DMM Correction: Priority Mail Express Delivery Times

In the article “DMM Revision: Domestic Competitive Products Pricing and Mailing Standards Changes,” in *Postal Bulletin* 22378 (12-12-13, page 4), the 12:00 P.M. delivery time option for Priority Mail Express™ Next Day and Second Day Delivery was discontinued.

Effective February 9, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, to retain the 12:00 P.M. delivery time option for Priority Mail Express™ Next Day and Second Day Delivery. Priority Mail Express items will now be available for delivery at 12:00 P.M. and 3:00 P.M. based on the origin and destination ZIP Codes™. A 10:30 A.M. delivery time option based on the origin and destination ZIP Codes will also be available for a fee.

DMM Revision: Clarifications for Flats Sequencing System Sortation

Effective March 3, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 705.14* to additionally clarify that nonbarcoded flats are included in the required preparation for flats sequencing system (FSS) processing. Such flats generally have to meet physical standards for flats-machinability such as deflection, flexibility, and uniform thickness standards. While the USPS encourages mailers to barcode all flats, nonbarcoded flats will be required to be included in FSS sortation as long as they meet all other eligibility standards.

Additionally, we are revising DMM 343 to clarify that nonautomation Standard Mail® flats not eligible for carrier route or 5-digit prices and correctly placed in FSS scheme bundles are eligible for 3-digit prices. New DMM 343.5.4c states this, but we are revising item 343.5.6 to more clearly agree with 343.5.4c.

Mailers should include nonbarcoded flats in FSS preparation as of January 26, 2014. Mailers also may claim 3-digit prices for nonautomation flats as indicated above and in the revised standards below as of January 26, 2014.

DMM Revision: Labeling List L012 for Automation Letter 5-Digit ZIP Code Scheme Combinations

Effective March 3, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 235, 245, and 707 to refer to the use of Labeling List L012 as the source for 5-digit ZIP Code™ scheme combinations when preparing automation letters.

Labeling List 012 was created in June 2012 as a parallel source of information formerly found in the City State Product. Letters were sent to City State Product subscribers in June 2012 and again in January 2013 to notify and remind them of the pending change. This change standardizes the use of Labeling Lists as the general source for customers obtaining Labeling List information. This use of L012 is effective immediately.

DMM Revision: New Commercial Service Premium Forwarding Service Commercial

Effective March 3, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) sections 507.3, 507.7, and 507.9 to implement new standards for Premium Forwarding Service Commercial (PFS Commercial™) service.

The Postal Service provided advance notice of changes to introduce Premium Forwarding Service in the *Federal Register* Docket No. 2013-27728, Volume 78, Number 224 (Wednesday, November 20, 2013). The Postal Service anticipated a systems implementation date of July 2014; however, many of the new features of PFS Commercial can be made available sooner than July 2014. Consequently, the Postal Service will revise DMM standards using a phased-in approach.

Currently, the Postal Service offers residential and commercial customers options for shipping mail from one delivery location or Post Office Box™ to another. For retail customers, Premium Forwarding Service® (PFS®) is available for up to one year and shipments are sent weekly. For commercial customers, Priority Mail Express™ (PME) Reshipment service [established with a USPS® Corporate Account (USPSCA™)] and Priority Mail® (PM) Reshipment service, established with a Merchandise Return Service (MRS) permit account, are available for a specific period of time and frequency. PFS Commercial will effectively replace both of these services.

Although the online enrollment and payment of postage and fees for PFS Commercial service will be launched in the Business Customer Gateway (<https://gateway.usps.com/bcg/login.htm>) in the future, the service is available immediately. New PFS-Commercial customers may enroll by making their requests in writing to the Postmaster of the origin Post Office™. Customers will determine the shipment frequency and will choose if the shipments will be sent by either Priority Mail Express or Priority Mail. Business customers may pay the annual enrollment fee at a retail Post Office location, station, or branch, and the applicable postage for the shipments through their *PostalOne!*® permit account or USPSCA. Shipping containers used for PFS Commercial will be restricted to sacks, tray boxes, and for minimal amounts of mail, Flat Rate envelopes.

Additionally, as a result of this new commercial offering, the Postal Service renames Premium Forwarding Service as Premium Forwarding Service Residential. However, no other changes to the standards for this service are being made. Although these revisions will not be published in the DMM until March, 3, 2014, these standards are effective immediately.

3.0 Premium Forwarding Services

3.1 Premium Forwarding Service Residential

3.1.1 Description

Premium Forwarding Service Residential (PFS Residential) provides certain residential customers (see 3.1.4) an option to have all mail addressed to their primary address shipped to a temporary address by a weekly Priority Mail shipment. Service is available for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year. This optional service is separate from the forwarding service offered in 2.0. Customers must pay a nonrefundable enrollment fee and a weekly charge for each Priority Mail shipment for each week of service requested. Except under 3.1.4b, the amount due for the total weeks requested must be paid in full. See Notice 123, *Price List*.

3.1.2 Extension of Service

Customers may extend PFS Residential for up to 1 year maximum service from the initial start date by contacting the Post Office of the primary address, or, for customers enrolled online, at www.usps.com/premiumforwarding. Except under 3.1.4b, an extension is processed only after the Post Office receives payment of the shipment charges due for the total weeks of extension requested.

