# Cover Story

## Beat the Heat — Shade. Rest. Water.

USPS® employees, like many others who work in the elements, face various environmental conditions while performing their daily duties. That's why USPS management provides employees with the proper awareness level and training to recognize the signs of heat-related illnesses, including guidance on how to prevent injury or illness, and what to do if an employee experiences symptoms. In response, the Office of Safety and Health has developed a *Safety Depends on Me* National Communication Campaign regarding Heat Stress.

This campaign includes a transmittal letter, poster, and separate safety talks directed specifically towards employees and supervisors. Within this campaign, the major areas of discussion are:

- 1. Shade.** Limiting time exposed to the sun and heat by finding a shaded area to take authorized work breaks.
- 2. Rest.** Using authorized breaks to relax from high heat conditions.
- 3. Water.** Making sure that carriers drink plenty of water throughout their work shift. It is recommended that they drink 1 cup of water every 20 minutes to stay hydrated.

In the event that an employee experiences any of the following symptoms and/or notices them in one of their coworkers (while working within high heat environments),

they **must** contact their supervisor immediately for assistance and seek relief in a cool area:

- Chills.
- Clammy skin.
- Cramps.
- Dizziness.
- Elevated temperature.
- Extreme weakness.
- Fatigue.
- Headache.
- Heavy sweating or hot, dry skin.
- Nausea.
- Pale complexion.
- Slurred speech.

The Postal Service is committed to providing a safe work environment for all employees. This includes, but is not limited to, providing adequate training and awareness regarding work-related hazards. Always remember, *Safety Depends on Me!* The more you know, the greater the chances of protecting yourself from potential injuries and hazards.

# Policies, Procedures, and Forms Updates

## Manuals

### DMM Revision: New Ancillary Service Endorsement Options

Effective July 28, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), section 507.1.5, to provide mailers with new ancillary service endorsement options. The new options will provide a separate correction notice via ACS™ (Address Change Service) to the mailer as well as the return of undeliverable mailpieces. In all cases in the revised standards, the new option is shown as option 2. There is a table available on our RIBBS® website at [ribbs.usps.gov](http://ribbs.usps.gov), which indicates the correct STIDS (service type IDs) to use within the Intelligent Mail® barcode to access these new options. Option 1 is the current treatment, and continues to be accessible only through the use of the printed Ancillary Service Endorsement. Charges for notices generated will be according to the current fee structure; for example, there is currently no charge for those pieces that qualify for full-service automation prices.

We will also revise DMM 507.1.5 and 602.3.0 to allow mailpieces mailed at First-Class Mail®, First-Class Package Service™, and Priority Mail® prices with alternative addressing formats to use the printed endorsement “Change Service Requested” (option 1). Mailpieces mailed as First-Class Mail letters or flats may use traditional ACS or incorporate the correct STID in the IM barcode. Priority Mail pieces and First-Class Package Service parcels must use traditional ACS. Both types require the associated MID (mailer ID) or PID (participant ID) to be set to option 1 in the ACS mailer profile. This allows mailers to receive information through ACS about undeliverable addresses due to vacancies, no such number, or insufficient addresses, and request that the USPS® dispose of those mailpieces instead of returning them to the sender.

#### **1.5 Treatment for Ancillary Services by Class of Mail**

##### **1.5.1 First-Class Mail, First-Class Package Service, and Priority Mail**

Undeliverable-as-addressed First-Class Mail (including postcards), First-Class Package Service, and Priority Mail pieces are treated under Exhibit 1.5.1, with these additional conditions:

*[Revise item 1.5.1b as follows:]*

- b. Alternative addressing formats under 602.3.0 may not be used on mail with any extra service or mail with any ancillary service endorsement except Change Service Requested (Option 1). Forwarding service is not provided for such mail. Undeliverable First-Class Mail, First-Class Package Service, or Priority Mail pieces with any alternative addressing format are returned with the reason for nondelivery attached, only if the address is incorrect or incomplete, or the mail is undeliverable for another reason as shown in Exhibit 1.4.1; however, if such mail is endorsed Change Service Requested, the piece is disposed of and an ACS record is provided for the same reasons.

**"TEMP-RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED"** Option 1: **If no change-of-address order on file:** Piece returned with reason for nondelivery attached (no charge).

**If permanent change-of-address order on file:** Piece returned with new address or reason for nondelivery attached (in either case, no charge).

