Second Quarter Voice of the Employee Surveys are Coming Soon

Every quarter, 25 percent of the career employee population is randomly selected to express their opinions about the work environment by completing a confidential VOE survey. The VOE is the United States Postal Service's™ measure of employee engagement.

Employee engagement is the extent to which people enjoy and believe in what they do, and feel valued for doing it. Having a positive attitude toward the organization and its values influences employees to invest discretionary effort to help the organization succeed. High levels of engagement lead to positive organizational outcomes such as customer satisfaction, productivity, safety, and retention.

Employees are most engaged when they have the right tools, training, teamwork, information, and leadership to do their job. Engaged employees know how their work impacts the success of the Postal Service, and they are motivated to achieve results.

To help employees feel more engaged, we encourage managers and supervisors to do the following:

- Keep employees apprised of what is going on in their installation as well as the entire organization.
- Listen to employees' ideas for making improvements.
- Give them individual feedback about how they are performing and coach them to be the best they can be.
- Give them opportunities to develop and grow professionally.
- Watch your VOE scores each quarter to see how you're doing, and ask your employees how you can do better.

IMM Revision: Shipments of Lithium Batteries to Italy Prohibited

Effective January 18, 2013, the Postal Service™ revised *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM)®* to reflect a change in the Individual Country Listing (ICL) for Italy to prohibit the shipment of lithium cells and batteries to Italy.

The article titled "IMM Revision: Outbound Mailing of Lithium Batteries" in *Postal Bulletin 22350* (11-15-12, page 15) announced new mailing standards that removed the prohibition against mailing lithium metal or lithium-ion batteries internationally, or to or from any Army Post Office™ (APO), Fleet Post Office (FPO), or Diplomatic Post Office (DPO) location, when not restricted or prohibited by the destination country or the APO, FPO, or DPO location.

Recently, Italy formally advised the Postal Service that it is prohibiting the inbound shipment of these items.

Consequently, shipments of electronic items containing lithium cells and batteries destined to Italy will be refused if

presented for mailing or will be returned to the sender if found in the mailstream.

As a reminder, the article titled "IMM Revision: Shipments of Lithium Batteries to Germany Prohibited" in *Postal Bulletin 22351* (11-29-12, page 9) announced that Germany prohibits the inbound shipment of these items.

This prohibition does not apply to shipments to and from APO, FPO, and DPO locations in Italy or Germany.

18-1.2.2 Negative Balance Accounts

[Revise 18-1.2.2 to read as follows:]

The District Finance Manager or designee must review the Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) Deficient Balance report at least twice per year to ensure that the District Business Mail Entry office complies with established collection procedures for negative balance accounts.

The collection procedure for a negative balance account is as follows:

- a. Exhaust all methods for local collection.
- b. Close the account in Electronic Marketing Reporting System (EMRS) and initiate a PS Form 2134, *EMCA Uncollectible*.
- c. Submit PS Form 2134 to Eagan Accounting Services.
- d. The collection agency provides confirmation through placement report to Accounting Services.

18-1.2.5 Closing an Account with a Negative Balance

[Revise 18-1.2.5 to read as follows:]

The District Business Mail Entry office must close an account that has a negative balance as follows:

- a. Notify the customer that the Postal Service will forward the account to the collection agency.
- b. If the customer does not pay the balance, invalidate the account in EMRS.
- c. After 30 days, the EMCA closes in EMRS and the balance appears as “Transfer to PM.” EMRS automatically posts accounting entries to AICs 055 and 606. (The PRU employee does not make any local PS Form 1412 entries).
- d. Complete PS Form 2134 and forward it to Eagan Accounting Services.

Reminder: International Reply Coupons

All postal retail units must submit foreign-issued (exchanged) and U.S.-issued (redeemed) international reply coupons (IRCs) accepted through December 31, 2012, to their assigned destruction stamp distribution center (SDC) or stamp distribution office (SDO) as follows:

- SDCs accepting redeemed or exchanged IRCs: Kansas City, Phoenix, and Atlanta.
- SDOs accepting redeemed or exchanged IRCs: Caribbean, Alaska, and Honolulu.