3.1.3 Early Termination of Service

Except under 3.1.4b, a customer who terminates service early may request a refund for any unused pre-paid weekly shipment charges from the Post Office serving the primary address.

3.1.4 Use

Participation in PFS Residential is subject to the following additional standards:

- a. Service is available to residential street delivery customers or residential/personal PO Box customers with a size-one or size-two PO Box who submit a completed PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service® (PFS®) Application*, at the Post Office serving the primary delivery address.
- b. Service is available to residential street delivery (not PO Box delivery) customers who submit an application online at www.usps.com/premiumforwarding.

The enrollment fee and weekly shipment charges are processed as services are rendered and must be paid by credit card. Modification or cancellation of the service can only be made online when the initial request was completed online.

- c. Customers must designate whether the order is for an “Individual” or an “Entire Household.”
- d. For customers whose primary address is a PO Box, only the box customer is authorized to initiate the application, and “Entire Household” must be designated on the application.

3.1.5 Prohibited Use

PFS Residential is available only from and to domestic addresses, cannot be combined with any ancillary or extra services, and is not available for:

- a. Customers who have an active change-of-address (COA).
- b. Customers who have an active Hold Mail Authorization (PS Form 8076). Mail that has previously been held at the primary address Post Office cannot be included in the shipments.
- c. Customers whose residential use PO Box is larger than a size-two box, unless their larger size PO Box is being used due to the unavailability of smaller boxes.
- d. Customers whose primary delivery address is that of a business or organization.
- e. Customers whose primary address is a central point to which the USPS provides delivery in bulk to a third party, such as a commercial mail receiving agency (CMRA), RV park, trailer park, hospitals, hotels, and U.S. Department of State (see 703.3.0) addresses.
- f. Customers whose primary address or temporary address is an APO/FPO or DPO.
- g. Customers whose temporary address is within the 969 3-digit ZIP Code area or is otherwise in a U.S. territory or possession that requires a customs declaration.

3.2 Preparation

3.2.1 Weekly Priority Mail Shipments

Premium Forwarding Service Residential shipments are dispatched weekly (on Wednesday) as Priority Mail with USPS Tracking service. Regardless of any mailer’s ancillary service endorsement on a mailpiece and provided it fits within the shipment container, all mail is included in the weekly Priority Mail shipment, except as follows:

- a. Any mailpiece arriving at the primary address that indicates surface only transportation such as Label 127, *Surface Mail Only* or bears other hazardous materials markings such as “Consumer Com-

modity ORM-D”, is not included in the weekly Priority Mail shipment and must be rerouted separately via surface transportation.

- b. Mailpieces that do not fit in the shipment container, or that require a scan or signature at delivery, are scanned (when applicable) and then rerouted separately to the temporary address, subject to the following:
 1. Priority Mail Express, Priority Mail[®], First-Class Mail[®] parcels, First-Class Package Service pieces and Periodicals parcels are rerouted separately at no additional charge.
 2. Standard Mail parcels and Parcel Select[®] Lightweight pieces are rerouted separately and charged postage due at the appropriate 1-pound Standard Post[™] price.
 3. Standard Post, Bound Printed Matter, Media Mail, Library Mail, and Parcel Select pieces are rerouted separately and charged postage due at the appropriate single-piece price for the class or subclass of mail in which the piece was originally shipped.
- c. Priority Mail is not included in the shipment if such inclusion may delay its delivery to the temporary address.
- d. Any mailpiece arriving postage due at the Post Office serving a customer’s primary address is not included in the weekly Priority Mail shipment and will be rerouted separately as follows:
 1. First-Class Mail, First-Class Package Service, and Priority Mail pieces are charged only for the original postage due amount.
 2. Standard Post, Bound Printed Matter, Media Mail, Library Mail, and Parcel Select pieces are rerouted postage due at the appropriate single-piece price for the class, or subclass, of mail the mailpiece was originally shipped plus the postage due amount already indicated on the mailpiece.

3.3 Premium Forwarding Service Commercial

3.3.1 Description

Premium Forwarding Service Commercial (PFS Commercial) provides business commercial customers, who establish a service agreement with the USPS, the option to have USPS gather their mail addressed to PO Boxes or business street addresses within the same servicing postal facility, then consolidate and dispatch the mail as Priority Mail Express or Priority Mail shipments to a new address. Customers must pay an annual enrollment fee and the applicable postage for the class of mail desired for the shipments. See Notice 123, *Price List*.

Depending upon the volume of mail collected, shipment containers may be sacks (not to exceed 70 pounds each), full (2-foot) or half (1-foot) tray boxes, or Flat Rate envelopes.

3.3.2 Authorization

Commercial customers may establish PFS Commercial service by making a request in writing to the origin Post Office for approval by the Postmaster. Requests must specify the business street delivery or PO Boxes addresses, destination address, shipment frequency (Monday through Saturday) and the postage payment method (see 3.3.3b). Service is activated by Postmaster approval.

