## Quarter Three Voice of the Employee Surveys are Coming Soon

The Voice of the Employee (VOE) survey is one of the largest employee opinion surveys in the nation. Every quarter, a random sample (25 percent) of career Postal Service employees are invited to express their thoughts on topics such as communication, trust, diversity, and respect. Participation in the VOE is voluntary and entirely confidential. Responses go directly to an independent party, who tabulates the results and reports them back to the Postal Service in summary form.

The VOE is a key measure of the engagement of our workforce — the extent to which employees feel like they believe in what they do, and feel valued for doing it. High levels of engagement lead to positive organizational outcomes such as customer satisfaction, productivity, safety, and retention. The results of the survey are used by locations all across the country to improve the work environment and increase employee engagement.

This quarter, all non-bargaining employees selected to take a survey will receive an email invitation to complete the survey online. Online administration of the survey is an effi-

cient and secure way to collect employee responses, and confidentiality is maintained like the paper version. Responses are sent directly to an independent party, who tabulates the results.

If you receive a third quarter VOE survey, take the time to confidentially express your opinion — on-the-clock — to help make the Postal Service a better place to work.

### IMM Revision: Mail Preparation for IPA Mail to Canada

## Forms

### PS Form 8230 is Going Away

Effective October 1, 2013, PS Form 8230, *Authorization for Payment*, cannot be used to pay for the local purchase of goods and services. Better and expanded use of eBuy2 catalogs, national/area contracts, and locally available suppliers who accept credit cards provide an ample source of preferred substitute payment options for local buying. In the absence of eBuy2 catalogs and/or contracts, local buying use of suppliers who accept credit cards is now mandatory.

If you currently use a supplier that does not accept credit cards, let them know they need to accept credit card payments by the October 1 deadline if they want to continue providing products or services locally. If your current supplier is unwilling to do so, then local buyers should identify alternate suppliers who do accept credit cards and make local purchases from them.

If local conditions or circumstances completely prohibit eBuy2 catalog, national/area contract, or credit card accessible supplier availability, then employees should

contact the Purchasing Shared Services Center (PSSC) at 877-293-2410 regarding purchase card account payment options.

A new PS Form 2551 is being developed to replace PS Form 8230 for the payment of non-goods and services, such as:

- Tort Claims.
- OSHA fines.
- HB 202 reimbursements.
- OWCP.
- Other third-party payments.

SUBJECT: Elimination of PS Form 8230, *Authorization for Payment*,  
for Purchases of Goods and Services

Effective October 1, 2013, the PS Form 8230, *Authorization for Payment*, method will become obsolete and will no longer be accepted for the local purchase of goods and services.

A new PS Form is being developed to replace the PS Form 8230 as the new method of payment for non-goods and services such as:

- Tort claims;
- OSHA fines;
- HB 202 reimbursements;
- OWCP; and,
- Other third-party payments.

The preferred method for paying Postal Service expenses is through electronic funds transfer.

- The 8230 payment method is a costly, paper-based process requiring scanning and manual processes.
- Its elimination will improve efficiency and help achieve our cost reduction goals.

In addition, fostering paperless payment processing is a federally mandated sustainability effort that is very much in keeping with an expanding marketplace of mobile credit card acceptance among both large and small businesses. To that end, the Postal Service's preferred payments for local purchases are revised in preferential order and correspond to its local buying priorities (see attached).

In summary, as of October 1, 2013, when an employee with local buying authority needs to purchase a good or service for an operational need that cannot be satisfied through eBuy2, or a contract, he or she must use a purchase card account for payment. 
When considering future local buying planning and decisions in the coming months, every effort must be made locally to identify and utilize suppliers that accept credit card payments.


- If local conditions or circumstances restrict access or availability to credit card accepting suppliers, then those employees delegated local buying authority should contact the Purchasing Shared Services Center (PSSC) at (877) 293-2410.

