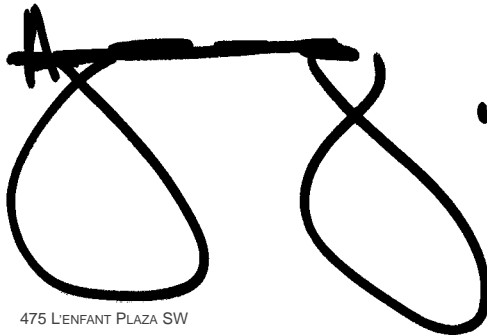

## PUBLICITY KIT

**National Card and Letter Writing Month***Overview*

April 2001 is National Card and Letter Writing Month (NCLWM). Expanding the traditional weeklong celebration to a month gives the Postal Service more opportunities to increase the awareness of the importance of card and letter writing.

Starting April 1, the Postal Service begins a special project called "Birthday Wishes to America." Although participants generally will be students at select schools that have participated in the Wee Deliver program or the Celebrate The Century® program, everyone is welcome to join the fun.

Participants will design, write, and send birthday wishes to America for receipt by July 4, 2001, which is the 225th anniversary of the founding of the United States. The wishes will be mailed to the Smithsonian's National Postal Museum. Some of the more interesting, creative, and well-written wishes will be publicized and displayed during the project.

Participants will also help the Postal Service in its effort to set a world record. To help promote the project, the Postal Service is attempting a world record for "the most birthday wishes ever received by one addressee." See below for details on how to support Birthday Wishes to America.

All postmasters are encouraged to help promote National Card and Letter Writing Month by implementing one or more of the ideas in this kit or by developing a unique activity of their own.

**National Card and Letter Writing Month Activity Ideas***Support the Birthday Wishes to America Project*

Promoting the Birthday Wishes to America project in Post Offices and in local schools, libraries, or other appropriate locations will help raise interest in the art of card and letter writing. In addition, these activities will help strengthen the Postal Service's role as a community leader.

Any event or other activity related to card and letter writing would work well with this project. The idea is to have all birthday wishes generated by your local writing project submitted to the National Postal Museum at the following address:

All birthday wishes must be postmarked by July 4, 2001. The wishes may be sent individually or grouped together in larger envelopes, and they can come in any form (e.g.,

cards, letters, postcards, etc.) as long as the sender uses sufficient postage and the items fall within the Postal Service's mailing and processing requirements.

*Other Activity Ideas*

- Work with a local school to initiate a writing project encouraging students to write and exchange letters with senior citizens from a nearby retirement center. Suggest a field trip to the center after the letter exchange. This provides a chance for the new "pen pals" to meet, take photos, and build friendships.
- Work with local schools to initiate a letter exchange between schools. Students who write the best letters can be invited to the Post Office or processing and distribution center to see how letters are sorted for delivery.
- Work with a local library to initiate a letter writing workshop and/or contest. Give a presentation on the history of letter writing (and share some famous letters) or the history of the Postal Service or postage stamps, and encourage attendees to write about it.
- Using the materials in this kit, be sure to publicize your community's, school's, or library's participation in National Card and Letter Writing Month and Birthday Wishes to America.

**Birthday Wishes to America (Questions and Answers)***Who is behind this project?*

The U.S. Postal Service is sponsoring Birthday Wishes to America as part of National Card and Letter Writing Month in April. The Smithsonian's National Postal Museum is partnering with the Postal Service.

*What is Birthday Wishes to America?*

Birthday Wishes to America is a project that will help launch National Card and Letter Writing Month in April 2001 and will help celebrate the United States' 225th birthday on July 4, 2001.

It is an opportunity to celebrate the nation's birthday, raise awareness of the importance and historical significance of letter writing, and help improve literacy and promote creativity among the nation's youth.

Writing, sending, and receiving cards and letters is a tradition that has preserved the nation's history and changed lives — particularly in times of war and times of personal triumph and tragedy. Unlike other communications, card and letter writing is timeless, personal, and immediately tangible.

Starting April 1, the Postal Service is encouraging hundreds of elementary schools across the country (i.e., participants in the Wee Deliver program and the Celebrate The Century Education Series) to participate in Birthday Wishes to America. Students will design and write birthday wishes that reveal their personal feelings and hopes for their country.

