PUBLICATION 223 CORRECTIONS

PS Forms 3854-A and 3883-A

Please make the following corrections to Publication 223, *Directives and Forms Catalog* (November 1997):

For PS Form 3854-A, *Registered Mail Dispatch Bill* (2-part set), PSN 7530-02-000-9085, the correct unit of issue is carton (CTN) (1,850 sets each).

For PS Form 3883-A, *Firm Delivery Receipt* (2-part continuous), PSN 7530-02-000-9100, change the unit of issue from "each" to "carton." There are 1,600 forms per carton.

In addition, special care should be taken when ordering forms issued in a pad. Quantities per pad vary and when the unit of issue is "pad," some offices have been requisitioning by the sheet. For example, for PS Form 1813, *Late Leaving and Returning Report—First Carrier Delivery Trip*, the unit of issue is pad and each pad contains 100 sheets. If you order 10, you will receive 1,000 sheets.

ASM REVISION

Cost Tracking and Estimation, Offsets, and Payments in Connection With Breast Cancer Research Special Postage Stamp

Effective immediately, the *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) is amended to include a new section 645, which assigns certain responsibilities related to the Stamp Out Breast Cancer Act, Pub. L. No. 105-41, 111 Stat. 1119 (1997). The Stamp Out Breast Cancer Act provides that the Postal Service make available a special postage stamp offered at a special rate of First-Class Mail postage to enable the public to make contributions to fund breast cancer research. The price of the special postage stamp is the First-Class Mail Single-Piece rate plus a differential, as determined by the Governors of the United States Postal Service.

The Act empowers the Postal Service to issue regulations to permit the recovery of reasonable costs incurred by the Postal Service, as determined by the Postal Service, in executing its responsibilities under the Act. These costs may be offset against the revenues received from the sale of the special postage stamp above the First-Class Mail rate of postage. The Act directs the Postal Service to transfer the remainder to the National Institutes of Health and to the Department of Defense.

For the Postal Service to make an informed determination of the costs reasonably incurred, the Postal Service should undertake to maintain records of its costs, or, as appropriate, estimate its costs, in executing its responsibilities under the Act. ASM 645 identifies certain offices within the Postal Service that bear responsibility for maintaining or estimating cost information in connection with the stamp. The Postal Service has identified costs it believes should be estimated or maintained to execute its responsibilities under the Act; however, ASM 645 does not spell out the types or amounts of

"reasonable costs incurred by the Postal Service" that should be offset against revenues collected from the differential. That decision is to be made at a later date by the Postal Service.

ASM 645 is intended only for internal delegation of responsibility and is not intended to confer any substantive rights upon any other person or entity. This revision will be incorporated in an incremental update of the ASM found via the USPS Intranet located at <http://blue.usps.gov>. 645.1	Offsets and Payments					

The Postal Service is to determine its reasonable costs in executing its responsibilities pursuant to the Stamp Out Breast Cancer Act, Pub. L. No. 105-41, 111 Stat. 1119 (1997), (codified at 39 U.S.C. 414). These costs may be offset against the revenue received through sale of the special postage stamp in excess of the product of the total units sold and the First-Class Mail Single-Piece rate under Domestic Mail Classification Schedule (DMCS) 221.21. Any reasonable costs offset by the Postal Service under 645 shall be retained

by the Postal Service, along with revenue from the sale of the special postage stamp that represents the product of the total units sold and the First-Class Mail Single-Piece rate under DMCS 221.21. The Postal Service is to pay the National Institutes of Health, at least twice each one-year period, 70 percent of the remainder of (a) the revenue from the sale of the special postage stamp less (b) the sum of (i) an amount to recover the costs of the Postal Service as determined by it under 645 and (ii) the product of the total number of units sold and the First-Class Mail Single-Piece rate under DMCS 221.21; the remaining 30 percent of this amount is to be paid, at least twice each one-year period, to the Department of Defense.

Service Weapons and Firearms Authorization

Effectively immediately, *Administrative Support Manual (ASM) 276* is amended to indicate that the inspector general shares control with the chief postal inspector when authorizing the issuance of service weapons and firearms. Further, the personnel in the Office of Inspector General are added to those authorized to carry firearms on postal property. A new subsection is added to indicate that postal employees who carry unauthorized firearms while on official duty, either on or off postal premises, are violating postal rules and regulations. This revision will be incorporated in an incremental update of the ASM found via the USPS Intranet site at <http://blue.usps.gov>. 276.1	Issuance of Firearms					

The issuance of service weapons and firearms authorizations is controlled by the chief postal inspector and inspector general and is limited to postal inspectors, special agents, and uniformed postal police officers.

