

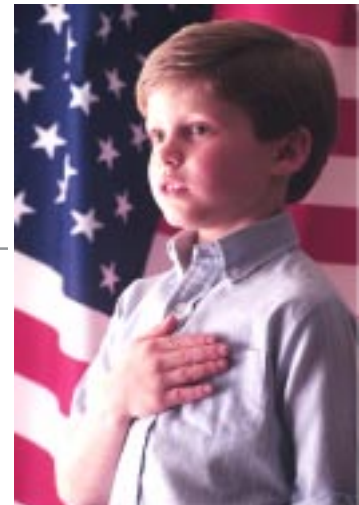



Publicity Ideas To Interest the Media

There are many ways to place your *Honoring Those Who Served* commemorative stamp events in the local media. Here are some methods to capture a reporter's attention:

- Hold first-day of sale and second-day ceremonies at local VFWs, American Legions, Veterans Hospitals, police and fire departments, and at post offices. Invite Congressional and local dignitaries and present sheets/enlarged copy of the stamp to dignitaries and community leaders. (Ceremonies can be held on or after August 16 or whenever there is a venue in your community. Remember, when planning events, make sure that stamps are available.)
- The Postal Service employs approximately 800,000 people, many of whom have served in the armed forces and many of whom continue to serve their country and fellow Americans by actively serving in the National Guard or by donating their time as volunteer firefighters.
 - Recognize your local postal “heroes” at ceremonies. Ask Congressional, civic, and community leaders to participate.
- Hold ceremonies to welcome home the men and women of your community who served during the recent Kosovo crisis.
- Coordinate groups of children — children of postal employees, YMCA camps, Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, etc., to write “Thank You” letters or notes to local police, firefighters, and veterans’ groups.
 - *Photo Opportunity:* Invite these children and their families to join your local event. Have the children place the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamps on their “Thank You” letters and drop them in the mailbox at the post office.
- Coordinate an essay-writing contest or art contest using the *Honoring Those Who Served* theme. Get local newspaper editors to judge essays and select winners. Have local art teachers from community schools judge art entries. Invite winners of these contests to your ceremonies; recognize their work and present them with sheet of stamps or philatelic collectible.
- Hold Flag Raising Ceremony/Moment of Silence at local post office. Invite Congressional and community leaders.
 - *Photo Opportunity:* Have Congressional and/or community leaders purchase first sheet of *Honoring Those Who Served* stamps or present them with the first sheet sold at your local post office.

- Hold Open House at post office or plant. Ask Postal Service military veterans to be your host or hostesses. Invite community, military, police, and firefighter personnel.
- Schedule an event at a local military base.

Implement any of these ideas, combine them or brainstorm with your employees and come up with an idea of your own. Be sure to publicize each and every event to your local newspaper, radio, and television stations via press releases, media advisories, letters to the media and follow up phone calls.

Speech Segment

(Note: This speech segment is only a suggestion. Feel free to customize it to fit your local event and community.)

Thank you and welcome.

Today we celebrate the issuance of the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp with this very special dedication ceremony.

I would like to use the dedication of this stamp as a chance for those of us gathered here today to honor fellow Americans who have served their country, and in particular, to remember those who have fallen in the line of duty.

This stamp salutes those public servants — policemen, firefighters — and all veterans who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces, whether in wartime or peacetime, in active units, the reserves, or the National Guard.

With this stamp we recognize the vital and varied roles veterans have played to ensure our peace, to stop aggression, and to provide logistical support during crises.

Veterans account for more than 25 million Americans, or, almost one in every 10 adults. And, 263,300 of them are Postal Service employees.

We would especially like to take this opportunity to recognize the many Postal Service employees who are veterans and those employees who serve in the National Guard. The Postal Service has a long and distinguished history of serving this country, not only through providing mail service to every American home and business, but also in its role as a leader in virtually every community.

Many Postal Service employees continue to serve their country and fellow Americans by actively serving in the National Guard. We are deeply proud of these Postal Service employees who have given of themselves so that the rest of us can live in peace and security. Thanks to each and every one of you.

With the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp, we pay tribute not only to our military veterans, but also to police officers and firefighters. The stamp also serves as a lasting tribute to those law enforcement officers and veterans who have given their lives to protect the welfare of all Americans.

It is my hope that the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp will help Americans focus on the valor, courage, and dedication of these people, many of whom are our neighbors, friends, and family members who work “behind the scenes” to ensure a safe and secure environment for all of us.

