SUBJECT: *Mentoring a Child* Stamp

Continuing its long-standing tradition of raising awareness of social issues, the United States Postal Service issued the *Mentoring a Child* stamp January 10. Mentoring is valued very highly within the Postal Service, and this is a wonderful opportunity for us to help make a positive difference in the lives of young people. Richard J. Strasser, Jr., chief financial officer and executive vice president of the U.S. Postal Service, and Maryland Governor Parris Glendening, were joined by The National Mentoring Partnership and Maryland Mentoring Partnership joined at the First Day of Issue Ceremony in Annapolis, Maryland.

The social awareness stamps issued over the years by the Postal Service have helped stimulate conversation and action in communities nationwide, and these activities go hand in hand with the historic role of the Postal Service as a community leader. The National Mentoring Partnership, with headquarters in Alexandria, Virginia, is an advocate for the expansion of mentoring and mentoring initiatives nationwide, providing assistance to any organization or individual wanting to develop, operate, or volunteer in a mentoring program.

Several national mentoring organizations in the United States, including Big Brothers Big Sisters of America and Boys & Girls Clubs of America, serve on The National Mentoring Partnership's Public Policy Council. Their mission is to assure greater support for quality mentoring by federal, state, and local government, and to expand the favorable attention given mentoring by the public policy community. In addition, schools, religious communities, and corporations, including the Postal Service, sponsor or participate in mentoring programs.

The effects of mentoring include greater self-confidence, improved relationships with peers and adults, better school attendance and academic performance, and increased interest in setting goals and preparing for careers. As we promote the *Mentoring a Child* stamp, I want to thank you for your support. Mentoring a Child Stamp**Publicity Ideas to Interest the Media**

The *Mentoring a Child* stamp was issued January 10, 2002, in Annapolis, Maryland, and went on sale nationwide the next day. Local dedication ceremonies for the *Mentoring a Child* stamp can be held any time throughout the year.

Thousands of volunteers offer friendship, guidance, and support to young people through mentoring, and this stamp is expected to be of interest to many of them.

Postal Service employees can find an electronic version of the *Mentoring a Child* stamp publicity kit on the intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov>. Click on *References*, then click on *Postmaster Toolkits*. That electronic version makes it easy to complete the fill-in-the-blank materials included in the kit.

Local and national publicity help increase commemorative stamp sales at Post Offices long after the date of issuance. There are many ways to interest local media in your *Mentoring a Child* event.

Here are some methods to capture a reporter's attention:

- Hold a stamp dedication ceremony and invite Congressional, community, and mentoring organization leaders; mentors; and those they mentor to participate. Present them with panes of the stamp or an enlarged image of the stamp.
- The Postal Service employs approximately 800,000 people; many are mentors, or their lives were changed by a caring adult mentor. Recognize local postal mentors at a *Mentoring a Child* stamp ceremony. Invite Congressional, community, and mentoring organization leaders to participate.
- Coordinate an essay-writing contest or art contest using the *Mentoring a Child* stamp theme. Ask local newspaper editors to judge essays and select winners. Have local art teachers judge art entries. And invite winners to your stamp ceremony to recognize their work and present them with a pane of stamps or other philatelic collectible.
- Hold an open house at your Post Office or plant. Ask postal employee mentors to be your honored guests and/or hosts. Invite Congressional, community, and mentoring organization leaders.

Implement any of these ideas, combine them, or brainstorm with your employees to come up with other ideas. Be sure to publicize each and every event to your local newspaper, radio, and television stations via press releases, media advisories, letters to the media, and follow-up phone calls.

Event Planning Checklist

When planning *Mentoring a Child* stamp events, keep the following suggestions in mind:

- Begin planning immediately.
- Using the list of mentoring organizations available at <http://www.mentoring.org>, check with mentoring organizations in your community to see if they will participate in a *Mentoring a Child* stamp event in your city.
- Set a date.
- Secure participants (postal employee mentors, community leaders, etc.).
- Order enlargements of the stamp image, flyers, and other supplies for the event.
- Prepare a pictorial cancellation from the approved design included in this kit.
- Secure staging and sound equipment, if applicable.
- Plan signage, including a podium sign and banners.
- Launch a local publicity campaign using the materials in this kit.
- Draft an agenda and remarks for speakers.
- Plan retail opportunities (booths, bag stuffers, etc.).
- Prepare ceremony programs and invitations.

