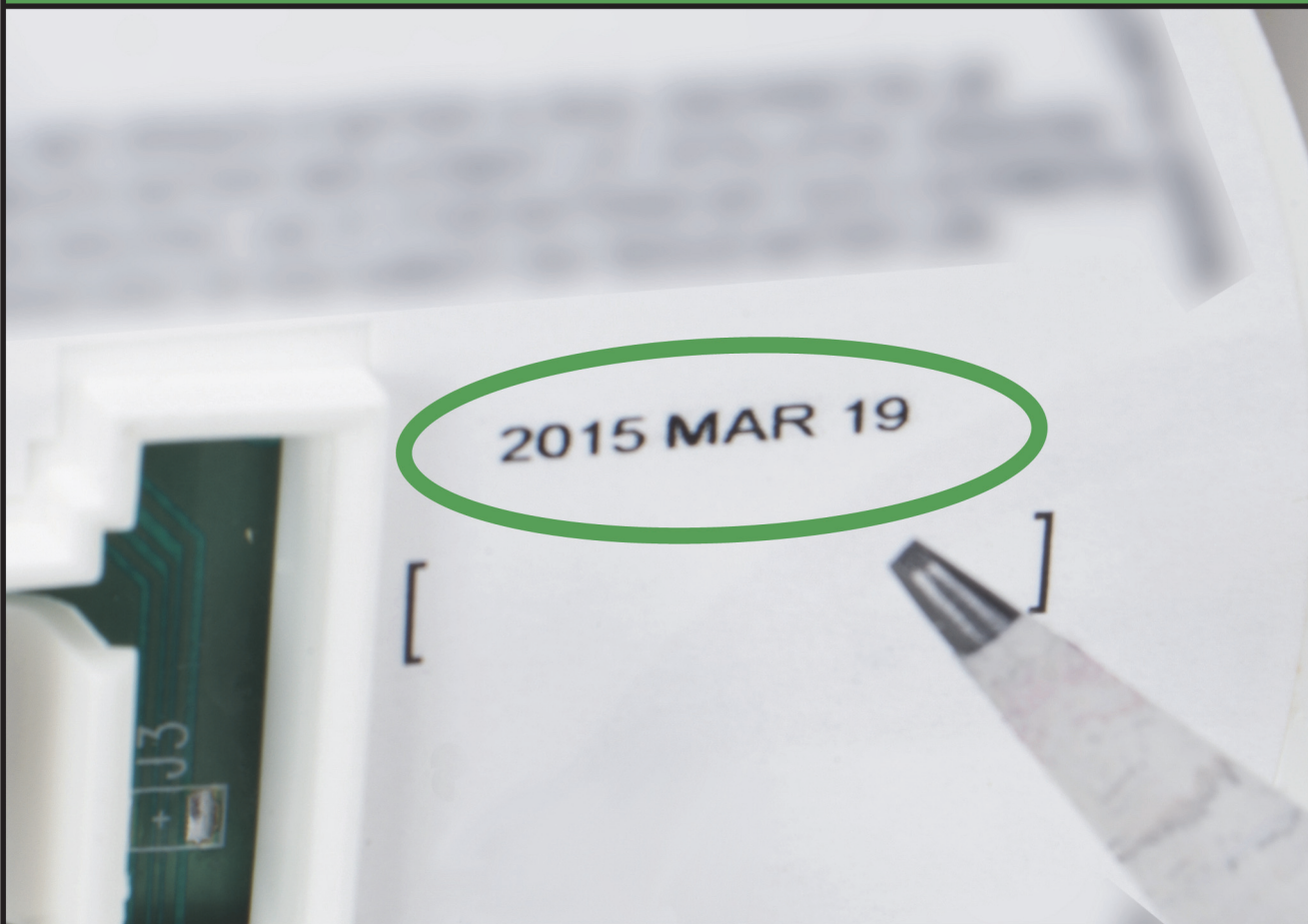

Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15, 2016: Don't Wait — Check the Date! Replace Smoke Detectors Every 10 Years

Almost 2,500 people die in home fires every year in the United States. Most of these people live in homes that do not have working smoke alarms. Approximately 60 percent of home fire deaths result from fires in which smoke alarms were not present or didn't work. Do you know how old your smoke detectors are or how often they should be replaced? Smoke detectors should be replaced every 10 years. To find out how old a smoke detector is, remove it from the wall or ceiling and look at the manufacture date on the back of the alarm.

You should put a smoke alarm on every level of your home, outside each sleeping area, and inside every bedroom. There are many brands of smoke alarms on the market, including alarms for people who are deaf or blind. These alarms may have strobe lights that flash and/or vibrate to alert those who are unable to hear standard smoke alarms when they sound. For the best protection, make sure all alarms are interconnected — when one sounds, they all sound.

