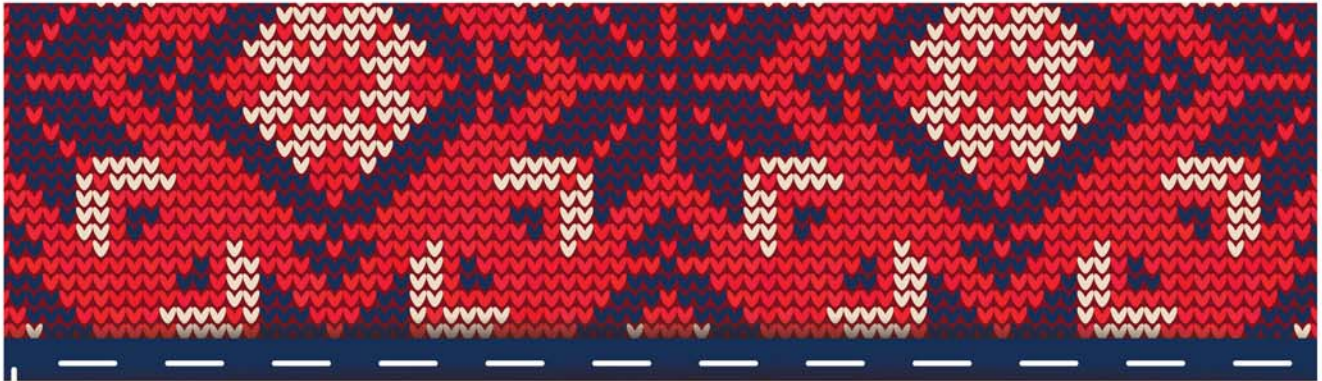

Cover Story

The Season for Returns...

The Postal Service™ is greasing the wheels of its returns infrastructure, in preparation for the 2016 shopping season and the annual returns flurry.

This shopping season is likely to be even more hectic than last year, with double-digit growth predicted in online shopping. USPS®, for its part, is projecting a 12% increase in package volume this holiday season — roughly 750 million packages.

Once the sun sets on candles and tinsel, consumers will set about returning items that they ordered, or that were gifted to them, and as the number of items ordered online and shipped to consumers grows, so will the demand for easy and convenient return methods that will attract repeat business.

The Postal Service is game for the challenge. USPS has:

- **Continued expanding its returns processing capabilities:** A total of 15,868 Parcel Return Service Return Delivery Units (RDUs) across the country are available to pick up packages. This will aid in handling the volume and help USPS position itself as the returns shipping provider of choice in a crowded market said to be worth some \$6 billion.
- **Made it easier for businesses to insure returns with USPS:** Insurance is available for up to \$5,000.
- **Created one universal returns permit:** USPS has one universal permit that covers Parcel Return Service, Merchandise Return Service, Bulk Parcel Return Service, and USPS Returns®.
- **Significantly enhanced Merchandise Return Service:** MRS applies to three mail classes: First-Class Package Service®, Priority Mail®, and Ground Return Service. This simplified returns for the Postal Service and for its customers by eliminating less cost-effective options and streamlined the manual weighing and rating of traditional MRS parcels.
- **Made Bulk Parcel Return Service (BPRS) an endorsement:** This means that mailers receiving these return packages pay the per-piece fee, without paying postage fees. Consumers no longer are required to download and print the mailer's BPRS label, which simplified the returns process on their end.

- **Increased the volume for First-Class Package Service:** Commercial customers with negotiated service agreements (NSAs) could now mail packages weighing up to one pound for a flat rate. This service targets merchants that ship high-value/lightweight products, such as jewelry or consumer electronics.

Return Labels

Return labels can either be included in the original order or requested via a merchant's call center. Consumers need only affix that return label to the package, and present it at one of more than 31,000 Post Offices™, drop it in one of 160,000 collection boxes (if it meets aviation mail security guidelines), or schedule a Package Pickup at any of the available 132 million domestic addresses by accessing www.usps.com.

The Postal Service also offers a number of options that help businesses create and deliver return labels to customers.

Businesses using Priority Mail Return Service, First-Class Package Return® Service, Ground Return Service, and Parcel Return Service can use the Print and Deliver application to order return labels; USPS will then create those labels and deliver them, along with return instructions:

- To one of the selected 31,000+ Post Offices;
- To a domestic address; or
- To one of more than 2,500 self-service kiosks, where consumers can print them.

Merchants can also instruct the Postal Service to hold the labels for pickup at a designated Post Office.

Click-N-Ship® Business Pro allows small- and medium-sized merchants to generate Parcel Return Service or Merchandise Return Service labels that will be:

- Included in the original shipment box;
- Available via the cloud platform;
- Available for self-service printing alone; and
- Available for self-service printing in batches.

DMM Revision: Customs Declaration Form PS Form 2976-B Mandatory for Use on All APO/FPO/DPO Priority Mail Express — Use of PS Form 2976-R Delayed

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), sections 703.2.3.6, 703.2.3.7, and 703.2.3.8, to make mandatory the use of PS Form 2976-B, *Priority Mail Express International Shipping Label and Customs Form*, on all Priority Mail Express® items, regardless of weight, value, or contents, to and from APO/FPO/DPO addresses.

We are simultaneously revising sections 123.61, 222.4, and the Individual Country Listings in the International Mail Manual (IMM®) to make PS Form 2976-B mandatory for all Priority Mail Express International® shipments; see separate article titled “IMM Revision: Preparation Requirements for Priority Mail Express International Shipments” in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin*.

Also, while our stated intention with the article titled “DMM Revision: New PS Form 2976-R, USPS Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note” in *Postal Bulletin 22448* (8-18-16) was to phase in the use of PS Form 2976-R, *USPS Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note*, at retail, and phase out the use of hard copy PS Form 2976, 2976-A, and 2976-B for APO/FPO/DPO addresses, systems are not ready yet for these changes. To avoid confusion for mailers and Postal Service employees, we are stating the regulations to reflect the current situation. We will revise them again once the systems can handle APO/FPO/DPO addresses on PS Form 2976-R.

2.3.6 Customs Declarations

[Delete reference to PS Form 2976-R in the first sentence, and add new second sentence prohibiting use of the PS Form 2976-R to read as follows:]

A hard copy or electronically generated PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B must be applied to mailpieces sent to or from APO, FPO, and DPO addresses as required in the “Overseas Military/Diplomatic Mail” section of the *Postal Bulletin*. At this time, PS Form 2976-R may not be used for any mail going to or from APO/FPO/DPO addresses.

