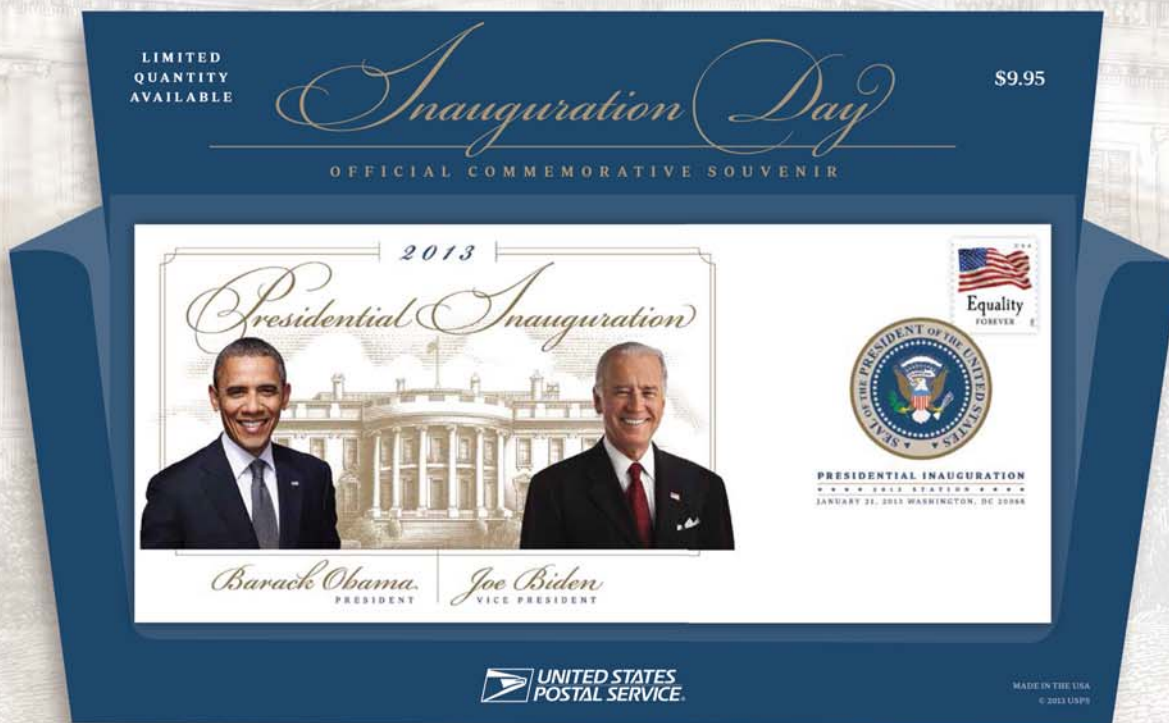



Publicity Kit: Lunar New Year Stamp to Celebrate Year of the Snake

In 2013, the U.S. Postal Service™ will welcome the Year of the Snake with a bang by issuing the sixth of 12 stamps in the current *Celebrating Lunar New Year* series. The Year of the Snake begins February 10, 2013, and ends January 30, 2014. The first-day-of-issue will be January 16, 2013 to provide ample time for customers to purchase the stamps and use them for invitations and greeting cards prior to the first day of the Lunar New Year.

Postmasters are encouraged to coordinate with local Asian community leaders and organizations, such as Asian chambers of commerce, along with elected officials to conduct first-day-of-issue ceremonies. If that is not convenient, “special dedication” ceremonies can take place anytime after that. (The term “second-day-of-issue dedication ceremony” is no longer used.)

- Sample media advisory (for distribution no later than three days prior).

- Sample speech.
- Contacts for obtaining a high-resolution image of the stamp for media use.

Lunar New Year Background

In 2013, the U.S. Postal Service® will welcome the Year of the Snake with a bang by issuing the sixth of 12 stamps in its current *Celebrating Lunar New Year* series. The Year of the Snake begins February 10, 2013 and ends January 30, 2014.