*What will the schools do with the students' completed wishes?*

The wishes will be sent to the National Postal Museum at:

All wishes must be postmarked by July 4, 2001.

*Why should teachers involve their students in this project?*

In addition to being a fun writing project, the students' birthday wishes could help establish a possible world record for letter writing. The Postal Service is attempting to set a world record for "the most birthday wishes ever received by one addressee."

Once the July 4 deadline has been reached and all the birthday wishes have been counted, the Postal Service

may publicize some of the more interesting, creative, and well-written birthday wishes, and the National Postal Museum will display them during the project.

*Are only students at participating schools allowed to send birthday wishes?*

Anyone can join in on the fun. The Birthday Wishes to America address and deadline apply to everyone.

*When will results of the Birthday Wishes to America project be announced?*

Soon after the July 4, 2001, birthday wish mailing deadline, the Postal Service and National Postal Museum will announce the results.

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main post offices, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by NCMEC.

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all postal facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in post office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other postal facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service only as described above. If postal employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local post offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 1-800-843-5678.

# Domestic Mail

## DMM REMINDER

### Upcoming Dates for Mail Preparation Changes

The table below summarizes upcoming mail preparation changes that are currently included in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM). Employees should begin working with customers as soon as possible to ensure that mailers are aware of these changes.

## REMINDER

**Required Pallets**

There has been some confusion about *Domestic Mail Manual* M041 and M045, which were revised extensively in conjunction with the January 7, 2001, rate change. Some employees have contacted Headquarters with questions about when palletization is required.

Pallets are required *only* to qualify for Parcel Post BMC (bulk mail center) and OBMC (origin bulk mail center) Presort discounts (there is no sacking option for those discounts). Otherwise, palletization is an optional method of preparation.

If mailers choose to prepare mail on pallets, then they must comply with the standards in DMM M041, General Standards, and M045, Palletized Mailings, to prepare pallets at the required levels when they have the specified volume of mail. The use of the word "required" does not mean that mailers must prepare pallets; it means that if mailers choose to prepare mail on pallets, then certain presort levels must be prepared.

For instance, if mailers of Standard Mail flats choose to prepare that mail on pallets (instead of in sacks), then they must prepare SCF (sectional center facility) pallets when they have 500 pounds of mail for the destination (see M045.3.2, Standard Mail Packages, Sacks, or Trays on Pallets).

**Requests for Special Treatment of Improperly Prepared Mail**

Management Instruction (MI) PM-680-2001-1, *Requests for Special Treatment of Improperly Prepared Mail*, has been published online.

It is essential that mailers properly prepare all mailings. Proper preparation includes correct ancillary service endorsements, address change service (ACS) keylines, and participant codes.

Any requests for special treatment of nonlocal mailings by delivery or computer forwarding system (CFS) units need Headquarters approval.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**B.** Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length	72" length and girth combined
42" . . . . .	24" girth
over 44" to 46" . . . . .	20" girth
over 46" to 48" . . . . .	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those available under DMM C021, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Section 766, Retention Period, is added to *International Mail Manual* (IMM) Issue 24. This section, which was previously Section 761 in IMM Issue 23, was omitted in IMM Issue 24, January 2001. The section has been renumbered and revised to delete all references to collection of storage charges, which were eliminated effective January 7, 2001.

Post Offices must hold international mail items for pickup by the addressee for 30 days.

However, inbound Express Mail items must be treated as prescribed in *Domestic Mail Manual* D042.1.7.

**766.2 Exceptions**

**766.21 Refused, Undeliverable, or Unforwardable Item**

An item refused or known to be neither deliverable nor forwardable must be treated as undeliverable immediately.

**766.22 Request for Return**

Items enclosed with a sender's request for return within a specified period may be held for the period specified, not to exceed 60 days.

**766.23 Items Conditionally Refused by Addressee**

An item conditionally refused by the addressee because of the duty assessed (see 713.233 for the procedure when the addressee asks that the U.S. Customs Service reconsider the duty) is held until the customs office gives a decision on the protest. If no decision is reached within 30 days, the customs office should be asked to expedite its decision.

**766.24 Items Returned From Customs Custody**

An item returned from customs custody with advice that the addressee has not complied with required customs entry procedures must be treated immediately as undeliverable.