2.3.7 Customs Declarations — Required Usage

[Remove the known mailer exception for Priority Mail Express to read as follows:]

Customs declarations forms required for use to or from APO/FPO/DPO addresses are as follows:

- Mailpieces addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO location must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B, *Priority Mail Express International Shipping Label and Customs Form*, if mailed using Priority Mail Express service, regardless of weight, value, or contents.

2.3.8 Customs Declarations — Exceptions

[Add the requirement for a customs form for Priority Mail Express to the first sentence of item a. and to items b. and c. to read as follows:]

The following exceptions to the customs declaration requirement are provided for items addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO destination ZIP Code:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more, except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form for all contents and weights.***
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as “Official Mail” are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APO, FPO, and DPOs to which restriction “B2” ap-

plies as required in the Restriction Legend of the “Overseas Military/Diplomatic Mail” section of the *Postal Bulletin* and except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form from all mailers.

- c. Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed “Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements,

except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form from all mailers.

First-Class Package Service

First-Class Package Service Optional ADC Presort

The Postal Service will offer an optional Area Distribution Center (ADC) presort for First-Class Package Service (FCPS) parcels to improve service for mailers. As a result, a new optional FCPS ADC Labeling List, L015, will be added.

Parcel Select

There are no product changes scheduled for the Parcel Select competitive product.

USPS Retail Ground

There are no product changes scheduled for the USPS Retail Ground competitive product.

Mailer Services

Premium Forwarding Service Commercial

The Postal Service will add 1-foot and 2-foot managed mail tray box flat rate pricing as an option to the current shipment containers for Premium Forwarding Service Commercial® dispatches.

Recipient Services

Post Office Box Service — Enterprise Post Office Box Online Fee Payment

The Postal Service is providing customers using the Enterprise PO Box Online (EPOBOL) system with the option to prorate semi-annual fees one time to align payment periods for multiple boxes. The prorated fee for each such box will be based on the number of months between the expiration of the current fee and the month of the payment alignment. Additional information on prorating of the semi-annual EPOBOL fees can be found in the Domestic Mailing Services *Federal Register* Notice.

Other**Address Enhancement Service — Topological Integrated Geographic Encoding and Referencing (Tiger/ZIP+4)**

The Postal Service is retiring Topological Integrated Geographic Encoding and Referencing (Tiger/ZIP+4) service.

Annual Mailing and Account Maintenance Fees

The Postal Service is eliminating the payment of annual mailing fees for Parcel Select and Parcel Select Lightweight. The annual return service permit fee and annual account maintenance fee for Parcel Return Service will also be eliminated. Additional information on the elimination of annual mailing and account maintenance fees can be found in the Domestic Mailing Services *Federal Register* Notice.

Permit Imprint Application Fee

The Postal Service is eliminating the payment of permit imprint application fees for Priority Mail Express, Priority Mail, First-Class Package Service, Parcel Select, and Parcel Select Lightweight competitive products. Additional information on the elimination of the permit imprint application fee can be found in the Domestic Mailing Services *Federal Register* Notice.

DMM Revision: New Mailing Standards for Domestic Mailing Services Products

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) in various sections to implement the changes coincident with the price adjustments and other minor DMM changes. Prices are available under Docket No. R2017-1 on the Postal Regulatory Commission's website at www.prc.gov.

In addition to the price adjustments, the following changes are being implemented:

Flats Sequencing System (FSS)

As background, on December 18, 2013, the Postal Service began to require bundle and pallet preparation of flat-size Standard Mail®, Periodicals, and Bound Printed Mat-

ter mailpieces for delivery within ZIP Codes™ served by FSS processing (78 FR 76533-76548). This requirement was incorporated into the DMM on January 26, 2014. Subsequently, on May 31, 2015, the Postal Service introduced FSS specific price structures for flat-sized Bound Printer Matter, Standard Mail, and Periodicals mailpieces, pursuant to PRC Order No. 2472, issued on May 7, 2015. This final rule removed all FSS specific pricing structures from Periodicals, Standard Mail, and Bound Printed Matter. One change, for example, requires mailers to add Optional Endorsement Lines (OELs) on each FSS scheme mailpiece. For FSS preparation, mailers place qualifying mailpieces from all price categories into a separate pool for each individual 5-digit FSS scheme combination.

All carrier route Bound Printed Matter (BPM), carrier route Periodicals, and carrier route (except saturation) Standard Mail flats meeting the standards in DMM 201.6.2 must be sorted to FSS schemes, properly bundled, and placed on or in pallets, trays, sacks, or approved containers, for FSS scheme ZIP Code combinations within the same facility. Mailings (excluding saturation mailings of Standard Mail) with non-presorted BPM flats may be included in FSS preparation, but will continue to be ineligible for presorted or carrier route prices.

To reiterate, all mailpieces in a 5-digit scheme FSS bundle must be identified with an OEL, as described in DMM 708.7.0. Mailpieces entered under a combined mailing of Standard Mail and Periodicals flats (DMM 705.15.0) still include class and price markings, applicable to the price paid, in addition to the OEL.

Periodicals, Standard Mail, and Bound Printed Matter flats properly included in a FSS scheme bundle qualify for the piece price applied prior to inclusion in the FSS scheme pool with the following exceptions for Standard Mail:

1. A carrier route mailpiece in a FSS bundle on a FSS scheme pallet will receive the Basic CR-Bundles/Pallet price.
2. A carrier route mailpiece in a FSS bundle on a FSS facility pallet will receive the Basic CR price.

Additional information on each mail class affected is under the Bound Printed Matter, Periodicals, and Standard Mail sections.

First-Class Mail – Combine First-Class Mail (FCM) Commercial Automation Automated Area Distribution Center (AADC) and 3-digit Sortations for Letters and Cards into One Combined Sortation Level Known as AADC

Currently, there are four presort levels for FCM Commercial Automation Letters and Cards: Mixed AADC, AADC, 3-Digit, and 5-Digit. To help simplify the pricing structure, the Postal Service implemented the same price for AADC Automation Letters (Cards) and 3-Digit Automations Letters (Cards) in Docket No. R2012-3. The Postal Service is now combining AADC and 3-Digit presort levels into one sortation. The new sortation name will be AADC. The existing Labeling List 801 will drive the FCM AADC separations, and origin entry separations, based on Labeling List 002, will be modified to reflect origin entry AADC separations.