The snake is one of 12 animals associated with the Chinese lunar calendar. According to legend, the animals raced across a river to determine their order in the cycle. The rat crossed by riding on the back of the ox, jumping ahead at the last minute to win the race. The tiger, rabbit, and dragon came in after the ox, followed by the snake in sixth place.

People born in the year of a particular animal are said to share characteristics with that animal. Individuals born during the Year of the Snake are said to be deeply philosophical, mysterious, and comfortable being alone.

The Lunar New Year is celebrated in many parts of the world, primarily by people of Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, Tibetan, and Mongolian heritage. Images associated with

some of these widespread customs are depicted in the *Celebrating Lunar New Year* series.

In the United States as elsewhere, the occasion is marked in various ways across many cultures; parades, parties and other special events are common. Firecrackers, such as those depicted on the stamp, are used to scare off evil spirits and welcome a time of renewed hope for the future. Monetary gifts are given to children and others. Lucky foods are eaten — kumquats, for example — and festive lanterns colored red for luck are common decorations at Lunar New Year celebrations.

Stamp Development Background

The U.S. Postal Service introduced this *Celebrating Lunar New Year* series in 2008. *Year of the Snake* is the sixth stamp in the series, which will continue through 2019 with stamps for the Year of the Horse, Ram, Monkey, Rooster, Dog, and Boar. A previous Lunar New Year stamp series was released between 1992 and the early 2000s. The popularity and universal appeal of the series led to the launch of this newly designed series, which explores the Lunar New Year from a fresh view.

Art director Ethel Kessler worked on the series with illustrator Kam Mak, an artist who grew up in New York City’s Chinatown and now lives in Brooklyn. The artwork focuses on some of the common ways the Lunar New Year holiday is celebrated. For the *Year of the Snake*, which begins February 10, 2013, the illustration was originally created using oil paints on panel and depicts firecrackers of the sort commonly used to greet the New Year with a bang.

Kessler’s design also incorporates two elements from the previous Lunar New Year stamp series — artist Clarence Lee’s intricate paper-cut design of a snake and the Chinese character for a snake drawn in grass-style calligraphy by Lau Bun.

Kam Mak was born in Hong Kong and grew up in New York City’s Chinatown after his family moved to the United States in 1971. Kam’s involvement with City Art Workshop, an organization designed to encourage the art interests of inner city youth, inspired his love of painting. He earned his bachelor of fine arts degree in 1984 from New York’s School of Visual Arts where he studied on a full scholarship.

Mak’s richly colored paintings have illustrated the covers of numerous magazines and books including his first offering as both author and illustrator, *My Chinatown: One Year in Poems*, about a little boy growing up in Chinatown.

DMM Revision: New Minimum Value for Treatment as Dead Mail

Effective January 27, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 507.1.9 to update the minimum value for treating undeliverable articles as dead mail.

Current standards require that matter deposited in the mail that is undeliverable and cannot be returned to the sender is treated as dead mail and forwarded to the Mail Recovery Center (MRC).

This revision serves to align the minimum value for treatment as dead mail from \$10 to \$25 in the DMM with the current threshold provided in the *Postal Operations Manual*, which contains USPS® policy and procedures for handling and disposing of dead mail.

1.9 Dead Mail

1.9.1 Basic Information

Dead mail is matter deposited in the mail that is undeliverable and cannot be returned to the sender. A reasonable effort is made to match articles found loose in the mail with the envelope or wrapper and to return or forward the articles. The disposition of dead mail items is as follows:

IMM Revision: Individual Country Listing for Peru

Effective January 27, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* to reflect various changes in the Individual Country Listings (ICL) for Peru. These revisions are made at the formal request of Serpost (the designated operator that provides postal services in Peru).

Drinks manufactured abroad under the brand name “Pisco.”

Organochlorinated pesticides and their derivatives and components.

Perishable infectious biological substances.

Pyrotechnic products.