Redeemed or exchanged IRCs (shown here) with an expiration date of December 31, 2013 (Item Number 330800), are the only version that SDCs and SDOs will accept. Postal retail units must submit IRCs by the January 31, 2013, due date.

The redemption rate for foreign-issued exchanged IRCs with an expiration date of December 31, 2013, is \$1.05. Customer-returned U.S.-issued IRCs are redeemed at 1 cent less than the purchase price.



Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, part 11-6.6, International Reply Coupons, provides instructions for submitting exchanged foreign-issued and redeemed U.S.-issued IRCs to SDCs or SDOs.

Do not return IRCs with an expiration date of December 31, 2009, and earlier to an SDC or SDO. For IRCs with an expiration date before December 31, 2009, that were not returned as advised in past Postal Bulletin articles, do as follows:

- Remove from your inventory.
- Destroy locally (no value).
- Post as a shortage (AIC 767) to your unit reserve stock inventory (POS units must enter a count in the “Count Inventory and Cash” workflow; select “Close Credit/Transfer to Another Employee”).

Unit reserve custodians may submit a claim for loss to the district finance manager following procedures in Handbook F-101, subchapter 8-7, Claim for Loss. Upon receipt of an approved claim for loss, clear the stamp credit shortage (AIC 367) and offset to AIC 633, Claim for Loss; use Reason Code 10, Uncollectible Employee Items.

Do not return IRCs with an expiration date of December 31, 2009, and earlier to an SDC or SDO for any reason.

Federal Income Tax Withholding

Effective immediately, payroll checks will reflect changes in the withholding of federal taxes. The biweekly personal exemption value for each federal tax allowance will change to \$150.00. In addition, the Single or Head of Household and the Married withholding tables have changed. The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 (H.R. 8) extends the Bush-era tax cuts for individuals earning under \$400,000 annually, and \$450,000 for couples. However, the marginal income tax rate for high-income taxpay-

ers will increase to 39.6 percent for the excess of annual taxable wages over \$402,200 (Single or Head of Household) or \$458,300 (Married).

All information in this article is based on a biweekly payroll period (PP) and the early release copies (Notice 1036 - Rev. January 2013) of the Percentage Method Tables for Income Tax Withholding that will appear in the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Publication 15, (*Circular E*), *Employer's Tax Guide*.

* Wages are determined after subtracting withholding allowances, CPP, FEDVIP, FEHB, FSA, HSA, and TSP contributions from your gross earnings.

Contributions made by employees to the following are treated as pre-tax monies for federal tax computations:

- Commuter Program pre-tax (CPP).
- Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).

- Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB).
- Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA).
- Health Savings Account (HSA).
- Traditional Thrift Savings Plan (TSP).

When calculating your taxes, remember to subtract your withholding allowances and all of these contribution amounts from your gross earnings.

Note: There are two technical exceptions to this pre-tax rule.

- Employee contributions to a Traditional TSP fund are treated as pre-tax monies because taxes on these contributions are deferred; hence, employee contributions to a Traditional TSP fund are subtracted from gross earnings.
- FEHB benefits are treated as pre-tax monies for almost all employees. However, for those few employees who signed pre-tax waivers for FEHB Benefits, FEHB premium contributions made by these employees are not treated as pre-tax monies and subsequently are not subtracted from gross earnings.

Employees are urged to review their withholdings every year and, if necessary, to update their Federal W-4 information. For example, individuals and couples with multiple jobs, people who are having children, getting married, getting divorced, or buying a home, and those who typically have a balance due or a large refund at the end of the year may want to consider submitting revised W-4 forms.