- The PSSC will provide assistance locating an alternate source of supply and/or will direct local buyers to appropriate approved payment methods.
- Local buyers must be prepared to use alternative suppliers that accept credit cards when electronic funds transfer payment cannot be made through eBuy2 or contracts.

## Finance

### Policy Reminder: Details in Excess of One Year

Employees on detail assignments expected to last or lasting for more than a year should not use the eTravel system for travel reimbursement. All travel and transportation reimbursements for these assignments is considered income and must be reported to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as income. Taxes will be withheld and you will not be grossed up.

The PS Form 1012, *Travel Voucher*, should be used by these employees for all travel and transportation reimbursements for detail assignments expected to last or lasting in excess of one year. A series of detail assignments in the same geographic area that cover a period greater than 12 months is also counted as one assignment by the IRS. For example, this means that an individual from California detailed to Headquarters for six months, then assigned for over six months to the Bolger Center or to Northern Virginia field offices must pay taxes on travel reimbursements.

This policy is stated in Handbook F-15, *Travel and Relocation*, under section 2-2.1.2.2, Tax Consequences of Details in Excess of One Year. The address for submission of PS Form 1012 is now:

## Sox Compliance Program: Plant-Verified Drop Shipment Mailings

Accurately handling Plant-Verified Drop Shipment (PVDS) mailings is critical to the SOX Compliance Program. The SOX program continues to test this key control at these destinations to ensure SOX compliance standards are met.

When accepting business mail, the destination office must confirm that PS Form 8125/8017 is complete, accurate, and matches the physical mail. This is especially important when handling Plant-Verified Drop Shipment (PVDS) mailings, as discrepancies or inaccuracies could impact revenue generation. The latest SOX Key Control Guide: [http://blue.usps.gov/sox/\\_pdf/Current\\_Key\\_Control\\_Guide.pdf](http://blue.usps.gov/sox/_pdf/Current_Key_Control_Guide.pdf) details the proper procedure and required documentation for PVDS destination processes.

Remember these three steps when receiving PVDS loads at the destination site:

### Review PS Form 8125/8017:

- Verify that the load arrived at the correct destination.
- Identify errors and resolve discrepancies with origin office prior to unloading or rejecting the load.
- Confirm all required fields are completed.

### Receive the Load:

- Confirm container counts are performed prior to releasing mail to operations.
- Perform a cursory review of the load to see if the Entry Office, Class of Mail, and Type of Mail Processing Category match the 8125(s).
- Resolve discrepancies with origin office (if discrepancies are not resolved, reject the mail).

### Record Irregularities:

- Record all drop shipment irregularities in the Facility Access & System Tracking (FAST) and eMIR systems.
- Retain all essential forms (PS Form 8125/8017).

## New Plan for Single Drawer Accountability

Earlier this year, the Postal Service™ announced a new strategy called Post Plan, which keeps the nation's smallest Post Offices™ open for business by realigning retail window hours based on customer use. The process to implement this plan is a multi-phased approach, which began in the fall of 2012 and continues over the next two years. This initiative identifies two groups of offices, Remotely Managed Post Offices (RMPOs) consisting of 2-hour, 4-hour, and 6-hour offices reporting to an Administrative Post Office (APO) and Part-time Post Offices (PTPOs), 6-hour offices that report directly to the District.

To support the Post Plan initiative and strategy, Finance has developed new financial policies and guidelines specially designed for 2-hour and 4-hour RMPOs which are Non-POS. These new policies streamline existing financial processes in order to add efficiencies that align with changing operational requirements and demands. In addition, we are establishing a new financial monitoring approach that assists APOs with their oversight responsibilities by leveraging the Accounting Service Centers (ASCs).

The USPS® Post Plan requires 2-hour and 4-hour RMPOs, which are Non-POS to convert to a new concept called Single Drawer Accountability (SDA).