First-Class Mail – Increase the Weight Standard for First-Class Mail (FCM) Commercial Automation and Machinable Letters and Cards from up to 3.3 ounces to up to 3.5 ounces

Currently, the “up to” weight standard for FCM Commercial Machinable Letters is 3.3 ounces. This lower

weight break of up to 3.3 ounces is being increased due to mail processing improvements. Since machinable letters must follow the standards for Automation Letters (except for IMb), the same weight maximum should apply. Based on this, the Postal Service will increase the weight maximum from 3.3 ounces to 3.5 ounces. This change does not apply to the maximum weight of Booklets, which are capped at 3.0 ounces.

First-Class Mail – One Price for up to 3.5 Ounces for First-Class Mail (FCM) Commercial Automation Letters

Currently, the same price applies for one- and two-ounce pieces for each individual mail sortation level for FCM Commercial Automation Letters. With this final rule, there will be one price for up to 3.5 ounces for each individual mail sortation level for FCM Commercial Automation Letters. This will also apply to mixed-weight FCM Residual mailings up to 3.5 ounces. The current preparation requirements for non-blended trays, such as one ounce, up to two ounces, and now extending to 3.5 ounces will continue. This change does not include FCM single-piece letters (non-residual) or FCM Flats.

First-Class Mail – Simplifying and Renaming FCM Alternate Postage as FCM Share Mail

The Postal Service will rename Alternate Postage as Share Mail™. This implements a proposal published in the June 9, 2016, *Postal Bulletin* (Issue #22443). Share Mail allows Postal Service customers to distribute single-piece FCM letters or cards to consumers, who may in turn mail those pieces to any domestic address, without having to affix postage. Share Mail pieces are permitted to weigh up to one ounce each. Payment is collected electronically from the customer’s Postage Due and Centralized Accounting Postage System (CAPS) Account. Invoicing is performed manually, by the Postal Service’s Share Mail Program Office in Marketing. To continue the Postal Service’s efforts to simplify its product line, the Share Mail payment tiers will be collapsed into one, and upfront postage payment requirements will be eliminated. Unique Intelligent Mail® barcodes are no longer required nor is a signed marketing agreement. Picture Permit will no longer be available in order to help expedite the approval process. A customer who wishes to participate must submit a request to the Share Mail Program Office along with production pieces to ensure readability for postal processing. Share Mail relies on Intelligent Mail barcode (IMb) technology and scan data collected as the mailpiece travels through the mailstream to determine piece counts, so readability is paramount.

Periodicals — Eliminate Flats Sequencing System (FSS) Pricing

The Postal Service will eliminate the FSS specific price structures for Periodicals Outside-County. FSS preparation will still be required and all FSS marking requirements will remain as is. Outside-County Periodicals flats properly included in a FSS scheme bundle will qualify for the price applied prior to inclusion in the FSS scheme pool. If a FSS scheme pallet is drop-shipped to a DFSS facility, the pallet will receive carrier route pallet pricing. If a FSS facility pallet is drop-shipped to a DFSS facility, the pallet will receive DSCF pallet pricing. Qualifying FSS scheme pieces entered at a DFSS facility will receive DSCF pound pricing. FSS scheme bundles on an FSS scheme pallet will receive carrier route bundle prices. FSS scheme bundles on an FSS facility pallet will receive 3-digit/SCF bundle pricing. FSS scheme and facility sack/trays or other authorized container will receive 3-digit/SCF sack/tray prices.

Standard Mail — Renaming Standard Mail as USPS Marketing Mail

The Postal Service will rename Standard Mail as USPS Marketing Mail™. This name change will better communicate to our customers the message that Standard Mail fits into their marketing mix.

To help smooth the transition for this change, the Postal Service will modify postage statements and the DMM for January 2017 and implement other changes to postal forms or documents during the normal update cycles. The initial implementation date for mailers to adopt the new USPS Marketing Mail abbreviations (such as MKT in lieu of STD) is July 1, 2018. Abbreviations and examples of permit imprints will be available in a future *Postal Bulletin*.

Bound Printed Matter — Eliminate Flat Sequencing System (FSS) Pricing

The Postal Service is eliminating FSS specific price structures for Bound Printed Matter Flats. FSS preparation will still be required, and all FSS marking requirements will remain in place. Bound Printed Matter flat pieces included in an FSS scheme bundle will qualify for the zone and entry piece pricing and pound pricing applicable to the mailing piece before inclusion in the FSS scheme pool. If an FSS container is drop shipped to a DFSS facility, those pieces will receive DSCF pricing.

Standard Mail — Combine AADC and 3 Digit Automation Sorts for Letters into One Sort Level

Currently, there are four presort levels for Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Automation Letters: Mixed AADC Automation Letters, AADC Automation Letters, 3-Digit Automation Letters, and 5-Digit Automation Letters. To simplify the pricing structure, the Postal Service implemented the same price for AADC Automation Letters and 3-Digit Automation Letters in Docket No. R2013-1. The

Postal Service is combining these two presort levels (AADC and 3-Digit) into one new sortation which will be named AADC.

Standard Mail — Increase the Weight Standard for Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Nonautomation Machinable Letters from up to 3.3 ounces to up to 3.5 ounces

Currently, the “up to” weight standard for Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Machinable Letters is 3.3 ounces. This lower “weight break” is no longer needed due to improvements in mail processing equipment. Since machinable letters must follow the standards for Automation Letters (except for the IMb standards), the weight maximum should also apply. Accordingly, the Postal Service will increase the weight maximum from 3.3 ounces to 3.5 ounces. This change does not include Standard Mail Ride-Along mailpieces which are capped at 3.3 ounces and inserted into a host Periodicals mailpiece.

It is important that both the Industry and the Postal Service evaluate the effects of higher weight breaks for First-Class Mail® automation letters and cards along with Standard Mail letters. Collaboration and feedback throughout calendar year 2017 will be critical in helping to determine whether higher weights cause processing or address quality metrics to be put at risk.

Standard Mail — Reduce the Number of Simple Sample Tiers

There are currently six volume tiers for Standard Mail Commercial and Nonprofit Simple Samples. Based on the volume thresholds currently used by most customers, the Postal Service will collapse the existing six tiers into two new tiers: volumes up to and including 200,000 pieces, and volumes greater than 200,000 pieces.

