

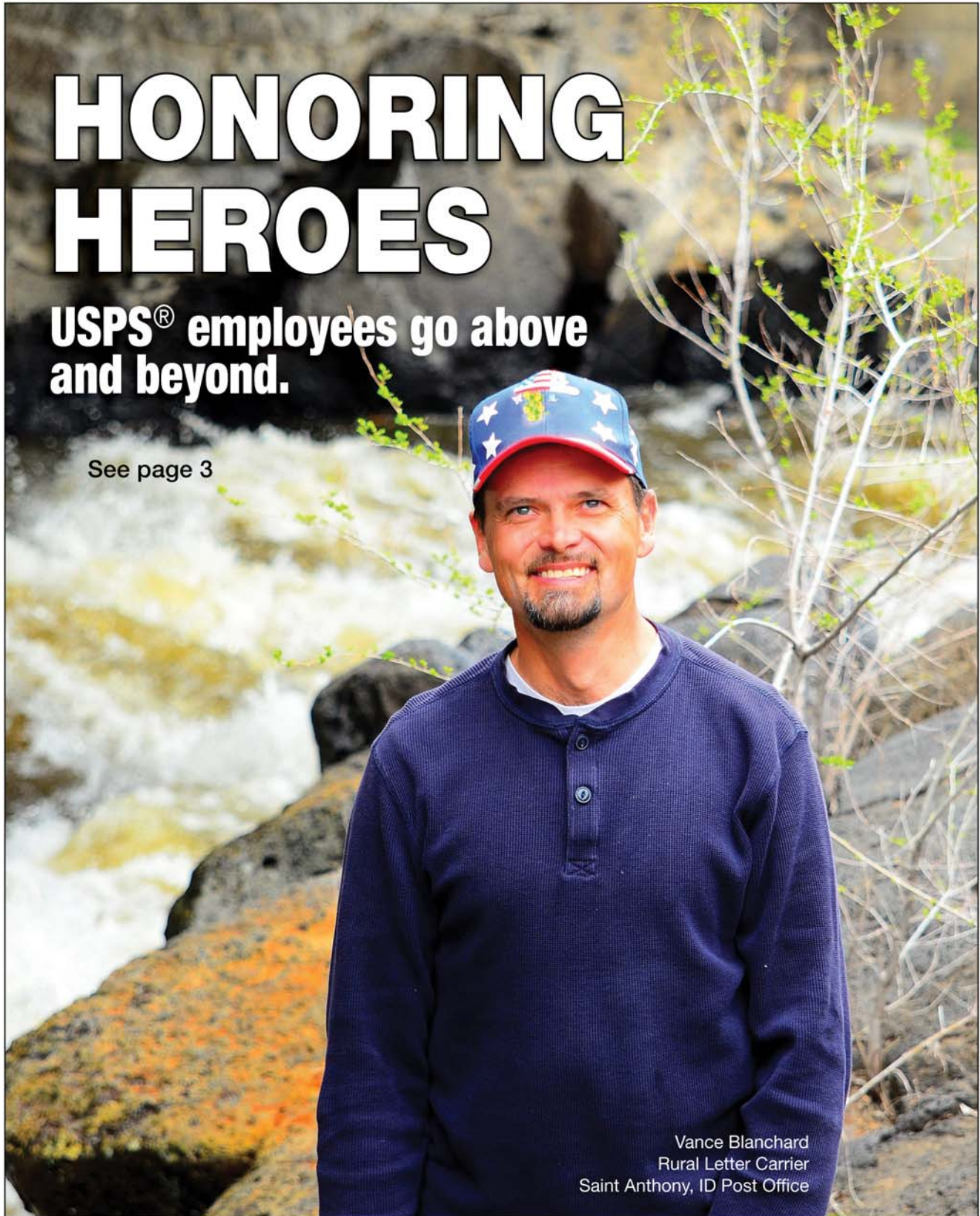

## Honoring Heroes: Vance Blanchard, Rural Letter Carrier

Vance Blanchard, a Rural Letter Carrier from Saint Anthony, ID, was hailed as a hero due to his daring rescue of a 6-year-old girl who fell through ice after walking onto a frozen river.

After finishing his route one wintry day — the wind chill factor at minus 6 degrees — Blanchard noticed several people gathered at the river's edge. And, while several people were involved in the action, one person acted — Vance Blanchard. He learned of the girl's predicament and quickly sprang into action. First, he grabbed a tow rope from his car, using it to rescue a man who had tried to walk out toward the girl and had fallen through ice near the bank. Blanchard gave the man his coat and threw the tow rope to the girl, who placed the rope about her neck. Blanchard then instructed her, in a calm and reassuring manner, to relocate the rope around her arms.

Firefighters arrived and pushed a ladder onto the fragile ice. The firefighters and Blanchard pulled the rope and ladder, with the girl tightly grasping onto her lifeline, toward shore and safety. It was a happy ending to a harrowing day.

Blanchard's story is one of many brave acts of heroism for which the USPS® Heroes Program was implemented. Since 2003, the Heroes Program has recognized employees who go above and beyond to serve communities. All

heroes receive a personal "thank you" letter from Postmaster General, Pat Donahoe, and are featured in USPS's internal publication, *Link*.