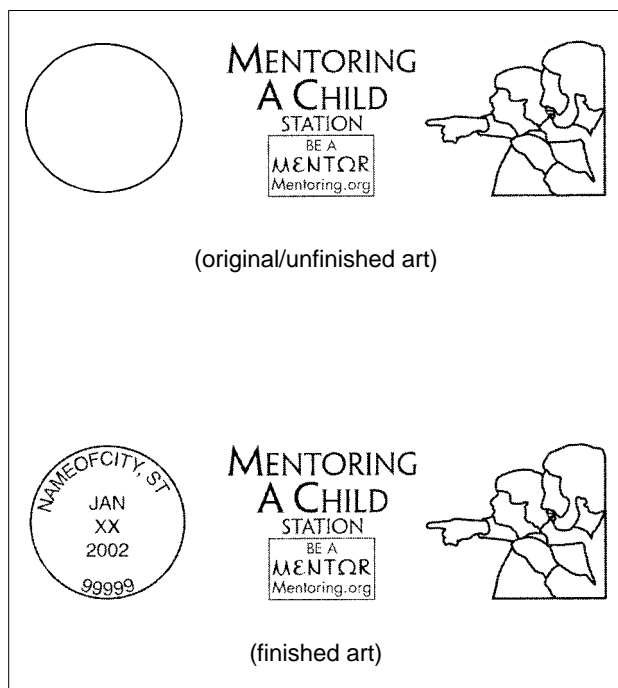
Mentoring a Child Pictorial Cancellation

The Postal Service has authorized a pictorial cancellation design for field use to help spread awareness about the *Mentoring a Child* commemorative stamp. Post Offices planning events are encouraged to use the design depicted below. Offices can offer this cancellation through mail-back service for 60 days.

As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking services widely known to collectors through advance publicity to avoid limiting the availability of these postmarks. Therefore, all pictorial cancellations must be reported to Stamp Development 3 weeks prior to local events. *Please use the announcement form on the following page to report your use of the cancellation.*

Guidelines for Finalizing Mentoring a Child Stamp Pictorial Cancellation Art

To finalize the Mentoring a Child Station pictorial cancellation art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP Code of the physical location of your event in the cancellation design. Refer to the original/unfinished and finished art below. Overall dimensions of the pictorial cancellation must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer 3 1/2 inches by 1 inch.

Licensing and Use of Mentoring a Child Stamp Image

- Organizations outside the Postal Service desiring products featuring the *Mentoring a Child* stamp image will be directed to authorized Postal Service licensees. Available products may include T-shirts, mugs, key rings, lapel pins, and so on. Such products may be resold by organizations for fundraising efforts.
- The Postal Service will consider waiving licensing fees for IRS-qualified nonprofit organizations that want to use the *Mentoring a Child* stamp image for products or uses not addressed by Postal Service licensees. Nonprofit organizations must submit their requests in writing to the following address:

- Written requests must reference the *Mentoring a Child* stamp and must include the name of the nonprofit organization or association, complete address, contact name, telephone number, IRS federal tax exempt number, and a brief description of the proposed use.
- Upon approval, nonprofit organizations will receive a transparency of the *Mentoring a Child* stamp image, along with further approval procedures and reproduction specifications.
- Any use of the *Mentoring a Child* stamp image by for-profit entities will require application for a license. Applications are available through Equity Management at the address above or by calling (212) 725-9066.

REMINDER

Bound Printed Matter

Undeliverable-as-addressed (UAA) Bound Printed Matter with no ancillary service endorsement is disposed of at the delivery unit. Unendorsed pieces *should not* be forwarded, returned, or sent to the mail recovery centers. This change was part of the R2000-1 Omnibus Rate Case implemented on January 7, 2001, and was developed after extensive talks with Bound Printed Matter mailers.

UAA unendorsed Bound Printed Matter with any special service is treated as if the piece is endorsed "Forwarding Service Requested."