Have you checked your smoke alarm to make sure it's still working? A smoke alarm with a dead or missing battery is the same as having no smoke alarm at all. Test the alarm monthly and replace the batteries at least once a year. A smoke alarm only works when it is properly installed and regularly tested. Some fire departments will install battery-operated alarms in your home for free. Contact your local fire department's non-emergency number for more information.

The risk of dying in a home fire is cut in half in homes with working smoke alarms. Smoke alarms save lives. Keep your family safe by putting working smoke alarms in your home.

Effective September 29, 2016, the Postal Service™ is revising the *Administrative Support Manual (ASM)*, Chapter 5, to update the processes and procedures related to Facilities and Equipment.

511	General				

511.1 Responsibilities

[Revise 511.1 to read as follows:]

Facilities is an organization whose primary mission is to provide quality real estate facilities and related services to meet the present and future needs of Postal Service operations.

511.11 Overall

[Revise 511.11 to read as follows:]

The Facilities organization is responsible for the following:

- a. Determining facility requirements and planning, including: facility space planning, design and construction, and decision analysis report preparation.
- b. Providing opportunities for occupancy of leased facilities, including continued occupancy of existing leased facilities.
- c. Providing new and/or improved owned facilities.
- d. Outleasing, subleasing, and/or developing underutilized space.
- e. Providing repairs and alterations for continued operational use.
- f. Providing requirements to Supply Management for the design and construction of all building-related project work at \$10,000 or more.
- g. Following applicable regulations and policies, including the Davis Bacon Act for applicable project work

at \$2,000 or more and the Service Contract Act at \$2,500 or more.

- h. Providing environmental assessments, historic assessments, and other real estate-related evaluations.
- i. Coordinating the development of material handling systems with Engineering.
- j. Coordinating with the Postal Inspection Service and the Office of Safety and Risk Management regarding the security and safety requirements at facilities owned or leased by the Postal Service.

511.12 Area Offices

[Revise 511.12 to read as follows:]

All Area offices have responsibility within prescribed limits for the following:

- a. Facility requirements and planning.
- b. Building inspections.
- c. Facility maintenance and minor repairs. Facility repairs that are declined by maintenance will be the responsibility of the Facilities organization.

511.13 References

[Revise 511.13 to read as follows:]

References include the following handbooks:

- AS-504, *Space Requirements*, has instructions to carry out facility requirements and space planning.
- RE-1, *Realty Acquisition and Management*, has policy and procedures to carry out acquisition, disposal, leasing, historic preservation, fine arts, and management of real property.
- AS-503, *Standard Design Criteria*, provides designs, criteria, and specifications for new buildings and repair and alteration of existing structures.
- RE-6, *Facilities Environmental Guide*, provides policy and procedures governing the environmental aspects of leasing, acquiring, managing, developing, and disposing of real property.
- RE-4, *Standards for Facility Accessibility by the Physically Handicapped*.
- RE-5, *Building and Site Security Requirements*.
- EL-602, *Food Service Operations*.

511.211 Handbook F-66 Series

[Revise 511.211 to read as follows:]

Handbook F-66 series on investment policies and procedures provides processes for obtaining approval of:

- a. The purchase, construction, lease, alteration, maintenance, and repair of postal land, facilities, and equipment.
- b. The disposal of equipment, leased land, leased facilities, and owned facilities.

511.22 Contracting Authority

[Revise 511.22 to read as follows:]

Authority for approving and entering into design and construction contracts is defined in the *USPS Supplying Principles and Practices* (<http://blue.usps.gov/policy/>), part 7-1, Appointment and Selection of Contracting Officers. Contracting authority for Real Estate and its related services is found in Handbook RE-1, *Realty Acquisition and Management*.

* * * * *

512.11 Policy

[Revise 512.11 to read as follows:]

Before deciding to acquire new facilities or expand existing facilities, Facilities will review the opportunity for continued occupancy of the present facility, including a review of the facility's capability to meet expected future requirements in capacity and service standards. The criterion for adding to existing facilities or replacing facilities is improvement of the Postal Service at least cost. New construction is authorized only when the current use of an existing building as is cannot be justified from a service, environmental, employee, space constraint, or economic standpoint.

* * * * *

512.211 Approval Factors

[Revise 512.211 to read as follows:]

Requirements for new or expanded facilities may be approved on the basis of one or more of the following factors:

- a. Employee factors such as providing safe and healthful working conditions.
- b. Service factors such as current or future capacity deficiencies, future expected growth, lease preemption, and condemnation.
- c. Economic factors such as providing a positive return on investment (ROI) (see the Handbook F-66 series).

