The Postal Service recommends customers in the U.S. visit a Post Office™ location no later than the dates in the table shown here for expected delivery by December 25 to Air/Army Post Offices/Fleet Post Offices/Diplomatic Post Offices (APOs/FPOs/DPOs) and domestic addresses*. Military Mail

To send packages to loved ones serving in the military abroad, the Postal Service offers a discounted price of \$18.45 on its largest Priority Mail Flat Rate® box. The price includes a \$1.50 per box discount for mail sent to APO/FPO/DPO destinations worldwide.

Priority Mail Flat Rate boxes are available at no cost at local Post Offices or customers can order them online at usps.com/freeboxes. Customers may print postage, labels,

and customs forms online anytime using Click-N-Ship® at usps.com/ship.

To ensure timely delivery of holiday wishes by December 25, 2019, the Postal Service recommends that you send cards and packages to military APO/FPO/DPO addresses overseas no later than the mailing dates listed in the following table:

1. PMEMS is available to selected military/diplomatic Post Offices. Check with your local Post Office to determine if this service is available to an APO/FPO/DPO address.
2. PAL is a service that provides air transportation for parcels on a space-available basis. It is available for USPS Retail Ground items not exceeding 30 pounds in weight or 60 inches in length and girth combined. The customer must pay the applicable PAL fee in addition to the regular surface price for each addressed piece sent by PAL service.
3. Customers pay for SAM parcels at USPS Retail Ground prices with maximum weight and size limits of 15 pounds and 60 inches in length and girth combined. SAM parcels are first transported domestically by surface and then to overseas destinations by air on a space-available basis.

Military Care Kit

The Postal Service has created a free Military Care Kit based on the items most frequently requested by military families. The kit contains:

1. Two Priority Mail APO/FPO/DPO Flat Rate boxes,
2. Two Priority Mail Medium Flat Rate boxes,
3. Priority Mail tape,
4. Priority Mail address labels, and
5. Appropriate customs forms.

To order the kit, call 800-610-8734. You can find guidelines for packing, addressing, and shipping items to U.S. troops at usps.com/ship/apo-fpo-dpo.htm. To order flat rate boxes featuring the “America Supports You” logo, go to usps.com/freeboxes.

Addressing the Package

Use the following directions to properly address your military mail package:

- Write out the service member’s full name.
- Include the unit and APO/FPO/DPO address with the 9-digit ZIP Code™ (if one is assigned).

- Do not write the country name where the service member is stationed in the address.
- Include a return address.
- Inside the box, include the service member’s name and address as well as the sender’s name and address on an index card in case the shipping label gets damaged in transit.

Busiest Mailing and Delivery Days

Our busiest time is now 2 weeks before Christmas. Starting the week of December 9, customer traffic is expected to increase. The Postal Service predicts that the week of December 16–22 will be the busiest mailing, shipping, and delivery week for the holidays.

Skip the Trip and Ship Online

The Postal Service anticipates December 16 will be the busiest day online with more than 8.5 million customers predicted to visit usps.com for help shipping that special holiday gift. And usps.com is always open.

The Click-N-Ship feature (usps.com) and other online services allow customers to order free Priority Mail boxes*, print shipping labels, purchase postage, and even request free next-day Package Pickup**.

* Boxes are delivered in the U.S. with regular mail usually within 7 to 10 business days. Exclusions apply. For details and to order, visit store.usps.com/store.

New Stamped Package Rule

There have been some changes made to how you can ship your packages this year. For safety reasons, as of October 1, the Postal Service will no longer accept stamped packages — which means using individual stamps as postage — that are more than one-half inch thick and/or weighing more than 10 ounces into blue collection boxes, building mail chutes, or Post Office mail slots. This restriction also applies to all other mailpieces, apart from packages, using individual stamps as postage that are more than one-half inch thick and/or weighing more than 10 ounces.

Instead, you must go to a retail counter or use the self-service kiosk to purchase a postage label. If you opt to use the kiosk to buy a postage label, you can drop your package in the package slots, not the mail slots, at a Post Office. If a restricted package or mailpiece is found in a collection box, mail chute, or lobby mail slot after October 1, it will be returned to sender with a Customer Return Label attached explaining the restrictions and reason for return.

Click-N-Ship customers are unaffected by this change.

Other 2019 Updates

- We will offer an expanded package delivery window — delivery in the morning, afternoon, early evening, and on Sundays where volume warrants.
- We have expanded our capacity by adding new equipment:
 - 20 automated package bundle sorters with more than 400 additional separations.
 - 16 universal sorters.
 - 5 package feed systems.
 - 6 robust bulk unloading systems.
 - 18 automatic tray unsleavers.
 - 6 sack shakeout systems.
 - 9 bed load/unload systems.
 - 40 overhead scanning systems.