Standard Mail — Eliminate Flat Sequencing System (FSS) Pricing

The Postal Service will eliminate the FSS-specific price structures within Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit. FSS preparation will still be required and all FSS marking requirements will remain intact.

Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit flats properly included in a FSS scheme pool will qualify for the price applied prior to the FSS scheme pool with the following exceptions:

1. A carrier route mailpiece in an FSS bundle on an FSS scheme pallet will receive the Basic CR-Bundles/Pallet price, and
2. A carrier route mailpiece in a FSS bundle on an FSS facility pallet will receive the Basic CR price.

If an FSS pallet is drop shipped to a DFSS facility, those pieces will receive DSCF pricing.

Standard Mail — Increase Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Flats, Nonautomation Letters, and Nonmachinable Letters Piece-Price Weight Break Structure from 3.3 ounces to 4.0 ounces

The current piece/pound price structure for Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Flats, Nonautomation Letters, and Nonmachinable Letters does not provide a simple, clear view of the actual price of a mailing, especially if it includes nonidentical-weight pieces between 3.3 and 4 ounces. The Postal Service will increase the piece price weight break structure from 3.3 ounces to 4.0 ounces for Standard Mail and Standard Mail Nonprofit Flats, and Nonautomation and Nonmachinable Letters. Pieces up to 4 ounces will pay the same price and a pound price will apply over 4 ounces. This will not include Nonautomation Machinable Letters.

Extra Services (Returns Simplification) — Eliminate BRM Parcels Permit and Account Maintenance Fee

Business Reply Mail® (BRM) currently consists of letters, flats, and parcels. Occasionally, BRM customers may choose to use Business Reply Mail for return parcels because they possess a BRM permit for inbound correspondence. The Postal Service will waive the annual permit fee for those customers using BRM exclusively for return parcels. This will align BRM parcels with other returns products. BRM permit fees for letters and flats, and for weight-averaged BRM letters, flats, and parcels, will remain.

Extra Services — Eliminate QBRM Permit Fees

The Postal Service is also eliminating the annual permit fees for Business Reply customers who use only QBRM Basic and High Volume Qualified for letters and cards. All other fees and postage pricing remain intact.

Extra Services — Shipping Services Permit Fees

The Postal Service will eliminate the fees for certain outbound and return permits used for parcel shipments, including associated annual account maintenance fees. This will streamline the application and returns process, and eliminate the need to pay permit application fees for additional entry points. Shipping Products included under this umbrella are outbound shipments of Priority Mail Express®, Priority Mail®, First-Class Package Service®, Parcel Select® (including Parcel Select Lightweight®), Bound Printed Matter (parcels only), Media Mail®, and Library Mail, as well as for return shipments of MRS, Parcel Return Service, and BRM (parcels only).

Extra Services (Address Correction) — Adjust Standard Mail Forwarding Fee to 2 Decimal Places

Standard Mail letters and flats mailers that use this service are charged the Forwarding Fee via Address Correction Service (ACS) billing which is managed by the ACS Department of Address Management Systems in Memphis, TN. The ACS data file, Shipping Notice data file, and the Invoice data file have an implied decimal position that is conducive to 2-decimal places for address correction services. When mailers use these files to track their ACS fees and costs, they must recognize that the Forwarded Fee product codes have an implied 3-decimal place price and must manipulate the data files provided to them through ACS so that the decimal place differences are recognized in all of the data files provided via ACS. This would adjust the Standard Mail Forwarding Fee to 2-decimal point places to allow mailers to track their ACS fees and costs without making adjustments for the Forwarding Fees.

Extra Services — Money Order Redemption Period

To be consistent with Banking Industry Standards and other companies' comparable money order offerings, the Postal Service will change the time limit for claims for improper payment to a limit of one year. This language will be updated on the reverse side of the domestic and international money order form so the purchaser is aware of the time limit.

Extra Services — Enterprise PO Boxes Online (ePOBOL) Payment Process Change

The Postal Service plans to allow Enterprise PO Boxes Online customers to modify their current payment period to align their multiple PO Boxes™, Caller Service, and Reserve payments to one due date per year, when using an Enterprise Payment Account (EPA). Eligible customers will be allowed to pay pro-rated fees on a one-time basis to align all payments to a selected annual renewal date in the future. This method is optional and will be available for all of an eligible customer's PO Boxes and Caller Service numbers. When the true-up date is reached they will continue to pay for the 12-month term as committed when first enrolled in the Enterprise Payment Account.

Extra Services — OMAS Stamp Delivery Fee for Federal Agencies Ordering Stamps from the Stamp Fulfillment Center

Federal agencies have the option today to order stamps from the USPS® Stamp Fulfillment Services in Kansas City and to pay for the stamps through their Official Mail Accounting System (OMAS) accounts. It has been a long-standing practice to charge customers other than federal agencies a nominal handling fee for all purchases ordered

through Stamp Fulfillment Services. Beginning January 1, 2017, these fees will apply to federal agencies using OMAS.

For three or more pieces with extra or accountable services presented for mailing at one time, the mailer uses PS Form 3877 (firm sheet) or USPS-approved privately printed firm sheets (see 1.7.2) in lieu of the receipt portion of the individual form. All entries made on firm sheets must be computer generated or made by typewriter, ink, or ballpoint pen. Alterations must be initialed by the mailer and accepting employee. Obliterate all unused portions of the addressee column with a diagonal line. USPS-approved privately printed firm sheets that contain the same information as PS Form 3877 may be approved by the local Postmaster or manager Business Mail Entry. The mailer may omit columns from privately printed PS Form 3877 that are not applicable to extra service requested. If the mailer wants the firm sheets receipted by the USPS (postmarked), the mailer must present the firm sheets with the articles to be mailed at a Post Office. The postmarked firm sheets become the mailer's receipts.

For Registered Mail and COD (when Label 3816 is used), the mailer submits the forms in duplicate and receives one copy as a mailing receipt after the entries are verified by the postal employee accepting the mailing. Except for Registered Mail and COD items, the USPS keeps no mailing records for mailpieces bearing extra services.