512.212 Long-Range Planning

[Revise 512.212 to read as follows:]

Long-range facility planning at the District, Plant, and Area Office levels is intended to identify problem facilities and provide adequate lead time for all alternatives to be considered and for proper action to be initiated.

* * * * *

512.231 Preparation

[Revise 512.231 to read as follows:]

Facilities Planning is responsible for developing planning documentation for Customer Service and Processing and Distribution Facilities with appropriate input from respective operational functions (i.e. Retail and Customer Service Operations, Delivery, etc.).

* * * * *

512.3 Funding Approval

[Revise 512.3 to read as follows:]

All projects must be approved within the delegations of approval authority specified by the vice president, Finance and Planning.

512.4 Facility Activation

[Revise 512.4 to read as follows:]

Facility Activation is an Area responsibility. Facilities will provide assistance as needed to the Area in the facility activation process. Guidelines for activating new facilities are specified in Handbook AS-501, *Postal Facility Activation*, and Handbook AS-502, *Activation of Non-Mail Processing Postal Facilities*, that are in effect at the time of the activation.

513.111 Documentation and Requests

[Revise 513.111 to read as follows:]

The requiring organization forwards requests for acquiring a new facility, whether an existing building or land upon which to construct a building through channels to the official with approval authority for funding, as specified in the Handbook F-66 series on investment policies and procedures.

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 513.112 to read as follows:]

513.112 Continuing Space in Existing Leased Quarters

To ensure that continued occupancy of a leased facility is a feasible alternative, each successive month the Customer Relations Manager (CRM) submits an expiring lease report to its respective Districts and Area.

* * * * *

513.13 Emergency Space

[Revise 513.113 to read as follows:]

The Postmaster may proceed to contact local brokers/property owners to secure emergency space, but must submit any contractual documents to the leasing team for review, approval, or disapproval and subsequent execution of an approved document.

513.14 Christmas Space Assistance

[Revise 513.114 to read as follows:]

The responsible operational unit can provide assistance in obtaining temporary space.

513.2 Security and Safety Management

[Revise 513.2 to read as follows:]

Before submitting requests for acquisition of new or existing buildings or Christmas space, notify the inspector-in-charge and the servicing safety office so that security and safety arrangements can be coordinated. Any property selected, including that for temporary use, must be examined to determine the adequacy of the security and safety arrangements.

[Add new 513.3 to read as follows:]

513.3 Procedures for Vacating Facility

There are times when a facility must be vacated on a temporary or permanent basis as a result of operational constraints (i.e., staffing) or as a result of necessary repairs required prior to continued occupancy. In these non-Facilities-driven circumstances where an existing facility is vacated, the District Operations is responsible for notifying Facilities that a facility is vacated. District Operations must complete the *Notification of Vacated Facility Form* and submit it to the appropriate customer relations manager with the district manager's signature. Upon receipt, the customer relations manager will submit the *Notification of Vacated Facility Form* to the Facilities planning program analyst who will coordinate the appropriate actions based on the standard operating procedures defined under the Notification of Vacated Facilities process.

* * * * *

514.11 General

[Revise 514.11 to read as follows:]

The lease agreement between the Postal Service and landlord may have provisions for cancellation of the lease prior to the end of the lease term upon written notice.

514.12 By Postal Service

[Revise 514.12 to read as follows:]

When the requiring organization no longer needs a leased facility, it must notify its CRM. Available options may involve termination of the existing lease, assignment of the

leasehold interest, or if other options are not available sub-leasing of the space. The request must be submitted in a timely manner to allow action by the responsible service organization in accordance with the provisions of the lease.

[Revise the title and text of 514.13 to read as follows:]

514.13 By Landlord

Postmasters must immediately forward to the CRM any notification received from a landlord that purports to terminate or cancel a lease on a leased building.

514.2 Vacating Building

[Revise 514.2 to read as follows:]

When a lease is terminated, canceled, or expires, and the property is to be vacated, the Implementation or Property Management RES coordinates with the Postmaster to ensure that the premises are vacated and keys are delivered to the lessor, if possible. Postmasters must remove Postal Service identification from the building and post a sign advising the public of the new location.

* * * * *

515.2 Repairs

[Revise 515.2 to read as follows:]

When repairs are needed for which the lessor is responsible, the Postmaster contacts the National Facilities Response Line and reports the problem that needs repair.

515.3 Emergency Repairs

[Revise 515.3 to read as follows:]

An emergency repair is action taken to correct a situation that constitutes a threat to the safety or health of postal employees or customers or threatens the security of the mail. The Postmaster contacts the National Facilities Response Line and reports the problem that needs repair.

* * * * *

516.11 Minor Repairs and Alterations

[Revise 516.11 to read as follows:]

All requests for facility repair and alteration projects are to be reported to the National Facilities Response Line.