3.3.3 Additional Conditions

Only the authorized recipient (or legal agent) of the business (or organization) mail may activate the request for PFS Commercial service. PFS Commercial service agreements are subject to these additional standards:

- a. Customers must pay an annual enrollment fee to establish service, regardless of the number of individual PO Boxes or street delivery addresses included for each servicing Post Office. The enrollment fee is refundable only if the request is denied.
- b. The annual enrollment fee may be paid at a retail Post Office location, station, or branch; the applicable postage for each shipment container is paid using the customer's *PostalOne!* permit account for customers choosing Priority Mail service, or with a USPS Corporate Account for customers choosing Priority Mail Express service.
- c. The postage is charged per shipment container as follows:
 - 1. A sack or tray box and its contents are considered one piece for calculation of the price of postage and must not exceed 70 pounds. Postage is calculated by the weight of the container and the Zone, based on the ZIP Code of the servicing Post Office and the delivery address for the shipment.
 - 2. A Flat Rate envelope and its contents are considered one piece for the applicable Flat Rate price.
- d. If no mail is collected for a shipment on a designated frequency day, no postage is charged.
- e. Except under 3.3.3g, the following classes of mail may be included in a PFS Commercial service container: Priority Mail, First-Class Mail, and First-Class Package Services pieces.
- f. The mailer must keep a postage-due merchandise return service (MRS) account, or Business Reply Mail (BRM) account at the originating postal facility where

the PO Box or business street address is located. Any short paid, MRS, or BRM pieces will be charged to the mailer's account prior to shipment. The customer's application must include confirmation that such an account exists.

- g. Priority Mail Express, USPS Tracking, Certified Mail, COD, Insured Mail, Signature Confirmation, or Adult Signature mailpieces are shipped and charged separately from non-accountable mailpieces. These accountable mailpieces are shipped to the destination delivery office and addressed to the Postmaster for proper handling.
- h. Registered Mail is not eligible for PFS Commercial service.
- i. Business customers may terminate their PFS Commercial service agreement, effective 24 hours after the USPS receives the customer's written notice of termination at the serving Post Office. The customer must pay all postage and fees as applicable for any shipments already scheduled before termination of service is made effective.
- j. The USPS may terminate a customer's PFS Commercial service agreement, effective 24 hours after the customer receives written notice of termination from the serving Post Office. Termination is based upon the customer's failure to pay postage and fees, failure to meet the standards for PFS Commercial service, or there is substantial reason to believe that the service is being or will be used for unlawful activities (in these cases, the 24-hour effective period may not be granted by USPS). The customer may appeal this termination of services to the manager, Post Office Operations, but must pay for all postage and fees as applicable for any service provided during the appeal period.

DMM Clarification: USPS Package Intercept Automated Retail Requests — Delayed Implementation

The Postal Service™ provided notice in the Federal Register Docket No. 2013-27728, Volume 78, Number 224 (Wednesday, November 20, 2013) that effective January 26, 2014, the Postal Service will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) section 507.5 to introduce an additional phase of Package Intercept service to automate the retail requests and related payments for Package Intercept service to online at www.usps.com. As a result of the retail online implementation, manual requests would no longer be necessary and PS Form 1509, *Sender's Request for USPS Package Intercept Service*, would be retired.

Due to unexpected systems delays, the online implementation is delayed with a new expected implementation date of March 2014. Although the DMM will reflect the updates to the standards for retail Package Intercept as

planned, retail customers may continue to request to have their package intercepted and redirected to sender by paying the fee and submitting PS Form 1509 at any retail Post Office™ location until systems implementation is completed. A subsequent *Postal Bulletin* article will be published at a later date to provide the final implementation date.

This delay does not impact commercial customers who may continue to request to have their package redirected through the Business Customer Gateway at <https://gateway.usps.com/bcg/login.htm>.

Publication 75, Mover's Guide, News

As of January 1, 2014, recycle any old copies of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*. All Post Offices™ should have received the new January–March 2014 issue of Publication 75 by December 31, 2013. Similar to last quarter's shipment, the total quantity of *Mover's Guide* copies sent to your facility may have been reduced. In an effort to reduce waste and account for more customers submitting change-of-address orders online, fewer *Mover's Guide* copies are needed. There are several things you can do to conserve as well:

- Make sure customers are aware that USPS.com® is the most convenient, safe, and secure way for customers to submit a change-of-address order.
- Encourage carriers to take ICOA message cards on their routes instead of *Mover's Guide* copies.
- Give *Mover's Guide* copies out to *moving* customers only.

Important Reminders

- Copies of *Mover's Guide* must be kept behind the counter *ONLY*, not in inner or outer lobbies or on clerk counters.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, unopened copy of *Mover's Guide*.
- Provide no more than three copies of *Mover's Guide* to each customer.
- *Mover's Guide* is printed and distributed four times a year.

Shipment Information and Inventory Management

Offices will continue to receive copies of *Mover's Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments should have arrived by the end of December. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later.

- Boxes with YELLOW stickers are the first shipment for this print run.
- Boxes with BLUE stickers are the second and final shipment for this print run.

2014 National Rural Route Mail Count

Effective July 2012, in order to comply with the July 3, 2012 Interest Arbitration decision between the United States Postal Service® and the National Rural Letter Carriers Association, a national rural route mail count is scheduled accordingly.