SDA is a single accountability comprised of stamp stock, cash, postage meter, and money orders (no unit

reserve stock or individual accountabilities). Postmaster Relief and designees will operate under a shared accountability concept, which includes traditional Post Office retail services such as selling stamps, maintaining a postage meter, selling money orders, and providing limited customer refunds. Cash/stamp accountability limits for the SDA office will be set by the managing APO. In those instances where postage sales exceed the office accountability, the APO Postmaster may request an exception to the accountability limits through the District Finance Manager. The APO will perform annual counts randomly determined by the ASC. The ASC will play an extensive role in monitoring the SDA offices and working closely with the APOs regarding financial issues in these offices.

Specific policy guidelines will be published no later than June 2013, in Chapter 24 of Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*. ## Information Security

### Don't "Reply to All"



If you receive an email as part of a mass mailing, don't make the mistake of replying by selecting the "Reply all" option.

The Postal Service's limited personal use policy prohibits sending or replying to chain emails or other unauthorized mass mailings using USPS equipment. These emails create a significant strain on the Postal Service's email capability.

Responding to a mass mailing with a "Reply all" message creates the same strain on the network and also places an employee in violation of the use policy. Such a violation can result in the employee losing email privileges.

Employees should note that using the "Reply all" option to request removal from a mass distribution list or tell others not to respond to the mailing also constitutes a use violation.

Local eBuy procedures may also apply (refer to local procurement procedures). Cyril-Scott Company must receive orders placed by mail by close of business the day of the print run cut-off date listed here. Orders received

after the cut-off date will be processed the next print run date.

All local Post Offices<sup>™</sup> and centralized sites should follow the ordering instructions contained within this article and utilize local funds.

#### For Orders Exceeding \$10,000

Use eBuy to process both centralized and decentralized brochure orders that exceed \$10,000.00. In the Purchasing Method field, select "Route Req to Supply Mgmt," then in the After Approval Route field, select "Eastern Services CMC (Memphis, TN)." Include completed PS Form 3227-O with imprint information with the eBuy order.

**Note:** These approved eBuy orders must be received by Supply Management at least 10 days prior to a published run cut-off date to be included in that run.

Cyril-Scott Company will deliver orders within 35 calendar days after printing. Printing begins 1 week after the deadline date, and actual receipt of the order will depend on the ultimate destination and the corresponding delivery service standard. You should save copies of all orders placed at your local Post Office until the order has been received. Ensure procedures are in effect locally for proper verification of receipt.

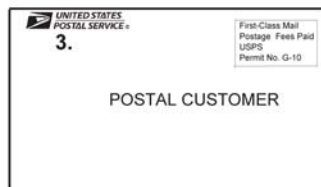
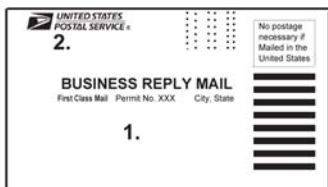

### Correction: A Flag for All Seasons Coil of 100 Stamps (Item 789600)

The stamp announcement, "A Flag For all Seasons," in *Postal Bulletin 22360* (4-4-13, pages 46-47), informed offices of the release of the (Forever®) A Flag for All Seasons Coil of 100 stamps (Item 789600). The announcement noted that the item would be available for sale May 3, 2013.

The SDCs will ship the Four Flags Coil of 100 stamps until inventory levels have been

sufficiently reduced, at which time, offices will be notified that the A Flag for All Seasons Coil of 100 stamps (Item 789600) is available.

### Migratory Bird Stamp Destruction

Prior to April 30, 2013, all Retail Associates must return unsold migratory bird stamps to the unit reserve. Unit reserve stock custodians must ship unsold migratory bird stamps to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) or stamp distribution centers (SDCs) for receipt during the next scheduled return cycle. All Postal Service™ retail units are required to return unsold migratory bird stamps annually. Only philatelic units may maintain inventories of prior year bird stamps for sale to collectors.