Employees are eligible to receive a Hero Award. PS Form 400, *PMG Hero Nomination*, is reviewed by Corporate Communications for accuracy and sent, for approval, to the Postal Inspection Service and Office of the Inspector General. Following approval, the Postmaster General reviews and signs the "thank you" letter, which is then mailed to the hero. The National Association of Letter Carriers also pays tribute to a select number of its members each year, through its *Heroes of the Year Awards*, which have been presented annually since 1974.

### DMM Deferral of Effective Date: Elimination of Business Reply Mail (BRM) Parcels

The Postal Service™ gives notice that the effective date of January 25, 2015, for eliminating mailers' option to use Business Reply Mail (BRM) to pay postage for parcel-shaped items, previously published on December 18, 2013, in a final rule in the *Federal Register* (78 FR 76548-76560), is hereby deferred until further notice. This deferral specifically applies to the requirements in the amendment to *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* 505.1.4.1. The decision to defer the effective date of this change was based on the review of subsequent mailer feedback, all other requirements that were published in the *Federal Register* (78 FR 76548-76560) will be implemented as specified.

#### **1.4 General Information**

##### **1.4.1 Description**

*[Delete current 1.4.1 and revert it back to the version before the Federal Register (78 FR 76548-76560) was released as follows:]*

Business Reply Mail (BRM) service enables a permit holder to receive First-Class Mail and Priority Mail back from customers and pay postage and per piece fee only for the pieces returned. BRM cards, envelopes, self-mailers, cartons, and labels may be distributed by a BRM permit holder in any quantity for return to any Post Offices overseas. Qualified Business Reply Mail (QBRM) is a subset of BRM available for specific automation-compatible, letter-size pieces that qualify for an automation postage price and a reduced per piece fee (see 1.10). Domestic BRM may not be distributed to foreign countries. Standards for International Business Reply Service (IBRS) are in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual*.

### DMM Revision: Clarification — Centralized Account Processing System (CAPS)

Effective July 28, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* in various sections to correct references to the Centralized Account Processing System (CAPS) inadvertently listed as Centralized Account Payment System.

This article also serves to eliminate any confusion with other systems such as the Centralized Payment System (CPP) for Periodicals Mail. The following Publication will

also be updated accordingly: PUB 95, *Quick Service Guide*.

### DMM Revision: eDoc Volume Criteria for Single-Piece First-Class Mail

Effective June 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 604.5.1 to permit less than the current minimum volume for permit imprint mailings when mailers submit electronic postage statements and piece-level barcode information for single-piece First-Class Mail®.

To accommodate mailers presenting the majority of their First-Class Mail using electronic documentation (eDoc), the Postal Service will permit mailings of fewer than 200 pieces for single-piece First-Class Mail letters when mailers submit electronic documentation, including piece-level barcode information, for these mailings as authorized by Business Mailers Support.

Although this update will not be in the DMM until July 28, 2014, these standards are effective immediately.

### DMM Revision: Clarification of Permit Fee Waiver in Participation Requirements for Full-Service Pieces

Effective July 28, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 705.23.3c to clarify the permit fee waiver in participation requirements for Full-Service pieces.

One of the benefits of participating in the Full-Service Intelligent Mail Barcode (IMb) program is the waiver of the annual permit fee. Currently, the permit fee must be paid immediately if the mailer submits a single mailing with less than 90 percent Full-Service pieces. This revision changes the method for evaluating whether a mailer remains eligible for the fee waiver. The 90 percent threshold will be tracked cumulatively over the period of 12 months immediately preceding the presentation of each mailing, rather than at the postage statement level. If the permit continues to hold at least a 90 percent Full-Service ratio, the annual fee will continue to be waived. If the permit no longer holds at least a 90 percent Full-Service ratio, the annual fee will be required immediately. This cumulative annual Full-Service percent

ratio is determined by dividing the total number of Full-Service pieces by the total number of pieces mailed, during the preceding 12-month period.

**DMM Revision: Revised Postage and Fee Refund Criteria**

Effective July 28, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 604.9 to update the hourly charges and related postage threshold used in assessing certain types of postage refunds and to provide the allowable time periods for requesting refunds for extra service fees.

On January 3, 2014, the Postal Service published a revised notice of proposed rulemaking [79 FR 375-6] to align with current costs of the assessments for processing postage refunds that have been in effect since 2003. The Postal Service received two formal responses to the revised proposed rule. After review and considering the responses, the Postal Service published a Final Rule on June 20, 2014.

This article serves to align the current assessments for processing postage refunds, in effect since 2003, with current costs as follows:

- The hourly factor used in various refund assessments will increase from \$35.00 an hour to \$50.00 an hour.
- The threshold for assessing postage refunds at the hourly factor will be updated from postage amounts exceeding \$350.00 to postage amounts exceeding \$500.00. The current 10% assessment below the threshold would remain unchanged.

Additionally, the Postal Service is adding standards to the DMM to provide customers with information on allowable refund periods for extra service fees that align with the revised claims filing periods (made effective January 26, 2014) to promote timely adjudication. Therefore, full refund requests for extra service fees, provided under the allowable standards for Registered Mail™, Certified Mail®, Signature Confirmation™, USPS Tracking™, and Adult Signature, must be made by the mailer no sooner than 10

days, or more than 60 days, from the date the service was purchased.

As a result of these revisions, PS Form 3533, *Application for Refund of Fees, Products, and Withdrawal of Customer Accounts*, will be revised to reflect the changes.

- h. For fees paid for extra services, as allowed under 9.2.3, when a refund request is made by the mailer less than 10 days, or more than 60 days, from the date the service was purchased, unless otherwise authorized by the manager, Revenue Field Accounting (see 608.8 for address).