Radioactive materials.
Used clothing and shoes.
Used tires.

What's New?

The new January – March 2013 issue of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, has been shipped to all Post Offices™. Similar to last quarter's shipment, the total quantity of *Mover's Guide* copies sent to your facility may have been reduced. In an effort to reduce waste and account for more customers submitting change-of-address orders online, fewer *Mover's Guide* copies are needed. There are several things you can do to conserve as well:

- Make sure customers are aware that *USPS.com*® is the most convenient, safe, and secure way for customers to submit a change-of-address order.
- Encourage carriers to take ICOA message cards on their routes instead of *Mover's Guide* copies.
- Give *Mover's Guide* copies out to *moving* customers only.

Important Reminders

- Copies of *Mover's Guide* must be kept *behind the counter ONLY*, not in inner or outer lobbies or on clerk counters.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, *unopened* copy of *Mover's Guide*.
- Provide *no more than three* copies of *Mover's Guide* to each customer.
- *Mover's Guide* is printed and distributed four times a year.

Shipment Information and Inventory Management

Offices will continue to receive copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments should have

arrived by December 31, 2012. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later.

- Boxes with *yellow* stickers are the first shipment for this print run.
- Boxes with *pink* stickers are the second and final shipment for this print run.

2013 National Rural Route Mail Count

Effective July 2012, in order to comply with the July 03, 2012, Interest Arbitration decision between the United States Postal Service® and the National Rural Letter Carriers Association, a national rural route mail count is scheduled accordingly.

Per standard procedure outlined in Handbook EI-902, *Agreement between USPS and National Rural Letter Carriers' Association, 2011–2015*, Section 9.2.C.3.a.(1), in 2013, a national mail count will be conducted for eighteen (18) working days beginning February 9, and ending March 2,

2013. All routes will be counted except those routes which both the regular carrier and management agree in writing not to count. The mail count will be effective at the beginning of the fourth full pay period following the end of the count period.

2012 Tax Information: Form W-2 Wage and Tax Statement; Form 1099

General Form W-2 Information

If an employee has earnings from more than one state or locality, a separate Form W-2 (see pages [20–21](#)) will be issued for each. The format of the 2012 Form W-2 remains unchanged from the 2011 version.

However, with the discontinuation of Advanced Earned Income Credit (EIC) Payments in 2011, Box 9 is shaded and no longer serves to identify monies of any type. All box numbers remain unchanged from the 2011 version.

New codes “AA” (TSP Roth), “DD” (Cost of Employer-Sponsored Health Coverage), and “Y” (Nonqualified Deferred Compensation) are shown in Box 12. Additionally, distributed deferred compensation is reported in Box 11.

An employee may be able to take the Earned Income Credit (EIC) for 2012, if s/he meets qualifying requirements. Details are printed in the “Notice to Employee” section of the Form W-2. (An employee may also qualify for a state EIC credit. Employees should visit applicable state taxing authority websites to determine eligibility.)

General Questions

Imputed Income Life Insurance

- Imputed Income Life Insurance is reported in Box 12 (letter code "C"). It is the net result of the IRS computation for taxable insurance benefits less the calendar year amount the employee paid for optional insurance. (The formula is based on employee's age, salary, and life insurance coverage.) The IRS requires employers to report as income the employer cost of Group Term Life Insurance in excess of \$50,000.
- Per the Reconciliation Formula, Imputed Income Life Insurance (Box 12) is added to gross pay and is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Thrift Savings Plan (TSP)

- Employee TSP traditional contributions including TSP Catch-up are reported in Box 12 (letter code "D").
- Per the Reconciliation Formula, traditional TSP contributions (Box 12, letter code "D") are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).
- TSP Roth contributions including TSP Catch-Up are reported in Box 12 (letter code "AA"). TSP Roth contributions do not reduce gross pay; they are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). Roth contributions (letter code "AA") are reported for your information only.

