SUBJECT: Poster 500, *Report Fraud, Waste, Abuse, & Mismanagement*

This memorandum is to notify you that Poster 500, *Report Fraud, Waste, Abuse, & Mismanagement*, which was distributed to all offices in December 1999, must be permanently and prominently displayed for all employees.

The national, toll-free Office of Inspector General Hotline serves as an effective and convenient avenue for employees, contractors, customers, and others to anonymously or confidentially report situations that could threaten the economy, efficiency, or effectiveness of Postal Service programs and operations. In addition to calls concerning fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement, the hotline is used to refer calls for appropriate attention that concern alleged assaults, threats, and potentially violent work situations.

Please verify that this poster is prominently displayed in areas accessible to all employees. If additional copies are needed, they can be obtained from the Material Distribution Center.

SUBJECT: Clarence E. Lewis, Jr.

Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President Clarence E. Lewis, Jr., is retiring from the Postal Service after a career that spanned 34 years. That is a long period of time — in any context. In the Postal Service, it measures the difference between the customer-focused, performance-driven, businesslike organization we are today and the waning days of an inefficient, underfunded, and struggling Post Office Department.

Clarence Lewis is one of a handful of leaders who helped us to bridge that huge gap, helping to build the successful and respected organization the Postal Service has become. Beginning as a letter carrier in 1966, Clarence Lewis learned the business from the ground up, bringing focus, accountability, and a fresh perspective to every assignment he held, whether in the field or at headquarters.

Serving as Chief Operating Officer in a time of dramatic industry change, Clarence Lewis provided the leadership and direction that resulted in continued, record-breaking levels of service performance. But his vision has always consisted of more than simply "moving the mail." Clarence Lewis recognized that any success we achieved was a direct result of the efforts and dedication of postal employees — whatever their jobs — in every corner of the nation. He knew, too, that a workforce rich in diversity strengthens our brand, just as he knew that the power of our brand rests on keeping the mail affordable.

Clarence Lewis acted on this knowledge. As cochair of the Postal Service's Diversity Oversight Committee, he helped guide diversity efforts that resulted in our receipt of the prestigious Hammer Award from the Vice President's National Partnership for Reinventing Government. This, combined with his contribution to helping to reduce costs by more than \$1 billion over the last two years, resulted in his receiving the highest honor that can be bestowed on a Postal Service employee — the coveted Benjamin Franklin Award.

We at the Postal Service will miss Clarence Lewis. His influence and contributions, however, will remain with us for generations to come. He leaves the Postal Service a far stronger organization than the one he found all those years ago. And that is Clarence Lewis' legacy to the service we provide everyone, everywhere, every day.

The table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Codes through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes, which appear on the page following the table.

Acceptance clerks should use this table with the Integrated Retail Terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to

determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and which conditions of mailing apply.

For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, all acceptance clerks must refer to the local hardcopy EMMS directory.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

Exceptions: All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those available under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

District Accounting Offices Statement of Account Submission — AP 1, PFY 2001

The normal submission schedule is extended for transmitting data from the standard field accounting system (SFAS) to the Eagan Accounting Service Center for accounting period (AP) 1, postal fiscal year (PFY) 2001. District accounting offices (DAOs) will have until COB *Tuesday, October 10, 2000*, to transmit a statement of account (SOA) via the SFAS.

The deadline is also extended for submission of official mail accounting system (OMAS) transactions for AP 1, PFY 2001. DAOs will have until 4 p.m. CT on *Tuesday, October 10, 2000*, to input OMAS data.

Note: The normal SOA submission date was changed to Monday after the close of the AP in *Postal Bulletin 22029 (7-27-00)*.

HANDBOOKS F-15 AND F-12 REVISION

Travel Per Diem Rates

Effective October 1, 2000, Handbook F-15, *Travel and Relocation*, Appendix A, and Handbook F-12, *Relocation Policy*, Appendix B. II. C., are revised as follows to reflect changes in travel per diem rates.

The entire text of Handbook F-15, Appendix A appears on pages 20–29 of this *Postal Bulletin*. The per diem rates for Handbook F-12 are the same as for Handbook F-15.