**If temporary change-of-address order on file:** Piece forwarded to temporary address (no charge); no separate notice of temporary address provided.

Option 2: Request must be made via the correct STID embedded in the Intelligent Mail barcode on the mailpiece for First-Class Mail letters or flats. **If no change-of-address order on file:** Piece returned with reason for nondelivery attached (no charge) and separate ACS notice provided. Address correction fee charged.

**If permanent change-of-address order on file:** Piece returned with new address or reason for nondelivery attached and separate ACS notice of new address provided. Address correction fee charged.

**If temporary change-of-address order on file:** Piece forwarded to temporary address (no charge) with no notice to the mailer.

Option 2: Request must be made via the correct STID embedded in the Intelligent Mail barcode on the mailpiece for Standard Mail letters or flats.

In all cases (**regardless of whether a change-of-address order is on file**): Piece returned with new address or reason for non-delivery attached and separate ACS notice of reason for nondelivery provided. In either case, both the address correction fee is charged, and return postage is charged at First-Class Mail or Priority Mail single-piece price, as appropriate for weight of piece.

### 3.1.3 Treatment

Mail with an occupant or an exceptional address format is delivered as addressed and is not forwarded. Such mail is treated as undeliverable only when the address is incorrect or incomplete or when the mail cannot be delivered for another reason related solely to the address (e.g., a vacant building), as shown in Exhibit 1.4.1. Periodicals publishers are notified when a mailpiece with an occupant or exceptional address format is undeliverable for solely address-related reasons. Mail with a simplified address format is distributed to all deliveries on a route or to Post Office box-holders. Undeliverable mail with any alternative addressing format is disposed of as waste under 507.1.9.1, except for First-Class Mail, First-Class Package Service parcels, and Priority Mail under 507.1.5.1b.

## DMM Revision: Collect on Delivery (COD) Service Features

Effective July 28, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 503.13, 507.4, and 508.1 to provide new standards for the automatic holding period for Collect on Delivery (COD) articles, expand the acceptable payment methods for COD articles, and provide current options for the redirection of COD articles.

In response to mailer's requests for the expedited return of their articles when COD shipments are unclaimed by the addressee, the Postal Service will modify the holding period for COD articles from the current 30-day maximum to a maximum of 10 days.

Additionally, these revisions will retire the current manual PS Form 3849-D, *Notice to Sender of Undelivered COD Mail*. The primary function served by PS Form 3849-D can be provided by USPS Package Intercept® service, which allows mailers the option to redirect COD articles to a new address, to a designated Post Office for Hold For Pickup service, or back to the sender. Unlike PS Form 3849-D, which entails sending of a notification to the mailer by mail

and requiring the mailer to then send written instructions back to the Postmaster, which may take more than 10 days to complete, Package Intercept service provides mailers with an immediate avenue to request a COD article be redirected to a new address. Since items subject to Package Intercept requests are also held for a 10-day period, this option aligns with the proposed new holding period for COD articles. However, the ability for a mailer, after mailing, to adjust the COD amount to be collected will be eliminated when the Form 3849-D is retired. The USPS® will continue to return COD articles to the mailer at the end of the holding period if no other applicable request is received; and to return COD articles addressed to an addressee who moved and left no forwarding address.

Additionally, payment options for COD articles will be expanded to allow money orders made payable to the mailer as an additional acceptable payment method for the addressee at the time of delivery. Payment remittance mailpieces will now include unique tracking barcodes affixed by USPS allowing further visibility into the COD payment

process through mail processing scans captured on the remittance en route to the recipient.

As a result of these revisions, PS Form 3816, COD form, will be revised to reflect the changes.

**12.2 Basic Information**

**12.2.1 Description**

[Revise the first, second, and fourth sentences of 12.2.1 as follows:]

Any mailer may use collect on delivery (COD) service to mail an article for which the mailer has not been paid, and have its price and the cost of the postage collected from the addressee (or addressee’s agent). The recipient has the option to pay the COD charges using either cash, or a personal check or money order made payable to the mailer.\*\*\* If the recipient pays the amount due by check or money order payable to the mailer, the USPS forwards the check or money order to the mailer.\*\*\*

**12.2.7 Redirecting COD Articles**

## IMM Revision: Mailing Cremated Remains Internationally

Effective July 28, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* to add new Part 139 to reflect mailability and preparation requirements for cremated remains (human ashes) mailed internationally.