276.2 Violations of Firearms Security**272.21 Having Firearms on Postal Property**

Firearms on postal property — other than those legally mailed or those carried by authorized Inspection Service and Inspector General personnel; by persons specifically authorized in writing by the chief postal inspector, inspector in charge, or inspector general; or by recognized law enforcement officers — are in violation of the rules and regulations for conduct on postal property (see the *Postal Operations Manual*; Poster 7, *Rules and Regulations Governing Conduct on Postal Property*; and Poster 158, *Possession of Firearms and Other Dangerous Weapons on Postal Property Is Prohibited by Law*).

276.22 Carriage of Firearms by Postal Employees

Postal employees carrying firearms while on official duty either on or off postal premises — other than those who are authorized by the chief postal inspector or by the inspector general — are in violation of the rules and regulations for the conduct of postal employees.

DELIVERY SERVICES REMINDER

Delivery Services Policy Reminder — Parcel Delivery

The Postal Service continues to receive reports from mailers and concerned customers regarding nondelivery of parcels, particularly in rural areas. The complaints are that some carriers are delivering one package a day to an address instead of all the packages received; some are placing a PS Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt (pkg of 250)* in the customer's mailbox and not actually attempting delivery and, even worse, others are refusing to deliver the parcel and requiring the customer to pick it up at the post office.

City carriers are required to deliver parcels to the door unless parcel lockers are available or the item is too large to fit in the locker. Rural carriers are required to deliver ordinary parcels to the customer's door if the parcel is too large for the mail receptacle and the residence is located within one-half mile of the carrier's line of travel with a passable road leading to the house. If the customer is not home, the carrier, with written permission from the customer or authorization of the mailer, may leave the parcel at the customer's door or by the mail receptacle as long as there is reasonable security and the parcel is protected from the weather. Rural carriers can still sound their horn and attempt to attract the customer to the mail receptacle to receive the parcel. However, in the event the customer does not come to the box, the carrier is required to go up to one-half mile on a passable road, or drive to the customer's business or residence, dismount, and knock on the customer's door to attempt delivery.

At centralized delivery locations where parcel lockers are in place, the carrier may use the parcel locker to deliver the ordinary parcel without first going to the door. If the carrier has a parcel that will not fit into the locker or has more parcels than lockers, the carrier must attempt delivery to the door for those parcels as long as the residence meets the one-half mile rule.

In apartment buildings, carriers may use lobby phones, parcel lockers, parcel acceptance by building desk or office personnel, or other procedures that are found in many multi-tenant buildings. If no alternate procedure exists or cannot be established, the carrier must attempt door delivery of the parcel.

Larger parcels, while cumbersome, should be carried daily. Leaving the parcel behind and just taking out a PS Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, for the customer does not fulfill our obligations toward delivery.

Carrier Release Program

The Carrier Release Program was introduced as a means for making it more convenient for our customers to receive parcels. Parcel mailers who choose this option must either endorse their parcels, "Carrier — Leave If No Response," or apply a Label 235, *Carrier Release*, which carries the same message. As with any parcel, carriers must attempt delivery to the customer's door whenever a parcel does not fit completely within the mail receptacle or parcel locker, as applicable.

If the customer is not available to receive the parcel, and it is properly endorsed, the mailer expects the parcel to be left at the customer's location. Unless a customer has specifically requested that no parcels be left, the carrier should leave the parcel in a relatively secure area that also is protected from the weather, for example, behind a storm door, or with an apartment manager or attendant.

Carriers are not liable for possible loss or damage under these circumstances. However, mailers who use this endorsement understand that there are areas where the Postal Service will not leave parcels for security or weather-related reasons. The Postal Service and parcel mailers expect carriers to use their best judgment when leaving parcels with the "Carrier Release" endorsement. If there is not a suitable location to leave a parcel, leave a Form 3849, *Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt*, instead.

Automatic Redelivery/PS Form 3849, Delivery Notice/Reminder/Receipt

When a customer is not home to receive a parcel and it cannot be left, carriers must either: (1) leave Form 3849 or, (2) if the customer is normally home, bring the parcel back the next day (without leaving a Form 3849) using the procedures listed below.

- Under the Automatic Redelivery Program, if a parcel is not an accountable item, and the addressee is normally home to receive parcels, the carrier simply initials and dates the parcel and brings it back to the office for attempted delivery the next day.
- If the customer is still not home the next day, then a Form 3849 is left.