**766.25 Request for Delivery to Alternate Addressee**

An item bearing the sender's request for delivery to an alternate addressee must be held 15 days at the disposal of the first addressee and 15 days at the disposal of the second. If the alternate addressee is at another Post Office, the item is forwarded subject to 764.1, and the 15-day period begins from the day of receipt at the second office of address.

**771.5 Return Charges for Letter-Post Mail**

**771.51 General Procedure**

Except as noted in 771.52, undeliverable-as-addressed letter-post mail that a foreign postal administration returns to the U.S. sender is *not* subject to the payment of return charges. This provision applies to postal items that were originally entered at the following rates of postage:

- a. airmail or economy (surface) letter-post
- b. post card/postal card
- c. International Priority Airmail (IPA)
- d. airmail or economy (surface) M-bag
- e. International Surface Airlift (ISAL)
- f. economy (surface) books and sheet music
- g. economy (surface) publishers' periodicals

**771.52 Exceptions**

Delivery Post Offices should collect return charges from the U.S. sender under the following circumstances:

- a. If a returned letter-post item bears a short-paid endorsement that was originally applied by the Postal Service dispatching exchange office, the delivery office should collect the amount of the postage deficiency that would otherwise have been collected from the foreign addressee.
- b. If a returned letter-post item bears a collection instruction that was applied by a Postal Service International Service Center (ISC), international exchange office, or mail recovery center, the delivery office should collect the "due amount" that is specified on the mailpiece.

**International Mail — Global Express Guaranteed Dimensional Weight Clarification**

Effective March 22, 2001, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 217.3 is revised to clarify how the postage rates for Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) nondocument and document shipments are determined.

Determine postage for nondocument GXG shipments by comparing the dimensional weight, (Length x Width x Height)/166, with the actual weight. Of these two weights (dimensional and actual scale weight), use the higher one to calculate the rate for GXG nondocument shipments, along with the appropriate rate chart for the service required. For document shipments, record the dimensions of 1" x 1" x 1" and use the actual weight to determine the postage.

**217.3 Dimensional Weight**

The equation for determining dimensional weight is as follows:

$$\text{Dimensional Weight} = (\text{Length} \times \text{Width} \times \text{Height})/166$$

When determining the dimensional weight, round each individual measurement down to the nearest whole inch. Determine the postage rate for nondocument shipments by comparing the dimensional weight, (Length x Width x Height)/166, with the actual weight. Round the dimensional weight up to a full pound. For example, (14 x 10 x 6)/166 = 5.06, which is rounded up to 6 pounds.

Of these two weights (dimensional and actual scale weight), use the higher one for GXG nondocument shipments, along with the appropriate rate chart for the service required. For document shipments, record the dimensions of 1" x 1" x 1" and use the actual weight to determine the postage.

Postage may be paid by permit imprints, subject to the general conditions stated in DMM P040 and P710.2.4. Postage charges are computed on PS Form 3651-LP, *Postage Statement — International Letter-post Permit Imprint*; PS Form 3651-PP, *Postage Statement — International Parcel Post — Permit Imprint*; or other postage statement as required. This postage payment method may be used for postage and special service fees for Global Priority Mail, letter-post, and Parcel Post.

**152.32 Minimum Quantity**

A single permit imprint mailing must contain at least 50 pounds or 200 pieces identical in size and weight and addressed to foreign destinations, unless otherwise specified for the class of mail, or authorized under a customized mail agreement. The pieces constituting the mailing do not have to be addressed to a single country.

**Note:** This minimum quantity does not apply to M-Bags.

**152.33 Required Format**

Each mailpiece sent under this payment method must bear a permit imprint indicia showing that postage is paid. Permit imprint indicia for international mail must be prepared in one of the formats shown in Exhibit 152.3. No variations or additions, such as Bulk Rate, Media Mail, Presorted Standard, Enhanced Carrier Route Sort, Automation Rate, Non-profit Organization, or Bound Printed Matter, are allowed.

**International Mail — Change in Special Drawing Rights (SDR) to U.S. Dollar Conversion Rate**

Effective April 1, 2001, section 324.22 and Exhibit 324.22 in the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) are revised to reflect a change in the SDR to U.S. dollar conversion rate. Postal Service retail employees use this information whenever an insured parcel is presented for mailing. Employees must write the insured amount, stated in terms of both dollars and SDR values, in the designated blocks on PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note CP 72*.