Per standard procedure outlined in Handbook EI-902, *Agreement between USPS and National Rural Letter Carriers' Association, 2011–2015*, Section 9.2.C.3.a.(2), in 2014, a national mail count will be conducted for twelve (12) working days beginning February 22, and ending

March 7, 2014. All routes will be counted except those routes which both the regular carrier and management agree in writing not to count. The mail count will be effective at the beginning of the fourth full pay period following the end of the count period.

Avoid Travel Card Foreign Currency Conversion Fees

Employees who travel internationally will see currency conversion fees assessed on their travel card statements when making purchases in non-U.S. currency. Pay close attention to any fees added to the cost of the item(s) purchased to ensure that no inappropriate fees are assessed.

Some foreign merchants offer (as a service to their customers) "Dynamic Currency Conversion" (DCC) service. Employees should avoid DCC. DCC is a point-of-sale conversion that dynamically converts the charge from foreign currency to U.S. dollars. Although this conversion may

seem like a good deal, typically the conversion is less cost-effective and unregulated.

Employees should make the purchase in the foreign currency and allow the conversion to be made through Visa. This approach will allow a regulated fee to be assessed that is in compliance with the GSA SmartPay master contract.

This year's training covers a number of new procedures and responsibilities involving the collection of information from customers and law enforcement representatives when conducting large dollar transactions. Along with the training presentation, the complete script for the training and a single sheet covering all of the new information about our BSA responsibilities are available for download via the

LMS. These documents are excellent reference materials to review and reinforce the new training information.

Please remember all employees who sell Postal Service financial instruments and those who supervise them must take this training in order to sell these products. This training is part of the mandatory training requirement for FY2014 and must be completed by September 30, 2014.

Claims Process Updates

Domestic Claims

Customers should file domestic claims and appeals online. For domestic claims, go to www.usps.com/domestic-claims. Domestic claims that can be filed online include insured mail, Collect on Delivery (COD), Registered Mail™ with insurance, and Priority Mail Express® items. The online claims process captures all the necessary domestic claim information, provides the ability to electronically upload requisite supporting documentation (in PDF or JPG format) for a claim, and when the documentation is complete, inserts the claim into the queue for initial review.

To File Domestic Claims Online:

1. Go to www.usps.com/domestic-claims.
2. Sign in to Online Claims with user ID and password.
3. Enter Tracking/Label Number and shipping date.
4. Enter Mailer and Addressee information and claim details.
5. Upload PDF or JPG files for substantiation of claim.
6. Review Claim and Submit.

A. Not at this time. We hope to add online enhancements during FY2014 for International. To file an international claim for damage to a US-inbound package, you must file a PS Form 2855 International Claim Form at the Post Office. Be sure to bring the item, the mailing container, wrapping, packaging, and any other contents to the Post Office. To start the international inquiry process, please call 800-222-1811. Go to www.usps.com/international-claims for more information and instructions.

Q. How do I check the status of my domestic claim?

A. For claims filed online, login to Online Claims at www.usps.com/domestic-claims and check the status in your *USPS.com* account. For other claim status questions, email the Accounting Help Desk at HelpDeskAccounting-St.LouisMO@usps.gov or call

866-974-2733, Monday through Friday, 7A.M. – 7 P.M. CST. If your original claim was filed online, you can also file an appeal online.

Q. What is the process to submit requests for Priority Mail Express service guarantee refunds?

A. This process has not changed; you (the mailer) should go to the local Post Office to request the refund. Be sure to bring the original customer copy of Label 11 (Priority Mail Express label).

Q. How do customers find the status of a Registered Mail item with no declared value?

A. The inquiry should be made 15 days after the mailing date, either at www.usps.com (by entering the Label/Tracking number) or by calling 800-222-1811.

Effective January 26, 2014, the value of the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps will increase from 55 cents to 60 cents.

eMOVES Offices

Retail Associates with Stamp Credits

- Retail associates must ship all *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps (AIC 848, *Stamp Stock Returned*) to the unit reserve custodian for revaluation.
- Use PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*, to ship stock.
- Stock is recorded at the full value (old price) on PS Form 17.

Unit Reserve Stock

- Unit reserve custodian receives the stamps (AIC 841, *Stamp Stock Received*) from the retail associate at the value shown (old price) on the PS Form 17.

- Record stock received on PS Form 3295, *Daily Record of Stamps, Stamped Paper, and Nonpostal Stamps on Hand*.
- Multiply the number of *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps on hand to be revalued by the difference between original price (old price) and revalued price (new price).
- Record the computations for each *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklet revalued on a PS Form 17.
- Enter the total for all calculations from PS Form 17 on PS Form 3958, *Unit Reserve Stamp Stock Transaction Record*, as follows:
 - Line 3 for increase (AIC 844, *Stock Increase — Revaluation*).
- Enter the calculated amount in AIC 844 on unit PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*.

Closeout Employee

- Verify entries in AIC 844 on the unit PS Form 1412.
- File PS Form 17 and PS Form 3958 as supporting documentation.

POS ONE Offices

The software download will automatically reevaluate all *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets on hand for the unit reserve stamp stock and each retail floor stock, Stamps by Mail®, Philatelic, and Mobile Unit segments.