Migratory bird stamps can be included with regular return shipments using the following guidelines found in Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, section 11-6.5, Non-Saleable Stock Returned From the Unit Reserve to the SDC or SDO:

When returning any non-saleable stock to the SDC or SDO, the unit reserve stock custodian does the following:

- Verifies and resolves any difference in stock returned from the RAs or the retail floor stock, and enters the total into the unit reserve stock identified as "redeemed stock."
- Follows the return schedule provided by the SDC or SDO.
- Prepares an original and three copies of PS Form 17.
- Enters the system-generated 10-digit numeric shipment number on the PS Form 17.
- Prepares a separate PS Form 17 for each carton. The PS Form 17 must equal the exact contents of each carton of stock submitted for destruction.

- Removes all redeemed stock from the unit reserve.
- With a witness, independently counts the stock and enters the total for each item, by item number, on PS Form 17.
- Ensures the redemption rates are clearly marked for each item listed.

Package non-saleable stock for return as follows:

- Place the original PS Form 17 in a sealed envelope and tape it to the outside of the carton.
- Place two copies of the PS Form 17 inside the carton, and file the third copy locally.
- Use Registered Mail™ service to send the stock for destruction to the SDO or the SDC if the amount of the shipment is \$10,000 or more. Do not commingle redeemed stock returned for destruction with saleable stock or IRCs.
- Use Priority Mail® service with Signature Confirmation™ service to send the stock for destruction to the SDO or the SDC, if the amount of the shipment is less than \$10,000. Do not commingle redeemed stock returned for destruction with saleable stock or IRCs.

Do not use original manufacturers' cartons/boxes to return stamp stock to the Priority Mail network.

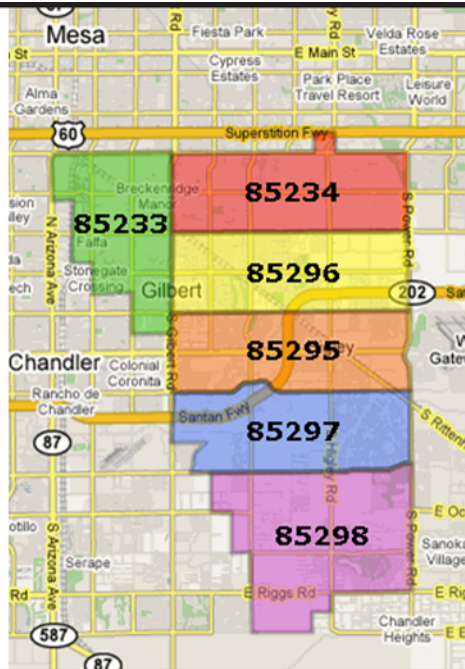

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <https://www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**A2.** APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E.** Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**U4.** Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. ## Stamp Announcement 13-25: Civil War: 1863 Stamp

On May 23, 2013, in Vicksburg, Mississippi, at the Vicksburg National Military Park, and at the Gettysburg National Military Park in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, the Postal Service™ will issue a *Civil War: 1863* (Forever® priced at 46 cents) commemorative se-tenant First-Class Mail® stamp pair (two designs) in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) souvenir sheet of 12 stamps (Item 578900). **The \$5.52 *Civil War: 1863* souvenir sheet may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.**

The stamps will go on sale nationwide May 23, 2013.

In 2013, the U.S. Postal Service® continues its 5-year commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War with this collectible pane, which includes two stamps: one depicts the Battle of Gettysburg, the largest battle of the war, while the other depicts the Battle of Vicksburg, a complex Union campaign to gain control of the Mississippi River. The background image on the pane is a photograph taken by Matthew Brady shortly after the Battle of Gettysburg. The pane also includes period quotes and lyrics of a popular Civil War song. The Civil War stamp series was designed by art director Phil Jordan.

