It is the responsibility of each organization to implement this policy within areas under their purview.

##### 485.1 Acceptable Use of Trailers for Storage

There are several circumstances under which use of trailers for storage is practical and justified:

- a. Trailer use during construction of a permanent facility; during remodeling of a facility; pending a relocation when the store- or stockrooms are being transferred, reconfigured, redeployed, or replaced.
- b. Truck/van/trailer which is in itself a traveling store-room servicing facilities on a roving or mobile basis.
- c. Trailer use of a seasonal nature; during periods of high use when the store/stock room does not have the capacity to support the seasonal requirement; during a recovery period after a calamity or natural disaster such as storm, flood, earthquake; during peak activity periods such as Christmas.
- d. Trailer use to support deployment of new automation equipment; to support transfer of equipment

between installations for re-deployment; to serve as a staging area in support of installation activities.

- e. Trailer use at temporary locations; use for a limited time when no permanent presence is planned but material support is required.
- f. Demurrage of trailers that must be detained until the warehouse, storeroom, or stockroom can off-load the shipment.

**485.2 Requirements of Storage Facilities as Pertinent to Trailers**

There is, however, no justification for the extended or permanent use of trailers as storerooms or stockrooms. Warehouse, storeroom, stockroom, and storage requirements are essentially a facility requirement wherein all proper postal amenities are implemented:

- a. Ventilation and temperature control serve to preserve the material as well as afford comfortable personnel habitat.
- b. Aisle access by material handling devices such as pallet jacks, forklifts, rolling carts, etc., is essential for personnel safety in handling heavy, bulky, or sensitive materials.
- c. Ingress and egress must not be cumbersome for personnel and materials.

Trailers by their nature when used for storage cannot provide these elements. It is therefore concluded that trailers may not be used for permanent storerooms, stockrooms, or substitutes for warehousing needs. Temporary use must be limited to those circumstances described under this policy.

Whether leased or owned, local organizations are responsible for the proper deployment of trailers. If leased or purchased, requests properly authorized should be processed through the area Purchasing Service Center.

**732.432 Process**

The district material management specialist reviews EXSEL and:

- a. The requesting DMMS and/or MAO (with EXSEL access) reviews EXSEL and:
  - (1) If available, reserves the items (via EXSEL) and acquires the necessary approvals, if needed.

- (2) Forwards the original PS Form 7381 to the applicable district administrative service office, attention: DMMS.

b. The district material management specialist (DMMS) holding the item (within the district boundaries) will:

- (1) **Expense:** Process PS Form 7340, *Shipping Instructions for Excess Property* (see Exhibit 732.432a), and any necessary shipping documents, e.g., GBL, and distribute the documents as follows:
  - (a) Forward copies 1, 3, and 4 to the holding/shipping office, attention: MAO/Installation Head, attach applicable GBL copies.
  - (b) Retain copy #5 with requisition.
  - (c) Discard copy #2.
- (2) **Capital:** Process PS Form 7340 facsimile (see Exhibit 732.432b and PPAS Field User Guide for proper input) and GBL, if necessary. Process as follows:
  - (a) Affix applicable label noting electronic transfer, date processed, who processed the form, name and telephone number of requester.
  - (b) Reproduce three copies and distribute:
    - 1. Shipping Office.
    - 2. Consignee, Attention: MAO/Installation Head.
    - 3. Retain with requisition.

**Note:** If item is not available, stamp the requirement “NOT IN EXCESS” and assist the requesting office with locating a replacement (another location, via EXSEL) or immediately return to the requesting DMMS for further action (see EXSEL user guide for proper input).

**732.433 Shipping Office**

The installation head or MAO of the shipping office ensures that items are properly packaged for shipment and expeditiously transferred, makes any necessary corrections on the Form 7340 or facsimile (SF 1103, *U.S. Government Bill of Lading* (Exhibit 732.433) may accompany 7340), notifies the DMMS, signs and dates the form as shipper, and distributes as follows:

Copy 1: *If capital property*, retain 7340 (facsimile) in the pending verification file to reconcile with the accounting period change listing. *If expense*, file in the expandable material transaction file.