Custom Solutions for Sending Holiday Packages

The Postal Service is uniquely qualified to deliver the holidays by offering a variety of custom solutions designed to make sending holiday packages easy:

- Packages that have stamps as postage and are more than one-half inch thick and/or weighing more than 10 ounces *must* be taken to a retail counter for drop off. Alternatively, customers can use a self-service kiosk for a postage label and drop off the package in a Post Office package slot, *not* a mail slot.
- Get free Priority Mail and Priority Mail Express boxes and envelopes in Post Offices or online at usps.com/freeboxes.
- Skip the line and use self-service kiosks located in larger Post Offices to weigh, pay postage, and deposit your packages.
- Use Click-N-Ship online at usps.com/ship to create shipping labels with USPS Tracking®, pay postage, or use flat rate shipping products to avoid weighing packages.
- With free Package Pickup, your package can be handed to your mail carrier on his or her regular delivery route or you can schedule a pickup. For details on availability, visit usps.com/pickup.
- Take your packages to the retail counter at any Post Office.

Custom Solutions to Help With Receiving Holiday Packages

The Postal Service also offers a variety of custom solutions designed to make receiving holiday packages more convenient:

- Informed Delivery® (informedelivery.usps.com/box/pages/intro/start.action) is the free daily digital preview of what is coming to your mailbox. You can see what mail is coming to your mailbox, manage your packages by providing delivery instructions or reschedule delivery online, and see some exterior images of magazines and catalogs — all from your mobile app, dashboard, tablet, or computer.
- Customers can also request the package be held at a Post Office by choosing the Hold for Pickup option in the Informed Delivery app, or online.
- Customers who know they won't be home when a package is delivered can use USPS Package Intercept® (usps.com/manage/package-intercept.htm). Before delivery, most domestic package shipments can be redirected back to the sender, to a new address (a neighbor, perhaps), or to the Post Office to be held for pickup.

Help Customers Avoid a Shipping Glitch

There are a number of things that customers can do to ensure their holiday mail gets delivered safely and correctly:

- Print addresses clearly and include all address elements, such as apartment numbers and directional information (ex., 123 S. Main St., Apt. 2B).
- Remove batteries from toys, if applicable. Wrap and place them next to the toys in the mailing box. Customers should include new batteries in the unopened, original manufacturer's packaging.
- Place a card inside the package that contains the delivery and return address. This ensures the package can be delivered or returned if the mailing label gets damaged or falls off.
- Never guess a ZIP Code. NO ZIP is better than a WRONG ZIP. Look up a ZIP Code at usps.com under Quick Tools.
- Include both "to" and "from" information on packages and only on one side.
- Do NOT reuse mailing boxes — they weaken in the shipping process.
- Select a box that is strong enough to protect the contents. Priority Mail and Priority Mail Express boxes are free at the local Post Office.
- Leave space for extra cushioning inside. Stuff glass and fragile, hollow items, like vases, with newspaper or packing material, to avoid damage. When mailing framed photographs, take the glass out of the frame and wrap it separately.

2019 Holiday Information

Holiday Advertising Campaign

Our 2019 holiday campaign will feature direct mail, TV, radio, print, digital, and social media promotions highlighting the organization's proud tradition of delivering cheer and value to consumers and businesses.

The first of several TV spots will begin airing in mid to late November and can be viewed on the Postal Service YouTube channel, USPS TV ([youtube.com/user/uspstv/custom](https://www.youtube.com/user/uspstv/custom)). A direct mailpiece with information customers need to know for the holidays will be mailed to more than 100 million homes by Thanksgiving.

Holiday Operating Hours

Post Offices nationwide will be closed on Christmas Day, Wednesday, December 25, and New Year's Day, Wednesday, January 1, 2020. All Post Offices will be open and regular mail delivery will resume on December 26 and January 2.

Some Post Offices *may* have extended hours leading up to the holidays, and limited hours on Christmas Eve, Tuesday, December 24, and New Year's Eve, Tuesday, December 31. Customers should *always* check with their local Post Offices for hours of operation.

As a reminder, blue collection boxes are not serviced on Sundays.

Holiday Hiring

The Postal Service will be hiring seasonal employees across the country to meet operational needs and the needs of our customers. Hiring decisions are made at a local level. Instead of just hiring seasonally, the Postal Service is focusing its resources on actively hiring year-round.

Employee Tipping

All Postal Service employees, including mail carriers, must comply with the Standards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive Branch. Under these federal regulations, carriers may accept a gift worth \$20 or less (this includes store, restaurant, or mall gift cards). However, carriers must never accept cash and cash equivalents, such as checks or gift cards that can be used like credit cards (with Visa, MasterCard, or American Express logos) for any amount.