Form 3849 has been redesigned to reflect a greater emphasis on redelivery. When Form 3849 is left and the customer calls to make arrangements to have the package redelivered, greater effort should be given to bringing the parcel back out to the customer. In the past, too much emphasis has been placed on customers coming to the post office to pick up parcels. The Postal Service wants to stress its ability to redeliver. As an example, redelivery can be to a neighbor if a customer finds it convenient. What is important is that our customers become aware of their options and that we all do our jobs in satisfying them. However, when customers request redelivery, remember that the half-mile rule is still applicable for rural customers.

For parcels that are not picked up or called for, a second notice is sent after 5 days. If there is no response within 5 days after the second notice, and no retention period is specified by the sender, the parcel is treated as undeliverable.

Mailers may specify a longer retention period for the parcel for up to 30 days after the first notice (See *Postal Operations Manual* [POM] 617.33). If mailers have specified longer retention periods within the guidelines of the POM, we are obligated to comply with those specifications. This does not apply to retention or return of mail addressed to post office box holders or to the handling of "hold" mail, held at the request of the addressee. The regulations which govern mail addressed to post office box holders are contained in POM 683.26f and DMM F030.5 and the guidelines for Holding Mail at Addressee's Request are found in POM 611.9.

Postmasters and delivery managers must ensure compliance with these procedures.

Publication 304, *Information Desk*, Now Available at MDCs

Publication 304, *Information Desk* (September 1997), is now available at the material distribution centers. Publication 304 is shrink-wrapped and includes a set of labeled separator tabs. The material is three-hole punched and ready to be assembled in the binder that was part of the original distribution. A binder does not accompany this update; any 1 1/2" binder will accommodate the material for those persons ordering for the first time.

An earlier, unnumbered version of Publication 304 was distributed in December 1995 to postal employees who work with customers on a regular basis. The hard copy reference book was produced in direct response to a field idea. The research confirmed the need for better and simpler information about postal business and the content evolved from reviews, comments, and recommendations from postal people. This second version has received additional support from focus group response and input by postal customers.

NEW SOFTWARE

Direct Mail Manager

Small businesses can now experience the power and benefits of direct mail through a new software application from Microsoft.

“Direct Mail Manager” is a new Microsoft wizard application contained in the latest release of Office '97, Small Business Edition Upgrade (version 2.0). It combines known software functionality (MS Word, MS Publisher), Internet access and business partners, including the Postal Service, to put direct mail accessibility right on the desktops of small businesses. It gives small businesses powerful desktop tools for creating, addressing, printing, mailing, and managing direct mailings.

The Postal Service played two roles as a partner to Microsoft in the development of the software. First, through the addition of an Internet connection, customers can access the USPS ZIP+4 national address database for cleaning their address lists. Second, the Postal Service provided an electronic version of the direct mail primer, “The Business Guide to Advertising with Direct Mail,” as an accompaniment to the application software.

USPS is not selling this software, but it is important for you to know about it for two reasons. First, you may want to tell customers about this useful software. Second, users of Direct Mail Manager constitute new business customers for the Postal Service. They may need a little additional “hand-holding” early on, and if you know their needs and concerns, you will be better able to help them and ensure that they will be happy, successful, repeat customers.

Following is information about Direct Mail Manager features that may be of value to your customers and to you as you help them.

Direct Mail Manager Features:

- Available as an upgrade to Microsoft Office '97 Small Business Edition, the software sells for around \$250. Direct Mail Manager went on sale in April. It will soon come as part of the installed operating system on many PCs. Direct Mail Manager shows up as an icon on the desktop. *(Neither the box nor the documentation makes mention of Direct Mail Manager, because the same product is sold in Canada as well as the U.S., and they don't yet have address hygiene for Canada. This makes it difficult for people to learn about the product and spot it in stores. Fortunately, wizard technology makes it pretty easy to use.)*
- Allows users to import address lists containing up to 3,500 addresses, and verifies the addresses against the Postal Service's national ZIP+4 database via the Internet. Where necessary, it appends the correct ZIP+4 code and corrects common addressing errors (for example, spelling, formatting and abbreviation corrections). The resulting list is CASS certified, and can qualify for Automation Standard (A) letter mailings, if other qualifications (that they don't necessarily know about) are met. It also prints out required forms and tray labels. *(Other qualification criteria for discounts are not well spelled out, which may cause confusion. The software doesn't prompt users to change paper for tray labels until just before they need it, so they may use plain paper.)*
- For occasional mailings of greater than 3,500 addresses, users may process them in multiple batches of less than 3,500, though address checking will take quite awhile over the Internet. *(A sister product available from Envelope Manager called “DAZZle Express” addresses some of the limitations of Direct Mail Manager: Nonprofit mailings; routine mailings of over 3,500; Automation First-Class letters or flats; Automation Standard (A) flats; carrier-route sortation discounts. DAZZle Express can be used with the USPS AMS CD-ROM, rather than using the Internet-supported address checking. DAZZle Express costs \$195 and can be purchased from the Envelope Manager website: www.envmgr.com or by phone at 1-800-576-3279.)*
- Provides a “Learn More” button, which appears at the bottom of the opening screen. Clicking on the prompt launches the direct mail primer, “Direct Mail Success for Small Business” developed by the Postal Service. It provides valuable information and links to direct mail and postal guidelines. This tool helps users understand the availability of presorting, automation and drop ship discounts. For more information specific to each user, this primer refers the user to their local post office. It includes a link to the USPS website's “Post Office Locator” to help them find the nearest post office.
- Allows the user to design and print envelopes for mailing. The printed envelope can include the appropriately formatted name and address of the recipient, the appropriate address-block barcode, permit imprint indicia and return address. They may be sorted and printed out in ZIP Code order.