When the total face value of the indicia is more than \$500.00, the amount refunded is the total face value reduced by \$50.00 per hour for the USPS time to process the refund, with a minimum charge of \$50.00. The charge is \$50.00 for each hour spent, with the last fraction of an hour treated as a full hour. Payment processing for refunds of \$500.01 or more is through the Accounting Service Center.

**ELM Revision: Injury Compensation Program**

Effective June 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ is revising the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) subchapter 5, due to the following:

- In January 2013, the Department of Labor/Office of Workers’ Compensation Programs (DOL/OWCP) updated its website that included injury compensation basic forms which are required to record and report a work-related injury.
- ELM section 541.3, Forms needs to be revised to reduce the risk of inaccurate information or employee actions that could potentially result in negative legal, contractual, or other business consequences to the Postal Service.

### ELM Revision: Labor Relations

Effective June 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ is revising the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) subchapter 650 to update:

- Section 651.1, Scope, restructuring the paragraph into a list and stating that Office of Inspector General (OIG) employees are excluded from the ELM 650 Nonbargaining Disciplinary, Grievance, and Appeal process and are covered under the *Inspector General Manual*, Chapter 109, Employee Relations. Based on the OIG's exclusions from the ELM 650 process, all verbiage pertaining to OIG employees has been removed from the following sections:
  - 651.61 Policy;
  - 652.21 Coverage;
  - 652.232 Headquarter (HQ), HQ Field Units, Inspection Service, and OIG Employees;
  - 652.233 Exceptions;
  - 652.3 Appeals of Letters of Warning in Lieu of Time-off Suspension and/or Time-off Suspensions for Office of Inspector General Employees;
  - 652.41 Coverage;
  - 652.43 Step B;
  - 652.44 Review;
  - 652.51 Exceptions; and
  - 652.52 Mediations.
- Section 651.4, Emergency Placement in Off-Duty Status, restructuring the first sentence into a list.
- Sections 651.5, Letter of Warning, and 651.66, Retention, adding electronic personnel folder (eOPF) language.
- Section 651.64, Response, adding deciding official identification language to include the name and title of the deciding official.
- Section 651.72, Policy, restructuring the paragraph into a list.
- Sections 651.73, Notice, and 651.75, Decision, to be specific and consistent as to who can make substitutions for a proposing official or deciding official when issuing an adverse action. It now specifies that



such a substitution may be made by the vice president of Labor Relations, area vice president, and area manager, Human Resources, or their designee.

- Section 652.252, Step 1 Official Action, restructuring the second sentence into a list.
- Section 652.42 Step A, increasing the supervisor response time limit for Step A from five to 10 days.

**651 Disciplinary and Emergency Procedures**

**651.1 Scope**

*[Revise the text of 651.1 to read as follows:]*

Part 651 establishes procedures for:

- a. Disciplinary action against nonprobationary employees who are not subject to the provisions of a collective bargaining agreement; and
- b. Emergency action for conduct that also normally warrants disciplinary action.

**651.4 Emergency Placement in Off-Duty Status**

*[Revise the 1st sentence of 651.4 to read as follows:]*

An employee may be placed in an off-duty nonpay status immediately, but remains on the rolls when he or she:

- a. Exhibits characteristics of impairment due to alcohol, drugs, or other intoxicant;
- b. Fails to observe safety rules;
- c. Fails to obey a direct order;
- d. Provides reason to be deemed potentially injurious to self or others; or
- e. Disrupts day-to-day postal operations in any other way.

**651.5 Letter of Warning**

*[Revise the text of 651.5 to read as follows:]*

When warranted by the failure of nondisciplinary corrective measures or by the seriousness of the offense, a letter of warning may be issued. Letters of warning are usually issued by the employee's immediate supervisor. The written warning should contain:

- a. Specific reasons for the letter; and
- b. A statement of applicable appeal rights.

Letters of warning remain in the employee's official personnel folder (OPF) and/or electronic official personnel folder (eOPF) for a period of two calendar years unless otherwise resolved or cited in subsequent disciplinary action.

**651.6 Letters of Warning in Lieu of Time-Off Suspensions**

**651.61 Policy**

*[Revise the text of 651.61 to read as follows:]*

Letters of warning in lieu of time-off suspensions replace time-off suspensions for nonbargaining employees, except when required otherwise by statute. This policy does not preclude management from placing a nonbargaining employee in an indefinite nonpay, nonduty status when there is reasonable cause to believe the employee has committed a crime for which a sentence of imprisonment may be imposed.

**651.64 Response**

*[Revise the text of 651.64 to read as follows:]*

The employee and/or his or her representative may respond to the proposed letter of warning in lieu of time-off suspension in writing and/or in person to the deciding official (management at a higher level of authority than the individual who issued the proposed letter of warning in lieu of time-off suspension) within 10 calendar days of receipt. You must include the name and title of the deciding official in your response.

**651.66 Retention**

*[Revise the text of 651.66 to read as follows:]*

Letters of warning in lieu of time-off suspensions remain in the employee's OPF and/or eOPF for two years unless otherwise resolved or cited in subsequent disciplinary action.

**651.7 Adverse Actions**

**651.72 Policy**

*[Revise the text of 651.72 to read as follows:]*

Adverse action may be taken against an employee:

- a. Because lesser measures have not resulted in the correction of deficiencies in behavior or performance;

- b. Because of the gravity of the offense; or
- c. For nondisciplinary reasons, such as the correction of a position misranking.

