## UNIFORM PROGRAM

### Corporate Uniform Emblem—Garment Availability

On June 1, the following uniform garments bearing the new “eagle in the wind” corporate uniform logo will be available for purchase by eligible letter carrier, motor vehicle service, and special delivery personnel in the Regular Uniform Program:

- Knit shirts (summer)
- Rainwear

The garments may be ordered effective May 1; however, shipping and invoicing may not be made until June 1. Employees should be advised that their existing uniform garments that bear the “eagle in flight” emblem are not expected to be replaced, and employees may continue to wear them. At this time, there is no definitive obsolescence date for the older uniform emblem.

### New Work Clothing

On September 1, the following work clothing garments will be available to eligible employees authorized an allowance under the Work Clothes and Contract Uniform Programs:

- Hooded zip-front sweatshirt (USPS shade navy blue)
- Insulated vest (USPS shade navy blue)
- Zip-front cardigan sweater (USPS shade navy blue)

Each of the above garments will bear a new corporate work clothing emblem designed specifically for the Work Clothes Program. Also, effective September 1, work shirts and utility work jackets will bear the new work clothing emblem.

Employees may place orders effective August 1; however, the items may not be shipped or invoiced until September 1.

Employees in the Regular Uniform Program may not purchase or wear the work clothing garments.

### Express Mail Service Directory—Distribution of IRT Update Diskettes

All post offices that use UNISYS II, UNISYS III, or MOS integrated retail terminals (IRTs) to accept Express Mail should receive *on or about May 30* an Express Mail directory update diskette from UNISYS or MOS. If more than one type of IRT is used for Express Mail, offices should receive a separate diskette for each type. If an office has a weighing and rating unit (WRU), it should receive a UNISYS III or WRU diskette to update the directory on the WRU.

MOS IRTs are in the process of being retrofitted, after which they will use double-sided/high-density diskettes rather than the previous double-sided/double-density diskettes. To ensure that each MOS site has the correct type of Express Mail network diskette for its equipment configuration, MOS will send one double-density and one high-density diskette to each MOS retail unit. Unretrofitted sites will use the double-density diskette. Retrofitted sites will use the high-density diskette.

The Express Mail network on the diskettes is *effective*

*immediately*. Install the Express Mail service directory diskettes on your IRT diskettes and WRUs at once (instructions for updating are included with the diskettes). Also enclosed is a form to complete and send to your expedited service specialist indicating receipt and updating of the Express Mail directory on your IRT diskettes and WRUs.

If your office did not receive the appropriate type of IRT diskettes for the IRTs or WRUs at your office, *immediately* contact your expedited service specialist (Express Mail office). If you have difficulty loading the directory from the diskettes received, contact the IRT vendor's hotline:

### Verification of Second-Class Publications Authorized Exceptional Dispatch

Under *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) D210.3, postmasters of an original or additional entry post office for a second-class publication may authorize publishers to deliver copies of a time-sensitive publication, at the publisher's own expense and risk, by exceptional dispatch, directly to other post offices. Because this provision is intended only for short-haul local distributions, it must not be used to circumvent additional entry requirements.

As instructed in *Domestic Mail Manual Transition Book* (DMMT) 426.6, at least once every 3 months, the entry post office postmaster must compare the number of copies received by each exceptional dispatch destination office with the number reported by the publisher. This is required to make sure that the number of copies actually mailed is accurately reported on the mailing statement and is properly paid for.

To accomplish this, the postmaster of the post office where the exceptional dispatch authorization was approved must select an issue date and request the following from each office where the publication is deposited under such authorization:

1. Facility name.
2. Mailing address, state, ZIP+4 Code.
3. Date received.
4. Number of copies received by preparation level (barcoded, level A, B, C, etc.).

On page 6 is a sample letter that entry office postmasters may copy and use.

After being provided this information, the entry office postmaster must ensure that it is consistent with the exceptional dispatch authorization and the publisher's mailing statement(s). Discrepancies must be resolved immediately with the publisher and, if necessary, the postmaster must request an amended application from the publisher that accurately reflects the publication's deposit times and number of pieces qualifying for and mailed at the various presort level discounts. Postage adjustments must also be resolved promptly, if needed.

HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

## Credit and Debit Card Acceptance

The U.S. Postal Service will accept credit and debit (ATM) cards for customer transactions at all non-contract retail window locations. The focus will be on individual customers and small businesses; therefore, credit and debit cards will not be accepted at bulk mail entry units (BMEUs).

Corporate Treasury has established a centralized account at the New York Federal Reserve where all credit and debit (ATM) card funds will flow. Credit and debit card acceptance can be processed only by using the USPS central card processor, not any other bank or processor. AICs have been established to support the centralized process; therefore Handbook F-1 is revised as follows:

### 315 Debit and Credit Cards

Accept credit and debit (ATM) cards for payment for postal products and services at all non-contract retail window locations under the following conditions.

**315.1 Specific Rules.** Only the following credit cards may be accepted: VISA, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express. The following debit POS network cards may be accepted: EXPLORE, STAR SYSTEMS, MAC, Infinet, NYCE & Yankee 24, HONOR, MOST, pulse PAY, pulse, MAGIC LINE, ACCEL, THE EXCHANGE, BankMate, Jeanie, Cash Station, GulfNet, MPACT, tyme, Instant Teller, ALERT, AFFN, Maestro, and Interlink.

**315.11 USPS Products.** If other cards are subsequently added or deleted, these changes will be communicated in the *Postal Bulletin*. Debit (ATM) cards may be accepted for USPS products and services at all non-contract retail window locations. Credit cards may be accepted for USPS products and services, except CODs and money orders, at all non-contract retail window locations.

**315.12 Non USPS Products and Services.** Credit or debit cards cannot be accepted for passport application fees. The interagency agreement provides that we receive payment through the Online Payables and Collections (OPAC) system. Debit cards may be accepted for traveler's checks at locations authorized to sell them. Credit cards are not acceptable for payment for traveler's checks.

**315.2 Acceptance at Retail Unit.** All cards must be swiped through the magnetic card reader and authorized (receive authorization code and approval on reader) by the card processor. Clerks must enter the last four digits of the number embossed on the front of credit cards. If a card is swiped three times, the embossed card number may be entered after the terminal prompts for manual entry. Autho-

rization through the magnetic card reader is still required. No manual card swipe machines are authorized for credit and debit card acceptance. Telephone credit and debit transactions may not be accepted. Direct customers buying postage by phone to the USPS Stamps by Phone program (1-800-STAMP24). Customer signatures are required on all credit card transactions. For VISA and MasterCard, clerks must compare the signature on the back of the credit card with the signature on the receipt. Do not accept unsigned cards. For American Express and Discover, the signature on the receipt must be the same as the signature on the back panel and must also match the name embossed on the card. If there are discrepancies between signatures, ask the customer to submit additional picture identification. For debit card transactions, the customer must enter a personal identification number (PIN) on the handheld PIN pad. Check all cards to ensure that usage dates are valid (i.e., not expired or a future date).

**315.21 Magnetic Card Reader Receipts.** All transactions for credit and debit cards must be supported by magnetic card reader generated receipts. Give the customer the duplicate; retain the original to support the 1412 entries—AIC 762, Credit Cards Remitted, and AIC 772, Debit Cards Remitted. Retain receipts at the unit for the time period of all documents associated with Forms 1412, *Daily Financial Form*, and file receipts so they may be retrieved if a customer disputes a charge to his card (chargeback).

**315.22 Disputed Charges.** The district finance office will send adjustment letters or Form 1908, *Financial Adjustment Memorandum*, to the unit for all differences between what is reported on the Forms 1412 and the automated file from the card processor.

**315.3 Accountbook Entries.** The total from AIC 762 flows to accountbook AIC 422, Credit Card Funds Transfer. The total from AIC 772 flows to accountbook AIC 423, Debit Card Transfer. Minneapolis Accounting Service Center (MNASC) will issue statements of difference (SOD) on an AP basis for CAGs A–G for any discrepancies. CAGs H–L will continue to receive SODs on a quarterly basis.

**315.4 Refunds.** All regulations for refunds and exchanges in PO14 or the applicable *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) section must be strictly followed. If a refund is warranted, follow current procedures. Credits to debit or credit card accounts will not be issued.

HANDBOOKS F-10 AND F-12 REVISIONS

**Travel Per Diem Rates**

Effective with this *Postal Bulletin*, Handbooks F-10, *Travel*, and F-12, *Relocation Policy*, Appendix B. II. C., are revised as follows.