**Distribution: Item 578900, \$5.52, Civil War: 1863 (Forever® priced at 46 cents) Commemorative PSA Souvenir Sheet of 12 Stamps**

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution centers (SDCs) will receive their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane of 12 stamps. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 2,000 panes. **The stamps will be shipped and sold as a pane of 12 (\$5.52).**

### Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs/SDCs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 45 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at [http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmngt/am\\_sdchome.ht](http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmngt/am_sdchome.ht). Post Offices may preorder these stamps 30 days prior to first-day-of-issue through the eBuy2 SEAM Catalog. However, offices should first check the website to determine the amount they will receive on their automatic push prior to placing a preorder. Post Offices should not sell the stamp prior to first-day-of-issue.

### Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

### How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. ## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

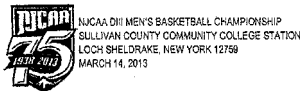
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

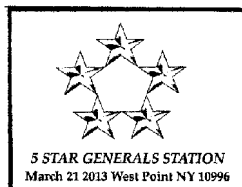

## How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

### USPS Headquarters Managers and Field Installation Heads: February 2013 Semi-Annual Capital Property Review Follow-up Action Reminder

#### **Sarbanes-Oxley Act (SOX) Requirement — Finalize Your Semi-Annual Capital Property Report**

If you submitted a Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report with all items found (marked “Y”), no further action is required; however, all offices are required to retain a copy of each Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report for five years.

If you submitted a February 2013 Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report with items marked “Not Found,” complete the following:

- Print the Property Changes for Month (PCFM) report for the months of February, March, and April — this report is available in the Enterprise Data Warehouse.
- Verify that the items marked “Not Found” on the Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report correspond with a “Full Retirement” on the PCFM.
- After verification, sign and date the PCFM report.
- Attach the PCFM to the Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report and retain the documents for five years.

In the event of an Office of the Inspector General (OIG) audit of the Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report, the OIG will ask to see a copy of the PCFM that verifies the submitted changes were made.

### Earth Day 2013 Service Talk

Earth Day is the birthday of a worldwide movement to increase environmental awareness. It marks the anniversary of what many consider the birth of the modern environmental movement in the 1970s. At the time, air pollution was commonly accepted as the smell of prosperity. “Environment” was a word that appeared more often in spelling bees than on the evening news. The Earth Day idea came to Gaylord Nelson, then a U.S. Senator from Wisconsin, after witnessing the ravages of a massive 1969 oil spill in Santa Barbara, California. He realized that if he could raise public consciousness of air and water pollution, it would force environmental protection onto the national political agenda. By order of the United Nations, Earth Day is now a worldwide event celebrated on April 22. Earth Day is the largest, most recognized environmental event worldwide and celebrated each year by over a billion people in 180 countries.

#### **Did You Know?**

- **Water.** Americans use an average of 100 gallons of water every day. Water is one of three critical resources required for our survival on this planet.

- **Paper.** Every American uses, on average, one 100-foot-tall tree’s worth of paper each year. Recycling just one 4-foot stack of newspaper saves a 40-foot-tall tree.
- **Electronics.** Americans throw out 350,000 cell phones and 130,000 computers on a daily basis.
- **Metal.** Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours. Cans made from recycled materials save 95 percent of the energy needed to make a can from scratch.

#### **What Does Earth Day Mean to the Postal Service?**

Earth Day promotes activities that help the environment — both at home or at work. While Earth Day should be honored every day, the month of April is a time to reflect and act on simple low-cost and no-cost actions we can take to conserve natural resources and protect the environment. Protecting the environment by reducing waste also saves money. As we look forward to Earth Day and our participation in its varied activities this year, we must remember that our individual and combined efforts matter, no matter how small. If you feel there is not much one person can do to make an impact, take

a look at the Earth Day resources on the USPS Sustainability web page to inspire you.

### What Can You Do?

Get involved! Talk to your manager about setting up an Earth Day event at your facility. ### What Should Employees Know?