A-1.2 Reimbursement for Postal Supervisors

Postal supervisors (see 5-5.2.1.2) will be reimbursed at the rate of \$6.00 per day or 32.5 cents per mile, whichever is greater, when a privately owned vehicle is used.

Odometer readings are not required on the respective claim forms; the integrity of the claim is the responsibility of the traveler. However, should the approving official have reason to question the claim, the claimant must provide evidence that supports the claim of distance traveled.

A-2 Travel Per Diem Rates

A-2.1 What Per Diem Includes

The per diem allowance includes all charges for meals; laundry and cleaning expenses; all fees and tips to waiters, bellboys, and porters; and other similar expenses.

A-2.2 If Lodging is Required

When a traveler is in a travel status and lodging is required, per diem will be allowed at the rate established in this handbook for each 6-hour segment or fraction thereof. (See A-2.5 for high cost areas.) For segments where travel occurs between areas of different per diem rates, the per diem rate in effect at the beginning of that period will continue in effect for that entire segment. The rate in effect at the beginning of the period will be the rate at this traveler's destination. When a traveler has multiple destinations, the rate will change at the beginning of the quarter when the traveler departs for each subsequent destination. The per diem rate for the traveler's return trip home is that of the traveler's permanent duty station. Receipts supporting any lodging claim must accompany the related travel voucher(s) and must be from a hotel, motel, apartment, or boarding house (see 8-2.2.2).

A-2.3 If Lodging is Not Required

When lodging is not required and the traveler is in a travel status for more than 10 consecutive hours and less than 24 hours or the traveler meets the exception in section 7-1.2.1, per diem is allowed per 6-hour segment or fraction thereof based on the actual elapsed time. (See A-2.5 for the appropriate per diem rate.)

A-2.4 Average Cost Localities

Unless a city is listed in the table in A-2.5, High Cost Localities, the daily per diem rate is \$30.

HANDBOOK F-12 REVISION

Reimbursement for Temporary Quarters for EAS Employees

Effective October 1, 2000, Handbook F-12, *Relocation Policy*, is revised to adjust the standard lodging rates for temporary quarters.

Persons who are being relocated and who move into temporary quarters on or after the effective date of this revision will be reimbursed for temporary quarters at the adjusted rates.

534 Computing the Maximum – Nonbargaining Employees

[Revise 534.1 to read as follows:]

534.1 Temporary quarters subsistence expense. If you are a nonbargaining employee, the amount you may be reimbursed for subsistence expenses for temporary quarters in CONUS will be the actual amount of allowable expenses incurred for a 60-day period, but this must not exceed a maximum amount computed using a standard lodging rate and per diem. Standard lodging rates are based on the per diem rate of the new duty station, and are as follows:

Per Diem Rate (Day)	Standard Lodging Rate (Day)
\$46	\$112
\$42	\$87
\$38	\$76
\$34	\$67
\$30	\$67

Daily rate for 60 days:

- a. For you, 80 percent of the sum of the per diem and standard lodging rate.
- b. For the first additional member of your immediate family, 25 percent of the rate established for you.
- c. For each additional member of your immediate family, 10 percent of the rate established for you.
- d. The maximum allowed for a 30-day period, regardless of family size, is \$5,000.

[Revise 534.2 to read as follows:]

534.2 Limitation of reimbursement. The Postal Service will compare the total amount of your actual expenses to the maximum amount allowable for the period. You will be reimbursed for the lesser of these two amounts. See Exhibit 534.2 for a sample voucher.

Example: The sum of the per diem (\$30 for the average cost area) and standard lodging allowance (\$67 for the average cost area) is \$97. If a nonbargaining employee, spouse, and one dependent child occupy temporary quarters for 15 days, the employee could claim actual expenses up to the maximum amount as computed here:

IMM REVISION

Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail

Effective September 14, 2000, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 613 is revised to comply with changes made by Canada Post to their rate structure for Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail. This revision will be incorporated into the printed version of IMM Issue 24 and the online IMM, accessible via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

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613 Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail

613.1 Description

Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail is an international mail service that is available on the basis of a service agreement between the Postal Service and a qualifying mailer. Under this service, a mailer must enter newspaper and periodical items that meet the applicable eligibility, makeup, and preparation requirements for Canada Post's domestic Publications Mail. The Postal Service transports the items to Canada for entry into Canada's domestic mail system. The mailer is responsible for ensuring that the items meet Canada Post's makeup and preparation requirements.