- Gives users three options for postage payment on discounted mailings: meter, precanceled stamps or permit. *(It does not provide additional information about fees and special circumstances for each payment method, such as the required use of a return address when using precanceled stamps.)*
- Sorts by ZIP Code and determines the required number and size of trays, based on the weight of a single mailpiece, and prints a traying report, which includes the cost of the mailing to the user. *(If the user is unsure of the weight of the mailpiece and/or does not fill in this field, the software uses the default of one ounce. This may cause the software to generate fewer tray labels than required. The user is not instructed to review the report to determine the beginning and ending pieces in each tray and the order in which the mail should be placed in the tray.)*
- Generates postage statements. *(The software may only partially complete the forms, but it does not instruct the user to review printed forms and fill in any additional required information.)*
- Gives the user three options for printing and sending their mailing: 1) Non-discounted First-Class Mail, 2) Standard Mail (A), or 3) Mailing services. Option three links the user through the Internet to mailing services partners (Pitney Bowes or Neopost) for the printing, sorting and post office entry of their mailing. There is, of course, an additional price to the use of these services.

- Connects users who don't have mailing lists or who want to augment their lists with a list broker (ABI) through an Internet connection. (There also is additional expense to this service.)

Direct Mail Manager is a useful product and introduces small businesses to the benefits of using direct mail, which helps generate new business and additional revenue for the Postal Service. Employees who are responsible for accepting and processing bulk business mail will help assure that postal customers who use Direct Mail Manager software have success in quickly and efficiently processing their mailings through the Postal Service.

Since USPS feels that both Microsoft's and Envelope Manager's products may be of value to postal customers, we have and will continue to work with these companies on the development of these products, and we will let our customers know about them, when we feel it would be helpful to them. USPS does not, however, sell or technically support these products.

The Postal Service is consulting with Microsoft to help ensure that the next version of Direct Mail Manager addresses some of the customer information issues identified above. In the meantime, we, like Microsoft, remain convinced that direct marketing is important to small businesses. Anything we can do to support this effort will be appreciated and valued by our customers.

DOMESTIC MAIL REMINDER

Mailing Adult Birds

Postal standards covering the mailability of adult birds are based on these factors:

- The humane consideration of the ability of the live animals to survive without food or water while in transit.
- Possible health hazards to postal employees.
- Possible damage to other mail and postal equipment.
- The ability of the Postal Service to cover the costs of providing service.

Only the types of adult fowl or birds specifically named in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C022.3.3 and 3.4 are eligible for mailing. No other types of adult birds may be sent through the mail. As information, day-old poultry or birds may be mailed only as allowed in DMM C022.3.1.

Under DMM C022.3.3, adult turkeys, guinea fowl, doves, pigeons, pheasants, partridges, and quail, as well as ducks, geese, and swans, are mailable. These types of birds must be sent via Express Mail in biologically secure containers that have been approved by the manager, Business Mail Acceptance, USPS Headquarters (see G043 for address). The number of birds per mailpiece must not exceed the limits of the container as specified by the manufacturer and each bird must weigh more than 6 ounces. Currently, three firms have had the biologically secure containers they manufacture approved for mailing the types of adult birds allowed in DMM C022.3.3. Under DMM C022.3.4, adult chickens may be mailed only when sent as Express Mail. The containers used to mail adult chickens must pass the standards in the International Safe Transit Association (ISTA) Test Procedure 1A, which are contained in Publication 2, *Packaging for Mailing* (January 1998). The containers must be designed to remain intact during normal handling, be constructed to totally confine the adult chickens, contain shavings or other material to prevent damage to the bottom of the container, and be ventilated properly to ensure humane treatment during transit. The number of adult birds per mailpiece must not exceed the container manufacturer's limit.