**651.73 Notice**

*[Revise the text of 651.73 to read as follows:]*

Normally, the employee's immediate supervisor issues a written notice of proposed adverse action. The Postal Service may substitute as the proposing official another supervisor or manager at the same or higher level as specified herein. Such a substitution may be made by any of the following: the vice president of Labor Relations; area vice president; and area manager, Human Resources. This notice includes:

- a. The action proposed, with specific and detailed reasons;
- b. The instructions for responding to the notice;
- c. A statement of the right of the employee or representative to review all material relied upon in proposing the action, and when and where the material is available for review; and
- d. The name of the official rendering the decision.

The proposal also advises the employee that a reasonable amount of official time is allowed for the preparation and presentation of a reply, if the employee is otherwise in a duty status, and that the proposed action will be effected no sooner than 30 calendar days after the employee receives the notice.

**651.75 Decision**

*[Revise the text of 651.75 to read as follows:]*

The deciding official, who must be higher in authority than the proposing official, considers the employee's response and gives a written decision, including reasons for the decision, as soon as possible after the employee's time to respond has expired, but no later than 60 calendar days following the receipt of the employee's response. In field installations, the installation head or designee usually makes the decision. In other offices, the decision is made by a branch manager or above. Normally, the deciding official is the supervisor or manager of the employee's immediate supervisor. The Postal Service may substitute as the deciding official another supervisor or manager. Such a substitution may be made by any of the following: the vice president of Labor Relations; area vice president; and area manager, Human Resources. If the decision is to effect the adverse action or to modify it to a lesser penalty, the employee's appeal rights, including Merit Systems Protection Board (MSPB) appeal rights, if applicable, are stated.

**652.2 Appeals of Adverse Actions**

**652.21 Coverage**

*[Revise the text of 652.21 to read as follows:]*

Upon receipt of a letter of decision ordering an adverse action, the following employees may appeal:

- a. All nonprobationary EAS and PCES Level I employees.
- b. EAS and PCES Level I employees who have completed a minimum of 12 months of combined service, without a break of a workday, in positions in the same line of work in the Civil Service and the Postal Service — unless any part of this service followed a temporary appointment in the competitive service with a definite time limitation.

**652.23 Appeal to Step 1**

*[Revise the title and text of 652.232 to read as follows:]*

**652.232 Headquarters, Headquarters Field Units, and Inspection Service Employees**

These employees may submit a written request for a hearing, or waiver of a hearing, to the Step 1 official (vice presidents, chief inspector, or designees) within 15 calendar days of receipt of a letter of decision on an adverse action. A copy is sent by the appellant to the official taking the action, who forwards the file to the Step 1 official.

**652.233 Exceptions**

*[Revise the text of 652.233 to read as follows:]*

In cases where a vice president or other officer reporting directly to the Postmaster General (PMG) is the deciding official, the PMG or designee is the sole appellate official. These exceptions apply to both 652.231 and 652.232.

**652.252 Step 1 Official Action**

*[Revise the 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence to read as follows:]*

\*\*\*The Step 1 official will determine if the hearing officer's proposed decision:

- a. Is supported by the facts of the case;
- b. Is in accordance with postal regulations or with postal policy; and

c. In Office of Inspector General cases, complies with Office of Inspector General policy.\*\*\*

\* \* \* \* \*

[Revise the title and text of 652.3 read as follows:]

**652.3 Appeal of Letters of Warning in Lieu of Time-off Suspensions**

The employee may appeal the letter of decision in writing within 15 calendar days of receipt. If the employee is assigned to Headquarters or a Headquarters field unit or is in the Inspection Service, or if an area vice president is the deciding official in an action taken, the request is directed to the vice president of Labor Relations at the address shown in the letter of decision. If the employee is assigned to a field installation, the request is directed to the area Human Resources manager at the address shown in the letter of decision. The review of the appeal is based solely on the record, and there is no opportunity for the employee or his or her representative to meet with the reviewing official. The reviewing official issues a written decision, and there is no further right of administrative appeal.

**652.4 Other Appealable Actions**

**652.41 Coverage**

[Revise the text of 652.41 to read as follows:]

Employees in EAS-17 and below, regardless of length of service, may appeal letters of warning, emergency placement in a nonduty status, and other matters not covered by 652.2 by using the procedures in 652.42 through 652.44.

PCES Level I, and EAS-18 and above employees have access to these procedures only to appeal discipline in the nature of a letter of warning and emergency placement in a nonduty status.

**652.42 Step A**

[Revise the text of 652.42 to read as follows:]

An employee or representative states the appeal in writing to the immediate supervisor within 10 calendar days of learning the appeal’s cause. The employee or representative has the opportunity to discuss the appeal with the supervisor during this period. The supervisor gives a written decision within 10 calendar days after receipt of appeal. If this timeframe is impossible because of extenuating circumstances, the decision must explain the reason(s) for the delay.

**652.43 Step B**

[Revise the text of 652.43 to read as follows:]

A field employee or representative may submit a written appeal to the installation head within seven calendar days after receipt of the Step A decision. (If the installation head is the immediate supervisor, appeals are made to the next

higher level of management.) A Headquarters, Headquarters field unit, or Inspection Service employee or representative may appeal within the same time limits to the next higher level of management (superior to the supervisor), at minimum, a manager or above. The appeal must include the employee’s name, title, grade, location, nature of appeal, and basis for appeal. Upon receipt of the appeal, the Step B official discusses the appeal with the employee or representative and renders a decision in writing within 10 calendar days after receipt of the appeal. Usually this decision is final.