516.12 Historically Significant Facilities

[Revise 516.12 to read as follows:]

Any proposed modification to an owned or leased postal facility listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places must be submitted to the Facilities preservation officer.

* * * * *

516.131 Asbestos

[Revise 516.131 to read as follows:]

Asbestos is a hazardous, regulated material, and any project that can disturb actual or suspected asbestos must be referred to the responsible service organization (see MI EL-890-2007-2, *Asbestos-Containing Building Materials Control Program*, and Handbook AS-556).

516.132 Lead-Based Paint

[Revise 516.132 to read as follows:]

Lead-based paint is a potentially hazardous and regulated material. Any project that may produce dust or fumes from suspected or known lead-based paint must be referred to the responsible service organization (see MI EL-890-2007-4, *Lead Hazard Management*).

[Add new 516.133 to read as follows:]

516.133 Mold

Mold is a potential health and safety issue when not properly managed (see MI AS-516-2008-1, *Mold Prevention, Assessment, and Remediation*).

* * * * *

516.21 Policy

[Revise 516.21 to read as follows:]

Postmasters have limited authority to rearrange or insert additional Post Office boxes in existing lobbies without going through appropriate higher management. Any proposed modification of Post Office boxes that would require a change to lobbies located in an owned or leased postal facility listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places must be submitted to the Facilities preservation officer.

* * * * *

516.231 Relocation

[Revise 516.231 to read as follows:]

The Postmaster is authorized only to replace blank panels with Post Office boxes or to relocate Post Office boxes within a panel if no rearrangement of the box lobby is required. This work can be performed by the local maintenance staff.

516.232 Redesign

[Revise 516.232 to read as follows:]

In cases where rearrangement or extensive modification of the Post Office box lobby is required, the project must be forwarded to the Facilities CRM. Facilities is responsible for the redesign of the lobby to ensure satisfactory changes in the heating, ventilating, air conditioning, and lighting systems; floor and/or ceiling structure; safety; and security. It is also responsible for ensuring compliance with requirements for persons with disabilities (see Handbook RE-4, *Standards for Facility Accessibility by the Physically Hand-*

icapped) and for compliance with section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 516.241 to read as follows:]

516.241 General Services Administration – Postal Service Agreement

The Government Services Administration-Postal Service Agreement does not permit the Postal Service to make building modifications without prior approval from the General Services Administration (GSA). However, the Postmaster may without prior GSA approval replace blank panels with Post Office boxes or relocate boxes within a panel unless the area of the boxes is historic. This work can be performed either by the local maintenance staff or GSA.

516.242 Other Modifications

[Revise 516.242 to read as follows:]

All other Post Office box lobby modifications must be submitted to the Facilities CRM for prior approval by GSA.

* * * * *

516.251 Panel Replacement

[Revise 516.251 to read as follows:]

When blank panels are to be replaced by Post Office boxes, or boxes are to be rearranged in a panel without modifying the box lobby, the Postmaster is authorized to perform the work. This work may be performed by the local maintenance staff. If local maintenance is not going to perform the work, then it should be called into the National Response Line.

516.252 Submissions

[Revise 516.252 to read as follows:]

Submit all other box lobby modifications to the Facilities CRM.

* * * * *

516.273 Approvals

[Revise 516.273 to read as follows:]

If the request is approved, the Facilities CRM advises the Postmaster of the project schedule within 30 calendar days.

* * * * *

517.11 Inventory Review

[Revise 517.11 to read as follows:]

Identification and tracking of useable underutilized space in the USPS building inventory is the responsibility of the following organizations:

1. HQ Network Operations identifies useable underutilized space in mail processing facilities and provides the information to Facilities.

- 2. District Operations identifies useable underutilized space in Customer Service facilities and provides the information to Facilities.
- 3. Facilities is responsible for tracking identified useable underutilized space in the USPS inventory. All building information including such space is tracked in the Facilities eFMS system.

* * * * *

517.121 Approval and Recommendation

[Revise 517.121 to read as follows:]

Facilities is responsible for coordinating with the local District and Area office for the disposal of excess property.

517.122 Funding

[Revise 517.122 to read as follows:]

Facilities provides the funding for disposal support with appropriate project approval.

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 517.23 to read as follows:]

517.23 GSA and Postal Service Relationship

The relationship between the GSA and the Postal Service is on a landlord-tenant basis. Other federal agencies (including the U.S. courts and members of Congress) occupying space in Postal Service buildings are considered subtenants of the GSA.

* * * * *

517.31 General

[Revise 517.31 to read as follows:]

The Postal Service owns and leases numerous properties throughout the United States. It is important to have an effective and successful asset management program and to consider leasing underutilized space and facilities to the extent practical and in the best interest of the Postal Service.