And, now, if INSERT NAMES OF CEREMONY PARTICIPANTS would join me in unveiling the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp.

I appreciate this opportunity to introduce this stamp to our customers and friends in this community. Thank you again for taking the time to join us here today for this important occasion.

Suggested Public Relations Timeline

(Note: If you have questions or need assistance with any of these items, please contact your Area’s Corporate Relations representative.)

Action:	Suggested Timing:
1. Send invitations to local and area dignitaries	A few weeks before event
2. Send announcement and invitation to employees	A few weeks before event
3. Distribute Calendar/Weekend Advisory to newspapers	A few weeks before event
4. Distribute Public Service Announcement to radio/TV	A few weeks before event
5. Distribute News Release	A few weeks before event
6. Distribute Media Advisory to newspapers, radio/TV	One week before event
7. Redistribute Media Advisory to all news media	One to two days before event
8. Remind invited dignitaries about event via telephone	Five days before event
9. Make follow-up calls to local news media	Day before event
10. Distribute “Day of Issuance” news release	Day of event
11. Send Letter to Newspaper Editor thanking community	Day after event’s completion
12. Send newspaper clippings to Area Corporate Relations	Week or sooner after event

Participation of Public Officials

The August 16 issuance of the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp is a perfect opportunity to involve public officials in an important and positive local event. There is likely to be keen interest on their part, as it provides elected representatives a chance to interact with constituents in a friendly, civic setting with secured media coverage.

You are encouraged to reach out directly to your federal, state, and local elected officials. ***Government Relations representatives are available to assist you in coordinating political involvement and would be pleased to help in any way.***

This Community Relations Tool Kit contains simple guidelines, sample letters, a suggested invitation list, and the names and telephone numbers of your Government Relations contacts.

Before the Event

Send a written invitation (see sample), four to six weeks before the event, to your two U.S. senators, your Congressional representatives, the governor of your state, and the mayor of your community. Please include any other local elected officials you feel would be appropriate. The local postmaster should sign the invitations.

Follow up the written invitation with a telephone call to the elected official's scheduler within a week if you have not received a reply. You may need to call more than once.

Keep in touch with all elected officials who respond. If asked, provide updated information to the elected official's staff as it becomes available — i.e., who else is participating, where and when to meet, what his or her role will be, etc. Stress that remarks should be brief and limited to the unveiling of the *Honoring Those Who Served* stamp and recognition of military veterans, police officers, and firefighters.

Include names of all participating elected officials on the Official Program as honored guests, and mention them in all media advisories.

Provide a courtesy copy of the program to the elected official in advance.

After the Event

Send a written thank you to all elected officials who participated in the ceremony, expressing your appreciation.

Provide copies to their offices of any newspaper articles about the event. Even though they surely will see those articles on their own, you can take the opportunity to remind them of the press coverage the event received.

Provide a supply of extra cachets with the special cancellation, if applicable, to elected officials, even to those who could not attend. These make great give-aways and serve as a positive reminder of the event.

Obtain and frame a photo of the elected official posing beside the stamp image and make an appointment to present it in person, if possible. A matted, well-framed photograph stands a good chance of being hung on the wall of the official's office, again serving as a positive reminder of the event.

Keep in touch with your elected officials. Good relationships are built over time.

DMM REVISION

Periodicals Classification Changes

Effective August 1, 1999, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E270 is revised to reflect a classification change for Nonprofit and Classroom Periodicals. This change creates provisions for a rate anomaly that has existed in the Periodicals rate structure since implementation of the omnibus rate case on January 10, 1999.

Since January 10, 1999, in some instances, based on advertising content and presort level, Regular Periodicals rates are lower than the equivalent Nonprofit and Classroom Periodicals rates. On July 12, 1999, the Board of Governors voted to allow mailers who qualify for Nonprofit or Classroom rates to claim the lower Regular rates.

For mailings made from January 10, 1999, to July 31, 1999, a publisher of a Nonprofit or Classroom Periodicals publication may request a refund for the difference between postage paid at Nonprofit or Classroom rates and postage computed at Regular rates, if the Regular postage is lower.

An application for a refund must consist of a written statement, to the postmaster of the entry post office, that the mailer is currently authorized to use either Classroom or Nonprofit Periodicals rates and wishes to retain that authorization, but also wishes to be considered for a refund to be calculated with reference to Regular rate postage statements to be submitted with the refund application and Preferred rate postage statements on file at the entry post office. Mailers must use the instructions published in the April 26, 1999, *Federal Register* notice. Some publishers may have already submitted refund requests for mailings made since April 9, 1999. Refund requests must be submitted according to published instructions and must be received at the entry post office no later than September 15, 1999. No refunds will be given for mailings entered on or after August 1, 1999, regardless of whether a mailer could have claimed a lower postage rate.