**652.44 Review**

[Revise the text of 652.44 to read as follows:]

The employee or representative may request a review of the Step B decision. The request of an employee administratively responsible to the area vice president is directed to the area Human Resources manager. The request of a Headquarters, Headquarters field unit, or Inspection Service employee is sent to the vice president of Labor Relations, or designee, with a copy to the Step B official, who forwards the file to the reviewing official. The request is in writing and gives specific reasons why the employee believes the Step B decision should be reviewed. The request is made within 15 calendar days from receipt of the Step B decision. The reviewing official replies in writing and states the disposition of the employee’s request. This reply is final.

**652.5 Alternative Dispute Resolution**

**652.51 Exceptions**

[Revise the text of 652.51 to read as follows:]

Mediation may not be appropriate in cases where the charges involve egregious misconduct, criminal activity, repeated misconduct, inability to perform, and other conduct as determined by the Postal Service. Additionally, mediation may not be appropriate where the appeal concerns issues beyond the control of the Postal Service, such as the denial of Workers’ Compensation benefits, retirement eligibility determinations, and similar matters adjudicated by other agencies. The determination of whether to grant mediation in a particular case is within the discretion of the Postal Service.

**652.52 Mediation**

[Revise the text of 652.52 to read as follows:]

Mediation programs will be implemented by area offices under guidelines issued by the manager, National EEO Compliance and Appeals Programs.

In an effort to reduce waste and account for more customers submitting change-of-address orders online, fewer *Mover’s Guide* copies are needed. There are several things you can do to conserve as well:

- Make sure customers are aware that USPS.com® is the most convenient, safe, and secure way for customers to submit a change-of-address order.
- Encourage carriers to take ICOA message cards on their routes instead of *Mover’s Guide* copies.
- Give *Mover’s Guide* copies out to *moving* customers only.

#### Important Reminders

- Copies of *Mover’s Guide* must be kept behind the counter *ONLY*, not in inner or outer lobbies or on clerk counters.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com) should be given a complete, unopened copy of *Mover’s Guide*.
- Provide no more than three copies of *Mover’s Guide* to each customer.
- *Mover’s Guide* is printed and distributed four times a year.

## Notices

### Notice: International Mail Global Express Guaranteed Service Resumes to all Destinations in Ukraine

Effective June 16, 2014, the Postal Service™ resumed accepting shipments to the Crimea and Sevastopol in Ukraine using its Global Express Guaranteed® (GXG®) service. Service to these areas using other USPS® international shipping options is still temporarily suspended.

As announced in *Postal Bulletin 22387* (4-17-14, page 40, “Temporary Suspension of Mail Service to Certain Destinations in Ukraine”), on April 11, 2014, the Postal Service temporarily suspended all mail service to the Crimea due to the Ukrainian State Postal Enterprise (Ukrposhta) informing the Universal Postal Union (UPU) that Ukrposhta had suspended delivery services for international mail addressed to the Crimea (postal codes in the range 95000–99999), Ukraine. However, this suspension no longer applies to GXG service and customers may resume shipments to the Crimea and Sevastopol in Ukraine using this service.

Until further notice, all Post Office™ and other acceptance locations must continue *not to accept* any mail des-

tined to the Crimea (postal codes in the range 95000–99999), Ukraine, using Priority Mail Express International®, Priority Mail International®, First-Class Mail International®, First-Class Package International Service™, International Priority Airmail® (IPA®), International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®), and M-Bag® items.

For already deposited non-GXG items addressed to these destinations, Postal Service employees must endorse them “Mail Service Temporarily Suspended — Return to Sender” and then place them in the mailstream for return.

For all returned items, the Postal Service will, upon request, refund postage and fees on mail returned due to the temporary suspension of service.

Prior to the implementation of eCareer in 2007, PS Form 991, *Application for Promotion and Assignment*, was used primarily for nonbargaining vacancies. Effective June 26, 2014, PS Form 991 is revised for bargaining employees (only) to use when applying or bidding for a position for which they are required to describe their qualifications (for example, when the selection method is “best qualified”).

- The first page containing instructions is edited.
- The Notes to Applicant page is edited for bargaining vacancies, the Privacy Act Statement has been updated, and the Computer Matching statement has been deleted.
- The Social Security number field has been changed to request the employee identification number.
- Page numbers have been edited.

- Two pages that specifically addressed nonbargaining vacancies have been deleted.

## Information Security

### Credit Check — Advice for Online Purchases



Do you use credit cards for personal purchases? If so, you should have at least two cards — one for purchases made online or by telephone and a second card for everything else.

This advice comes from the Postal Service™ Corporate Information Security Office (CISO), which confirms the risk of a credit card being compromised is greater for online and telephone transactions. Using a separate credit card with a lower credit limit for these transactions reduces your exposure to potential fraud.

Credit cards designated for online and telephone transactions are helpful because:

- They aren't tied directly to your bank account;
- If the card is compromised, the impact to your daily routine is reduced while waiting for a replacement card; and
- It's easier to track online and telephone purchases.

According to CISO, this advisory does not apply to official business or travel-related purchases with USPS® credit cards.