**Appendix B  
Reimbursement Rates**

**C. High Cost Localities**

The following key cities and/or areas are classified as localities with above average lodging costs. The per diem rate applicable for each of these localities is indicated. All other cities are classified as average cost localities, with a per diem rate of \$26.

IRS regulations governing the taxability of relocation benefits now require that the distance between the employee's new duty station and old residence be at least 50 miles greater than the distance between the employee's old duty station and old residence. To conform to these regulations, Handbook F-11, *PCES Relocation Policy*, and Handbook F-12, *Relocation Policy*, will be changed as follows:

For those nonbargaining employees who are not now currently eligible to use the Relocation Management Firm services, specifically EAS 18 and below, the Relocation Management Firm Home Purchase and Home Finding services may be extended if they are reassigned as a result of certain actions initiated by management, i.e., closure of an office or reduction in force—to a postal station that is 50 miles farther from their home than their previous postal station. Approval must be obtained in advance from the vice president, controller.

## Nondenominated Canadian Stamps

## National Dog Bite Prevention Week, June 12–17, 1995

More than 2 million dog bites are reported each year in the United States. It's a serious problem for everyone—not just the 2,782 letter carriers who were bitten last year. And, it's a problem we can all solve!

This year, to increase public awareness, the Postal Service is partnering with the Humane Society of the United States to declare June 12 through 17 National Dog Bite Prevention Week. The goal of this joint effort is to educate pet owners and the general public on ways to prevent dog bites. National Dog Bite Prevention Week's central message promotes responsible pet ownership.

Postmasters with access to cc:Mail can request an electronic version of the press kit by sending a cc:Mail message to the following address: Bite, Dog

### Nationwide Mailing

This year's campaign will include a nationwide mailing to every address in America for delivery between June 12 and 17. This "tip sheet" postcard will advise dog owners how to restrain their pets, and give non-owners tips on how to avoid dog bites.

### Posters

Posters with the message, "Don't Let Your Dog Bite the Hand That Serves You" will be sent to the nation's 40,000 post offices near the end of May. Postmasters are asked to display the posters throughout the summer and retain them for use next year. Postmasters seeking additional posters may contact their local district safety office. A sample poster appears on page 35.

### Media Opportunities

**June 7:** Postmasters are asked to distribute the following news release, "(Name of local Post Office) and (Local Animal Shelter/Humane Society) Deliver Dog Bite Prevention Tips" to local newspaper, radio, and television outlets for advance coverage. A national press conference in Washington, DC will also take place on June 7. *Therefore, postmasters are asked to delay any dog bite related photo opportunities/events until the week of June 12–17.*

**June 12–17:** During Dog Bite Prevention Week, postmasters are asked to coordinate with local Humane Soci-

ety chapters to stage photo opportunities for the news media. The opportunity, which must take place between Monday, June 12 and Saturday, June 17, *and not before*, should include letter carriers lining up "chorus line" style to display dog bite scars.

- Postmasters can speak on the pain, suffering, replacement carrier costs, and delivery curtailment issues associated with this problem.
- Letter carriers can speak to reporters individually on their own experiences with dogs.
- Local Humane Society spokespersons can speak on the problems of dog bites to the community and the nation.

### **(Name of Local Post Office) and (Local Animal Shelter/Humane Society) Deliver Dog Bite Prevention Tips**

(City, State)—If you're a dog owner or one of the two million Americans who fell victim to dog attacks last year, the U.S. Postal Service and the Humane Society of the United States have good news for you: Dog bites are preventable and it's a nationwide problem we all can solve.

The two organizations are jointly sponsoring National Dog Prevention Week, June 12 through 17. Dog bite prevention tips are being mailed to every address in America.

"This is clearly a nationwide problem and not just a postal issue," said (town Postmaster name), "and our partnership with the Humane Society of the United States will help us convey this message."

The Humane Society reports that children, the elderly, and letter carriers are the most frequent victims.

"Dog attacks are the most commonly reported childhood public-health problem in the United States," said (Humane Society/Shelter spokesperson). "The Humane Society reports that, in number, dog attacks exceed the reported instances of measles, whooping cough, and mumps combined. Victims of dog bites account for up to five percent of emergency-room admissions.