To determine the amount of withholding, follow steps 1 through 10 as follows:

1. Determine normal biweekly gross wages from earnings statement.
2. Determine normal biweekly Traditional TSP employee contributions from earnings statement.
3. Determine normal biweekly FSA contributions from earnings statement. If applicable, add the amounts from both the FSA Dependent Child (FSADC) sub-account and the FSA Health Care (FSAHC) sub-account.
4. Determine normal biweekly FEHB pre-tax employee contributions from earnings statement (abbreviated as HP).
5. Determine normal biweekly CPP employee contributions from earnings statement.
6. Determine normal biweekly FEDVIP employee contributions from earnings statement.
7. Determine normal biweekly HSA contribution from earnings statement.
8. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the new biweekly exemption value of \$150.00 (withholding allowance). The federal tax line on the earnings statement shows the number of exemptions claimed (e.g., S1 = single with one exemption, M3 = married with three exemptions).
9. Subtract the amounts in step 2 (Traditional TSP), step 3 (FSA), step 4 (FEHB), step 5 (CPP), step 6 (FEDVIP), step 7 (HSA), and step 8 (exemptions) from step 1 (biweekly gross wages). The balance is the amount subject to withholding.

10. Determine into which range this amount falls on the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table; follow the instructions listed in the table.

The following is an example of how to compute federal income taxes for a Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) employee who claims married with three exemptions, and makes pre-tax contributions to the TSP, FSA, FEHB, CPP, and FEDVIP.

Example: A FERS employee receives \$3,826.35 as biweekly gross wages. The employee makes the following contributions: 11 percent of basic earnings (for this example, all of the gross \$ is basic; basic X 0.11 = \$420.90) per pay period (PP) to the TSP; \$65 per PP to the FSADC sub-account; \$95 per PP to the FSAHC sub-account; \$91.29 per PP to the FEHB; \$105 for this PP to the CPP; and \$45.76 per PP to the GEHA PPO High Option Dental Premium. The employee claims “married” with three exemptions (M3 on the federal tax line of the earnings statement). Using the information provided in the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table in this article, federal taxes are computed as follows:

To complete the computation, refer to the Married/Biweekly segment of the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table. The amount of wages subject to withholding (\$2,553.40) falls within the “over \$1,006 but not over \$3,108” range. Using the information provided within that range, the final computation is as follows:

Amount subject to withholding	\$2,553.40
Subtract \$1,006 from \$2,553.40	1,547.40
Multiply \$1,547.40 by 0.15 (15%)	232.11
Add from the table	68.70
Add \$232.11 and \$68.70	300.81
Total federal income tax* that should be withheld from this employee's biweekly check	\$300.81

* Rounding may vary this total by a few cents.

Federal Taxation Percentages for Supplemental Wages

USPS® employees are reminded that the percentages used to tax supplemental wages are different from the normal taxation percentages. Supplemental wages may include, but are not limited to, annual leave exchange, awards, back-pay awards, prizes, severance pay, and reimbursements for moving expenses. Effective January 1, 2005, The American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 and Section 31.3402(g)-1 of IRS regulations created a two-tiered taxation rate for supplemental wages. These regulations apply to all supplemental payments received by USPS employees in the United States, as well as the U.S. territories.

These regulations apply to taxation of supplemental wages up to a total of 1 million dollars within a calendar year at a *mandatory* withholding rate of 25 percent. Regulations also provide for a *mandatory* withholding rate of 35 percent (or the highest rate of income tax for the year) for

any supplemental wages paid in excess of 1 million dollars within a calendar year. These remain in effect until taxation percentages are changed by Congress and the Internal Revenue Service.

With the passage of the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 (H.R. 8), the marginal income tax rate for high-income taxpayers will increase to 39.6 percent for wages paid on and after January 1, 2013. The rate for supplemental wages up to a total of 1 million dollars will remain 25 percent for 2013. However, the rate on supplemental wages in excess of 1 million dollars will increase to 39.6 percent for 2013.

Statutory Requirement to Review and Post OSHA 300A Summary for Calendar Year 2012

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires all Postal Service™ installation and establishment heads to prepare and post the OSHA Form 300A, *Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses*, for calendar year (CY) 2012, in accordance with 29 CFR 1904 and the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 821, Actions in the Event of Accident, Injury, or Illness*.

From February 1, 2013 through April 30, 2013, installations are required to post a copy of the OSHA 300A for CY 2012 in a conspicuous place at every establishment where employees work or report to work.