Mailings that include 10 or more pieces of USPS Marketing Mail flats, 6 or more pieces of Periodicals flats, or 10 or more pieces (or 10 or more pounds) of BPM flats to an FSS scheme must be separated/pooled into FSS scheme bundles. The Postal Service also recommends the use of authorized flat trays in lieu of sacks for FSS bundles. FSS scheme bundles that are not required to be placed in a FSS scheme or FSS facility container are combined with bundles of non-FSS sorted bundles and placed on an applicable SCF, 3-digit, or NDC

container. Mailers must prepare FSS scheme qualifying mailpieces for each individual FSS scheme combination, and then prepare bundles of uniform size from those pieces. Mailings (excluding saturation mailings of USPS Marketing Mail) with nonpresorted BPM flats may be included in FSS preparation, but will not be eligible for presorted or carrier route prices. Mailpieces that meet the eligibility standards for 5-digit or 3-digit automation, 5-digit or 3-digit nonautomation, carrier route (except USPS Marketing Mail saturation) or presort will continue to be eligible for those piece prices when prepared in accordance with the FSS preparations standards. Mailpieces and bundles must also be prepared as follows:

FSS scheme or facility sacks or trays will be assessed the 3-Digit/SCF Sack/Tray price. Pallets, sacks, and trays entered at a DFSS will claim the DSCF entry price.
- c. The Outside-County pound price for mail entered at a DFSS will be the DSCF price. The Inside-County price will claim prices for the "None" entry level.
- d. Mailers must provide standardized presort documentation under 708.1.0 that demonstrates eligibility for prices in accordance with 207.14.0 and 207.25.0.
- e. Each mailpiece must be identified with an optional endorsement line in accordance with Exhibit 708.7.1.1, or when authorized, using a red Label 5 SCH barcoded pressure-sensitive bundle label.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Reserved for future use.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an MPO or DPO ZIP Code. If mailed using Priority Mail Express service, mailpieces requiring a customs form that are addressed to or from an MPO or DPO location must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., nonnegotiable documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an MPO except for those MPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
 - If mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.

S. Synthetic cannabinoids used to stimulate the central nervous system commonly known as "synthetic marijuana," "K2," or "Spice" are prohibited.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items only. This restriction also applies to Official Mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and

their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. IMM Revision: Individual Country Listing for Egypt

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise the Individual Country Listing (ICL) for Egypt in *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) to reflect that Egypt is prohibiting postal items containing liquids or lithium batteries, whether sent directly or in transit. Although not included in the IMM until January 22, 2017, these changes are already in effect.

This ICL revision is a result of a formal request made through the Universal Postal Union (UPU) via International Bureau Circular 179, dated November 14, 2016.

IMM Revision: Preparation Requirements for Priority Mail Express International Shipments

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) to reflect updated mail preparation requirements for Priority Mail Express International® shipments. Revisions will appear in Exhibit 123.61, section 222.4, and all Individual Country Listings (ICLs) for countries that accept Priority Mail Express International service.

In the article “IMM Revision: Preparation Requirements for Priority Mail Express International Shipments” in *Postal Bulletin* 22375 (10-31-13, pages 17-19), we incorporated mailing standards for the July 2013 edition of PS Form 2976-B, *Priority Mail Express International Shipping Label and Customs Form* and announced that Label 11-B, *Express Mail Post Office to Addressee* would no longer be authorized for Priority Mail Express International shipments. In the articles “IMM Revision: Preparation Requirements for Priority Mail Express Shipments” and “DMM Revision: Mandatory Use of Customs Declaration PS Form 2976-B on APO/FPO/DPO Priority Mail Express” in *Postal Bulletin* 22418 (6-25-15, pages 7–11 and page 6, respectively), we continued the work begun in the 2013 article and made PS Form 2976-B mandatory for all Priority Mail Express International shipments that require a customs form. Now, in this article, we are completing the transition and revising the IMM to indicate that all Priority Mail Express International shipments must carry a PS Form 2976-B, regardless of weight, value, or contents.

In conjunction with the IMM revisions, we are making PS Form 2976-B mandatory for all Priority Mail Express® shipments to and from APO/FPO/DPO addresses, regardless of weight, value, or contents — see the article “DMM Revision: Customs Declaration Form PS Form 2976-B Mandatory for Use on All APO/FPO/DPO Priority Mail Express — Use of PS Form 2976-R Delayed” in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin*.

Effective Pay Period 01-2017, payroll checks will reflect changes in the withholding of federal taxes. All information in this article is based on Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Notice 1036, revised December 2016. The Early Release Copies of the Percentage Method Tables for Income Tax Withholding will appear in the IRS Publication 15 (Circular E), *Employer's Tax Guide*.

The biweekly personal exemption value for each federal tax allowance remains at \$155.80 per allowance. The dollar amounts for the withholding tables have changed. The existing withholding rates (10%, 15%, 25%, 28%, 33%, 35%, and 39.6%) did not change.

Contributions made by employees to the following are treated as pretax monies for federal tax computations:

- Commuter Program (CPP) up to the transit/parking pretax limits.

- Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).
- Health Benefits (HB):

- Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB), unless employee declined the pretax benefit.
- USPS Health Benefits (USPS HB), only if employee opted for pretax contributions.
- Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA).
- Health Savings Account (HSA).
- Traditional Thrift Savings Plan (TSP).

When calculating your federal taxes, remember to subtract from your gross earnings your withholding allowance amount as well as these pretax contribution amounts to determine your federal taxable wage amount.

Upon submission of your federal tax return, you are urged to review your federal tax withholdings particularly if you owed a significant amount of money or were due a large refund. If necessary, update your Federal Form W-4 (Employee’s Withholding Allowance Certificate).

To determine the amount of withholding, follow steps 1 through 10:

1. Determine biweekly gross wages from earnings statement.
2. Determine biweekly Traditional TSP employee contributions from earnings statement.
3. Determine biweekly FSA contributions from earnings statement. If applicable, add the amounts from both the FSA Dependent Child (FSADC) Sub-Account and the FSA Health Care (FSAHC) Sub-Account.
4. Determine biweekly FEHB pretax employee contribution from earnings statement (abbreviated as HP).
5. Determine biweekly USPS HB pretax employee contribution from earnings statement. **Note:** Generally USPS HB contributions are treated as post-tax monies.
6. Determine biweekly CPP employee contributions from earnings statement.
7. Determine biweekly FEDVIP employee contributions from earnings statement.
8. Determine biweekly HSA contributions from earnings statement.
9. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the biweekly exemption value of \$155.80 (withholding allowance). The federal tax line on the earnings statement shows the number of exemptions claimed (e.g., S1 = single with one exemption, M3 = married with three exemptions).
10. Subtract the amounts in step 2 (Traditional TSP), step 3 (FSA), step 4 (FEHB), step 5 (USPS HB), only if

pretax), step 6 (CPP), step 7 (FEDVIP), step 8 (HSA) and step 9 (exemptions) from step 1 (biweekly gross wages). The balance is the amount subject to withholding.