Currently, requirements for cremated remains appear only in Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail*, but not in the IMM. The current requirements stipulate that cremated remains mailed internationally must not be prohibited in the destination country (as noted in the Individual Country Listing in the IMM) and that the mailer must send the remains by First-Class Package International Service™ using Registered Mail™ service only.

However, the new requirements will also authorize mailers to send cremated remains by Priority Mail Express International™ service (where available). This option accommodates cremated remains that exceed 4 pounds in weight (which is the current maximum weight for any First-Class Package International Service item).

Consequently, we will revise the IMM accordingly. (Publication 52 is also revised, as noted in the article titled Publication 52 Revision: Sending Cremated Remains Internationally on page 18 in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin*.)

### **139 Cremated Remains**

#### **139.1 Eligibility**

Cremated remains (human ashes) are permitted to be mailed internationally under the following conditions:

- The cremated remains are not otherwise prohibited by the destination country (see the Individual Country Listing).
- The package is sent by either of the following methods (with the selected method being available for the destination country):
  - Priority Mail Express International service.
  - First-Class Package International Service using Registered Mail service.

#### **139.2 Packaging**

The mailer must package cremated remains (human ashes) in a strong and durable container. If powders could escape from their containers and thereby cause damage, discomfort, destruction, or soiling, the mailer must pack the powders either in a sift-proof container or in other containers sealed in durable, sift-proof outer containers.

#### **139.3 Markings**

The mailer must indicate the identity of the contents on the required applicable customs declaration form (see 123.61).

## IMM Revision: Revised PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, and PS Form 2976-E

Effective July 28, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* part 123 to reflect revisions to the following forms:

- PS Form 2976, *Customs Declaration CN 22 — Sender's Declaration*.
- PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*.
- PS Form 2976-E, *Customs Declaration Envelope — CP 91*.

The revised edition date for each form is July 2013.

Images of various pages of the revised PS Form 2976 and PS Form 2976-A appear with this article, on pages 11–15 in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin*.

### **PS Form 2976 Summary of Changes**

The July 2013 edition of PS Form 2976 has the following revisions:

- On the Sender's Instructions page, in the list of services in the first paragraph, the addition of "First-Class Package International Service™."
- On the Sender's Instructions page, in the list of services in the first paragraph, the product name change from "Express Mail International®" to "Priority Mail Express International™."
- On the Reverse of the Sender's Instructions page, in the bullet regarding NOEEI § 30.37(h), the revision of text from "as of September 2012" to "as of July 2013."



**PS Form 2976-A Summary of Changes**

The July 2013 edition of PS Form 2976-A has the following revision:

- On the Reverse of the Sender’s Copy, in the second paragraph from the bottom, the product name change from “Express Mail International®” to “Priority Mail Express International™.”

**PS Form 2976-E Summary of Changes**

The July 2013 edition of PS Form 2976-E has the following revision:

- In the first paragraph on the front of the plastic envelope, the product name change from “Express Mail International®” to “Priority Mail Express International™.”

**Availability of Forms**

We will publish a separate article in a later issue of the *Postal Bulletin* to announce when the revised forms are available for ordering from the Material Distribution Center (MDC). All the forms are scheduled to be available online starting on July 28, 2013.

**Use of Old and Revised Customs Forms**

All three forms have a revised edition date of July 2013. We encourage mailers to begin using the revised forms immediately upon receipt. We ask that Postmasters tell customers about the revised forms and encourage them to start using the revised forms as soon as possible. However, for PS Forms 2976 and 2976-A, customers may continue to use earlier editions (September 2012 and editions from 2009) until further notice. For PS Form 2976-E, customers may continue to use all earlier editions (October 2012, March 2008, and earlier).

Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelopes and Priority Mail International Small Flat Rate Boxes are letter-post items and do not include indemnity coverage.

**Insured mail service** is available for a fee and replaces indemnity on ordinary parcels. Insurance coverage varies by country and is not available to some countries. Indemnity coverage is subject to both U.S. Postal Service® regulations and the domestic regulations of the destination country. Insurance for loss, damage, or missing contents covers the actual (depreciated) value of the contents.

Claims for lost ordinary and insured parcels may be payable only to the sender, and claims for damage and missing contents may be payable only to the addressee. The sender or addressee may waive the right of payment in favor of the other.