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 517.321 to read as follows:]

517.321 Procedure

Available underutilized space is offered to the marketplace.

* * * * *

[Add new 517.323 to read as follows:]

517.323 Specific Requirements

The following requirements must be met for leases to the private sector:

- a. The prospective tenant must be financially reliable as determined by the Postal Service.

- b. The space leased to nonpostal tenants must be accessible by private entrance or public hallways that do not violate postal security regulations.
- c. The normal operating hours of the tenant should not conflict with the operating hours of the building.
- d. The building maintenance, repairs, utilities, and custodial services normally are Postal Service responsibility, but subject to the terms of the tenant's lease with the Postal Service.
- e. The tenant contracts with the appropriate communication services for telephone installation and service at no expense to the Postal Service.
- f. The Postal Service is responsible for basic security of the building and common areas, as determined by the Postal Inspection Service.

* * * * *

[Revise the title and text of 517.33 to read as follows:]

517.33 Reporting Underutilized Space, Buildings, and Land

Provided that District Operations notifies Facilities, Facilities Planning will identify and report all underutilized space in Postal Service-owned and Postal Service-leased buildings and in undeveloped Postal Service-owned and -leased sites. In turn, Facilities Planning will notify, through regular channels, Facilities Real Estate Assets that excess space exists and the space should be either sold or leased. Facilities' finance number is credited for the gross proceeds or rental income generated by the respective sale or outlease/sublease for leasing of underutilized property or space to federal and non-federal tenants.

[Delete sections 517.331 through 517.334.]

[Revise the title and text of 517.34 to read as follows:]

517.34 Lease of Space to Credit Unions (As Applicable Under the National Labor Agreements)

In the event that unions or their local unions (whether called branches or by other names) presently operate and charter credit unions, the USPS may, if space is available, provide limited non-workroom space without charge, for the operation of such credit unions in postal buildings. Requests for future space for union credit unions are to be sent to Facilities Real Estate Assets for review and consideration.

* * * * *

517.41 Requests From Government Agencies

[Revise 517.41 to read as follows:]

All requests for space at Postal Service facilities received by the Postal Service from federal agencies (including U.S. courts and members of Congress) must be referred to Facilities Real Estate Assets personnel. When an agency wants additional space at a Postal Service property, GSA

notifies Facilities Real Estate Assets. Postal managers must not authorize the use of unassigned space without the concurrence of Facilities Real Estate Assets.

517.42 Procedure

[Revise 517.42 to read as follows:]

Arrangements for assigning space in Postal Service buildings for federal agency use are made by GSA with the concurrence of Facilities Real Estate Assets. Space in Postal Service buildings already assigned to GSA for GSA or agency use may be reassigned by GSA, provided reasonable advance notice is given to Facilities Real Estate Assets.

[Delete current 517.43 in its entirety. Renumber current 517.44 through 517.46 as new 517.43 through 517.45 to read as follows:]

517.43 Alterations to Vacant Space

If underutilized space is not leasable without alterations, a study is conducted to determine whether these required alterations are structurally and architecturally feasible. An economic analysis is also made to determine whether this action is in the best interest of the Postal Service, based on anticipated rental.

517.44 Initial Tenant Alterations

The Postal Service is responsible for initial tenant alterations to the space assigned to GSA in Postal Service-owned or -leased buildings, as required by the GSA-Postal Service Agreement.

517.45 Monitor Space Assignments

Postmasters are responsible for monitoring space assigned to GSA, including relocations, transfers, expansions, reduction, and vacation of space. These changes must be reported to Facilities Real Estate Assets.

* * * * *

517.51 Procedure

[Revise 517.51 to read as follows:]

When the Postal Service requires space in a GSA-controlled building, or additional space in one it already occupies, Facilities Real Estate Leasing notifies GSA. The requirements organization submits a PS Form 7437, *Facilities Services Request*, or a written request through proper channels to Realty Asset Management.

517.52 Initial Tenant Alterations

[Revise 517.52 to read as follows:]

GSA is responsible for initial tenant alterations to space assigned to the Postal Service in GSA-controlled buildings, as required by the GSA-Postal Service Agreement.

517.53 Alterations, Improvements, and Services

[Revise 517.53 to read as follows:]

The GSA-Postal Service Agreement provides that GSA is primarily responsible for work involving alterations, improvements, and service in GSA-controlled buildings. If the Postal Service requests, and GSA provides, work or services that exceed those provided under the standard levels established in the GSA-Postal Service Agreement (for example, evenings, weekends, and holidays) the Postal Service pays these costs separately to the GSA by the Postal GSA. Make arrangements and secure approvals for funding prior to commencement of the work or service. Facilities Real Estate Leasing personnel prepare and execute contract documents with GSA.