## ICM UPDATE

**International Customized Mail**

On February 13, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** February 27, 2001, through December 31, 2004.
- b. **Type of mail:** International Priority Airmail Service (IPA) and International Surface Air Lift Service (ISAL). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Worldwide.
- d. **Services provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
  1. Furnish Mailer, or Mailing Agent, with the equipment and supplies necessary for the use of Qualifying Mail.
  2. Provide Mailer, or Mailing Agent, with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training necessary to prepare Qualifying Mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
  3. Transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.
- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The Mailer has agreed to tender a minimum of \$10 million in international postage in each calendar year of the Agreement.

f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:

1. Provide the Postal Service with notification of intent to drop ship mail at a specific International Service Center (ISC) 2 weeks before the initial shipment to that ISC.
2. Provide the Postal Service with notification of new dedicated permit numbers 2 weeks in advance of using the new dedicated permit numbers.
3. Provide the appropriate Postal Service acceptance sites with projections of mailing to include the intended date of mailing, weight, and volume of the mailings.

g. **Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for IPA and ISAL Qualifying Mail at a rate discounted at fifteen (15) percent off of nondiscounted published rates in effect on the date of mailing.

*Note:* If Mailer does not tender at least \$10 million in actual postage on an annualized basis, the Mailer must reimburse the Postal Service the amount of the additional discount it received above the discount earned subject to the Agreement in accordance with Exhibit 1.

**International Customized Mail**

On February 22, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service hereby makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** March 8, 2001, through December 31, 2002.
- b. **Type of mail:** Global Express Mail Service (EMS) and other International Services. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Australia, Canada, China, Japan, Korea, Singapore, and the United Kingdom.
- d. **Services provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
  1. Furnish the Mailer with the equipment and supplies necessary for the use of Qualifying Mail.
  2. Provide the Mailer with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training necessary to prepare Qualifying Mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
  3. Provide a system, which will include a computer workstation, in-line scale, printers, and manifesting software to produce a manifest, EMS labels, customs documents, and customized reports.
  4. Provide at the end of each postal accounting period an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) mailing statement showing a beginning balance, deposits, a listing of each shipment mailed and date, label numbers, office of mailing, number of shipments, postage and fees, and the ending balance in the account.
  5. Transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.

6. Return items refused by the addressee and undeliverable items to the sender by EMS at no extra charge provided that the return rate is no more than four (4) percent of ICM mailings.

- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The Mailer has agreed to tender a minimum volume of 16,000 pieces annually.
- f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:
  1. Provide the Postal Service with notification of all dedicated EMCA numbers 2 weeks in advance of using the EMCA numbers.
  2. Tender Qualifying Mail to the Postal Service, in accordance with instruction the Postal Service provides, at a location the Mailer and the Postal Service mutually agree upon.
- g. **Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for EMS international shipments to Australia, Canada, China, Japan, Korea, Singapore, and the United Kingdom according the following rate chart:

## Retail Acceptance Tips — Global Express Guaranteed™

Global Express Guaranteed is the Postal Service's premier guaranteed international service. As the service's volume increases, the need for proper retail acceptance procedures becomes even more critical for successful delivery.

The following are remedies to the most frequently made retail acceptance errors:

1. Complete the Global Express Guaranteed mailing label properly (complete all required fields).
2. Verify that the shipper has signed the mailing label.
3. Advise the shipper that additional charges for duties and taxes may be required.
4. Advise the shipper that clearance delay is not part of the guarantee and does not warrant a refund.
5. Verify that the shipper has listed the value on the label for all merchandise shipments.
6. Ensure that the shipment is not destinating for Brazil, as Global Express Guaranteed does not service Brazil at this time.
7. Ensure that the mailing label is the current version (version 21h).
8. Verify that the retail consolidation unit (RCU) transmission was successful to avoid having missing acceptance records.
9. Ensure proper and timely dispatch of Global Express Guaranteed shipments to the airport mail center (AMC) or airport mail facility (AMF).
10. Ensure that the shipment does not contain human remains.
11. Ensure that the shipment does not contain cash.
12. Verify that any Post Office box accepted for recipient address is being sent only to countries listed on page 4 of Publication 141, *Service Guide for Global Express Guaranteed* (January 7, 2001), and that no Post Office box address is accepted for sender's address.
13. Verify that the mailing label is completed in English.
14. Verify that the shipper telephone number is provided on the mailing label.
15. Verify that the consignee telephone number is provided on the mailing label.
16. Inform the shipper of correct delivery days for shipments to Mexico.
17. Verify that all copies of the mailing labels are legible.
18. Communicate to the shipper that delivery days are Monday through Friday.
19. Ensure that the shipper understands the service features of the various international products and services (Global Priority Mail, Global Express Mail, etc.).