Copy 3 (Expense only): When item is shipped, sign and date the form and forward to consignee.

Copy 4 (Expense only): When item is shipped, sign and date the form and return to issuing DMMS.

**Note:** If the capital property ID label is not affixed to the property, either affix label to the property or mail directly to the consignee.

**732.434 Receiving Office**

The installation head or MAO at the receiving office must take the following steps:

- a. Retain the consignee copy (#3 of Form 7340 – Expense or Facsimile – Capital) in the suspense file pending receipt of the items.
- b. Upon receipt, verify shipment against Form 7340 (or facsimile) for accuracy. If capital, ensure that the ID label is attached to form or on items and is correct. If not, contact the shipping and/or applicable DMMS. Retain the form in the pending verification file to reconcile with the accounting period change listing. If expense, retain the form in the expendable material transaction file.
- c. If not received within 15 days, contact the shipper and/or applicable DMMS for assistance.
- d. An SF 1103, *U.S. Government Bill of Lading*, may accompany the Form 7340 or facsimile if commercial transportation is required. Maintain copies with Form 7340 (or facsimile). See Chapter 5 for instructions.

**732.44 Special Equipment Redistribution**

The area office, In-Plant Support, is responsible for approval of all relocation and excessing of major mechanization/automated equipment within the respective areas. Relocating equipment between areas must be approved by the manager of Equipment Requirements and Economic Analysis (EREA) at Headquarters. All transfers, cannibalizing, scrapping, etc., must be coordinated with the local DMMS.

The cost basis for transfers is: new expense material is transferred at 100 percent of unit cost. For used items, the cost basis is 50 percent of unit cost. For capital equipment, consignee assumes balance of depreciation.

## DMM REVISION

### Publications Pending Authorization — Treatment and Forwarding Standards

Effective July 1, 1996, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) D210, F010, F020, and F030 are revised to clarify the privileges afforded publications that are pending authorization as Periodicals (second-class mail). (With Classification Reform, the class name *second-class mail* was changed to *Periodicals*.) DMM Issue 50 (July 1, 1996) contains these revisions.

**Postage Statement Correction**

Mailers who use the July 1996 editions of Forms 3602-R, *Postage Statement — Standard Mail (A) (Other Than Nonprofit) — Permit Imprint*, and 3602-PR, *Postage Statement — Standard Mail (A) (Other Than Nonprofit) — Meter or Precanceled Postage Affixed*, should note that the field for “Federal Agency Cost Code,” in the upper left of the form, was transposed between those two forms.

On postage statements for permit imprint mailings, the space on the right end of the line for the “Permit No.” field is used by the field for “Federal Agency Cost Code.”

That field is left open on statements for postage-affixed mailings.

As a result, until corrected forms are issued, mailers can disregard the “Federal Agency Cost Code” field on Form 3602-PR. Mailers who need to can enter the “Federal Agency Cost Code” information in the unmarked blank space described above on Form 3602-R.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**B.** Form 2976 is required. Prepaid mail from a contractor addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.

**B1.** Form 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

**B2.** Form 2976 is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.

**B3.** Form 2976 is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

**B4.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required for all mail weighing over 16 ounces. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear customs declaration, but must be endorsed, "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length

42" .....	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" .....	24" girth
over 44" to 46" .....	20" girth
over 46" to 48" .....	16" girth
Maximum length 48"	

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

checks must be presented. This change will be reflected in the Student Workbook of the updated version of the Standard Window Clerk Training Program, which should be available in November 1996.

### Computer Matching of Employee Data

The Postal Service may disclose limited information about its employees internally, to other federal agencies, or to state or local government agencies in the performance of computer matching programs conducted pursuant to the Privacy Act, as amended by the Computer Matching and Privacy Protection Act of 1988 (Public Law 100-503).

Matching programs usually are conducted to: (1) establish or verify initial or continuing eligibility for federal benefit programs, (2) verify compliance with the requirements of those programs, (3) recoup payments or delinquent debts owed to the federal government, (4) locate absent parents owing child support obligations, or (5) verify compliance with Postal Service policies for the hiring and conduct of its employees.