Employee Business Expense (EBE)

Equipment maintenance allowance (EMA), carrier drive-out, vehicle hire, and supervisor vehicle usage are considered employee expenses. The nontaxable (not the total) EBE amount is reported in Box 12 (letter code "L"). If there is a taxable amount, it is reported in Box 14 (Other). Per the Reconciliation Formula, taxable vehicle (Box 14) is added to gross pay and is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA): Dependent Care (DC) and Health Care (HC)

- Employee contributions to an FSA for dependent care are reported in Box 10 (Dependent Care Benefits). Per the Reconciliation Formula, FSA contribu-

tions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

- Employee contributions to an FSA for health care are not reported separately in any box on the Form W-2. Per the Reconciliation Formula, FSA contributions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in the gross wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the Pay Period 26-12 earnings statement for the total Health Care FSA amount.

Health Benefits (HB)

- Employee payments for HB premiums are considered pretax unless the employee declined the pretax benefit. Employee pretax HB premium payments are no longer reported separately in any box on the Form W-2. Per the Reconciliation Formula, employee pretax HB premium payments are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in the gross wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the Pay Period 26-12 earnings statement for the total employee pretax HB premium payment amount.
- The Cost of Employer-Sponsored Health Coverage (employer costs plus employee pre-tax and post-tax costs) is reported in Box 12 (letter code "DD"). Reporting is required by the Affordable Care Act but is reported for informational purposes only. The amount reported is not taxable.

Health Savings Accounts (HSA)

HSA contributions are reported in Box 12 (letter code "W"). Per the Reconciliation Formula, HSA contributions (Box 12) are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in the gross wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the Pay Period 26-12 earnings statement for the total employee contribution HSA amount.

Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP)

Employee payments for FEDVIP premiums are considered pretax. Per the Reconciliation Formula, employee FEDVIP premium payments are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in the gross wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the Pay Period 26-12 earnings statement for the total employee FEDVIP premium payment amount.

Commuter Program

Employee contributions for the Commuter Program are considered pretax for 2012 up to the IRS \$125 monthly limit (annual \$1,550) for public transportation and/or the IRS \$240 monthly limit (annual \$2,930) for parking. Per the Reconciliation Formula, employee pretax commuter contributions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the Pay Period 26-12 earnings statement for the total Commuter

Program amount. Any commuting contributions elected over the IRS limits are considered post-tax.

Relocation Payments

Qualified relocation (excludable) reimbursements paid directly to an employee are reported in Box 12 (letter code "P"). Per the Reconciliation Formula, Relocation Gross is added to gross pay while Relocation Excludable (Box 12) is subtracted from gross pay. The net difference between Relocation Gross and Relocation Excludable is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See the statements issued to you by CARTUS, the relocation service for the Postal Service™, if you need additional information.

Military Differential Payments

Military Differential Payments are reported in Box 14 (Other) and are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation) as well as Box 16 (State Wages, tips, etc.) and Box 18 (Local Wages, tips, etc.). Differential payments made to an individual while on active duty for more than 30 days are not subject to Social Security and Medicare taxes. Differential payments made to an individual while on active duty for 30 days or less are subject to Social Security and Medicare taxes.

Nonqualified Deferred Compensation

- Nonqualified Deferred Compensation is reported in Box 12 (letter code "Y").
- Additionally, distributed Nonqualified Deferred Compensation is reported in Box 11 (Nonqualified plans). Per the Reconciliation Formula, Nonqualified Deferred Compensation (Box 11) is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

State/Territory Taxable Wages

The amount in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc) will equal Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation) with the following exceptions:

- California and Wisconsin do not allow income deferral for Health Savings Accounts (HSAs).
- Mississippi does not allow income deferral for pretax commuter program public transportation and parking.
- New Jersey and Puerto Rico do not allow income deferral. Therefore, employee TSP, FSA, FEDVIP, Commuter Program pretax contributions, HB pretax contributions, and HSAs are not subtracted from state gross pay for New Jersey and Puerto Rico.
- Pennsylvania is the only state that does not require the addition of Imputed Income Life Insurance to state gross pay. Also, Pennsylvania does not allow income deferral for TSP, FSA Dependant Care, and Commuter Program pretax contributions.
- Hawaii includes Territorial COLA (TCOLA) in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc.).