11. Determine into which range this amount falls on the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table; follow the instructions listed in the table.

The following is an example of how to compute federal income taxes for a Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) employee who claims married with three exemptions, and makes pretax contributions to the TSP, FSA, FEHB, CPP, and FEDVIP.

A FERS employee receives \$3,826.35 as biweekly gross wages. The employee makes the following contributions: 11 percent of basic earnings (for this example, all of the gross \$ is basic; basic X 0.11 = \$420.90) per pay period (PP) to TSP; \$65 per PP to FSADC; \$95 per PP to FSAHC; \$148.46 per PP to FEHB, \$105 for this PP to the CPP; and \$57.23 per PP to the GEHA PPO High Option Dental Premium. The employee claims “married” with three exemptions (M3 on the federal tax line of the earnings statement). Using the information provided in the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table in this article, federal taxes are computed as follows:

Biweekly gross wages	\$3,826.35
Minus Traditional Thrift Savings Plan contributions	-420.90
Minus Flexible Spending Account Dependent Care contributions	-65.00
Minus Flexible Spending Account Health Care contributions	-95.00
Minus Federal Employees Health Benefits contributions	-148.46
Minus Commuter Program pretax contributions	-105.00
Minus Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program contributions	-57.23
Minus Exemptions (3 x \$155.80)	-467.40
Amount of wages subject to withholding	\$2,467.36

To complete the computation, refer to the Married/ Biweekly segment of the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table. The amount of wages subject to withholding (\$2,467.36) falls within the “over \$1,050 but not over \$3,252*” range. Using the information provided within that range, the final computation is as follows:

Amount subject to withholding	\$2,467.36
Subtract \$1,050 from \$2,467.36	1,417.36
Multiply \$1,417.36 by .15 (15%)	212.60
Add from the table	71.70
Add \$212.60 and \$71.70	284.30
Total federal income tax* that should be withheld from this employee’s biweekly check	\$284.30

* Rounding may vary this total by a few cents.

Federal Taxation Percentages for Supplemental Wages

USPS® employees are reminded that the percentages used to tax supplemental wages are different from the normal taxation percentages. Supplemental wages may include, but are not limited to, annual leave exchange, awards, back-pay awards, prizes, severance pay, and reimbursements for moving expenses. *The American Jobs Creation Act of 2004* and Section 31.3402(g)-1 of IRS regulations created a two-tiered taxation rate for supplemental wages, effective January 1, 2005. These regulations apply to all supplemental payments received by USPS employees in the United States, as well as the U.S. territories.

With the passage of the *American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012* (H.R.8), the marginal income tax rate for high-income

taxpayers was increased for wages paid on and after January 1, 2013.

Current regulations provide for taxation of supplemental wages up to a total of 1 million dollars within a calendar year at a *mandatory* withholding rate of 25 percent. Regulations also provide for a *mandatory* withholding rate of 39.6 percent (or the highest rate of income tax for the year) for any supplemental wages paid in excess of 1 million dollars within a calendar year. These regulations remain in effect until taxation percentages are once again changed by Congress and the IRS.

Foreign-issued (exchanged) IRCs (pictured below) with an expiration date of December 31, 2017, are the only version that will be accepted by SFS.

- The redemption rates for all foreign-issued exchanged IRCs with an expiration date of December 31, 2017, are based on the **round date stamp** (on the right hand side of the coupon) and are acceptable for return to the SFS.

Do not send in any IRCs with an expiration date of December 31, 2013 or earlier to SFS for any reason. Follow the procedures below:

- Expiration dates are printed on the back of the IRCs.
- IRCs with an expiration date on or before December 31, 2013, that were not returned as advised in past *Postal Bulletin* articles, must be removed from the unit inventory, destroyed locally (no value), and posted as a shortage (AIC 767) to the unit reserve stock inventory. RSS units must enter a count in the “Count Inventory and Cash” workflow; select “Close Credit/Transfer to Another Employee”.
- Unit reserve custodians may submit a claim for loss to the District Finance Manager following procedures in Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, subchapter 8-7, Claim for Loss. Upon receipt of an approved claim for loss, clear the stamp credit shortage (AIC 367) and offset to AIC 633, Claim for Loss; use Reason Code 10, Uncollectible Employee Items.

Submission Instructions

- Bind exchanged foreign-issued IRCs in bundles of 100 or less.
- Bind U.S.-issued refunded IRCs in packages of 100 or less (separate from exchanged foreign-issued IRCs).
- Prepare PS Form 17 (May 2007) in triplicate and annotate "IRC Return."
- Include a shipment number or the shipment will be returned to the originating unit. Include the Destruction SFS finance number (receiving unit location ID).

Migratory Bird stamps or any other stock will **not** be accepted at this time; stock will only be accepted during your regular destruction schedule. IRCs need to be sent in separately.

Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS)

SFS will be responsible for the consolidation and batching of the IRCs from the PRUs. SFS will send via email a notice of the IRCs to be exchanged to the St. Louis ASC International Accounting Branch (IAB) by February 28 of each calendar year.

The IRC notice will be sent to the International Accounting Management Team at the following email address: IAMgmt@usps.gov.

The notice will provide the quantity of IRCs to be exchanged and the number of boxes to be returned to the UPU International Bureau. SFS will be responsible for the shipment of the exchanged IRCs to the UPU International Bureau.

Once the completed IRC Cover Letter, CN 03 form, and the Shipping Information packing list is received from the St. Louis ASC International Accounting Branch, SFS will prepare the IRCs to be exchanged for shipment.

The IRCs will be shipped Priority Mail Express International[®] with Customs Declaration, PS Form 2976-B, *Priority Mail Express International Shipping*, and PS Form 2865, *Return Receipt for International Mail*.

The IRCs will be returned in accordance with the Letter Post Manual, International reply coupons, currently Article RL 146 of the 2014-2017 Letter Post Manual.

Once the funds have been identified, IAB will create a manual invoice.

Once the manual invoice is created in accordance with IAB procedures, settlement will clear the receipt.