Last year, nearly 2,800 letter carriers were attacked by dogs, many of which, according to their owners, 'wouldn't hurt a fly.'"

The "tip sheet" postcard scheduled for delivery between June 12 and 17 will advise dog owners how to restrain their pets. Non-owners will get tips on how to avoid dog bites.

Tips on the card read as follows:

How to avoid being bitten:

- Don't run past a dog. The dog's natural instinct is to chase and catch prey.
- If a dog threatens you, don't scream. Avoid eye contact, try to remain motionless until the dog leaves, then back away slowly until the dog is out of sight.
- Don't approach a strange dog, especially one that's tied or confined.
- Always let a dog see and sniff you before you pet the animal.

How to be a responsible dog owner:

- Spay or neuter your dog—unneutered dogs are more likely to bite!
- When your letter carrier comes to your home, keep your dog inside, away from the door in another room, or on a leash.
- Don't let your child take mail from the letter carrier in the presence of your dog. Your dog's instinct is to "protect" the family.
- Obedience training can teach your dog proper behavior and help you control your dog in any situation.

(Name) said that the Postal Service and the Humane Society of the United States agree that, in most cases, dog bites are not caused by "bad" dogs as much as by irresponsible dog owners. Dogs that haven't been properly "socialized," that receive little attention or handling, and that are left tied up for long periods of time, frequently turn into biters.

Humane Society statistics indicate that dogs that have not been spayed or neutered are up to three times as likely to bite as non-neutered or spayed dogs. In fact, while particular breeds are identified from time to time as bite-prone, a dog's breed is less likely to mark him as a biter than whether he has been neutered.

**Loose Dogs and Letter Carriers Don’t Mix**

Whatever the reasons for them, dog bites are a serious problem for letter carriers trying to deliver your mail. Nationwide, Postal Service carriers suffered 2,782 dog bites last year (an average of nine dog attacks every working day), and that figure does not include the number of threatening incidents that did not result in injury.

In (city) last year we had (number) dog bites, and (a significant number of/estimate a number if you can) instances where dogs interfered with the delivery of mail. Fortunately, most dog bites can be prevented through responsible pet ownership.

If a letter carrier or other neighborhood worker needs to hand you something in person—a package or certified letter—shut the dog in another room before opening the door. Dogs have been known to burst through a screen door, even a plate-glass window, to get at the carrier.

Just ask Dover, Delaware, Postmaster Jack Bailey. One of his veteran letter carriers, who had survived eight vicious attacks during his 20-year career, felt secure in his ability to avoid dog bites.

That was until Thursday, February 25, 1993, a day that would scar the carrier’s life—both physically and emotionally—forever.

While making his delivery to a mail box on the wall next to the entrance of a customer’s home, the carrier stared in horror as a 100-pound dog charged a Plexiglas-plated door. Instinctively, he braced his foot against the door as the dog backed-up to charge again, but this time the animal crashed through and clamped onto his arm.

“It happened so quickly that he didn’t have time to react,” explains Bailey, who prefers not to identify the carrier, who owns four dogs and is still undergoing treatment.

“The animal’s grip so severely shredded his left arm that the carrier has had to undergo several recuperative surgeries since the incident, and he may never have full use of his arm,” says Bailey.

Nationally, the number of carriers bitten by dogs has dropped from more than 7,000 in 1983 because of greater

cooperation from dog owners, stricter leash laws, and stepped-up efforts to educate letter carriers and the public in dealing with the problem.

Unfortunately, our employees still face dangerous incidents.

Our carriers can be vigilant. We can even stop mail delivery and collect damages for injuries received. This is a last resort, but we will do it when all other means have failed. We can't control dogs; only the dogs' owners can do that.

While some attribute dogs' scorn for postal workers to an inbred aversion to uniforms, the psychology actually runs much deeper. Every day the letter carrier comes into the dog's territory, the dog barks, and the letter carrier leaves. Day after day the dog sees this action repeated, and after a week or two it starts to feel invincible. Now, what do you think that dog's going to do once it gets loose and has a chance to attack?

When school lets out, dog owners should talk to their children about the need to keep the family dog secured. I also recommend that parents tell their children not to ask for or take mail directly from the letter carrier. A dog may see the handing of mail to a child as a threatening gesture.