Local Taxable Wages

The following statements do not take into account taxable wage limits that exist for certain localities. For those localities, amounts in Box 18 (Local wages, tips, etc.) will not exceed local taxable wage limits.

The amount in Box 18 (Local wages, tips, etc) will equal gross pay with the following exceptions:

- New York City, NY; St. Louis, MO; and MI Locals (Battle Creek, Detroit, Flint, Grand Rapids, Lansing, Pontiac, and Saginaw): Local taxable wages are the same as the federal taxable wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).
- Kansas City, MO, and Madison County, KY: Local taxable wages are federal taxable wages plus HSA.
- OH Locals (Akron, Brecksville, Brook Park, Canton, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Fairview Park, Heath, Kettering, Mansfield, Newark, Oberlin, Sharonville, Springfield, Toledo, Whitehall, and Youngstown): Local taxable wages are federal taxable wages plus TSP and minus Imputed Income Life Insurance.
- With the exception of Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, PA Locals (Bethlehem, Erie, Greene, Hanover, Harrisburg, Horsham, Lancaster, Middletown, Reading, Scranton, Sunbury/Gregg, Tinicum, Warminster, Wilkes-Barre, and York) are the same as the PA taxable wages reported in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc).

Annuity Protection Program (APP)

Form 1099-R

Notice to Employee

Refund. Even if you do not have to file a tax return, you should file to get a refund if box 2 shows federal income tax withheld or if you can take the earned income credit. **Earned income credit (EIC).** You may be able to take the EIC for 2012 if (a) you do not have a qualifying child and you earned less than \$13,980 (\$19,190 if married filing jointly), (b) you have one qualifying child and you earned less than \$35,920 (\$42,130 if married filing jointly), (c) you have two qualifying children and you earned less than \$41,952 (\$47,162 if married filing jointly), or (d) you have three or more qualifying children and you earned less than \$45,060 (\$50,270 if married filing jointly). You and any qualifying children must have valid social security numbers (SSNs). You cannot take the EIC if your investment income is more than \$3,200, or if income is earned for services provided while you were an inmate at a penal institution. Any EIC that is more than your tax liability is refunded to you, but only if you file a tax return.

Clergy and religious workers. If you are not subject to social security and Medicare taxes, see Pub. 517, *Social Security and Other Information for Members of the Clergy and Religious Workers*.

Corrections. If your name, SSN, or address is incorrect, correct Copies B, C, and 2 and ask your employer to correct your employment record. Be sure to ask the employer to file Form W-2c, *Corrected Wage and Tax Statement*, with the Social Security Administration (SSA) to correct any name, SSN, or money amount error reported to the SSA on Form W-2. If your name and SSN are correct but are not the same as shown on your social security card, you should ask for a new card that displays your correct name at any SSA office or by calling 1-800-772-1213. You also may visit the SSA at www.socialsecurity.gov.

Cost of employer-sponsored health coverage (if such cost is provided by the employer). The reporting in Box 12, using Code DD, of the cost of employer-sponsored health coverage is for your information only. The amount reported with Code DD is not taxable.

Credit for excess taxes. If you had more than one employer in 2012 and more than \$4,624.20 in social security and/or Tier 1 railroad retirement (RRTA) taxes were withheld, you may be able to claim a credit for the excess against your federal income tax. If you had more than one railroad employer and more than \$3,192.90 in Tier II RRTA tax was withheld, you also may be able to claim a credit. See your Form 1040 or Form 1040A instructions and Pub. 505, *Tax Withholding and Estimated Tax*.

Instructions for Employee

Box 1. Enter this amount on the wages line of your tax return.
Box 2. Enter this amount on the federal income tax withheld line of your tax return.