Carriers and Dogs

The Postal Service asks customers to place their dogs in a separate room before opening the front door to accept packages from carriers. Dogs are protective in nature and may jump through screen doors or squeeze through door openings. Dogs attacked nearly 6,000 carriers last year. We want everyone to go home safely each day.

USPS Operation Santa®

DMM Revision: Competitive Post Office Box Service

Effective January 26, 2020, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), section 508.4.5.4a.2, to clarify the requirements for customers who use competitive Post Office Box™ services and receive packages from private carriers.

The Postal Service is amending section 508.4.5.4a.2 to clarify that packages received from private carriers must meet all applicable Postal Service standards governing mailability. This clarification will provide consistency with the customer agreement that must be completed to receive one or more of the competitive PO Box™ service enhancements.

Although the Postal Service will not publish these revisions in the DMM until January 26, 2020, the standards are effective immediately.

DMM Revision: Hold Mail Service

Effective January 26, 2020, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), Chapter 508, to add a new section about USPS Hold Mail™ service. New section 508.11.0, “Hold Mail Service,” will be the primary source for consistent standards on USPS Hold Mail service. The information included in new section 508.11.0 codifies current USPS Hold Mail procedures.

Although the Postal Service will not publish these revisions in the DMM until January 26, 2020, the standards are effective immediately.

- Customers who choose to use the street addressing designation also have the option of receiving packages from private carriers at the customer’s Post Office Box address, if the packages comply with applicable Postal Service standards governing mailability (e.g., 70-pound maximum weight; 130 inches length and girth maximum dimension; hazardous, restricted, or perishable matter under Publication 52).

[Add new section 11.0 to read as follows:]

11.0 Hold Mail Service

11.1 General

11.1.1 Description

USPS Hold Mail service provides customers, or an authorized agent (11.1.2), the option to have all mail for an eligible address held at the Post Office for a period of not less than 3 days and not more than 30 days. There is no fee for this optional service.

11.1.2 Authorized Agent

An authorized agent is someone authorized by the customer to act on the individual's behalf. An authorized agent may schedule, change, or cancel, a USPS Hold Mail service request for a particular address as long as the customer can provide the agent with all the information required to complete the request.

11.2 Requesting Hold Mail Service

11.2.1 Online Request

Customers may apply for Hold Mail service online at usps.com. Customers are required to sign in or create a USPS.com account to verify their identity. Online Hold Mail service requests submitted before 2:00 A.M. (Central Time) may begin on the same business day. Online Hold Mail requests submitted after 2:00 A.M. (Central Time) may begin on the next scheduled delivery day.

11.2.2 PS Form 8076 Request

Customers may apply for Hold Mail service by completing PS Form 8076, *Authorization to Hold Mail*, and submitting the form in person to the local Post Office, providing the form to a mail carrier, or by mailing the form. Hold Mail service requests must be accepted by closing time of the Post Office location for the request to be completed by the next scheduled delivery day.

11.2.3 Customer Care Center Request

Customers may apply for Hold Mail service by contacting the Postal Service Customer Care Center at 1-800-ASK-USPS (1-800-275-8777). Hold Mail service requests made by contacting the Customer Care Center must be accepted by the closing time of the Customer Care Center for the request to be completed by the next scheduled delivery day.

11.2.4 Confirmation Number

A confirmation number will be provided only to customers who successfully establish a Hold Mail service request through usps.com or the Customer Care Center.

11.3 Change or Cancel a Request

11.3.1 Change or Cancel a Request Submitted Online

To change or cancel a Hold Mail service request submitted online, customers must go online at usps.com and provide a Hold Mail confirmation number. If a customer cannot provide a Hold Mail confirmation number, that individual must visit the local Post Office and present a form of identification that is acceptable under 608.10.

11.3.2 Change or Cancel a Request Submitted via PS Form 8076

To change or cancel a Hold Mail service request submitted via PS Form 8076, customers must visit their local Post Office and present a form of identification that is acceptable under 608.10.

11.3.3 Change or Cancel a Request Submitted to the Customer Care Center

To change or cancel a Hold Mail service request submitted by contacting the Customer Care Center, customers must contact the Customer Care Center and provide the Hold Mail confirmation number. Without a confirmation number, a Customer Care Center agent can only extend the Hold Mail service request. To change (other than extend) or cancel the Hold Mail service request when the Hold Mail confirmation number is not available, customers must visit their local Post Office location and present a form of identification that is acceptable under 608.10.

