Clean Your Files Day offers an excellent opportunity to establish or enhance relationships with local governments and generate media exposure both on a local and national level. It also provides the opportunity to rally support for workplace recycling programs while significantly increasing the amount of recycled office paper. This event will help the nation reach the goal set by the National Office of Paper Recycling Project of recycling 65 percent of paper by the year 2000.

The Conference of Mayors will be focusing its efforts in cities all across the nation, which will mean extensive national exposure for the Postal Service. But, as always, it will be your efforts on a local level that will make the difference. We need your help in promoting Clean Your Files Day and have prepared the following materials to help you have a successful event at your post office.

PLANNING POINTERS

- Determine the scope of your promotion. This can range from the employees in your office to the entire community. Base your participation on local recycling capabilities.
- Have a clear goal in mind. Examples include establishing a workplace recycling program, providing better education for employees, improving the quality of the fiber collected in your area, increasing the quantity of paper currently collected, or engaging additional businesses to recycle with you.
- Gain the cooperation and support of your local recycling haulers.
- Form a Clean Your Files Day organizing committee. Think about who is going to be involved in the event and invite representatives to plan it. Create a phone and FAX list of all people on the committee.
- Ask your mayor/city manager's office, city/county department of public works, state/local recycling organizations, businesses, Chamber of Commerce, and schools/universities to support and take part in your event.
- Invite Members of Congress or Congressional staff to attend, and if they do, inform the media, Government Relations, and your local Corporate Relations Center.
- Involve employees, management and craft organizations, customer advisory councils, postal customer councils, and community volunteers.
- Include the media. Send public service announcements to local newspapers and TV and radio stations to promote the event (see Media Outreach).
- Devise a method of measuring the results of your efforts.
- Remember, Earth Day is every day. Your recycling program/event can be promoted on April 22, during Earth Week, or any day of the year.

TAKE CARE OF THE EARTH — RECYCLE

The U. S. Postal Service, in partnership with the U. S. Conference of Mayors, is sponsoring Clean Your Files Day, designed to promote workplace paper recycling programs, during the week of Earth Day, April 22, 1998 in cities all across the nation. As an award-winning environmental leader, last year the Postal Service recycled more than a million tons of wastepaper, cardboard, plastics, and other materials, and every year the USPS purchases more than \$160 million in products with recycled content.

A typical American office with 65 employees collects an average of 800 pounds of waste paper in less than six working days. Multiply that by all the companies in America, and you've got a whole lot of trash. And most of that trash is recyclable. In fact, more than 80 percent of it is paper.

Here at (name) Post Office, we are pitching in and cleaning out our old files. Pledging to "lead by example," we will clean our files and recycle office paper we no longer need. I challenge all postal employees to roll up their sleeves, sort through their files, get rid of outdated material, and put the office paper and discarded mail they might ordinarily throw out into recycling bins.

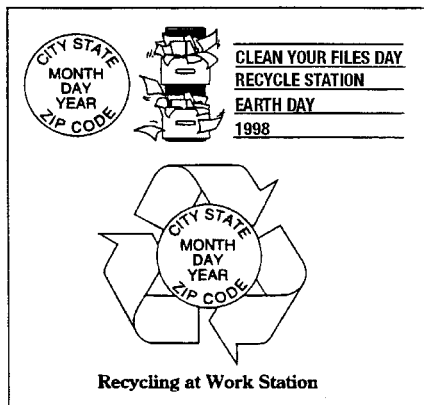

CLEAN YOUR FILES DAY

EVENT IDEAS

- Have the mayor of your city endorse Clean Your Files Day and have the mayor's office issue an official proclamation about CYFD before the event day (see sample proclamation).
- Swear the mayor in as postmaster of the "Clean Your Files Day Special Postal Station." Invite him/her to cancel the first letters using your pictorial cancellation (see sample).
- Present a framed copy of the 1996 Environmental envelope, a letter with the 1996 Endangered Species Stamp, or other environmental stamps or products, postmarked with your pictorial cancellation, in a ceremony to a local group or individual who has been a successful recycler.
- Sponsor a poster or essay contest with your Wee Deliver school or local school district. The winners would be the students who created the best poster or essay about recycling or protecting the environment. Feature the winners at your open house and/or in the post office lobby.
- Reward school groups that bring in the most recyclable paper with a tree. "Save a tree, get a tree."