Note: All *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps on hand must be properly identified with the required item numbers and the quantities prior to the automatic revaluation. All newly received shipments from the SDOs must be accepted into inventory on the date specified on the enclosed PS Form 17. All stock transfers between the Unit Reserve and the Retail Floor Stock, or any other segments containing *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps inventory, *must* be completed prior to the software download.

CPUs

CPUs that submit a daily PS Form 1412 to a host Post Office must increase the value of each *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklet in their inventory as follows:

- Count each *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp to be revalued.
- Multiply the number of *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets on hand to be revalued by the difference between original price (old price) and revalued price (new price).
- Record the computations for all *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets revalued on a PS Form 17.
- Enter the calculated amount in AIC 844, *Stock Increase – Revaluation*, on PS Form 1412.
- Submit PS Form 17 and the CPU's PS Form 1412 to the host Post Office or the Contracting Officer's Representative.

Note: CPUs with Contract Access Retail System (CARS) do not need to revalue the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps in their inventory. The CARS system will automatically change the price and the CPU will sell the stamps for the new price on January 27.

Rural Carrier Fixed Credit

Prior to January 27, exchange any *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets in a rural carrier fixed credit with denominated 55-cent stamps. All *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets with the old price need to be in the unit reserve stamp stock or the retail floor stock for revaluation.

After the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps have been revalued to the new 60-cent price on January 26, 2014, rural carriers may exchange their denominated 55-cent stamps for the revalued 60-cent *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamps.

eMOVES Offices

The unit reserve custodian will exchange the rural carrier's *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets with denominated 55-cent stamps or equivalent amount of denominated stamps. Ensure the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets with the old price are added to the unit reserve stamp stock to be revalued on January 26, 2014.

POS ONE Offices

The POS ONE system will automatically revalue all *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets on hand; therefore, all *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets must be in the retail floor stock prior to January 26, 2014. A retail associate working from the retail floor stock will exchange the rural carrier's *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets following the **Exchanging Stamp Products** workflow:

- Press **[Stamps and Merchandise]** or **[Stamps]**.
- Select **<Exchange>**.
- Enter the quantity (*Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets). Press **[Quantity]**.
- Scan/enter the item number of the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets being exchanged and select **<Exchange by Item Number>**.
- Select **<Saleable>**.
- Select **<Continue>**.

Note: When completing the exchange, this item *must* be equal to the value of the item being exchanged.

- Scan/enter the item number of the denominated 55-cent stamps or equivalent amount of denominated stamps and then select **<Sell by Item Number>**.
- Press **[Quantity]**.
- Scan/enter the item number of any other denomination stamps to be issued and then select **<Sell by Item Number>**.
- Press **[Quantity]**.
- Once the values of the denominated 55-cent stamps or equivalent amount of denominated stamps sold are equal to the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save*

Vanishing Species semipostal stamps being exchanged, press **[Payment or End of Visit]**.

Note: The amount required to satisfy the exchange is displayed as a negative total at the bottom of the notebook area. The amount total of loose stamps sold is displayed in the message.

Rural Carrier Owned Stock

No action needed.

Breast Cancer Research and Save Vanishing Species Semipostal Stamp Booklet Exchanges

Breast Cancer Research and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets that are damaged or otherwise unusable for postage while in a customer's possession

may be exchanged for an equal number of *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets at the current price. Postal Service employees must pick up the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets to be exchanged at the current price. For POS ONE equipment, follow the Exchanging Stamp Products workflow and scan the *Breast Cancer Research* and *Save Vanishing Species* semipostal stamp booklets to be exchanged, and the current price will be reflected.

Forever Stamp Stock Revaluation Instructions

Effective January 26, 2014, the Postal Service's™ new First-Class Mail® single-piece 1-ounce price is 49-cents. All Post Offices™, postal retail units, Self-Service Kiosks (SSKs) with stamp accountability, and contract postal units (CPUs) must increase the value of each Forever® Stamp booklet on hand in their inventories prior to opening for business on January 26, 2014. All Forever Stamp booklets on hand are revalued to the new First-Class Mail single-piece 1-ounce price of 49-cents each.

New Selling Price for Forever Stamp Booklets

Forever Stamp booklets are recorded in inventory at the old price; therefore, the booklets must be revalued. To increase the value, stock custodians and retail associates must count the number of Forever Stamp booklets in their inventories and multiply by the corresponding increase amount to compute the value of the increase in accountability.

- Enter the total for all calculations from PS Form 17 on PS Form 3958, *Unit Reserve Stamp Stock Transaction Record*, as follows:
 - Line 3 for increase (AIC 844, *Stock Increase — Revaluation*).
- Enter the calculated amount in AIC 844 on unit PS Form 1412, *Daily Financial Report*.

Closeout Employee

- Verify entries in AIC 844 on the unit PS Form 1412.
- File PS Form 17 and PS Form 3958 as supporting documentation.

POS ONE Offices

The software download will automatically reevaluate all Forever Stamp booklets on hand for the unit reserve stamp stock and each retail floor stock, Stamps by Mail[®], Philatelic, and Mobile Unit segments.