11.4 Mail Pick Up or Delivery

Customers have the option to pick up their accumulated mail at their local Post Office location, or have a letter-carrier deliver the accumulated mail on the ending date specified in the Hold Mail service request under the following conditions:

- a. When customers request to pick up their mail, they must present a form of identification that is acceptable under 608.10. Regular mail delivery will resume the next scheduled delivery day after pick up of the accumulated mail.
- b. When customers request to have a letter carrier deliver the accumulated mail, only the mail that will fit in the customer's mail receptacle will be delivered. If the accumulated mail exceeds the mailbox size, a PS Form 3849, *We ReDeliver for You!*, will be left with instructions on pick up or redelivery of the accumulated mail.
- c. Customers must pick up the accumulated mail under items a. and b. within 10 days of the end date of a Hold Mail service request. If the accumulated mail is not picked up within the 10-day period, it will be returned to the sender or securely destructed.

11.5 Hold Mail Service Requested with Active Change-of-Address Order

When Hold Mail service is requested with an active change-of-address (COA) order, it is handled as follows:

- a. If the Hold Mail service request is for the customer's new address, and the customer is residing at a new address, the customer may submit a Hold Mail service request for the new address.
- b. If the Hold Mail service request is for the customer's former address and the customer is still residing at the former address, the COA order must be canceled before the customer can submit a Hold Mail service request for the former address.
- c. If the Hold Mail service request is for the customer's former address and the customer is residing at a new address or a different address, the customer cannot submit a Hold Mail service request for an address where the individual does not reside.

11.6 Change-of-Address Order Requested with Active Hold Mail Service

When a COA order is requested with an active Hold Mail service request, the Hold Mail service request is cancelled and all held mail is forwarded as specified in the COA order.

IMM Revision: Individual Country Listing for United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland

Effective October 24, 2019, the Postal Service™ is revising the Individual Country Listing for United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (United Kingdom) in *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* to note that the United Kingdom is adding a new prohibition for knives and sharp-pointed items.

This revision is based on a formal request that Royal Mail Group made through the Universal Postal Union via *International Bureau Circular 144*, dated September 9, 2019. Although the request noted that the effective date of the change in the United Kingdom is November 1, 2019, the Postal Service is implementing this change effective October 24, 2019, to allow adequate time to transport, process, and deliver items in the United Kingdom that otherwise are subject to return November 1, 2019.

Christmas Pay Procedures for Rural Carriers

The 2019 Christmas period for rural carriers begins Saturday, December 7, 2019 (Week 1, Pay Period (PP) 26-2019), and ends Friday, December 27, 2019 (Week 1, Pay Period 01-2020). During this period, certain timekeeping and pay rules apply. Timekeepers, including postmasters, supervisors, and other employees responsible for rural carrier time and attendance recording, must become familiar with Article 9.2.K., Christmas Allowances and Procedures, of the 2018–2021 USPS/National Rural Letter Carriers' Association (NRLCA) Agreement.

This article describes:

- Types of compensation to which rural carriers are entitled during the Christmas period.
- Related timekeeping procedures and regulations for the Christmas period.
- Special rules that begin with the start of the Guarantee Year (October 12, 2019) and continue through the end of the Christmas period (December 27, 2019).

The preferred method of timekeeping data entry is through the Rural Management Support System (RMSS) web application. The following information provides USPS® guidelines for Rural Carrier compensation during the designated Christmas period:

Overtime During the Christmas Period

Regular Carriers (Des 71) — FLSA B

Types of Overtime

During the Christmas period, regular rural carriers are eligible for two types of overtime — FLSA overtime and Christmas overtime.

FLSA Overtime

FLSA overtime is paid at all times of the year, not just during the Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid FLSA overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Hours worked in excess of 12 hours in a day. If a carrier works more than 12 hours in a day, the amount over 12 is entered in the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week. These hours are calculated automatically when the total weekly work hours are greater than 56, so no separate entries are required.

Christmas Overtime

Christmas Overtime is paid only during the designated Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid Christmas overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Christmas Assistance — This is assistance provided by the regular carrier on his or her relief day. Christmas assistance work hours are entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of the route's evaluation — This is based on the total actual work hours for the week, not on individual days. For example, if a route has a daily evaluation of 9 hours and the regular carrier works 10 hours on 2 days, and 8 hours on the other 3 days, no overtime would be paid. Even though the carrier exceeded the daily evaluation on 2 days of the week, he or she did not exceed the *weekly* evaluation. The weekly evaluation is 45 hours; the carrier worked 44 hours. (See Handbook F-21, section 567, for overtime calculation when leave days are taken during the week and for routes with an evaluation of less than 40 hours.) These hours are calculated automatically, so no separate entries or calculations are required.