- Set up a display in your post office lobby with a recycling bin or overflowing file cabinet beside it to advertise your upcoming Clean Your Files Day event.
- Establish collection points for paper from cleaned out files. If your office does not have a recycle bin, take recyclables to a school, club, or store that does recycle.
- Eliminate outdated policies, retire the old eagle, and get rid of old letterhead or other paper not used anymore. Review retention schedules in the Administrative Manual 351.21 and Handbook 305 if you have any questions about what to keep and what to get rid of.
- Hold an open house and invite local environmental groups to pass out their literature.
- Encourage important postal and community VIPs to write editorials about the importance of recycling at work.

When most of us think about improving the environment, we think about preserving the Amazon rain forest, or protecting an exotic species of wild animal from extinction. But taking care of the environment can be much closer to home. As the saying goes: think globally, act locally. Protecting the environment can be as simple as cleaning out a file cabinet.

That's why the Postal Service, in partnership with the U. S. Conference of Mayors, is sponsoring Clean Your Files Day during the week of Earth Day, April 22, 1998, to encourage people all across the nation to clean their files and recycle the paper they don't need. While helping the environment may seem like a monumental task, an action as basic as putting unwanted files in the local recycling bin rather than in the trash can make a real difference.

How does it make a difference? Besides reducing the amount of trash we dispose of, recycling helps to save resources, water, and energy. Recycling one ton of office paper saves 7,000 gallons of water and 4,200 kilowatt-hours of electricity!

And if you think a ton seems like a lot of trash, consider this: a typical office with 65 employees collects an average of 800 pounds of waste paper in less than a week, and paper makes up as much as 80 percent of waste in an office. When you add up all the companies across the United States, that's a whole lot of trash!

Here in (post office/community name), we have our own story to tell (mention local postal/community recycling successes, individuals who volunteer for local projects, etc.)

Earth Day is a yearly celebration, and in communities across the country, people gather together to clean up litter, plant trees, and spread information about the ways we can work together to save the earth. Let's all work together to make this Earth Day and Clean Your Files Day a success. And let's keep the spirit of Earth Day alive and well each day of the year.

Please join us as we celebrate the planet Earth and work together to preserve it for future generations.



MEDIA OUTREACH

The fill-in news release featured on this page is designed to help generate coverage in your local media outlets. You should customize the release with local information and quotes and include a local contact's name and number on the top of it. The additional materials in this kit will help you tell the Postal Service's environmental story.

To prepare for your event, you should:

- Invite television and print reporters to your post office to cover special events such as the mayor's visit, presentations, postmaster or postal official physically cleaning files and "leading by example."
 - Reinforce the message that CYFD is an effort with local roots, something in which the community has an important stake.
 - Designate a drop-off container in a busy plaza or central location where all participants can deposit their accumulated files at the end of the day, and invite the media to be there for the drop-off. This can serve as an excellent background for a press conference hosted by postmaster and mayor. The mayor, sworn in as postmaster for the day, also could perform a ribbon-cutting ceremony.
 - When contacting the media, be prepared with all the information necessary to explain the days' events and convey a clear message on current postal recycling practices and the goals of the CYFD event.
 - Ask local VIPs to lend their support, and urge them to contact the media.
 - Designate a person to serve as spokesperson about CYFD. He/she should help coordinate interviews with local postmaster/officials.
- Distribute release to daily newspaper reporters who regularly cover postal/community activities, television consumer reporters, and radio news directors two/three days before your event (weekly papers need at least a week's notice).
 - Place a follow-up call to the local media contacts to confirm they received the release. Ask if they need any additional information.
 - Provide radio stations and cable companies with short public service announcements of the event.
 - List the event on community calendars.
 - Send all reports of media coverage and clippings to your area Corporate Relations Center.