Under the applicable standards, indemnity for a mailpiece containing adult birds may be paid only for loss of, damage to, or rifling of the parcel. Indemnity may not be paid for death of the adult birds during transit if there is no visible damage to the container.

Customers should not ship mailable adult birds when temperature conditions could harm the type of bird being shipped. Post offices should ask customers to make advance arrangements to ensure the availability of adequate postal equipment to handle shipments of live animals. The Postal Service's Traffic Control System is used to advise destination and transfer offices when any significant quantities of animals are moving through the mail. Postal field personnel should ensure that the duration of ground transportation (via trucks) is limited to a four-hour time period. Any mailpiece identified as containing live birds must be handled with care and sensitivity by postal employees.

Effective immediately, the following entry in the Individual Country Listing for Pakistan, under the header, Prohibitions (130), which pertains to the mailing of coins; bank notes; gold; or silver to Pakistan is being replaced with the following entry:

* * * * *

Coins; bank notes; currency notes (paper money); securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver (manufactured or not); precious stones; jewelry; and other valuable articles are prohibited in all classes

of mail, including Express Mail International service (EMS) shipments, that are mailed to Pakistan.

IMM REVISION

International Mail — Special Services Changes

Effective immediately, section 324.22 and related Exhibit 324.22 in the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) are revised to reflect a change in the U.S. dollar to SDR (special drawing rights) conversion rate. This information is required by USPS acceptance personnel whenever an insured parcel is presented for mailing. The insured amount, stated in terms of both dollars and SDR values, must be "written in" on PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note CP 72*.

As a consequence, IMM 324.22 now reads as follows:

324.22 Accepting Clerk's Responsibility

Accepting clerk must:

a. Indicate on the parcel the amount for which the parcel is insured. The amount must be written in ink and expressed in U.S. currency (figures) and special drawing rights (SDR) values. Indicate the SDR values in figures only. For example:

INSURED VALUE
\$100 (US)
71.66 SDR

b. See Exhibit 324.22 for an SDR conversion table for all U.S. dollar values up to \$600. To determine SDR equivalents above \$600, the acceptance employee must multiply the insured amount, rounded up to the next full dollar, by the conversion factor 0.7166.

Note: The conversion of U.S. dollars into SDR equivalents is based on the following formulas:

$$1 \text{ SDR} = \$1.40 (1.3954) \quad 1 \text{ US } \$ = 0.7166 \text{ SDR}$$

c. Enter the insured number, insured amount, and SDR equivalent on PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note CP 72*.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 98-11

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items

submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self addressed envelope.

Sexual Harassment Awareness and Prevention Courses

Diversity Programs is beginning the national rollout of "It's an issue of respect... and it's the law," a sexual harassment awareness and prevention education course for all postal supervisors and managers. New AIC 086 for Precanceled Stamp Sales

A new Account Identification Code (AIC) has been designated for the sale of all precanceled stamps. Prior to this change, precanceled stamps had been sold as part of AIC 090, Postage Stock Sales. Effective June 20, 1998 (the first day of AP 11), all sales of precanceled stamps, including bulk rate precanceled stamps, First-Class presort precanceled stamps, and non-profit precanceled stamps, should be recorded as AIC 086. All customers purchasing these stamps must hold a permit for the purchase of precanceled stamps (DMM P023.2.0). AIC 086 will be used for precanceled stamps only. Sales of large quantities of regular rate stamps are not affected.

The IRTs are currently set up to accept AIC 086; however, when you use this AIC, the AIC title on the IRT screen will be blank. The correct AIC title will be added in future IRT programming updates.

This new AIC will allow the Postal Service to more effectively track revenue by customer type, and will help us better analyze how customers are preparing their mailings. Increased understanding of our customer base will help the Postal Service retain and grow our core business.

Introducing the New Priority Mail Window Envelope

The new Priority Mail window envelope is designed for the customer who walks into a post office with a pre-addressed and/or stamped envelope and wants to upgrade to Priority Mail. Their envelope can slip inside the red, white, and blue packaging for ease-of-use and expedited handling. The appropriate postage can be placed on the original envelope, since the large glassine envelope allows for the postage to show through, or on the right-hand corner of the Priority Envelope. Be sure to cancel any stamps.