Some employees may be hesitant to dispose of a mailpiece, such as a book, that appears to have value. Be assured that mailers use the ancillary service endorsement that best suits their business. When mailers choose not to use an ancillary service endorsement, they are making a business decision that they *do not* want their mailpieces forwarded or returned to them. In many cases, it is less expensive to dispose of an item than it is for the mailer to process and re-mail the returned piece.

Treatment of unendorsed Bound Printed Matter is the same regardless of the weight of the piece. The 1-pound minimum weight requirement for Bound Printed Matter was removed on January 7, 2001, but that has *no impact* on how UAA pieces are treated.

In addition, some employees are confused by the rate marking "PRSRT STD" on pieces of Bound Printed Matter. "Presorted Standard" (or "PRSRT STD") was formerly a correct rate marking for presorted Bound Printed Matter. Mailers had until January 1, 2002, to discontinue using it. The correct rate marking for presorted Bound Printed Matter is "Presorted" or "PRSRT."

Bound Printed Matter with an ancillary service endorsement is treated the same as other Package Services mail. See *Domestic Mail Manual* F010.5.4 or *Quick Service Guide* 015. Employees with additional questions about ancillary service endorsements should contact their district manager of business mail entry.

Overseas Military Mail

Mail addressed to or from military Post Offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Codes through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes, which appear on the page following the table.

Acceptance clerks should use this table with the Integrated Retail Terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to

determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and which conditions of mailing apply.

For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, all acceptance clerks must refer to the local hardcopy EMMS directory.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length	72" length and girth combined
42"	24" girth
over 42" to 44"	20" girth
over 44" to 46"	16" girth
over 46" to 48"	
Maximum length 48"	

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those available under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

INSTRUCTIONS

International Reply Coupons

Postal Bulletin 22061 (10-18-01, page 23) contained information regarding the new version of the International Reply Coupon (IRC) for calendar year 2002. Prior versions of U.S.-issued IRCs in inventories became obsolete as of the close of business December 31, 2001.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp service centers (SSCs) were directed to submit their inventories of obsolete IRCs with the statement of account for accounting period (AP) 4, which ended December 28, 2001.

Instructions for Retail Units

Exchanged Foreign-Issued IRCs

- Retail units must return **all exchanged foreign-issued IRCs** to the main stock at non-Standard Field Accounting Procedures (non-SFAP) offices or to the unit reserve at SFAP units by the close of business February 1, 2002.
- Non-SFAP offices must submit **all exchanged foreign-issued IRCs** with the statement of account for accounting period (AP) 6, or postal quarter (PQ) II, ending February 22, 2002.
- SFAP units must submit **all exchanged foreign-issued IRCs** to their SDOs/SSCs prior to the close of AP 6, PQ II, to ensure receipt.

U.S.-Issued IRCs (Pre-2002)

- Retail units must return **all U.S.-issued IRCs (pre-2002 versions only), both refunded and unsold inventories**, to the main stock at non-SFAP offices or to the unit reserve at SFAP units by the close of business February 1, 2002.
- Non-SFAP offices must submit **all U.S.-issued IRCs (pre-2002 versions only), both refunded and unsold inventories**, with their statements of account for AP 6, or PQ II.
- SFAP units must submit **all U.S.-issued IRCs (pre-2002 versions only), both refunded and unsold inventories**, to their SDOs/SSCs prior to the close of AP 6, PQ II, to ensure receipt.

Note: District accounting offices served by an SDO must submit both the exchanged foreign-issued and U.S.-issued IRCs with their statements of account for AP 6.

Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 426.9, Handling International Reply Coupons, contains specific instructions for the collection and proper documentation of exchanged foreign-issued and U.S.-issued refunded IRCs for non-SFAP offices, SFAP units, SDOs, and SSCs. Because pre-2002 U.S.-issued IRCs are now obsolete, unsold inventories of pre-2002 U.S.-issued IRCs must be submitted with the U.S.-issued refunded IRCs. **When submitting IRCs with the statement of account, package the exchanged foreign-issued, U.S.-issued refunded, and U.S.-issued unsold IRCs separately. Within each group, package by denomination (e.g., exchanged foreign-issued 60 cents from the 80 cents).** The Eagan accounting service center (ASC) will accept only properly processed IRCs.