As Earth Day approaches, many (city) residents are looking for a way to do something beneficial for the environment. I'd like to suggest that they join me in recovering a valuable natural resource: the unwanted paper in our files.

Old paper a natural resource? Many of us probably don't stop to think about it, but old paper — like unwanted files — is a valuable raw material recyclers use to make recycled paper products. And recycling just one ton of office paper saves 7,000 gallons of water and 4,200 kilowatts of electricity. One ton of paper might seem like a lot until you consider that a typical office of 65 employees collects 800 tons of paper in just about one week.

That's why the Postal Service, in partnership with the U.S. Conference of Mayors, has designated a day during Earth Day Week as National Clean Your Files Day. Here in (name of city), we have designated (date) as official Clean Your Files Day. All postal employees will take time out to clean their files and throw away files and paper they no longer need into recycling bins. I encourage the entire community to help us celebrate this worthwhile event.

U. S. POSTAL SERVICE ENVIRONMENTAL FACTS

Recycling and Waste Prevention

- During the week of April 22, 1998, Earth Day, the Postal Service will lead the nation in "Clean Your Files Day," an event emphasizing recycling and buying recycled materials.
- Since September 1995, the White House has presented the Postal Service with 20 "Closing the Circle Awards" for its pollution prevention and recycling accomplishments. The Postal Service also has been recognized with numerous regional, state, and local awards for its environmental practices.
- In March 1997, the Postal Service won the Direct Marketing Association Rodale Award for "Making Mail More Recyclable."
- Mail can be recycled as mixed paper waste, so there's no reason for any mail to end up in landfills. More than 150 million Americans reside in communities that recycle mixed paper waste.
- Shopping by mail saves millions of vehicle trips that contribute to air pollution and gasoline use.
- Last year, the USPS recycled about one million tons of wastepaper, cardboard, plastics, cans, and other material. About \$8 million in revenue was generated from recycling activities in 1997.
- The USPS has reduced its energy usage by nearly 10 percent since 1991 and recently won five awards from the Department of Energy for its energy initiatives.

Fleet Management

- The USPS has the nation's largest compressed natural gas (CNG) delivery fleet, with approximately 7,500 of its Long-Life Vehicles converted. Electric and ethanol-powered vehicles also are being tested.
- The USPS is a national leader in the use of re-refined oil and retreaded tires. More than 100,000 postal vehicles currently use re-refined oil, and more than 100,000 retreaded tires are purchased annually.

Purchasing

- The USPS has received an EPA award for its LED Energy Star® exit sign program. Over the last year, the Postal Service has purchased 25,000 Energy Star® exit signs, saving over \$500,000 annually.
- The USPS has placed more than \$150 million in Energy Star® computer systems in service over the last two years.
- The USPS annually purchases more than \$160 million worth of products with recycled content.
- Approximately four million recyclable plastic pallets are in use. Longer-life plastic trays and pallets are replacing limited use cardboard trays and wooden pallets. New hampers and mail containers contain 50% recycled material.
- Aqueous-based cleaners are replacing hazardous chemicals in many cleaning and maintenance operations. The use of 17 targeted chemicals has been reduced by more than 50%.
- In 1995, the USPS received an Innovative New Product or Material Award from the National Recycling Coalition for its efforts to incorporate recycled products into its procurement programs.

Stamp Products

- Retail and philatelic products — including stamped envelopes, postal cards, stamp booklet covers, packaging materials, and Express Mail and Priority Mail envelopes — contain recycled material.
- New water-based inks used to print stamps do not contain lead or other "heavy" metals, and new "self-stick" stamps use water-removable adhesives.
- On April 20, 1996, a "Save Our Environment" stamped envelope was issued. The envelope is made of 100% recycled content with post-consumer material made from recycled mail.
- On October 2, 1996, "Endangered Species Stamps" were issued on 15 endangered animals, promoting environmental awareness to help protect these scarce creatures.