613.2 Qualifying Mailers and Mailing Locations

613.21 Qualifying Mailers

Qualifying mailers must agree to mail a minimum of 10,000 items or 250 pounds for delivery to Canadian addresses per mailing. All tendered mailpieces must conform to the applicable eligibility, makeup, and preparation requirements for Canadian domestic mail, as specified by Canada Post. Specialized sortation software and address accuracy software that is recognized by Canada Post is required.

613.22 Mailing Locations

613.33 Postage Payment Method

Postage must be paid through an advance deposit account. Qualifying mailers must have the following information printed on one of the first five or last five pages of each newspaper or periodical issue:

- a. The words “Agreement Number 03429792.”
- b. The Canadian address to which change of address information and the address blocks of undeliverable copies should be sent. (The Postal Service will provide this address if the mailer does not have a Canadian return address.)

If the publication is mailed under cover, the information outlined above must be clearly visible on the outside of the envelope or, if clear-wrapped, on the front or back cover of the publication.

613.34 Postage Statement

Mailers must complete the total postage on PS Form 3651, *Postage Statement — International Permit Imprint Mail or Bulk Letters to Canada with Permit Imprint or Postage Meter Affixed*, and attach a completed worksheet, PS Form 3658, *Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail*. Both of these forms are provided by the Postal Service. A set of separate postage statements must be prepared for each individual mailing.

613.4 Preparation Requirements

Mailers are responsible for ensuring that newspapers and periodicals tendered under the Global Direct – Canada Publications Mail service comply with Canada Post’s domestic mail preparation requirements.

613.5 Ancillary Services

613.51 Business Reply Service

This service provides for the return of Canadian business reply mail through the Postal Service to a specified address in Canada. Detailed specifications for this service are contained in Publication 524-A, *Global Direct – Canada Admail Service Guide*. The rates for this service are:

- a. \$0.45 for items weighing 1.06 ounces (30 grams) or less.

613.6 Service Agreement

IMM REVISION

Global Direct – Mexico

Effective October 1, 2000, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 611 is revised to update the direct entry service for Mexico. Global Direct – Mexico is an international mail service that is available on the basis of a service agreement between the Postal Service and a qualifying mailer. Under this service a mailer may enter letter mail, publications, and direct mail items that meet applicable eligibility, make-up, and preparation requirements. The Postal Service transports the items for entry into Mexico's domestic mail system.

This revision will be incorporated into the printed version of IMM Issue 24 and the online IMM, accessible via Postal Explorer (<http://pe.usps.gov>).

The Postal Service transports the items for entry into Mexico's domestic mail system.

611.2 Qualifying Mailers and Mailing Locations**611.21 Qualifying Mailers**

Qualifying mailers must agree to mail a minimum of 750 pounds for delivery to Mexican addresses per mailing per mail category. All tendered mailpieces must conform to the applicable makeup and preparation requirements.

611.34 Postage Payment Method

611.4 Ancillary Services**611.41 Global Direct Mailbox Service**

This service provides for the return of Mexican business reply mail to a specific address in Mexico, and then the Postal Service forwards items to the mailer in the United States. Detailed specifications for this service will be provided as part of the application process. The rate for this service is \$0.40 per item returned.

611.42 Return of Undeliverable Mail

This service provides for the return of letter mail and publications that are undeliverable. Mailers using a Mexican indicia and Mexican return address may have undeliverable

items returned to the United States in bulk. The sender must endorse items "Return Requested" and use the return address specified by the Postal Service. The rate for this service is \$1.75 per pound or fraction of a pound for the total number of items returned at a single time.

611.5 Service Agreement

Before the first mailing, mailers must submit a completed PS Form 3681, *Global Direct Service Agreement*, 14 business days prior to their planned mailing date. Concurrent with the establishment of the agreement, instructions are issued to the designated post office of entry regarding the acceptance and verification of the prospective customer's mailpieces.

611.6 Advance Notification

Mailers interested in using Global Direct – Mexico service must complete PS Form 3682, *Notification of Mailing*, 5 business days prior to the planned mailing date. PS Form 3682 can be found in Publication 526, *Global Direct Service Guide*, or on the USPS Web site.