Note: All Forever Stamp stock on hand must be properly identified with the required item numbers and the quantities prior to the automatic reevaluation. All newly received shipments from the SDOs must be accepted into inventory no later than Saturday, January 25th, or on the date specified on the instructions accompanying the PS Form 17, if applicable. All stock transfers between the Unit Reserve and the retail Floor Stock, or any other segments containing Forever Stamp inventory, *must* be completed prior to the software download.

Self-Service Kiosks (SSK)

The software download will automatically reevaluate all Forever Stamp booklets on hand for the stamp dispenser, stamp repository and the reject bin.

Note: All Forever Stamp stock on hand must be properly identified with the required item numbers and the quantities prior to the automatic reevaluation. All newly received shipments from the SDOs must be accepted into inventory no later than Saturday, January 25th, or on the date specified on the instructions accompanying the PS Form 17, if applicable. All stock transfers containing Forever Stamp inventory, *must* be completed prior to the software download.

CPUs

CPUs that submit a daily PS Form 1412 to a host Post Office must increase the value of each Forever Stamp booklet in their inventory as follows:

- Count each Forever Stamp to be revalued.
- Multiply the number of Forever Stamp booklets on hand to be revalued by the difference between original price (old price) and revalued price (new price).
- Record the computations for all Forever Stamp booklets revalued on a PS Form 17.
- Enter the calculated amount in AIC 844, *Stock Increase – Revaluation*, on Form 1412.
- Submit PS Form 17 and the CPU's PS Form 1412 to the host Post Office or the Contracting Officer's Representative.

Note: CPUs with Contract Access Retail System (CARS) do not need to revalue the Forever Stamps in their inventory. The CARS system will automatically change the price and the CPU will sell the stamps for the new price on January 27, 2014.

Rural Carrier Fixed Credit

Prior to January 27, exchange any Forever Stamp booklets in a rural carrier fixed credit with denominated 46-cent stamps. All Forever Stamp booklets with the old price need to be in the unit reserve stamp stock or the retail floor stock for revaluation.

After the Forever Stamps have been revalued to the new 49-cent price on January 26, 2014, rural carriers may exchange their denominated 46-cent stamps for the revalued 49-cent Forever Stamps.

eMOVES Offices

The unit reserve custodian will exchange the rural carrier's Forever Stamp booklets with denominated 46-cent stamps. Ensure the Forever Stamp booklets with the old price are added to the unit reserve stamp stock to be revalued on January 26, 2014.

POS ONE Offices

The POS ONE system will automatically revalue all Forever Stamp booklets on hand; therefore, all Forever Stamp booklets must be in the retail floor stock prior to January 26, 2014. A retail associate working from the retail floor stock will exchange the rural carrier's Forever Stamp booklets following the **Exchanging Stamp Products** workflow:

- Press **[Stamps and Merchandise]** or **[Stamps]**.
- Select **<Exchange>**.
- Enter the quantity (Forever Stamp Booklets). Press **[Quantity]**.
- Scan/enter the item number of the Forever Stamp booklet being exchanged and select **<Exchange by Item Number>**.
- Select **<Saleable>**.
- Select **<Continue>**.

Note: When completing the exchange, this item *must* be equal to the value of the item being exchanged.

- Scan/enter the item number of the denominated 46-cent stamps and then select **<Sell by Item Number>**.
- Press **[Quantity]**.
- Scan/enter the item number of any other denomination stamps to be issued and then select **<Sell by Item Number>**.
- Press **[Quantity]**.
- Once the values of the denominated 46-cent stamps sold are equal to the Forever Stamps being exchanged, press **[Payment or End of Visit]**.

Note: The amount required to satisfy the exchange is displayed as a negative total at the bottom of the notebook area. The amount total of loose stamps sold is displayed in the message.

Rural Carrier Owned Stock

No action needed.

Forever Stamp Booklet Exchanges

Forever Stamp booklets that are damaged or otherwise unusable for postage while in a customer's possession may be exchanged for an equal number of Forever Stamp booklets at the current price. Postal Service employees must pick up the Forever Stamp booklets to be exchanged

at the current price. For POS ONE equipment, follow the Exchanging Stamp Products workflow and scan the Forever Stamp booklets to be exchanged and the current price will be reflected.

The Postal Service's™ new First-Class Mail® single-piece 1-ounce price is 49-cents, effective at 12:01 A.M., Sunday, January 26, 2014. All Post Offices™, postal retail units, and Stamp by Mail fulfillment centers must increase the value of each Forever® Stamp on hand in their inventories prior to opening for business on January 26, 2014. All Forever Stamps on hand must be revaluated to the new First-Class Mail single-piece 1-ounce price of 49-cents each.

The new First-Class Mail single-piece 1-ounce price may affect Stamps by Mail® Forever Stamp orders that are in transit. If a Stamps by Mail Forever Stamp order is mailed (postmarked) or the order form and check are dated before January 26, 2014, with the old First-Class Mail single-piece 1-ounce price, accept the order with the old price and process the transaction as follows:

Prohibitive Email Use



Postal Service™ resources should not be used to check personal email accounts (i.e. Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, AOL, Excite, MSN, or other webmail programs). Other prohibited activities when using Postal Service email include, but are not limited to, sending or arranging to receive the following:

- Information that violates state or federal laws or Postal Service regulations.