Box 8. This amount is not included in boxes 1, 3, 5, or 7. For information on how to report tips on your tax return, see your Form 1040 instructions.

Unless you have records that show you did not receive the amount reported in box 8 as allocated tips, you must file Form 4137, *Social Security and Medicare Tax on Unreported Tip Income*, with your income tax return to report the allocated tip amount. On Form 4137 you will figure the social security and Medicare tax owed on the allocated tips shown on your Form(s) W-2 that you must report as income and on other tips you did not report to your employer. By filing Form 4137, your social security tips will be credited to your social security record (used to figure your benefits).

Box 10. This amount is the total dependent care benefits that your employer paid to you or incurred on your behalf (including amounts from a section 125 (cafeteria) plan). Any amount over \$5,000 is also included in box 1. Complete Form 2441, *Child and Dependent Care Expenses*, to compute any taxable and nontaxable amounts.

Box 11. This amount is (a) reported in box 1 if it is a distribution made to you from a nonqualified deferred compensation or nongovernmental section 457(b) plan or (b) included in box 3 and/or 5 if it is a prior year deferral under a nonqualified or section 457(b) plan that became taxable for social security and Medicare taxes this year because there is no longer a substantial risk of forfeiture of your right to the deferred amount.

Note. If a year follows code D through H, S, Y, AA, BB, or EE, you made a make-up pension contribution for a prior year(s) when you were in military service. To figure whether you made excess deferrals, consider these amounts for the year shown, not the current year. If no year is shown, the contributions are for the current year.

A-Uncollected social security or RRTA tax on tips. Include this tax on Form 1040. See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

B-Uncollected Medicare tax on tips. Include this tax on Form 1040. See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

C-Taxable cost of group-term life insurance over \$53,000 (included in boxes 1, 3 (up to social security wage base), and 5).

D-Elective deferrals to a section 401(k) cash or deferred arrangement. Also includes deferrals under a SIMPLE retirement account that is part of a section 401(k) arrangement.

E-Elective deferrals under a section 403(b) salary reduction agreement.

F-Elective deferrals under a section 408(k)(6) salary reduction SEP.

G-Elective deferrals and employer contributions (including nonelective deferrals) to a section 457(b) deferred compensation plan.

H-Elective deferrals to a section 501(c)(18)(D) tax-exempt organization plan. See "Adjusted Gross Income" in the Form 1040 instructions for how to deduct.

J-Nontaxable sick pay (information only, not included in boxes 1, 3, or 5).

K-20% excise tax on excess golden parachute payments. See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

L-Substantiated employee business expense reimbursements (nontaxable).

M-Uncollected social security or RRTA tax on taxable cost of group-term life insurance over \$50,000 (former employees only). See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

N-Uncollected Medicare tax on taxable cost of group-term life insurance over \$50,000 (former employees only). See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

P-Excludable moving expense reimbursements paid directly to employee (not included in boxes 1, 3, or 5).

Q-Nontaxable combat pay. See the instructions for Form 1040 or Form 1040A for details on reporting this amount.

R-Employer contributions to your Archer MSA, Report on Form 8853, *Archer MSAs and Long-Term Care Insurance Contracts*.

S-Employee salary reduction contributions under a section 408(p) SIMPLE plan (not included in box 1).

T-Adoption benefits (not included in box 1). Complete Form 8839, *Qualified Adoption Expenses*, to compute any taxable and nontaxable amounts.

V-Income from exercise of nonstatutory stock option(s) (included in boxes 1, 3 (up to social security wage base), and 5). See Pub. 525 and instructions for Schedule D (Form 1040) for reporting requirements.

W-Employer contributions (including amounts the employee elected to contribute using a section 125 (cafeteria) plan) to your health savings account. Report on Form 8889, *Health Savings Accounts (HSAs)*.

Y-Deferrals under a section 409A nonqualified deferred compensation plan.