* * * * *

[Add new 517.611 and 517.612 to read as follows:]

517.611 Notification

The Postal Service notifies GSA in writing at least 180 days in advance when space is required in Postal Service buildings occupied by federal agencies. **Exception:** If the Postal Service needs space used as a courtroom in a Postal building, at least one year advance written notice must be given to GSA.

517.612 Returning Space

When the Postal Service plans to dispose of a facility in which federal agencies (including U.S. courts or members of Congress) occupy space, Facilities Real Estate Assets notifies the appropriate GSA regional office, according to the above schedule in section 517.611.

* * * * *

517.632 Returning Space

[Revise 517.632 to read as follows:]

When GSA plans to dispose of a facility in which the Postal Service occupies space, GSA notifies Facilities Real Estate Leasing, according to the above schedule.

* * * * *

517.641 Moving Expenses

[Revise 517.641 to read as follows:]

When either GSA or the Postal Service preempts, for its own use, space assigned to the other, the preempting agency funds only the moving expenses, including reasonable costs incidental to the move (such as communication line) of the agency required to relocate.

[Revise the title and text of 517.642 to read as follows:]

517.642 Communication Lines

- a. **Relocation costs:** Costs for relocating communication lines cannot exceed costs of duplicating the lines existing before moving. *Duplicating existing lines* is defined as replacing like equipment, including color, number, and type of instruments, number of circuits, buttons, lights, and buzzers.
- b. **Exception:** The cost of moving and reinstalling communication lines is not payable by the Postal Service to agencies required to relocate from a building being abandoned and excessed by the Postal Service.

* * * * *

517.713 Other

[Revise 517.713 to read as follows:]

Physical protection, maintenance, and policing of all parking areas are provided by the owner of the building.

517.72 Building Services

[Revise 517.72 to read as follows:]

The owner furnishes space, building services, and utilities, specified as standard level in the GSA-Postal Service agreement. Complaints and requests relating to required building services are made or referred to the owner's building manager or Postmaster. If the building manager or Postmaster does not provide a satisfactory solution to the complaint or request, refer the matter to Facilities Real Estate Assets or the GSA regional office.

517.82 Definitions

517.842 Unauthorized Use of Space

If a postal manager becomes aware that a federal tenant agency is using unauthorized space other than what is reflected on the rent bill, using unauthorized recurring or nonrecurring services, and/or making improvements or alterations to Postal Service space without a GSA Form 2957 on file in the postal manager's office, the postal manager must notify Facilities Real Estate Assets immediately. Facilities Real Estate Assets investigates the service being used by the federal tenant agency and notifies GSA that such services, if recurring in nature, are to be discontinued within 10 days if GSA Form 2957 is not submitted. If the service is nonrecurring in nature, GSA must be advised to cease work immediately. If the Postal Service has incurred cost or substantial damage as a result of the federal tenant agency actions, GSA is to be advised accordingly and the Postal Service will seek payment.

518.6 Security Evaluation

518.7 Facility Activation

Management must begin planning to activate a new facility at about the time a design contract is awarded. This function is an Area responsibility. Facilities will provide assistance as needed in the process. The guidelines for facility activation will be as stated in Handbook AS-501, *Postal Facility Activation*, for major processing and distribution facilities and in Handbook AS-502, *Activation of Non-Mail Processing Postal Facilities*, for non-processing and distribution facilities, stations, and branches under 30,000 square feet that are in effect at the time of the activation.

In March 2015, President Obama signed Executive Order 13693, Planning for Federal Sustainability in the Next Decade, requiring federal agencies to, among other things, reduce building energy intensity by 2.5 percent annually through the end of fiscal year 2025, relative to their 2015 baselines. While the Postal Service is not required to comply with EO 13693, the Postal Service may seek to comply with EO 13693’s goals as a matter of policy and may be subject to future laws and executive orders requiring further energy consumption reductions.

In addition, under the Energy Conservation and Production Act, the Postal Service is required to construct new buildings in accordance with building efficiency standards established by the Department of Energy. In November 2015, the Department of Energy issued a final rule adopting the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating, and Air-Conditioning Engineers' (ASHRAE) standard 90.1-2013 as the energy efficiency standard for all federal buildings for which design for construction began on or after November 6, 2016. It is assumed that the Department of Energy will adopt future ASHRAE standards as they are developed.

It is required by federal statute and by Postal Service policy, when designing, constructing, leasing, or altering facilities,

DMM Revision: Alternate Marked Copy Process

Effective November 7, 2016, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), section 207.16.2, to add an alternate process for publishers to submit their marked copies.

Currently, publishers are required to submit a marked copy(s) at either the original entry office or an additional entry office, unless they are certified by the Postal Service to use the Periodicals Accuracy, Grading, and Evaluation (PAGE) Program.