Overtime Rate

The overtime rate paid to regular (FLSA Code B) carriers is 150 percent of the carrier's regular rate. The regular rate is determined by dividing the total compensation received for hours actually worked by the carrier since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime), by the total number of hours worked since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime). This overtime rate is used for both FLSA overtime and Christmas overtime.

Replacement Carriers

Replacement Carriers (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, and 79) are only entitled to FLSA overtime. For these employees, FLSA overtime is paid for hours worked in excess of 40 in a week.

Regular Carriers (Des 71) — FLSA A

Regular carriers whose FLSA code is A are paid for actual hours worked, not evaluated hours. They are paid overtime for hours in excess of 8 in a day or 40 in a week. For FLSA Code A carriers, enter hours in excess of 8 in a day to the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314. Hours in excess of 40 in a week are calculated automatically.

Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the **hourly rate** for actual hours worked during PP 26-2019 and Week 1 of PP 01-2020. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route. Overtime is paid only when the carrier exceeds 40 hours for the week.

Christmas Assistance

Christmas assistance is additional service provided on a rural route during the Christmas period. For regular carriers, Christmas assistance applies only to assistance given by the carrier, on his or her relief day, while a replacement carrier is assigned to work the full route. For replacement carriers, it applies to any assistance provided on a regular or auxiliary route during the Christmas period. Christmas assistance is reported in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314 (for regular carriers) or PS Form 1314-A (for replacement carriers).

Regular carriers can perform Christmas assistance only on their relief day. Therefore, only regular carriers assigned to J or K routes may report Christmas assistance. Regular carriers assigned to route types H or M cannot perform Christmas assistance because these route types do not have a relief day. **Note:** There are no provisions for paying a regular carrier for performing service on a Sunday, on an actual holiday, or other than on the assigned route. These situations must be avoided.

Examples of Christmas Assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and helps the replacement carrier case the route.
- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and carries part of his or her regular route. (Replacement carrier is listed on PS Form 1314.)
- A replacement carrier carries part of a regular route due to heavy Christmas volume.

These are **NOT** examples of Christmas assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and cases and carries his or her regular route.
- A regular carrier works 2 hours beyond the daily evaluation of his or her regular route.
- A regular carrier performs any work while assigned to an H or M route.

the assigned route (as is done on a scheduled day), enter DACA Code R, 3, or 5 (as appropriate) on PS Form 1314 for that day. If the carrier is due an X day for working the relief day (e.g., DACA Code R or 3 is entered), this X day must be granted in the same pay period. If the X day is not granted within the same pay period, DACA Code 5 must be entered on PS Form 1314.

- b. Christmas assistance — If a relief carrier serves the assigned route and the regular carrier provides assistance on the relief day, record the hours worked by the regular as Xmas Assist Work Hours. If additional Equipment Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is due for work performed on the relief day, enter the mileage traveled in whole miles in the Route Deviation block for the appropriate week.

B. FLSA Code A Regular Carriers

Regular carriers (FLSA Code A) are paid at the regular rate for all hours worked up to 8 per day and 40 per week, and at the overtime rate for all hours worked in excess of 8 per day or 40 per week. FLSA Code A employees are not entitled to any X days as they are paid for working the relief day.

1. Report total hours worked for the week in Actual Weekly Hours.
2. If the carrier worked more than 8.00 hours in a day, enter total hours worked in excess of 8 for that day in the Daily Overtime block.
3. If the carrier worked on a scheduled relief day, enter R on the day the carrier worked the relief day and include the hours worked in Actual Weekly Hours. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.

C. Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during PP 26-2019 and Week 1 of PP 01-2020. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route (this includes newly hired RCAs in the first five pay periods of training). The only changes to standard timekeeping procedures for auxiliary routes are when a Designation (Des) 79 provides Christmas assistance on the assigned auxiliary route. (See section E, item 2).

D. Replacement Carriers Assigned to Vacant Regular Routes (Designations 72/74)

1. Designation 72
 - a. FLSA B — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA B.
 - b. FLSA A — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA A.

2. Designation 74

Work on relief day

- a. Carrier worked scheduled relief day:
 - (1) Enter R on the day the carrier worked the relief day.
 - (2) Include the hours worked in the Actual Weekly Hours. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.
- b. Carrier provided Christmas assistance on relief day:
 - (1) Enter the Christmas auxiliary assistance time on PS Form 1314 in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
 - (2) Do **NOT** include these hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
 - (3) Enter J or K in the appropriate block on PS Form 1314 if the replacement carrier worked a full day on the route.

E. Replacement Rural Carriers Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

All replacement carriers serving as Christmas auxiliary assistants are compensated at their regular rate for actual hours worked up to 40 per week, and at the FLSA overtime rate for actual hours worked in excess of 40.