The Postal Service will issue a 20-cent *University of South Carolina* stamped card (Item Number 220200) in Columbia, SC 29201, on April 26, 2001. The stamped card, designed by Ethel Kessler of Bethesda, MD, is based on a painting by T. Ulor and goes on sale nationwide April 27, 2001.

Chartered as the South Carolina College on December 19, 1801, the University of South Carolina will celebrate its bicentennial in 2001. Reestablished as the University of South Carolina in 1906, the school prides itself on being the first institution of higher learning funded entirely by a state. Today the University of South Carolina at Columbia offers 350 degree programs and serves more than 26,000 students from 50 states and more than 100 countries.

This stamped card, part of the Postal Service's *Historic Preservation* series, features a detail of a painting (circa 1820) that depicts the historic Horseshoe district on the main campus in Columbia. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places as the "Old Campus District," this site is the original campus of the university.

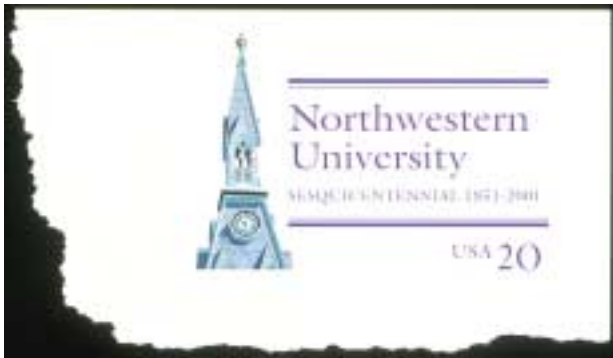

The Postal Service will issue a 20-cent *Northwestern University* stamped card (Item Number 220600) in Evanston, IL 60201, on April 28, 2001. The stamped card, designed by Howard Paine of Delaplane, VA, and illustrated by Arnold C. Holeywell of Warrenton, VA, goes on sale nationwide April 30, 2001.

The Postal Service commemorates the 150th anniversary of the founding of Northwestern University with the issuance of this stamped card as part of the *Historic Preservation* series. After the university's act of incorporation was approved by the Illinois State Legislature, Governor Augustus C. French signed it into law on January 28, 1851. Northwestern was originally established to serve the people of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, and Wisconsin, the states that had been carved from the Northwest Territory. Today Northwestern's students come from all 50 states and several foreign countries.

The stamp art, a tempera painting by Arnold C. Holeywell, features the main tower of University Hall, which is Northwestern's oldest building on the Evanston campus.

## University of Portland Stamped Card

The Postal Service will issue a 20-cent *University of Portland* stamped card (Item Number 220700) in Portland, OR 97208, on May 1, 2001. The stamped card, designed by Richard Sheaff of Scottsdale, AZ, and illustrated by John Pirman of New York, NY, goes on sale nationwide May 2, 2001.

The University of Portland is an independently governed Catholic University that was founded by Archbishop Alexander Christie as Columbia University in 1901 and received its current name in 1935. The oldest building on campus, Waldschmidt Hall (constructed in the early 1890s, before the university's inception), is depicted on this stamped card. Considered the university's signature building, Waldschmidt Hall was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on September 22, 1977. The stamped card is in commemoration of the university's 100th anniversary as part of the Postal Service's *Historic Preservation* series. John Pirman's illustration of Waldschmidt Hall is computer-generated and is his first project for the Postal Service.

### Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be post-marked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage

issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

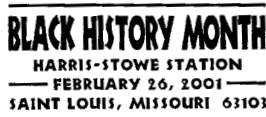
Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

The C Fund is invested in the Barclays Equity Index Fund, which tracks the S&P 500 stock index. The F Fund is invested in the Barclays U.S. Debt Index Fund, which tracks the Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond index. Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.