International Mail

ICM UPDATES

International Customized Mail

We have combined ICM updates into one *Postal Bulletin* article to save space and paper. Twenty-six ICM updates appear on the following pages.

On October 19, 2001, the Postal Service amended an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement dated January 12, 2001. The Agreement was published in *Postal Bulletin* 22060 (10-4-01, page 27). The Amendment modifies the Agreement to extend the existing Agreement. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service previously announced entering into an International Customized Mail Service Agreement with this qualifying mailer and now makes public the following information regarding this Amendment:

a. Term: January 15, 2001, through May 31, 2002.

b. Type of mail: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

c. Destination countries: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

d. Service provided by the Postal Service: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

e. Minimum volume commitments: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

f. Worksharing: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

g. Rates: *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*

On October 20, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

a. Term: October 20, 2001, through October 31, 2004.

b. Type of mail: *Domestic Products and Services and International Products and Services.* Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) for Qualifying Mail.

c. Destination country: United States of America and its territories.

d. Service provided by the Postal Service: The Postal Service has agreed to:

1. Furnish at no cost any packaging supplies the Postal Service requires for the use of Qualifying Mail.
2. Provide Mailer with the training necessary to prepare Qualifying Mail.
3. Provide Mailer with access to the Postal Service web-based Application Program Interface (API) system.

e. Minimum volume commitments: The Mailer has agreed to tender a minimum of US\$2 million in postage or 1 million pounds of Qualifying Mail annually for the duration of this Agreement.

f. Worksharing: The Mailer has agreed to:

1. Provide the Postal Service with schedules of mailings to include date, weight, volume, location where mail will originate, and office of tender in accordance with instructions the Postal Service provides.
2. Pay postage for Qualifying Mail in accordance with payment methods in the DMM.
3. Use a Postal Service-approved manifest system.
4. Pay for telephone communications associated with the manifest system.

g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for Qualifying Mail in accordance with the applicable rates as published by the Postal Service at the time of mailing.

On November 1, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual (IMM)* 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** November 15, 2001, through October 31, 2003.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Airmail Parcel Post (APP)* and *Global Express Mail (EMS)*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Canada and Japan.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 1. Furnish Mailer with the equipment and supplies necessary for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 2. Provide Mailer with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training necessary to prepare Qualifying Mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
 3. Provide Mailer with technical assistance to prepare the information linkages, electronic data files, and data exchanges.
 4. Transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.
 5. Return APP items refused by an addressee and undeliverable APP items to Mailer in accordance with the IMM.
 6. Return EMS items refused by an addressee and undeliverable EMS items to Mailer at no charge provided that the return rate is no more than four (4) percent of the total volume.
- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized minimum combined volume commitment of 25,000 packages mailed via APP and EMS to destination countries.
- f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:
 1. Establish the linkages with the Postal Service.
 2. Exchange electronic information with the Postal Service according to the instructions the Postal Service provides.
 3. Provide the Postal Service with notification of new permit numbers one week in advance of using the new permit numbers.
 4. Provide the appropriate Postal Service acceptance sites with a schedule of mailings, to include the intended date of tender, weight, volume, and location where mail will originate in accordance with instructions the Postal Service provides.

g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage and return service fees for Qualifying Mail in accordance with Exhibit 1.

On November 8, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** November 8, 2001, through November 7, 2006.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Domestic Products and Services* and *International Products and Services*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) and IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. **Destination countries:** Originating outside the territory of the United States of America and intended for delivery within the territory of the United States of America.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 1. Participate with Mailer in a joint management team to monitor service performance of ICM Mail and other subjects as the team.
 2. Participate with Mailer in the development and execution of a joint Commercial Business Plan.
 3. Provide Mailer, upon request and at no cost, training for the preparation of ICM Mail at a site within the continental United States.