- Information designated as sensitive-enhanced or sensitive information unless encrypted according to USPS® standards.
- Unsolicited commercial announcements or advertising material.
- Any material that may defame, libel, abuse, embarrass, tarnish, present a bad image of, or portray in false light, the Postal Service, the recipient, the sender, or any other person.
- Pornographic, sexually explicit, or sexually oriented materials.
- Racist, hate-based, or offensive material.
- Viruses or malicious code.
- Chain letters, unauthorized mass mailings, or any unauthorized request that asks the recipient to forward the message to other people.

Management at each Postal Service employment installation may permit employees to make *limited personal use* of USPS information technology, if that use has minimal

effect on Postal Service resources. Sending a brief email message from a Postal Service email account can be included in limited personal use; however, sending or receiving email through a personal email account is not permitted on Postal Service equipment or networks.

The cost per unit of 500 is \$12.50. This cost includes overprinting the address of the fulfillment office placing the order. Cyril-Scott Company must receive orders placed by mail by close of business the day of the print run cut-off

date listed here. Orders received after the cut-off date will be processed the next print run date.

Use eBuy2 to order Stamps by Mail brochures. These approved eBuy2 orders must be received by Supply Management at least 10 days prior to a published run cut-off date to be included in that run.

Cyril-Scott Company will deliver orders within 35 calendar days after printing. Printing begins 1 week after the deadline date, and actual receipt of the order will depend on the ultimate destination and the corresponding delivery service standard.

Statutory Requirement to Review and Post OSHA Form 300A Summary for Calendar Year 2013

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires all Postal Service™ installation and establishment heads to prepare and post the OSHA Form 300A, Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses, summary for calendar year (CY) 2013, in accordance with 29 CFR 1904 and the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 821, Actions in the Event of Accident, Injury, or Illness.

From February 1, 2014, through April 30, 2014, installations are required to post a copy of the OSHA Form 300A for CY 2013 in a conspicuous place at every establishment where employees work or report to work.

When reviewing the OSHA 300 Log, installation heads must pay close attention to column F. Column F includes descriptions of the injury or illness, the parts of the body affected (including which side of the body), and the object or substance that directly injured or made the person ill. For example: “Second degree burns on right forearm from acetylene torch.”

Installation heads must also pay close attention to columns K and L. If an injury is identified as “days away from work” in column K or “on the job transfer or restriction” in column L, installation heads must ensure that the number of days entered is accurate.

For every entry on the OSHA 300 Log, the installation head must ensure that there is a corresponding Accident Report Form 1769/301 in the Employee Health and Safety application, which populates the OSHA 301, *Injury and Illness Incident Report*.

The left side of OSHA Form 300A contains sets of information data points, with a letter (such as the letter “K”) corresponding to each data point. The data points come from the OSHA 300 Log summary columns with the same letter.

The right side of the OSHA Form 300A is self-explanatory except for the North American Industrial Classification code. The code for Vehicle Maintenance Facilities is 811111; the code for all other Postal Service establishments is 491110.

Before posting and signing the OSHA Form 300A, the installation or establishment heads are required to review the OSHA 300 Log and the OSHA 300A Summary Reports. When they sign the OSHA Form 300A, they are affirming that they have reviewed both OSHA forms for accuracy and completeness (whether they use the manual or automated versions of the forms).

Stamp Announcement 14-5: Shirley Chisholm Stamp

On January 31, 2014, in Brooklyn, New York, at the Brooklyn Burrough Hall, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Shirley Chisholm* commemorative First-Class Mail® stamp (Forever® priced at 49 cents) in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 471600).

The stamp will go on sale nationwide January 31, 2014.

The U.S. Postal Service honors *Shirley Chisholm* (1924-2005), the first black woman ever elected to Congress, with the 37th stamp in its *Black Heritage* series. An outspoken politician who shattered barriers of race and gender in the 1960s and 1970s, Chisholm ran for president in 1972, becoming the first African American and only the second woman to seek the nomination of a major political party. Art director Ethel Kessler designed the stamp using a painting of Chisholm by artist Robert Shetterly. The portrait is taken from a series of paintings titled “*Americans Who Tell the Truth.*”

Distribution: Item 471600, Shirley Chisholm Commemorative First-Class Mail (Forever stamp priced at 49 cents) PSA Pane of 20 Stamps

Stamp Distribution Offices (SDOs) and Stamp Distribution Centers (SDCs) will receive their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane of 20 stamps. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 40,000 stamps.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs and SDCs will make a subsequent automatic push distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 30 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic push distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm. Post Offices may preorder these stamps prior to first-day-of-issue through the eBay2 SEAM Catalog. However, offices should first check the website noted above to determine the amount they will receive on their automatic push distribution.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures. Post Offices should not sell the stamp prior to first-day-of-issue.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-STAMP-24. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. For more than 50, customers have to pay five cents each. All orders must be postmarked by April 2, 2014.

Special Dedication Postmarks

Only the following pictorial postmark is permitted for the *Shirley Chisholm* stamp. The word “Station” or the abbreviation “STA” is required somewhere in the design, because it will be a temporary station.