I hope that reminders and tips like these can reduce this hazard. If not, we can invoke the policy of holding mail until the hazard is removed, and others in the neighborhood may share the inconvenience of picking up their mail at the post office. Help us to help you this spring and summer.

## Why Do Dogs Bite?

Would yours? The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) estimates that between two and three million dog bites are reported to local authorities each year. Millions more go unreported.

Dog bites range from painless nips to fatal maulings. Children are most often the victims. Dog attacks are the most commonly reported childhood public-health problem in the United States. Dog bite victims account for up to five percent of all hospital emergency-room admissions.

You may feel confident that your dog won't add to these statistics, and it is probably true that your trusty companion will never seriously harm anyone.

However, if your dog attacks or bites someone, including your letter carrier, you could be liable for the victim's pain, suffering, and medical costs. There are several ways you can reduce that liability. Reducing the likelihood that your dog will ever bite someone helps protect you, your canine companion, and everyone else in the community.

### Why do some dogs bite?

Although dogs may bite for a variety of reasons, whether a dog has been spayed or neutered greatly affects the degree of the dog's aggressiveness. Bite statistics show that unsterilized dogs are up to three times more likely to bite than sterilized dogs. Lack of socialization, improper training, excitement, and fear can all contribute to a dog attack. Even a nip on the calf is unacceptable behavior for a family dog.

Here are three suggestions to help take the bite out of your dog.

- Teach your dog appropriate behavior. Don't play aggressive games with your dog such as wrestling, tug of war, or "sicking" your dog on another person. It's essential that your dog recognize you and all the members of your family—including young children—as dominant and not challenge your leadership.
- Be a responsible pet owner. For everyone's safety, don't allow your dog to roam. Make your pet a member of your family. Dogs spending too much time in the doghouse or tied in the backyard have a much greater chance of developing aggressive behavioral problems.
- Err on the safe side. If you don't know how your dog will react to a new situation, be cautious. If you think your dog could panic in a crowd, leave him or her at home. If your dog may overreact to visitors or delivery persons, keep him or her in another room. Help your dog become accustomed to a variety of situations.

## Protecting the Community

Last year, dog attacks resulted in 2,782 reported injuries to letter carriers nationwide, about nine dog bites every delivery day. But as high as that number is, it pales in comparison to the 2 million U.S. citizens bitten yearly. Half are left scarred, a tenth require stitches, and a third suffer lost school or work time.

Even more chilling are the 12 deaths recorded last year as a result of dog attacks. Already, one death due to dog attacks has been reported this year by the Humane Society of the United States, which compiles an annual report on all fatal dog bites. Most dog bites and attacks can be prevented through responsible dog ownership.

A study by the Centers for Disease Control identified 157 dog bite related fatalities that occurred in the United States from 1979 through 1988.

Those people who so confidently say "my dog never bites" will be surprised to learn that nearly 70 percent of the fatal attacks involved a family pet. Twelve deaths involved 3 to 22 dogs running in packs.

One of the most disturbing statistics revealed that the vast majority of deaths occurred among children who were under 10 years of age, and the death rate was highest for children under 1 month old.

In older children, most cases involved a victim who gained unauthorized access to a fenced yard where a dog was kept, or who wandered too close to a chained dog.

The study also recommends strong animal control laws, public education regarding dog bites, and more responsible dog ownership.

Clearly, parents must never leave a defenseless infant with a dog and must make sure that older children know the potential danger of dog bites.

Studies have shown that dogs are three times more likely to bite if they have not been spayed or neutered.

Dog owners could prevent serious injuries by realizing that a chain may not be a sufficient restraint to ensure that a dog cannot escape, and that a securely enclosed and locked pen or structure, able to prevent the entry of young children, may also be necessary. In particular, the study said that parents should be aware that very small infants left alone with a dog may be at risk of death.

*A Delaware postmaster offers advice about what you, as postmaster, can do to promote dog bite awareness in your community.*

Not wanting to endure the trauma of having history repeat itself, Dover, Delaware, Postmaster Jack Bailey looked at all aspects of preventing dog bites, including local city ordinances.

"I was amazed to learn how weak city dog laws are," he explained. "Some dog related laws are more punitive for dogs relieving themselves on neighbors' lawns than for dog bites."