Under the new rules, the mailer must choose either Regular or Preferred rates for each issue of a publication and complete the applicable postage statement, except that a supplemental mailing at least 10 calendar days after other mailings for the issue can be treated separately. All postage statements for a particular issue should be provided with an application for a refund, but a supplemental mailing at least 10 calendar days after other mailings does not need to be included in calculating refunds.

Information about the refund procedure was published in the *Federal Register* on April 26, 1999, and again on July 20, 1999. *Federal Register* notices are available on the Postal Service Internet site at www.usps.com (select "Business," then "Business Operations," and then "RIBBS: Rapid Information Bulletin Board System").

DMM REVISION

Periodicals Endorsements

Effective July 29, 1999, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P070.2 is amended to provide an exception to the requirements of P070.2.5 and P070.2.6, which require printing a permit imprint on the outside of a mailpiece or in the identification statement when mailing First-Class Mail or Standard Mail (A) enclosures. The use of the marking "First-Class Mail Enclosed" or "Standard Mail (A) Enclosed," as appropriate, on the outer wrapper, polybag, envelope, or cover of the host publication, or in the identification statement, indicates that postage has been paid by permit imprint, unless the correct amount in precanceled stamps or meter stamps is affixed to the enclosure or the outer wrapper, polybag, envelope, or cover of the host publication.

This revision will be reflected in the printed version of DMM Issue 55 and in the online DMM, which can be accessed via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

FORM REVISION

Revision of PS Form 3533, Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage, Fees, and Services

PS Form 3533, *Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage, Fees, and Services*, is revised as follows:

- The new title is "Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage, Fees, and Services."
- The form is rearranged in a more chronological order for ease of completion.
- The Privacy Act Statement has been updated.
- The form's parts are now indicated by Arabic numbers instead of Roman numerals.
- Additional customer information is added to Part 1 — Application.
- The AIC numbers in Part 1 — Application are revised to include changes for refund AICs established in *Postal Bulletin* 21979 (8-27-98).
- Part 2 — Acceptance Verification is added to the front of the form to document the date of acceptance and the name of the employee accepting the application.
- Part 3 — Postage or Meter Stamps, formerly Part IV, is revised to provide for additional information and to include a certification for the destruction of unusable postage meter stamps.
- Part V, Postage Meter Withdrawn From Service, is removed from the form due to the acceptance of vendor-generated postage meter checkout forms.

Offices may continue to use the December 1994 edition of PS Form 3533 through accounting period 12 of the current fiscal year. The new PS Form 3533 will be stocked at the material distribution centers. A copy of the new PS Form 3533 is in this *Postal Bulletin* on pages 41–42.

FISCAL YEAR 2000 FORMS UPDATE

Automatic Distribution to DAOs of PS Form 1551 and PS Form 1555

The Material Distribution Center (MDC) is making an automatic distribution of PS Form 1551, *Accountbook for Post Offices and Financial Reporting Units (CAGs H-L)*, and PS Form 1555, *Statement of Account*, for postal fiscal year (FY) 2000. These forms are being distributed in bulk quantities only to district accounting offices (DAOs) and should be further distributed by the DAOs to the field no later than August 27, 1999. If your office does not receive its forms by this date, contact your DAO, not the MDC.

All CAG H-L offices that submit a manual statement of account (SOA) are to begin using the new forms at the beginning of FY 2000 (09-11-1999). These offices should destroy all old unused versions of PS Forms 1551 and 1555 after the current FY ends.

PS Forms 1551 and 1555 are revised as follows:

1. The revised forms are designated for use by CAG H-L offices only.
2. AICs 094, 158, 116, 117, and 134 have been removed from the "ADDITIONS TO ACCOUNTABILITY" section of the forms.
3. AICs 084, 085, 086, 095, 096, 097, 098, 099, and 224 have been added to the "ADDITIONS TO ACCOUNTABILITY" section of the forms.
4. AICs 425, 510, 511, 536, 592, 594, and 604 have been removed from the "REDUCTIONS IN ACCOUNTABILITY" section of the forms.
5. AICs 526, 528, 553, and 689 have been added to the "REDUCTIONS IN ACCOUNTABILITY" section of the forms.
6. PS Form 1551-E, PART SEVEN, POSTAL REVENUES — OPTIONAL, has been eliminated.
7. PS Form 1555, "Automatic Distributions," on page 2 has been eliminated.
8. PS Form 1555, Section VII — COMPUTERIZED METER RESETTING REVENUE, on page 2 has been eliminated.