Here are just a few ways to make a difference at work or at home:

- **Think spring cleaning.** Good housekeeping helps prevent spills or leaks from becoming larger problems. Sweep floors, parking lots, and driveways, and keep them free of oil, automotive leaks, chemical spills, and debris. Dispose of wastes appropriately and recycle as much as possible.
- **Use it up.** Make an effort to use up older materials, cleaning products, and other supplies before buying new products. Don't buy more than you need. Products that are no longer useful, including used oil, batteries, and bulbs should be recycled appropriately.
- **Participate in local hazardous waste collections.** Check with your community regarding the next household hazardous waste day, see what types of

wastes the community accepts, and if you are able to participate. Don't create hazardous waste at work by mixing hazardous and non-hazardous chemicals together.

- **Don't trash it.** If you see something going into the trash receptacles or dumpster that should be recycled, say something. We all need to do our part to prevent pollution.
- **Save water.** Fix leaky faucets, valves, and toilets to conserve water and reduce costs.
- **Save energy.** Turn lights off when exiting rooms and set back thermostats to save energy.
- **Plant a tree.** Trees offer important benefits to our communities including wind protection, shading, greenhouse gas mitigation, and habitats for a wide range of other species.

## New Federal Recycling Program for Postal Service Employees' eWaste

The U.S. Postal Service® has launched an exciting new program to assist federal agencies to recycle electronic waste on a national level. The USPS® Federal Recycling Program allows the customer agencies and their employees to repurpose and recycle qualified end-of-life products free of charge. Most federal agencies have some type of recycling program in place but usually serve only the largest facilities or the headquarters location, and require a truck pick-up. The USPS Federal Recycling Program provides every federal agency with an opportunity to recycle at every location, no matter how large or small, using USPS as the carrier.

The USPS Federal Recycling Program is divided into two categories:

- A recycling program for federal agencies on a national level for official equipment, such as ink jet and toner cartridges, and small electronics shipped via USPS from a government location.
- A recycling program for federal agencies' employees on a national level for disposal of their personal property, such as ink jet and toner cartridges, and small

electronics shipped via USPS from the employee's home.

### Did You Know?

The US Postal Service is uniquely positioned to touch every consumer, business, and government agency through over 150 million mailboxes nationally. While this new program provides recycling and financial benefits to all employees of the federal government, this service talk focuses on its benefits to USPS employees.

### What Does the USPS Federal Recycling Program Mean to the Postal Service?

In 2012, the Postal Service adopted the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Federal Green Challenge with the objective of recycling 50 percent of all our solid waste by the year 2015. We know this goal is achievable because, thanks to you, we recycled 48 percent of our solid waste in FY 2012. Coincidentally, electronic waste represents 2 percent of the total waste stream in America and nearly that same amount within the Postal Service. If we can recycle all of our electronic waste by FY 2015, we can meet our Federal



Green Challenge goal and, more importantly, divert these wastes from landfills. The Postal Service has an effective internal program to recycle company electronic property.

The Federal Recycling Program provides postal employees with a convenient way to recycle inkjet/toner cartridges; they may even earn cash back for used cell phones, tablets, and iPods. These transactions are included in the USPS eWaste recycling performance reports.

### What Can You Do?

- Don't trash your personal electronics — electronic waste must be recycled.
- Log in to <http://blueearth.usps.gov> as a USPS employee to recycle your eWaste.