For example, a matching program may be conducted to identify postal employees who (1) owe delinquent debts to the United States under a program administered by a federal agency, such as a Department of Education student loan program or a Department of Housing and Urban Development home loan program, (2) are receiving excessive food stamp benefits from a particular state as a result of underreporting their income, or (3) are in arrears in child

support obligations. Disclosure of information about employees is limited to that necessary to accomplish the objectives of the matching program.

In accordance with the Privacy Act's provisions, the participant agencies enter into a matching agreement specifying the terms for conducting the match. These terms include the methods an agency will use to verify independently the information obtained through the matching program.

No adverse action may be taken against an individual as a result of the information obtained unless the appropriate notice and opportunity to contest are provided to the individual. These due process requirements are specified in the Privacy Act. Each matching program and agreement is subject to approval and oversight by the Postal Service Data Integrity Board, composed of senior management officials (see Management Instruction AS-353-96-2, *Establishment of USPS Data Integrity Board* (4-11-96)).

## Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 96-15

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail

postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.



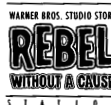

# Riverboats Commemorative Stamps

The Postal Service will issue five 32-cent Riverboats stamps, in a self-adhesive pane of 20 (Item 4486), on August 22, 1996, in Orlando, Florida, in conjunction with STAMPSHOW '96. The stamps go on sale nationwide August 23.

Designed by Dean Ellis of Amagansett, New York, these stamps feature five designs of riverboats that operated from 1860 to the 1900s and represent all five regions of the United States. These commercial, inland boats were chosen for their historical significance and visual appeal and are listed below, along with the river on which they operated:

Robt. E. Lee	Mississippi River
Sylvan Dell	East River/Delaware River
Far West	Missouri River
Rebecca Everingham	Apalachicola-Chattahoochee River
Bailey Gatzert	Columbia River/Puget Sound

This will be the first self-adhesive commemorative pane to be issued by the U.S. Postal Service. To accommodate small and large purchasers, these self-adhesive stamps are being issued in sheetlet format perforated in a wavy design to be separated and sold as single or multiple stamps. The liners are enhanced with tabs for added ease in tearing. Care should be taken by postal personnel and customers to first crease the section of stamps being sold vertically, then horizontally before tearing. The format of self-adhesive stamps issued in the future will be refined to develop the best stamp product possible.

### How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 30 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase the new stamps at their local post office, affix them to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service returns the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark. All orders must be postmarked by September 21, 1996.

The Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center also offers first day covers for new stamp issues and postal stationery items postmarked with the official first day of issue cancellation. Each item has an individual catalog number and

First day covers remain on sale for at least 90 days after the stamps' issuance.

**Distribution**

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive their standard

distribution for a 20-stamps-per-pane issue, rounded up to the nearest master carton size (40,000 stamps).

SDOs and SDNs will make subsequent automatic distributions to post offices for half their standard distribution using Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, and Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. SDOs and SDNs must not distribute stamps to post offices before August 15, 1996.

**Philatelic Requirement**

SDOs and SDNs with authorized philatelic centers will receive automatic distributions of these stamps in ten positions for subsequent distributions to each center:

**Additional Supply**

Post offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO, using a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, or designated SDN, using a separate Form 17-S, *Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition*. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from their APD, using a separate Form 17.

All accountable paper depositories (APDs) will receive 1,240,000 stamps for filling supplemental orders. The Kansas City SDN will receive 1,280,000 stamps.

**Sales Policy**

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale, generally 1 year from the date of issue. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities through their normal ordering procedures.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will not use Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, to make subsequent distribution to post offices for these self-adhesive booklets, Item 6634, as is the usual practice for definitive stamp issues. This was

misstated in the original announcement. To obtain an initial supply of this stamp, all post offices that requisition from SDOs must immediately submit a separate Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their designated SDO. Post offices under the SDN concept must follow their normal procedures for acquiring supplies of this stamp.