An accountbook consists of PS Forms 1551, sections A-G, banded or shrink-wrapped as a set. Each CAG H-L office that maintains an accountbook should receive one set.

PS Form 1555 is shrink-wrapped in sets of 16. Each CAG H-L office that prepares a quarterly statement of account should receive one set.

Due to the limited quantity printed, DAOs are cautioned not to order more PS Forms 1551 than necessary.

*IMM AND PUBLICATION 51 REVISION***International Mail: Resumption of Mail Service to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia)**

Effective July 12, 1999, international air and surface mail service was resumed to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia). Mailpieces that were returned to the sender during the service suspension may be reentered without the payment of additional postage provided that a refund was not issued in the interim. Under those circumstances, the "return to sender" endorsement must be *marked through* to ensure proper handling of the reentered mailpieces.

The resumption of mail service to Serbia-Montenegro (Yugoslavia) will be reflected in the printed version of the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) Issue 22 and the next printed version of Publication 51, *International Postal Rates and Fees*, and it will also be reflected in the online IMM and Publication 51, both of which can be accessed via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

All Aboard! 20th Century Trains Commemorative Stamps

The Postal Service will issue 33-cent *All Aboard! 20th Century Trains* commemorative stamps (Item Number 447800), water-activated pane of 20, in Cleveland, OH, on August 26, 1999. The stamps, designed by Howard Paine of Delaplane, VA, and illustrated by Ted Rose of Santa Fe, NM, go on sale nationwide on August 26, 1999.

The U.S. Postal Service pays tribute to American industry and design, specifically to the heritage of the American railroads, with stamps of five celebrated passenger trains from the 1930s and 1940s. On the front of each stamp is a reproduction of a watercolor painting of one of the five trains, with a landscape representative of its route in the background. On the back of each stamp is text describing the train's unique features.

These five trains — the *Daylight*, the *Congressional*, the *20th Century Limited*, the *Hiawatha*, and the *Super Chief* — were updated in the Art Deco style on both the exterior and interior by famous industrial designers. The style, comfort, and efficiency of these luxury passenger trains were at the forefront of the railroads' battle to compete with automobiles and airplanes.

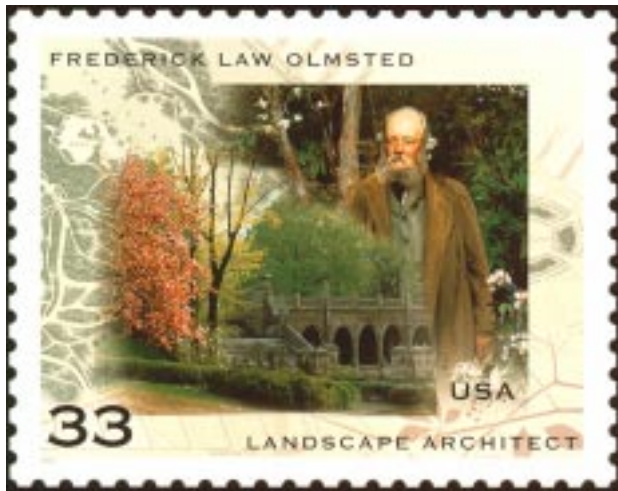

Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*


All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items

The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

Direct Delivery Ordering Procedures From the MDC

Any stocked item that is available to the public can be shipped by the Material Distribution Center (MDC) directly to a customer. This includes the following items that previously were supported by the Express and Priority Mail Center:

You may place your orders for direct delivery to a customer either on a one-time basis by writing the customer's address in the body of the PS Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*, or as a standing order for automatic replenishment on a regular frequency. The five frequencies available for standing orders are as follows:

- a. Every 7 days (weekly).
- b. Every 30 days (monthly).
- c. Every 90 days (quarterly).
- d. Every 180 days (semi-annually).
- e. Every 360 days (annually).

Note: Standing orders may be entered for up to one year at a time.

To place a standing order, please send your request on PS Form 7380. At the top of the requisition, write "Standing Order." In the body of the requisition, you *must* include the following:

- a. The PSN or PSIN.
- b. Quantity per shipment.
- c. The frequency (*in days*).
- d. The date the order is to start.
- e. The number of periods to continue processing the order, up to one year from date of first order.
- f. The customer's delivery address.