### What Should Employees Know?

- **How does the recycling program work?**  
To recycle your personal eWaste, go to the website, input your data, print a label, and mail in your items.
- **What products can I recycle?**  
You can recycle ink jet and toner cartridges, and small electronics, such as cell phones, computers, game systems, etc.
- **Who qualifies?**  
Any federal agency employee who wishes to recycle their personal eWaste qualifies for this service.
- **Who do I contact for more information?**  
Call 202-268-6300 or email: [govt.sales@usps.gov](mailto:govt.sales@usps.gov).
- **Does this replace my existing recycling program?**  
No. This program is designed to supplement the existing USPS eWaste recycling program managed through the Topeka Material Distribution Center by helping employees recycle their personal eWaste — not their government-owned eWaste.
- **Why should I participate?**  
As a responsible citizen, we all should participate in programs that help our environment. Throwing cell phones and other electronics in the trash not only is

a waste of resources, but it releases toxic metals into the environment. You may even get paid for more recent model cell phones if you choose to recycle — why throw away money?

- **How much does it cost?**

The USPS Federal Recycling Program is free. There is no charge to participate, no charge to access the web-based program, and no cost to send back your qualified recyclable items.

- **Are packing materials provided?**

No. We recommend you reuse existing boxes and envelopes.

- **Does the Postal Service participate in this program?**

Yes, the Postal Service participates. To learn more, contact us at 202-268-6300 or via email at [govt.sales@usps.gov](mailto:govt.sales@usps.gov).

- **Is the program specific to designated recycling locations?**

No. The preprinted label automatically prints the correct recycling location for that specific recyclable product.

### Your Efforts Count.

If each Postal Service employee recycled all his or her personal eWaste, we could reduce solid waste by more than 5.4 million pounds a year. The typical American household owns almost 10 pounds of electronic waste that's ready to be recycled.

The Postal Service® recognizes that consumers want convenient choices when it comes to recycling household items. Our new "Return for Good" website at <http://usps.com/return-for-good> provides information about

mail-back programs that demonstrate that our commitment to the environment extends beyond our internal initiatives. Not only are we providing consumers with convenient ways to repurpose or recycle used electronics through certified recycling providers, but we are also creating a new revenue stream.

Our first mail-back programs are for inkjet cartridges and small electronics:

- Consumers can dispose of used inkjet cartridges for free. There are free postage-paid plastic envelopes for used inkjet cartridges in about 3,100 Post Office™ lobbies.
- Consumers can get money for recycling their newer model used cell phones, MP3 players, and tablets. MaxBack quotes a price and pays the postage. Upon receipt and inspection, they issue payment.

As a Postal Service employee, you can use the Federal Recycling Program for your personal electronics and inkjet cartridges. Your transactions will be included in the USPS Sustainability progress reports. For information on this program, go to <http://blueearth.usps.gov>.

#### The Environmental Protection Agency estimates:

- The average U.S. household spends \$1,407 per year on new electronics.
- Consumers buy 30 million computers and 130 million cell phones every year.
- Consumers throw out about 350,000 cell phones and 130,000 computers every day.

- Consumers recycle less than 30 percent of their used electronics.

#### What Does Return for Good Mean to the Postal Service?

Return for Good recycling mail-back programs are an exciting new way for the Postal Service to generate new postage revenue, enhance our brand image by showcasing our commitment to the environment, and make it easy for consumers to do the right thing with recyclable products.

## Recycling Fluorescent Lamps

For Post Office™ facilities that accumulate less than 100 lamps in a year, this SOP shows how to effectively recycle those lamps using a shipping strategy available through a USPS®-approved recycling contractor. United States Environmental Protection Agency universal waste regulations require that used fluorescent lamps not accumulate for more than one year. This means you **MUST** recycle used fluorescent lamps within one year of the start of accumulation, which means the date when the first lamp is put into the RecyclePAK. This SOP is intended to assist Post Offices with this environmental requirement — follow these instructions to ensure safe package, storage, and shipment of the container.

**Note:** An additional fee may be charged if the purchased lamp recycling package exceeds the stated capacity, has non-approved contents, contains the wrong items, or if packaging other than the RecyclePAK is used.

This program is designed for Post Offices located in the 48 contiguous states, Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. By using the postal eBuy2 system, you can purchase a box to recycle your fluorescent lamps using a pick-up service. The price includes everything that you need to recycle fluorescent lamps, including the box, shipping, and environmental records. Choose a box that meets your facility needs.