The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.

# Purchasing and Materials

## Copiers and Copier Maintenance Cost Savings

On December 20, 2000, the Postal Service entered into a national strategic partnership with the Ricoh Corporation for the purchase and/or lease of digital copiers and for related copier maintenance.

As the Postal Service faces increasing financial pressure, every purchase decision becomes more critical. Decisions regarding the maintenance of existing copiers should not be made without considering today's copier market. A nationwide contract was awarded to the Ricoh Corporation, and the lower cost resulting from it can make a real difference. For example, a new digital copier, complete with networking capability, can prove less costly than a maintenance agreement for an older analog copier.

The table below itemizes the direct cost of ownership for each of the copiers under the Postal Service/Ricoh strategic partnership. These prices include the purchase or lease of the new equipment, amortized over a 4-year period, and all maintenance and supplies (except paper and staples). Prices are calculated on a per-copy basis for ease in comparing these figures to those within a proposed maintenance agreement.

Most copier maintenance agreements offered by other providers include minimum monthly usage terms or overage charges that would severely penalize the Postal Service if estimated usage is inaccurate. The Ricoh maintenance included in the table does not have such provisions — the Postal Service pays only for the copies made. Also consider the cost-per-copy prices on laser printers. The industry average price is \$0.05 per print, and an office operation can save considerable expense by replacing several of these laser printers with one strategically located digital copier.

Efficiency can also be gained by having a digital copier available on the Postal Service local area network (LAN) as a system printer. Documents can be sent directly from the workstation to the copier for printing, collating, and binding.

# Retail

## ALL IRT AND DEBIT/CREDIT CARD OFFICES

### Setting Clocks for Daylight Saving Time

Managers must ensure that before opening for business on Monday, April 2, 2001, the clocks in all integrated retail terminals (IRTs) and debit/credit card terminals under their control are set *forward* (in most locations) 1 hour to reflect the change to Daylight Saving Time. Facilities with Saturday night operations should reset the time as soon as possible after the 2 a.m. start time, Sunday, April 1, 2001.

The correct system time in integrated retail terminals (IRTs) is critical since their internal clocks are used to verify Express Mail and Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) acceptance times and service commitments. The IRT system time is also printed on customer receipts and employee reports. It is very important that the debit/credit card terminal clocks be set to the correct day, date, and time as this will help reduce the possibility of accepting an expired card.

#### IRTs

On the UNISYS III Supervisor Disk, select menu item 11, Set System Date and Time, from the Control menu, and perform the following steps:

1. Observe that the date appears.
2. Press ENTER key to accept the current date. The time appears.
3. Press CE key to clear the time.
4. Enter correct Daylight Saving Time in military format (examples: 8 AM = 0800, 1:30 PM = 1330).
5. Press ENTER key to save the corrected time. The Control menu appears.
6. Observe that the corrected time is displayed in the upper right hand corner of the screen.

On the MOS IRT Control Disk, select menu item 5, Change Fees and Tables, from the Main menu; then select item 5, Set Unit Date and Time, from the Change Fees and Tables menu.

### Debit and Credit Card Terminals

For Debit and Credit Card Terminals, follow these steps:

Display	Action
U.S. Postal Service	Press the * key and the 3 key at the same time. (If you are having trouble, simply hold the * key and tap the 3 key.)
Diagnostics	Press ALPHA key.
Year	Key in the current year (4 digits). Press ENTER key.
Month	Key in a number (1–12) for current month. Press ENTER key.
Date	Key in a number (1–31) for current date. Press ENTER key.
Hour	Key in a number (1–24) for current hour. Press ENTER key.
Minutes	Key in number of minutes (0–59). Press ENTER key.
Seconds	Key in number of seconds or press ENTER key to bypass.

You must make an entry for each selection, even if the display is correct.

To verify the existing date and time of the clock in the terminal, follow these steps:

### Retail Consolidation Unit (RCU)

The time for the RCU/VAX will be updated automatically by the Raleigh Information Systems FSCS VAX Support Group. However, all RCU operators should validate the correct time and date when they log on to the RCU on Monday, April 2, 2001, and notify Raleigh if the time and date are incorrect.



**Mobile Data Collection Devices (MDCDs)**

The Delivery Confirmation handheld scanners will automatically change to Daylight Saving Time. No manual changes are necessary.