The Postal Service is adding the Alternate Marked Copy process to simplify the submission of marked copies for both the publishers and the Postal Service. This new process will not require a publisher to submit a marked copy(s) with every mailing. Instead, the Postal Service will request a randomly selected marked copy for review as part of the annual Statement of Ownership review. The Postal Service will confirm the information provided in the marked copy is accurate and properly represented on applicable postage statements.

This process will not eliminate the requirement to provide the correct advertising percentage for each Periodicals mailing on the electronic documentation or postage statement.

Publishers can enroll in the Alternate Mark Copy process as follows:

DMM Revision: Extra Services Eligibility

Effective November 7, 2016, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, Chapter 503.0 and section 505.3.0, to provide clarity and consistency on the eligibility of extra services.

The text of subsection 503.1.4.1 will be revised to clarify the use of Exhibit 1.4.1, Eligible Matter — Domestic Destinations, and minor revisions will be made to the exhibit. Exhibit 1.4.2, Eligible Matter — Offshore Domestic Destinations, will be revised for clarity and consistency with Exhibit 1.4.1. Exhibit 1.4.3, Eligible Matter — Domestic Returns, will have a minor revision for clarity. Minor revisions will be made in Chapter 503.0 for consistency with the aforementioned changes.

Section 503.9.0, Collect on Delivery (COD), will be revised to remove text referencing retired PS Form 3816-AS (*Postal Bulletin*, December 24, 2015). It will also be revised to add a subsection on COD Restricted Delivery for consistency in Chapter 503.0.

Section 505.3.0, Merchandise Return Service, will be revised to clarify the extra services that may be obtained by the permit holder and sender for consistency with subsection 503.1.4.3, Exhibit 1.4.3.

In Retirement: USPS to Drop PS Form 3575www

Effective September 29, 2016, the Postal Service™ is retiring a change-of-address form that has declined in popularity among customers.

PS Form 3575www, which is available on *Mover's Guide Online*, is generated when customers use the site to submit a change-of-address order without providing a credit card for identity validation.

Although customers can print PS Form 3575www and submit it to USPS® for processing, many customers fail to do so.

Among the 36.9 million change-of-address orders submitted during the previous fiscal year, less than 1 percent were submitted using PS Form 3575www. Usage of the form has decreased about 39 percent since 2014.

Postal Service leaders say the decrease suggests more people are choosing to submit their change-of-address orders electronically, which comprised 41 percent of all orders last year.

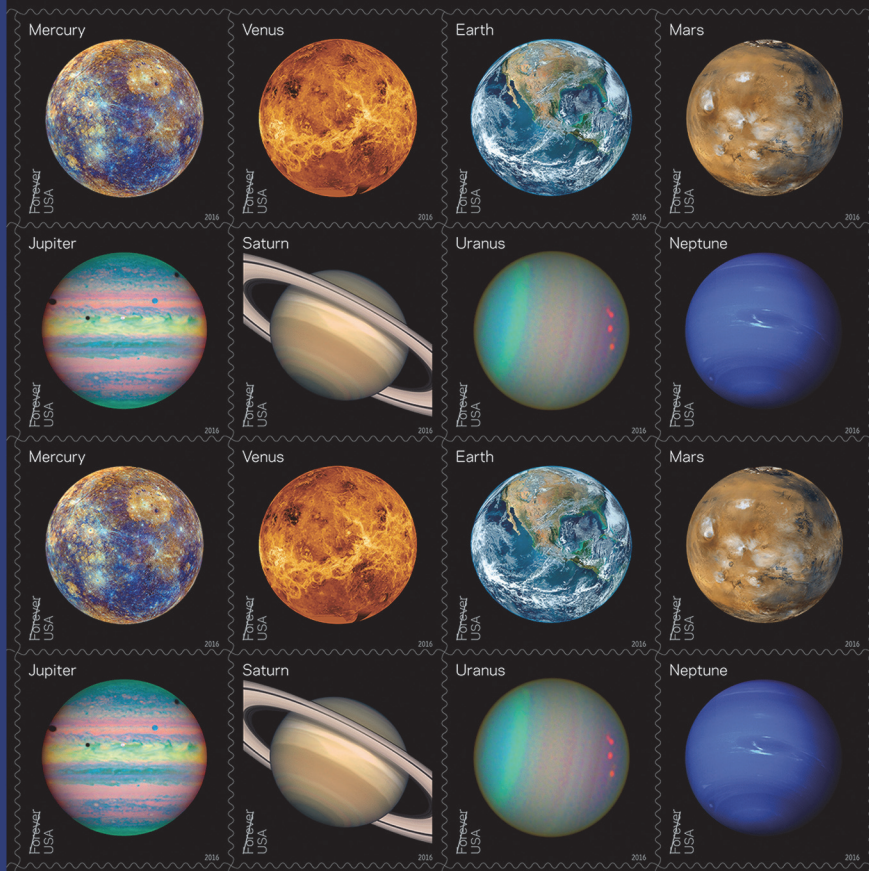

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Reserved for future use.