To start the recycling process, order the boxes for proper storage of used fluorescent bulbs you need to recycle. The following three boxes are available from USPS-approved vendors and on the eBuy2 home page listed in the USPS-preferred products box as *Fluorescent/Used Bulb Mailback Boxes*:

- Supply-044: Holds 16 T12 or 39 T8 8' straight fluorescent lamps **ONLY**.
- Supply-098: Holds 16 T12 or 39 T8 4' straight fluorescent lamps **ONLY**.
- Supply-126: Holds 22 T12 or 32 T8 U tubes, miscellaneous amounts of high intensity discharge lamps, or up to 250 compact fluorescent lamps.

**Note:** When you purchase a box, you pre-pay the recycling fee and the FedEx fee. FedEx is the only approved carrier for taking the boxes to the recycler. The recycler has contracted FedEx as their shipper. These specific procedures are those of the Recycler. In order not to accrue additional costs, please follow the Recycler's specific instructions:

- **When you receive your RecyclePAK, open and complete the return shipping label with these step-by-step instructions:**

- a. Open the FedEx Ground Label booklet adhered to the front of the box.

- b. For Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico, call the customer service toll-free number at 888-669-9725 to arrange for pick-up, if no label was included.
- c. Fill out the mailing address in the "From" section on the label using the facility's actual mailing address and include USPS as the company name. If this information is not properly filled out, A CERTIFICATE OF RECYCLING WILL NOT BE ISSUED.
- d. Complete the label by checking the type of lamps you have placed in the box and enter the accumulation start date, which is defined as the date when the first item is placed in the box.
- e. Apply the appropriate color-coded sticker to the FedEx Ground Label as directed by the FedEx Ground Label booklet included with the package.



- **Prepare the package:**

- a. Open the package and ensure that all corners, edges, flaps, and seams are properly sealed with 3" minimum clear package tape.
- b. Open the brown corrugated tube and place inside the liner.
- c. Place the bagged tube into the RecyclePak.
- d. Adhere the enclosed Velcro strips to the box on the locations marked "EZ".
- e. Close the flaps in the order marked.





■ **Fill the RecyclePAK with used fluorescent lamps:**

- a. Carefully fill the RecyclePAK with the appropriate lamps, which depend on the box model purchased. Only intact lamps may be recycled using this container. A broken lamp is classified as hazardous waste and must be disposed of accordingly.
- b. High Intensity Discharge Lamps must be placed in the original manufacturer's box or wrapped in newspaper prior to placing them in the RecyclePAK.
- c. Do not exceed capacity. An additional fee applies and the lamps may break and cause a hazardous waste stream.
- d. Keep the box closed and place in a universal waste storage area until ready for shipment.

■ **Shipping the RecyclePAK:**

- a. When the RecyclePAK is full and the lamps are packed according to the instructions, seal the poly liner with 3" minimum width packaging tape. Ensure the sealed liner is completely inside the box.
- b. Close the flaps and tape all corners, edges, and seams with 3" packaging tape.
- c. Complete the Generator's Responsibilities section on the package.
- d. Call FedEx Ground at 888-777-6040 to schedule a commercial pick-up from your facility location. Containers cannot be shipped FedEx freight.



Once the certificate of recycling has been received, file with appropriate environmental facility folders to maintain environmental compliance.

**Special Instructions:**

- Maine facilities — contact Customer Service at 888-669-9725 prior to shipping the package.
- District of Columbia facilities must have an EPA ID number from the District's Department of the Environment (DDOE) and comply with additional reporting requirements contained in DDOE rules. The DDOE phone number is 202-535-2600.

- Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico — if a prepaid shipping label is not enclosed, contact customer service at 888-669-9725 to arrange pick-up.
- For mailback recycling assistance — contact Veolia customer service at 888-669-9725.