1. Christmas assistance on a regular route:
 - a. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for each carrier that provides Christmas assistance.
 - b. Do **NOT** enter more than one carrier on each PS Form 1314-A.
 - c. Submit a separate certificate for each regular route on which the carrier provides assistance.
 - d. Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
 - e. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.
2. Christmas assistance on an auxiliary route:
 - a. Assigned carrier (Des 79) provided Christmas assistance on assigned auxiliary route:
 - (1) Enter N in the appropriate block in the No Service section of the carrier's PS Form 1314-A for the assigned route.
 - (2) Record hours worked in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block. Only enter Christmas assistance when the Des 79 assists the replacement carrier working the N day.
 - (3) Include EMA hours and miles (not trips) in the total for the appropriate week. Trips may not exceed the number of days worked in the No Service blocks.

- (4) A replacement carrier is required to cross-foot the card.
- b. Replacement carrier (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, and 78) provided Christmas assistance on auxiliary route:
 - (1) Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A. Enter route number A997. Use this route type and number for overburdened service or Christmas assistance on auxiliary routes only.
 - (2) Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
 - (3) Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles (if applicable) in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.
 - (4) If Christmas assistance is performed on two or more auxiliary routes in the same pay period, combine all work hours and EMA data on one manually prepared PS Form 1314-A.

F. Postal Employees (Other Than Rural) Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

Postal Service employees (other than Des 7X) who provide Christmas assistance on rural routes are compensated at their regular rate of pay for actual time worked. Include all work hours using their normal Time and Attendance System (Manual Timecards or TACS).

Nonrural employees are entitled to EMA payment if a personal vehicle is used. Prepare PS Form 1314-A as follows: (Do **NOT** prepare PS Form 1314-A if a government vehicle is provided.)

1. Report the hours worked on the rural routes on PS Form 1230-C, *Time Card*.
2. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for EMA compensation. Complete indicative data at the top of

the certificate. Use Des/Act 99-0, actual route type and number, FLSA code P, and correct employee and pay period information.

3. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.

Important Items to Remember: Rural Carrier Christmas Pay Procedures

- Hours entered in the Daily Overtime block are **always** included in Actual Weekly Hours.
- Hours entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block are **NOT** included in Actual Weekly Hours.
- Carriers on auxiliary routes are paid for actual hours worked, not the route's evaluation, during the Christmas period.
- During the period from the beginning of the Guarantee Year (October 12, 2019) through the last day of the Christmas period (December 27, 2019), a DACA Code X cannot be entered on a timecard unless there is a corresponding DACA Code R or 3 in the same pay period and the carrier's X day balance is zero or greater.
 - DACA R and 3 require a DACA Code X to be used in the same pay period.
- If Actual Weekly Hours exceed 56 hours in a week, a DACA Code 5 must be used. DACA Code 3 or R are not allowed.
- If a regular carrier works his or her relief day and serves his or her assigned route, this is **NOT** reported as Christmas assistance.
- Regular carriers may only work on their assigned route.
- Second trip is not allowed during the Christmas period.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal Service money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - When there is discoloration around the dollar amounts, this might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Other than for PMEMS and the exceptions listed below, a customs declaration PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, and for all items (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. Other than the exceptions listed below, all PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply to known mailers, who for this purpose are defined as follows:

- Business mailers who enter volume mailings through business mail entry units or other bulk mail acceptance locations, pay postage through advance deposit accounts, use permit imprints for postage payment, and submit completed postage statements at the time of entry that certify that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations. Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail." Such agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation, except for any items addressed to an MPO or DPO to which restriction "B2" applies.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

C2. E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. The returns for the four indexes shown do not include any of these deductions.

Orange Plastic Mailbags Now Available at Mail Transport Equipment Service Centers

The United States Postal Service® has developed a new, orange plastic mailbag. These mailbags are made from 100 percent polypropylene plastic and are secured with the same Velcro closure used on the clear domestic mailbags.

Use the new mailbag (shown here) for Priority Mail® and mail transported through the air network:



The new mailbags feature an opaque plastic sack material that eliminates scan errors during transportation. Additionally, the new mailbags offer two-layer construction, which prevents moisture or contaminants from entering or leaking from the mailbags after they are sealed.

The new mailbag is now available to all Mail Transport Equipment (MTE) customers:

- Order the new mailbags from Mail Transport Equipment Service Centers (MTESCs) through the Mail Transportation Equipment Ordering System (MTEOR).
- When ordering from MTESCs through MTEOR, the identification number for the new plastic mailbags is EIRS 12PV.