BACKGROUND

Clean Your Files Day (CYFD) is an annual event organized by the U. S. Conference of Mayors in partnership with the Postal Service that encourages employees to increase the amount of paper recycled in the workplace by cleaning and purging old unnecessary files.

The first national Clean Your Files Day was organized by Recycling at Work, a campaign of the National Office Paper Recycling Project, a public-private partnership managed by the U. S. Conference of Mayors. It was launched during Earth Day Week in 1995 in Chicago where participating employees recycled up to 12 times their normal rate of collection. In one building alone, 3,500 employees recovered 27 tons of office paper in one day.

By encouraging employees to purge old files, CYFD hopes to increase recycling of office paper and help meet Recycle at Work's goal of recycling 65 percent of all office paper by the year 2000.

Last year during Earth Day Week, the Postal Service held CYFD events in post offices across the nation.

Why Recycle?

To save energy. It takes 60 percent less energy to manufacture paper from recycled stock than from virgin materials; every ton of recycled paper saves 4,200 kilowatt hours of energy, enough to meet the daily energy needs of 4,000 people.

To save water. Making paper from recycled paper stock uses 15 percent less water than making paper "from scratch"; recycling one ton of paper saves 7,000 gallons of water, enough to supply the daily needs of almost 30 households.

To save resources. Recycling paper saves numerous other resources.

To reduce garbage. Every ton of paper not put into a landfill saves three cubic yards of landfill space.

Practice the three Rs: Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle

Here are some things you can do:

Reduce paper usage. Use both sides of the page when you're making copies or rough drafts of documents or letters.

Reuse dining utensils. Bring your lunch to work in reusable containers instead of paper plates, cups and utensils.

Recycle newspapers and paper at home and at work.

Buy recycled products. You not only reduce pollution, you will help boost the demand for recycled products.

Recycle mail. The EPA has categorized mail as mixed paper, and it is all recyclable. Encourage your customers, families, and friends to recycle their used mail, too. There is no reason for any mail to end up in landfills.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

(For internal/external use)

Q: What is Clean Your Files Day?

A: Clean Your Files Day (CYFD) is an annual event organized by the U. S. Conference of Mayors that encourages employees to increase the amount of paper recycled in the work place by purging old unnecessary files. The first CYFD was launched during Earth Day Week in 1995 in Chicago where participating employees recovered up to 12 times their normal rate of collection. In one building alone, 3,500 employees recovered 27 tons of office paper in one day. The Postal Service partnered with the Conference of Mayors on the promotion of a CYFD event on Earth Day 1997 and is continuing that partnership in 1998.

Q: Why have a Clean Your Files Day?

A: The Postal Service and the Conference of Mayors are serious about recycling. Setting this day apart provides an opportunity for office workers to observe Earth Day, while at the same time learning about their office recycling program. It is a fun way to raise awareness while doing a little spring cleaning. CYFD will encourage employees to increase paper recycling and remind them of the importance of protecting the environment by using less paper and recycling what they do use. Recycling saves resources, energy, water, and reduces garbage, plus there is also the potential to save money both in document storage costs and waste disposal. Participation in this event has tremendous potential for improving existing recycling programs and helping the nation reach the 65 percent office paper recycling goal by the year 2000 set by the National Office Paper Recycling Project.

Q: What is the Postal Service's involvement in CYFD?

A: As a national partner, the Postal Service is mobilizing staff to clean and recycle their files and encouraging postmasters to team up with mayors in promoting this event in the community. The Postal Service has also created a special cancellation using the CYFD logo that some communities are using as part of their celebration.

Q: Why is the Postal Service involved in CYFD?

A: The Postal Service is an award-winning national leader in protecting the environment and is involved in CYFD both to be a good corporate citizen and to keep costs down. The Postal Service has demonstrated that you can recycle and save money, too.