Guidelines for Finalizing Shirley Chisholm Stamp Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize the *Shirley Chisholm* stamp pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state and ZIP Code™ of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3-1/2 inches by 1.

The Postal Service must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the *Postal Bulletin*. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services four weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

A2. APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. USPS Tracking is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

On January 28, 2014, in Independence, Missouri, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue *The Star-Spangled Banner* First-Class Mail® stamp (Forever® priced at 49 cents), in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) booklet of 20 stamps (Item 689000), produced by security printer Ashton Potter and a coil of 100 (Item 789900), produced by security printers Ashton Potter and CCL Label, Inc.

The stamp will go on sale nationwide January 28, 2014.

This stamp commemorates the 200th anniversary of The Star-Spangled Banner with a photograph of the flag that flies over Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine in Baltimore. This flag is a replica of the one that inspired Francis Scott Key to write “The Star-Spangled Banner” after realizing Fort McHenry had withstood the British attack of September 13–14, 1814. The picture of the flag was taken against a backdrop of fireworks during an annual celebration of Defenders’ Day. Photographer Gary Clark said it was a challenge to get the fireworks and the flag in the same shot and that “the wind picked up quite a bit that night.” Art director Phil Jordan designed the stamp.

Notice: January 2014 Postage Price Changes

New Stamps and Suggested Alternate Make-Up Postage

New Postage Prices

New postage prices take effect on January 26, 2014. Stamps in support of the new prices will be issued beginning on January 27 through March 2014. Recommendations for stamps that can be used in conjunction with existing stamps as make-up postage, until supplies of new denominated stamps can be made available, are noted below.

The release and availability date reflects the earliest the stamps may be available to the public for online, phone, and mail orders. These dates are tentative and subject to change.

There will be no automatic distribution of these items to Post Offices™. Offices will be notified when these stamps are available to order through eBuy2.

First-Class, First-Ounce Rate

On January 27, 2014, large coils of 3,000 and 10,000 stamps featuring Ferns will be issued as 49-cent denominated stamps. Later this year, large coils will also be made available in the Forever® format for added convenience to business mailers.

Postcard Rate

On February 7, 2014, the 34-cent *Hummingbird* stamp for the postcard rate will be issued in PSA panes of 20 stamps and PSA coils of 100 stamps. The panes of 20 will be available first, followed soon after by the coils of 100. Offices should maintain a supply of 1-cent *Tiffany Lamp* PSA panes of 20 stamps to offer customers for use as make-up postage in conjunction with the 33-cent *Apple* stamps.

First-Class, Additional-Ounce Rate

On February 12, 2014, the 21-cent *Abraham Lincoln* stamp will be issued in PSA panes of 20 stamps and PSA coils of 100 stamps, for the First-Class additional-ounce rate (extra ounces above the first ounce). Offices should maintain a supply of 1-cent *Tiffany Lamp* PSA panes of 20 stamps to offer customers for use as make-up postage in conjunction with the 20-cent *George Washington* stamps.

First-Class, Two-Ounce Rate

On February 10, 2014, the 70-cent *Great Spangled Fritillary* (Butterfly) stamp will be issued in PSA panes of 20 stamps, for the First-Class 2-ounce rate and the non-machinable surcharge rate. Offices should maintain a supply of 4-cent *Chippendale Chair* PSA panes of 20 stamps to offer customers for use as make-up postage in conjunction with the 66-cent *Butterfly* stamps. Offices may also offer pairs of the 2-cent *Navajo Necklace* stamps as an alternative to the 4-cent *Chippendale Chair* stamp. Additional 2-ounce rate, 70-cent stamps will be released in late February featuring the *Wedding Cake* and in March featuring *Yes, I Do*, as well as *C. Alfred "Chief" Anderson*.

First-Class, Three-Ounce Rate

On February 18, 2014, the 91-cent *Ralph Ellison* stamp will be issued in PSA panes of 20 stamps for the First-Class 3-ounce rate. Offices should maintain a supply of the 5-cent *American Toleware* PSA panes of 20 stamps to offer customers for use as make-up postage in conjunction with the 86-cent *Tufted Puffins* stamps.

Priority Mail Express Flat Rate

On March 13, 2014, the \$19.99 *USS Arizona* stamp will be issued in PSA panes of 10 stamps for the Priority Mail Express™ flat rate. Offices may offer the same 4-cent options noted above as make-up postage for use in conjunction with the \$19.95 *Grand Central Terminal* stamps.

Rate-Change Packets

Special "rate-change packets" are being prepared and offered for sale to customers by Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS). These packets are for online, mail, and phone orders only through SFS. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. 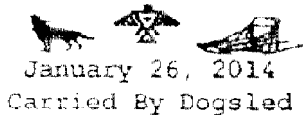

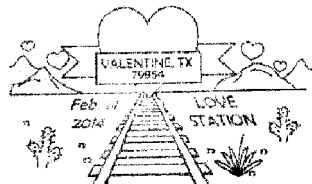

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

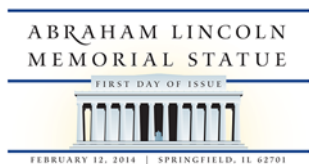