## Labor Relations

### Postal Service Policy on Workplace Harassment

Effective June 10, 2014, the Postal Service™ reissued its Postal Service Policy on Workplace Harassment (see pages [41–42](#)).

This policy:

- Includes a reference to military service in accordance with the Veterans Opportunity to Work (VOW) to Hire Heroes Act signed into law November 21, 2011, which expands protections against workplace discrimination based on military status under the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) of 1994. An employer's anti-harassment policy must prohibit all forms of harassment that violate federal anti-discrimination laws to include military service.
- Reaffirms the Postal Service's commitment to providing a work environment free of harassment.

- Supersedes MOP DD-10-04-2010, *Postal Service Policy on Workplace Harassment*.

The cost per unit of 500 is \$12.50. This cost includes overprinting the address of the fulfillment office placing the order. Cyril-Scott Company must receive orders placed by mail by close of business the day of the print run cut-off date listed here. Orders received after the cut-off date will be processed the next print run date.

Use eBuy2 to order Stamps by Mail brochures. These approved eBuy2 orders must be received by Supply Man-

agement at least 10 days prior to a published run cut-off date to be included in that run. From June 15–30, eBuy2 will have a blackout for ordering the Stamps by Mail brochure. We are converting the system over to the new 2014 Holiday (HOL) brochure.

Cyril-Scott Company will deliver orders within 35 calendar days after printing. Printing begins 1 week after the deadline date, and actual receipt of the order will depend on the ultimate destination and the corresponding delivery service standard.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**A2.** APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E.** Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**U4.** Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** USPS Tracking is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

### Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. ### Postal Service Policy on Workplace Harassment

The United States Postal Service® is committed to providing a work environment free of harassment based upon race, color, religion, sex (including gender identity and gender stereotypes), national origin, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, genetic information, uniformed (military) service, or in reprisal for an employee's or applicant's complaint about or opposition to discrimination or participation in any process or proceeding designed to remedy discrimination. The Postal Service's workplace must be one in which all employees are treated with dignity and respect by supervisors, subordinates, and coworkers. Supervisors and managers will take prompt action to prevent, address, and remedy workplace conduct that is contrary to this policy.

#### Prohibited Activities

Harassment is unwelcome verbal or physical conduct, which is so severe or pervasive that it interferes with or changes the conditions of one's employment by creating a hostile, intimidating, or abusive working environment. Examples may include, but are not limited to, making offensive or derogatory comments or engaging in physically threatening, intimidating or humiliating behavior based upon race, color, religion, sex (including gender identity and gender stereotypes), national origin, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, genetic information, past, present, or future uniformed (military) service, or in reprisal for an employee's or applicant's complaint about or opposition to discrimination or participation in any process or proceeding designed to remedy discrimination. These activities are prohibited by Postal Service policy and may amount to harassment in violation of federal anti-discrimination laws. Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination. The Postal Service is committed to providing its employees a safe, productive, and inclusive workplace and will tolerate nothing less.

Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature such as, but not limited to: making or threatening to make employment decisions based on an employee's submission to, or rejection of, sexual advances or requests for sexual favors; deliberate or repeated unsolicited remarks with a sexual connotation or physical contact of a sexual nature that is unwelcome to the recipient; or behavior that creates a sustained hostile or abusive work environment so severe or pervasive that it unreasonably interferes with or changes the conditions of one's employment.

Although not every instance of inappropriate behavior may fit the legal definition of harassment, such behavior in the workplace undermines morale and violates the Postal Service's standards of conduct. Disciplinary action may result even if the conduct does not constitute harassment under the law.

#### Management Responsibility

All managers and supervisors are responsible for preventing harassment and inappropriate behavior that could lead to illegal harassment, and must respond promptly when they learn of any such conduct. Any manager or supervisor who receives a complaint must see that a prompt and thorough investigation is conducted. Investigations of all forms of harassment must be done in accordance with the "Initial Management Inquiry Process (IMIP)." Materials are available in Publication 552, *Manager's Guide to Understanding Investigating, and Preventing Harassment*. When harassment or inappropriate conduct is found, managers must take prompt and effective corrective action.

**Employees' Rights and Responsibilities**

Postal Service employees who believe that they are the victims of harassment prohibited under this policy (i.e., harassment based on race, color, religion, sex (including gender identity or gender stereotypes), national origin, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, genetic information, uniformed (military) service, or in reprisal for an employee or applicant's complaint about or opposition to discrimination or participation in any process or proceeding designed to remedy discrimination) or who have witnessed such harassment or inappropriate conduct, which could lead to illegal harassment, should bring the situation to the attention of a supervisor, a manager, or the manager of Human Resources to address most forms of harassment described above. Refer to Publication 553, *Employee's Guide to Understanding, Preventing, and Reporting Harassment* for further information. In accordance with this policy, supervisors, managers, managers of Human Resources, or the next higher level manager (HQ and HQ field units) are responsible for ensuring that direct and prompt action is taken to investigate and, where appropriate, remedy such misconduct when brought to their attention. The Postal Service will protect the confidentiality of harassment complainants to the extent possible.

Federal law requires the Postal Service to afford equal employment opportunity to employees and applicants for employment regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age (40+), physical or mental disability, and genetic identification. Employment discrimination or reprisal for engaging in an EEO-protected activity is prohibited. Employees pursuing an EEO complaint should contact the Postal Service's EEO centralized intake center within 45 days of the conduct giving rise to the claim in order to preserve their rights under federal law. Employees making a complaint can call toll free 1-888-EEO-USPS (1-888-336-8777). Deaf and Hard of Hearing employees can call 1-888-325-2914 (Federal Relay Service). In addition, bargaining unit employees may seek relief through the grievance-arbitration procedures, and if applicable, non-bargaining unit employees may use the grievance procedures described in Section 652, *Employee and Labor Relations Manual*.