Safety and Wellness

Help Prevent Cold Stress

As the seasons change and cold weather approaches, it’s time to think about the potential dangers of exposure to cold temperatures. Prevent cold weather-related injuries by dressing in three light layers:

- An inner layer for wicking moisture away from your body.
- A middle layer to insulate you from the cold.
- An outer layer that repels wind, snow, and rain that can be removed, as needed.

Also, protect your hands, neck, and face, and wear warm, waterproof shoes or boots. Prolonged exposure to cold temperatures can cause your body to lose heat, which puts you at risk of hypothermia or frostbite. Frostbite occurs when skin is exposed to extreme cold for long periods and the skin and underlying tissue freeze. The fingers, toes, and feet are most commonly affected, but other extremities such as the nose, ears, and cheeks can also develop frostbite.

At the first sign of frostbite, get out of the cold. Unless absolutely necessary, do not walk on frostbitten feet or toes. Do not rub the frostbitten area because it will cause more damage. Warm the affected area using body heat or by immersing in warm water; avoid using a heating pad, heat lamp, or the heat of a stove, fireplace, or radiator for warming because direct heat can burn damaged tissue. Drink warm beverages to replace lost fluids. In case of severe frostbite, seek medical attention.

USPS National Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention Week, October 26 – November 1, 2019

The United States Postal Service® is sponsoring its first National Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention Week, a public service campaign that offers safety tips and emphasizes the need for increased owner responsibility to help prevent carrier injuries.

From painted porches to neglected icy surfaces, hazardous conditions on customer property pose serious threats to Postal Service™ employees. To emphasize the enormity of this issue, USPS® reported 18,684 Postal Service employees experienced a slip, trip, or fall last year.

The tips available in this article can promote awareness of this issue and help reduce the number of carrier injuries in local communities.

Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention

Last year, most slip, trip, and fall incidents involved mail carriers. More than half resulted in at least one day away from work.

How Carriers Can Avoid a Slip, Trip, or Fall

- **Wear proper footwear.** Keep your feet warm and dry. Choose high-traction, slip-resistant footwear.
- **Stay away from slippery surfaces.** Avoid wet leaves or icy areas whenever possible. Shorten your steps and shuffle your feet when near slippery surfaces. You are not required to risk personal injury from icy steps.
- **Be alert.** Finger mail only when it is safe to do so. Always remain focused, alert, and ready to react to the conditions in front of you.

- **Use handrails or other stable supports, when available.** Holding on to something keeps you steady when ascending and descending stairs or entering and exiting vehicles. Keep one hand on the handrail or grab bar, so you can catch yourself if you start to slip.
- **Report hazards.** Be diligent about examining your path for hazards. Use PS Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition or Practice*, to report a hazard to your supervisor. Alert replacement carriers to any hazardous conditions by completing PS Form 1766, *Hazard Warning Card*.

How Customers Can Prevent a Slip, Trip, or Fall Injury

- **Clear the way.** Keep the carrier path clear of obstacles like leaves, ice, and snow. Make sure doors and porches used by mail carriers are cleared of hazards.
- **Maintain the carrier path.** Repair cracks and fill in holes. Repair, paint yellow, or block access to unstable or uneven walking surfaces.
- **Avoid startling carriers.** Keep animals away from the delivery path.
- **Make painted porches skid-proof.** Install non-skid strips or add sand to the paint to provide traction.