- 4. Return undeliverable Qualifying Mail to the Mailer at an address within the continental United States.
- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The Mailer has agreed to tender US\$2 million in postage on an annualized basis derived from Qualifying Mail or 1 million pounds of Qualifying Mail on an annualized basis for each year this Agreement is in effect.
- f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:
 1. Provide the Postal Service with schedule of mailings to include the intended date and site of tender, weight, and volume.
 2. Participate with the Postal Service in a joint management team to monitor service performance of Qualifying Mail and other subjects as the team.
 3. Use a manifest system that meets the approval of the Postal Service Rates and Classification Service Center for all mailings.
 4. Pay for telephone communications associated with the manifest system.
- g. **Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage for Qualifying Mail in accordance with applicable rates as published by the Postal Service at the time of tender.

On November 9, 2001, the Postal Service amended an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement dated October 5, 1999. The Agreement was published in *Postal Bulletin 22021* (4-6-00, page 38). The Amendment is to modify the rates and minimum volume commitment and extend the term of the Agreement. In accordance with *International Mail Manual (IMM)* 297.4, the Postal Service previously announced entering into an International Customized Mail Service Agreement with this qualifying mailer and now makes public the following information regarding this Amendment:

- a. **Term:** November 23, 2001, through December 31, 2001.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Global Express Mail (EMS)*.

On November 15, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual (IMM)* 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. **Term:** November 29, 2001, through November 28, 2003.
- b. **Type of mail:** *Global Express Mail (EMS)*. Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for EMS.
- c. **Destination countries:** Worldwide.
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to transport EMS to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authorities.
- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized minimum of 900 pieces of EMS or \$18,000 in annual postage for EMS.

- c. **Destination countries:** *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*
- d. **Service provided by the Postal Service:** *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*
- e. **Minimum volume commitments:** The mailer has agreed to meet a minimum volume commitment of 12,500 pieces annually.
- f. **Worksharing:** *All other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.*
- g. **Rates:** The mailer has agreed to pay postage for EMS at thirteen (13) percent off the non-discounted published rates.

- f. **Worksharing:** The Mailer has agreed to:
 1. Comply with the terms and conditions for mailing EMS as set forth in the IMM.
 2. Pay postage for EMS by means of a dedicated Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) in accordance with the EMCA requirements set forth in the *Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)*.
- g. **Rates:** The Mailer has agreed to pay postage at a rate discounted at eight (8) percent off of non-discounted published rates in effect on the date of mailing in accordance with Exhibit 1.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

The "Winter Sports" pictorial cancellations were developed for commemorating winter sports events and activities during the Salt Lake City Winter Olympic games.

As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking widely known to collectors through advance national publicity to avoid such postmarks being available only to small groups of people.

Mail-back service will be honored by participating Post Offices for 30 days following the event.

- Certify completion of the inspection to the servicing safety office.

PM/IHs in Level 13 or below Post Offices should contact their servicing safety office if they need technical assistance or if they do not receive the package that includes the inspection checklists and instructions.

PS Form 1094, Request for Post Office Box Key or Lock Service

The article "Revised Form: PS Form 1094, Request for Post Office Box Key or Lock Service" in Postal Bulletin 22066 (12-27-01, pages 73-74) listed the incorrect information for Touch Tone Order Entry and the incorrect Quick Pick Number.

- The correct Quick Pick Number for PS Form 1094 is **113**.
- The correct information is "**Call 1-800-332-0317, option 1, then option 2.**"

Corrected information is shown in bold in the revised article below.

PS Form 1094 (see page 69), *Request for Post Office Box Key or Lock Service*, has been revised to reflect the January 7, 2001, fee changes. In particular, a \$10 lock replacement fee has been added under the "Reason for Request" section. The "Fee Calculation (For Additional Keys Only)" section has also been changed to \$5. Included in the \$5 fee is \$1 for the key deposit and \$4 for each additional key. Recycle old forms and replace them with the revised PS Form 1094. Supplies are available in the Material Distribution Center.

Remember that the primary box customer (box applicant) may request that the Post Office box lock be changed. To change the lock, the customer must first pay the applicable lock fee as described in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) R900.19.0. Lock fees are charged for replacing keyed locks and combination locks and for resetting combination locks. Lock fees are not refundable. Customers may turn in Post Office box keys for the old lock and receive a refund of the key deposit. Two keys are provided with each new lock, with a refundable deposit for each key charged under R900.19.0. Customers may obtain additional keys for the new lock under R900.19.0.