Bailey offers these tips:

- Contact your district safety office for guidance. Local safety officers, having been down this road before, can prevent "reinventing the wheel."
  - Contact your local police department or animal shelter for a copy of their dog ordinances to assure that they are strong enough; if not, involve your Employee Involvement team to affect change. Dangerous dog ordinances should hold the owner accountable for their dog's behavior. Mandatory sterilization of dangerous dogs is an important facet of any good dangerous dog law.
  - Get involved with local authorities:
    - Attend town meetings and promote dog awareness.
    - Make arrangements with the state police for their dog trainer to demonstrate dog awareness.
  - Foster community awareness through local TV and radio stations by providing interview opportunities with dog bite victims. Better still, coordinate these opportunities with the local animal shelter, utility companies, and newspaper delivery firms.
  - Intensify your dog bite prevention program to identify aggressive dog locations, ensuring that all employees are aware and prepared to deal with situations as they develop.
  - Develop procedures for your post office to follow when there are two incidents involving the same dog (i.e., withdraw delivery for the entire street until the dog is removed from the area).
  - Work with local animal shelters and postal dog bite victims to provide dog safety talks.
  - Review your use of cluster boxes for all delivery areas where there have been dog-related problems.

Postmasters who want the following Public Service Announcements broadcast for a specific date should personally visit the television or radio station 10 days in advance. If possible, coordinate this opportunity with your local Humane Society or animal shelter.

### **Thirty-Second Public Service Announcement**

*(for release to local radio or television stations)*

Well, it's that time of year again and the Postal Service and Humane Society need your help. Last year, nationwide, nearly 2,800 letter carriers were attacked and injured by dogs or other pets—pets that "wouldn't hurt a fly." You can help protect your letter carrier, meter reader, or newspaper delivery boy or girl this spring and summer by making sure your pet is properly restrained or confined. Don't think your fence solves the problem—especially if a letter carrier or delivery person has to enter your yard. Please make sure your pet is properly restrained so we can deliver your mail. Responsible pet owners spay or neuter their pets. This message is a public service of your local post office and local chapter of the Humane Society.

### **Thirty-Second Public Service Announcement**

*(for release to local radio or television stations)*

Here's a switch. Instead of dog bites man, it's man bites dog. Pet owners, did you know that if your dog attacks a letter carrier, you can be held liable for all medical expenses and other costs that can run into the thousands of dollars?

Don't think your fence is your best insurance policy—especially if a letter carrier or delivery person must enter your yard. The Postal Service is not anti-dog, but pro-responsibility. Responsible pet ownership includes making sure your pet is properly restrained. Dog bites can be hard on the wallet. Last year, nationally, nearly 2,800 letter carriers were attacked while delivering the mail. Help our carriers feel safe while delivering your mail this spring and summer. This message is a public service of your local post office.

### **Quiz: Are You an Unwary Visitor?**

Post, print in a newsletter, or use as a handout to test the dog bite prevention awareness of supervisors and carriers.

Are you an unwary visitor to what a dog feels is its territory? If so, a dog bite might occur. Take this quiz to test your awareness of how to handle some typical situations encountered by many delivery service people. It may help you prevent an injury. Answer True or False:

1. If a dog is sleeping in the side yard, you should quietly slip up to the front door and make your delivery so you don't disturb the dog.
2. Turning away and retreating quickly from a dog will probably prevent your being bitten.
3. Carrying dog biscuits with you will help you make friends with all the dogs on your route.
4. Many bites occur because the dog is protective of its home territory.
5. To be sure that you have your repellent, it's a good idea to secure it to a mail cart or your vehicle dashboard.
6. Dogs only attack if you threaten or challenge them.
7. Dogs always make their intentions known by growling or barking before they attack.
8. A storm or screen door will keep the dog inside from attacking you at the door.
9. One way to protect yourself is to spray repellent on all the large dogs on your route at least once so they are afraid to challenge you.
10. Talking softly to a dog while petting it will reassure the dog you mean no harm and reduce your chance of being bitten.