Information Security

It's that Time of Year — CyberSafe at USPS Training Courses are Here!

As a part of the FY 2017 Strategic Training Initiative (STI), the Corporate Information Security Office (CISO) released four CyberSafe at USPS™ training courses in the Learning Management System (LMS). We require all identified employees and strongly encourage contractors to complete the training courses, which educate learners on information and cybersecurity leading practices.

The following provides a brief overview and completion deadlines for each of the courses:

CyberSafe 101: Passwords and Phishing (Course #10025917): Presents basic tips for creating strong passwords and avoiding phishing traps to help protect USPS® information assets. **Completion Deadline:** 2-28-17

CyberSafe 201: Data Protection (Course #10025918): Provides best practices for handling sensitive and sensitive-enhanced information to keep USPS information assets secure. **Completion Deadline:** 2-28-17

NEW CyberSafe 102: Workstation Safety (Course #10025921): Focuses on workstation safety methods to effectively protect the Postal Service™ network, such as securing USPS devices, avoiding computer misuse, and applying USPS data protection techniques when telecommuting or during travel. **Completion Deadline:** 6-30-17

NEW CyberSafe 103: Protection from Malware (Course #10025923): Describes the various forms of malware, techniques to safeguard computers from harmful software, and methods to protect personal and USPS information. **Completion Deadline:** 9-15-17

eAccess identified all employees required to complete the courses based on their role. Using the listed course numbers, learners can search for and complete these training courses in the LMS before they are formally enrolled via eAccess in January. All identified **employees** are **required** to complete the courses by the associated deadlines. Failure to complete the courses by the deadlines will result in limited ACE system access until successful completion. Please note these courses are an annual requirement and must be completed each fiscal year.

All active **contractors** with an ACE ID are **strongly encouraged** to complete these courses by the completion deadline.

Ring In the New Year with Information Security Resolutions

What can you do to keep Postal Service™ networks, systems, and resources secure in 2017? As 2016 comes to a close, this is a question all employees should keep in mind to protect the organization from cyber harm.

The Postal Service faces over 257 billion unauthorized attempts to access its networks each month.¹ Although the Postal Service has successfully combatted billions of cyber threats, it is important to be prepared for new, more com-

plex attacks which are expected to arise in the coming year. These include:

- **Phishing** – Phishing attempts are typically conducted through emails. They can be identified by looking for an unknown sender, suspicious links or URLs, requests for immediate action (i.e., requests for credit card or account information), and misspellings and/or grammatical errors.

- **Mobile Devices** – Cyber threats are not unique to computers or laptops. Hackers also use text messages to send malicious links or attachments. Think carefully before downloading attachments or clicking on links sent to your mobile device, especially if they come from an unknown sender.
- **Ransomware** – Hackers use ransomware to hold your computer “hostage” (i.e., lock you out of your device and/or files) until a sum of money is paid. To prevent a ransomware attack, exercise caution when clicking on pop-up advertisements or unknown websites and links.

You can help protect the Postal Service from cyber threats by exercising cybersafe behaviors and reporting suspicious activity. In an increasingly dangerous cyber environment, it is important that employees remain vigilant and exercise caution online. One wrong click by an

employee can jeopardize the full scope of the Postal Service network. To protect against cyber threats, always report all suspicious activity, even if you’re not sure if it poses a threat.

Suspicious activity should be reported to the CyberSecurity Operations Center (CSOC) at CyberSafe@usps.gov. International Mail

Changes to Pricing for International Mailing Services

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise prices for the international mailing services noted below.

The following information is based on Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) Order No. 3610 issued on November 15, 2016, in Docket No. R2017-1. In that order, the PRC found that the First-Class Mail® (including First-Class Mail International®), Standard Mail®, Periodicals, and Package Services pricing proposals in the Postal Service’s Request may go into effect on January 22, 2017. The PRC approved the revisions to international extra services and fees in Order No. 3670 issued on December 15, 2016, in Docket No. R2017-1, and those prices may go into effect on January 22, 2017. The orders are available on the PRC website at www.prc.gov.

First-Class Mail International Service

We will not increase prices for single-piece First-Class Mail International letters, postcards, and flats. The price of a single-piece 1-ounce letter will continue to be \$1.15. The First-Class Mail International letter nonmachinable surcharge will not increase.

International Extra Services and Fees

The Postal Service will increase prices for certain market-dominant international extra services on January 22, 2017, including the following:

- **Certificate of Mailing service:** Prices for certificate of mailing service are increasing — the overall price increase is 5.64 percent.
- **Registered Mail™ service:** The price for international Registered Mail service is increasing to \$14.95.
- **Return Receipt service:** The price for international return receipt service is increasing to \$3.85.
- **Customs Clearance and Delivery Fee:** The Customs Clearance and Delivery Fee is increasing to \$6.00.
- **International Business Reply Service (IBRS):** The price for IBRS cards is increasing to \$1.35, and the price for IBRS envelopes is increasing to \$1.85.

Changes to Pricing for International Shipping Services

Effective January 22, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise Notice 123, Price List, to reflect changes to the prices for international shipping services noted below. The Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) issued Order No. 3622 in Docket No. CP2017-20 on November 18, 2016, approving the price adjustments to the following services:

- Global Express Guaranteed® (GXG®).
- International Priority Airmail® (IPA®).
- International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®).
- Direct Sacks of Printed Matter to One Addressee (Airmail M-bag®).
- International Extra Services:
 - Priority Mail Express International® (PMEI) Insurance.
 - Priority Mail International® (PMI) Insurance.
 - Registered Mail™ service.
 - International Postal Money Orders.
 - Pickup on Demand® service.
- Priority Mail International® (PMI) ISC Zone Chart subscription fee.

Global Express Guaranteed

Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) service provides fast international shipping with international transportation and delivery provided by FedEx Express®. The price increase for GXG service averages 4.9 percent.

The Postal Service continues to provide Commercial Base™ pricing to online customers who prepare and pay for GXG shipments via USPS-approved payment methods (with the exception of Click-N-Ship® service), with variable discounts up to 5 percent off the published retail prices for GXG.

The Postal Service also continues to offer Commercial Plus™ pricing incentives for large volume customers who commit to tendering \$100,000 in annual postal revenue from GXG service, PMEI service, PMI service, and First-Class Package International Service® (FCPIS®) via USPS-approved payment methods, with variable discounts up to 5 percent off the published retail prices for GXG service.