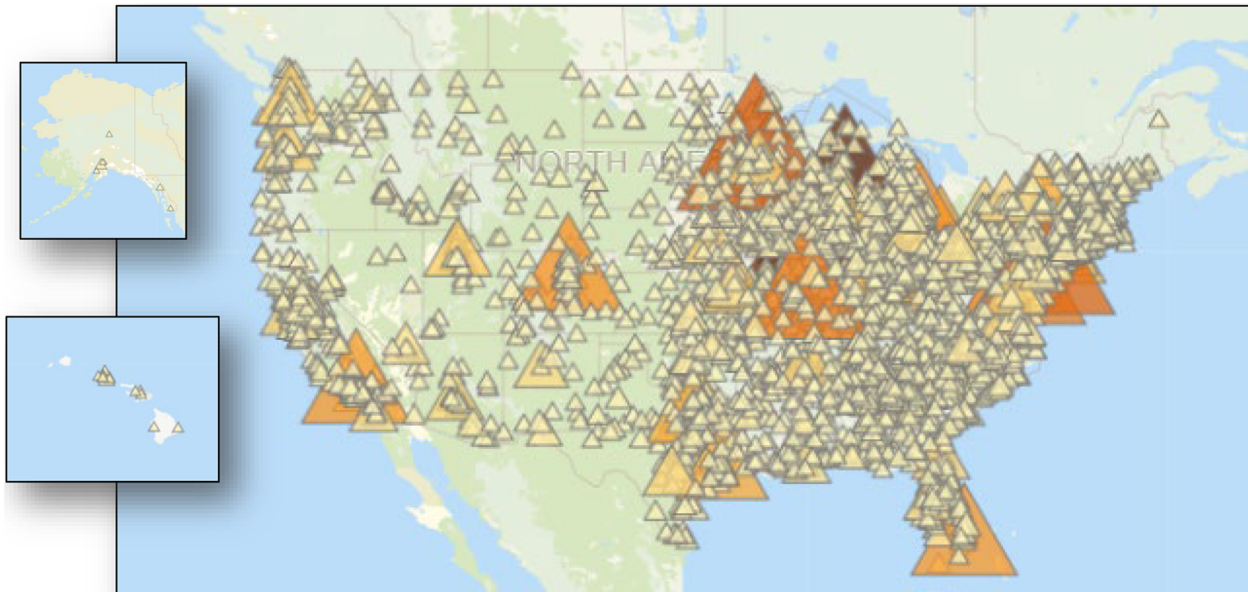

Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention Tips for Mail Carriers

Make an effort every day to:

- Maintain good housekeeping.
- Wear proper footwear.
- Report unsafe conditions to your supervisor or manager.
- Take messages on your Mobile Delivery Device (MDD) seriously.

Stay alert at all times:

- Observe the area carefully.
- Stay alert to avoid being startled.
- Avoid distractions. Never finger mail when changing surface types, going up and down stairs, and entering or exiting vehicles.

Be aware of common places that falls occur:

- Changing surface types.
- Stairs.
- Cracks in sidewalks, driveways, or roads.

If you start to fall, these tips will help:

- Relax, as tensing your body is more likely to cause injury.
- If holding an object, drop it.
- Do not try to break your fall with an outstretched hand, elbow, or knee.

Use these preventative measures:

- Wear proper footwear.
- Maintain good posture to improve balance.
- Scan the area ahead:
 - Avoid patchy snow or ice when possible.
 - Avoid wet leaves and mud slicks.
 - Look for cracks and gaps that signal uneven surfaces.
 - Do not carry items you cannot see over.
- Use handrails when available.
- Finger mail only when safe to do so.
- Use caution when mounting and dismounting vehicles.

- Withhold delivery if ice or snow covered steps prevent safe access. Notify supervisor or manager of mail withheld due to ice or snow.
- Keep in mind most injuries on stairs occur on the way down.
- Report hazards to your supervisor.

Slip, Trip, and Fall Prevention Tips for Mail Customers

On an average day, 51 United States Postal Service mail carriers will experience a fall while working. The Postal Service reports that last year, 18,684 carriers experienced a fall at work. With deliveries every day, including all seasons and weather conditions, carriers continue to experience falls in urban, suburban, and rural settings.

Most falls are preventable. To ensure mail carriers' safety, the Postal Service requests that all residents and business owners identify and correct hazards on their properties.

Here are four simple tips to prevent slips, trips, and falls by mail carriers and others on private property year round:

1. Inspect the path.

Walk the path your carrier takes along your property to identify hazards. This may be an entrance you use less often, and you may not realize there is a hazard present. Replace doormats that roll up along the edges, and use rubber-backed mats to prevent them from sliding. Ensure there is adequate lighting along the walking path.

2. Repair hazards.

Cracks in steps and porches, loose railing, uneven sidewalk joints, and loose bricks or blocks in the walkway happen over time and water is one of the main culprits. Check drainage slopes and look for pooling areas to help prevent icy spots in the winter. Make repairs as quickly as possible. If you are unable to make the repair, block off the area or add paint to an uneven surface to bring attention to it.

3. Control slippery surfaces.

Leaves, rain, and ice can pose serious fall hazards. Keep leaves off walking paths, use sand in the paint for traction on porches, and clear ice and snow from the path your carrier takes.

4. Stay informed.

Customers with access to postal notification features, such as Informed Delivery[®] for letter mail and package tracking, are encouraged to use these features to determine if mail is expected that day. If so, make sure a path has been cleared for the carrier to make a safe delivery, even on the weekend.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by phone at 800-782-6724, or on The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches (vertically) by 4 inches (horizontally). Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of

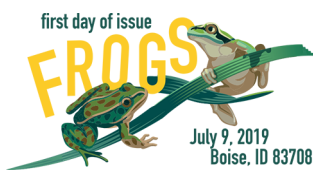

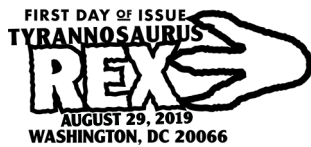