### **Answers to Unwary Visitor Quiz**

1. FALSE. Dogs have keen senses; under these conditions, you would probably startle the dog and increase the possibility of an attack. The right procedure? Make a soft noise, such as a low whistle, so the dog won't be surprised. Keep your eye on the dog, and if you must withdraw, back up slowly and carefully to avoid a fall.
2. FALSE. Turning and running often increases the dog's excitement and provides an opportunity for it to bite while your back is turned. The proper procedure? Stand your ground initially; face the dog; use your satchel as a shield; keep your repellent handy; and back away slowly and carefully to avoid a fall.
3. FALSE. Too often the dog will readily accept the treat, but still not accept you. A proper procedure? You will be safer by attempting to reassure the dog by talking in a friendly manner and using its name if known. But do this from a safe distance.



4. TRUE. Dogs instinctively recognize their owners' premises as territorial boundaries. Before entering a customer's property, quickly check for places a dog may be hiding and be alert.
5. FALSE. Most attacks occur away from carts and vehicles. The correct procedure is to keep your spray with you and carry it in a way that lets you use it quickly if attacked.
6. FALSE. Dogs might attack under any circumstances. Properly protect yourself by being aware of the presence of even the friendliest of dogs.
7. FALSE. Many bites have occurred without warning. The best way to protect yourself is remaining alert and, if confronted, following the withdrawal procedures noted above.
8. FALSE. Dogs have been known to break through screen and storm doors, and many have escaped when the owner opens the door to get the mail. On outward opening doors, you might place your foot against the bottom of the door. If the dog is in the next room, ask the owner to remove it before opening the door. In any case, be wary of these situations.
9. FALSE. Repellent should be used only to thwart an attack. Spraying animals unnecessarily will serve to enrage them (and their owners) and it is a violation of postal regulations concerning the use of spray.
10. FALSE. Although well-intended, this approach continues to be a source of dog bites. The best safety procedure? Don't pet dogs on your route, even if you know them well.

# PHILATELY

## Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-11

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

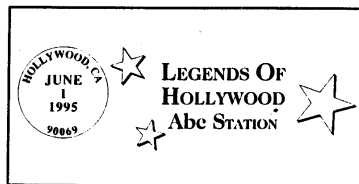
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail post-

age (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

**Automatic Distribution of the Marilyn Monroe Commemorative Stamp, Item 4474**

Postal Bulletin 21892, dated April 27, page 57, stated that all stamp distribution offices (SDOs) will receive two standard automatic distribution quantities for 20-stamps-per-pane commemorative stamps, rounded to the nearest new master carton size (50,000 stamps) for this issue.

Owing to the incorporation of a unique perforation technique featuring a star perforation, some initial start-up delay was experienced in manufacturing. Consequently, automatic distributions will be shipped in four waves. Each wave will be half of the standard automatic distribution quantities.

The first automatic distribution to SDOs began May 17 and will be completed May 23. The second automatic distribution will begin May 24 and will be completed May 31. The third automatic distribution will begin June 7 and will be completed June 12. The final distribution will begin June 13 and will be completed by June 16, 1995. SDOs will make one subsequent automatic shipment to post offices (from the first wave) for half of each standard automatic distribution, using Forms 3309, *Advice of Ship/Stamp Invoice*. Post offices must not place these stamps on sale until June 1, 1995.

Supplemental stock scheduled for accountable paper depositories (APDs) and the stamp distribution networks (SDNs) has been revised. APDs and SDNs will not receive supplemental stock from the first wave. The supplemental stock from the second wave will be shipped June 1 and completed by June 6; each APD and SDN will receive 5,000,000 stamps. Supplemental stock from the third wave will be shipped June 13 and completed by June 16; each APD and SDN will receive 5,000,000 stamps, with the exception of the SDN in Kansas City, MO. The SDN in Kansas City, MO, will receive 6,500,000 stamps. Supplemental stock from the fourth wave will be shipped June 26 and completed by June 30. The APDs in New York, NY; Washington, DC; Memphis, TN; Chicago, IL; and San Francisco, CA, each will receive 4,000,000 stamps. The APD in Denver, CO, will receive 3,000,000 stamps, and the

SDN in Kansas City, MO, will receive 6,700,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders.

SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from their designated APD, using separate Forms 17, *Stamp Requisition*. All other post offices requiring additional stamps should requisition them from their designated SDO on a separate Form 17, or designated SDN on a separate Form 17-SX, *Accountable Items Requisition Stamp Distribution Network*.

Postmasters and stamp custodians are encouraged to submit a separate Form 17 to their designated SDO, or a Form 17-SX to their designated SDN for Item 4474 before completely depleting your inventory.