ICM UPDATE

International Customized Mail

On July 18, 2000, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 294, the USPS hereby makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** July 18, 2000, through October 31, 2003.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Domestic Products and Services and International Products and Services*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) for qualifying mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** United States and its territories.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 - 1. Participate with the mailer in a joint management team to monitor service performance of qualifying mail.
 - 2. Participate with the mailer in a joint marketing and sales efforts for the purpose of maximizing sales.
 - 3. Provide the mailer or mailing agent with the training necessary to prepare qualifying mail at the site within the continental United States in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
 - 4. Provide the mailer Priority Mail packaging materials at a location the mailer designates within the continental United States.
 - 5. Return undeliverable mail to the mailer at an address within the continental United States.
- e. **Minimum volume commitment:** The mailer has agreed to a minimum of U.S. \$2 million in postage annually or 1 million pounds of qualifying mail annually for the duration of this Agreement.

- f. **Worksharing:** The mailer has agreed to:
 - 1. Prepare mail in accordance with the applicable USPS requirements.
 - 2. Implement a postage payment system in accordance with the DMM before September 1, 2000, that meets the approval of the USPS Rates and Classification Service Center and to use that system for all mailings after that date.
 - 3. Make payment to the USPS in accordance with the requirements set forth in the DMM for the qualifying mail.
 - 4. Provide an advance schedule of all mailings to include the intended date and site of tender and the anticipated weight and volume in accordance with instructions provided by the USPS.
 - 5. Provide the USPS with an analog telephone line to allow the USPS to monitor the manifest system.
 - 6. Use a separate and unique permit for all qualifying mail.
 - 7. Participate with the USPS in a joint management team to monitor service performance of qualifying mail.
- g. **Rates:** The mailer will pay postage for qualifying mail in accordance with the applicable rates as published by the USPS at the time of tender.

The new packaging has two peel-off barcodes in the current barcode area and verbiage near the barcodes that says, "For Removal by Foreign Postal Administration Only."

REMINDER

Xpresspost-USA: Priority Mail Handling and Delivery Scans Critical

Xpresspost-USA, the new southbound international mail service from Canada Post, has been increasing its volume of flats and parcels to the U.S. Accordingly, Postal Service employees should be reminded that *Xpresspost-USA items are to be handled as domestic Priority Mail*. Also, since Xpresspost-USA includes Delivery Confirmation, *it is critical that each piece receives a delivery scan*.

Xpresspost-USA is available to Canadian mailers in a prepaid envelope, in two sizes: large (9-1/2" x 12-1/2") and small (6" x 10-1/4"). Mailers also have the option of sending parcels and affixing an Xpresspost-USA USPS-approved Delivery Confirmation label with the Universal Postal Union (UPU) standard 13-character barcode affixed to the package shipment.

The address side of an Xpresspost-USA envelope will show the Canada Post postage paid permit indicia, the *Exprès Chevron*, and the Delivery Confirmation barcode.

Xpresspost-USA mailpieces are dispatched from Montreal, Toronto, and Vancouver to one of the six USPS International Service Centers/Exchange offices: New York, Miami, Dallas, Chicago, Los Angeles, or San Francisco. Mailpieces will arrive in flat-sized trays or sacks accompanied by a completed CN 38 Delivery Bill.

Undeliverable-as-addressed Xpresspost-USA mailpieces will be returned to the Canadian sender in accordance with the provisions of *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 782.14.

The White House Commemorative Stamp

The Postal Service will issue a 33-cent *The White House* commemorative stamp (Item Number 446900) in Washington, DC, on October 18, 2000. The stamp, designed by Derry Noyes of Washington, DC, goes on sale nationwide October 19, 2000.

John Adams, second President of the United States, moved into the unfinished "President's House" in November 1800, 8 years after the first stone was laid. The U.S. Postal Service joins the White House in commemorating the 200th anniversary of the first residency of the White House, an enduring symbol of the American presidency.

The pristine blanket of snow in Patricia Fisher's serene photograph of the north façade belies the executive mansion's multiple functions: bustling office, site of official state ceremonies, and home to the nation's chief executive and the "first family."