International Priority Airmail and International Surface Air Lift

The structure of IPA and ISAL price categories will continue to be priced by the current 20 price groups (“worldwide” and 19 country price groups) and applicable mail shapes (letters and postcards, large envelopes [flats], and packages [small packets and rolls]). These categories correspond to the Universal Postal Convention requirements

to use shape-based pricing. For IPA and ISAL service, the Postal Service offers incentive pricing through international Negotiated Service Agreements (NSAs).

IPA service, including IPA M-bag® service, is a bulk commercial service that provides business mailers with rapid and economical worldwide delivery for volume mailings of First-Class Mail International® postcards, letters, large envelopes (flats), and FCPIS packages (small packets) weighing up to a maximum 4.4 pounds. IPA is dispatched to the destination country where it is entered into the postal administration’s air or surface priority mail system for delivery. The overall price increase for IPA service averages 3.8 percent; published prices increase 3.8 percent for IPA service and 3.9 percent for IPA M-bag service.

ISAL service, including ISAL M-bag service, is a bulk commercial service that provides economical worldwide delivery to business mailers of volume mailings of all First-Class Mail International postcards, letters, large envelopes (flats), and FCPIS packages (small packets) weighing up to 4.4 pounds. ISAL is dispatched to the destination country, where it is then entered into the postal administration’s surface nonpriority network. The overall price increase for ISAL service averages 3.8 percent; published prices increase 3.8 percent for ISAL service and 3.9 percent for ISAL M-bag service.

Direct Sacks of Printed Matter to One Addressee (Airmail M-bags)

Airmail M-bags are direct sacks of printed matter sent to a single foreign addressee at a single address. Prices are based on the weight of the sack. The price increase for Airmail M-bags averages 4.9 percent.

International Extra Services

Depending on country destination and mail type, customers may add a variety of extra services to their outbound shipments. Prices for some of these extra services are increasing.

For our competitive offerings, we revised the prices for the following international extra services.

- *PMEI Insurance and PMI Insurance:* The price for PMEI Insurance and PMI insurance increases an average of 4.7 percent.
- *Registered Mail:* The price for Registered Mail service increases 7.2 percent.
- *International Postal Money Orders:* The price for International Postal Money Orders increases 73.7 percent.
- *Pickup on Demand:* The price for Pickup on Demand increases 10 percent.

- *Priority Mail International ISC Zone Chart Subscription Fee:* The price for a subscription to the PMI ISC Zone Chart increases 7.94 percent.

Stamp Announcement 17-03: U.S. Flag Stamp

On January 27, 2017, in Norcross, GA, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *U.S. Flag* First-Class Mail® stamp (Forever® priced at 49 cents), in one design. The formats available are a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) booklet of 10 stamps (Item 674700) produced by security printer Banknote Corporation of America (BCA), a PSA booklet of 20 stamps (Item 672000) produced by security printers BCA and Ashton Potter (USA) Ltd. (APU), a PSA coil of 100 stamps (Item 749800) produced by security printers BCA and APU, and a PSA Automated teller machine (ATM) sheetlet of 18 stamps (Item 564400).

The stamp will go on sale nationwide January 27, 2017.

With the new *U.S. Flag* stamp, the Postal Service™ continues its tradition of celebrating patriotism with one of the most recognizable symbols of our nation. The stamp, sold in booklets of 10 and 20, coils of 100, and an ATM sheetlet of 18, features a detail from a photograph of the billowing Stars and Stripes. Terrence W. McCaffrey was the art director of the project and Greg Breeding designed the stamp with an existing photograph of the flag taken by Tom Grill.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at <http://www.usps.com/shop>, or by calling 800-782-6724. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. All orders must be postmarked by March 27, 2017.

How to Order First-Day Covers

The Postal Service also offers first-day covers for new stamp issues and Postal Service stationery items post-marked with the official first-day-of-issue cancellation. 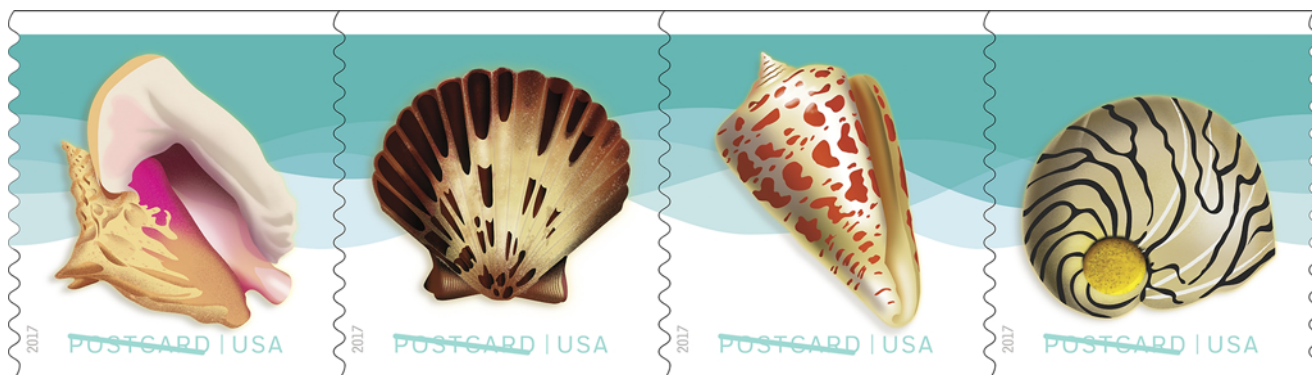

On January 28, 2017, in San Diego, CA, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Seashells* Postcard Rate stamps (Non-denominated, priced at 34 cents) in four designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 119600) and a PSA coil of 100 stamps (Item 749900).

The stamps will go on sale nationwide January 28, 2017.

Four new postcard stamps celebrate the wonder of seashells. Each stamp depicts one iconic shell found in North American waters: the alphabet cone, the Pacific calico scallop, the zebra nerite, and the Queen conch, commonly known as the pink conch. The highly stylized stamp art expresses a lighthearted, artistic view of shells. The horizontal swaths of white and blue in the background suggest waves washing the shells onto a beach. Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamps. Sergio Baradat created the stamp art.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

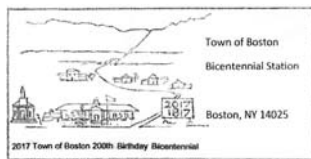
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