Allegations involving any possible criminal misconduct should be reported to the appropriate law enforcement authorities as follows: any physical misconduct relating to workplace harassment (i.e., any physical assault, threat of a physical assault, or stalking) should be reported to the Postal Inspection Service; use of any electronic device, computer, or the internet to transmit threatening or harassing communications, obscene or indecent images and materials, should be reported to the Office of Inspector General (OIG).

Reprisal against employees who raise a claim of harassment, report inappropriate conduct, or provide evidence in any investigation, is illegal and can result in disciplinary action, and should be referred to the Inspection Service or OIG as appropriate.

The Postal Service will not tolerate any type of harassment, inappropriate conduct, or reprisal in the workplace.

## Stamp Announcement 14-32: Medal of Honor: Korean War Stamps



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On July 26, 2014, in Washington, DC at the Korean War Veterans Memorial, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Medal of Honor: Korean War* (Forever® First-Class Mail priced at 49 cents) stamps, in two designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) prestige folio of 20 stamps (Item 587400).

The stamps will go on sale nationwide July 26, 2014.

In January 2012, the U.S. Postal Service invited the last living Korean War Medal of Honor recipients to join in honoring the extraordinary courage of every member awarded the medal for their valorous actions during the war. This 4-page prestige folio, *Medal of Honor: Korean War*, honors those 145 recipients. The first side of the prestige folio highlights historical photographs of the last living recipients of the Medal of Honor from the Korean War. The 13 photographs surround two Forever stamps. One stamp features a photograph of the Navy version of the Medal of Honor; the other stamp features a photograph of the Army version of the Medal of Honor. The second page includes a short piece of text and a key to the names of the recipients pictured in the cover photos. The names of all 145 recipients of the Medal of Honor from the Korean War are listed on page three. The remaining 18 stamps are found on the back page along with a quote describing why the Medal of Honor is awarded, "For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life, above and beyond the call of duty." Art director Antonio Alcalá designed the prestige folio and the stamps, working with photographs of the medals by Richard Frasier.

**Distribution: Item 587400, \$9.80 Medal of Honor (Forever priced at 49 cents) Commemorative Prestige Folio of 20 Stamps**

The Binghamton, Kansas City, and Dulles Stamp Distribution Centers (SDCs) will receive an automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane of 20 stamps. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 1,000 panes. The stamps will be shipped and sold as a pane (folded) of 20 (\$9.80).

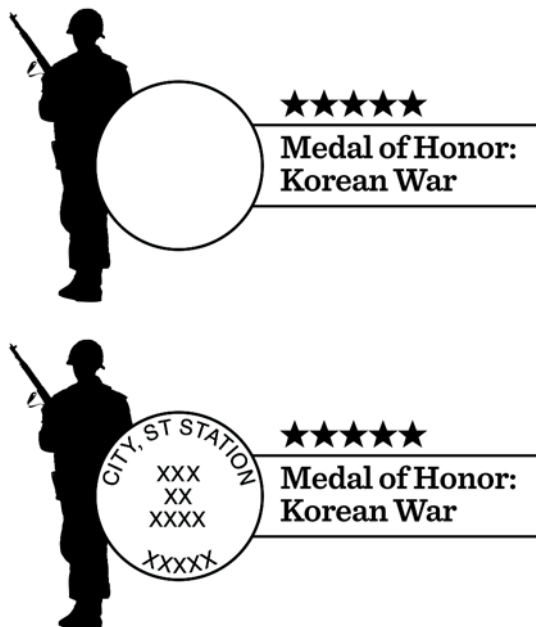
**Initial Supply to Post Offices**

Stamp Fulfillment Services will make a subsequent automatic push distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 30 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic push distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the AssetManagement SDC webpage at [http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am\\_sdchome.htm](http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm). Post Offices may preorder these stamps prior to FDOI through the eBuy2 SEAM Catalog. However, offices should check the website noted above to determine the amount they will receive on their automatic push distribution.

**Special Dedication Postmarks**

Only the following pictorial postmark is permitted for the *Medal of Honor: Korean War* stamps. The word "Station" or the abbreviation "STA" is required somewhere in the design, because it will be a temporary station.

**Guidelines for Finalizing the Medal of Honor Stamp Pictorial Postmark Art**



To finalize the *Medal of Honor: Korean War* stamps pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP™ Code of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3-1/2 inches by 1.

The Postal Service must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the Postal Bulletin. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services four weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. ### How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop), or by calling 800-STAMP-24. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. For more than 50, customers have to pay five cents each. All orders must be postmarked by September 24, 2014.

## Stamp Announcement 14-33: Civil War: 1864 Stamps



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On July 30, 2014, in Petersburg, Virginia at the Petersburg National Battlefield, and in Mobile, Alabama at the History Museum of Mobile, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue a *Civil War: 1864* (Forever® priced at 49 cents) commemorative se-tenant First-Class Mail stamp pair (two designs) in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) souvenir sheet of 12 stamps (Item 587300). **The \$5.88 Civil War: 1864 souvenir sheet may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.**

The stamps will go on sale nationwide July 30, 2014.