Q: Why is it important to recycle at work?

A: People often recycle at home, but studies show very few people recycle at work. A typical company with 65 employees collects an average of 800 pounds of waste paper in about one working week, and paper often comprises as much as 80 percent of waste in an office. So when you add up all the companies across the United States, that's a whole lot of trash. If the USPS can encourage people to recycle at work, it can make a significant contribution to the protection of the environment.

Q: Isn't mail bad for the environment?

A: No. Mail is made up of mixed paper that can be recycled, so there's no reason for any mail to end up in landfills. Shopping by mail also saves trips in cars, which contributes to a decrease in air pollution and energy use. That's why some people call advertising mail a "mall in a mailbox."

Q: Why does the Postal Service recycle?

A: For two reasons: because it is cost-effective and because it is the right thing to do. The Postal Service has clearly demonstrated that an organization can both protect the environment and the bottom line at the same time. In 1997, the Postal Service made more than \$8 million by recycling and saved an additional \$10 million through avoiding the cost of disposing of those materials.

Q: In what ways does the Postal Service recycle?

A: The Postal Service recycling program promotes pollution prevention through waste reduction, reuse, and recycling. More than 100 tons of materials were recycled by the Postal Service last year. USPS also used more than \$160 million worth of products last year that contain recycled material. We are a national leader in the use of re-refined oil and retreaded tires. More than 100,000 USPS vehicles currently use re-refined oil and retreaded tires.

Q: Why was April chosen for Clean Your Files Day?

A: Earth Day is celebrated on April 22, so it was a logical time for a day about recycling and preserving the environment. Spring also is a time of renewal and new beginnings and provides the perfect opportunity to launch a spring cleaning to dust out the cobwebs, clean out our files, and start fresh. But, it's important to remember that we can't just work to protect the environment in April. We must work together to keep the spirit of Earth Day alive every day of the year.

Administrative Services

ALL IRT, WRU, CTT, DEBIT/CREDIT CARD AND CASH REGISTER OFFICES

Setting Clocks for Daylight Saving Time

The correct system time in integrated retail terminals (IRTs) and weighing and rating units (WRUs) is critical because their internal clocks are used to verify Express Mail acceptance times, service commitments, and network status. The IRT system time also is printed on customer receipts and employee reports. Computerized Tracking and Tracing (CTT) scanner clocks are used to record Express Mail arrival and delivery times. It is important that the Debit/Credit Card Terminal clocks be set to the correct day, date, and time so that the possibility of accepting an expired card is reduced.

Managers must ensure that before opening for business on Monday, April 6, 1998, the clocks in all IRTs, WRUs, CTT scanners, cash registers, and debit and credit card terminals under their control are set *forward* 1 hour to reflect the change (in most locations) to daylight saving time. Facilities with Saturday night operations should reset the time as soon as possible after the 2 a.m. start time, Sunday, April 5, 1998.

On the UNISYS III Supervisor Disk, select menu item 11, Set System Date and Time, from the Control Menu. On the UNISYS II Supervisor Disk, select item 10, Set System Date and Time. On the MOS IRT Control Disk, select menu item 5, Change Fees and Tables, from the Main Menu, then select item 5, Set Unit Date and Time, from the Change Fees and Tables Menu.

Laser Scanner

For a laser scanner, follow these steps:

1. Press the CTRL (control) key and the T key. The current date and time appear.
2. Press the CLR (clear) key. A prompt to enter a date appears. Enter the current date as MMDDYY (example: 040698).
3. Press the ENTER key. The scanner then prompts the user to enter the time. Enter correct daylight saving time in military format (examples: 8 a.m. = 0800, 1:30 p.m. = 1330).
4. Press the ENTER key. The scanner returns to the first screen.
5. Press the CTRL key and the T key to verify the time and date.
6. Press the ENTER key if correct; if not, reenter correct information.