Before posting and signing, the installation or establishment heads are required to review the OSHA 300 Log and the OSHA 300A Summary Reports. When they sign the OSHA 300A, they are affirming that they have reviewed both OSHA forms for accuracy and completeness (whether they use manual or automated versions).

When the OSHA 300 Log is reviewed, installation heads must pay close attention to column F. This includes describing the injury or illness, the parts of the body affected (including which side of the body), and the object

or substance that directly injured or made the person ill (for example: “second degree burns on right forearm from acetylene torch”).

Installation heads must also pay close attention to columns K and L. If an injury is identified as “days away from work” in column K or “on the job transfer or restriction” in column L, the installation head must ensure that the number of days entered is accurate.

For every entry on the OSHA 300 Log, the installation head must ensure that there is a corresponding Accident Report Form 1769/301 in the Employee Health and Safety (also known as EHS) application; which populates the OSHA 301, *Injury and Illness Incident Report*.

The left side of OSHA 300A contains sets of information data points, with a letter (such as K) corresponding to each data point. The data points come from the OSHA 300 Log summary columns with the same letter. The right side of the OSHA 300A form is self-explanatory except for the North American Industrial Classification (NAICS) code. The code for Vehicle Maintenance Facilities is 8111; the code for all other Postal Service establishments is 4921.

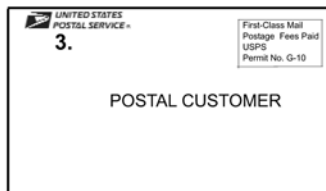
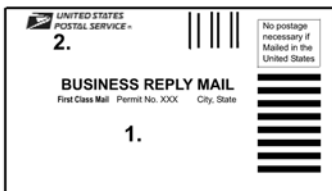

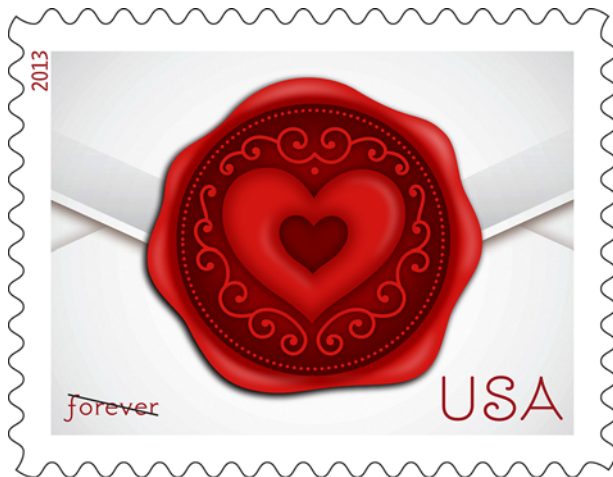

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On February 4, 2013, in Detroit and Dearborn, Michigan, the Postal Service™ will issue a *Rosa Parks* commemorative First-Class Mail® stamp (Forever® priced at 46 cents) in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 470400).

The stamp will go on sale nationwide February 4, 2013.

With this stamp, the U.S. Postal Service® honors Rosa Parks, an extraordinary American activist who became an iconic figure in the civil rights movement after refusing to give up her seat on a municipal bus to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama, in 1955. The stamp art, an original painting of Parks, emphasizes her quiet determination and pleasant persona. Working with art director Dery Noyes, artist Thomas Blackshear II created the stamp art. The stamp is one of a Civil Rights Set being issued in 2013. The *Emancipation Proclamation* stamp is also part of this set.

Distribution: Item 470400, Rosa Parks Commemorative First-Class Mail (Forever stamp priced at 46 cents) PSA Pane of 20 Stamps

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution centers (SDCs) will receive their normal automatic distribution quantity of *Rosa Parks* stamps. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 40,000 stamps.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs/SDCs will make subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 45 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit id, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm.