Z-Income under section 409A on a nonqualified deferred compensation plan. This amount is also included in box 1. It is subject to an additional 20% tax plus interest. See "Other Taxes" in the Form 1040 instructions.

AA-Designated Roth contributions under a section 401(k) plan.

BB-Designated Roth contributions under a section 403(b) plan.

DD-Cost of employer-sponsored health coverage. The amount reported with Code DD is not taxable.

EE-Designated Roth contributions under a governmental section 457(b) plan. This amount does not apply to contributions under a tax-exempt organization section 457(b) plan.

Box 13. If the "Retirement plan" box is checked, special limits may apply to the amount of traditional IRA contributions you may deduct. **Note.** Keep Copy C of Form W-2 for at least 3 years after the due date for filing your income tax return. However, to help protect your social security benefits, keep Copy C until you begin receiving social security benefits, just in case there is a question about your work record and/or earnings in a particular year.

Form W-4 Completion for Employees Claiming Exempt Status for 2013

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations permit employees who anticipate no federal tax liability for 2013 to continue to claim total exemption from federal tax withholding provided they owed no federal taxes for 2012. These regulations also require that a new Form W-4, *Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate*, be submitted every calendar year by employees claiming an exempt status. However, because of *PostalEASE*, these employees no longer have to file a hard copy Form W-4.

Employees may meet IRS filing requirements for exempt Forms W-4 by either logging onto *PostalEASE* via the USPS® intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov> or by calling *PostalEASE* toll-free at 877-477-3273, option 1. Follow the Form W-4 instructions provided by *PostalEASE*, and your form will be updated for calendar year 2013. If you need to contact the HR Shared Service Center (HRSSC) in Greensboro about this matter, call 877-477-3273, option 5.

Any employee currently in an exempt status who does not submit a new Form W-4 claiming a continuation of the exempt status will be converted to a taxable status, effective Pay Period (PP) 05-13. For an exempt status to remain effective into the next year, the IRS requires completion, submission, and acceptance of a new form no later than

February 15. Since February 15 falls within PP 05-13, updated Form W-4 information must be entered into *PostalEASE* no later than Friday, **February 15, 2013**. Entry of the information by that date will ensure continuation of the exempt status for 2013.

Any employee who claimed exempt status for 2012 and who does not submit a new Form W-4 will have federal taxes withheld at the rate normally applicable to an employee claiming "single" with "0" allowances. Employees with an exempt status (as of PP 26-12) will receive printed messages on their earnings statement during PP 03-13 and PP 04-13 reminding them a new Form W-4 is required.

Reminders

- All administrative and managerial employees are prohibited from providing any tax advice to employees about the completion of Form W-4.
- Sending information about exempt Form W-4 to Eagan Accounting Services is no longer required.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <https://www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

A2. APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district “Missing Children” coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. New International Hazardous Materials Posters and Notices Are Now Available

There have been recent changes to mailing standards when mailing primary and secondary lithium cells or lithium batteries internationally, or to and from APO, FPO, or DPO destinations. Employees can use these materials to assist customers in determining if their package meets Postal Service, Department of Transportation (DOT), and Federal Aviation Administration standards.