WRU Clocks

For the WRU, follow these steps:

1. From the Maintenance menu, select item 2, Change System Data.
2. From the Change System Data Menu, the Set System Date and Time screen appears. Select item 1, Change System Date and Time.
3. Press the YES key to accept the current date. The time appears. Press NO to clear the time.
4. Enter correct daylight saving time in military format (examples: 8 a.m.= 0800, 1:30 p.m.= 1330).
5. Press YES to save the corrected time. The Change System Data Menu appears.
6. Verify the time and date and correct all errors.

Debit and Credit Card Terminals

For debit and credit card terminals, follow these steps:

Display	Action
U.S. Postal Service	Press * and 3 at the same time. (If you are having trouble, simply hold * and tap 3.)
Diagnostics	Press ALPHA.
Year	Key in the current year. Press ENTER.
Month	Key in a number 1-12 for current month. Press ENTER.
Date	Key in a number 1-31 for current date. Press ENTER.
Hour	Key in number 1-24 for current hour. Press ENTER.
Minutes	Key in number of minutes 0-59. Press ENTER.
Seconds	Key in number of seconds or press ENTER to bypass.

You must make an entry for each selection even if the display is correct. To verify the existing date and time of the clock in the terminal, follow the steps below:

Retail Consolidation Unit (RCU)

All IRT sites must coordinate the changing of system time with the RCU. In most cases, IRT units will change the system time before opening for business Monday April 6, 1998. In the case of units that open for business on Sunday April 5, 1998, the IRT windows must be configured to remain "open" for a longer period to compensate for the time difference. The District RCU coordinator must coordinate the changing of the system time on the VAX where the RCU application is running with the VAX system manager. This could be the local IS or Raleigh FCSC.

The *Administrative Support Manual (ASM)* 353 is updated to include the inspector general as a Data Integrity Board member as required by the Computer Matching and Privacy Protection Act of 1988 (Public Law 100-503). Effective immediately, the ASM is revised as follows:

353.344 Data Integrity Board

a. *Responsibilities.* The Data Integrity Board oversees Postal Service computer matching activities. Its principal function is to review and approve all written agreements for receipt or disclosure of Postal Service records for matching programs to ensure compliance with the Privacy Act, and all relevant statutes, regulations, and guidelines. In addition, the Board annually reviews matching programs in which the Postal Service has participated to determine compliance with applicable laws, regulations, and agreements; com-

pires a biannual report of matching activities; and performs review and advisory functions relating to records accuracy, record keeping, and disposal practices, and other computer matching activities. The manager of Payroll Accounting and Records serves as secretary of the Board, maintains the executed computer matching agreements, and performs administrative activities for the Board.

b. *Composition.* The Privacy Act requires that the senior official responsible for implementation of agency Privacy Act policy and the inspector general serve on the Board. The Board is designated by the postmaster general, as follows:

- (1) Vice President, Controller, Finance (Chairperson).
- (2) Inspector General.
- (3) Chief Postal Inspector.
- (4) Vice President, Human Resources.
- (5) General Counsel and Vice President.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. **Exceptions:** Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Known Mailers may use either Form 2976-A on each item or Form 2976 (or facsimile) with a mail manifest in conjunction with a packing list. Form 2976 must state "packing list enclosed." The packing list must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO/FPO ZIP Code of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value. The packing list should be enclosed in the parcel or attached to the outside of the parcel. The mail manifest which itemizes all parcels that a Known Mailer deposits will be given to Postal Official at Business Mail Acceptance Unit. Form 2976 may be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in US dollars) must be enclosed in the package.

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

 42" 72" length and girth combined
 over 42" to 44" 24" girth
 over 44" to 46" 20" girth
 over 46" to 48" 16" girth
 Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 11 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

Collecting Nonsufficient Fund (NSF) Checks and Express Mail Corporate Accounts (EMCAs)

Effective April 1, 1998, returned checks for NSFs and delinquent EMCAs should no longer be sent to CSC Credit Services for collection. All checks and EMCAs should be sent to:

The Postal Service has entered into a national contract with the above agency to provide debt collection services. Dun and Bradstreet must be used as the collection agency for the Postal Service unless approval is obtained from Headquarters to use another agency. Continue to use existing procedures in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, with the exception of the changes noted below. Additional changes will be made to the check collection procedures and will appear in a future *Postal Bulletin* article.