Post Offices requiring these items must requisition them from their designated SDO/SDC using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*. Post Offices may preorder these stamps 30 days prior to first-day-of-issue through the eBuy2 SEAM Catalog. Post Offices should not sell the stamp prior to first-day-of-issue.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/stamps, or by calling 800-STAMP-24. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark. All orders must be postmarked by April 4, 2013.

Guidelines for Finalizing Rosa Parks Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize the *Rosa Parks* stamp pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP Code™ of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. **Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3 1/2 inches by 1.**

The Postal Service must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the *Postal Bulletin*. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services 4 weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <https://www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

A2. APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

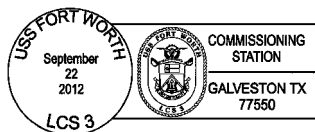
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

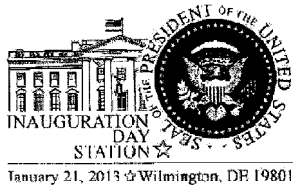

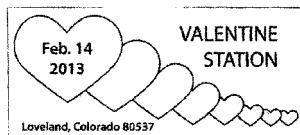

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

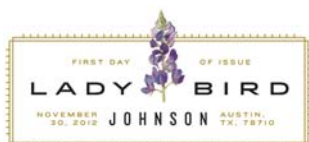
Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

Don't Trash It – Recycle It – Tips for Zero Waste

At one time, we have all thrown away something that could have been recycled. Next time think — Don't Trash It – Recycle It! Throwing away items that can be recycled is unsustainable and adds unnecessarily to the waste stream while increasing waste disposal costs. Recycling effectively reduces waste disposal costs while creating increased revenue for the Postal Service™.

Did You Know?

- Recycling diverts waste from landfills, reduces greenhouse gasses, and generates revenue.
- Recycling prevents the disposal of raw materials, saves energy, and reduces pollution.
- Recycling 1 ton of mixed paper, cardboard, or mixed metal reduces greenhouse gases by 1 metric ton of carbon equivalent (MTCE).

What Does This Mean to the Postal Service?

The Postal Service seeks to recycle at least 50 percent of the solid waste stream. When you recycle, the USPS® reduces its solid waste disposal costs and generates revenue. In fiscal year (FY) 2012, the Postal Service generated nearly \$24 million in recycling revenue and over \$25 million in landfill cost avoidance. Recycling is a win-win proposition that makes good business sense and helps protect the environment.

What Can You Do?

- **Take the Zero Waste Challenge.** The zero waste challenge can help your facility increase recycling revenue, reduce solid waste disposal costs, and reduce greenhouse gases.
- **Start a Green Team at Your Facility.** Talk to your manager about establishing a Lean Green Team at your facility.
- **Manage Your Dumpster.** Paper, cardboard, plastic, or metal should not be found in your dumpster. Make sure everyone knows which materials are recyclable and therefore are not placed in the trash.
- **Eliminate Trash Containers.** Use recycling containers to replace trash containers, especially where the bulk of waste generated is recyclable. If a trash container is necessary, place it in a central location.

What Should Employees Know?

- **Focus on Key Recyclables.** Paper, cardboard, plastic, and metal represent 90 percent of the USPS solid waste stream. Make sure these items are being recycled at your facility. Research has shown that 60 percent of the waste in Postal Service dumpsters is recyclable, even at sites with recycling programs.

- **Exceed the 50 percent Recycle Goal.** The Postal Service aims to eliminate solid waste by recycling more than 50 percent of what it generates. Today, the USPS recycles about 40 percent of all waste generated nationwide. By increasing what you recycle by just 5 percent this year, we can meet our goal by 2015!
- **Think Zero Waste and Recycle Everything.** Other important items we can recycle include oils, batteries, fluorescent bulbs, antifreeze, tires, and eWaste (i.e., electronics).
- **Eliminate Trash Containers.** Use recycling containers to replace trash containers, especially where the bulk of waste generated is recyclable. If a trash container is necessary, place it in a central location. Properly label all containers for your recyclables.
- **Manage Your Dumpster.** If your facility has paper, cardboard, plastic, or metals recycling programs in place, these materials should not be in your dumpster. Make sure your dumpster has signage in place that indicates which recyclables cannot be discarded.
- **Trash is Cash.** Recycling creates revenue for the Postal Service, so remember that recycling is not just good for the environment — it is smart business.
- **Buy Recycled Products.** Buying products made of recycled materials helps close the loop by creating demand for recyclables.
- **Your Efforts Count.** If each Postal Service employee recycled all his or her waste daily, we could reduce solid waste by more than a quarter million tons a year. Your efforts count at work and at home.
- **Get Involved.** Learn more about how to recycle and save energy by joining a "Green Team." Talk to your manager about establishing a Lean Green Team at your facility.