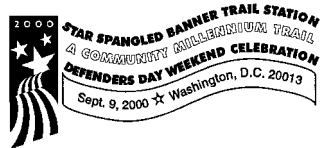

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

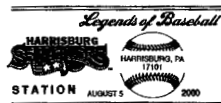
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard).

Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

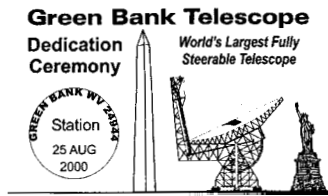
Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

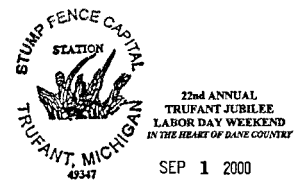

HANDBOOK M-41 AND HANDBOOK PO-701 REVISION

Vehicle Door Policy

Effective immediately, Handbook M-41, *City Delivery Carriers Duties and Responsibilities*, is revised by amending 812.31 and adding 812.32, and Handbook PO-701, *Fleet Management*, is revised by amending 245.28. Previous policy memos pertaining to these sections are obsolete.

[Revise 812.31 to read as follows:]

812.31 When traveling to and from the route, when moving between park and relay points, and when entering or crossing intersecting roadways, all external vehicle doors must be closed. When operating a vehicle with sliding driver's cab doors on delivery routes and traveling in intervals of 500 feet (1/10 mile) or less at speeds not exceeding 15 MPH between delivery stops, the right-hand sliding cab door may be left open.

[Add new 812.32 to read as follows:]

812.32 For vehicles with separate driver and cargo compartments, only working mail should be kept in the driver's compartment while performing delivery and collection duties. Interior cargo doors (if any) may be kept in the "open" position to accommodate authorized passengers being transported in auxiliary seating, operator use of cargo area windows (if any), or to aid airflow. Consider the nature of mail

or equipment being transported and use good judgment in deciding when an open internal door is suitable and will not interfere with the safety of vehicle operations. Internal cargo doors must be closed and locked when the vehicle is parked (see 822.e).

[Revise 245.28 to read as follows:]

245.28 Protection of Mail in Vehicles. Protect the mail at all times. Keep the rear vehicle door locked, except when loading or unloading the vehicle. For vehicles with separate driver and cargo compartments, only working mail should be kept in the driver's compartment while performing delivery and collection duties. Interior cargo doors (if any) may be kept in the "open" position to accommodate authorized passengers being transported in auxiliary seating, operator use of cargo area windows (if any), or to aid airflow. However, drivers must consider the nature of mail or equipment being transported and use good judgment in deciding when an open internal door is suitable and will not interfere with the safety of vehicle operations. Internal cargo doors must be closed and locked when the vehicle is parked. Do not leave mail in an unlocked truck, even at a mail platform, unless opened door(s) of the vehicle are in full view and can be reached quickly if a theft is attempted. To prevent delay or loss of mail, check vehicles carefully before completing the assignment to ensure that mail has not been concealed or

has not slipped into crevices. Supervisors must frequently inspect all postal-owned or -leased vehicles (including vehicles leased by employees or used in drive-out agreements) to prevent delay and loss of mail. In particular, leased vehicles must be inspected carefully for mail or postal property prior to their return to the lessor at the conclusion of the lease.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.

The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

PM REVISION

Performance and Payment Bonds

The Construction Industry Protection Act of 1999 amended the Miller Act, which requires performance and payment bonds or alternate payment protection for construction or repair and alteration contracts valued at more than \$25,000. As a result, and effective immediately, the Purchasing Policy Committee has decided to revise the *Purchasing Manual* to reflect these changes.

Specifically, PM 7.1.2.a.5 subparagraph (a) is revised to state that the penal amount of a performance bond must equal 100 percent of the original contract price, and subparagraph (b) is revised to state that the amount of a payment bond must also equal 100 percent of the original contract price. (In both instances, contracting officers may decide that a lesser amount is sufficient.) Lastly, a new subparagraph (c) is added to define "original contract price."

These revisions will be incorporated into the next printed version of the PM and in the online version accessible on the corporate intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov> (click on *Information*, then *Policies and Procedures*, then *Manuals*, and then *Purchasing Manual*).