The following changes apply with the new collection agency.

1. PS Forms 2131, *Uncollectable Check Report*, and 2134, *EMCA Uncollectible*: You will be notified when these forms are available at the material distribution centers (MDCs). Offices may make copies of the sample forms shown on pages 35 and 37 and use them until the revised forms are available. Duplicate copies of PS Forms 2131 and 2134 sent to the collection agency should be maintained for your records. Discontinue using the sample forms when printed forms are available at the MDCs.
2. Surcharge: Do not add a surcharge to the check amount on PS Form 2131 when submitting the check to the collection agency. The collection agency will add the allowable fee. The accounting entries that are made when a \$100 check is submitted to the collection agency are as follows:

AIC 363/814 \$100 AIC 615 \$100

Note: The fee amount is not added to AIC 615. The collection agency will add the fee when the funds are collected from the customer.

3. Automated Return Check Maintenance System (ARCMS): Offices using ARCMS may continue to use the automated PS Form 2131. When submitting PS Form 2131 to the collection agency, the surcharge field must be blank. Offices using ARCMS must go into the file maintenance option to change the vendor's name and address. If problems are encountered when making these changes, call Minneapolis Customer Support at 1-800-USPSHELP.
4. Local Collections: Offices that collect returned checks locally should continue to collect the surcharge fee as allowed by the state (\$25 if no state law exists).
5. Sign 145, Check Acceptance Policy: This will be updated to show the surcharge fees are charged under the new contract. A sample sign with the new language is shown on page 39. It may be used to overlay the existing sign until new signs are printed.

Coins; bank notes; currency notes (paper money); securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver (manufactured or not); precious stones; jewelry; and other valuable articles are prohibited in registered and unregistered letter packages, small packets, air and surface parcels, and Express Mail International Service shipments that are mailed to Australia.

On March 4, 1998, the United States Postal Service (USPS) entered into an International Customized Mail Service agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the USPS hereby makes public the following information about that service agreement:

- a. **Term:** March 4, 1998, through March 31, 2000.
- b. **Type of Mail:** Printed Matter and Small Packets: Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth by the USPS for all qualifying Global Direct Canada Advertising Mail and to the requirements set forth in the IMM for all qualifying ISAL mail.
- c. **Destination Countries:** Worldwide.
- d. **Service Provided by the U.S. Postal Service:** The USPS has agreed to (1) furnish the mailer with the sacks, tags, and other supplies that the mailer is required to use for Qualifying Mail; (2) provide the mailer or mailing agent with the training necessary for them to prepare ICM mail in conformity with the requirements for Qualifying Mail; (3) arrange with air and surface carriers, as appropriate for Qualifying Mail to be transported internationally for delivery by Canadian Postal authority.
- e. **Minimum Volume Commitments:** Qualifying ISAL Mail: 15,000,000 pieces.
Qualifying Global Direct Canada Admail: 18,000,000 pieces.

- f. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to (1) package mail in accordance with the applicable USPS requirements based on the class of mail and the mail preparation and sorting requirements for qualifying Global Direct Canada Admail, prepare qualifying ISAL mail in accordance with requirements set forth in the IMM; (2) pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with the IMM using a system approved by the appropriate Rates and Classification Service Center (RCSC); (3) maintain an established number of pieces during the service agreement, (4) tender qualifying mail to the USPS at the designated USPS facility; and (5) coordinate a schedule of mailings and provide notifications as specified in the service agreement.
- g. **Rate:** ISAL: 15 percent off nondiscounted published rates