In 2014, the U.S. Postal Service continues its five-year commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War with this souvenir sheet, which includes two stamps. One depicts the 22nd United States Colored Troops engaged in the June 15-18, 1864, assault on Petersburg, Virginia, at the beginning of the Petersburg Campaign. The stamp is a reproduction of a painting, dated 1892, by J. André Castaigne (painting courtesy of the West Point Museum, United States Military Academy, West Point, New York). The other stamp depicts Admiral David G. Farragut's fleet at the Battle of Mobile Bay (Alabama) on August 5, 1864. The background image on the pane is a photograph of Battery A, 2nd U.S. Colored Artillery (Light), Department of the Cumberland, 1864 (photograph courtesy of the Chicago History Museum, ICHI-07774). The souvenir sheet also includes period quotes and lyrics from a Negro spiritual. The *Civil War Sesquicentennial* series was designed by art director Phil Jordan.

**Distribution: Item 587300, \$5.88, Civil War: 1864 (Forever priced at 49 cents) Commemorative PSA Souvenir Sheet of 12 Stamps**

The Binghamton, Kansas City, and Dulles Stamp Distribution Centers (SDCs) will receive an automatic distribution quantity for a PSA pane of 12 stamps. Distributions for panes are rounded up to the nearest master carton size of 1,400 panes. The stamps will be shipped and sold as a pane of 12 (\$5.88).

**Initial Supply to Post Offices**

Stamp Fulfillment Services will make a subsequent automatic push distribution to premier Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 30 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic push distribution will be posted, by finance number and unit ID, on the Asset Management SDC webpage at [http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am\\_sdchome.htm](http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/assetmgnt/am_sdchome.htm). Post Offices may preorder these stamps prior to the FDOI through the eBuy2 SEAM Catalog. However, offices should check the website noted above to determine the amount they will receive on their automatic push distribution.

**Special Dedication Postmarks**

Only the following pictorial postmark is permitted for the *Civil War: 1864* stamps. The word "Station" or the abbreviation "STA" is required somewhere in the design, because it will be a temporary station.

## Guidelines for Finalizing the Civil War: 1864 Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize the *Civil War: 1864* stamps pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP™ Code of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3-1/2 inches by 1.

The Postal Service™ must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the Postal Bulletin. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services four weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. For more than 50, customers have to pay five cents each. All orders must be postmarked by September 28, 2014.

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

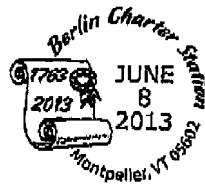

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Ser-

vices, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute tradi-

tional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-

issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

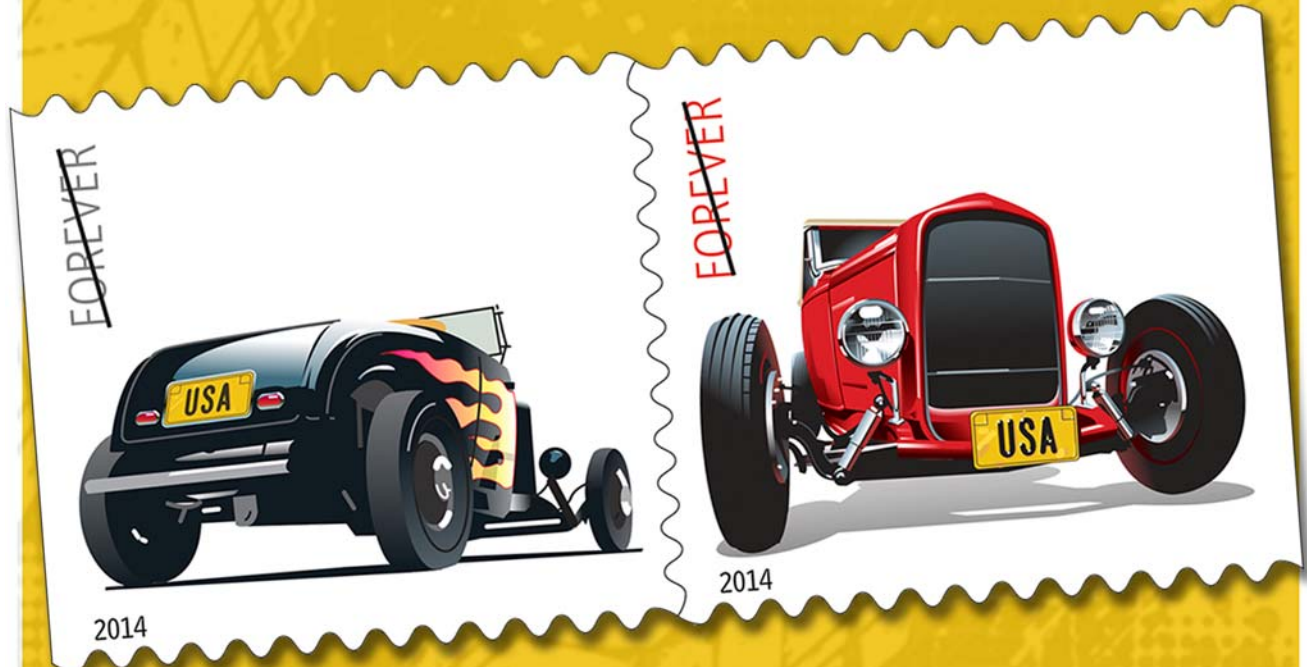