POSTAGE METER UPDATE

Clarifications of On-Site Postage Meter Setting Procedures

A recent Inspection Service audit of on-site postage meter procedures revealed two areas that need immediate attention. The first was that in some locations the same postal clerk responsible for setting meters also had responsibility for the accounting functions related to those settings. At some sites a failure to separate duties led to the embezzlement of postal funds. Second, there were local variations in the application of fees for setting and related activities. In some cases the Postal Service was not paid for all services rendered, and in other cases postal customers paid in excess of the correct charges. The following clarifications are provided to assist post offices in the administration of this program, and they should alleviate the problems noted in the audit.

1. Separation of Duties

Payment for on-site setting and the related activities of installation, withdrawal, and examination is made by check or by a deduction from the customer's advance deposit account. The postal clerk performing these functions may collect a check from the customer but must turn the check, and appropriate forms, over to another window service employee at the setting clerk's postal unit for verification and deposit. Similarly, if payment is made through the advance deposit account, the setting clerk must deliver the appropriate forms to the second clerk so that the deduction may be made. *Under no circumstance may the setting clerk perform the accounting or deposit functions.*

2. Application of Fees

The following is a clarification of fees applicable to on-site postage meter remote settings.

Postage meter settings and related examinations, installations, and withdrawals can take place at four locations:

- a. Local post office (no fees are charged for activity at a post office).
- b. Meter licensee's place of business.
- c. Meter manufacturer's sales facility (or its dealer's or agent's facility).
- d. Meter manufacturer's direct distribution center (DDC).

The various types of authorized activities are defined below, along with the applicable fee for each:

1. An **installation or withdrawal** is defined as a function related to verifying information related to the specific meter and licensee to which the meter is to be assigned or removed, as presented on PS Form 3601-C, *Postage Meter Activity Report*. This includes a cursory examination of the meter to detect any evidence of misuse or tampering. The fee for this service is **\$8.50 per each meter installed or withdrawn**.
2. An **examination** is defined as a comprehensive review of function performed by a postal clerk to ensure proper meter operation, to detect evidence of tampering or misuse, and to reconcile meter control totals to postal records. Examinations typically are performed at a post office according to an established schedule. However, the customer may elect to have the examination performed on site in lieu of taking the meter to the post office. Since an examination for the first meter is included in the scheduled/unscheduled fee (see item 4 below), the fee for this service is **\$4.00 per meter after the first meter examined**.
3. **Setting** is defined as the postal activity associated with increasing the value of the descending register, showing the postage available, in the amount requested and paid for by the licensee. Since a setting for the first manually set meter is included in the scheduled/unscheduled fee (see item 4 below), the fee for this service is **\$4.00 per manually set meter after the first meter set**.

Note: Remote-set meters — those using the Computerized Remote Postage Meter Resetting System (CMRS) — are set electronically by the licensee accessing the meter manufacturer's resetting center and are not reset by postal clerks. *Therefore, USPS setting fees do not apply to remote-set meters.*

4. **Scheduled service** occurs when the local post office and the licensee have mutually agreed to a time(s) when a postal clerk(s) may perform the requested on-site services. **Unscheduled service** occurs when no

advance visit was arranged and the licensee typically calls for service on an urgent or emergency basis. *The fee for the first meter processed by each clerk on an on-site visit is \$27.50 for scheduled service and \$31.00 for unscheduled service.* This fee covers getting the postal clerk to the site and having the postal clerk set the first meter, if manually set, and/or examine the first meter.

Postmasters and/or applicable supervisors are requested to review these service fees and their applications with all employees involved with setting, examining, installing, and withdrawing postage meters to ensure that all applicable postal revenues are being properly applied and collected.

POSTAGE METER UPDATE

Final Settings of Mechanical Postage Meters

The final phase of mechanical postage meter decertification is being implemented with the cessation of resetting these meters by the Postal Service. In an effort to make the transition to more secure meters as easy as possible for our customers, one time resettings were allowed after the official decertification dates of December 31, 1998, for high-speed meters and March 31, 1999, for low-speed meters. Additional settings were allowed if customers had valid rental agreements with meter manufacturers for replacement meters. Reference *Postal Bulletin* 21988 (12-31-98) and 21995 (4-8-99). Since users have had more than sufficient time, in some cases over 6 months, to replace their decertified meters post offices will cease setting the mechanical meter models shown below according to the following schedules.

August 13, 1999, is the final date for setting high-speed mechanical postage meters.