5. Amount

- (a) Unless the contracting officer determines that a lesser amount is adequate for the protection of the Postal Service, the penal amount of a performance bond must equal 100 percent of the original contract price (see (c) below), and, if the contract price increases, an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the increase. The contracting officer must indicate the bond amount in the Schedule.
- (b) Unless the contracting officer makes a written determination supported by specific findings that a payment bond in this amount is impractical, the amount of the payment bond must equal 100 percent of the original contract price (see (c) below), and, if the contract price increases, an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the increase. The amount of the payment bond may not be less than the amount of the performance bond. The contracting officer must indicate the bond amount in the Schedule.
- (c) The original contract price is (1) the award price of the contract; or (2) the price payable for the estimated total quantity of a requirements contract; or (3) the price payable for the specified minimum quantity of an indefinite delivery contract. The original contract price does not include the price of any options except options exercised at the time of contract award.

Loss or Damage to Supplies and Equipment Received From Freight Carriers

As we enter FY 2001, many offices are ordering supplies and equipment to support the autumn mailing season. On occasion, shipments of this material may be lost or damaged by the freight transportation carrier.

If you discover damage or a shortage in the number of units when a carrier delivers freight, call the driver's attention to the discrepancy. A short statement should be noted on the carrier's delivery receipt and signed by both the driver and the person receiving the items. If a camera is available, take pictures of the damage. Please contact Mr. Phillip K. Asbury at Material Distribution by telephone (202-268-5561) or by cc:Mail for further guidance.

In most cases, the carrier will pay for the loss or damage if it occurred during the transportation movement. This conserves Postal Service funds for other uses.

Payment will be made via USPS credit card, check, or money order. *It is recommended that you consult with the manufacturer's Customer Service Department to verify the correct printer ribbon for your particular application.*

Printer ribbons must be ordered in case lots. All orders will be delivered by Priority Mail within 10 business days from receipt of order.

2001-Year Type for Hand Stamp and Canceling Machines

The 2001-year type for hand stamp and canceling machines will be automatically distributed to all postal facilities that received 2000-year types for hand stamps and canceling machines. The Material Distribution Center (MDC) will mail postcard notifications on September 22, 2000, to each postal facility that received 2000-year types. If changes are needed, note the changes on the pre-addressed postcard and drop it in the mail. If no changes are needed, do not return the postcard. Complete instructions are on the postcard.

If your facility needs 2001-year type for hand stamp or canceling machines but has not received a postcard notification by October 13, 2000, contact Materials Customer Service at 800-332-0317, option 4 no later than October 20, 2000. Please be ready to give the customer service representative the PSIN number for the item needed, the quantity, and the FEDSTRIP number for the ordering facility. The MDC will ship the year type no later than December 13, 2000. Allow 10 to 14 days for delivery.

To determine the proper year type for canceling machines, check the model number on the machine nameplate. Use the list below and Exhibit 15 in Publication 247, *USPS Supply and Equipment Catalog*, as a guide for ordering the correct type.

- PSIN O76E for Models D, K, and G new style canceling machines using 77, 225, and 218-A die hubs (NSN 7520-01-363-9283).
- PSIN O103HD2 for Models HD-2 canceling machines (NSN 7490-00-920-9277).
- PSIN O217E for Model G canceling machines using 218 die hubs (NSN 7520-01-363-9279).

- PSIN O691G for Model Flier and M machines using 1207-G die hubs (NSN 7520-01-363-9280).
- PSIN O702A for steel postmarker, hammer type (NSN 7520-01-363-9281).
- PSIN O718A for steel postmarker, rotary type (NSN 7520-01-363-9282).
- PSIN O642 rubber, for use on Nos. 550, 570, 552 (NSN 7520-01-000-9100).
- PSIN O744, steel, for use with No. 700 without flange (NSN 7520-01-364-1911).
- PSIN O747, steel, for use with No. 700 with flange (NSN 7520-01-364-3887).

The 2001-year type for Mark II Facer-Cancelers, NSN 7490-04-000-2001, will be distributed automatically to all plant maintenance facilities that received the 2000-year type. This year type is also used on the flats canceling machine (Model 15) and the AFCS machine both lead and trail. Only plant maintenance facilities may order this year type. Plant maintenance facilities are responsible for supplying this year type to all offices they service.