- b. **Type of Mail:** Letters: Every item must conform to the size requirements and must comply with the design requirements set forth by the USPS. All qualifying mail will weigh 30.4 grams.
- c. **Destination Country:** Mexico.
- d. **Service Provided by the U.S. Postal Service:** The USPS has agreed to (1) furnish the mailer with the sacks, tags, and other supplies that the mailer is required to use for Qualifying Mail; (2) provide the mailer or mailing agent with the training necessary for them to prepare ICM mail in conformity with the requirements for Qualifying Mail; (3) accept and verify through the Detached Mail Unit located at each mailing agent; (4) provide direct air transportation from the United States to Mexico City, Mexico; (5) tender the mail to the postal administration of Mexico upon its arrival.
- e. **Minimum Volume Commitments:** Letters: 250,000.
- f. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to (1) package mail in accordance with the applicable sequence based on the class of mail and the mail preparation and sorting requirements of the foreign postal administration; (2) pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with the IMM using a system approved by the appropriate Rates and Classification Service Center (RCSC); (3) provide a measurement system, acceptable to the RCSC, as specified in the service agreement; (4) maintain an established number of pieces over the course of the service agreement, (5) tender qualifying mail to the USPS at the pick-up point of the designated USPS facility; and (6) coordinate a schedule of mailings and provide notifications as specified in the service agreement.
- g. **Rate:** Letter Mail: \$0.25 per piece for postcoded mail and \$0.54 per piece for non-postcoded mail.

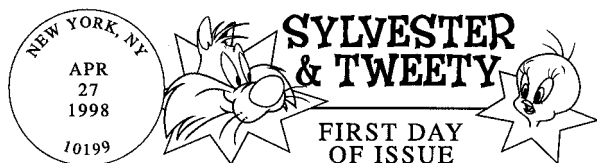

Distribution

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp distribution networks (SDNs) will receive approximately one-quarter of their standard automatic distribution based on the distribution quantities requested for self-adhesive booklets. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size (2,000 self-adhesive souvenir sheets).

SDOs and SDNs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to post offices for one-quarter of their standard automatic distribution quantities using PS Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice*, and PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*. SDOs and SDNs must not distribute stamps to post offices before April 20, 1998.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs and SDNs with authorized philatelic centers will provide a subsequent automatic distribution to each philatelic center from their standard automatic distribution quantity.

Additional Supply

Post offices requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO or SDN using a PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from the appropriate accountable paper depository (APD) using PS Form 17.

APDs and SDNs will have the following quantity of Sylvester and Tweety souvenir sheets available for filling supplemental orders: Kansas City SDN, 320,000; San Francisco, Chicago, Memphis, Washington, DC, and New York APDs, 310,000 each; Dulles SDN, 220,000; and Denver APD, 200,000.

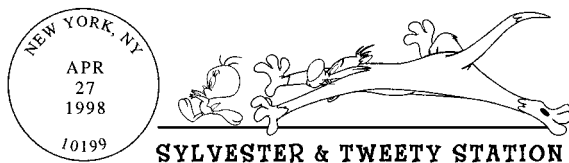
Also, beginning April 27, an additional 10,000,000 Sylvester and Tweety souvenir sheets will be made available for filling supplemental orders. Direct shipments to all SDOs and SDNs in proportionate quantities are scheduled for completion no later than May 19.

Sales Policy

All post offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as quantities are available, customer demand exists, or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, post offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

To obtain the authorized Sylvester & Tweety pictorial cancellation art and guidelines on how to finish the design, please contact your district stamp and retail coordinator.

The Sylvester & Tweety station pictorial cancellation art was developed exclusively for commemorating Sylvester & Tweety stamp events and may not be used for nonrelated events. Additionally, this art may not be altered in any way, except as instructed in the guidelines.

As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking services widely known to collectors through advance national publicity to avoid such postmarks being available only to small groups of people. Therefore, all pictorial cancellations must be reported to Stamp Development 3 weeks prior to local events so that advance national publicity may be arranged.

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*


All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items sub-


mitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.


Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).


After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.