**FILING CLAIMS:** To initiate an inquiry for loss, damage, or missing contents, call the International Inquiry Center at 800-222-1811. International indemnity inquiries and claims for loss must be filed within the time limits for the service purchased. All claims for damage or missing contents must be filed immediately, and the article, containers, packaging, and all contents received must be presented to the destination Post Office.

Evidence of mailing (e.g., original mailing receipts or wrapper), evidence of insurance, and evidence of value (e.g., sales receipt or repair estimate) must be submitted in support of all claims. For complete regulations, see the IMM at <http://pe.usps.com>.

**EXCEPTIONS:** No coverage is provided for consequential losses, delay, concealed damage, spoilage of perishable items, articles improperly packaged, articles too fragile to withstand normal handling in the mails, or prohibited articles. See the DMM and the IMM for the specific types of losses that are covered, the limitations on coverage, the terms of insurance or indemnity, and the conditions of payment.

**IMPORTANT:** Indemnity coverage is not paid for Priority Mail Express International™ or ordinary (uninsured) Priority Mail International parcels containing the following: coins; banknotes; currency notes, including paper money; securities of any kind payable to the bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver; precious stones; jewelry; watches; and other valuable or prohibited articles. See the IMM for complete regulations.

## IMM Revision: Foreign Office of Exchange Code for IPA and ISAL Service to Great Britain

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) Exhibits 292.452 and 293.452 to update the foreign office of exchange codes for International Priority Airmail™ (IPA®) items and for International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®) items sent to Great Britain.

Periodically, the Postal Service receives such requests from foreign posts to facilitate operational needs. In this case, this foreign post requested these revisions be implemented as soon as possible. However, in order to provide mailers the time needed to make necessary logistic and software changes, we are not requiring these revisions from mailers until September 3, 2013. Nonetheless, in order to expedite delivery, the Postal Service encourages mailers to implement these revisions immediately.

For consistency, we have included all of Great Britain's localities (England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and The Isle of Man) in both the IPA and ISAL listings (previously, they were listed only for IPA).

## IMM Revision: Availability of Electronic USPS Delivery Confirmation International Service

Effective July 28, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) sections 232.122 and 252.22 to show the countries for which Electronic USPS® Delivery Confirmation™ International service is available. Previously, this service was available only to Canada.

The article titled “IMM Revision: Additional Countries Added for Electronic USPS Delivery Confirmation International Service” in *Postal Bulletin 22365* (6-13-13, pages 6–7) announced that the Postal Service would revise the IMM to add an additional 15 countries for this service. However, since that notice, two countries — Ireland and Sweden — informed the Postal Service that they have elected not to participate at this time.

Consequently, the revised IMM will include all the authorized countries for this service — a total of 14, including Canada, but not Ireland and Sweden.

### Handbook AS-805 Revision: Information Security

Effective July 11, 2013, Handbook AS-805, *Information Security*, is revised. The May 2013 edition has been updated to reflect the following:

- Several requirements were added for processing Payment Card Industry (PCI) information including the protection of PCI information in transit and at rest.
- A requirement was added to prohibit processing sensitive and sensitive-enhanced information in a cloud.
- Compensating controls to be implemented in lieu of Production Data Usage Letters were defined.
- The Certification and Accreditation (C&A) Process was updated to reflect the automation of the C&A application.
- The process for emergency access to production information was updated.
- The requirements for shared accounts were clarified.
- A section on the cryptographic hash function was added.
- A requirement was added to issue teleworkers an ACE laptop where Postal Service™ non-public information is processed via teleworking.

- Requirements for the hardening firewalls and determining when a secure enclave is required were updated.
- Wireless architecture requirements and the process for requesting wireless solutions were updated.
- The requirements for vulnerability scans were clarified.

## Finance

### Interest Rate on Contract Claims

In the *Postal Bulletin*, the Postal Service™ periodically publishes the interest rate payable on a claim decided in a supplier's favor, under the Contract Disputes Act of 1978. This rate also applies for late payments to suppliers under the Prompt Payment Act, as amended.

The interest rate effective for the six-month period beginning July 1, 2013, and ending December 31, 2013, is 1-3/4 percent.

## Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes

### Rural Carriers

In accordance with the provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.3 of the Rural Carrier National Agreement, effective July 13, 2013, (pay period 16–13), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will remain 73.0 cents per mile. The EMA is 73.0 cents per mile, or a minimum of \$29.20 per day, whichever is greater.

### Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.5,

receive an EMA of 73.0 cents per mile or \$7.90 per hour, whichever is greater. This EMA should not exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance allowance for the route stops and miles.

### EMA Rate Schedule

## Information Security

### Dangerous Pictures — Cyber Criminals Use Photo-Sharing Programs



The Postal Service™ Computer Incident Response Team (CIRT) wants employees to know that there is an increase in cyber criminals using online photo-sharing programs to perpetrate scams and harm victims' computers.

According to information CIRT has received from the FBI, these criminals advertise vehicles online and tell interested customers they will send photos on request. Customers

receive these photos either as an email attachment or as a link to an online photo gallery.

The attached photos contain malicious software that infects a victim's computer. The online links direct victims to fake websites nearly identical to the real sites with the original advertisements. To appear authentic, these sites even include features such as tech support, live chat support, and recommended escrow services. After receiving a payment, the criminal stops responding to the victim's emails.

CIRT and the FBI urge consumers to be cautious when shopping online. Here are a few tips for staying safe:

- Be careful if you lose an auction, then the seller contacts you and claims the original bidder fell through.
- Make sure websites are secure and authentic before purchasing an item online. Use only well-known escrow services.

- Research car dealerships advertising online to determine how long they've been in business and if they are legitimate.
- If the price for an item is well below market value, it's a likely sign of fraud.

CIRT also advises employees to follow these tips when using their home computers:

- Scan files before downloading them to your computer.

- Keep computer software, including the operating system, updated with the latest patches.
- Ensure anti-virus software and firewalls are current to help prevent malware infections.

## Retail

### Discontinuance of VAR Refunds at the Retail Window

Effective July 28, 2013, Value-Added Refunds (VARs) will be discontinued at the retail window with *PostalOne!* Release 35.0. VAR functionality at retail windows will be eliminated, and AIC 541 that accounts for the refund will be disabled.

VAR requests for combined and single statements which meet certain conditions will be automatically generated by *PostalOne!* when the statements are entered into *PostalOne!*. Value-Added Refunds will not be generated for amounts less than \$50.00. *PostalOne!* will not allow VARs to be applied to auto-finalized postage statements.

All refund requests will be sent from *PostalOne!* in a daily batch file for processing on the same business day for all

refunds that have been processed that day. Payments will be sent directly to the customer. Mailers are still required to submit PS Form 3533, *Application for Refund of Fees, Products and Withdrawal of Customer Accounts*. Retail and BMEU sites will maintain PS Form 3533 on file at their locations. PS Form 3533 should not be forwarded to Scanning and Imaging for processing. The E-2 Quick Reference Table in Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, will be updated to reflect the change in the next F-101 revision.

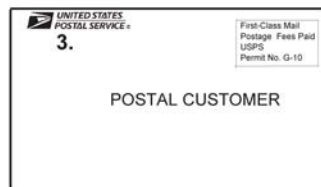
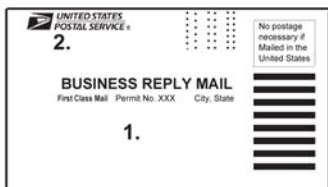

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**A2.** APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E.** Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**U4.** Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

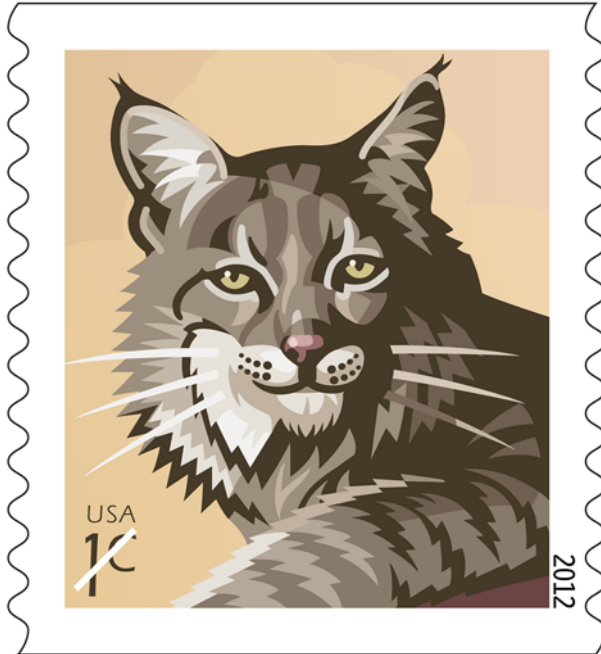

On August 9, 2013, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, at the American Philatelic Society Stamp Show, the Postal Service™ will issue a one-cent *Bobcat* definitive stamp in one design in a water-activated gum (WAG) coil of 10,000 stamps (Item 789200).