A2. Reserved for future use.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an MPO or DPO ZIP Code. If mailed using Priority Mail Express service, mailpieces requiring a customs form that are addressed to or from an MPO or DPO location must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., nonnegotiable documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an MPO except for those MPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- If mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.

K. Reserved for future use.

L. All Official Mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, live animals, and live plants are prohibited.

N. Registered Mail service is prohibited.

P. Official Mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under Publication 52, Part 421, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Synthetic cannabinoids used to stimulate the central nervous system commonly known as "synthetic marijuana," "K2," or "Spice" are prohibited.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes

Rural Carriers

In accordance with the provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.3, of Handbook EL-902, *Agreement between the United States Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association*, effective October 1, 2016 (pay period 21-16), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will decrease to 65.0 cents per mile. The EMA is 65.0 cents per mile, or a minimum of \$26.00 per day, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.5,

receive an EMA of 65.0 cents per mile or \$7.10 per hour, whichever is greater. This EMA should not exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance allowance for the route stops and miles.

Notice to All Post Offices With Rural Delivery Service: Rural Carrier Guarantee Period

Postal Service™ managers must effectively manage rural carriers who work under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), section 7(b)(2). Those carriers are paid overtime for all hours actually worked in excess of 2,080, up to 2,240, within the 52 consecutive week guarantee period.

If a carrier works more than 2,240 hours within the guarantee period, the agreement under FLSA, section 7(b)(2), is considered void, and the carrier must be compensated for all hours worked during the guarantee period in accordance with FLSA, section 7(a).

It is important that concerted effort is made to minimize the number of hours carriers work over 2,080 and strictly monitor these carriers to ensure that no carrier works in excess of 2,240 actual work hours.

This year's 2016–2017 guarantee period will begin on Saturday, October 15, 2016, and continue through Friday, October 13, 2017.

The Gospel says: “And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.” Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamp with original art by Nancy Stahl.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

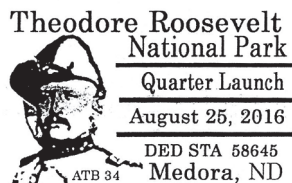

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

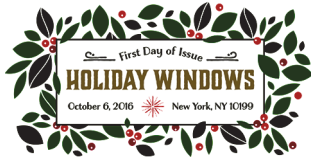

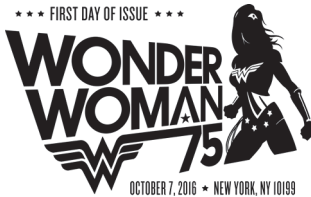

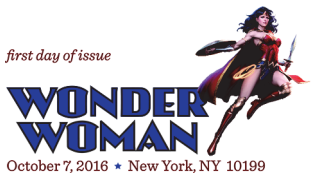

Sustainability

Required Procedures for Environmental Regulatory Agency Site Visits and Notices of Violation

It is Postal Service™ policy to comply with all applicable local, state, and federal environmental regulations and to cooperate fully with environmental regulators.

Environmental Agency Inspections and Site Visits

The site installation head **must immediately** report any visits and site inspections by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or state or local environmental regulatory agency to the appropriate USPS® regional manager, Environmental Compliance and Sustainability, regardless of whether the site visit is announced (pre-scheduled) or unannounced.

In addition, the installation head or his/her designee **must** follow the Postal Service's "Standard Operating Procedure for Environmental Agency Inspections and Site Visits" to ensure appropriate authorization and facility compliance during environmental agency inspections at postal facilities. The Procedure is available at: <http://blue.usps.gov/sustainability/environmental/facility-inspection.htm>

Environmental Notices of Violation and Similarly Entitled Notices

A notice of violation (NOV), or similarly entitled notice, such as a warning letter or a notice of non-compliance, can be issued to the Postal Service for failure to comply with an environmental regulation. Notices can be issued from the EPA or a state or local agency, and may occur as the result of a regulator site visit or inspection.

The site installation head or, if applicable, the Facilities Department project manager **must** notify the appropriate USPS regional manager, Environmental Compliance and Sustainability, within five days of becoming aware of an NOV, or similarly entitled notice. He or she must send an electronic copy of the notice to the respective regional manager within five days of receipt.

Reporting NOVs and similar notices will ensure that timely and necessary response actions are taken and that critical items are referred to the Law Department.