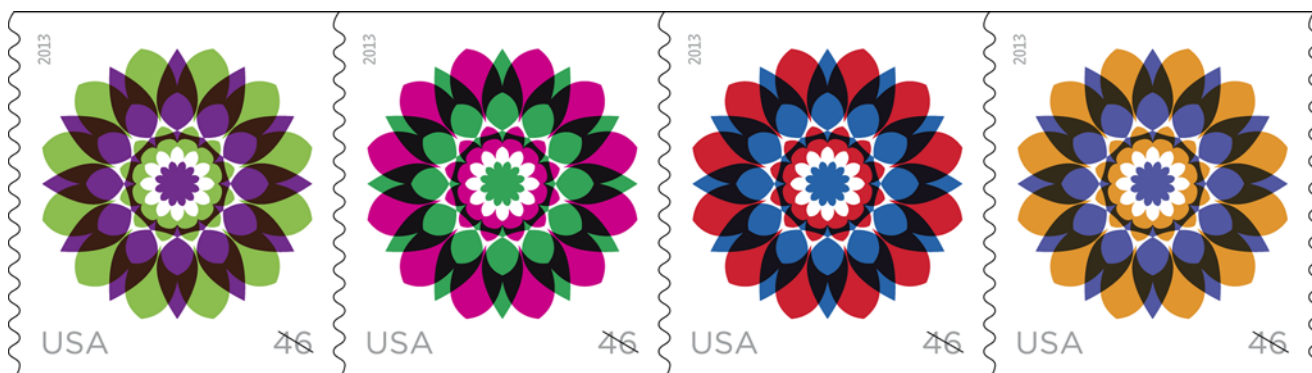

Correction: Forever Stamp Stock Revaluation Instructions

In the article “Forever Stamp Stock Revaluation Instructions,” in *Postal Bulletin* 22353 (12-27-12, pages 68–70), the form recommended for Unit Reserve Stock and Closeout Employees under the eMOVES Offices heading is incorrect.

The corrected information is given below in bold.

Unit Reserve Stock

- Unit reserve custodian receives the stamps (AIC 841, *Stamp Stock Received*) from the retail associate at the value shown (old price) on the PS Form 17.
- Record stock received on PS Form 3295, *Daily Record of Stamps, Stamped Paper, and Nonpostal Stamps on Hand*.
- Multiply the number of Forever Stamps on hand to be revalued by the difference between original price (old price) and revalued price (new price).

- Record the computations for each Forever Stamp booklet revalued on a PS Form 17.
- Enter the total for all calculations from PS Form 17 on **PS Form 3959**, *Unit Reserve Stamp Stock Transaction Record*, as follows:
 - Line 3 for increase (AIC 844, *Stock Increase — Revaluation*).
 - Enter the calculated amount in AIC 844 on unit PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*.

Closeout Employees

- Verify entries in AIC 844 on the unit PS Form 1412.
- File PS Forms 17 and **PS Form 3959** as supporting documentation.

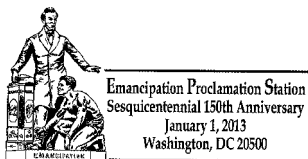

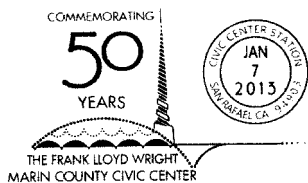

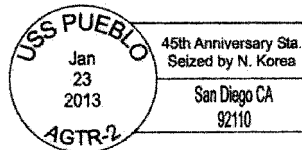

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

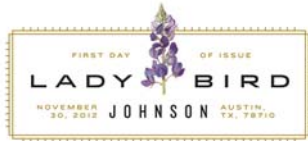
The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of

their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992,

Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

The interest rate effective for the 6-month period of January – June 2013 is 1-3/8 percent.

The next Semi-Annual Capital Property Review is scheduled to begin on February 4, 2013; the completion deadline is February 18, 2013. The list of items to be verified by the selected finance numbers will be sent from National Materials Customer Service by email from "NMCS Autoreply" during the week of February 4, 2013.

The Semi-Annual Capital Property Reviews are a Sarbanes-Oxley requirement. A list of finance numbers that receive a Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report but do not submit the report on time will be provided to senior management.

As needed, the Asset Accountability Service Centers (AASCs) will be contacting Headquarters, area, district, and

local management to verify the points of contact for the upcoming February 2013 Semi-Annual Capital Property Review. Instructions on how to complete the Semi-Annual Capital Property Review will be available via a web link included in the email from NMCS Autoreply. The AASCs are also available to provide support and training upon request. Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, is under revision; instructions and guidelines provided by the AASCs will supersede Handbook AS-701, where there are conflicts.
