Job Arrival Time (JAT) box. The following list details the five BMEU controls tested regularly at Postal Service facilities:

- Acceptance: Postage Statement Completion.
- Postage Statement Check-in.
- Mailing Verification Procedures.
- Finalize/Clear: Verify Each Container has Clearance Document.
- Reconciliation: Perform End-of-Day Reconciliation.

The Key Control Guide also explains the following testing protocol and procedures at DMUs:

- Acceptance: Postage Statement Completion.
- Mailing Verification Procedures.
- (PVDS Origin) Compare Postage Statement to PS Form 8125 (if applicable).
- Finalize/Clear (DMU): Observe Loading and Secure Vehicles.

Given the nature of the work performed within the BMEU/DMU, ensuring proper execution of procedures and required documentation of these controls are critical to the Postal Services's bottom line. With your help and diligence, the Postal Service will continue to be a SOX-complaint organization.

Government Relations and Public Policy

Antiques, Collectibles, and Objects of Historic Value

As USPS® facilities are consolidated or upgraded, some employees may be tempted to leave historic items in disused spaces or even keep the items for themselves — especially if they were used throughout a long career. However, these items belong to the United States Postal Service®. Theft of USPS property is a federal felony punishable by steep penalties.

Policy

All antiques, collectibles, and objects of historic value must be controlled within a postal facility and appropriately safeguarded to ensure that they are not damaged, destroyed, stolen, or disposed of as junk or valueless property.

Local postal officials may not dispose of historic items — whether by loan, donation, sale, or otherwise — without the approval of the USPS historian. Requests for such approval must include a photograph and description of the item.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
- **B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
 - E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.
- G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

 - U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. The returns for the four indexes shown do not include any of these deductions.

Offices are no longer required to send a copy of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service[®] (PFS[®]) Application, to Headquarters (HQ). In 2005, the application was a four-part form and "Distribution: Copy 3 - HQ" was sent to Headquarters. The form has been revised multiple times and "Distribution: Copy 3 - HQ" has not been a part of the application for several years, but we continue to get copies of the application. Many offices continue to use the 2005 or 2006 edition of the form, and others are making copies of "Distribution: Copy 1 - Post Office" and sending it to HQ.

Please use the most current, January 2011, edition of the form. It has a new format and the Terms and Conditions have been updated. You can order the current edition of the form from the Material Distribution Center and use touch-tone order entry (TTOE). Call 800-273-1509.

Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

Stamp Announcement 12-29: Great Film Directors

On May 23, 2012, in Silver Spring, Maryland, the Postal Service™ will issue the Great Film Directors commemorative stamp (Forever® priced at 45 cents) in four designs in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 469200). The stamps will go on sale nationwide May 23, 2012.

With these stamps, the U.S. Postal Service® honors four extraordinary film directors - Frank Capra, John Ford, John Huston, and Billy Wilder. Creators of some of the most iconic scenes in American cinema, they gave audiences an unforgettable (and in some cases, deeply personal) vision of life. The stamps showcase portraits of each filmmaker against a background suggesting scenes from their work: Frank Capra, It Happened One Night; John Ford, The Searchers; John Huston, The Maltese Falcon; and Billy Wilder, Some Like It Hot. Working with art director Derry Noyes, illustrator Gary Kelley created the stamp art using pastels on paper.

Distribution: Item 469200, Great Film Directors (Forever priced at 45 cents) Commemorative PSA Pane of 20 Stamps

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution centers (SDCs) will receive their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane stamp. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 40,000 stamps.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs/SDCs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices of a quantity to cover approximately 45 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at http:// blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm.

SDOs/SDCs must not distribute this commemorative sheet to Post Offices before May 9, 2012.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional quantities of Item 469200 must requisition them from their designated SDO/SDC after the first day of issue using PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-STAMP-24. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.



How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office[™], by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store[®] website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

Revised Process for the Pre-Authorization of Mobile Fueling

Traditionally, fueling out of USPS® bulk tanks and then retail locations, in that order of preference, are the best methods for getting vehicles fueled. Only under special circumstances should mobile fueling be used for the procurement of fuel. The mobile fueling contracts are administered by the Fuel Management Category Management Center (CMC) at Headquarters. Mobile fueling entails a fuel tanker truck going onsite to the USPS location and fueling each vehicle directly from the tanker. Typically, the fueling takes place in the evening or after normal business hours, to eliminate interference with normal business activity. Prior to establishing mobile fuel locations, local managers must define a business case supporting the higher fuel costs that historically average an additional 22 cents per gallon over retail. Mobile fueling is paid for with a U.S. Bank/Voyager "M" card.

The approval process for Postal Service™ sites requesting to become a mobile fueling location has changed at the suggestion of the Environmental Compliance & Risk Mitigation (ECRM) group. The new approval process is as follows:

- Site Manager (Requestor). The site manager determines if mobile fueling is the best method for attaining fuel for the site by describing the factors used to offset the higher mobile fueling costs. The requestor forwards the pre-authorization form to the district manager.
- District Manager. The district manager reviews the pre-authorization form and documentation to determine that the mobile fueling site's request for mobile

- fueling is justified, then forwards to the area manager, Operations Support (MOS).
- Area Manager, Operations Support (MOS). If the area MOS approves the request, then he or she will forward the request to the Office of Sustainability via the appropriate regional manager of Environmental Compliance and Sustainability.
- 4. The Office of Sustainability. The Office of Sustainability will perform an Environmental Risk Evaluation consisting of a review of the local air permit requirements, fire marshal requirements, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) state permit requirements, and other state/local environmental requirements. The Environmental Risk Evaluation process may take up to 180 days to complete. The regional manager of Environmental Compliance and Sustainability will provide the results of the Environmental Risk Evaluation to the area MOS and will assist in reaching a decision based on environmental costs and compliance considerations.
- Area MOS. Once all the permits and compliance requirements are in place, the area MOS will submit the approved pre-authorization form containing all required signatures and documentation to the Fuel Management CMC to begin the contract process.