The stamp will go on sale nationwide August 9, 2013.

In 2012, the United States Postal Service® first issued the one-cent *Bobcat* stamp in pressure-sensitive adhesive coils of 3,000. Bobcats (*Lynx rufus*) are members of the feline family found across America. The stamp art is a highly stylized, digital image of a bobcat with golden eyes, a pink nose, and fur in shades of brown. Nancy Stahl illustrated the stamp, under the direction of Carl T. Herrman.

### Distribution: Item 789200, \$100.00 One-cent Bobcat Definitive WAG Coil of 10,000 Stamps

Stamp Distribution Centers (SDCs) will receive their normal automatic distribution quantity of *Bobcat* stamps. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 20 coils.

### Initial Supply to Post Offices

Stamp Distribution Offices (SDOs) and SDCs will **NOT** make any automatic distribution to Post Offices™. Post Offices requiring these items must requisition them from their designated SDO/SDC using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*. Post Offices may preorder these stamps 30 days prior to first-day-of-issue through the eBuy2 SEAM Catalog. Post Offices participating in the

SEAM Stamp Auto Replenishment Pilot (Seattle, Portland, Alaska, and Salt Lake City districts) will be automatically replenished based on their current inventory of Item 786400, *Tiffany Lamp* one-cent definitive WAG coil of 10,000. If pilot sites need Item 789200, *Bobcat* one-cent definitive WAG coil of 10,000 to meet special customer requests, they must place an order in eBuy2 and choose “expedited” as the shipping method. Post Offices should not sell the stamp prior to first-day-of-issue.

## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service<sup>™</sup> offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office<sup>™</sup> station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail<sup>®</sup> postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4<sup>®</sup> Code, as listed below.

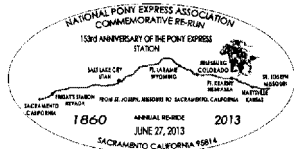

## How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

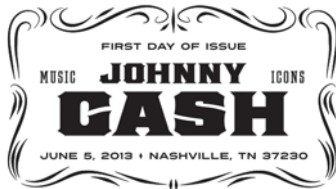

## Sustainability

### Standardized Reporting Requirements for Environmental Notices of Violation and Environmental Regulatory Agency Site Visits

It is Postal Service™ policy to comply with all applicable local, state, and federal environmental regulations. A Notice of Violation (NOV), or similarly entitled action, such as a warning letter or a notice of non-compliance, is issued to the Postal Service for the violation of an environmental regulation. These actions can be issued from a local, state, or federal agency.

Examples of non-compliance actions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- The issuance of a NOV from a state environmental protection agency for a Vehicle Maintenance Facility's non-compliance with the state's underground storage tank regulations.
- The issuance of a notice of non-compliance from a state environmental agency for the improper disposal of hazardous waste generated by a postal worker or contractor working at a postal facility.
- A warning letter issued by a state department of environmental protection for storm water violations.

The Office of Environmental Compliance and Risk Management, within the Office of Sustainability, is standardizing the tracking and reporting of all NOVs within the Postal Service. Tracking NOVs ensures timely and necessary actions are taken in response and that certain critical NOVs are referred to the Law Department; tracking also assists with trend analysis to determine internal compliance-focused activities.

When an Installation Head or Facility Department project manager become aware of a NOV, or similarly enti-

led action issued by a local, state, or federal agency, he or she must send an electronic copy of the NOV to the respective Regional Manager of Environmental Compliance and Sustainability within five days of receipt.

In addition, the Environmental Compliance and Risk Management Office is also standardizing the reporting of site visits and site inspections by local, state, or federal environmental regulatory agencies. Regardless of whether the site visit is announced (pre-scheduled) or unannounced, notification to the respective Regional Manager, Environmental Compliance and Sustainability must be reported as soon as it is known.