The green containers have the following pre-printed wording: “Plastic Wrap Only.” Use these containers to collect plastic for recycling purposes only.

Orders from Post Offices™ and other retail facilities have been changed to one container for each two carrier routes. For example, a facility with 20 carrier routes is authorized to order ten green plastic containers. For plants, order one container for each mail induction station that generates plastic. Supplies are limited and orders will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Affected Postmasters should use the eBuy on-catalog requisition system to order the workroom floor containers from the Topeka, Kansas, Material Distribution Center (MDC). Search for items using the PSN number listed below (without the dashes). If your office does not have access to eBuy, order using touch-tone order entry (TTOE) at 800-273-1509.

Box customers can recycle their mail in specially designed, secured recycling containers recently deployed nationwide to more than 11,000 Post Offices with P.O. Box lobbies. These secure containers carry the message, “Read, Respond, and Recycle Your Mail.”

If customers recycle their mail, the Postal Service™ can make significant reductions in solid waste disposal costs.

Offering customers the opportunity to recycle their mail right in the lobby plays an important role in meeting customers’ environmental expectations. Federal Reporting Requirements for Hazardous and Toxic Chemicals

Reminder

Any postal facility that stores 500 pounds or more of an extremely hazardous substance or 10,000 pounds or more of hazardous and toxic chemicals, at any time within the year, must comply with the reporting requirements of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), a stand-alone provision of Title III, Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act, enacted in October 1986.

EPCRA, along with Executive Order 13514, *Federal Leadership in Environmental, Energy, and Economic Performance*, reiterated the need for federal agencies to lead by example in their environmental considerations. The regulations and executive order provide guidance for our

ongoing commitment to preserve our country’s national resources and to meet our environmental objectives.

Background

Postal Service™ facilities have been reporting under Section 312 of EPCRA for hazardous and toxic chemicals and extremely hazardous substances stored onsite. The reporting threshold is 10,000 pounds or greater for any chemical present (e.g., heating oil, gasoline, sand, and de-icing compounds) and 500 pounds or the threshold-planning quantity for any extremely hazardous substance (e.g., sulfuric acid and sulfuric acid in batteries) stored at a facility at any one time during the preceding calendar.

Reporting Process

As applicable, all Postal Service installation heads should submit the emergency and hazardous chemical inventory reporting form (EPCRA Tier2 Form) annually by March 1, 2013, for the preceding calendar year, to the following entities:

- The State Emergency Response Commission (SERC).
- The Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).
- The local fire department that would respond to an emergency at your facility.

Commonly reported substances/thresholds are as follows:

- *Lead Acid batteries*: The threshold is 500 pounds of sulfuric acid. This threshold can be met by having more than 6 tow motor batteries on site. Estimate the threshold by multiplying the battery weight by 18 percent.
- *Gasoline, diesel, and heating fuel*: The 10,000-pound threshold can be met at 1,433 gallons of gasoline or 1,223 gallons of diesel/heating fuel.
- *Ice melt and anti-skid products (e.g., rock salt, calcium magnesium acetate, and sand)*: Whether delivered in one bulk location or on pallets dispersed on the site, report the product if the product exceeds 10,000 pounds.

For states that recommend using EPA's Tier2Submit 2012 software, it is anticipated that Postal Service facilities will be allowed, through an eAccess request, to download and use EPA's Tier2Submit 2012 software for electronic reporting.