**IBM and NCR POS ONE Terminals**

The IBM and NCR POS ONE terminals will automatically change to Daylight Saving Time. No manual changes are necessary.

## FedEx Retail Agreement — Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Will the existing FedEx drop boxes in smaller towns be moved to the Post Office and become the only location?
  - A. FedEx will make that determination.
2. What does it cost to send a FedEx piece?
  - A. FedEx pricing varies by service. Per our agreement with FedEx, you do not need to be familiar with those prices. If customers inquire, politely refer them to 1-800-GO FEDEX, where such questions can be answered.
3. What if customers want to give their FedEx pieces to our carriers?
  - A. Politely advise the customers that we can not take their FedEx pieces. Customers must deposit their pieces in the FedEx drop box, or they may call 1-800-GO FEDEX.
4. What if a FedEx piece will not fit into a drop box?
  - A. If customers ask about this at the retail counter, politely refer them to call 1-800-GO FEDEX to arrange for pickup.
5. What if other carriers want a similar agreement?
  - A. The FedEx Drop Box Agreement is nonexclusive. Postal Service national headquarters will handle any discussions with other prospective partners. Do not make any local agreements.
6. What if the site selected is currently occupied?
  - A. Anything that is contemplated to be moved in favor of a FedEx drop placement will be worked out by the Postal Service District Implementation team and FedEx on a case-by-case basis. FedEx may place a drop box at any Post Office, station, or branch location.
7. Will FedEx customers have access to our lobbies to complete their paperwork?
  - A. Yes, they are our customers too. However, we will not keep FedEx supplies in our lobbies. FedEx supplies are available at the drop boxes and are maintained by their couriers.
8. When customers call 1-800-GO FEDEX, will they speak with a person or be routed through a call messaging system?
  - A. FedEx has indicated that customers will speak directly with a FedEx representative.
9. Does the Postal Service anticipate retail associate hours to increase due to the time required to answer customers' questions?
  - A. No. Politely advise customers to call 1-800-GO FEDEX. Doing so will not result in an increase in work hours.
10. Who will be responsible for tracking the number of FedEx packages, and how will we be sure of the accuracy?
  - A. FedEx scans each piece removed from a drop box. FedEx is responsible for supplying the Postal Service with collection data reports using a mutually agreed upon system.
11. Will Postal Service employees be provided with pre-printed 1-800-GO FEDEX cards to give to customers who have questions?
  - A. No. Politely refer customers to 1-800-GO FEDEX when they have questions.
12. Is this a 7-year agreement, or is there a provision for canceling the agreement prior to 7 years?
  - A. A 7-year agreement has been signed.
13. Is FedEx rate information posted on their drop boxes?
  - A. No. Politely instruct customers to call 1-800 GO FEDEX.
14. What if customers approach the retail counter, wanting to mail FedEx pieces?
  - A. Politely direct customers to deposit their pieces in the FedEx drop box. In exceptional circumstances and in the interest of good customer relations, you may accept the FedEx piece (do not weigh or rate the piece) and deposit it in the drop box if the customer insists that we accept it.
15. What if the FedEx drop box is overflowing or pieces are on the ground?
  - A. FedEx monitors its drop boxes. However, in the spirit of good partnership, you should call 1-800-GO FEDEX to report the issue.
16. What do you do if you observe customers or couriers dropping FedEx packages at the back dock?
  - A. There are no provisions for FedEx packages to be left at the back dock. Politely inform customers and couriers of the FedEx drop box location for deposit.

17. What if FedEx or Postal Service packages are received in the incorrect box?

- A. As soon as you discover that packages have been deposited into the wrong drop box or collection box, immediately transfer the packages to the correct receptacle. If the pick-up time has already occurred for the correct drop box or collection box, meaning the package will not "go out" on the day deposited, contact the other party to arrange pick-up. At no time should you convert to the other party's service a package that has been tendered to either the Postal Service or FedEx by mistake, unless the customer initiates the service change.

18. What does the agreement allow for in terms of FedEx marketing material?

- A. FedEx may place promotional materials on their drop boxes only. Postal Service headquarters must approve all other requests.

*Note:* Questions and concerns have already been raised concerning the transportation agreement. Those issues will be addressed in conjunction with the implementation scheduled for August 2001.
